Abbott Residents Fear • Approach To New Bridge

It's bad now, but when school buses start traveling the intersection of KY 1427 and KY 1428 near the Cliff bridge, residents fear tragedy may strike.

The cause of concern is a large mound of rock left at the intersection after recent work done there in preparation for the opening of the new Cliff bridge. Critics say the mound obscures the view of drivers entering the intersection from both roads. Residents of that section want it removed.

They have enlisted the help of House Majority Leader Greg Stumbo, who attended a meeting of the group last Friday, and who says he agrees the situation is bad.

"Someone dropped the ball," said Stumbo, referring to engineers who designed the project. He added that final design plans were approved by state Highway Dept. head Bob Capito in Frankfort.

Chief District Engineer Kirby Ison, Jr., of the department's Pikeville office, agreed that the site is undesirable at present. However, he said things will improve when the new Cliff bridge is completed. Drivers entering 1428 from 1427 will be able to see 15 to 20 additional feet, he said.

Ison added that the obstruction was left in place because design plans submitted by Palmer Engineering of Winchester called for it to be left there. He said the design was made with the new span in mind. "It probably meets minimum standards," he said, "but with a little more thought it could have been better."

It will be between four and five months before the new bridge is open, said Ison. In the meantime, Floyd School Transportation Director Ed Patton says it will be necessary to have someone directing traffic between 7 a.m. and 8 a.m. to insure the safety of the three school buses which will use that intersection.

Patton, who agrees that the new bridge will solve the problem, said after an on-site inspection Tuesday that he had spoken with Denton Billiter of the state highway department, who told him it was the responsibility of the contractor, Bush and Burchett, Inc., of Allen, to supply someone to direct traffic.

In response to complaints from residents there, state workers were at the scene yesterday (Tuesday) restriping the road and adjusting stop signs in an attempt to keep traffic in proper lanes and to lessen the chance of collission at the 1427/1428 intersection.

But Abbott Creek resident Tom Hereford, Jr., says the only safe solution is the removal of the obstruction. He said the Abbott residents he had talked with—about 90 attended Friday's meeting—felt that re-striping the road and moving the stop sign would not solve the problem.

"It's a mistake, an engineering error, and I really think the highway department knows it's gonna have to come out. I just don't understand this bandaid approach now," he said. "I don't want to see another school bus tragedy in my lifetime."

• Creditor Wins Claim Against P'burg Village

The developer of the Prestonsburg Village shopping center is in default on payments to a Lexington paving company for asphalt and paving materials supplied last year, Special Judge Will T. Scott ruled last Friday in Pikeville.

Mountain Enterprises, Inc. claimed in its motion for a default judgment that the financially-troubled developer had paid only \$293,350 for materials valued at \$404,439. Named as defendants in the suit were Robert M. Greer, Jr., of New York, John W. Waits, of Oldham county, and three firms in which the men have an interest—W&G Prestonsburg Associates, Century Builders, and Commonwealth Development Corporation.

Scott awarded the paving company the outstanding \$111,089 in damages, together with interest that a Mountain Enterprises attorney said could amount to \$15,000. The attorney. Masten Childers II, said Scott's order did not apply to Greer because the New York financier has denied signing three promissory notes issued to secure payment of the Mountain Enterprises bill.

Of the three \$50,000 notes apparently signed by Waits and Greer, only one has been paid. Greer has filed a response in the Floyd Circuit Court suit, denying that he signed the notes or that he authorized anyone to sign them on his behalf. That issue was not addressed by Judge Scott in Friday's hearing.

In another judgment, Scott recently ordered the shopping center sold to pay creditors. That action came in response to a suit filed by Buckingham Kentucky Holdings, Inc., which invested \$13.5 million in the shopping center.

Many other creditors have also filed suit against the developer, most recently Adams Construction Company, which last month asserted a materialman's lien for \$43,596, the value of crushed limestone, mixed concrete and concrete blocks delivered to the shopping center site last year.

Public To Be Heard On Highway Proposal

Residents on the two arms of Beaver Creek will be given an opportunity this month to be heard on a proposal to build a road between Garrett and McDowell.

Kirby Ison, chief district engineer in the Pikeville office of the state Department of Highways, said transportation officials will attend meetings on Wednesday, Aug. 13 at Allen Central High School and on Thursday, Aug. 14 at the Old Regular Baptist Church at Minnie to explain construction plans. Both meetings begin at 7 p.m.

Construction of the five-mile highway, which will extend from KY 80 near Gosling Branch to KY 122 at Minnie, is scheduled to begin in September, 1987. The intervening months will be taken up with plan reviews, purchase of right-of-way, and relocation of utilities.

The highway will be of two lanes, with an additional truck lane on the hills, the engineer said. Construction is expected to take two years and to cost about \$11.5 million.

Bids Are Under The Mark On Prater Water Project It is Prater Creek's second attempt Construction Company, of London,

It is Prater Creek's second attempt to get a public water system—an earlier effort failed about 10 years ago—and it has been four years in the making, but a milestone was passed last Thursday, when bids were opened for the laying of a water line and installation of a storage tank and pumps to serve the entire watershed.

While the awarding of contracts will wait on an engineer's checking the bids, water district officials were confident that contracts will be let shortly and that construction will be under way this fall.

In all, eight firms submitted bids on the water line project, which the water district's engineers estimated would cost \$657,415. The low bid was tendered by Claud Wilburn and Sons, a Greenup county firm, for \$611,156.

For installation of a 100,000-gallon steel storage tank, which engineers estimated would cost \$120,800, Laurel

Mishaps Claim Four Victims Here Recently

Unnatural causes were cited in the deaths of four Floyd countians this week, including three children killed in accidents and an elderly man who died by his own hand.

A crib in disrepair was blamed for the strangulation death last Tuesday of a six-month-old baby, Michael Todd Ferrell, the son of Lackey and Carol Stephens Ferrell, of Prestonsburg, was dead on arrival at Highlands Regional Medical Center, where he was brought after being found unconscious at home.

The baby's head reportedly became lodged between the side and the bottom of the crib, which had become loose because of a missing bolt.

The child was born Jan. 11 this year in Pikeville. Besides his parents, he is survived by a brother, Joshua Seth Ferrell, and a sister, Angela Dawn Ferrell; and grandparents Sam and Martha Ferrell, of Prestonsburg, and Don and Joanne Storey, of Spurlock Creek.

Funeral services were held Friday at the Floyd Funeral Home chapel and burial was in the Ousley cemetery on Spurlock, with the Rev. Bobby Joe Spencer officiating.

Stephen Ray Goble, a 17-year-old Prestonsburg High School student, died last Tuesday after being pulled unconscious from a swimming pool in a western Kentucky motel six days earlier.

Deputy McCracken County Coroner James Craig said the boy was vacationing with his family in the Gingerwood Lodge on Kentucky Lake in adjoining Marshall County on July 23, when he was found on the bottom of the motel pool. He was placed on a respirator at Western Baptist Hospital in Paducah but failed to regain consciousness.

Goble was born Nov. 20, 1968 in Pikeville, son of Angeline Fraley Goble Hart, of Stratton Branch, and the late Laurence Oliver Goble. Besides his mother, he is survived by two brothers, Gary E. Goble and Denny Ray Hart, and a sister, Lisa Ann Goble; his paternal grandfather, Oliver Goble, of Betsy Layne, and maternal grandmother, Lida Fraley, of Prestonsburg.

Funeral services were conducted Friday at Floyd Funeral Home and burial followed in the family cemetery on Stratton Branch, with the Rev. Henry Crider officiating.

Meanwhile, the Public Service Commission has scheduled an August 20 hearing on the rates to be charged Prater Creek water consumers. Water district commissioners have proposed a rate of \$13 for the first 2000 gallons, which would also be the minimum monthly bill, and \$5.50 for each additional thousand gallons. However, the PSC itself has the final say on the rates to be levied.

The Prater Creek project represents a further expansion of the area served by Prestonsburg's newly-upgraded water treatment plant, which will supply water to the new district through a connection at the junction of U.S 23 and KY 1426 at Banner. Financed by \$1.05 million in grant and loan funds from the Farmers Home Administration, it calls for the laying of 6.3 miles of sixinch water line up main Prater Creek and, along its tributaries, nearly 12

miles of four-inch lines.

The storage tank is to be installed at the head of the creek, near the crest of the ridge that divides Prater Creek from Sammy Clark Branch of Little Mud Creek. The project, which has been designed by Lexington engineers Parrott, Ely and Hurt, also calls for two booster pumps to force water to the

system's upper reaches.

Dana contractor Ervin Akers, who is chairman of the water district's three-member commission, said Thursday he expects a last-minute surge of homeowners wanting to take advantage of a subsidized tap-on fee offered to those who sign up before construction begins. "A lot of people wait

Judge Announces Abuses Mean End Of Work Release

Persons sentenced to jail terms and hoping they will be freed to go to work each day can forget it. District Judge Harold Stumbo said last week.

And that will be just fine with him, added County Attorney David Barber, who said that granting work release was an affront to juries which have been increasingly inclined to send offenders—especially repeat drunk drivers—to jail.

The court's tougher attitude on work release follows several incidents in which DUI convicts allegedly abused the privilege.

A bench warrant was issued Thursday for Carl Hall, 29, of Teaberry, who did not return to jail after being released to go to work. He will stay in jail for the remainder of the 30-day term he was given for a third DUI offense, Stumbo said. Lon Slone, of Blue River, returned to jail Thursday after a bench warrant was issued for him. He will serve out his 90-day sentence in jail because police officers found him at a licensed club in Prestonsburg when he was supposed to be on the job in

"There will be no work release for anybody," Stumbo vowed. "I don't have any way to monitor it. I don't know whether they're working or not."

Summer Brings Slight Dip In Floyd Jobless Figures

More than 26,000 Kentuckians found jobs between May and June, which helped push jobless rates down in 83 counties, including Floyd. While the number of counties reporting double-digit unemployment also declined, 63 counties still report jobless rates of 10 percent or above.

According to preliminary figures for June released last week by the state Cabinet for Human Resources, the state unemployment rate stood at 8.9 percent, compared to a national rate of 7.1 at that time. In Floyd county, the figure was 13.0, down from 13.3 in May

(The national jobless rate dropped to 6.9 in June. State and local figures for June have yet to be released).

While the Floyd figure is well above state and national averages, unemployment is less acute here than in any of the other four Big Sandy counties. Pike county reported a 14.4 jobless rate, Johnson 15.7, Martin, 17.2, and Magoffin 19.5. The overall rate for the area was 14.8, down from 15.6 in May.

The monthly sample of those applying for unemployment benefits here shows 59.3 percent worked in mining.

12.6 percent in trade, 8.7 percent in

construction, and 7.4 percent in services

Kentucky's 8.9 percent for June is the lowest state rate since last October, when it was 8.4 percent. June also marked the first time in eight months the state has posted a jobless rate below 9.0 percent. And it was only the third time since 1970 that the state's unemployment rate has decreased bet-

ween May and June.

"Normally the influx of students and recent graduates into the labor market forces the rate up because the supply of workers far exceeds the number of jobs available," said state labor market analyst Ed Blackwell.

"However, this year there were more jobs to go around as 26,200 more Kentuckians were working in June than

Trimble county reported the lowest rate in the state, 3.2 percent, followed by Oldham with 4.2 percent, Carroll and Fayette, both with 4.4 percent, Calloway, 4.6 percent, and Woodford, 4.9 percent.





Annexation Question To Appear On Ballot

It will take the agreement of 75 percent of the registered voters in that precinct, but Auxier Road residents opposed to annexation will get their chance to reject Prestonsburg's takeover bid in the November general election.

A petition containing 269 names purporting to be landowners or residents of that section was filed with Mayor Ann Latta April 8. Latta turned the list over to County Court Clerk Carla Bolton for verification of the signatures. Though Bolton found that only 168 of the signatures were valid-some people had signed more than once and some who signed were neither voters nor landowners there—the total still was above the 50 percent needed to get the question on the ballot.

Had there not been enough signatures, the Auxier Road section would have been taken into the city automatically.

Bolton said the task of checking the signatures was a time-consuming job. In addition to checking voter-registration cards, names had to be checked against records in tax assessor Lovell Hall's office to find legitimate landowners. "If you added it all up, I guess we worked about two weeks," she said, adding that her staff did the majority of the work 'as we could.'

Bolton said the biggest problems will occur election day, when precinct workers will have to make sure everyone voting on the question is eligible to do so. She said she has heard rumors that both sides plan to have challengers at the polls to combat fraud, though no papers had been filed as of

Monday. Challengers have until seven days before the election to file.

Though the ballot is designed to give the opposition a chance to defeat annexation, some Auxier Road residents don't

want either the annexation or the vote. A class action suit filed June 3 by attorney Ralph Stephens on behalf of Dallas Sammons and Frank Branham seeks to have the ordinance which initiated the annexation proceedings declared illegal, thereby doing away with the need for a vote to kill the move.

The suit claims that the ordinance violates state law by not accurately defining the boundary of the territory proposed to be annexed; that the city failed to file an accurate map of the area to be annexed with a metes and bounds description and a copy of the ordinance duly certified in both the office of the county court clerk and of the state attorney general; and that the city failed to provide the county clerk with a map clearly delineating the boundaries of the area affected along with a list of the names and addresses of those property owners and/or registered voters living along the Auxier Road.

City Attorney Larry Brown contends that the city followed state guidelines in initiating annexation procedures. Soon after the suit was filed, Brown said it was his understanding that the city was not required to make the filings in question until after the annexation was accomplished.

The territory in question extends from the city's northern boundary along U.S. 23 to the Auxier Bridge.

Telephone Worker Sues For Damages In Gas Explosion

A cigarette lighter is believed to have sparked the explosion that left a telephone company worker badly burned in May, but the worker claims in a suit filed this week in Floyd Circuit Court that a gas company was negligent in allowing gas to escape from its lines.

The May 7 blast occurred as Paul Wade, of Martin, entered a manhole near the intersection of U.S. 23 and KY 1428 at Allen to inspect South Central Bell phone lines underground. The conduit carrying the wires is in the vicinity of a four-inch gas line which leads from a nearby well. The line is owned by Floyd County Water and Gas System and leased by East Kentucky Utilities.

Both companies are named as defendants in a suit filed on Wade's behalf by Lexington attorney Raymond D. Kirk. The suit alleges they were negligent in not clearly marking their gas line, in failing to test it, and in not providing adequate ventilation. The gas buildup in the telephone company manhole was a result of a "longstanding leak" in the gas line, the plaintiff alleges.

The suit says Wade received burns over 60 percent of his body as a result of the blast, spent 10 weeks as a patient in the University of Kentucky Medical Center, and has already incurred medical expenses amounting to

He is permanently scarred and will be totally disabled for the rest of his life, according to the suit, which seeks unspecified actual and punitive damages

David Allen, president of East Kentucky Utilities, declined to be interviewed for the record. As filed in court, the suit outlines only the plaintiff's version of events.

Seek Approval For Vet Tech Program

Unique in the state of Kentucky, Morehead State University's veterinary technology program will be one of three in the nation if approval of a four-year degree is granted

Recently endorsed by MSU's Board of Regents, the proposal requesting a program change will be submitted to the Kentucky Council on Higher Education. If approved, MSU's bachelor degree in vet tech could be the only such program in the country and will begin in Fall 1987. MSU currently offers a two-year

associate degree in vet tech with enrollment limited to 40 students. The program, accredited by the American Veterinary Medical Association, is the only one of its kind in the state

'We want to graduate students competent of walking in and setting up a new clinic," said Dr. Donald Applegate, coordinator of the vet tech program. "At the present time, vet tech students who want a four-year degree must take classes in other areas to accomplish this.

"We feel there is a definite need for this proposed bachelor degree program," Dr. Applegate continued. "More than 30 percent of our graduates continue their education. There is a need for veterinary hospital management and additional training in anestheology, clinical pathology, radiology and office management which would be available under this two plus two program," Dr. Applegate said.

The lower land prices in eastern Kentucky will increase movement of sheep. cattle, hogs and poultry into this region, according to Dr. Applegate. As the animal population increases so will the need for veterinarians, he said.

Begun in 1974, MSU's vet tech program allows students to receive handson experience from initial enrollment. They are trained in all aspects of veterinary medicine under the supervision of qualified personnel which includes practicing veterinarians and pro-

The 14 graduates of the 1986 vet tech program who took the National Board Examination for Animal Technicians scored siginificantly higher than did the other 65 candidates taking the exam. One MSU graduate, Louisville native JoAnn Jansing, had the top score in the

"This achievement indeed speaks well for the veterinary technology program and Morehead State University," said Diane Popp, executive secretary for the Kentucky Board of Veterinary

MSU has a job placement service for its vet tech graduates and often has three job offers for every student, according to Dr. Applegate. In addition to





Defendants Have Second Thoughts About Juries' Trying DUI Charges

Drunk driving defendants, who have increasingly chosen to take their cases before a jury in an effort to avoid the jail terms that are mandatory and severe for repeat offenders, are apparently having second thoughts.

Three defendants who initially requested jury trials changed their minds-one after the Commonwealth had put on its evidence-and entered guilty pleas this week in Floyd district

The prosecutor had already rested his case when Roger D. Hall, 30, of Allen, changed his plea. He received a probated 30-day sentence and was ordered to pay \$407 in fine and costs. The same penalty was given Millard Ray Conn. 36, of Martin, who also changed his plea after initially requesting a jury trial. Everett Salisbury, 36, of Harold, was given a sevenday sentence, to be served on weekends, and ordered to pay \$557 after he entered a guilty plea rather than face a jury panel as he had originally re-

One repeat offender who did argue his case before a jury was Phillip Dale Moore, 43, of Price. Jurors were unable to reach agreement in the case. however-the prosecutor said the panel voted 5-1 for conviction-and it has been scheduled for retrial on October 7.

Moore, who was being tried for a fifth offense, allegedly refused to submit to a Breathalyser test, but Wheelwright police officers said he failed a field sobriety test when they arrested him on Feb. 1.

Anthony McKinney, 41, of Harold, also refused to take the BA test when he was arrested on Tolers Creek by Trooper Greg Roberts on May 6. McKinney said he declined to take the test because he had not been drinking and added that he failed field sobriety tests because of a nervous condition.

In response to the police officer's testimony that McKinney initially caught his attention because he was



Hooray for the National Football League and our court system. In a recent ruling the courts granted the United States Football League a grand total of three dollars in their challenges of the

The money awarded was a far cry from what USFL people come begging for but maybe they didn't even deserve the three dollars received.

Ever since the USFL began its impossible task of playing football and attracting revenue during the summer, their major accomplishment was lowering the degree of athletic ability, even though it was slightly visible, of the

The lesser league stole such players as quarterbacks Jim Kelly and Doug Flutie along with running great Hearsher Walker but now these people could be out of a USFL job. If the NFL wanted to do the right thing, these people would be digging ditches instead of playing

Several NFL stars left that league for the greener USFL financial pastures, leaving behind the people who gave them their initial football jobs and any chance they had of setting or building on NFL records.

When the USFL began their meager efforts many football fans stood shaking their heads because those fans remembered the Old World football league and their devastation of the Miami Dolphins.

The WFL lured away such players as Paul Warfield and Jim Kick to separate what stands today as one of football's greatest teams.

Warfield returned to the NFL as a Cleveland Brown but was a neer shadow of his former self. Kick, on the other hand, was never really heard from

Warfield and Kick's stories have been retold by the USFL and players such as former Cincinnati Bengals all-pro tightend Dan Ross. Ross was virtually unstopable until he jumped to the USFL and now he can't find a starting job in the NFL

Many have questioned the motives of new league people with not many answers being found. Expansion could be one idea why different football leagues flair up periodically but the NFL

is doing fine without additional clubs. The New Jersey Generals, if expansion becomes a reality, is a fore runner of USFL teams being tossed around, probably because Mr. Trumpt has mega bucks to toss with them.

With the USFL in the folding stages, they couldn't even pay their players last year, one thing returns as a certainty for NFL people. A number one draft choice means they have an opportunity of adding the best college player to their roster instead of deciding who will go to the USFL or who are NFL faithfuls.

The older league was never threatened by its junior but did manage to disrupt football fans' yearly football routines. The networks did air early USFL games and holdover fans who didn't get enough football in the winter did tune in but were rapidly turned off by less than standard play.

Nobody enjoys football in the summer but most devastating to the USFL, nobody enjoys football players who perform lesser than the best.

Sorry guys, you're history. There will be no more stealing draft choices or luring players by flashing your big bucks

because you went broke and we love it. The NFL had only one major challenge which came several years ago

and they settled this while improving themselves but there are no more Jos Naimiths left to lead a league to prominence.

Maybe this situation will send a message to others planning on establishing another league. It won't work fellows, the NFL is too strong for you to make any money

Speaking of strong, the Chicago Bears appear to be back in full force. Chicago defeated Dallas 16-6 Sunday

in England which proves nothing except that the Bears bench and draft choices are stronger than those of the Cowboys

Chicago, however, is a powerful team to say the least and the only question surrounding this club is, can they go 19-0. If it had not been for Miami the Bears would have done this last year but 1986 is another season and everyone knows about Chicago and that they are real.







Reserve Program Helps Wildlife

Farmers wishing to encourage which were eligible. wildlife on their lands should consider putting unneeded acreage into the USDA Conservation Reserve Program (CRP), says Jeff Sole, upland game program coordinator for the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources.

The Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) was established by the farm bill of 1985 as a voluntary program to remove highly erodible cropland from production.

The application period for CRP for 1987 begins August 4 and runs through August 14.

Farmers with eligible lands sign a 10-year contract with the USDA, agreeing to take the land out of annual crop production and put it in perennial grass, wildlife plantings, trees or windbreaks. In return, the USDA provides annual rental payments, based on a bid, in cash or commodities. USDA also covers half the expenses of establishing permanent cover on the land and provides technical help through various agencies.

Thus far, approximately 60,000 acres in Kentucky have been taken out of production, far short of the 105,000 acres

vent soil erosion.

Sole suggests that landowners interested in obtaining technical guidance to improve upland game habitat on the CRP acreage should contact him. He will put the farmer in contact with a district wildlife biologist who will visit the property and make recommendations for wildlife plantings and other beneficial manipulations.

"Become a part of the walls you build" is the slogan of the Breast Center's fundraising drive. For only \$25 your signature will be silkscreened onto a 4x4 ceramic tile and placed on the walls of the Center.

Jeannie Melody, Lisa, Cristy, Joy, Beverly, Denise, Carol, Susan, Paula, and Linda are all women between the ages of 25 and 35. They are women with jobs or families or both. One of those eleven women will develop breast cancer in her lifetime and may die because the disease was not discovered in time.

Five hundred fifty women died in Kentucky from breast cancer in 1986. Breast Cancer caused 40,000 women to die in the United States last year. Until last year breast cancer was the leading cause of cancer deaths among women.

"Many women don't realize that discovering a lump in their breast means more than the possibility of having a breast removed. Breast cancer can kill you," said Carol Blevins, public information officer at Highlands Regional Medical Center. Blevins is one of the women responsible for raising funds for the Breast Cancer Center at HRMC

The breast center was planned to combat the disease of breast cancer and to ease the emotional trauma of the disease by having this facility close to home," added Blevins.

Dr. Timothy Johnson of the Harvard University Medical Center recommends regular mammograms (x-rays of the breast) together with monthly BSE (breast-self-exam) as the best defense against breast cancer. The Breast Center at HRMC will include a state-of-the-art mammography unit with instructors to teach breast self exam. With the Breast Center women in southeastern Kentucky will have access to this 'front-line' defense against

Highlands Regional Medical Center is currently involved in a major fund raising drive to raise the needed \$92,000 to establish the Center. A flyer was placed in local newspapers during the week of July 14-18 explaining the purpose of the breast center and how individuals can get involved.

Winston Churchill is remembered as a powerful politician and world leader who, as Prime Minister, guided England through its darkest hour. Robin Wright's own life is quite different from Kelly's

As Kelly Capwell on 'Santa Barbara,' Robin Wright has been through a series of lovers. She was also harassed and nearly killed by would-be lover Peter Flint. She is currently incarcerated in a mental hospital and accused of killing one of her lovers, Dylan Hartley, who actual-ly killed himself accidentally by backing through a high-rise hotel window. But Kelly hasn't been in much of a position to deherself, since her mind has blocked out the facts of Dylan's death.

Thankfully, Wright's real life has gone a lot smoother than that of her fictional counterpart.

'I've always wanted to be an actress, but I never thought I'd get my big break so quickly," says Wright. "I was ready to leave for Hawaii to work on a boat, when I got a call to do a screen test for 'Santa Barbara.' I postponed my trip for two days, then learned that I had landed the part of Kelly.

Since Wright had very little acting experience under her belt (she had a guest-starring role on the failed NBC nighttime serial "The Yellow Rose"), she considers herself very lucky to have gotten her 'Santa Barbara' role.

"I auditioned for a few different parts, including that of Laken Lockridge," says Wright. "I felt the most comfortable with the role of Kelly, and evidentally the producers felt the

same way." Before launching her acting career, Wright appeared in numerous television commercials and was a professional model. But her memories of modeling aren't all that happy.

'Models are highly competitive with one another, and it can be a very cutthroat business," says Wright. "But the cast of Santa Barbara' is like a family to me. We all give each other a lot support.

When Wright auditioned for "Santa Barbara," she had just returned from a trip to Europe. She has many fond memories of the experience.

"I back-packed through England, France, Switzerland, Monaco and Greece," says Wright. "I even settled in Paris for a while. In Paris, on Sundays, I used to get up very early and visit all the museums.

When she's not working, Wright, who lives in the beach community of Venice, Calif., is like any other sun-worshiper — she enjoys swimming, jogging and getting a tan.

Bar Assn. Handbook Outlines Rights, Programs For Elderly

Older Kentuckians needing information about their legal rights or about assistance to which they are entitled can find a wealth of it in a handbook published recently by the Kentucky Bar Association.

Included is advice for the elderly on finding a lawyer, the range of public benefits open to them, drawing up a will, managing their affairs if they become disabled, arranging pre-paid funerals, their rights as tenants, choosing a nursing home, their rights to medical treatment and to refuse it. choosing a nursing home, filing a consumer complaint, keeping a job, getting credit, or going back to school.

It discusses age discrimination; such programs as Social Security. Medicaid, Medicare, food stamps, black lung, veterans' benefits and railroad retirement benefits; and estates and property management, including life insurance, pensions, banking, taxation, investments and trusts.

The handbook, "Laws and Programs for Older Kentuckians," was edited and coordinated by Frederick W. Whiteside, Jr., who heads the bar association's special committee on legal concerns of elderly clients. The chapter on public benefits was written



MORE PROPHECY...by Wilmay

The Bible provides abundant insight into the second coming of Jesus, which most spiritual leaders think is quite near. Mark 13 is replete with signs to precede it. A few decades past no one expected to hear computers talk like human beings, the way the image of the antiChrist will do in the last days. But now computers everywhere-including our own county-are performing this feat that has to occur to fulfill Rev. 13:15. Such clues substantiate the belief that Christ will not be long coming unless the U.S. obeys II Chron. 7:14, and God temporarily postpones the greatest event ever. Extra space is devoted to sign No. 16 of this series, because children are our most precious possession.

No. 16. Mark 13:12 lists disobedience to parents./ Is the percentage of youngsters who make parenting difficult growing or not? When deference to authority is adequately taught and practiced in the home, obedience to superiors comes naturally for the vast majority. An ancient adage says, "As the twig is bent so groweth the tree." Experts in the behavioral professions say if parents are in control when the little fellow reaches the age of one to two he will begin to show respect for all adults. It doesn't take a child long to learn who is in command. If he gets his "bot" every time he whines, the seed sown thereby is likely to create problems later

Training does not begin with adolescence, but at birth; moreover, it should continue till the late teens, financial independence, or marriage. Pr. 22:6. Kids are sharp enough to test anyone accountable for them till grown. Parents are more responsible than schools, churches, or society as a whole. Millions of parents and offspring do fantastic jobs in every way, but all parents make mistakes. Parenting is the hardest task on earth, so this is not a diatribe against those who fail or seem to do that. Its purpose is to focus attention on the opposite side of the scenario that has hordes concerned because of increasing youth suicides, patricides, fratricides, matricides, infanticides, and run-away

kids, often in families where no one dreamed such could occur. Shocking child and spouse abuse mounts. Children are kidnapped in frightful numbers. Such was rare decades ago.

Some parents leave child-rearing to their mates, which is a blunder. Vast numbers spoil every child in the family or permit relatives to do that. Many children talk impudently to anyone in authority. They get by with it, because those in charge fail to exert authority. Deportment in school reflects that at home. Hear teachers describe classroom conduct, particularly that in large cities and ghettos, where pupil behavior is often so terrible security guards are necessary. Why be surprised since reliable surveys show that countless TV programs for youth feature violence and obscenity? The majority of offspring spend more time TVing, playing, wasting time in myriad ways than they do reading, studying, attending school and performing family chores. Loitering has led many youngsters into the drug habit, plus other undesirable ones. Homework from "Teacher" and family assignments are good deterrents to idleness and delinquency that may lead to crime.

Might some of these facts be one reason that children from several other nations far outrank ours in academia. though much less is spent per capita there than here? This is worth thinking about, for national security depends upon superior scholarship eventually. Two other facets help to mar the picture: 1. As a nation we have become more interested in athletics than in education, 2. Last but not least, when morals of a nation decline everything else tumbles sooner or later, generally

Tin Can Tourists and Other American Travelers

It's easy to recognize an American tourist in his non-native habitat. Most visible in the summertime, he sports peacock-bright plumage and, commonly, a shading crown of straw or cotton. Glazed protective coverings of brown, gray or green shield his eyes. He moves determinedly from sight to sight, wearing about the neck a black appendage designed to capture encountered wonders. A tourist is the other guy.

Americans don't like to think of themselves as unsophisticated outsiders. "In the 19th century, the word tourist was identified with those educated and cultured individuals who took the Grand Tour of Europe," the Smithsonian's Roger White says. White, a transportation historian, observes that today many think of the tourist as a person "unfamiliar in his surroundings" who "never really sees a place as it is."

Nowadays, Americans may prefer to think of themselves as "travelers," "sightseers," "vacationers" or "visitors," but enthusiastic tourists have been part of the nation's landscape for more than a century. "Americans have always had an intense latent desire to see their own country," White says.

A new exhibition organized by White, "At Home on the Road: Autocamping, Motels and the Rediscovery of America," dynamically illustrates his view. The show, which will be at the National Museum of American History in Washington, D.C., until Jan. 11, 1987, traces the odyssey of a people who went in search of their land but never really wanted to leave the comforts of home. Their journey changed life in America.

A national institution today, the summer vacation once belonged only to an affluent few. Leisurerich, the very wealthy could attune their lives to the unpredictable rhythms of stage and sailboat travel. For most Americans working a six-day week, the notion that adults as well as schoolchildren might vacation at all was not popular until the late-19th century when technology and enterprise came to their rescue.

An explosive expansion of steamship and railroad lines and new excursion fares brought the middle class to once-exclusive vacation places. At venerable health spas like Saratoga Springs, N. Y., one could now recover equilibrium at the mineral baths and lose one's starched shirtfront at the racetrack. By 1918, a visitor found Saratoga a place of bankers and book-makers. Niagara Falls, which had plunged solely for the eyes of the privileged few, became the most popular tourist attraction in America. Shops sold painted plates, wild animal parts and other take-home memories.

As more and more tourists left home and began encountering people they had never known before, social friction and discrimination became ugly facts of life in such scenically beautiful resort areas as the Catskills in New York. Protective mamas, who brought offspring to the mountains for the summer to breathe the rarefied air while papa labored in the city inferno, harbored anxieties that their marriageable sons and daughters might meet the "wrong" people. To alleviate their fears, one Catskill hotel proprietor apologetically served notice that "the Loxhurst accommodates gentiles only."

Yellowstone National Park sounded a more democratic note. Established in 1872 as a "public park or pleasuring-ground for the benefit and enjoyment of the people," it would soon be host to a new form of wildlife—the tourist. The siren song of Nature and the promotion of Western railroads lured Victorian "dudes" and "dudettes"—that is, Eastern couples—to Yellowstone, Yosemite and other exotic Western destinations.

With the advent of the automobile—mass-produced and within reach of many middle-class Americans by 1915—conservationists began to fear for Nature. Naturalist John Muir tried to look on the bright side of increasing numbers of "devotees" of the "scenery habit" in the national parks. Even though they were "arrayed more gorgeously than scarlet tanagers, frightening the wild game with red umbrellas," he thought they might still be "a hopeful sign of the times." In 1916, the year the National Park Service was established, a visitor to Rocky Mountain National Park found candy boxes at the spectacular overlooks and "paper covers torn from rolls of Kodak films."

Though he or she sometimes abused the new freedom of the open road bestowed by the automobile, the American vacationer gloried in being released from what one traveler in 1911 called "the inflexible track of the steel highways" and the "bondage of timetables." American automobile owners quickly came to consider long-distance leisure travel as a "birthright," White

believes. Indeed, from the turn of the century on, intrepid automobilists like social arbiter Emily Post adventured across the continent. Post's party traveled in an open touring car packed to overflowing. Forty minutes out of New York City, out came the silver tea set and a full meal for a roadside "picnic."

"The automobile became a satellite of the American home," White points out. Autocamping, a national pastime in the 1920s, brought families together. One autocamping enthusiast sniped at the old separate vacations: "It's nice to have daddy along. He's great fun when you get to know

Even large families could travel in early recreational vehicles—house cars with beds, toilets and kitchens built on used automobile chassis—created by autocampers who didn't want to sacrifice indoor pleasures. Sharing the recreational road were "tin can tourists," who traveled in tin lizzies and elegant automobiles alike.

These virtuous autocampers ate food from tin cans heated on the radiator. Some of the tin can tribe took great pride in traveling light. More anxious campers, however, took everything they could possibly need on the road—tents, cots, stoves, all manner of gadgets and, it seems, anything collapsible. A tongue-in-cheek ad in "Motor Camper and Tourist" boasted that "This camper's children are trained to fold up."

As the enthusiastic 1920s came to a close, most autocampers were folding up their tents, but they weren't giving up travel. In the following decades, public and private autocamps gave way to cabin camps, cottage courts, tourist homes and an American contribution to the history of tourism—the motel. As they always had, many tourists stayed in city or small town hotels, but the attractions of roadside accommodations—privacy, no dress codes, no tips, cheaper rates—were powerful

In the postwar boom, Americans become a nation of sightseers. To smooth their way, an astonishing array of roadside services spread across the land like a giant carnival come to town. There were roadside eateries shaped like coffee pots, teapots, a miner's hat, a derby, a fish and a big apple. In Colorado, there was the "Only Petrified Wood Filling Station in the World." Diners had names like "Streamliner," "Super Chief," "Port Silver," "Airway" and "Zep"—and shapes to match. Highway travel was entertainment.


But America's motoring midways were not fun for everybody. The Negro Motorist Green Book, published from 1936-1963, listing hotels, motels, cottages, tourist homes and restaurants that served black travelers, was a sad and ironic comment on the open road.

Today, the old roads are commercial strips. The roadside stands are standardized restaurants and franchised fast-food outlets. The Kozy Kottages are chain motor lodges. You can get a clean bed in familiar surroundings and a meal you can depend on because you've had it before. But chances are poor that you'll see a gas station shaped like a Chinese pagoda. Beyond the old road—isolated from human events, speed its main mission—drones the superhighway.

Above the road, speed was not, in the beginning, the primary consideration of airline travel. America's first scheduled passenger airline in 1914 was a tourist service ferrying vacationers between Tampa and St. Petersburg, Fla., in "flying boats." In 1930, however, TWA introduced the first transcontinental air service that wasn't partly by train. Allowing no time out for sightseeing, the trip still took 36 hours with 10 stops and an overnight rest in Kansas City. Airplane travel has improved since then, but most Americans continue to do their traveling for pleasure in their automobiles.


Flyway or superhighway, one thing is certain—this year, from Atlantic to Pacific, the traffic will be terrific. Encouraged by lowered gas prices and discouraged by increased terrorism abroad, many millions of our on-the-go citizenry will do as boosters urged during World War I and "See America First."

As their ancestors did before them, American tourists will stand before such natural wonders of the land as the falls of Yosemite. They will pay their respects to the Statue of Liberty celebrating her centennial year. And, chances are, they won't feel like outsiders. They'll know that, though on the road, they are at home.





Hospital Telephone Operators Week

The room is filled with dozens of switches, beeping lights, security screens, and files. No, this isn't the cock pit of a 747; it's the room where the telephone operators at Highlands Regional

These professionals will be honored August 3-8. Governor Martha Layne Collins has declared that time State

The Health Care Operator is the first voice you hear when calling a hospital. This is just one of his or her many responsibilities. According to Phyllis Joseph, PBX Operator at Highlands, their day begins with one of 3 shifts, 7:30 a.m.-3:30 p.m., 3:30 p.m.-12 mid, 12 mid-8:30. The operators handle approximately 164 calls per hour, plus other duties. Their day consists of patient calls, Doctor's calls, and employee pages. They also keep call logs, watch security screens, keep an eye on fire alarm boards, observe blood bank temperature, check oxygen levels, and sometimes handle emergencies.







FEDERAL TAX REFORM

(The Work Continues)

The tax conference committee is at work reconciling the difference between the House and Senate tax bills. The result of the committee's work is likely to become law sometime in September.

The House and Senate bills already agree in a number of areas, and these provisions are likely to appear in the final bill. The two agree on provisions that would:

- Eliminate investment tax credit
- Eliminate the working couple's deduction
- Eliminate income averaging for non-farmers
- Fully tax unemployment benefits
- · Reduce to 80% the deductibility of business meals and entertainment
- Repeal the \$100 single, \$200 joint, dividend exclusion
- · Increase the earned income credit

Some of the main areas where the two bills disagree include the following:

- Deductibility of IRA contributions (House keeps the deduction; Senate eliminates it for individuals covered by employee pension plans)
- Top individual tax rate (38% in House bill; 27% in Senate)
- Top corporate tax rate (36% in House bill; 33% in Senate bill)
- · Capital gains (House top rate is 22%; Senate treats capital gains as ordinary income, so top rate is 27%)
- Sales tax (fully deductible in House plan; limited deduction in Senate plan) • Effective date for law (House January 1, 1986; Senate January 1, 1987. Major exception is that both bills repeal investment tax credit effective January

The final bill agreed upon by the tax committee conferees must be approved by both the House and Senate and signed by President Reagan before it becomes law.

Simon Kenton Festival Scheduled Sept. 20-21

By PHYLLIS HELPHENSTINE The 1700's historic village of Washington, Kentucky is inviting the public to spend a delightful week-end at their 10th Simon Kenton Festival September 20-21 from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. both days. Always held the third weekend in September, the event is sponsored by the Historic Washington Shopkeeper's Association. The festival is named in honor of one of the most famous explorers and pioneers in American history. Simon Kenton spent 14 years in this picturesque village of log cabins, five museums, 28 antique and craft shops (open daily in the afternoon) herb gardens and Brodrick's 1788 Tavern for fine Kentucky dining.

Simon Kenton always gave April 3, 1755 as the date of his birth. He was born in Farquier County, Va., the seventh child of an Irish father and Scotch-Welsh mother who never rose above the poor, land-renting class into which they were born. Kenton was self-taught with little or no schooling, although he was described as more intelligent than other frontiersmen of his time.

Early in life he fell in love with a young lady who did not return his affection. What was even worse, she loved one of his best life-long friends. Kenton went to their wedding, uninvited, and thrust himself between the bridal pair, whereupon, the groom and his brothers pounced on him and gave him a good beating. Later, when the groom was alone, Kenton beat him unmercifully and left him for dead. He fled without any money or food and only the clothes on his back. His misfortune was Mason county's good fortune. The early settlement of the village of Washington-the first in the nation to be named after President Washington-was made possible by the efforts of the heroic pioneer, Simon Kenton.

Kenton was 16 when he heard about Kain-tuck-ee cane lands. At the age of 18 he led a party on the first trip by land from northern Kentucky to western Virginia which made his name known to every borderman. In 1784 he built his station here, the first defense against the Indians in northern Kentucky.

Simon Kenton was one of the most colorful men in American History, and it seems fitting that he chose the most colorful state in the Union for his daring adventures. A favorite description of him reads, "He was over 6 feet in stature, erect and graceful. His complexion and hair were light, and his soft grayish-blue eye was lighted up by a bewitching, fascinating smile.'

Once when Daniel Boone suffered a broken leg in an Indian attack and the Indian was ready to scalp him, Kenton knocked the Indian down and dragged his leader back into the fort, saving his life. "Well, Simon, you have behaved yourself like a man today-indeed you are a fine fellow." This from Boone was said to be a great compliment.

After settling here, Kenton spent most of his time at the mouth of Limestone Creek where the boats docked. It was his self-appointed duty to guide, warn, and welcome the parties arriving daily. He

and later Washington was filled with the illustrious men. Kentucky and Kentuckians can never forget this unsung hero, to whom they owe so much. One of the original 119 log cabins is now the Simon Kenton Museum.

The festival will have entertainment, a street fair, a parade, demonstrations of basket making, rug weaving, and chair caning. The 1812 Pillsbury House will be on tour from 2 p.m. until 4 p.m. both days. There are guided tours of the five museums. Amish baked goods, food booths, bingo, antique and craft exhibitors will line the streets of Washington which by 1790 was the second largest town in Kentucky with a population of 500. Today the population is still 500 and although the village has been completely restored it retains the charm and atmosphere of its past.

The entire downtown district is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The village has the only known log postoffice and bank, also a log church, two log museums-one of which is the last existing flatboat house. In 1833 Harriet Beecher Stowe witnessed her first slave auction on the courthouse lawn and from that experience wrote the book, "Uncle Tom's Cabin."

Washington is located on US 68, 4 miles south of Maysville, 65 miles from Lexington, and 60 miles from Cincinnati, Ohio. From Cincinnati take US 52 to Aberdeen, Ohio and cross the Simon Kenton Memorial Bridge into Maysville. For information write Phyllis Helphenstine, P.O. Prepare your child for School

1. A law passed by the 1986 legislature requires parents of children entering school for the first time in Fall of 1986 to present a certified copy (full size) of the child's Birth Certificate.

A Blue Card from the Health Department will not meet this requirement.

Applications for birth certificates are available at the Floyd County Health Department, the principal's office of your school, or at the Board of Education's Central Office. There is a \$5.00 charge for Certified Birth Certificates.

- 2. Each child enrolled in the Floyd County School System this fall (1986) MUST present the principal or head teacher with a Kentucky Immunization Certificate. This certificate must be signed by a physician, clinic or local health department, and it must list the immunizations which the child has completed.
- 3. Each child entering the Floyd County School System for the first time (Kindergarten, or transfer students) must have a Tuberculin Test Certificate (CH-91A)

Immunizations and T.B. skin tests may be obtained at the Floyd County Health Department any Monday, Wednesday, or Friday from 8:00 A.M. until 3:00 P.M. There is no charge for these services.

IN ADDITION TO THE SCHOOL REQUIREMENTS LISTED ABOVE:

4. All students enrolled in the Floyd County School System this fall (1986) should have on file or MUST present the principal or head teacher with a Medical Examination on the KDE approved form (1671-000-003) and signed by a PRIVATE PHYSICIAN. Lab studies can be obtained free of charge at the health department. Head Start physicals are not acceptable unless it is recorded on the KDE approved form (1671-000-003) and was done six (6) months prior to entrance to school.

These items must be completed and a proper certificate for each item submitted to the school principal or head teacher on the opening day of school this year (1986).

Disaster Regs Are a Disaster

By Congressman Carl C. Perkins The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has the primary responsibility to provide assistance whenever there is a declaration of natural disaster. As you know, when there is a flood, tornado, or hurricane, the Governor of the state submits a request to the President through FEMA requesting such a declaration. This Spring, FEMA proposed new regulations which would totally devastate the current disaster program.

The Subcommittee on Investigations and Oversight of the House Committee on Public Works and Transportation recently held an all-day hearing on these proposed regulations. During the course of this hearing it was revealed that about the first of the year the Office of Management and Budget in the White House ordered FEMA to come up with a scheme to cut the Federal cost of disaster assistance by 50%. FEMA then proceeded to come up with proposed regulations to accomplish this.

Under the registration proposed by FEMA, state and local governments would have to agree to pay 50% of the costs through a complex formula. In addition, FEMA proposed to significantly increase the criteria which would have to be met in order to receive a Presidential declaration

According to testimony before the Subcommittee, there were approximately 110 disasters throughout the nation between 1980 and 1985. Only 10 of these would qualify for a Presidential declaration under the proposed regulations. As a practical example close to home, analysis of these regulations by the Kentucky National Guard indicates that the May, 1984, flood in Eastern Kentucky would only marginally qualify.

When a community is devastated by a disaster, it needs help. The Commonwealth of Kentucky has only limited capability. Our county and city governments are in desperate financial straights. It is obvious they would not be able to come up with the amount of money that FEMA is proposing in order to obtain Federal assistance.

The regulations were condemned by everyone who testified except the officials from FEMA. This is going to be a continuing battle between the Congress and the Administration. The hearing record developed by the Subcommittee will be used to provide a basis for this flight. All testimony was taken under oath. One of the members of Congress who condemned, in the strongest possible terms, these proposed regulations, was the Republican Whip in the House who is the second ranking Republican leader. I am cautiously optimistic that the Congress will be able to prevent these regulations from taking effect. Action is anticipated in the House of Representatives on this matter in the upcoming weeks. The legislative action to block the regulations will probably occur on the bill appropriating funds for FEMA. Because of the strong bipartisan opposition to these regulations, the necessary legislative provision to block these regulations will probably become

David Arlen, who was a short-term love interest for Jackie Zeman (Bobbi Brock).



John Hillerman has planned a very uneventful summer

It doesn't take John Hillerman long to explain what he's going to do on his summer vacation.

"I have no plans," says the actor, who plays Jonathan Quale Higgins III on CBS's "Magnum P.I." After pondering his statement a moment, Hillerman throws in an addendum: "I'm going to turn off the phone and stay in bed with a good book.'

Hillerman's respite at his California home won't last too long. By next month, he'll be back at his Hawaiian penthouse with its "view of the world" - and will resume shooting on "Magnum." "Higgins is the best part

I've ever had," Hillerman says. "And it gets better and more interesting each year." Hillerman has done dual roles the past few seasons and is cooking up yet another one, although plans are nowhere near finalized. "It's a great way to stretch the acting muscles," he explains.

One of his greatest stretches has been convincing viewers that Hillerman is like Higgins -

stuffy, staid, not much fun and veddy English.

"I'm from Texas," says Hillerman. "Last year, we were in England for a twohour 'Magnum' episode, and everyone in England thought I was English. I was flattered."

Hillerman says he has worked hard to draw out the inner qualities of his character and admits that Higgins started out "very much two-dimensional." But he steadfastly refuses to take all the credit for the three-dimensional metamorphosis.

"It all goes back to the writers," Hillerman says. "I can't do a thing without a good script. I'm an actor. Higgins is a role."

But Hillerman knows this role won't roll on forever. "Magnum" has enjoyed a fine run since debuting in late December 1980, but despite the enduring attractiveness of Tom Selleck in the series title role, "Magnum" has begun to slip in the ratings. To prolong the series CBS is experimenting, airing the show on Saturday night, away from the familiar Thursday-night slot that it has held since September 1981. The network is hoping that getting "Magnum" away from the top-rated "Cosby Show" will revive its popularity.

"It's a phenomenon." Hillerman says of "Cosby." "I think experimenting with new time slots (for 'Magnum') is a good idea. There's life in the ol' boy yet. We're not ready to write the obit, and I don't think our viewers are either.'

Precautions Are In Order Against Hot-Weather Ills

alert in effect.

Although summer is traditionally a time for outdoor recreation, the National Institute on Aging warns that hot, humid weather may pose severe health problems for a great many people. Older people, particularly, should take necessary steps to lessen the risks of heat-related

Heat exhaustion is a serious warning that the body is getting too hot. It is probably the most common form of heatelated stress caused by the body's loss of water and salt. A person may exhibit thirst, giddiness, weakness, profuse sweating, loss of coordination, lightheadedness, loss of appetite, and nausea. Body temperature is often elevated, but usually not higher than 101 degrees. The pulse rate is normal or raised. The victim is probably sweaty and pale but the skin is cold and

Heat exhaustion may be treated in everal ways. The victim should lie down in a cool place, preferably one that is air-conditioned, and be given fluids. Avoid alcohol and caffeine. Water and fruit or vegetable juices are best. Encourage the individual to shower, bathe, or sponge off with cool water. If left untreated, heat exhaustion can progress to

clammy.

Heat stroke, however, can be lifethreatening. Immediate attention is reguired. The death rate for unattended eat stroke approaches 100 percent.

The condition is usually preceded by headache, dizziness, nausea, confusion, and even convulsions. The victim may be flushed but may not be perspiring. The pulse is generally strong and rapid. The body temperature, taken rectally, is 104 degrees or higher, and rising. The person may lose consciousness. If someone you know exhibits signs of heat stroke, emergency medical assistance s essential.

It is easy to avoid heat-related illnesses by simply following some basic. common sense procedures:

Drink plenty of water and juices. Bathe or shower frequently using cool water.

Wear light-weight, light-colored, loose fitting clothing; cotton is best.

Avoid vigorous outdoor activity during the hottest part of the day, noon to

Wear a hat or use an umbrella when But in the sun.

Use fans and air conditioners liberally. If no air conditioner is available, keep shades or curtains down during the day and windows open at night.

Visit air-conditioned places such as shopping malls, libraries, or theatres but avoid overcrowded areas. Many communities now provide older persons with transportation.

Avoid heavy meals. Limit the use of

Stay in an air-conditioned place on especially hot and humid days, par-

Rules Changed For Calling Operator

Customers in Prestonsburg soon will need to change the way they dial to get operator assistance on some longstance calls, according to South Cenral Bell.

Customers will still dial "0" to get assistance on local calls and on longdistance calls within the same South Central Bell calling zone. But, beginning August 11, customers who need assistance on long-distance calls not handled by South Central Bell should

The customer guide in the front of telephone directories contains more information about calling zones. Local and ong-distance calls dialed by the customer are not affected by the changes.

'The majority of South Central Bell callers will not be affected by the changes in dialing for assistance," said Art Willett, manager. "That's because almost all the long-distance calls made today are dialed by the customer, either '1' plus or '0' plus. the only callers affected are those who want operator ssistance of some kind.'

Customers will still dial "0" to reach an operator for help in emergencies, to get assistance on misdialed or disconnected calls and to get rate information for South Central Bell-handled calls.

Calls to directory assistance will still be placed the same way-"1" plus "411' and "1" plus the area code, if different, plus "555-1212."

South Central Bell will employ some 156 trained telephone operators to proide operator assistance in Kentucky. The operators are being transferred from AT&T to South Central Bell in a further step in the court-ordered divestiture that took place in 1984. Since January 1984, South Central Bell has contracted with AT&T for operator

assistance. South Central Bell has prepared a brochure, "Operator Services: The Personal Touch from South Central Bell" hat explains in detail when to dial "O" and when to dial "00". Customers can get a free copy of the brochure by calling their South Central Bell business office at 1-557-6500, for residence, and 1-557-6000 for businesses. All calls are toll free.

Morehead Dentist Credits Success to 'Upward Bound'

"Upward Bound made me believe in myself and my abilities.

That's the conviction of one distinguished Morehead State University graduate who credits Upward Bound and MSU with his subsequent success.

Dr. Walter Blevins, Jr., Morehead dentist and state representative from District 71, went on from MSU to dental school at the University of Kentucky where he graduated with distinction.

One of five children of Walter C. Blevins, of Morgan county, and the late Dorothy B. Blevins, he is a first generation college graduate.

"I wish there could be an Upward Bound for everybody," Blevins said. For him, Upward Bound meant cultural experiences, exposure to science equipment and computers as well as an opportunity to meet new people.

Before coming to MSU's campus as an Upward Bound participant in the summer of 1966, the only vacation he had known was visiting his grandmother who also lived in Morgan county. "It was a real eye-opener for me," he said.

Upward Bound, a federally-funded component of MSU's Trio Programs, is described by University officials as a 'Head Start Program at the pre-college

Designed to encourage students to complete high school and go on for additional post-secondary education, Upward Bound has benefited more than 2,000 Eastern Kentucky youngsters since its inception in 1966. Blevins was one of the first participants in the

"Upward Bound is a year-round academic program," said Betty Moran. MSU's Trio Programs director. "It's designed for youth who display academic potential, but for some reason or another lack the academic skill our support necessary to succeed," she

"I was a good student in elementary school, but I wasn't meeting my potential until Upward Bound," said Blevins. "It whetted my enthusiasm and made me want to do my very best. I had considered college but wasn't sure I could

Blevins was introduced to Upward Bound through his high school counselor. He applied, met the federal guidelines and spent three years as a participant, serving as a counselor for other youth like himself in the last year.

"My four years at MSU also provided me with a solid educational background so that I could succeed in dental school, where I was competing with students from all over Kentucky and the major universities across the nation," he said.

The Eastern Kentucky political leader not only was an Upward Bound pioneer, but also was a member of MSU's first four-year ROTC class and he also served as president of the MSU Young

Blevins, who has continued to work with Upward Bound, serving as a model for other youth, has been honored on the national level with a Trio Achievers Award from the National Council of Educational Opportunity Association. He also has testified twice before Congress on the importance of the program.

During the school year, Upward Bound counselors visit schools and meet with the students. Once a month, the students come to campus for special enrichment programs and each summer spend six weeks living on campus, where they receive additional help in the basic skills as well as computer literacy.

After their senior year in high school, Upward Bound students take part in the "Bridge" program, where they may take six hours of college level work during MSU's summer sessions. "It is exactly what the name implies, a bridge between high school and college, Moran explained.

ASCS Will Accept Late Acreage Reports


July 15 was the last day for farmers to report their 1986 planted acres, according to Joe Ed Slone, chairperson of the Floyd County ASCS Office. Mr. Slone said several producers in the county have not filed a crop report this year.

Late filed acreage reports will be accepted as long as the farmer pays the cost of verifying the acreage, and there is physical evidence of production. Late reports are subject to mandatory spot checks.

ASCS uses crop reports to determine program compliance and to document crop acreage bases. Before program participants receive deficiency payments and other benefits, they are required to report crops and acreages planted, the uses to be made of these crops, and cropland acres to be devoted to the acreage conservation reserve.

Crop certification is most important to farmers who are participating in the 1986 program because without an acreage report, farmers are not really participating. The acreage report determines the level at which farmers are eligible for program payments and other

MSU Lowers Tuition

At Six Locations Effective this fall, all out-of-state students taking classes at Morehead State University's off-campus centers will be eligible for the in-state tuition

Approved by MSU's Board of Regents earlier this month, the new policy represents a substantial savings, according to Michael Walters, business services director at MSU

Undergraduate students will pay \$43 per credit hour, rather than \$121, while graduate students will pay \$63 per credit hour as opposed to the out-of-state tui-

tion of \$178 per credit hour. "The policy only applies to classes at the off-campus centers," Walters explained. MSU currently offers offcampus classes at six regional centers: Ashland, Jackson, Maysville, Pikeville,

Prestonsburg and Whitesburg. Out-of-state students taking classes on the main campus will be charged the nonresident tuition rate.

The new tuition policy off-campus center classes replaces a similar policy approved in 1983 which limited a reduced rate to students working in Kentucky, Walters noted. "This just simplifies things and provides students who live just outside our border the opportunity to pursue their education at an affordable cost," he added.
