

Fiscal court repeals insurance tax

The Floyd County Fiscal Court unanimously approved repealing its 6 percent insurance premium tax last week, prompting questions about how the in-

coming fiscal court will deal with the revenue loss.

When the fiscal court held the first reading of its new budget in May and its proposed insurance premium tax repeal on June 5, that budget set expected revenues from the tax at

\$600,000.

But since that time, the projected revenue from the tax has increased to \$1.4 million - and the fiscal court's decision to remove those revenues from the county's coffers prompted questions and words of caution from

Floyd County Attorney Keith Bartley during its Friday meeting.

The fiscal court did not discuss the increase in insurance tax revenues detailed in the budget before voting
