Wes Hall, 74, of Topmost died Tuesday at McDowell Appalachian Regional hospital.

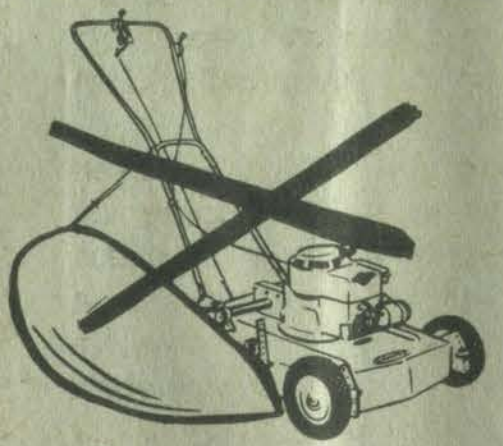

After a scoreless first quarter, Tommy Burchett raced 20 yards for the first Prestonsburg touchdown in the second on a fine fake by quarterback Scott Cline. The kick for extra point failed. Later in the quarter, John Paul Leslie intercepted a Pirate pass but when the march for another marker bogged down Leslie on fourth down kicked a field goal from the 25-yard line to bring the score to 9-0.

Belfry came back in the third quarter to score, and the two-point conversion brought the score to 9-8. This was followed by a deflected Belfry punt by John Paul Leslie and George Hale. Terry Hickman picked up the ball and ran 35 yards to score. Leslie's kick failed.

With a 15-8 lead, Prestonsburg still was not out of the woods, with Belfry scoring again in the fourth quarter on a pass. The two-point conversion attempt that could have given Belfry the win was stopped.

The win gave the Cats a 5-1 season record. Next on their schedule is Whitesburg, here Friday night.

Danny Wells picked up valuable yardage on the ground over the strong side, with David George, Bill Roberts and Leslie in front. Byron Hamilton's clutch catch of a pass in the second quarter got Prestonsburg out of its own territory. Randy Leslie throughout the game caught clutch passes in tough situations, and Dickie Jarvis in the second quarter helped the winners by snagging a deflected Pirate pass. The line was bolstered by the work of George Hale and Guy Rorrer.



Breckinridge's request to intervene was the first such action his office has taken in the continuing controversy involving overweight coal trucks.

Social Security Has Teleservice To Help Reduce Office Visits

A new telephone service at the Pikeville social security office can handle "most social security business" without requiring personal visits to the office by the public, according to Daryl E. Ratliff, social security district manager for Pikeville.

"We call it Teleservice," Ratliff said. "With it, we can handle a great deal of the paperwork by phone that involves such social security matters as application for benefits, change of address for prompt delivery of monthly checks, and general and specific questions about social security programs, including Medicare."

With Teleservice, Ratliff said, social security personnel can, in many instances, fill out an application for benefits over the phone, then mail the form to the beneficiary for his or her signature.

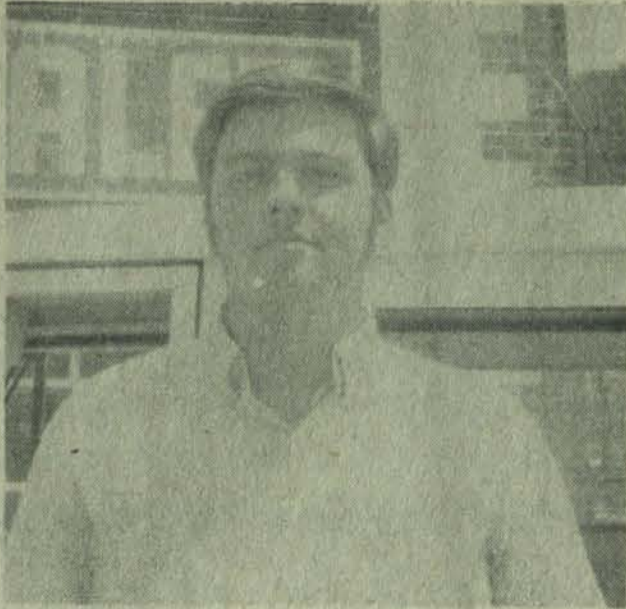

5 Big Sandy Counties Receive Crime Funds

Gov. Louie B. Nunn last Friday approved and signed into effect a \$1.5 million anti-crime package containing 44 grants recommended by the Kentucky Crime Commission for local law enforcement agencies.

Funds are being provided under the Federal Safe Streets Act of 1968 and will be matched by 40 per cent local funds.

The five counties receiving the grant are Floyd, Martin, Johnson, Magoffin and Pike. The money will be used by the Sheriff's department in each county to purchase communications equipment which will allow the counties to use both common and independent frequencies as well as monitors and mobile facilities.

A total of \$272,950 was awarded to 11 agencies for projects to combat juvenile delinquency.

The grant package announced represents half of the nearly \$3 million available to

Kentucky for 1970 to implement the Kentucky Crime commission's comprehensive criminal justice plan.

Eight awards totalling \$278,829 have already been made by Governor Nunn to state law enforcement agencies. Remaining funds will be allocated by December 31 and the deadline for local applications has been set for October 15.

Large or Small, School Districts May Save through Central Buying

FRANKFORT, KY.—The Louisville independent school district has about 55,000 pupils and the East Bernstadt independent district, in Laurel county, has about 400.

Both school systems have a common financial goal—to get as much as possible for the taxpayer's educational dollar.

Officials in Louisville and East Bernstadt—as well as in most of the other 190 school districts in Kentucky—expect important savings to result from the new law under which supplies can be bought at state-discount prices.

The smaller school districts stand to benefit most from the new law, in the belief of James Melton, assistant superintendent of public instruction in charge of administration and finance.

For any purchase of \$1000 or over, bids have to be taken.

"The superintendent of a small school district has so many duties that he does not have the time to make a study of dozens of price lists on the scores of items that must be bought during the year," Melton observed. "However, on purchases that run into the most money, he can order through the state and be sure of getting good prices."

The new law should result in substantial savings to most schools, Melton added.

The East Bernstadt superintendent, Russell Mason, said: "I can see that quite a lot of saving is possible."

Mason, like many other Kentucky school officials, obtained a rundown on possible discounts by writing to N. B. McCubbin, state purchasing director.

J. B. Myers, purchasing director for the Louisville city schools, is taking a close look at state price lists and is planning to buy through state channels whenever a saving is possible.

For some time Myers' office has benefited from the joint buying system set up by the city of Louisville and Jefferson county in 1965. He pointed out that in some instances buying through a local firm is more advantageous even if the price is slightly higher—if considerations such as machine servicing are included.

"We take bids on our own, we study the city-county price lists and now we'll study the state price lists, and from all these we'll

take the best," Myers said.

The medium-size school district also stands to benefit from the central-purchasing law (HB 204).

Hayward Gilliam of London, Laurel county school superintendent, plans to use the state price lists whenever his district would benefit. The district has 6200 pupils.

"I feel like it will help us," Gilliam said. Rep. Brooks Hinkle, D-Paris, chairman of the Joint Legislative Interim Committee on Education, said that use of the new central-purchasing law by most Kentucky school districts "could give them the equivalent of an appropriation of several hundred thousand dollars a year in additional funds. Eventually the savings should total into the millions."

Hinkle pointed out that the bipartisan-sponsored law, which passed both houses of the last General Assembly unanimously, is permissive—not mandatory.

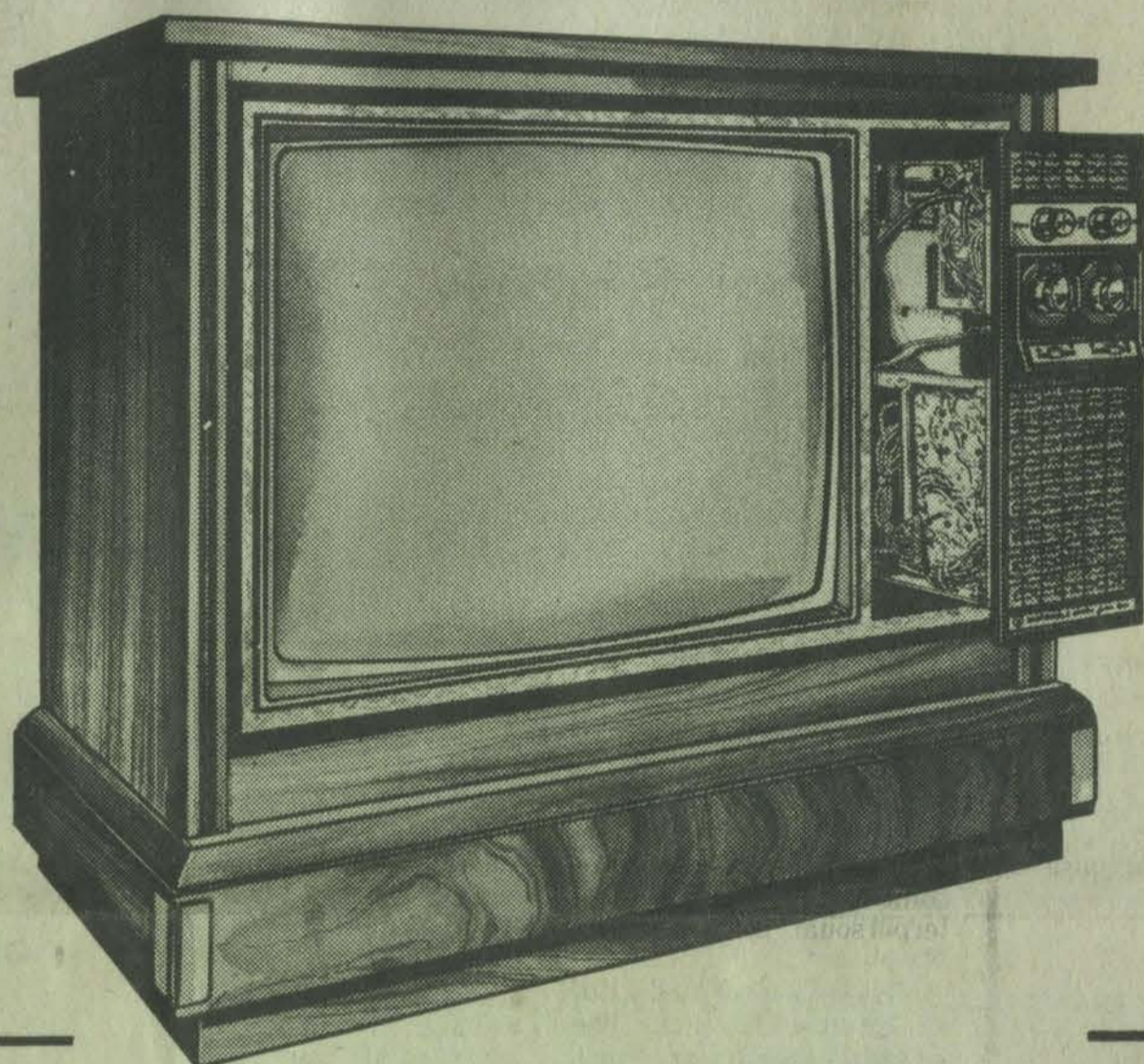
