

County's Status Officially 'Wet' After 30 Years

For the first time in more than 30 years, beer may be legally sold in this county, beginning today (Wednesday), Licenses have been issued by the state Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) Board to 17 prospective beer dealers here and county licenses were expected to be issued to them by today. the date the state licenses become effective

It may yet be some time, however, before beer is sold in Prestonsburg, which has been somewhat slower than the county in processing license applications.

As many as 140 applications for license as retail beer dealer have cleared his office and been sent to Frankfort for approval, Phillip Damron, the county's alcoholic beverage control administrator, said this week. More than 100 have applied for liquor licenses as well, and perhaps another 150 have picked up application forms but not filed them, he said.

Of those who have filed, almost all have been interviewed already by state ABC officers, Damron said. The 21 whiskey licenses to be issued in the county will be announced at one time, after all applications have been received; beer licenses, on which there is no legal limit, may be issued at any time. Liquor sales are not expected before mid-November.

In Prestonsburg, the license application process was delayed until the city

Three Charged As Marijuana **Plots Uncovered** Three Floyd men were charged with growing marijuana following two raids last week as peace officers over the state moved in an apparent attempt to curb the increasing production of the substance. Earl D. Derossett, 30, was arrested by sheriff's deputies Thursday and charged with cultivating marijuana for sale and with possession of drug paraphernalia. In the course of a raid on a house trailer and property about three miles up the Spurlock Fork of Middle Creek, 24 plants and a pound of dried marijuana were seized, according to Sheriff Henry Hale. Derossett was originally held under bond of \$50,000. This figure was reduced to \$10,000 following a bond hearing Monday morning. Contending that the bond should not be reduced, County Attorney Arnold Turner, Jr. pointed out that this was the second felony charge lodged against the defendant in a period of two weeks. Merlin Martin, 20, and Johnny Dye, 20, both of Drift, were arrested two days earlier after state police raided a property at the head of Stumbo Hollow Sixteen plants and six pounds of dried marijuana were confiscated, police said. The two were charged with cultivating marijuana for purpose of sale and released on \$5000 bond each. The cases against all three will be presented to the grand jury which convenes next Tuesday. Billy Salisbury, 25, of Prestonsburg, driver of a school bus, was arrested with three juveniles on the Big Branch of Abbott Creek, Aug. 16, by Sheriff Henry Hale and deputies. He was charged with unlawful transaction with a minor. Details of the charge were not disclosed.

Heavier Coal Loads Hit Bridge Problem

The way the new law was supposed to work, trucks could haul overweight loads of coal-which many operators say they have to do if they are to make a living-and the state could raise money for badly needed road repairs in the coal counties

The problem, it turns out, is the bridges. Many of them might not be able to support the heavier loads. Which leaves state officials wondering how they can write regulations without being liable for the collapse of a bridge and truck operators wondering whether the new law is going to do them any good after all.

One suggestion that has surfaced is that the truck operators themselves might help rebuild the smaller bridges. Under the new bill, which was sponsored by Sen. Benny Ray Bailey and **Drunk Drivers**, passed by the 1982 General Assembly, carriers can apply for a state permit to haul loads that are heavier than a **Drunks Marked** highway's posted weight limit. Sexton Hit Second **Time at Rail Crossing**

About five years ago Elkana Sexton figured in a rail crossing accident at Emma when his automobile was struck by a Chessie train.

Last Wednesday morning, he was at the wheel of a pickup truck which was hit at the same crossing by a train of two locomotives and a caboose.

The 71-year-old Emma man's truck was hit last Wednesday, around 11:30 a.m., as he drove from his home to the postoffice, across the railway tracks. Mrs. Sexton said she was watching her husband as he drove from home and that she did not hear the train and that there was no warning whistle. Her husband also reported he had no warning.

Sexton's truck was knocked into the ditch bordering the rail line. He was taken to Our Lady of the Way Hospital at Martin and, later, to a Lexington hospital. He is now at home.

Two Die in Mud Creek Wreck

Two Mud Creek men were killed and a third seriously injured at 3 o'clock Sunday morning when their pickup truck smashed into an oncoming truck driven by a Water Gap man.

The dead are Michael L. Newsome, 24, of Craynor, driver of a Toyota pickup, and his passenger, James A. Johnson 19, of Teaberry.

Another passenger, Gregory Hall, of Melvin, was seriously injured and is in St. Joseph Hospital, Lexington, with multiple injuries.

Donald DeRossett, of Water Gap, driver of the second truck, suffered chest bruises but was released after examination and treatment at the McDowell Appalachian Regional Hospital.

Both Newsome and Johnson were dead on arrival at the McDowell hospital, Coroner Roger Nelson said.

Chimney Sweep from Top Hat to Toe

State Trooper John Sizemore said his investigation of the tragedy indicated Newsome was driving around a curve on the wrong side of KY 979, at a point two-tenths of a mile upstream from the Grethel postoffice, and that DeRossett attempted to avoid a collision. He said that of the 225 feet of skid marks measured, 175 feet were on the wrong side of the highway.

Newsome, an employee of the Scott's Branch Mining Co., was a son of Kermit and Barbara Newsome, of Craynor, who survive. Other survivors include his widow, Mrs. Glenda McKinney Newsome; a daughter, Crystal Dawn; one brother, Kermit Newsome, Jr., of McDowell, and a sister, Mrs. Loretta Marie Hogg, Milford, Michigan. His funeral was conducted at 10 a.m. Tuesday from the New Salem Regular Baptist Association building at Minnie, and burial was in the Lucy Hall cemetery at McDowell.

Johnson was employed by the Ligon Preparation Company. His survivors include his parents, Cleveland and Daphine Johnson; two brothers, Cleveland and Jimmy Dale Johnson, and three sisters, Jacqueline, Josephine and Polly Marie Johnson, all of Teaberry. His funeral, also at 10 a.m. Tuesday, was from the home of his parents, and burial was made in the Hall cemetery at Grethel.

Both funerals were directed by the Hall Funeral Home.

PCC Crowded, Director Says As Enrollment Nears 1,000

"Full to overflowing" was the assessment made by Dr. Henry A. Campbell, director of Prestonsburg Community College, Tuesday morning after a record student registration of 925 had been reached.

Not only the facilities of the college itself were taxed; no parking spaces were left for vehicles outside

The registration figures reported cover only students seeking accreditation. In addition to the 925 fulltime students already registered, as many as 10 more may be enrolled. Besides, Morehead State University has 12 extension classes going at the college, and several hundred other individuals participate in the college's continuing education and community services program

'We expect to go to 1000 students by next fall, and there must be some building done in the next biennium," Dr. Campbell said. "We could use one by next fall.'

This is the third consecutive year of record enrollments at PCC. The new enrollment represents a 10% increase over the fall semester last year and 14% above the 1982 spring semester, according to the college admissions of-

The college opened in 1964 with an enrollment of 322.

Four Festivals Slated in County

Beginning with the Floyd County Fair this week, it's a steady round of "back-home" events and festivals for Eastern Kentucky that will carry well into next month.

With at least four festivals planned, Floyd county leads in the number of such events. Each is different, varying in their emphasis on the music, dances, customs and history of the area. Chronologically, in this county there will be:

-The Kentucky Highlands Folk Festival, beginning Sept. 10 at the Jenny Wiley State Park amphitheatre, for its 17th annual three-day program.

-The Squirrel Festival, for its third vear, Sept. 19 on Slone Mountain, Left Beaver Creek

-The first annual Jenny Wiley

Festival, tentatively scheduled here for three days, Oct. 7-9.

-The 13th annual Red, White and Blue Day, Oct. 16 at Martin.

Elsewhere in the region, there will be Johnson county's Apple Day at Paintsville, Sept. 28-Oct. 2; the Gingerbread Festival at Hindman, Sept. 9-14; Morgan county's Sorghum Festival at West Liberty, and Hazard's Black and Gold Festival, Sept. 16-19.




Student Benefits Begin Now

Scout Volunteers In Training

Social Security benefits for college students 18-22, which were stopped last May, will begin with the September check, which will be issed in early October, Jim Kelly, Social Security District Director for the Big Sandy area, said recently.

In addition, the amount of the September checks will be about 25 percent lower than they were last spring. These changes are the result of a new law that went into effect this year, Kelly said

Students will receive a "beginning of school year" report during the first weeks of the fall term. The report asks about school attendance and work. The student should complete the top part of the form and then give it to the school



registrar to complete and mail to Social Security right away.

If the report is not completed and returned promptly, benefits may be stopped.

Students should also remember that their benefits may be affected if they worked during the year and have earned more than \$4,440 this year or expect to earn more than that amount by the end of the year. Earnings a student had during months he or she did not receive benefits count toward this limit.

In general, \$1 in benefits is withheld for each \$2 of earnings above \$4,440. Benefits to post secondary students

who are still eligible will continue until they reach 22 or April 1985, whichever comes first, Kelly said.

People now becoming eligible for benefits can receive benefits until age 19 as long as they are full time high school students.








Shaker Heritage Celebrated

SHAKERTOWN, Mercer County, Kentucky—Every September more excursionists and vacationers than usual choose to spend a day in the 19th century at the Shaker Village of Pleasant Hill. During the Shaker Heritage Weekends on September 11-12, 18-19, 25-26 an influx of visiting craftspeople, performers, shopkeepers, and vendors joins the historic restoration's daily staff to add more of the sights and sounds of a hard-working, selfsufficient Shaker village a hundred years ago.

New on the craft roster this year, Joel Kammerad from Spring Lake, Michigan and Doug and Gwen Noren from Shipshewana, Indiana demonstrate the making of oval boxes, one of the most well-known products of superior Shaker craftsmanship. Last year's new craft demonstration, the production of silk, is presented this year by Mary Stock from Canton, Ohio. Silkworms, cocoons, the reeling of silk from the cocoons and silk spinning are all included in the September 11-12 weekend.

The Shakers, a shortened version of their 19th century nickname, the "Shaking Quakers," created an entire body of American folk music to accompany their frenzied religious movements. Music emanates from the Meeting House to fill the village each weekend when groups perform these spirited tunes and dances. On September 11, 12 the University of Kentucky Choristers, directed by Sara



Coming also from the University of Kentucky are students in the College of Pharmacy's historic pharmacy class under the professorship of Richard Doughty to demonstrate herb processing on all three weekends. Karen Dever and other members of the Lexington Quiltmakers exhibit their quilts and quilting techniques on September 11-12, 18-19.

From Sparta, Kentucky, Jerry and Sandi Wallin use the anvil, forges, and tools of the blacksmithing and tinsmithing trades. From Harrodsburg, Calvin Shewmaker creates fine reproductions of Shaker furniture, using the historic tools and talents of Shaker cabinetmakers. Martha and Chet Cramer from Lebanon, Kentucky demonstrate pole-lathe cabinetry and basketry on September 11-12 and 18-19. On September 18-19 Doug Rowe from Ft. Mitchell, Kentucky takes over the Shaker leatherworking exhibit room for the fashioning of shoes.

From Dayton, Ohio, Marvin Bishop brings the products of the tole painter's trade for all three weekends and Richard Jamerson creates tinware on September 11-12 and 25-26. Helen and Nel Laughon bring their camera obscura from Richmond, Virginia to cut visitor's silhouettes on September 11-12 and 18-19.

On all three weekends, village craftspeople contribute candle-dipping and beehive-oven baking demonstrations and a tasting kitchen of herb cooking. Rides on the village's paddlewheeler riverboat, and on a wagon drawn by a team of Belgian horses, little antique shops, and country vegetable market complete the events list.



The cost of replacing a small bridge is \$200,000 to \$300,000, Metts said. The Transportation Department's current five-year construction plan includes some 300 bridge replacements, he noted.

In this county, four substantial bridge projects are under way, or planned. The Tram bridge (estimated cost, \$888,000) is under construction; replacement of bridges at German (\$850,000) and Allen (\$1.7 million) is scheduled for next year; and a \$2.8 million bridge replacement at Cliff is listed for 1985.



could enact an ordinance taxing liquor sales here. Passed last week, the new law levies a tax of 5 percent of gross sales-and applications are only now "starting to drift in," explained Paul P. Burchett, administrator of the city licensing program.

City officials intend to inspect carefully any premises to be used as liquor outlets, he said.

Because of special legislation enacted several years ago by the General Assembly, the city of Martin is classed as a fourth class city and may enact a sales tax on alcoholic beverages. The city council there has not adopted an ordinance setting such a tax but is in the process of doing so, and the sale of beer is not expected to be delayed, City Attorney David Barber said. City Clerk Johnna B. Stephens is Martin's alcoholic beverage administrator.

About 200 persons attended a public meeting Friday at May Lodge, where attorneys explained to prospective beer and whiskey dealers the law pertaining to liquor sales.

Mr. Hurlbut, a "qualified Duplex field expert," worked six days and some nights, and had as his helper his young nephew, and his total labor charge for both was \$171.60. We paid for his meals, which for the six days cost a total of \$24, and he charged us \$40 mileage for 800 miles of travel.

Indeed, those were good, old days. I shudder at the thought of what one of these "electronics experts" would charge for working six days, not to mention overtime.

NO ILLEGAL SOFT DRINKS

With no comment ready that would be helpful, now that the county is ready to turn to the legal sale of beer, I tell this one that, I am assured, really happened several years ago.

The boys had driven to the neighborhood bootlegger's place of business, and after establishing their credentials with an extremely wary seller, departed with two pints of his best. Back in their car, they discovered they had no chaser, so one trotted back, knocked on the door, the seller peeked around the door as he opened it and whispered, "What you want?"

"A Seven-Up. "Don't have any. Sell no soft drinks.'

"Why?" the thirsty customer inquired.

" 'Cause," the bootlegger replied, "I never got any soft drink license.'

NO PLACE LIKE HOME

At the risk of something I would shun,-repeating myself-, I relate this anecdote which I also found among my rather disorganized "effects".

En route to Frankfort some years ago, I rode with an oldtimer who lived far up a hollow and had never been as far away from home as the Blue Grass. in his life. Private School Opens, Another **Being Planned**

With the county's public schools already back in session for the year, a private school is set to take its first shaky steps here next week, and yet another is on the drawing board.

The Prestonsburg Christian Academy, sponsored by the Water Gap Free Will Baptist Church, will open next Tuesday, although as a more modest project than was anticipated when plans for the school were made public last spring.

The coal industry slump has cut by half enrollment at the school, making it doubtful whether grades 1-3 will be offered this year as intended, said Barbara Curry, whose husband is pastor of the church. The kindergarten will open as scheduled, she said.

Of about 30 pre-enrollments in the first three grades, only about 15 were enrolled this week, Mrs. Curry said. Ten children have been signed up for kindergarten.

With its biblically-oriented curriculum and tough discipline, the school would offer an alternative to the secularized public schools, Pastor Danny Curry told a group last March. Fees were set at \$100 a month for the first three grades, \$38 a week for fulltime kindergarteners, \$24 for those attending half-days.

A number of those who showed an interest in the school but did not enroll their children indicated they were outof-work coalminers, Mrs. Curry explained.

Meanwhile, about 40 persons answered a recent invitation by Father Ralph Beiting, pastor of Catholic churches in Prestonsburg and Martin, to discuss formation of yet another private school in this county.

Beiting is president of the Christian Appalachian Project, a non-profit corporation based in Lancaster, which would own and operate the school. The near Martin and plans are to begin operation of the school next year, it was said.

Water Request **Nears Hearing**

The state Public Service Commission will hold a hearing in Frankfort next Tuesday on the request by Prater Creek residents for the establishment of a water district in that section.

A preliminary survey by a state utility inspector found a "definite need" for a water distribution system on Prater Creek and noted that Prestonsburg, which recently expanded the capacity of its water treatment plant, should be able to supply the proposed new district.

By law, PSC approval is needed before a water district can be formed. If it is given, it will be then up to the county judge-executive to name three water district commissioners.

Winning official approval of the water line may turn out to be a good deal easier than finding the money to construct it, however. Cost of the project is tentatively reckoned at \$800,000.

If rates are to be kept within acceptable limits, a Prater audience was told last week, the water district would need to secure a government grant for 75 percent of the cost, with the remaining 25 percent to be financed by loan.

With such an arrangement the average water bill for Prater Creek residents would probably work out around \$17 a month at current rates, said Roger Recktenwald, director of the Water Resources Assistance Corporation. "That's pretty close to average around here," he said.

The water system proposal calls for 19 miles of water lines, including a 6.5 mile main to run along KY 1426 from Banner south to Jarrell Branch. The 6-inch line would be tied in to an 8-inch transmission main recently laid by the Prestonsburg utilities commission along US 23 from Allen to Stanville.

According to the preliminary survey, the system could serve 397 customers, including 17 small businesses.

Application for a hearing on the proposal was submitted to the PSC in April by Ervin Akers, Benjamin Akers, Don Wallen, Clinton Akers, and James Click

Johnson fiscal court is one of four that undertook to support the Floyd detention center following a cutback of state funds last year. Under the arrangement, Johnson county was to pay \$18,000 a year to house its juveniles here.

However, Johnson could detain its young offenders more economically by converting the third floor of the Johnson county jail to a detention center, Judge Johnson maintains.

Floyd Judge-Executive Jerry Lafferty, Jr. said this week that, besides Johnson county, Lawrence. Magoffin and Martin counties, as well as Floyd, house their juvenile offenders in the facility here.

He apparently does not view the proposed "defection" of Johnson county as a threat to continued operation of the center.

The proposed school would combine "religion and learning" and "would actively seek to involve all Christian faiths," according to a paper describing the project. A Chance at a Lifetime

By AMY CONN He was born two months too early, three years ago today. Aaron Thomas Cantrill, 3 lbs., 10 3/4 ozs., fought for life in the Highlands Regional Medical Center nursery.

Dr. Penny Grino, obstetrician, assisted by Dr. K. Vidwan, Neonatologist, delivered Aaron by an emergency Cesarean operation. When he was two hours old, he quit breathing because his lungs were not fully developed. For Aaron's parents, Michael and Rene Cantrill, of Meally, it was a terribly frightening time. Nurses comforted them while they viewed their newborn son in an incubator. He had two I.V. tubes protruding from his tiny limbs, three wires attached to his chest to constantly monitor his heart rate, and a catheter inserted in an artery in his umbilical cord. A respirator pumped air to his lungs through a tube in his throat and a nose tube kept air out of his stomach. His head was swelled due to bleeding within his skull.

Aaron had company in his struggles at Highlands Regional that evening. The nursery was crowded with a number of healthy infants, two other seriously ill premature babies and another sick baby that was transferred in from the Paintsville Hospital. The

'ighlands nursery team was able to sustain the babies through their first critical hours of life. Due to the lifesaving measures, taken, the conditions of the three premature infants were stable enough to be transferred by helicopter to the neonatal intensive care nursery at Cabell Huntington Hospital.

Tiny Aaron spent 17 days in the hospital. Six months after his release



from Cabell Huntington Hospital, he believe we would be celebrating was diagnosed as having cerebral palsy which is a typical condition that may result from prematurity. However, he has proved the doctors wrong. Although a bit small for his age, Aaron has no serious disabilities.

Just as Aaron has grown and developed over the past three years, so has the HRMC nursery. Under the guidance of Dr. Vidwan, the nursery was furnished with specialized equipment such as two infant respirators, heart and breathing display monitors, and automatic blood pressure monitors. Gradually, additional items have been purchased including a special light for diagnosing a collapsed lung, water on the brain and other common problems of premature infants. A computerized, double-wall isolette and an automatic ventilator alarm system are the most recent additions.

Very seriously ill babies that need surgery or intensive care treatment still must be transferred to Huntington or Lexington hospitals. But, many infants that previously had to be transferred can now receive expert care at Highlands. This eliminates the problems of transportation and the anxiety of separation that used to be an additional burden for parents of sick babies

Besides the sophisticated technology available at HRMC to care for premature infants, the nursing staff has received additional intensive training. Five nurses attended 10 days of classes at the Cabell Huntington Neo-Natal Intensive Care Nursery. They received practical experience in the unit as well as lecture, textbook and audiovisual information. These nurses then returned to Highlands and taught a 12-week course to all nursery, O.B. staff members, head nurses and other interested nursing personnel. These special classes are now a requirement for all new O.B. personnel, in addition to the regular education and training they receive. Even though the level of sophisticated equipment and training was not as high three years ago as it currently is, Aaron Cantrill's story did have an extremely happy ending. "We're so grateful for the care our son received at Highlands Regional Medical Center. Without it, I don't



Sales of Existing Houses **Expected To Improve**

Although the rate of existing home sales declined in July, there are now numerous indications that better days lie ahead for the real estate industry, Dr. Jack Carlson, chief economist and executive vice president of the National Association of Realtors, said last week

"July's high mortgage interest rates and the fact that as of last month Congress had not yet made significant progress in enacting legislation to reduce the deficit were primary factors that caused existing single-family home sales to slip to a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 1,860,000 units-identical to the rate recorded last January, and below the revised June rate of 1,980,000," he said.

"There is no reason to believe, however, that last month marked the low point in what has proven to be the worst housing decline since the Great Depression," said Carlson.

July's resales report marked the 10th consecutive month that the rate of existing home sales remained below the two million unit level. Last month's resale figures were 24 percent lower than a year earlier and 54 percent below the peak annual rate of 4,020,000 units recorded in November 1978.

"July's resale activity is consistent with the depressed level of singlefamily housing starts reported last month," Carlson said. "While the annual rate of all housing starts increased more than 30 percent from June to July, that increase was in multi-family housing, not in a single-family home starts.

"However," he added, "last week's enactment of major spendingreduction and revenue-raising legislation-without which the fiscal 1983 deficit could have been as much as \$80 billon higher-already is helping to bring interest rates down and is paving the way for a housing recovery.

"Now that Congress has taken concrete action demonstrating it is serious about reducing the deficit short-term interest rates are declining significantly and mortgage interest rates are beginning to decline," said Carlson.

This week's reduction in the interest rates for FHA- and VA-backed loans and the reducation by the Federal National Mortgage Association of minimum interest rate requirements for adjustable mortgages are specific examples of why NAR expects the existing single-family home sales will improve, the economist said.

Not only did the high cost of mortgage credit depress the number of

home sales last month, but it also held down prices.

The median sales price of an existing home in Juy dropped \$200 to \$69,200. July's median price is only \$1,700 above that of one year ago.

"Home prices would be even lower if people-to-people financing were not available," Carlson said. "It is almost certain that the net selling price of existing homes had actually declined since last year."

The median price changes were very different for each region. The median price in the West increased \$200 to \$100,300 in July. In the Northeast, the increase was \$700 to \$64,000. The North Central region posted a loss of \$800 to \$55,300, and the South dropped \$100 to \$69,900.

Lower home prices and lower mortgage interest rates from financial institutions combined with the fact that so many sellers are willing to help with financing make the next 90 days a good time to buy a home, Carlson predicted.

'As financing from institutions becomes more affordable, home prices may resume normal inrcreases to reflect the underlying shortage of housing," he said.

Keeping Chimney Clean, An Important Task

Chimney fires are a major concern to all homeowners and residents. Whether you use a woodstove or your fireplace, owners should be careful to avoid fire caused by ignition of "creosote" and carbon deposits in the chimney, commonly known as soot. Creosote is a chemical substance that forms when wood burns. Some creosote escapes in smoke, but part condenses and accumulates within a chimney.

Before each heating season, chimneys should be inspected for creosote and soot build-up as well as obstructions, such as nests, broken mortar or brick. If you use your fireplace often, it should be inspected periodically throughout the year. Creosote is highly flammable and burns with a very hot flame that can damage the chimney and set fire to the house.

Creosote accumulation can be removed safely only by a mechanical process such as scraping or brushing. Of course, you don't want a mess in your house. This is why most professional chimney sweeps own an industrial vacuum, as well as an assortment of steel wire brushes to scrape the deposits loose.

Board May Hear Pupil Fee Gripes

"Terrible" is how Lorraine Prater describes the fees being levied on Floyd students for school supplies this year. And she vows the Board of Education will hear from her on the subject at its monthly meeting tonight (Wednesday).

For their part, local school officials can lay the blame at the feet of state legislators who last year pared to the bone the fees paid to school districts for consumable supplies—workbooks, typing paper and the like—and this year eliminated the state payments entirely.

After fixing the maximum that could be charged for each grade or subject, the Floyd school board left it up to individual school principals to decide what fees to levy.

Whoever is to blame, says Mrs. Prater, the fees are too high. Her daughter, a junior at Prestonsburg High School, will pay \$75 in fees this year, she claimed.

She is incensed that parents, after paying taxes, have to pay school fees as well—especially since recentlypublished test scores indicate that, for their money, students here are receiving a less-than-average education, Mrs. Prater said.

At the least, she will be asking for an explanation of how the fee money is being spent, she indicated.

The need for a proper accounting of the fees was raised by other parents, representing about eight county schools, who met in Martin last Tuesday. Members of a coalition of parentteacher organizations called the Floyd Education Council, they reported wide variations not only in the fees but also in the way they were presented to parents.

While a first-grade teacher at Prestonsburg Elementary itemized materials for which fees were being levied there and a letter of explanation was sent to parents of Clark students, the fees were more commonly exacted with little or no accountability, it was said.

Moreover, while some schools are charging the maximum permitted by the board, others have levied lesser amounts, and yet others are charging nothing. Clark school will split with its PTA the cost of classroom materials, it was said. At the Prater Creek school, where no fees are being charged, the PTA will apparently be asked to foot the whole bill.

For some parents at least, that solution only compounds the problem. If parents are going to have to pay, said one, the burden should be spread as widely as possible, rather than left to parent-teacher groups which already do most of the fundraising for classroom supplies.

New Licensing System Developed for Cyclists

Just because a motorcycle rider has passed his state's examination doesn't mean he is equipped to handle emergency situations when they crop up. The truth is that many states' licensing systems aren't adequate in testing what cyclists really should know out on the streets and highways. In fact, there are five states that still don't require a separate motorcyle license—if you can drive a car they consider you qualified to ride a motorcycle, too.

The U.S. Department of Transportation, with cooperation from the Motorcycle Safety Foundation and others, has developed and tested a licensing system, the Motorcycle Operator Skill Test, that can make a big difference for motorcyclists. When it was tested on license applicants in California there was a 15 to 21 percent reduction in accidents for those who took the new test when compared with those passing the old test.

The test is designed to insure riders can handle emergency stops and evasive maneuvers to avoid an accident. Many states are considering the test for their motorcyclists since its adoption could go a long way toward reducing motorcycle accidents and injuries.

Little Paint Church Project Is Completed

Breast Milk Beats Formula

More experts now agree that breast milk produced by a healthy mother is nutritionally far superior to any formula. There are, however, many other advantages in nursing rather than bottle feeding: breast feeding is easier in that there are no bottles to wash or sterilize; the food supply is always convenient, available and at the right temperature; nursing becomes a time for rest for the mother; also, nursing is cheaper in that no money is spent on bottles, formulas or sterilizers.


It has long been known that breastfed babies receive antibodies against early bacterial infections that babies fed artificial (including cow's milk) formulas never receive. One can examine the stool of any person, up to the age of thirty years, and tell by the presence or absence of certain essential bacteria whether or not the person was nursed as a child.

Damage from artificial formulas may be immediate as well as delayed. Because cow's milk contains three times as much salt as human milk, it presents an abnormal amount of sodium to the infant's kidneys. Sodium damage is frequently responsible for brain damage and later intellectual retardation. High blood pressure, widely believed to be caused by high salt intake in infancy, is another suspected ill effect.


It is important to realize, too, that breast feeding is much more than a means of supplying nourishment. It is a form of mothering which brings lifelong happiness and security to the child and helps the child reach his or her genetic potential.



Independent Bankers Organize To Battle Multi-Banking Plan

"We are independents and we're prepared to fight to stay that way," was the message surfacing from a meeting of a group of independent bankers in Frankfort August 17.

The group, composed of independent bankers from all regions of the state, had gathered in the state capital to file the articles of incorporation of the Independent Community Bankers Association of Kentucky, a new trade association formed to combat efforts by the state's largest banks to push for multi-bank holding company legislation in the legislature.

Said Charlie Bennett, president of The Farmers State Bank, Hardinsburg, and president of the newly formed group. "We want Governor Brown and the state legislature to know that bringing up the multibank bill in connection with other much needed legislation would be a serious mistake due to the intense controversy surrounding the multibank holding company bill." Protesting that the Kentucky Bankers Association may have sold out to the big banks on this issue, the ICBAK group claims to represent the views of the majority of the bankers in the state in opposing the bill and said, "We're going to fight the pill tooth and nail.'

Moves by the KBA in recent weeks have angered the independent bankers in the state. Said Bennett, "By voting to support merger with the Progressive Bankers Association including the assumption of the debt of the multibank proponents, it now appears that the KBA will no longer carry our message to the state legislature...unity is not worth sacrificing our goals and philosophy on the merits f independent banking to a minority of big bank supporters.

Vowing to take their message to the people of Kentucky, the ICBAK members pledged to "defeat the

Good News Report

His name is Powell Hollings, and he looks as distinguished as his name sounds—over six feet, blue-eyed, white-haired, 81 and on the go. He's just completed work on a mural for the Nassau County Medical Center in Long Island. It's a circus scene in the children's ward. Not that he spends all his time with brush in hand, but he does spend a great deal of time with young people.

That special relationship was begun about six years ago when he agreed to do some radio and TV commercials encouraging retirees to get into volunteer work. Suiting his own actions to the word, he checked in at the Nassau County Department of Senior Citizen Affairs. Since then he's been a member of RSVP, ACTION's Retired Senior Volunteer Program, serving as a tutor and a teacher's aide at Westbury Powell Lane Elementary School.


He started with slow learners in the fifth grade as a-math and reading instructor on a one day per week schedule. He came well-equipped for the challenge, not only because of his own careers in aviation, advertising, accounting, theater and films, but also because Powell Hollings is an understanding and patient man who has never forgotten what it's like to be very young and very unsure. Immediately he saw the magnitude of the scholastic problem and expanded his availablility, spending three days a week with children in grades three through six. The teachers at Powell Lane cannot praise him enough.

Hollings gets through to those ten times younger than himself because he understands what motivates the very young who are up against difficulties; he can reach across the years and turn them on because he knows how to convert what appears to be a barrier into a pathway. "I give them encouragement," he says. "Once they start to see they can do it, they light up. They come to me not knowing their ten math tables. I tell them they'll know nine of them in ten minutes. They don't believe it, and when they see it's possible—well, it makes my day."

It makes the teacher's day, too. Powell Hollings' students are mostly minorities—Black, Vietnamese and Cambodian. "There was one girl from the South, old enough to be in the fifth grade but with a serious reading problem," he relates. "We went to work, and by the end of the school year, she was doing just fine. It made quite a change in her outlook."

As for how his students look upon Powell Hollings, most of them call him Grandpa. He laughs, "That's great, particularly at the supermarket when they start hailing me."

Well, school is out for the summer now. But not for Grandpa Hollings. On Mondays he works with a group at the beach pool helping to teach physically handicapped children of all ages to enjoy the therapy of swimming. On Tuesday, he's a mural painter, and Wednesday through Friday he is involved with gifted high school graduates, introducing them to technological opportunities in area industries. On the weekends, you may find him in the garden, or with palette in hand, or maybe you won't find him at all because he's off somewhere helping someone to make the grade. Powell Hollings has won numerous awards for his volunteer efforts, but he's just doing what comes naturally to him and enjoying every minute.



Mine Permits Issued

The division of permits in the state Department of Surface Mining Reclamation and Enforcement issued 851 mining permits during the month of July.

The number and types of permits issued included 632 original permits, 77 revision permits and 142 continuation permits. Continuation permits may be amendments, renewals, repermits or succession permits.

Of the total number of permits issued, 559 were for surface-mining operations, 248 were for undergroundmining operations, 9 for haul-road construction and 35 for preparation plants and refuse areas.

Permitting activities in July authorized the disturbance of 37,721.2 new acres of land and resulted in the collection of \$1,899,845 in fees.

Mine No. 1, Chapperal Coal, Delta Energy (two permits), Dixie Coal, GRM Inc., Jones Branch Coal, L.T. Ruth, Layne Processing, Levisa Energies, Ligon Preparation Co., Mitch Coal, Northern Elkhorn Coal (two permits), Premium Elkhorn (two permits), Somerset Coal, Sun Coal, T and T Ivel Associates, T and H Coal, Triple Elkhorn (two permits), Wheelwright Mining (two permits), for underground mines.

Even though prices are rising, a wise shopper can get the most from the money she does spend, if she abides by one simple rule when purchasing cosmetics.

By simply reading the ingredient labels on cosmetics and beauty aids, you can learn to buy the products that do you the most good, and avoid excess spending on those items that will end up in the bottom of your dresser drawer, unused.

The first thing you should know is that all ingredients are listed in descending order. The item listed first is present in a larger amount than those listed second, and so on down the line, to the final ingredients which are usually found in trace amounts.

How can this information help you? If, for example, you purchase a foundation that is too oily for your skin, you can avoid making the same mistake again. Upon examining the ingredient label of the foundation you already have, you will probably notice that oil, (and most probably mineral oil) is among the first three or four ingredients listed. That means you have an oil based foundation.

To keep from wasting money on another product with the same basic formula under a different brand name, pay attention to the ingredient label of the new products. If the first 3 or 4 ingredients are the same, or if oil is among the top ones listed, then you can be sure that this product will also be too oily for your complexion.

Shop instead for one that contains water as its main ingredient and keeps its oil content to a minimum by having that ingredient in the middle, or near the end of the label listing. The point is, do not duplicate the product you already have sitting in a drawer simply because the bottle or brand name makes it appear different. "Get the most out of your cosmetic dollar"





Is there life after disco? -Dancemeister Gino Soccio nudged over into 'electropop" for his new LP, "Face to Face," and it just won the People's Choice Award in Quebec. Soccio is a hometown boy there.

Forget the earplugs, get an umbrella! -Manowar who play through 10 stacks of amps and claim to be the "loudest, fastest, heaviest" band ever, brought the house down in Chicago. Literally. Playing at a club there, they set up so much vibration that plaster fell from the ceiling like snow

And the years pass - This week, Buddy Holly would have been 46 years old, Otis Redding would have been 41.

Steve Winwood -"Talking Back to the Night" (Island) - Since he was 16 years old, Winwood has been a potent force in rock 'n' roll From Spencer Davis to Traffic to Blind Faith, he molded the maturation of the British Inva-sion. His solo last year, "Arc of a Diver," was a consummate work of artistic integrity. Surprisingly, it was also a com-mercial success. "Talking Back to the Night" has all the elements of "Diver" — in fact, it sounds enough like it to be a sequel - and it disappoints for that very reason In this one-man show, Win-

wood played all the instruments, co-wrote the songs, engineered and produced the album himself. There is no fault to find with the professionalism or competence; the problem is that the artist has looked no deeper into himself, nor searched farther afield, than he did last time. You know what the man said about those not busy being born.

Australian Crawl - "Sons of Beaches" (EMI) - How can anyone resist punmakers like this? The popsters from Down Under are reminiscent of the Plimsouls, Bram Tchaikovsky and that ilk; accessible, melodic tunes produced by Mike Chapman (Blondie, the Knack) with an ear to the car radio speaker. It's terribly derivative and obvious and all good fun performed well.

"Battle Manowar Hymns" (Liberty) - Having mentioned this band already because of the things they do it's only fair to warn you that the music they play is totally unlistenable for anyone but the most dedicated metallurgist. It'll make your eardrums bleed. C 1982 Compulog



Q. I'm a cancer patient taking chemotherapy. My doctor explained the possible side effects before I began treatment, and I'm doing OK. What I want to know is WHY have I lost my hair, had a sore mouth, etc.?

A. In order to understand how chemotherapy works and why it causes side effects, it is necessary first to learn about the cells of the body and their growth.

The body is composed of various different kinds of cells, each designed to perform a particular function. Similar types of cells form tissues (muscle, bone) or organs (heart, lungs). Cells divide to reproduce themselves as necessary. Once the division is complete, the cells receive a signal to stop. Cancer occurs when cells overproduce themselves. They may spread to neighboring or far distant areas of the body. Chemotherapy is used to stop the further spread of the disease. Chemicals destroy cancerous cells by interferring with their growth or by preventing them from reproducing.

The drugs that kill cancer cells are also capable of harming normal cells, particularly those which are fastgrowing or not fully developed. The mouth, stomach, hair roots, and bone marrow all have fast-growing cells. Thus, they are frequently the focus of side effects. As you have learned, most side effects such as nausea and vomiting last only a few hours or a few days. Hair loss, of course, is more of a long-term problem and may not disappear until the chemotherapy treatments are completed. To allow normal tissues to repair themselves, chemotherapy drugs often are given in cycles such as one week on and five weeks off. Despite the drugfree intervals, the chemicals are able to work against the cancer because normal cells repair themselves much faster than the cancerous ones. Chemotherapy side effects have no bearing on what is happening to the tumor. Neither experiencing side effects nor having none at all seems to have any relationship to the effectiveness of the drug. It all seems to depend on the patient's tolerance for the drugs. With Motor Running, Leave Window Open

Anytime the motor of a parked car is running, a window should be left partially open to guard against carbon monoxide leaks, the Kentucky State Police advised today.

Ventilation is needed whether the motor is powering a heater in winter or an air conditioner in summer.

State police at Bowling Green Post 3 have reported that carbon monoxide poisoning caused the deaths of two young people in late July. The bodies of the young man and woman were found on July 19 in a parked car near Bowling Green. They apparently had been running the motor to power the air conditioning unit and were overcome by fumes from a leaky exhaust system.

From Highlands to Highlands

The traditional beliefs, legends, customs, etc., of the Appalachian people has been a topic of much interest to Barbara McDermitt, of Edinburgh, Scotland, who is currently working on her Ph.D. degree in folklore at the School of Scottish Studies, Edinburgh University

She has been in Pikeville since July 4 doing a comparative study of Scottish and Appalachian folklore

"Dr. Leonard Roberts, director of the Appalachian Studies Center at Pikeville College, is my acting supervisor for the Appalachian half of my study," she said recently. "I am concentrating on collecting tales and legends. In Scotland, for the last three years I have been collecting the oral traditions of Scottish travelers.

"Travelers (tinkers, as they used to be called) are like gypsies in that they don't live among the settled community if they can help it, but rather travel from one caravan site to another working at odd jobs as they go. They have a termendous oral tradition of songs and stories and superstitutions.

"For my dissertation I have been concentrating on recording an Aberdeenshire traveling family. For my Appalachian counterpart I have been taping the Hicks (clan) of North Carolina. My study will compare the cultures of these two peoples and their oral traditions with especial emphasis on their stories."

Mrs. McDermitt says her association with Dr. Roberts began two years ago. "I already owned several of his books that had been very valuable to my study of folklore, but I needed more precise help from Dr. Roberts regarding a paper I was preparing for an international conference on a comparison of Scottish and Appalachian jack tales. At the time, Dr. Roberts sent me this marvelous book," Old Greasybeard: Tales from the Cumberland Gap." I already owned his well-known collection, 'South from Hell-Fer-Sartin,' and two of his other books. It was largely due to Dr. Roberts that I settled on the dissertation topic that finally was accepted by my advisory committee.

"From the early days of our correspondence I began to plan, with Dr. Roberts' help, my eventual trip to Kentucky and North Carolina. I am also indebted to Dr. Loyal Jones of Berea College who, through the college's Appalachian Center, secured a summer research grant to help cover my expenses.

Previous to starting on courses for her Ph.d., McDermitt taught 10 years in the School of Speech at Northwestern University in Illinois. It was there that she received a master's degree in Theater Arts.

'In Scotland, I have a 12-year-old daughter, Heather, who unlike me, speaks with a very Scottish accent. I do besides collecting tales, a fair

amount of professional storytelling at folk festivals and in local schools.'

McDermitt has traveled "many a mountain" in her efforts to record the oral traditions of the mountain folks. "I am recording Ray Hicks of Beach Mountain, his cousin, Stanley, who lives on another mountain, his sister, Hattie Presnell, on still another mountain, and Ray's nephew, Frank Proffitt, Jr. They are all very interesting people.

"Ray is a marvelous storyteller, harmonica player and singer. Stanley also sings, plays the dulcimer and tells stories, too, but perhaps he is best known nationally and internationally as a dulcimer maker. His sister, Hattie, sings and tells stories. Frank, the youngest of the group, picks a mean banjo as well as a dulcimer and sings the old traditional songs he learned from his father."

Mrs. McDermitt says she has been overwhelmed by the mountains in Appalachia because, she says, "in Scotland, the mountains are treeless. The richness of the green here is also so much more prevalent than in Scotland. The mountains are beautiful, but is exhausting for travel from one place to another," she added with a laugh.

McDermitt will be in the Appalachian area until the end of August when she will return to Scotland. Then she will have the job of transcribing all the tapes she has made this summer as well as continuing to tape her informants in Aberdeenshire. "Hopefully, I will be able to return to Appalachia next summer to begin writing the Appalachian half of the dissertation.'

"I certainly have found a great deal of kindness everywhere I go," she adds. "People are always willing to help. I also find that the mountain tradition bearers are very similar to their Scottish counterparts, the traveling people. Both these peoples are proud and strong and independent and deeply spiritual. They have a great deal of good old common sense and aren't afraid of plain talking. They are very hospitable and kindly towards strangers, contrary to the belief that they are very aloof.'

apart. The six found in Kentucky are the shagbark, the bitternut, the pignut, the big shellbark, the mockernut and the red hickory-Dr. Care lists the shagbark as the most important of all.

Hickories are members of the Walnut Family, and like the walnuts, they are noted for their strong-scented leaves. All the members of their family also have compound leaves

To me, the old shagbark hickory is the Abe Lincoln of the woods. It has an untidy look as its sheds its outer bark in long, thin strips, which cling to the trunk and give the tree a shaggy look. Yet, like Lincoln, the shagbark stands tall and strong against the storms of winter. It grows on the higher slopes of our hills and often attains a height of 100 feet. Its wood is tough and strong and is used to make tool handles.

Oldtimers used hickory bark and corn cobs to smoke their ham meat. This gave the hams a flavor that was simply delicious and made red gravy so good with hot biscuits.

The leaves of shagbark are compound, with five leaflets, the three larger ones at the end of the leaf. The bark and leaves of hickories have valuable medical properties. A tea made of the leaves and inner bark is a good remedy for colitis. This tea also cures diarrhea. An ointment made from hickory bark soon heals old sores and ulcers. The tea is also valuable to purify the blood and clean up the system. A tea made from the inner bark is also a good remedy for constipation. The word, "hickory," is an old Indian name. The Indians made a stimulating drink from the fermented nuts, which they called "hiccora"; hence, the name, "hickory."

"LUCY IN DISGUISE" The oldest, most complete human skeleton was found in Ethiopia eight years ago. Kentucky Afield

Early season dove hunting success often depends more on finding good concentrations of doves than on actual dove populations. There are almost always plenty of birds around when the season opens, but finding fields of cut silage or harvested grains where doves are concentrating is sometimes a problem.

Unfortunately, there are a few individuals who try to solve this problem by an illegal process known as "baiting." And in doing so, they can



cause otherwise honest hunters to unwittingly break the law.

A "baited" field, according to state and federal laws, is one where corn, wheat, salt or any other substance has been placed to attract or entice doves. The key word here is "placed," since it is legal to hunt over grains which are on the field as the result of a valid agricultural operation or as the result of growing and manipulating crops specificially for wildlife management. But bringing an attractant into a field does constitute baiting, even if the substance is a grain that was grown on that field. In other words, you can't shoot over a field where corn, for example, has been grown, harvested, stored and then brought back to the field.

Even after the bait is removed, the law still considers the field baited for 10 days. So it's possible for a hunter to inspect a field, find nothing out of the ordinary and still be in violation of the law.

The hunter who wants to make sure he is hunting legally can take several steps to detect possible baiting, according to Steve Yontz, director of law enforcement for the Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources.

The first step is to look for suspiciously heavy concentrations of wheat or other cover crop grains, Yontz says. These crops are usually sown at a rate of between 12 and 16 grains per square foot, so anything heavier than this is suspect because it is probably not a "valid agricultural operation."

There is also no valid reason for grains to be in piles. So if you encounter heaps of grain in the field, don't hunt there. Any kind of cracked or shelled corn is also a good sign of illegal baiting, since there's no reason for a farmer to be planting corn in September.

(However, it is legal to hunt over a harvested corn field, since the leftover corn is the result of a valid farming practice.)

The best way to determine the status of a field where you're going to hunt, Yontz says, is to ask the person who owns or works the land what, if anything, he has done to attract doves. If the procedures he describes seem questionable, look for another place to hunt.

Even if you are invited to a dove shoot, it's a good idea to inquire about baiting, even though it would be a poor host, Yontz points out, who would subject his guests to arrest by baiting a field.

"But it would be an even poorer host," Yontz concludes, "who would evade a direct question about baiting." **The Floyd County Times**

Power Cheaper Here, Is Finding Of Study


Kentuckians who receive electricity from the state's privately-owned utilities can take heart. They are paying much less for that particular product than most of their counterparts in the rest of the country

Out of 210 electric utilities nationwide, with number 210 having the cheapest rates, Kentucky's four privately-owned companies were ranked 164 (Kentucky Utilities), 170 (Union Light, Heat and Power), 175 (Louisville Gas and Electric), and 194 (Kentucky Power).

The rankings were revealed in a study of winter 1981-82 residential bills compiled by the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners. The NARUC is a national organization for state utility commissions including Kentucky's Public Service Commission

"Certainly electricity rates have gone up quite a bit in recent years and no one likes to see that," said state Public Protection and Regulation Secretary Tracy Farmer. "However, I believe this study shows that the PSC, the utilities and our abundance of coal have helped make us the envy of most of the nation." The PSC, which regulates all but municipally-owned

Number 210, the utility with the lowest rates, was the Washington Water Power Co. of Idaho, Washington Power's customers were charged \$10 for 500 kilowatt-hours of electricity in February. During the same month, customers of the Nantucket Electric Co. of Massachusetts were charged \$62.82 for 500 KWH. Nantucket Electric was ranked number one. The midrange, number 105, was set by the Alabama Power Co. That utility's customers were charged \$33.97 for 500 KWH in February.

The residential customers of the Kentucky companies were charged \$27.95 (KU), \$27.76 (ULH&P), \$27.86 (LG&E), and \$23.05 (Ky. Power) for 500 KWH in February. While ULH&P was cheaper than LG&E in February, its rates were slightly higher for the three-month period of December, January and February.

The study was of residential areas only and did not include municipallyowned systems or rural electric cooperatives.

September means different things to different people. Many people who work look forward to Labor Day weekend as one last chance to go home to visit family and friends. To the elderly, it means the end of summer and the fact that they will soon be faced with extremely high heating bills. To young mothers with school age children it means the beginning of school. I don't know how some of them are able to cope with the endless task of taking their children to school, picking them up, then going back for extra curricular activities and still keep a clean house and put meals on the table. It requires unlimited patience and endurance.

I still recall the day I sent my oldest daughter, Carol, off to school for the first time. I was so concerned for her safety. She seemed so little to be leaving home to be gone all day. We didn't have kindergarten then where I live. Later on it became easier with the older children to look after the younger ones.

I remember my own first grade teacher, Miss Austin. She never married and devoted her life to teaching first grade. I wish everyone could have had a first grade teacher like her. In my mind's eye, I can see her standing at the blackboard with her pointer in hand. Although her back was to the class, if anyone misbehaved, she could turn around and immediately spot the culprit. We were sure she had eyes in the back of her head.

Miss Austin taught us to read by the phonics system. She used flash cards which helped enormously. Very few of her students ever failed of promotion. She made the children want to read. A teacher-friend told me several years ago that the teachers were discussing why my children could read so well at an early age. They decided it was because I made them read. I told her it was because I made them want to ead. I read poetry and classics from he time that they could understand. I ead poems mostly from "The Best oved Poems of the American eople". It is a wonderful book. My children have copies for their own hildren. My children loved the poems that told a story such as "The Charge of the Light Brigade," "My Kentucky Belle" and "Oh, Captain, My Captain". I believe that "My Kentucky Belle" was their favorite. My third oldest daughter could quote even the longest poems by heart. She heard them more often than the other girls. The children would sit and listen by the hour and beg me to read longer.

My children never went to school without breakfast as children do now. I SIFT then measure into sifter: 4 cups flour

ADD: 1 tsp. salt Sift dry ingredients into butter-egg mixture alternately with milk-yeast mixture. Beat vigorously by hand. Place in large buttered bowl. Brush top with melted butter. Cover with a cloth and place in warm place. Let rise about 2 hours. During this time, the dough should be practically doubled in bulk. Punch down. Beat vigorously again. Pour into a well-buttered 91/2-inch tube pan. This dough is thinner than regular bread dough. It is more like a thick cake batter. Brush top again with melted butter and set in warm place to rise again. Allow to rise until dough comes just short of top of pan. Bake in 350° oven for approximately 1 hour. Slip out of tube pan, slice and serve.

Note: If any is left over, it is delicious toasted.

September is the beginning of changing from a summer menu to more complete meals. I have changed a lot in what I like. I used to prepare beef as simply as possible. I now like it better with sauces and dressings, etc. This recipe for Sweet and Sour Beef is from Gail Henkel, of Louisville, Kentucky. If you have never tried beef with this type of recipe, try it and let me know how you like it.

Sweet and Sour Beef

BROWN 1 lb. stew meat chunks in bacon drippings. Add enough water to simmer. Cover and simmer approximately 1 hour or until tender. DRAIN: 1 (No. 21/2) can pineapple chunks Reserve syrup. COMBINE: 1/4 cup brown sugar 2 tbsps. cornstarch ADD: 1 tbsp. soy sauce Reserved pineapple juice 1/2 tsp. salt 1/4 cup vinegar Cook over low heat, stirring constantly, until thickened. Pour over meat. Simmer slowly until ready to serve. Just before serving, ADD: ³/₄ cup green pepper strips

- 1/4 cup sliced onion
- Pineapple chunks
- Serve over rice or noodles. Serves 6.

OPEN LETTER TO THE CONCERNED CITIZENS OF CLIFF & FLOYD COUNTY

Re: County Participation of Cliff Road Project

Dear Mr. McCauley:

In light of your recent comments about the County's failure to participate in the construction of the Cliff Road Project, my office conducted a review of the past history of the project and have concluded that the quotations attributed to you in the Floyd County Times were misleading, if not false. The following facts I will recite are a matter of record, or are otherwise undisputed.

In October of 1977 the Floyd Fiscal Court under then Judge Henry Stumbo, and upon motion of Bill Wells, then Magistrate for District No. 1, passed a Resolution authorizing the County Judge Executive to join in agreement with the Department of Transportation and the City of Prestonsburg and Prestonsburg Housing Authority for construction of a road to the planned Cliff Housing site. At that time no funds were set aside by the County to pay for that right-of-way, apparently upon the representation when the time came to buy right-of-way the County would be granted money through some Federal Agency. This agreement was formalized on July 14, 1978 by then County Judge Yvonne Jones. However, the County records clearly reflect that no money was available when that agreement was signed.

In September of 1978 the Fiscal Court, under then County Judge Yvonne Jones recognized the obvious predicament of having signed an agreement to acquire right-of-way solely without money on the future hope of securing Federal funds. The then County Judge Executive, the County Attorney and various members of the Fiscal Court met with the then Secretary of Transportation Grayson and sought permission to withdraw. Due to the assurances from all parties, including your agency, that when the time came for Floyd County to make any financial expenditures Federal funds would be available.

Finally, under the Bill Wells Administration the Floyd Fiscal Court again recognized that it had absolutely no funds to pay any judgment that may be rendered against Floyd County in favor of property owners in the Cliff area. Thereupon, then Floyd County, on June 10, 1981 formally passed a Resolution withdrawing the County from the lawsuit. Thus, the County records clearly reflect that the Bill Wells Administration was the first to recognize and act on the obvious, THAT FLOYD COUNTY WAS PARTICIPATING IN A LAWSUIT TO PURCHASE LAND FOR WHICH THEY HAD NO MONEY TO BUY. After much agreement and countermaneuvering the Fiscal Court, under Bill Wells, withdrew it's earlier Resolution and re-entered the lawsuit. This was June 18, 1981 and said Resolution clearly stated on it's face the earlier Resolution was withdrawn to give "the City additional time to bring proof that the County will not be responsible for any suit filed". When I took office on January 1, 1982 I was immediately confronted with the Cliff Road problem as had been my predecessors. The issue facing me was identical, specifically that the County was involved in a lawsuit to buy land for which it had no money to pay. I understood at that time that the City had verbally commited itself to Bill Wells to pay for the entire road and expected no funds from the County Government. However, recognizing the uncertainty of verbal agreements, it was insisted that the City of Prestonsburg put their guarantee in writing. This insistence was not an effort to "kill" the project but simply to make sure that everyone understood their obligations and fulfill them. As a result of our insistence, on February 25, 1982 the Mayor of Prestonsburg, Harold Cooley, gave me in writing a complete assurance and promise that the City of Prestonsburg would pay for any judgment rendered against the Floyd Fiscal Court by their participation in the lawsuit. A copy of that letter is attached hereto.

To summarize the foregoing let me state that my office inherited a situation whereby in 1977 the County promised in writing to participate in a project for which they had no funds. The danger of that situation was first recognized by Yvonne Jones who attempted to withdraw the County from the Cliff Road Project. Later, the then County Judge Bill Wells, did, in fact, withdraw the County from the lawsuit and then re-instated the County in the suit after verbal assurance from the City of Prestonsburg that they would, in fact, pay for any judgment. My office simply followed through and insisted that these assurances from the City of Prestonsburg that had been given almost a year before be put in writing. The present difficulty in the Cliff Road Project is not the result of any failure of the County but simply the failure of the City of Prestonsburg to do as they specifically promised in writing on February 25, 1982, that is "that the City of Prestonsburg will idemnify the Floyd Fiscal Court against any judgments rendered hereafter" in the Cliff Road matter. The present Fiscal Court never created the Cliff Road Project nor have we failed to perform any promised obligations. This \$30,000 deficiency that has been discussed is the City's deficiency and if the Cliff Road Project fails it will fail because the City has not done what it promised.

Social Security Help Possible Thru Schools

Schools may be able to help students obtain Social Security numbers without the need for the students to visit a Social Security office, Jim Kelly, Social Security district director for the Big Sandy area, said recently.

Social Security numbers can now be issued in about two weeks after a person provides the required application and evidence.

"Even so," said Kelly, "many students wait until they find a job before applying for a Social Security number and sometimes they want us to provide a number the same day. Schools can help students avoid this situation."

Under a voluntary plan suggested by the Social Security Administration, schools may arrange for students in the seventh grade or higher to complete applications for Social Security Administration, schools may arrange for students in the seventh grade or higher to complete applications for Social Security numbers at the school. The school can assist in establishing the student's identity. Evidence of identity, together with proof of age and of U.S. citizenship or legal immigrant status, is required before a Social Security number may be issued.

The question of identity is particularly important for students in the seventh through the ninth grades, since many have not yet acquired drivers' licenses or voters' registration cards or similar documentation. A birth or baptismal record cannot be accepted as proof oa a person's identity, but certification by the school can help the student meet this requirement.

Teachers and school administrators who would like more information about how they can help their students obtain Social Security numbers should contact the Big Sandy area Social Security office, located on U. S. 23 between Prestonsburg and Paintsville. One last note is the County intends to continue to participate in the Cliff Road Project lawsuit. The current legal relationship is that we will participate in the Cliff Road lawsuit to a conclusion and any judgment rendered we will expect the City of Prestonsburg to pay as they committed themselves to do on February 25, 1982. Therefore, any question of funds are theirs to answer, not mine. I hope this information places public attention where it belongs and will help you assess the current situation.

Oil Industry Eyes Deep Exploration (From The Salyersville Independent) Oil and gas industry executives will be looking closely toward Magoffin county in the next several weeks to discover if a deep drilling venture by Samar Oil and Gas Company adds sup-

port to the feasibility of deep oil drilling in eastern Kentucky. Samar's project comes in the wake of a successful test well in the same area recently undertaken by Ashland Oil in conjunction with Columbia Gas

and Spartan Oil. Samar's Sam Davidson says his company hopes to start drilling within the week in the Jellico area of Magoffin county, just a short distance from Ashland's test well. They plan to drill to a depth of 4000 feet in hopes of realizing production from the Black River and Upper Beekman Town geological formations.

"We're looking at two weeks' from the time of starting to the time of production," stated Davidson in reference to the timetable for the project. "There's a pretty good chance we'll get similar production (to Ashland's well)."

As hland's well was drilled to a depth of 5,200 feet. However, production is coming from about 3,800 feet. Last week, company officials said that the well was producing 225 barrels of high grade oil a day, plus 400,000 cubic feet of gas. Most of the wells currently operating in the county are shallow (1,100 to 1,200 feet) and produce less than 10 barrels of oil per day.

Davidson is optimistic that their initial deep well will produce in similarly large quantities—and this could mean significant changes in the local oil industry if the deep reserve does prove out. While there is a flurry of leasing activity already in the area, most drillers are reluctant to risk the investment a deep well entails until there is more certainty as to the quantity of the reserve.

"If we get good production, you'll see a lot of activity there immediately," said Davidson. "There's a lot of leasing going on already."

Samar's risk in this venture approaches the \$750,000 mark, primarily invested in a new R-75 Reedmill drilling rig recently purchased from the Midco Kentucky Company. The rig is specifically designed for drilling to depths of 3,000 to 4,000 feet.

Samar is owned and operated by Sam and Marilyn Davidson, and has previously drilled about 25 wells in the county. They plan to drill several deep wells in the Jellico area.

GREEN: Black bass fair early and late and at night with plastic worms and buzzbaits; white bass fair trolling deep runners; crappie fair 10-12 feet deep in submerged cover; murky to muddy, falling, 4½ feet above summer pool, 79.

DALE HOLLOW: Black bass fair early and late and at night with plastic worms and jig-and-rind combinations off deep banks; bluegill fair; clear, falling, two feet above summer pool, murky, stable, at summer pool, 79.



She uses a porcelain-like white clay which is high fired, in a propane fired kiln, to 2300°F, making her pottery ovenproof, dishwasher safe and lead-free.

Job Corps Students Active In Varied Area Vocations

Prestonsburg Job Corps students are finding their way into the business and professional life of the area.

Bill Marshall, Burna, Ky. student at the Job Corps Center, has been participating in a radio training program at WQHY/WDOC, Prestonsburg. He has been involved in the program for 12 weeks and upon completion will operate the Job Corps Center's own radio station WCDP (Job Corps' first and only radio station) until he graduates.

According to WQHY/WDOC oficials, Marshall has "temendous aptitude and motivation," in the radio communications field and has made rapid progress. He is the third student trained at the radio Previous trainees have been Kelvin Booker and Ted Dunaway. "The station and its management have been so helpful and cooperative," said Tom Hummer, Job Corps Center director, "and we are most appreciative." The second Job Corps Hospital Orderly Training Program will be completed September 13. The training at the Paintsville Hospital is an intensive 10-week schedule of activities in which the corpsmen receive training in each department. Hosptial officials

report that the young men are making rapid progress and can be ready soon to help meet the shortage of male orderlies in area hospitals.

Those corpsmen in the program are Jeff Arnett, Corbin; Angelo Hicks, Garrett; Frank Sparks, Johnson City, Tenn.; Gary Harrod, Glasgow; Bobby Rice, Cave City, and Charles Stovall, Louisville.

Mined Land Conversion To Agriculture in Plan

Standing on a surface-mined, reclaimed Martin county mountaintop, officials of Martiki Mining Corp. and Morehead State University last Friday announced a joint research and demonstration project to determine the feasibility of using such land for agricultural production.

"We are joining hands here with the University and its outstanding agriculture faculty to develop a model farming operation which, hopefully, will allow thousands of acres of surface-mined land in Eastern Kentucky to be used profitably in the future for agricultural purposes," said Michael H. Vallez, vice presient for East Kentucky operations of MAPCO, Inc., parent firm of Martiki.

MSU President Morris L. Norfleet described the proposed Martiki-Morehead State Mountaintop Agricultural Complex as "a great opportunity for the University to cooperate with the mining industry to help this region's reclaimed land become the agricultural frontier of Kentucky. From an academic perspective, this joint venture will provide our students and faculty members with an ideal laboratory for applied research into the adaptability of various agricultural enterprises to reclaimed land."

Vallez announced that Martiki will spend about \$250,000 this year for construction and operation of the first phase, with MSU planning and managing the entire project under a 15-year lease arrangement.

The 250-acre site is off Wolf Creek in Martin county, about nine miles southeast of Inez.

Plans call for the eventual development of swine, poultry and beef cattle facilities and for cultivation of row crops, orchard crops, greenhouse flowers and vegetables and forests for commercial wood products and wildlife habitat.

In addition to agriculture, the project also will involve MSU's students and faculty members in mining, reclamation and energy studies, according to Dr. Charles M. Derrickson, dean of the

School of Applied Sciences and Technology.

U.S. Rep. Carl D. Perkins and State Natural Resources Secretary Jackie Swigart were among the more than 80 dignitaries attending the announcement ceremony at the mountaintop site.
