Moody said the June pickup will result from:

1. Increased orders from the steel industry, one of the biggest coal customers.

2. A leveling-off of coal stockpiles. Consumption has been greater than production since the first of the year.

3. The normal seasonal shipments of coal across the Great Lakes to industrial centers in the North.







On the other hand, these operators-a bit late in the day, to be sure-admit coal must be given some consideration by the railroads, too. (In our case, "railroads" means the C.&O., the only system serving the Big Sandy.)

Here is the case of a railroad boasting that it is the world's greatest coal-carrier but hanging on to policies which are killing "the goose that laid the golden egg." Its policies are flexible only in those instances which will mean immédiate greater profits to C.&O. The future may go hang.

Its dieselization is nearing the one hundred per cent mark. 



# RAISE TO HIT FARM LANDS

# In County As Commission **Grders** Assessment 'Floor' **On All Kentucky Property**

The new State Tax Commission minimum assessment rate of 30% of a fair market value on all Kentucky property will mean a raise of 3.3% on Floyd county for acreage but may not affect town lots values doubting one. here, it was indicated.

Town lots in this county already are at the 30% minimum average while farm acreage is being assessed at 26.7%

Pike county, on the other hand, has farm lands assessed at 32% above the "floor" set for assesslow on farm acreage, 25%, but has bugs out of your garden. its town lots assessed at 32%. Johnson county will be untouched by the bird that will keep the bag-worms the bonds. The County Board would established level because of the raise put into effect there, a few years ago, when Department of Revenue help was called on for the assessment problem. There farm lands are assessed at 36.7% of market value while town lots are assessed as 32.7%

More than half of Kentucky's 120 counties are due for blanket raises o bring their assessments of town lots and farm acreage up to the 30 per cent floor unless their tax commissioners or boards of tax supervisors voluntarily raise county levels before June 20.





The nine coaches of the 58th district organized the Floyd County High School Coaches Association here last week to standardize the payment of basketball ofifcials and to promote a uniform athletic program for the various high schools.

John Campbell, Jr., Garrett net coach, was named president of the group, and Denzil Halbert, veteran Martin mentor, was elected secretary-treasurer.

The group unanimously passed a resolution that all basketball officials must officiate both the first and second team games next season, and that no official is to be paid more than \$15. This precedent is an attempt to alleviate the cost of basketball officiating, and thus far has created varied comments among the whistle tooters.

Through close cooperation and frequent meetings, the association will be striving to give Floyd county's 13,000 school children a uniform physical education and athletic program. At present, all schools are represented by basketball teams, five by baseball teams, three by track teams and two by football teams.

Future stress is to be placed on a wide range of physical education activities for grade school children.







But the U.M.W. has no such recourse because it has declined to sign a non-Communist affidavit. The Taft-Hartley Law requires such an affidavit for a union to take cases to the N.L.R.B. The association and the union are now putting off contract negotiations that might have come up last fall. Moody would like to see a reduction in the 40-cent-a-ton royalties that go into a welfare fund for the miners. A miner injured in the mine is entitled to a "gold-plated bedroom,' he remarked, "but we should not have to pay accident prevention for someone cut up in a saloon fight." Moody would also like to see the elimination of pay for lunch-time, travel time, and other time not actually spent on work. 




