

Program participants want a chance, not a handout

Sheri Arms is 27 years old. She is raising two children, one of them hers, one a stepdaughter. Her husband is disabled and she's attending Prestonsburg Community College.

She never knows, however, if her car will make it to school. She has problems finding adequate child care, but she says she's trying to get her family off welfare.

Barbara LeMaster is the mother of four. After spending many years with an abusive and alcoholic husband, she loaded her kids into a bus and headed to Michigan. When her youngest entered school, she went to college.

"I'm first generation welfare," she said. "My parents weren't on welfare. I get so mad sometimes about how we're perceived because we're on welfare. I'm Phi Beta Theta and on the National Dean's List. I'm not here to grab this money and run."

These two women, and a group of others are SASSY (Students Academically Supporting Successful Years) and they are concerned about proposed changes in the welfare system, including a decrease in the amount of education a recipient may

get and have it count toward the J.O.B.S. (Jobs Opportunity and Basic Skills) program.

"If they cut us now, what will we do?" LeMaster asked.

She said if she is forced into dropping out of school, her children will be discouraged as well.

The group met Friday with John Clayton, Kentucky's commissioner for the AFDC program.

He said the reform is being structured for the better. "We want to reform in a way to give opportunities to people," he said. "We feel like, if we give them a little help, they will achieve."

Clayton was raised in Knott County.

"I understand what it's like to be poor. I was one of ten children. My parents are still poor," he said. "We are planning to look at the system in place and implement enhancements to make it better."

Wanda Justice, president of SASSY, said her family of five children and an unemployed husband qualifies only for food stamps because of the 1990 Chevrolet Lumina she drives.

"Being on welfare is a struggle," she said. "There are a lot of changes that could be made, but most of us are trying to get off welfare as quick as we can."

Community activist, Times columnist Wilma May dies

A former Floyd County Times columnist who had initiated several community programs in her home area of Maytown died Sunday.

Wilma Elizabeth Gunn May, known in her former Times' columns as "Wilma," died October 8 at the Riverview Manor

Nursing Home. She was 89.

Mrs. May was a community leader whose ideas became the foundations for many programs in Maytown. She was the founder of the Maytown Community Homecoming celebration that began 33 years ago. The Maytown First Baptist Church also grew out of her efforts, her daughter, Libby Flannery, said Monday.

The city of Prestonsburg may be expanding its horizons again, if a proposed annexation goes through.

Former city attorney Larry Brown and Grant Hughes, a resident of Little Paint, approached city council Monday to see about the possibility of Little Paint being annexed into the city.

Brown, also a resident of Little Paint, said the area has city water, but not sewage nor police and fire protection.

Brown said several residents were interested in being annexed.

Prestonsburg Mayor Jerry Fannin said the council would be glad to explain the benefits of annexation to any areas that are interested.

"We are willing to take anyone who is interested, but the council does not want to force annexation onto anyone," Fannin said.

A tentative meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, October 25, in Little Paint. The meeting is to inform the public about the annex-

ation process and to determine how many people are interested.

In other business:

• Council adopted an ordinance that sets the tax rates for 1995. The tax rate is 21 cents per \$100 valuation for real estate and 27.8 cents per \$100 for personal property.

• Councilman Estill Carter, finance and revenue committee chairman, recommended purchas-

ing a computer for Safety Officer Mike Mays. The computer will cost \$1,949.00.

Funding for the computer will be taken from the department of code enforcement and safety. Within the department budget, \$1,000 will be taken from funds budgeted for travel and training. The other half is from money budgeted for repairs of Freddy, the robot. Freddy is used for fire prevention week.

Council approved the recommendation.

• Trick or Treat is set at the same time as the county; Tuesday, October 31, from 6-8 p.m.

• A roadblock request was granted for Saturday, November 4, for the Eula Hall Foundation.

Fannin and all council members except Dick Clark were present for the meeting.

Can't afford to renovate, can't afford not to renovate :

Board stuck between a rock and a hard place

Facing one of those can't-afford-to-do-it, can't-afford-not-to-do-it quandaries, Floyd County School Board members were to mull over a recommendation Tuesday night to revive the controversial Prestonsburg High School renovation project.

In order to recoup approximately \$350,000 already spent on the project, board members must vote to put the renovation back on the drawing board. The board voted earlier this year to cancel the renovation, citing a lack of funding to do the entire \$7.1 million project and in response to protests from a group of residents from the northern area of the county.

The board is looking at an \$800,000 deficit in the 1995-96 budget, but that figure could be cut to \$450,000 if the go-ahead is given to the Prestonsburg project.

The state's School Facilities Construction Commission (SFCC) allocates funds to school districts for construction projects. The Floyd board used general fund monies to finance the design work on the project and hoped to reimburse the general fund when bonds were sold for it.

But, when the board voted to cancel the project, the district could not use the SFCC funds to replace the monies taken from the general fund.

Interim superintendent Ed Allen said last week that the board "can't afford not" to proceed with the project.

"We could do it in two phases," Allen said. "We could do enough in the first phase so the people will be more satisfied. The board could afford to do a reasonable amount and hold-off on the final phase. We need to move forward. We can't wait."

Tax hike possible in school budget crunch

Floyd County property owners could see a four percent increase in their school taxes if school board members voted last night for a proposed tax increase.

At Tuesday's school board meeting, interim superintendent Ed Allen was to ask the board to consider raising taxes by four percent, which would raise real estate taxes to 59.3 cents per \$100 valuation and personal property to 63.5 cents. Last year's tax rates were set at 54.6 cents for real estate and 62.8 cents for personal property.

The school district is facing an \$800,000 budget deficit for the 1995-96 school year and apparently ended the 1994-95 year with a deficit, a state education official said last week.

In a memo to the board, Allen said if the board adopted a compensating tax rate—which would generate approximately the same amount of money as last year—the district would lose an additional \$139,000, which would be gained with the four percent increase.

"It is my understanding that you may not wish to adopt the four percent rate, but rather the compensating rate. . . ." Allen's memo said. "Obviously, the additional \$139,000 would be helpful to the district in working its way out of the present dilemma. Once you pass on this opportunity for this \$139,000, you cannot regain it in a future year. However, I am well aware of the pressure you face and

The Jenny Wiley Festival got underway Monday in Prestonsburg. The festival continues through Saturday.

Festivities, today, Wednesday, include a luncheon at the Riverview Manor Nursing Home and tennis tournament finals, from 3-7 p.m.

A Youth Celebration is the highlight of Thursday's events. The celebration will feature various competitions for area youth.

Arts and crafts, antiques and collectibles, and concession booths will be set up Friday in downtown Prestonsburg.

Evening events Friday include a Jenny Wiley Bowl on the Prestonsburg football field and a gospel sing in downtown Prestonsburg.

Saturday's activities include "The Wonderful World of Dogs" at the River Park; a costume contest, terrapin trot, and a reception for the grand parade marshal.

The voice of the Wildcats, Cawood Ledford, will sign auto-

graphs from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. in downtown Prestonsburg.

The annual Jenny Wiley Festival parade steps off at 3 p.m.

Evening festivities Saturday include an old-fashioned pie social from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m.; line and square dancing, beginning at 7 p.m.; and the Jenny Wiley Trophy Dash, from 8 p.m. to 11 p.m.

The festival honors Jenny Wiley, a pioneer woman who was captured October 1, 1789 in Walker's Creek, Virginia by Indians.

Jenny Wiley was brought into this area by the Indians and held captive for several months. She escaped and crossed the Big Sandy River at East Point to Harmon Station at Block House Bottom.

Jenny Wiley and her husband, Thomas Wiley, eventually settled in Johnson County. She died in October of 1831. She was buried at River in Johnson County.

A pilgrimage to the cemetery will be made Saturday.

May

In the early 1950s, Mrs. May began producing an Easter pageant held on the bank of a hillside at Martin. Although the play was eventually discontinued, the name "pageant" stuck to the production's location and a housing project built there in later years became known as "Pageant Hills."

She also started the Maytown Woman's Club and the Maytown Flower Show, which gained statewide recognition.

Mrs. May came in contact with people from all walks of life. She recognized the special attributes in each person. In the late 50s or early 60s, she began the Floyd County Hall of Fame, with categories of recognition from sports to motherhood.

During the depression years, she headed a relief office in Floyd County. The program fed the hungry by distributing seeds to those families in need, requiring them to plant a garden and produce their food through their own efforts.

In the 40s, when Floyd County faced a wet/dry election, Mrs. May was a leader in the effort to make the county dry. She served as publicity chairman and utilized her writing skills to woo the voters to her side. Her efforts paid off when the county went dry.

She also used her writing skills to put the problems in education into the hands of her readers. Her book, "A Teacher Views the School Crisis," is in libraries across the state.

May had an insider's view into education. She came to Floyd County from Mississippi in 1924 at the age of 18 to serve as a teacher. She came in response to an ad placed in a Mississippi newspaper by Alice Lloyd, founder of Alice Lloyd College. She didn't come alone. With her came her sister and two other young ladies and the four were sent to Floyd County. Mrs. May was assigned to the Maytown Independent School District, where she discovered that she was teaching students older than she was.

When she first came to Floyd County, May had received her basic teaching requirements, but she continued to educate herself and received her degree from Morehead. She also updated her education at Mississippi Southern.

She became a special education teacher at Martin and at schools in West Virginia. Concerned about the lack of programs addressing the needs of special children, she became a lecturer, bringing those issues to the attention of state officials and to the public.

She served as principal at Allen School. Her main means of transportation at that time were her feet. She made a daily trek down the railroad tracks from Martin to Allen.

"She planted many seeds in the minds of many, many children, and that will go on for many, many years," her daughter Libby said.

Klondike, Mississippi, she was a daughter of the late Frank W. and Mary Elizabeth Brame Gunn. She was preceded in death by her husband, Edgar R. May.

In addition to her daughter Libby, she is survived by one son, Edgar Ronald May of Shawnee Mission, Kansas; one sister, Undine Thomas of Long Beach, Mississippi; seven grandchildren and 11 great-grandchildren.

Funeral services will be conducted at 10 a.m. Wednesday, October 11, in the Hall Funeral Home Chapel. Bob Varney will serve as the officiating clergyman. Burial will be made in the Flanery Family Cemetery at Langley.

Bathroom facility to be built

Work is set to begin this week on a concession stand and bathroom facility at Stumbo Park at Allen.

County workers were at the park on Tuesday outlining the foundation for the building and actual construction is to begin today (Wednesday).

For the past several years, residents have complained at fiscal court meetings about the lack of restroom facilities and that the portable restrooms at the park are not handicapped accessible.

Road supervisor Mike Jarrell said Tuesday that the facility will be handicapped accessible and that it would add greatly to the park.

The two-story building will have 1,145 square-feet of space and press boxes will be located in the upstairs portion, Jarrell said. The facility will be located between the high school and grade school baseball fields.

Labor for the project will be provided by county workers and the \$40,000 facility is being paid for by a grant, he added.

Additional press boxes will be built adjacent to the high school baseball field, Jarrell said.

Jarrell said the facility is expected to be finished by November 15.

appreciate the difficulty of your decision."

The board can also levy an additional seven-tenths of one cent to the proposed rates to recover prior year losses in revenues due to exonerations.

Under state law, if a school district is proposing a four percent tax increase, a public hearing must be held, but the rate is not subject to recall if it does not exceed four percent.

A public hearing on the tax rate was set for 6 p.m. Tuesday at Adams Middle School.

School officials are looking for ways to cut costs and generate revenues in an effort to head off the projected budget deficit. State education officials discussed Floyd County's financial woes last week with the state school board.

Tom Willis, associate commissioner for the state's District Support Services, said last week that state officials will work with local school personnel to develop a plan to eliminate the budget deficit. A plan is expected to be submitted to the state school board in December.





An unbalancing act

Since we haven't seen the Floyd County Board of Education's annual financial report, which is now nearly 45 days past due for publication under state law, it's hard to say just how the school system managed to rack up an \$800,000 deficit.

Okay, it's not that hard to figure out, is it?

The board spent money on things it could ill afford, like athletic facilities, salary increases, and a construction project here or there, without realizing or recognizing the financial consequences of those actions.

That's not a new subject of conversation, either.

What is most troubling about the latest financial dilemma, though, is who is being asked to pick up the tab.

It would appear, from preliminary discussions at least, that the folks who can least afford it are going to foot the bill for the board's fiscal irresponsibility.

We're talking about the students, of course.

Here are some proposed cuts.

You decide who is getting the short end of the stick...

- Slash \$51,000 from the district's writing program.
- Chop another \$31,000 from the forensics program.
- Clip another \$34,000 from the talented and gifted program.
- Take \$25,000 from special education.
- Trim technology expenses by \$20,000.
- Cut professional development by \$15,000.

Who suffers by those cuts? Certainly not the people responsible for the budget woes.

Oh, they might lose a little sleep, worrying about the political implications of having to raise taxes, which they'll probably have to do, too, but then if they act true to form, some of them will find someone else to blame.

They can't blame the students, though, and they should not be permitted to make them pay for their mistakes through the loss or curtailment of vital programs.

Education should come first in the order of importance and last when the budget axe falls.

The Prestonsburg High School project has been a hot topic of discussion by the board for the past five years. In 1990, a previous board voted to build a new high school on a site at Middle Creek.

In 1993, state education officials recommended that the board halt work on the Prestonsburg project and suggested an investigation into it.

The board reviewed alternate plans for a new site and renovation of the current high school.

The district's Local Planning Committee, a group of area residents appointed to develop a five-year building plan for the district, recommended that Prestonsburg High School be renovated. The board adopted the LPC's five-year

plan. Last week, state education officials discussed Floyd County's budget shortfall with state school board members and will be working with the district to develop a plan to eliminate the deficit.

Tom Willis, associate commissioner for the state's District Support Services, said Thursday that it appears Floyd County school officials will be unable to present a balanced budget for the 1995-96 school year. Also, the \$350,000 reimbursement posted on the district's annual financial report for the Prestonsburg project apparently will not be approved by the state, which means the district ended the 1994-95 year in the red.

"We haven't decided how to proceed," Willis said. "We've not had time to sit down and discuss a resolution. It's pretty much known that Floyd County cannot submit a balanced budget for this year."

Interim Floyd superintendent Ed Allen agreed with Willis' assessment and hopes to work with state officials to resolve the situation.

"We are working with the department and we will not be able to submit a balanced budget," Allen said. "We want the state to assist the district in developing a plan of correction."

A plan to eliminate the deficit is expected to be presented to the state school board at its December meeting. Willis said that the plan would have to be approved by the state board.

At a work session of the Floyd school board on October 3, board members discussed proposed cuts in the district's writing program; the talented and gifted program; special education; technology; professional development; and mathematics.

A decrease in enrollment in the district, an increase in staffing and pay raises this year for all district employees are being cited by school officials as reasons for the deficit.

Parsons resigns from commission

As soon as one seat was filled another was vacated on the Allen City Commission, but enough members remain to conduct monthly meetings.

At Monday's commission meeting, Jimmy "Fudd" Parsons announced that he is resigning his seat in order to take a job driving a truck cross-country.

In September, Donald Calhoun was named to the commission to replace Virgie Woods, who moved out of state, but Calhoun did not attend Monday's meeting. Mayor Sharon Woods said she had not talked with

Calhoun and she wasn't sure if he was still interested in the position.

Also Monday, commissioners appointed Billy Salisbury to fill one of the vacancies on the commission. Parsons' resignation leaves one seat empty and there will be two vacancies if Calhoun declines to accept the post.

Mayor Woods told commissioner Larry Castle and Salisbury to see County Clerk Carla Boyd and register as write-in candidates for the November election.

In other business Monday, commissioners chose to go with the firm of Walter P. Walters for the city's liability insurance.

Betty Boyd, another member of the group, said she understands there needs to be changes, but she fears the "total control" she perceives as taking place.

The group said they have read proposals showing that welfare recipients, along with social security, disability, and SSI recipients will have all funds placed in an account. They will be able to access the funds through an ATM machine. Two withdrawals a month will be permitted before activity charges are assessed.

They also said they are concerned because of a proposed budgeting plan that would prohibit them from making withdrawals that are outside their budget.

"How can someone who doesn't know me know my family's needs?" LeMaster asked.

Clayton told the group that the proposed changes are just that, proposed and that withdrawals from an ATM machine gives them more opportunity, not less, to use their funds.

"Now, when you get your checks, you go to the bank and cash them," he said. "You have only one opportunity to access those funds. This would give you more."

Clayton said he agrees that the welfare stereotypes are, for the most part, untrue.

"It's not true that most people keep having children to stay on welfare," he said. "There's an average of 1.7 children in the AFDC home. And the check is only \$202. That family is actually losing money. The amount goes up so little it doesn't offset the cost of one

more child."

But he said it is important for people to move off the welfare system and the proposed limit is five years for all but the permanently disabled. Fifteen percent of a state's population could be exempt, based on certain criteria, Clayton said.

"We're looking at a two-tiered approach," he said. One tier will focus on job training and the other will be actual employment, he said.

Some training, like getting a GED, will no longer count in the program and the job readiness training will be geared toward getting people into the work force immediately rather than several years down the road.

"Naturally, there are people on both sides of the issue," Clayton said. "But most people are in the center. I envision a system where participants work part of the day and are in training the other part."

U.S.S. Hornet survivors gather

Former crew members on the U.S.S. Hornet ev-12 met at Jenny Wiley Lodge on September 23 for an evening of reminiscing.

In March 1944, the ev Hornet joined the United States fleet to begin a 150,000-mile path of destruction through the Pacific. The Hornet left in her wake, a dazed Japanese force that lost 1,270,000 tons of shipping that was sunk or damaged in the battle. The Hornet also destroyed 1,410 Japanese airplanes, crew members said.

On September 21, 1944, the Hornet exacted the toll on the enemy by engaging them in battle through every major operation in the Pacific from March 1944 to June 1945.

The Hornet steamed up the coast of Luzon and launched the first attack on enemy shipping, installations and airfield in and around Manila. She was also the first ship to hit the Yamato, a top-of-the-line, 45,000-ton Japanese battleship. The Yamato was sunk and is now at the bottom of the East China Sea.





Coleman tosses for 188 yards in 19-7 Allen Central win

The Allen Central Rebels (4-3) extended their winning streak to three straight after posting a 19-7 win over McCreary Central (1-6) this past Friday night on the road.

Adam Coleman continued to demonstrate why he is one of the state's top passers by completing 12 passes for 188 yards to lead the Rebels. He passed for two touchdowns. He has 844 yards passing for the season.

"Adam is the smartest we have on the field," Coach Glenn Reeves said. "He came in as a sophomore and took over for us and is doing an excellent job. Adam always plays under control."

His target was fullback Beau Tackett

who has seven catches for 138 yards receiving. Tackett also rushed for 55 yards on 14 carries.

"Beau's a very aggressive player," Reeves said of his feature back. "He's the best back in the county. We're fortunate to have him on our team. We had to pull him out of defense because it was too much for him."

Reeves said he likes the way his defense performed at McCreary Central and has performed late in the season.

"I'm proud of them all," he said. "Our philosophy is, if you can't score you can't beat us. Levi Wells had some big hits for us at linebacker. He really has come on in the past four games."

"Gordon (Reeves), Phillip (Robinson) and Mark (Varney) have really been playing

hard on defense and I'm so proud of them. Craig Crace is another that has been a pleasant surprise. He does an excellent job on the pass rush. Estill Stumbo, a latecomer, has had some big hits for us at defensive end.

"Josh (Reeves) is our other defensive tackle and he is playing real good for us. Mike Goble and Thomas Jenkins gives a good outing every time."

Allen Central had to come from a touchdown deficit to pull out the win. Both teams went scoreless, after a couple of defensive stands by the Rebels, in the first half. McCreary Central took the first lead at 6-0 on a run by Monroe to start the third quarter.

The lead was short-lived when Tackett took a 42-yard pass reception from Coleman and trotted into the end zone to tie

the game at 6-6. Allen Central led 12-6 after three quarters after Josh Reeves crossed into the end zone from four yards out.

The Rebels put their final score on the board late in the fourth period on a seven-yard pass play from Coleman to Shane Blackburn.

"It was our defense that won this game for us," Reeves said. "We stopped them at the three-yard line in the first quarter and had two other goal line stands. We had a big play from Jenkins when they fumbled the football in the end zone and he came up with the loose ball and brought it back out to the 20. That was a big play for us."

Gordon Reeves led the Rebel defense with 11 tackles. Robinson and Stumbo each had ten. Josh Reeves and Wells finished with six each. Wells also had a pass inter-

ception. Jenkins, at safety, recovered a fumble and had five tackles. Shane Blackburn had five first hits as did Mike Goble. Crace had two fumble recoveries to go with his three tackles.

Robinson had one quarterback sack. Reeves and Stumbo had two QB sacks each.

"It was just a great defensive effort," Reeves said. "It kept us in the game."

The Rebels' defense has shown remarkable improvement since the early part of the season, according to Coach Reeves.

"We had problems on defense at Elkhorn City and again at Knott County Central," he said. "We had problems up the middle, but




Lyon, who rushed for 133 yards, said the courtroom at halftime made the difference in the second half.

A FEW GOOD QUESTIONS MERIT A FEW STRAIGHT ANSWERS

Gleaned from telephone scuttlebutt, coffee shop patter and commercial breaks of Larry King Live/O.J., a few questions I've been asked along with a few answers.

Q. How come you don't title your column Sports at the University of Kentucky?

A. Because Sports in Kentucky focuses on athletics throughout the state, college and high school as well as commentary about issues that impact both. A standing and popular forum for fan views is Readers (Right) Write.

Q. How come you're such a staunch defender of Bill Curry?

A. Not so much Curry as the integrity and principles he represents. I would like to see a football coach in the Southeastern Conference maintain a successful program with academic excellence without cheating. Why not Kentucky?

Footnote: Kansas State and Kansas, once ridiculed as the worst football programs in America, are unbeaten this week and ranked eighth and ninth in the country in the college coaches poll.

Q. How bad is this UK football team?

A. Curry's is a young, but improving, team in some areas. Contrasting last year, it has shown heart and self esteem, and maybe grit too. The Auburn game cast some doubt on the latter. But the remaining schedule is ripe with opportunities.

Q. Surprised how short Ron Cooper's honeymoon at U of L has been?

A. Yes. Interesting, Cooper's media honeymoon too. On September 21 the Cardinals handed North Carolina a gift win on ESPN. By last Saturday's game in Hattiesburg, Miss. where U of L blew a 13-3 lead on the way to a 25-21 loss to Southern Miss., the Louisville metro newspaper's leading sports columnists were coming to you from Bloomington and Cincinnati.

Q. What do you have against Rick Pitino? And why have you become a C.M. Newton critic?

A. Pitino is an excellent (hot air) motivator and a fair basketball coach. Most important the combination has created a lasting feeling among UK fans. But here is a measure of the depth of Mad About Rickmania — his team had better be in the Final Four next spring.

C.M. Newton. A man who makes \$145,000 salary, plus perks and an expense account, and very likely does Olympic basketball committee globe trotting on Kentucky taxpayer time, should not be recommending the athletic board charge students \$5 a game to see UK in Rupp Arena. Newton did and it was tantamount to a president raising Medicare premiums.

I suggest Newton has been on scholarship so long, enjoyed darling status with media herd for so many years, he has no inkling the burden on a middle class family to send a young person to college.

Q. Which teams loom as biggest roadblocks to UK reaching the Final Four next spring?

A. One. UK.

Postscript: A critical mystery in UK's chances of winning an NCAA title is Da Coach. Must be haunting to UK fans, Pitino's team being badly outsmarted by North Carolina last spring; same thing happened against Michigan in 1993 Final Four. Then there was the last out-of-bounds play in the Duke game in 1992.

Q. The most important key in UK's basketball season?

A. Unequivocally, team chem-

istry. Rod Rhodes' absence is a blessing. Still to be seen — will Ron Mercer's presence be an asset, major asset, what?

Q. Tim Couch is being portrayed as the greatest thing since sliced bread. What's your spin?

A. Others can better analyze his football skills, but Couch, while he might not be a superman, is a special youngster from the neck up. Reminds us of Bill Ransdell with quicker feet. Couch is big, tough, natural leader and a good decision-maker.

Without apology, I want him to play here for fans' sake. From Paul Hornung (Flaget-Notre Dame) to Kurt Barber (Tilghman-Southern Cal) the list is too long of Kentucky-breds who took their talent elsewhere.

Q. University of Louisville basketball, why has your admiration for Denny Crum cooled?

A. Not only is U of L's basketball ship run too loosely, its academic track record is abysmal dating back to 1989 when Morley Safer and 60 Minutes skewered Crum. U of L still recruits student-athletes who are weak academically.

Moreover, three years ago Crum did to Western Kentucky U. what he

complained for years the University of Kentucky had done to U of L — looked down his nose, ignored the series' popularity with fans, and signaled: "I don't like Ralph Willard making waves ...we can make more money playing a home game than risking a loss to Western in Bowling Green. All U of L-WKU games will be played at Freedom Hall or the series contract will not be renewed."

Q. Who are the three best football coaches in Kentucky?

A. Roy Kidd. Roy Kidd. And who ever's coaching any given year at Boone County, Trinity, Danville or Mayfield.

Q. Your spin on the O.J. Simpson verdict?

A. Most damning thing to happen to inter-American relations since LA South Central. The national media reached a shameful low during George Bush re-election campaign, but its insatiable feeding frenzy during the Simpson double murder trial and coverage of jubilation after the verdict, is a sad commentary of what the media has convinced themselves is important in our lives.

News editors at television affiliates across America ought to step up and admit their complicity had less to do with public service than ratings and keeping up with their competition. Their daily decisions nourished, reinforced the media's (not viewers) obsession with this case.

BITS 'N PIECES

Bart Miller of Meade County is the first high school basketball senior to choose a college. The 6-5, 190-pound guard/honor student picked Marquette over Stanford. "He wanted to get the decision out of the way early," Coach Larry Miller, Bart's father, said last week. GET THEIR CHANCE

After ten non-stop weeks of NASCAR racing action, the Winston Cup Series finally gets a well-deserved break this weekend before heading to Rockingham for the running of the AC-Delco 500 on October 22.

Although there isn't a race this coming Sunday, you can bet your sweet potato that NASCAR teams are not taking the weekend off. You can rest assured that many teams are hard at work in the hops, preparing their rides to ensure peak performances for the season's final three events.

In addition to getting ready for the season's final three races, NASCAR crew members are gearing up for the 29th Annual Unocal 76/Rockingham World Championship Pit Crew Competition slated for Saturday, October 21.

This heated competition will determine the fastest pit crew on the NASCAR Winston Cup Series. This is one of the few times during the course of a season that the unsung heroes behind pit wall get to step forward and take center stage.

Teams will be battling each other for cash prizes, but perhaps more important than that, teams will be battling for pride. They all want to be the fastest.

The annual competition is held under simulated racing conditions.

Officiating is conducted by NASCAR with electrical timing under the direction of NASCAR's chief of timing and scoring, Morris Metcalf.

Over the years, the popularity of the pit crew competition has grown by leaps and bounds and is now televised each year.

An across-the-board increase in prize money for the top ten finishing teams in the Unocal 76/Rockingham World Championship Pit Crew Competition has many crew members fired up and ready to go. Unocal 76, the sponsor of the competition, announced the first place prize is now \$10,000. Along with winning the \$10,000 first place prize, team members will also receive specially designed world championship rings.

The "Refuse to Lose" pit crew of current NASCAR Winston Cup

point leader Jeff Gordon, led by crew chief Ray Evernham, set a world record time of 19.363 seconds for changing four tires and adding fuel from two separate dump cans in last year's competition.


Don't expect the world record set last year by the "Rainbow Warriors" to be broken in '95. NASCAR's new pit stop rules have limited the number of men over the wall to service the race car. And also, teams are now restricted to using just two air-wrenches during a stop as opposed to three.

Regardless, you can expect the competition to be as hot as ever. Teams who often figure into the outcome of the yearly competition include Rusty Wallace's "Over the Wall Gang," Dale Earnhardt's "Flying Aces," and the crew of the Kodak Chevrolet led by Tony Glover.

The rules for the competition are simple. The driver must pull his car into the pit where the crew must change four tires and add 22 gallons of Unocal to the car. NASCAR hands out penalties for missing lug nuts, not getting the car full of fuel, etc.

Although the Unocal sponsored event is slated for Saturday, October 21, it will not be televised until Sunday, November 12 at 3:30 p.m. on TNN.

A wish of quick wrenches and fast stops to all the crews.





SELECTING THE RIGHT SHAFT

Selecting an arrow shaft is just as important as the selection of a bow. There are more than 40 shaft sizes available, but only three or four have the just-right stiffness (spine) to shoot well at your personal draw length and the draw weight of your bow.

Consider six factors to select the appropriate and accurate arrow shaft. In addition to draw length and draw weight, you must know what kind of wheels your compound bow has, what synthetic material the bowstring is made of, the grain-weight of your arrowhead and whether you intend to release the string with your fingers or a mechanical, trigger-operated aid.

When these six factors are plugged into a modern shaft-selection chart, you'll end up with first-rate, good-shooting arrows.

A shaft-selection chart also identifies and recommends light, medium and heavy shafts of either aluminum or carbon suitable for flat trajectory or deep penetration. When in doubt about shaft selection, ask your archery dealer for help.

Bassin' with the Pros

HEAVY BOAT TRAFFIC CAN MAKE BASS EASIER TO FIND

When your favorite bass fishing lake gets crowded with skiers and pleasure boaters, don't give up in dismay. Just keep fishing.

That's the advice of Evinrude Outboards Pro Staff angler Mickey Bruce, who says he believes heavy pleasure boat traffic can actually make bass easier to locate on some lakes.

"I believe bass become accustomed to the traffic, the noise, and the boat wakes," Bruce says. He learned his fishing skills on Georgia's Lake Lanier, one of the most heavily visited lakes in the United States.

"One of the things I've learned is that bass in those lakes often take up residence around boat docks and piers. Heavily visited lakes tend to have a lot of docks on them, and the owners usually put out cover as well as food to attract the fish.

"Once around a dock, if the conditions are favorable, the bass stay." When he is fishing boat docks, Bruce says he usually starts at the entrance to a creek or cove because docks there will have the closest access to deep water. Other consid-

erations that make him fish a particular dock include the presence of fishing rods, rod holders, or lights along the railings, or brush underneath the dock itself.

"I also like to fish boat houses that are standing by themselves," acknowledges the Evinrude pro. "Sometimes a single dock provides the only cover in an area and the bass flock to it. Only trial and error fishing will determine this for you, but a solitary pier or dock is always worth fishing."

When he isn't fishing boat docks on crowded lakes, the Georgia pro looks for ditches and channels near the mouths of tributary creeks, but away from the shoreline.

"On lakes that receive a lot of traffic, the shallow water tends to get muddy very quickly," he explains, "so I look for structure away from the shoreline. The depth I work depends a lot on water clarity, but basically, I'll start fishing a channel break with a Carolina rig lizard or plastic worm, or possibly a crankbait until I locate bass."

Bruce says it's difficult to ignore boat traffic when fishing more open water like this, but he doesn't worry about it.

"I know the bass get accustomed to it," he says, "and fishermen need to accept it, too."

DON'T OVERLOOK TOP-WATER FISHING AS AUTUMN WEATHER BEGINS

As autumn begins to arrive in different areas of the country, bass tournament pro Denny Brauer makes certain he has at least one top-water lure tied on a rod.

"Many fishermen think of top-water fishing only in the spring, but the autumn months can provide exciting action, too," says the Evinrude Outboards Pro Staff angler. "It's a good time of year to catch a lot of bass, and a big fish is always a possibility because the bass are feeding heavily."

Brauer's two favorite top-water lures are the Pop R, a small chugger-type lure, and the Zara Spook, a larger stick bait famous for bringing strikes from big bass.

"Normally, the Pop R is good for numbers of bass while the Spook is better for larger fish," he says, "but

my largest bass ever on a top-water lure weighed nine pounds, four ounces and I caught it on a Pop R."

Brauer's favorite retrieve with either lure is a fairly slow stop-and-go around shallow cover. He usually works the lure up to the cover fairly quickly, then stops it and twitches the bait a time or two, before continuing the retrieve. Strikes generally come very close to the cover and right after the lure stops.

"Your retrieve has to be worked out on the water according to the mood of the bass," Brauer cautions. "Sometimes the fish may prefer a faster retrieve, and other times they want it moving extra slow. With a top-water lure, your retrieve speed is really critical, so keep experimenting until you determine what works."

The Evinrude pro prefers to use the smaller Pop R in clear, generally calm water, and he really likes to use it over or around the edges of vegetation.

"Bass will use the vegetation as both a hiding zone as well as a feeding zone," he explains, "and with a slow, noisy retrieve, a Pop R can bring bass out of that vegetation."

"A Zara Spook, on the other hand, is a good lure to try in dingy water, especially if you use the frog-colored paint scheme. Overall, any top-water lure works better in clear water, but the noise and commotion a Spook creates attracts bass in dingy water, as well.

"Because of its size and the noise it makes, a Spook will also bring bass up from deeper depths. I especially like to work the lure around boat houses and docks where the water depth changes quickly from shallow to deep because I believe it actually draws bass away from the cover of the dock."

This time of year, Brauer recommends fishing top-water lures around stumps and other visible cover near the mouths of tributary creeks, beside rip rap, and over long points.



Colson and Scott drew their weapons on sight. As guests attempted to take cover Colson shot at both Scott and Golden. As the Barbourville native headed for the entrance to the hotel, a bullet from Colson's 44 crashed into his back sending him sprawling into the arms of former Governor McCreary.

Colson then turned his attention back to Ethelbert Scott, taking deliberate aim with each shot while Scott fired quickly as he backed toward a corner of the hotel lobby.

Colson's revolver spat hot lead, yet his bitter enemy continued returning his fire. Pow, Pow, Pow, click! Colson's 44 was empty.

He felt vulnerable when he realized his gun was empty. As Colson lay the 44 aside a bullet from Scott shattered his elbow and sent a sharp pain up his arm. He quickly reached in his belt and drew out the .38 calibre and began circling to get a better shot at Scott. As he did, a large number of guests who had been safe became vulnerable as they were again put in the line of fire.

Ethelbert Scott appeared unsteady and Colson realized that he had been hit. Luther Demaree, a prominent farmer and lawyer from Shelbyville, Kentucky, was hiding near Scott's position. Scott grabbed Demaree to keep from falling. Colson continued his fire with one of the bullets striking Demaree in the heart and another passing through Demaree's body and again striking Scott.

Demaree collapsed and Scott had to let him go. He attempted a quick burst of shots at Colson in order to buy time to find another position, but his gun was empty. Colson continued his onslaught with his 38 methodically bursting shot after shot at him. Despite three bullet wounds, he quickly darted for the stairway leading downstairs from whence he came. He became an open target.

Colson knew he must complete his task or the vendetta would continue at some future time. He had to complete his task while he had such a splendid opportunity.

He took careful aim and fired twice, the bullets hitting the fleeing Scott in the back of the head and in the back. They sent Ethelbert Scott crashing down the staircase and into the arms of a man who was ascending the steps. It sent both to the basement floor. Scott was dead and the other man unconscious.

Colson exited the hotel and continued on to the apartment of a friend from Eastern Kentucky where he borrowed a revolver in case a spare was needed. After awhile he was persuaded to call on a physician who removed the bullet from his elbow.

In the meanwhile, the law was searching for Colson. They learned where he was being treated and arrested him at the doctor's office.

Captain Golden, Scott's acquaintance, lay near death in a nearby hospital. His recovery was slow and took several months.

A third man, Charles Julian, a well-to-do farmer and innocent bystander, was killed. In addition to the wounds suffered by Golden and Colson, two others were hit by stray bullets.

The grand jury indicted Colson for killing Scott, Demaree and Julian and for wounding Golden.

He was acquitted of the charges however after testimony indicated that Scott was just as much at fault as Colson. He returned to Middlesborough a free, but crippled man. One of Bell County's favorite sons, he turned to spirits to ease the pain that surged through his body the remainder of his days—pains inflicted by Ethelbert Scott.

Both David Colson and Ethelbert Scott had been young men with education, connections and high aspirations. Their ambitions did not come to fruition however due to their personal vendetta that resulted in Scott's death and Colson without the energies to realize his great potential.

Survival skills for parents

It's 6:30 p.m. You've just gotten home from work and it's time to start dinner.

But your children are fighting. And there's no one at home to help you.

This can be a typical day for a single parent. Juggling work and home responsibilities can be difficult when there's no one to fill in an emergency.

Even two-parent families have similar problems when parents work a different shift and aren't home at the same times.

Nell Johnson and Carol Denicke, from Mountain Comprehensive Care offered tips for parents Friday at Prestonsburg Community College.

"When there's just one parent at home, it's known that there are higher cases of child abuse," Johnson said. "This is especially true of single mothers.

She said parents need to find ways to organize their lives to cut down on problems.

"It's very hard to be both mom and dad," she said. "It can be overwhelming when someone's gone. There are feelings of guilt that the loss of the parent is the other parent's fault."

She also said a lack of time also contributes to the feelings of being out of control. That's when parents start cracking down on their children.

"Then you become unbearable and extremely restrictive," she said. "That's when the nighttime kisses become glares and stares."

How to eliminate the stresses of being a single parent? "You need to do things to alleviate stress and to teach the kids to take care

of themselves," she added.

And teaching the children to take care of some of their needs helps mom or dad take care of theirs. "If you don't take care of

difference between wants and needs,"

Johnson said. "Yes, they need jeans, but do they need GUESS jeans? Yes, they need sneakers, but do they need Nike tennis shoes?"

She said parents are overwhelming kids by giving them too much.

"We need to give them some vitamin N," she said. "They need to learn the meaning of the word 'No.'"

Children don't learn coping mechanisms if they aren't forced to deal with situations where they can't have what they want.

"If, as children, they are getting 100 percent of what they want, how, when they get to be an adult and they are getting only, maybe, ten percent, how are they going to cope?" Johnson said. "We are setting our children up to fail. We are trying to take care of the child in us instead of our children."

She said parents need to remember that they have needs as well. "You need to have something for yourself," she said.

"It's like a well running dry," Denicke said. "You give until there's nothing left to give. You have to do something to recharge yourself. If you keep running dry a lot, you need to prioritize."

And anger can be a part of those priorities. "Anger is a wonderful emotion, but we should never let anyone else make us angry."

Avoiding child-controlled anger comes from having posted rules and consequences when those rules are

yourself, nobody's a happy camper," Johnson said.

She said the goal should be not meeting the needs for your children, but seeing that they get what they need, much like a manager in a business delegates the responsibilities of his or her jobs.

"And it's important that children know the

"This way, children can make informed choices when they decide to break the rules, "and you don't have to be angry. If you get angry, they have the power," she said.

"And you can always put yourself in time-out," Johnson said. "It's hard being a parent."

- Praise. Children should be praised often and freely. Look for desirable

Tips for positive behavior management

behaviors each child displays. Let the child know you are pleased with the behavior.

- Redirect. Don't focus on the undesir-

able behavior. Re-focus the child's attention from an undesirable or possibly unsafe behavior to one that is more desirable.

- Choices and consequences. Help children learn self-control, make wise decisions, and accept responsibility by having consequences for unacceptable choices. Listen to the child's ideas and concerns and always consider his or her feelings.

- Be consistent and fair.

- Time-outs. Make sure children know what time-outs are and how long each will last. Establish rules that warrant time-out



Group wants to build children's hospital

Janie Bailey-Bamer has a dream. It is a dream born from long trips to Lexington and Louisville with her sick daughter.

It is a dream of a new children's hospital for Eastern Kentucky.

Bailey-Bamer — along with her husband, Bill, her daughter Suzanne, Steve Patrick, and Dave Trimble — opened an account at First Commonwealth Bank Friday morning, establishing the Eastern Kentucky Children's Foundation.

"I don't think there's ever been a philanthropy movement like this one in Kentucky," she said. "We have no idea what it will take."

Bailey-Bamer's story began eight years ago when her daughter was born. Doctors diagnosed the child as having an upper respiratory infection when she actually had a heart defect. Complications arose and cerebral palsy and brain damage followed. The child is confined to a wheelchair.

"We don't want to see another

kid go through what we've gone through because of a misdiagnosis," Bill Bamer said. "We might not benefit, but your children's children will."

He said he'd like to see the facility go into the Allen area. "That's about the middle of the area we'd like to serve," he said, mentioning Floyd, Pike, Perry, Knott, Magoffin, Martin, and Johnson counties.

The first donation for the new hospital came from the Pikeville Pediatric Clinic.

The Bammers said it depends on the people of Eastern Kentucky as to how long it will be before the center is built.

"This is a grass roots and growing effort," Janie Bailey-Bamer said. "We're really excited about

this. It's really opening up something for Eastern Kentucky."

The group is looking for national corporate sponsors and will be holding several fundraisers over the next few months. The first, a motorcycle field meet, is set to be held at Thunder Ridge October 20-22.

Health Matters

SELECT THE EXERCISE INTENSITY THAT IS RIGHT FOR YOU

Many people perform cardiovascular activity without monitoring their exercise intensity. However, by monitoring their intensity they may be able to reduce their risk for injury and coronary events, reach their desired goals in a shorter period of time, and enjoy exercise more. There are two main ways to monitor exercise. Heart rate and perceived exertion are both effective ways to monitor exercise intensity.

Using a target heart rate is the most common method of prescribing and monitoring exercise intensity. The formula used by most health fitness professionals is: $220 - \text{your age} = \text{theoretical maximum heart rate}$.

Next, you multiply your theoretical maximum heart rate by the appropriate heart rate intensity. The heart rate intensity is determined by your goals and fitness level.

If your current fitness level is low or you wish to lose weight, then the appropriate target heart rate intensity is 60 percent to 70 percent. If your fitness level is slightly above average and/or your goal is to become fit, then the heart rate intensity should be 65 percent to 70 percent. If your current fitness level is high and your goal is competitive athletics, then the intensity should be 75 to 85 percent. An example of determining heart rate intensity for a 20-year-old who wishes to lose weight is shown below:

$220 - 20 = 200$ (maximum heart rate). $220 \times 60\% = 120$ (lower end of range). $200 \times 70 = 140$ (higher end of range).

The target heart rate range is 120 to 140 beats per minute. Divide this range by six to get 20 to 23 beats for 10 seconds.

The Karvonen formula allows for the current fitness level to be factored in by including resting heart rate in the equation. In general, the higher your fitness level is, the lower your resting heart rate. The formula uses the theoretical maximum heart rate as determined above. Next, subtract your resting heart rate from your theoretical maximum heart rate. Multiply this number by the appropriate intensity (selected using the criteria listed above). Finally, add in your resting heart rate. An example of this formula is shown below for a 20-year old with a resting heart rate of 60 beats per minute.

Lower end: $220 - 20 = 200$; $200 - 60 = 140$; $140 \times 60\% = 84$; $84 + 60 = 144$. Higher end: $220 - 20 = 200$; $200 - 60 = 140$; $140 \times 70\% = 98$; $98 + 60 = 158$. Thus the target heart rate range is 144 to 158 beats per minute or 24 to 26 beats for 10 seconds.

The choice of activity may require you to adjust the target heart rate range. If swimming is your cardiovascular activity of choice, then you should lower the exercise intensity by one to two beats per 10 seconds. Cycling requires that heart rate range be lowered by one beat per 10 seconds. Aerobic classes, due to the large number of hand movements, require heart rate range be raised by one to two beats per 10 seconds.

To measure your exercise heart rate, take your pulse rate during exercise or within 10 seconds of stopping. If your pulse is below your target zone, exercise a little harder next time. Attention to target

heart rate is particularly important during the first three months of an exercise program since the greatest improvements occur during this time.

Perceived exertion is another method of determining exercise intensity that is simpler to use and does not have to be adjusted for activity. This method is often used with individuals who are on medications that lower their maximum heart rate. Beta-blockers such as Inderal have this effect. Exertion is estimated on a scale of six to 20. A six is an activity that is very light while a 20 is very, very hard. Intensity should be fairly light and equal to a two for weight loss or for a person with a low fitness level.

Intensity should be somewhat hard and equal to a 14 for above average fitness and/or a goal of improved fitness. Individuals with a high fitness level and athletic goals should exercise at an intensity that

is hard and equal to a 15.

Following the general guidelines listed above will enable you to pick the most appropriate intensity for you. In general, you should exercise at an intensity that you can talk but cannot sing. If you feel that you need further assistance in monitoring exercise intensity, consult your physician.

Tip of the Week: A bacon cheeseburger has, on average, 250 more calories than a plain burger—plus a good deal more saturated fat and cholesterol.



PUMPKIN PIE

1 9-inch piecrust
1 16-ounce can mashed, cooked pumpkin
3 large eggs, separated
1 14-ounce can sweetened condensed milk
1/4 cup water

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg
Dash of salt
1/4 teaspoon cream of tartar
1/2 cup sugar

Prick bottom and sides of piecrust with a fork. Bake at 425° for 5 minutes on lowest oven rack.

Combine pumpkin, egg yolks, sweetened condensed milk, and next 5 ingredients; pour into piecrust. Shield crust with aluminum foil, and bake at 400° for 30 minutes in center of oven.

Beat egg whites and cream of tartar at high speed with an electric mixer until foamy. Gradually add sugar, 1 tablespoon at a time, beating until stiff peaks form and sugar dissolves (2 to 4 minutes). Spread over hot filling, sealing to edge of pastry. Shield crust, and bake at 325° for 25 to 28 minutes or until golden brown; cool on a wire rack.



MSHA to sponsor 1995 national coal mine rescue contest

The top coal mine rescue teams from around the country will gather in Louisville, October 16-19 to compete in the National Mine Rescue, First Aid, EMT and Bench Contest. The event is sponsored by the Department of Labor's Mine Safety and Health Administration (MSHA).

"Mine emergencies present extraordinary challenges, and the men and women who will participate in this contest represent the very best among coal mine rescue teams," said J. Davitt McAteer, assistant secretary of labor for mine safety and health. "They have devoted a considerable amount of their time to shapen their skills and, in the event of a real mine emergency, they will be the first ones summoned."

More than 500 participants are expected to compete in the contest, which will be held at the Kentucky

Fair and Exposition Center in Louisville.

Each coal mine rescue team, composed of six members and two alternates, is required to navigate a series of simulated problems—such as might be encountered in a mine fire or explosion—to locate and rescue trapped miners.

In the first aid contest, participants must demonstrate the correct method of caring for an injured miner. Teams are judged on the use of proper application of skills according to the fundamentals of first aid.

In the bench competition, participants must thoroughly inspect breathing apparatus for possible defects which, if not corrected, could threaten the life of rescue team members.

This year marks the addition of an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) portion of the contest, in

which a primary EMT and a secondary EMT tackle real-life scenarios. EMTs are certified and provide an unbroken chain of medical care until the patient arrives at the hospital.

State and federal mine safety experts will evaluate each team as they work through their rescue problems in a simulated mine environment. Teams are rated on adherence to safety procedures and how quickly they complete their particular task.

The mine rescue contests for coal and metal/nonmetal mine rescue teams are held in alternate years.

Mine rescue training began in the United States in 1910, the year the U.S. Bureau of Mines was created. Joseph A. Holmes, the bureau's first director, sought a training vehicle that would provide the mining industry with a cadre of

mine rescue specialists who would be prepared to respond to mine disasters. The training efforts evolved into local and regional competitions and, a year later, a national contest. President William Howard Taft was present at the first national competition.



AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PRESTONSBURG RELATING TO A TAX LEVY ON REAL AND TANGIBLE PERSONAL PROPERTY AND FRANCHISES, ALL FOR THE GENERAL OPERATING EXPENSE PURPOSES OF THE CITY OF PRESTONSBURG, KENTUCKY.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Prestonsburg, Kentucky, in order to maintain a progressive and stable tax base for the city, finds it necessary to adopt the following Ordinance in order to provide funds for the general operative expense purposes of the City;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF PRESTONSBURG, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: The County assessment of property situated in the City of Prestonsburg, both real and personal, is hereby adopted.

Section 2: For the purposes of providing funds for the general operating expenses of the City of Prestonsburg for the fiscal year from July 1, 1995 to June 30, 1996 and for each year thereafter, until this Ordinance is amended or enacted, the following taxes are levied.

(A) Upon all real estate within the City of Prestonsburg, not specifically exempted from taxation, situated within the City of Prestonsburg of the 0.21 per One Hundred Dollar (\$100.00) of assessed value.

(B) A tax upon all tangible personal property and franchises not specifically exempted from taxation, a tax of 0.278 per One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), of assessed value.

Section 3: A discount of two percent (2%) of the total amount of the tax bill is hereby allowed upon all tax bills paid prior to November 15th of each year.

Section 4: A penalty of six percent (6%) of the total amount of the tax bills that are not paid on or prior to the thirty-first (31st) day of December of each year shall be imposed and collected.

Section 5: The City Clerk is hereby designated and authorized to collect the tax imposed herein.

Section 6: This Ordinance is passed pursuant to, in compliance with, and by virtue of the authority of the following constitutional and statutory provisions, to-wit: Kentucky Constitution Sections 157, 170 and 181; Kentucky Revised Statutes 92.160, 92.170, 92.330, 18.280, 132.010, 132.027, 132.385, 136.270 136.280 and 142.020.

Section 7: Any word, phrase section, or sub-section of this Ordinance declared by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance, which shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 8: All ordinances, or any parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby expressly repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 9: This Ordinance shall become effective upon adoption and publication as required by law.


