EXTRA FUNDS ASKED HERE

By American Red Cross To Aid Flood Victims Of 10 Mid-Western States

Of the \$490 additional funds asked of Floyd county by the American Red Cross for flood relief, three Prestonsburg churches have raised \$175.35, Miss Ella Noel White, executive secretary of Floyd Chapter,

Eighty-four counties in 10 midwestern states have been affected by the flood. More than 31,000 families were hit. In a radio broadcast James T. Nicholson, executive vicepresident of the Red Cross, said:

"As the flood waters recede in each community, the Red Cross will move into high gear with its program for rebuilding the shattered lives and homes of those reqiring further help. Rehabilitation aid is given on an individual family basis, as contrasted to the mass care of the emergency period. First attention obviously will be given to the

most urgent cases.
"This assistance is always given as a direct grant—never as a loan. It is a gift of the American people, through the American Red Cross, yith no obligation of repayment."



Wayland, Clear Branch Hardest Hit; One Mine Closed As Drivers Quit

A slow coal market and the uncertainty of the steel situation, plus minor labor disturbances, combined to hit Floyd county's coal mining industry this week, with upwards of 300 mine employes already idled and others threatened by loss of

Hardest hit were the Wayland and Clear Branch communities. At Wayland the Elk Horn Coal Corporation had laid off, or were in process of doing so, 175 men who, a company official was quoted as saying, may never again return to work there The Clear Branch Mining Company had approximately 130 men tempor-

At Wayland those out of work are mostly hand-loaders, it was said, The reason for the company's action was not definitely known here.

Approximately 100 men from varous mines of the Reed interests also are out of work. In one of these, the Liberty-Elkhorn Coal Company on Wilson Creek, unemployment for miners resulted from a strike of truckdrivers. Claimants from other mines which are not closed but lack sufficient orders to keep the men working are showing up at the Kentucky Unemployment Service office

Mr. Harris writes that hi conscience is clear, but that repor from the Fiscal Court Claims Book has disturbed him, that being Mag istrate is a liability and that his is not a paying office. I wish to repor to the readers of this paper that have just finished a complete audi of the records Mr. Harris has turned in to the courts on file and below i my sworn statement as to their truth and accuracy, and I challenge Mr. Harris to deny same under

oath. Affiant, Burnis Martin, says tha he has very carefully checked every item on Mr. Harris' record, and find that from Jan. 30, 1950 to March 27, 1952, his family has drained from the County Treasury the sum of \$9,454.74 and he has the same period he has tried and prosecuter 727 erring boys. He has collected in fines the amount of \$4,777.74 which at 10 percent commission would be \$477.76. A magistrate collects \$6.00 cost for himself in each case and with 727 cases tried, he should have stuck in his pocket \$4,362.00 (The giving away of costs is the exception and not the rule). 

THE athletic situation at the University of Ken-ell's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Perry tucky, far from ideal, is that of a thousand smaller schools over the land, mag-

It was not created by the University, per se; rather, the situation evolved from public demand for a winner. From that start the thing H. Marshall, James Durham, Carl snowballed till the situation

Followers of the fortunes of football teams of the school do not have to recall too many years to remember when they plaintively chorused, "Why can't we have teams like Alabama or Tennessee?", "What's wrong

with Kentucky?", and so on. The answer to the questions, of course, was-Capable coaches and better player-material.

So, as other schools got the headlines — the big. black headlines and the lyri--Kentucky prepared to get Price. The alumni, the public de manded it; they got it.

Coaches were hired to deliver the goods. If they didn't, other coaches would be sought. You know the story. A losing coach moves on, and somebody else moves in. Character-building? Eyerybody - not necessarily the coaches, but all of uswere looking for a winner. The Epworth League for character!

Then came Madison Square Garden and the gamblers. Then the debacle. All the sordidness of bigtime athletics hit the public with shocking effect. The public learned that scholastic effort had been subordinated to athletic prowess; that Kentucky had induced athletes through the lure of money-as if no other school had ever done likewise! Coach Rupp of Kentucky's basketball team was accused by players who themselves faced charges of accepting gamblers' bribes; he was accused of being a doting, fatherlike personality in victory, a stern, unforgiving tyrant in defeat. He was accused of talking point spreads to his boys—a fact known to every reader of the country's sports pages.

This is not to argue Rupp's case or the University's. It is all sickening, But overem-phasis of athletics did not begin at the University of Kentucky, though it may well begin to end there.

We are all, in some degree, guilty. Did you ever bet on a basketball or football game and gripe your head off at the coach, the players who were doing their best, and at the referees when you lost?

Now the pendulum starts its inevitable swing in the other direction? Will it go to the other extreme? Will the public want the mediocrity of athletic talent which simon-pure amateur-ism brings? Will it stand for

If not, how much sensible cooperation will be given toward attaining the "golden mean" between those two extremes of rank amateurism and near-professional-

#### AN OPINION ABOUT COAL

The brilliant essayist Ralph Waldo Emerson, wrote in 1860: "Coal lay in ledges under the ground since the Flood, until a laborer with pick and windlass brings it to the surface. We may well call it black diamonds, Every basket is power and civilization. For coal is portable climate. It carries the heat of the Tropics to Labrador and the polar circle; and it is the means of transporting itself whithersoever it is wanted. Watt and Stephenson whispered in the ear of mankind their secret, that a half-ounce of coal will draw two tons a mile, and coal carries coal, by rail and by boat, to make Canada as warm as Calcutta; and with its comfort brings its industrial power."






