### VICTOR SLONE, 20, KNOTT OFFICIAL'S SON, CRASH VICTIM

Victor Sloane succumbs at Martin to injuries suffered Sunday in Auto

Victor Sloane, 20-year-old son of Ballard Sloane, circuit court clerk of Knott county, died in the Beaver Valley hospital, Martin, at 10 o'clock Sunday night, three hours after he and three others had been injured in an auto wreck on Jones Fork eight miles from Lackey.

The wreck occurred when an automobile driven by Mitchell Combs, of Hindman, plunged from the highway over a 25-foot embankment. The driver sustained broken ribs and an arm injury. Delzie Gearheart is reported as having suffered a broken hip, and Miss Prude Sloane a broken arm and collarbone.

Funeral rites for the victim were conducted Tuesday afternoon at Hindman, where burial was made. Mr. Sloane is survived by his parents and five brothers and sisters.

### MAYTOWN MOTHER, DAUGHTER INJURED

Langley, Ky., May 13—Mrs. J. H. Allen, wife of Dr. Allen, and daughter, Peggy, were injured early Saturday morning when they prepared to leave home for Pikeville. Mrs. Allen was at the wheel, and after backing the car out of the garage, she stepped on the gas through mistake, and the car headed down the hillside which is both long and steep.

After passing the concrete curb of the driveway the auto went into the air and struck nose first, some distance below, turning over into the road and on over a second embankment, landing on the rear end this time, then rolling over a fence and coming to a final stand on its side.

How either occupant escaped death is a mystery. Miss Peggy Allen received minor cuts and bruises, and had one front tooth broken. Mrs. Allen suffered a broken leg and internal injuries. Witnesses rushed to the scene and removed the two women from the car and then rushed them to the hospital at Martin. Dr. Allen was called and followed hurriedly.

Miss Harriet Allen, of Pikeville College, and George and Claude Allen, of the University of Kentucky, came to their mother's bedside. Peggy Allen returned home Saturday night. Friends of Mrs. Allen are encouraged by improvement in her condition.

### EDGAR SAMMONS VICTIM OF SHOT FROM OWN GUN

Local Taxi Driver Dies in Hospital at Paintsville From Chest Wound

Edgar Sammons, 36 years old, Prestonsburg taxi driver, died in the Golden Rule hospital at 2 o'clock Monday morning from a bullet wound near his heart which was self-inflicted.

The bullet, of .38-calibre, entered his left chest, above the heart and emerged from his back. He was rushed to the hospital at Paintsville in his taxi, driven by Tom Marshall.

Motive for the shooting has not been definitely established.

A son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Sammons, of this place, the victim was one of Prestonsburg's best-liked young men. He was of a quiet, unassuming nature and held the friendship of all who knew him. Surviving him are his parents, his widow, Mrs. Ruth Spradlin Sammons; one stepson, Otto, 11; seven brothers and one sister: Dewey, Marion, Toy and Darling Sammons, of Prestonsburg; Roland, of Ashland; Floyd Williams, a half-brother; Anna-polis, Md.; and Miss Tonia Mae Sammons, Prestonsburg.

The body was returned to the home here and Tuesday afternoon was taken to the home of the victim's parents, on the Auxier road, a few miles below here, where funeral rites were conducted by Rev. Arnold T. Malmberg of the Presbyterian Church. Burial was made under the direction of E. P. Arnold in the Bingham cemetery.

### Mrs. Sallie Blanton Shoots Alleged Rival for Husband's Affections

Mrs. Sallie Blanton fired a bullet from a .38-calibre revolver through the hip of Mrs. Bert Wells, of Auxier, whom she is said to have considered as a rival for the affections of her husband, Walter Blanton, a driller, when she found her husband and Mrs. Wells sitting in an automobile in front of the Harvey Patton filling station here Tuesday afternoon.

Mrs. Blanton, who resides at Paintsville, is said to have fired five shots at Mrs. Wells. The wounded woman was taken to the Paintsville hospital, where it is said she is not seriously hurt.

Mrs. Blanton was arrested by Deputy Sheriff W. A. Wills and Policeman Jim Meade. She promptly executed \$1,500 bond and was released.

**KNIGHT, AUTHOR OF  
ALLEN BIOGRAPHY**

One of the new books just announced by the University of North Carolina press is Grant C. Knight's "James Lane Allen and the Genteel Tradition," which forms one of a series of volumes dealing with southern literature and society. Professor Knight is associate professor of English at the University of Kentucky.

This biography, on which Prof. Knight has been working for approximately seven years, presents not only the first full-length account of Kentucky's most noted writer but also, by exposition of literary and social trends, a chronicle of the whole important American era (1845-1925) through which the novelist lived.

Mr. Allen's life is presented in full detail his early years in the Blue Grass, his relations with various Blue Grass families, his career as student and reluctant teacher, his first attempts at literature, his moving to New York City, his evolution from romanticism to realism, then to symbolism and realism to a blend of universal scope.

Allen's personality is also examined carefully, with (ex-)made him seem difficult socially. The last part of the volume, called by the editor of the University of North Carolina press "the most original critical thing that has come my way for a long time," defines and defends the tradition of gentility in literature and attacks the hard-boiled school as represented by Faulkner and Caldwell. Mr. Knight is also author of "Superlatives," "The Novel in English," "American Literature and Culture," and editor of "Readings from the American Mercury."




