Prestonsburg has the opportunity of gaining, through the Kentucky Emergency Relief Administration, a benefit which may reasonably be expected to last down through the years. This for the simple reason that the expected advantages accrue to children. The benefits?—that is of prime importance in this

investment-minded world. Consider A playground for young children, removed from the streets where they are in constant peril from passing automobiles.

Your youngsters, though perhaps mingling with older children, whose influence may not be idealistically wholesome, removed from the ordinarily unsavory associations with which they may be afflicted in the

Your children playing happily in a well-organized playground, under the supervision of competent playground directors, removed as far as is possible from every physical hazard, every moral threat reduced to a minimum.

Our children prepared for dizenship through cooperative play, trained in the fundamentals of competing with others, of winning and losing, of appearing in public, not only in athletic roles but also as musicians and exponents of other arts.

That is the sum total of our argument. The cost, then, to us as parents and taxpavers? Simply furnish playground equipment. The relief administration will pay salaries of playground directors in each school or town where such projects are approved. That is all. The cost itself is negligible; the investment, a good one because the returns cannot be computed in dollars and cents alone.

A news-story in this issue of The Times sets forth in detail the plan. It is up to us to avail ourselves and our children of the opportunity offered us.

Maytown has already availed litself of this opportunity. That is a challenge to Prestonsburg and other Floyd county towns and schools.




