## Homestead Exemption Increased for Elderly

FRANKFORT, Ky.—Persons 65 and older, or who will reach that age this year, have one opportunity to keep up with inflation, thanks to the 1974 legislature. They can secure a \$7,700 tax exemption on a residence they own.

But applications must be made by March 1. An eligible person must apply with the county property evaluation administrator and maintain the property for which the exemption is sought as his personal residence.

Homestead exemptions are not automatic. Only one exemption per homestead is allowed, regardless of the number of 65-year-olds residing there.

House Bill 436, which provided for the exemption, specified the amount as \$6,500, but further stipulated that "this is construed in terms of the purchasing power of the dollar in 1972." It also provided for adjustment every two years thereafter. "If the cost of living index of the United States Department of Labor has changed as much as one per cent, the maximum exemption shall be adjusted accordingly."

This has made possible the raising of

the exemption by \$1,200 as a result of an 18 per cent increase.

Under terms of the Homestead Exemption Amendment to the Constitution of Kentucky, ratified in the general election, Nov. 10, 1970, properties exempted from taxation were those which were used as public places, used for religious worship, places of burial, institutions of purely public charity, institutions of non-profit education, public libraries and single-unit residences occupied by persons 65 years of age or older. It stipulated single-unit tax exemption of up to the assessed valuation of \$6,500 on each residence.

Owners of a duplex may apply if the duplex is owned jointly by two persons and each is 65 years or older or if either owner has a spouse 65 years or older. Each eligible owner must live in a separate unit of the duplex. The exemption may apply to both of them as if they owned a single homestead.

### Speeds Reduced, Deaths Decrease

FRANKFORT, Ky.—In terms of vehicle miles traveled, Americans had in 1974 the safest highway travel year in history, according to a report released by the Federal Highway Administration.

That's far too many deaths, but when you consider that in the intervening decade, traffic volume has increased by 50 per cent (from 805 billion to 1.27 trillion vehicle miles), the rate of highway deaths per mile traveled has never been lower.

In Kentucky, the figures are even more dramatic. According to Bennie R. Maffet of Kentucky's Office of Highway Safety Programs, the total number of highway deaths in the state last year was the lowest number since 1961.

In Kentucky, 707 died in the past year as compared to 722 in the year 1961. Every year since, until the advent of the energy crisis a year ago, there had been a steadily increasing fatality toll.

Asked for comparative travel figures for 1961 and 1974, Maffet said that the mileage traveled in the earlier year was 11.5 billion miles compared to 23.4 billion miles of motor vehicle travel in 1974. A simple computation shows that travel on

Kentucky highways had more than doubled in those 13 years, while the number of fatalities was held close to the 1961 level.

In 1961 an average 5.4 people lost their lives in Kentucky for each 100 million vehicle miles of travel. In 1974 the records show three people killed for the same volume of traffic.

Nationally, fatalities were reduced 16.5 per cent for 1974 compared to 1973. Kentucky experienced a reduction of 30 per cent for the same time period.

Using the criteria established above, Kentucky drivers have a safer driving record than drivers nationally, Maffet said.

At least one transportation official gives credit for 1974's reduction in highway fatalities to the man behind the wheel. Bennie R. Maffet, director of the Office of Highway Safety Programs, says that drivers of the Commonwealth's highways now have a better awareness of safe, energy saving driving habits.

Highway accidents claimed the lives of 785 people in Kentucky during 1974, according to fatality figures released by the Kentucky Department of Transportation. The figures indicate approximately 30 per cent fewer highway deaths than the 1,117 reported in 1973.

"We cannot overlook the impact of the 55 mile per hour speed limit," Maffet said. "It has brought down the accident figure dramatically. Still, the lowered limit, of itself, was no panacea. The constant reiteration of the speed limits imposed last spring has made us all aware of the hazards of driving."

Maffet referred to urban accident figures by way of example. "For the most part, urban roads have always had lower speed limits, yet urban accidents are also down."

Nor is reduced travel necessarily the cause of lower fatalities. By year's end, traffic volume was nearly up to 1973 standards. Vehicle miles traveled are currently within five per cent of their level before the energy crisis occurred. In addition to the 30 per cent reduction in fatalities, Maffet points out that state police have reported 4,000 fewer accidents this year than last year.

The director of the safety office cites a number of contributing factors to the safety record. "Concentrated enforcement has certainly helped in making us conscious of speed limits," he said.

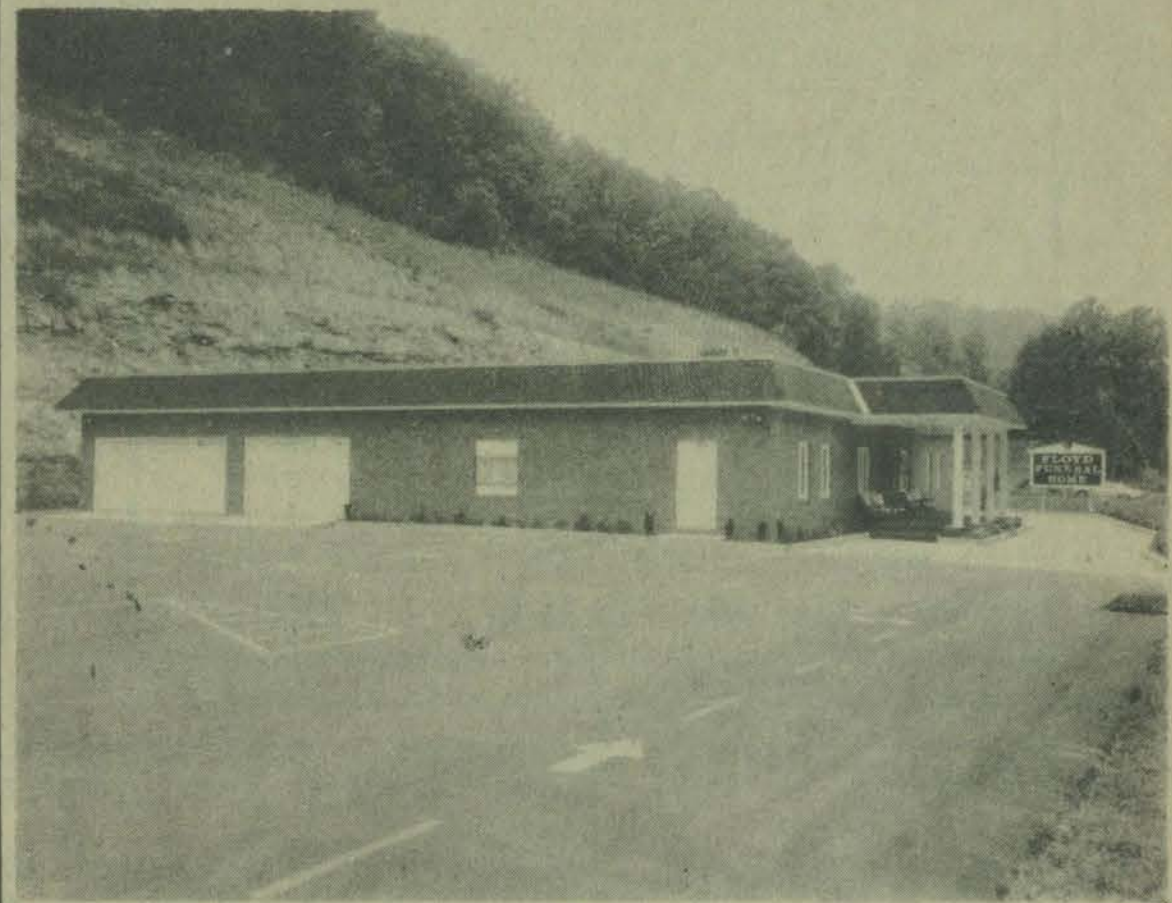

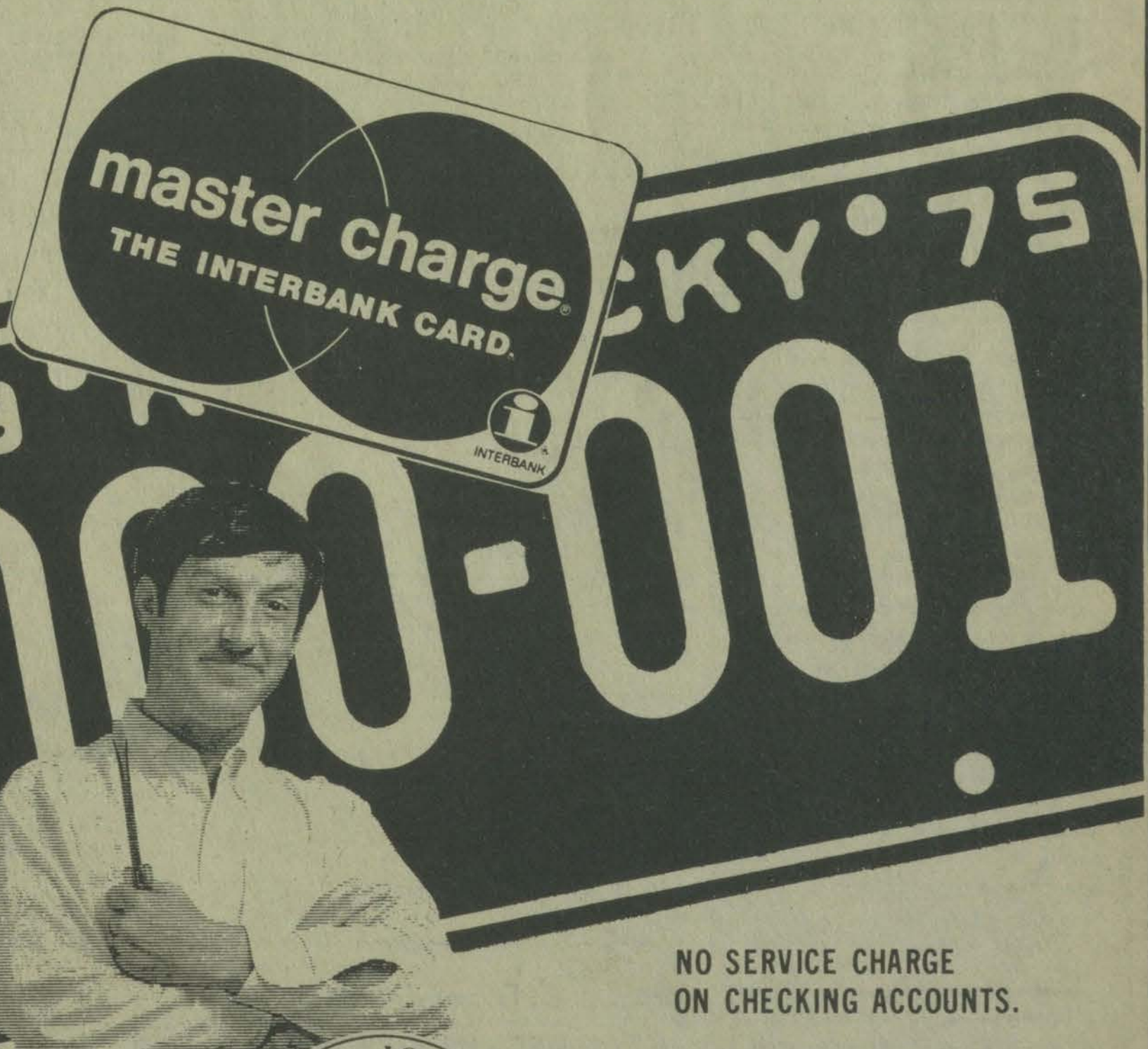

## Plan Meeting To Map Drive For Industry

FRANKFORT, Ky.—Looking toward an eventual decline in the coal boom, an interim legislative committee will try to meet in Eastern Kentucky next month to find ways to get industry to move there.

State Rep. Hoover Dawahare, D-Whitesburg, raised the subject at a meeting of the subcommittee on consumer protection. He said the state commerce department should be required by law to set up a branch development office in Eastern Kentucky.

General approval greeted a suggestion by State Rep. Thomas Burch, D-Louisville, chairman of the parent Labor and Industry Committee, that the full committee meet in Eastern Kentucky to consider the subject.

Burch said he would see if the full committee could extend a meeting already scheduled for Ashland next month so as to also have a series of meetings the next day in several other Eastern Kentucky cities.

Most subcommittee members said now would be the best time to finance any plan to attract industry to that area because the boom in the coal industry could provide the revenue.

"Coal will go down again. It always has," commented Sen. Joe Stacy, D-West Liberty, the subcommittee chairman. "If we don't do something now to bring in industry, we'll be right back where we've always been (when that happens)."

Stacy and others said the subcommittee also could help Eastern Kentucky by looking into the operation of coal-ramp operations, if that fell in its jurisdiction.

Agreeing, Dawahare said: "Ramp owners make most of the money (from coal) and they don't pay any taxes."

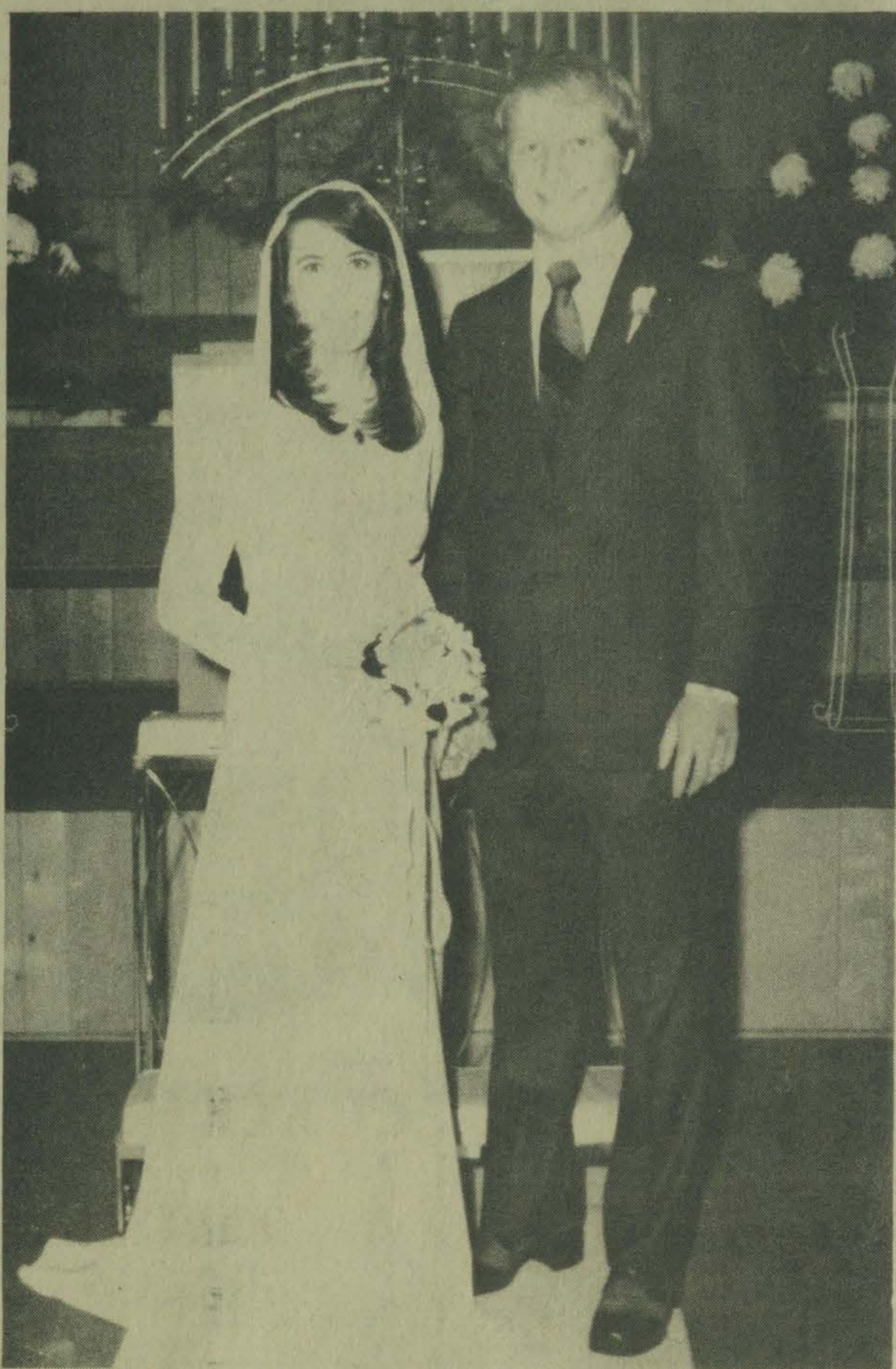

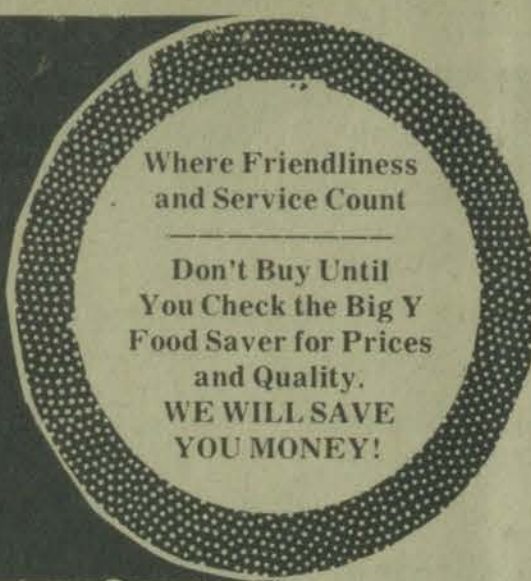
