



### This Is Our Stand

The Floyd County Times salutes Circuit Judge Hollie Conley for the moral and political courage shown by his action last week in discharging the grand jury here when he became convinced that it had failed in the discharge of an important duty.

We take this stand with the full knowledge that it may offend some good people and some good friends of ours. But we do not attack their motives; we say only that their judgment and their resultant action were such that Judge Conley was within his rights when he took the action he did. However high their motivation may have been, their vote against an indictment in a local option violation case was a serious impairment of the force of the law as an honest attempt is being made to enforce

An authorized representative of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board was the only witness, true. But could there have been a better qualified witness? Besides, the grand jury needs only the testimony of one valid witness; it is not the duty of a grand jury to hear all the evidence, since it is not sitting in the trial of the case.

Some said the ABC agent himself violated the law when he took a drink of the whiskey which he says he purchased. Is it illegal to take a drink, or is it illegal to sell it? All legal technicalities aside, the grand jury could not expect an undercover agent to procure evidence of such an offense unless he appeared to be "one of the crowd." An officer wearing a badge or a minister carrying a Bible would have poor chance of gathering incriminating evidence in such a situation, it must be admitted.

Besides all this, the grand jury had the advice of the Commonwealth's Attorney and the County Attorney who should have been trusted in this particular situation. We do not suggest that a jury of any sort should be puppet-like, but men and women unskilled in the law must look to such officials for legal advice. In this instance, as we understand the events of last Wednesday morning in the grand jury room, the jurors got advice, were advised to indict—then voted unanimously not to indict.

This bootlegging business is a serious matter in Floyd county. Officials are being blamed daily for the situation. Then, when they make an honest attempt to meet the problem, head-on, even at the risk of offending a large segment of the voters, some who wear the label of "good citizen" lead the booing chorus.

We stand firm in our belief that this bootlegging racket should be rooted out and that all in the racket, wherever or whoever they may be, should be indicted and prosecuted and fined and jailed. So it is that we refuse to join the booing chorus. Instead, we offer these officials our full support for whatever it may be werth.

SECRETARY OF AGRICULTURE

My friend Bordeaux over in Terrebonne Parish received a \$1,000 check from the government this year for not raising hogs. So I am going into the not-raising-hogsbusiness next year. What I want to know is, in your opinion, what is the best kind of farm not to raise hogs on and the best kind of hogs not to raise? I would prefer not to raise razorbacks, but if that is not a good breed not to raise, I will just as gladly not raise any Berkshires or Durocs.

The hardest work in this business is going to be in keeping an inventory of how many hogs I haven't raised. My friend is very joyful about the future of this business. He has been raising hogs for more than 20 years and the best he ever made was \$400 until this year when he got \$1,000 for not raising hogs. If I can get \$1,000 for not raising 50 hogs then I will get \$2,000 for not raising 100 hogs.

I plan to operate on a small scale at first, holding myself down to about 4,000 hogs, which means I will have \$80,000. Now, another thing: These hogs I do not raise will not eat 100,000 bushels of corn. I understand that you also pay farmers for not raising corn. So will you pay me anything for not raising 100,000 bushels of corn not to feed the hogs I am not raising? I want to get started as soon as possible as it seems to be a good time of year for not raising

#### Spring Clean-Up Set By Betsy Layne FD, Chief George Notes

"Clean up for fire safety." This is, basically, the reason for the spring clean-up campaign which starts in Betsy Layne, Harold and Stanville, April 15, Fire Chief James George, of the Betsy Layne fire department, said Monday.

"Clean-up brings a lot of benefits to the community but one of the really major accomplishments is to get rid of the trash and rubbish which provides a breeding place for fire," George said.

Every 12 minutes one American home is destroyed or damaged by fire starting in rubbish, according to National Fire Protection Association statistics.

So the fire department goal for spring clean-up is to make every home in these communities safer from fire. This means concentrated attack on the spots in and around houses where fires start-accumulations in attics, basements and closets, any place where there is trash and rubbish.


