### Floyd County physician is reprimanded

A Floyd County physician, who tested positive for cocaine, has apparently been prohibited from practicing medicine in the county after he was placed on probation by the state medical board.

James D. Hoffman, a family practitioner in Lackey, has been under the supervision of the Kentucky Impaired Physicians Program and was ordered to undergo drug treatment for four months last spring.

Hoffman's medical license was suspended seven years ago in West Virginia after he pleaded guilty to federal charges of unlawful possession of cocaine.

He has practiced in Floyd County since December 1996.

Hoffman's probation requires that he practice medicine only at the South Williamson Appalachian Regional Hospital, submit to random drug testing, and abstain from any mood-altering substances unless prescribed by another doctor.

## No script, just help, KSBA says

Floyd County school board members were not given a play-book to avoid ouster by the Kentucky Board of Education, according to a spokesman for the state school board association.

Brad Hughes, with the Kentucky School Boards Association, said Monday that a two-page handout, titled "Floyd County School Board Team Governance and Management Initiatives," that was given to board members last week was only

a list of suggestions for improvement, and that an October 1 deadline for implementing some of those suggestions was just a coincidence.

A management audit of the Floyd County system will be reviewed by the state board of education at an October 6 meeting.

Hughes said that state officials were aware that KSBA would be offering assistance to Floyd school officials to try to correct problems in the district.

Deputy Education Commissioner Randy Kimbrough, however, said that talks with KSBA were not about the handout.

Hughes said Tuesday that the

"What you've written here is a creation of someone's imagination," Hughes said in reference to an article in Friday's edition of *The Times*.

"We provide training and assistance to any school board in the state of Kentucky that is a member of KSBA," Hughes said.

"We have, for quite a number weeks, been following the problems the Floyd County district is facing, through *The Floyd County Times*. We have contacted the board on numerous occasions about offering

the types of services that we offer to try to help them deal with their situation. There is not an idea on that sheet of paper that we provided to them that we have not provided to other school boards around the state. It has nothing categorically, absolutely in no shape form or fashion to do with an alleged... play-book to head-off state intervention."

Hughes said KSBA is not trying to interfere with the state's mission in Floyd County.

## Two are killed in separate accidents

A Floyd County man was killed early Tuesday morning after he was involved in an accident on Route 80 and trapped in his vehicle which caught on fire.

The fatality was the second in Floyd County within four days.

Barry L. Combs II, 20, of Garrett, was pronounced dead at the scene by Floyd County deputy coroner Glenn Frazier.

According to a Kentucky State Police media release, Combs was attempting to leave the Cardinal County Store around 7 a.m. when the accident occurred.

Combs apparently pulled into the path of a westbound truck — a U-haul — driven by Kenneth Wallace.

"The vehicles impacted and slid into the guardrail on the eastbound side of (Route) 80," the release says. "Combs was trapped in his vehicle which caught fire and burned."

Frazier said Tuesday afternoon that suffocation as a result of the fire was the preliminary cause of Combs' death.

Wallace and his passenger, Chris Wireman, were transported to Highlands Regional Medical Center, where Wireman was admitted and Wallace was treated and released.

According to a spokesperson at Highlands Regional Medical Center, Wireman was listed in stable condition at presstime.

The Prestonsburg Fire Department, Floyd County Emergency and Rescue Squad, and the Allen Volunteer Fire Department responded to the early morning accident to assist with the blaze.

"When we arrived on the scene, both vehicles were on fire," Prestonsburg fire chief Tom Blackburn said.

The fire chief said the gas tank on Combs' vehicle apparently ruptured and caused both vehicles to catch on fire.

No obituary information for Combs was available at presstime.

## Agency's secret settlement of suit draws open records request

The Floyd County Solid Waste Commission has put to rest a lawsuit that has been on-going for four years, but raised an additional issue when it decided to withhold the amount of the settlement from public disclosure.

During a special meeting Thursday, the solid waste commission agreed for County Attorney Keith Bartley to enter into an agreement with Preston Collins and his attorney to have a 1993 lawsuit dismissed.

Collins filed a civil suit against the commission in June 1993 for alleged water supply contamination from the old Garth landfill and a de-

preciation in the value of his property, which is adjacent to the landfill.

In a response to the lawsuit, the commission denied the allegations.

According to Bartley, the agreement includes a non-disclosure clause and he is not permitted to discuss the amount of the settlement because of the attorney/client privilege.

"The agreement was reached to hopefully avoid further lawsuits in the area," Bartley said Tuesday. "(It) was voted on and approved by the board."

When questioned about the legality of withholding a settlement which involved a public agency, Bartley said the solid waste commission was a separate entity from

the county.

"(FCSW) is a company and not part of the Floyd County government," Bartley said. "The funding (for the settlement) will come from money that the company has from its duties — not from the fiscal court or taxes."

According to state law, a public agency is "any board, commission, committee...established, created, and controlled by a public agency."

The fiscal court created the solid waste commission and controls the disbursements of the commission's funding.

Solid waste director Mike Vance said the commission does not receive any funding from the fiscal

## Utility boards to hold joint meeting

The Prestonsburg City Utilities and the David Water District have called for a joint special meeting Wednesday (today) to discuss the "future operations" of the David Water District.

Commissioners with the David water company have apparently been considering a merger with either the Prestonsburg or Beaver-Elkhorn water companies, and commissioners reportedly chose to merge with Beaver-Elkhorn.

However, the merger with Beaver-Elkhorn was reportedly tabled after a public hearing last Friday at the David Volunteer Fire Department.

According to David residents who attended that meeting, many residents wanted to know how the commissioners came to the decision to merge with Beaver-Elkhorn.

"Their answers just weren't good enough for all of us," one resident said Monday night. "We just want to know what resources were used to come to this decision."

Another resident said Prestonsburg Utilities already has water lines in the area and "when you have an option — you need to look at both options."

Some residents have indicated they have had no notice of prior meetings of the David Water Commission, and one said she had requested copies of meeting minutes, but was told there were none.

The joint meeting of the commissions will be held at 6 p.m. at the offices of the Prestonsburg City Utility Commission at Lancer.

## Wrongful death alleged in lawsuit

A Floyd County woman has filed a civil lawsuit against Big Sandy Health Care Inc. d/b/a Mud Creek Clinic, and one of its doctors for allegedly prescribing medication which killed her husband.

Clara Hamilton, administrator for the estate of Levi Hamilton Sr., alleges that Dr. Abu Salahuddin gave her husband medication that was detrimental to his chronic liver problems and diabetes.

According to the lawsuit, Levi Hamilton was prescribed the medication Glucophage on March 21, 1996, and he died April 21, 1996. The suit says that Hamilton was seeking medication to treat his diabetes, high blood pressure, liver disease and ulcers.

The suit seeks an unspecified amount of punitive damages, reimbursement for funeral expenses, and a trial by jury.

Note: A civil lawsuit lists only the plaintiff's cause for action.

"This is a service we provide to member school boards, regardless of whether they're facing any trouble with the state," Hughes continued. "If we were giving them a playbook to head off state intervention, we would have not told them to ask for management assistance from the department. We had conversations with at least four different people with the Department of Education. We are not stupid enough to attempt to try to get in between a local school board and the department of education, and first tell the department of education this is what we're doing."

When asked what KSBA might suggest to local boards to head off a state takeover, Hughes responded, "Since, we're not trying to do that, there's no purpose for me to get into anything of that."

Some recommendations in KSBA's handout include: publicly

## Fatalities

James A. Thacker, 18, of Salyersville, was pronounced dead Friday by the emergency room staff at Highlands Regional Medical Center.

Thacker, who was traveling

state the board's commitment for improvement; commit to attend a series of board development workshops; state that the board has asked a KSBA representative to attend regular meetings; direct the superintendent to develop a plan of correction "not later than thirty days following the receipt of the KDE audit; and to keep state officials informed of the district's status and progress for improving deficiencies.

Hughes said the two-page handout was not prepared specifically for Floyd County, despite its mention of superintendent Gene Davis by name.

"We would give this handout to school boards who were facing, whether it be financial difficulty, whether it be problems with attendance boundaries. . .," Hughes said. "We would tailor it to the problems that school district was having. But, everything on this list of suggestions that we have made to the Floyd County board, we have offered to other boards around this state. This is not a two-page playbook to head off state intervention."

The purpose of the KSBA recommendations is to "help school boards do what they ought to do," Hughes said. He added that since school boards are not professional administrators or budget managers, KSBA offers such services to school districts.

As for an October 1 target date for implementing some of the KSBA's suggestions, Hughes said that date was not intended to coincide with the state school board meeting, set for October 6-7.

"We give people time frames all the time," Hughes said. "October 1 happens to be end of this month. That's roughly from the date of this meeting (Floyd school board meeting), that was a three-week time-frame. . . It's just the end of the month. That's just what it is." The October 1 date was a time period KSBA felt superintendent Davis could have the recommended tasks accomplished, he said. "There's just no motive there. I know it may look like that. . . We would've made the same October 1 date if they weren't to appear before the state board."

When asked about how aware he

was of the Floyd board's problems, Hughes replied, "Virtually everything that we know about Floyd County's particular problems come from *The Floyd County Times*."

"Many of these are boiler plate recommendations that we have come up with over the years to try to help a board get its own grip on handling its own problems."

As for the document mentioning superintendent Davis, Hughes said, "you won't find that anywhere else in the rest of it. As a matter fact, that is the only thing that even specifically mentions anything about this particular school district."

"It's just not a Floyd County playbook. No matter how it looks. . . to anybody else. We generated it. We wrote it up. We developed it. There's only one organization, and I'm the spokesperson, who can say why it was done and what it was done for."

"I wouldn't even mind, I guess, if it was listed as a two-page playbook. . . except that (it was reported) as a two-page playbook to head-off state intervention. And it flat out is not. Couldn't be. And is not."

Hughes then contradicted himself saying that the document was, in fact, developed to address Floyd County's needs.

"It was designed for the problems we have seen identified in *The Floyd County Times*. We have not had in-depth discussions with the board as a whole or Mr. Davis. That's what we'd like to do with these (workshops)."

As for how long KSBA has been offering local school officials assistance, Hughes said, "It's been a number of weeks. Since the depart-

ment started looking back at Floyd County after the June or July state board meeting."

court, but the commission's board and payroll is approved by the court.

State law also defines a public agency as any "entity where the majority of its governing body is appointed by a public agency (the fiscal court)."

Vance said the settlement would be paid from old accounts and the "chise fee received from USA ste.

He also said that the money which will be used for the settlement could be considered public funds because the fiscal court has to approve the commission's payments, and the funds are located in one of the county's accounts.

"I can see a problem with it," he said about withholding the amount of the settlement from the public. "I would rather not do it if there's another way."

The Floyd County Times filed an open record's request Tuesday to inspect the terms of the agreement with Collins and his attorney.

Bartley said a special meeting would be called to address the request.

### Good news for America's rural committee

There's something new in America's farm and rural communities, and it's good news for hundreds of thousands of men, women and children.

From now on, the nation's toughest laws against housing discrimination are on the side of every family in rural America.

In keeping with President Clinton's commitment to build One America, the U.S. Department of Agriculture and the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development have signed a major agreement that will give HUD the ability to use its enforcement tools to fight housing discrimination in USDA-supported housing.

Life can be tough for some families in our rural and farming communities, especially if you've been turned down for a place to live because of your race, your religion—or even just because you have children. America won't stand for discrimination, so USDA and HUD have agreed to work together by sharing information, conducting joint investigations, and enabling HUD to take action in USDA complaints of housing discrimination.

It makes sense for USDA and HUD to specialize in the areas where they have the greatest experience and strength. HUD has been

the lead agency in enforcing the Fair Housing Act since 1968; USDA is the department of rural America. If you lived in a city, you knew that HUD would stand up for your rights if you were discriminated against when you tried to rent or buy a home. With this agreement rural families can have that same peace of mind. And since 1988, when the Fair Housing Act was expanded, HUD has gained new, stronger tools to ensure fair housing opportunities.

Where housing discrimination is suspected, HUD can provide access to temporary restraining orders; the use of subpoenas; government representation for the victims when a charge is issued; and because of this new agreement, a USDA-assisted landlord or owner who discriminates could wind up before an administrative law judge, be prosecuted by the U.S. Department of Justice, pay civil penalties, punitive damages and more.

Today, USDA is the nation's largest provider of rural housing through a variety of loan programs—since 1949, USDA has helped over 2 million rural families purchase their own homes, and has financed construction of 457,800 units of affordable rental housing in rural areas—and it will continue to play a major role in fighting discrimination and enforcing civil rights laws. It will conduct an

exhaustive review of all its programs and activities to root out and investigate any evidence of past discrimination in the sale or rental of USDA-financed rural housing.

But now, under our memorandum of understanding, our two federal agencies will play on our strengths as we work to expand housing opportunities throughout our nation, and make this a better country for all of its citizens.

As part of President Clinton's One America initiative, he appointed the noted scholar Dr. John Hope Franklin as Chairman of the President's Advisory Board on Race. Dr. Franklin was asked what he expected to come of his work. One of the first things that he mentioned was his hope that it would lead to specific improvements in housing, including the elimination of housing discrimination.

As America moves to a new demographic reality, a nation that has a majority of minorities, we are determined to spread the word about our precious American rights. We begin a public education and outreach campaign to give all Americans the knowledge that our laws guarantee hope.

There is good news in the fight to end this discrimination—because for hundreds of thousands of men, women and children, whether they live in the city or in the country, Fair Housing rights are stronger than ever.

The only thing between the ball and the goal is your face. Take one for the team.

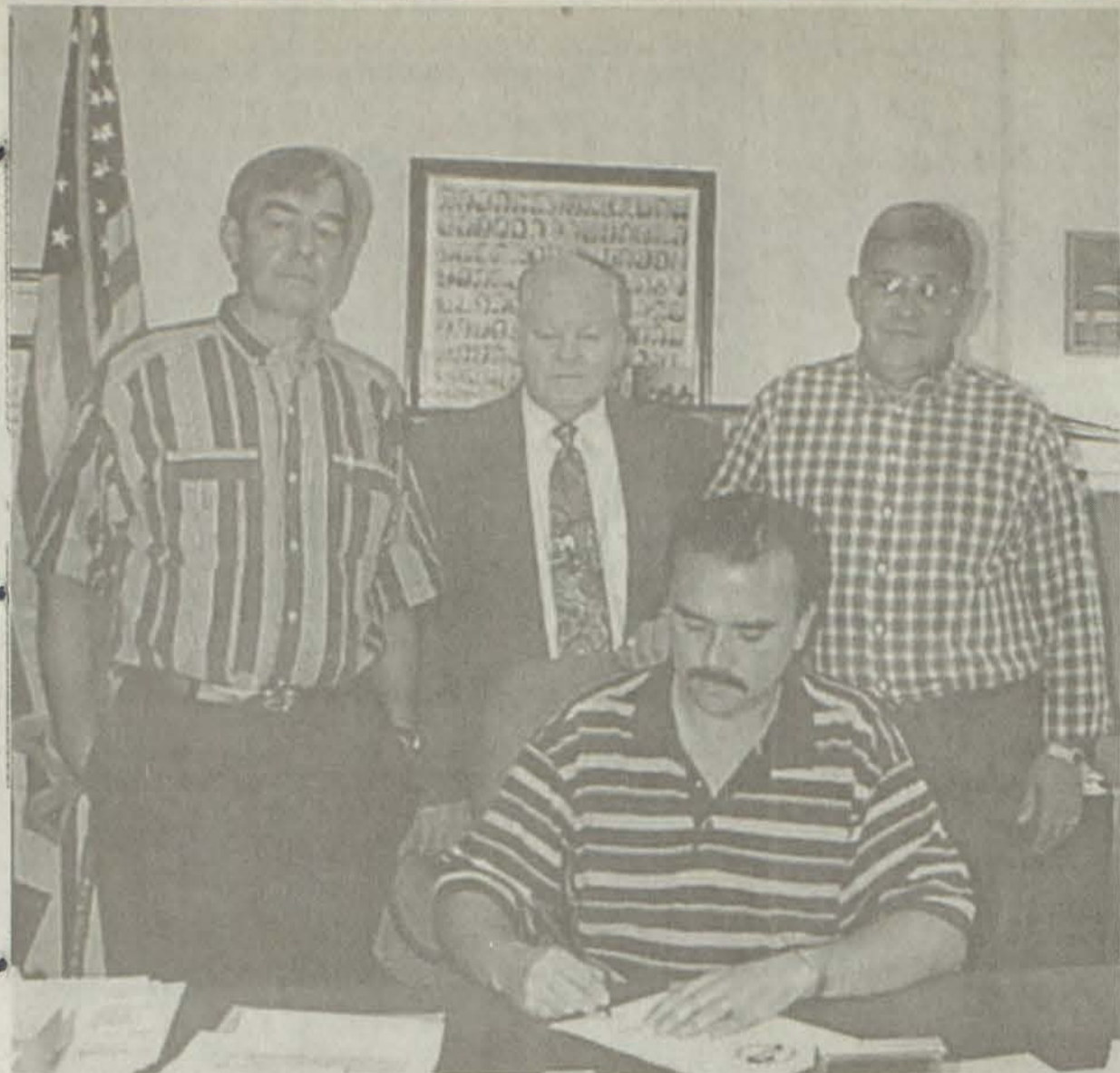

# Floyd named to national leadership roles

Dr. Deborah L. Floyd, president of Prestonsburg Community College, has accepted an invitation to serve as Chair of the Publications and Public Relations Commission of the American Association of Community Colleges. "Serving on this national board and the commissions helps afford our college and region opportunities to be heard on issues that impact our mission and communities."

David Pierce, AACC president, said, "The special commissions established by the American

Association of Community Colleges serve as key advisory groups to our board and our administrative staff. We see them as a direct link to our colleges and their students. "Our senior citizens are precious, because they have handed down to this generation, the heritage of our mountain people," he said, adding "this wisdom benefits us all."

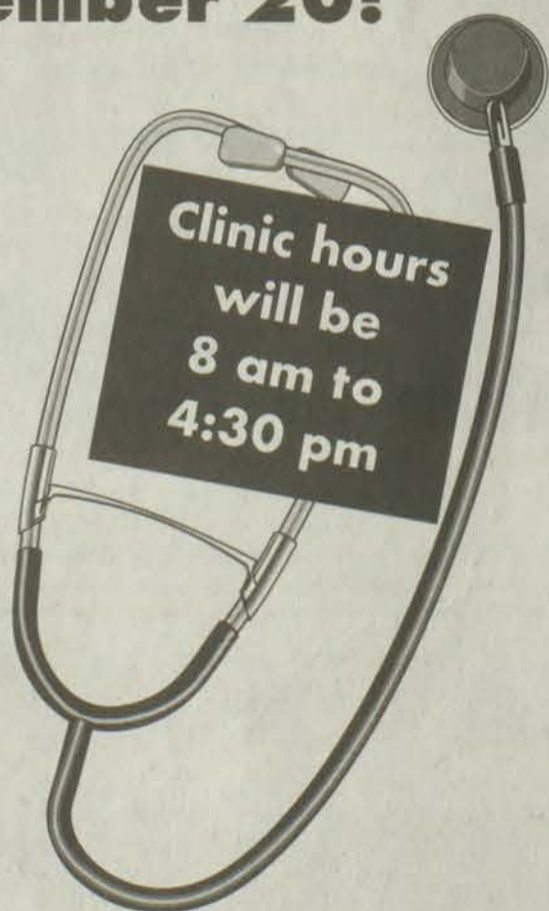

# Ortega, Hall lead Prestonsburg offense in district win

## Yellowjackets honor Coach Chandler in mentor's final game

Whitesburg head football coach Doug Chandler has been a fixture at Whitesburg High School and across the state of Kentucky, is considered one of the top coaches in the Commonwealth.

But this past Friday night, the Yellowjacket's coach was honored as he coached his final football game, and it had to be against Prestonsburg. It appeared the whole city of Whitesburg turned out for the happening, but Prestonsburg

was very well represented as well with Blackcat fans.

While the media was in full force for the occasion, it was Prestonsburg coming home with a 29-3 win over the Yellowjackets to go 1-0 in district play and 2-1 overall. Prestonsburg's defense held Whitesburg to just 157 yards total offense, 130 on the ground and 37 in the air.

Junior John Ortega ran at will against the Whitesburg defense rushing for 159 yards and scoring two touchdowns. Junior quarterback Adam Hall hit Ortega with a 72 yard touchdown toss and had 104 yards passing for the game. Ortega had two catches for 101 yards. Neil Hamilton caught a pass on a two-point conversion play.

The Blackcats were playing their first game without fullback Jeremy Caudill, who was hurt during the Sheldon Clark game two weeks ago. But coach John Derossset got good support out of the backfield in Seth Crisp, Grant Castle, Dennis Lafferty and Hank Mullins.

Lafferty played both sides of the football and was a torment to the Whitesburg offense with 12 tackles and a fumble recovery. Bill Willis had 11 tackles and he also recovered a fumble. Nathan Leslie had a blocked punt attempt.

Prestonsburg led 8-0 after the first quarter on a touchdown run by Ortega and Hamilton's conversion catch. Whitesburg found little running room against the Blackcats' front line, who seem to be getting

stronger with each game.

On their third possession of the game in the second quarter, Whitesburg drove the ball down to the Prestonsburg 29 where the Blackcat defense held with Mark Branham and Willis leading the line. Prestonsburg took over at their own 25 and it took only two plays for the Blackcats to make it a 14-0 game. Ortega rushed for 14 yards for a first down and Hall handed the fleet-footed back the ball at the 39 yard line where he scampered 61 yards for a touchdown.

On the ensuing kickoff, Whitesburg returned the ball 32-yards to mid-field and drove the ball to the Prestonsburg 24, but had to settle for a 42 yard field goal to make it a 14-3 game.

It took Prestonsburg only two plays to make it a 22-3 game. Hall connected with Ortega for a 72 yard touchdown pass and Castle ran the two-point conversion with 1:35 left in the second quarter. The score stood up at the half.

The final touchdown of the game came in the fourth for Prestonsburg. On a second-and-eight, Hall broke tackle and jaunted into the end zone from 18-yards out for the touchdown. Brooks Stinnett added the PAT for the 29-3 margin. The touchdown was set up when Leslie blocked a Whitesburg punt attempt and gave the football to the Blackcats on the Yellowjackets 26 yard line.

Prestonsburg (2-1) will travel to Cawood this Friday night.

# Raiders run past Phelps 36-26 in first district win

## Mays rushes for 273 yards, scores three TDs

Everyone, including the Phelps Hornets, just knew that the South Floyd Raiders were going to air it out last Friday night in district football play at Brackett Field in Wheelwright. It was a no-doubter.

The game started that way with Raider quarterback Nick Compton opening up in the shotgun. But it was the running game of South Floyd that did the Hornets in as coach Donnie Daniels ballclub ran all the way to a 36-26 win over the Hornets.

Scatback, Ketrin Mays, had a career high 273 yards on 21 carries and scored three touchdowns to lead the offense for South Floyd. When the Raiders did throw the ball, they were successful against the Phelps secondary. Compton completed six of nine passes for 113 yards passing.

South Floyd's defense, which looked shaky at the start, held the Hornets to a touchdown in the second half.

"Shane McCray and James Walker played a heckuva defensive

game for us," said the South Floyd coach. "Nick had two big time hits."

Compton took Shawn Clusky out on a play that made the fans yell "ouch."

It was a come-from-behind affair for the Raiders as their defense spotted Phelps a 12-0 lead. A turnover set up the first Hornet score when Matthew Robinette intercepted a Compton pass and returned it to the South Floyd 1-yard line before being dragged down. On the first play from scrimmage, Robinette ran into the end zone for the TD.

Doing the Arthur Murray routine, 1-2-3-kick, South Floyd gave the ball back to the Hornets. It took only six plays for the Hornets to take a 12-point advantage when Billy Peck scampered 37 yards for the touchdown.

With 1:52 to play in the first quarter, the Raiders completed a six play, 70 yard drive to get on the scoreboard. Mays broke two tackles and jaunted 29 yards for his first touchdown, making it a 12-6 score.

It was three downs and out for Phelps on their next possession, and Mays put on a clinic on how to avoid tackles when he raced 76 yards for a touchdown that tied the game at 12-12. Mays side-stepped several would-be tacklers and broke into the open field after five missed

him.

The game was a fan's treat if they liked a lot of scoring. Phelps wasted little time in regaining the lead, marching 67 yards on ten plays where Peck scored from 3 yards out and the two point conversion by Luke McCoy gave the Hornets a 20-12 lead. Peck had 28 yards rushing on the drive.

A face masking call on Phelps helped the Raiders to get deep into Hornet territory where Mays went up the middle and to the left for a 24 yard touchdown run. He added the two-point conversion to tie the game at 20.

Phelps had the football in the red zone at the South Floyd 14 yard line, but the Raider defense met the challenge and held the Hornets with the score tied 20-20 at the half.

Shawn McCoy and Peck teamed to start the third quarter and sparked a Phelps drive that started at their own 35, and concluded on a 3 yard run by Peck for a touchdown and a 26-20 Phelps lead. It was the fourth touchdown of the game for Peck.

A breakdown in the Hornets' front line allowed the Raiders to come back and take their first lead of the game. Compton, on a keeper, busted his way up the middle on a third-and-one play. But he got more than just the first down.

# Rebel's clash goes to Tolsia as Allen Central falls 54-0

The Tolsia (W.Va.) Rebels scored on eight of their ten possessions and manhandled the Allen Central Rebels 54-0 in intra-state football last Friday night at the Don Daniels Athletic Complex.

It was the fourth consecutive loss for Allen Central, who is still looking for their first win of the season. They have lost 12 straight, going back to last season.

Tolsia was too much, too big, too quick and too experienced for the young Allen Central team, who did not quit, but played hard.

The Allen Central defense gave up 277 yards on the ground to the

visiting Rebels as 11 players carried the ball during the game. Mike Boone, a junior, had six carries for 91 yards while sophomore Steve Vanhoose rushed for 73 yards on 11 attempts.

Tolsia used three different quarterbacks with starting signal caller, Dan Dillion, completing two of three passes for 38 yards.

It was all minus yardage for Hall, Rodney Bentley, Jim Branham and Sizemore for Allen Central. Sizemore was sacked in the end zone for a safety.

It didn't take Tolsia long to get on the scoreboard as they scored on a 3-yard run by Boone to lead 6-0. On a punt attempt by Allen Central, Jonathan Ellis was hit hard and the ball came loose with Rose picking up the football and walking into the end zone for a 12-0 Tolsia lead.

After the interception by Marcum, it took three plays for Tolsia to score on a 9-yard run by Boone with 3:35 left in the first quarter.

After a three-and-out possession for Allen Central, Tolsia scored with 40 seconds showing on the clock and led 24-0 after the first quarter.

Tolsia added a touchdown early in the second period and took a 33-0 lead to the locker room at the half.

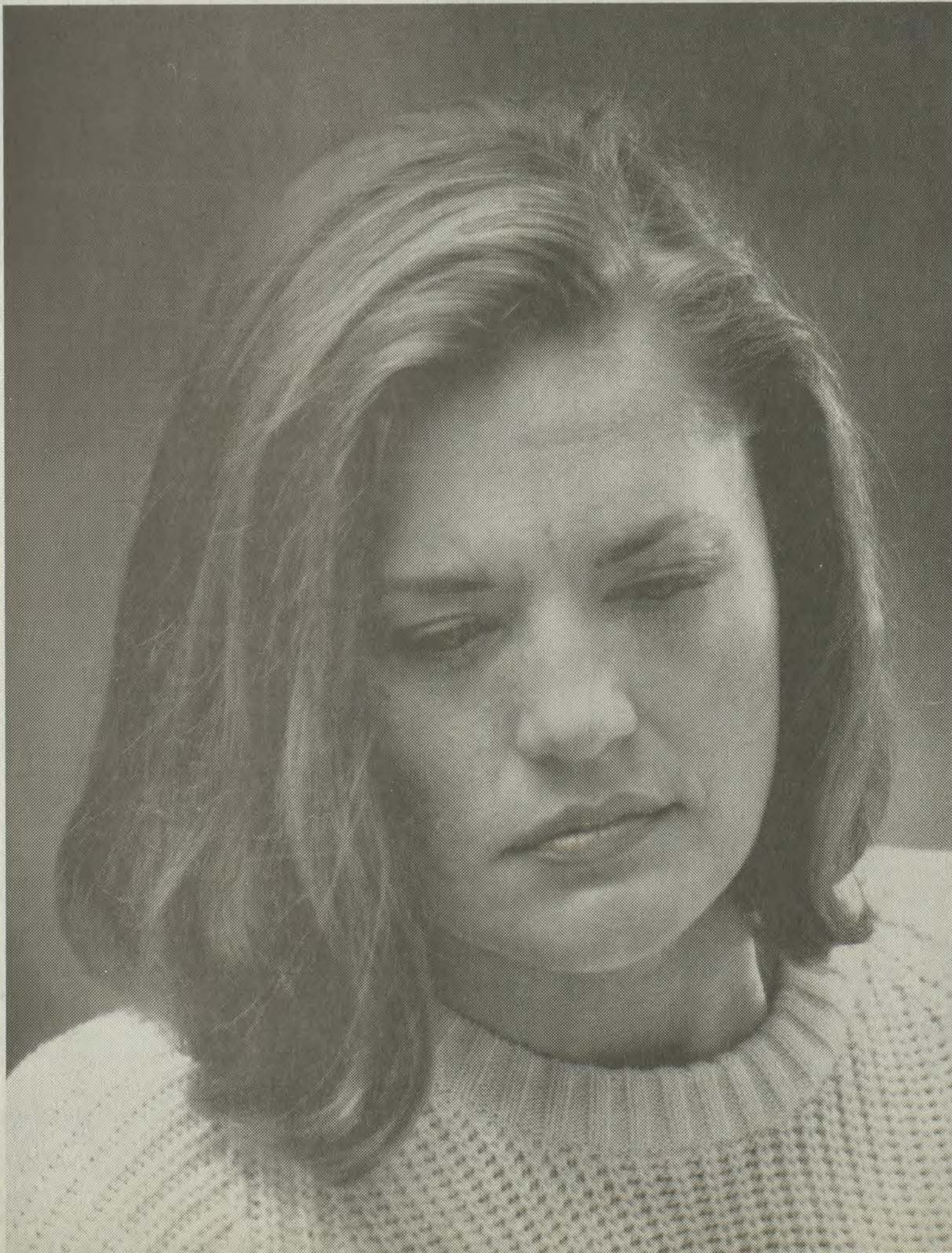

They are taking that love and spreading it around in helping the Muscular Dystrophy Association (MDA) of Central and Eastern Kentucky.

"It is something we want to do," said Shawn Blackburn of the local Prestonsburg H.O.G. chapter. "Our main purpose is to raise money for the MDA."

The local Chapter 1652 will hold their fourth annual Fall Benefit and Pig Roast at Archer Park, Sunday, September 28. Last year they delivered a check for \$15,000 in funds raised from the benefit and pig roast.

"We had about 400 people and a couple hundred bikers," said Blackburn. "By the time everyone brings their families and friends, you have a good turnout."

"It keeps getting bigger every year," said Sherry Adkins, an employee at the local cycle shop. "It is a family atmosphere. We don't allow any alcoholic beverages in the park. There are games for the kids to play."

H.O.G. stands for Harley Owners Group, a national organization through the Harley-Davidson Motorcycle Company.

"Each dealer is divided in a local chapter," explained Blackburn. "They have always been big in raising money for the MDA. We're just the local chapter that sponsors it."

The day will begin at approximately 9 a.m. with registration for the 70-mile Poker Run. Riders will begin to depart the park area at 10 a.m. with the last bike leaving at 11 a.m.

"We get a person to head up the Poker Run," said Blackburn. "He will go out and make a course. Probably around the lake, the dam, go through Paintsville, what-

ever. It will start at the park that morning. We have this board with a deck of cards on it. They will flip the arrow, where it lands that is your first card."

Each biker will collect three more cards while running the course, and a fifth one upon their return to the park.

"Someone will initial a sheet to what each rider has gotten,"

explained Blackburn. "Then they will go through the sheets and whoever has the best hand wins. The top two or three win. We give door prizes for that."

Persons taking in the benefit show will enjoy the music of Dwight Whitley, the brother of a famed U.S. 23 Country Music Star, the late Keith Whitley.

Dwight always worked closely with Keith in his music endeavors and now is being well received by everyone as an artist in his own right.

Whitley was nominated for male vocalist of the year, county division by the Academy of Independent Recording Artists.

"This year makes our fourth year as host of the fall-fest and we've always enjoyed strong local support," said Wes Blackburn, owner of the local cycle shop. Harley-Davidson Motor Company has been a tremendous supporter of MDA for 17 years and encourages all of its dealers around the country to host events."

To date, the Prestonsburg Harley-Davidson dealership has raised over \$35,000 with hopes of

going over the \$40,000 mark this year.

"There's a lot of gratification in doing this," said Adkins. "It is good to see where your money goes knowing you are helping someone else."

"It is just a way to get out, ride and have fun," said Blackburn. "Most of our riders are local."

"We have had some people come from Lexington, and Paducah," said Adkins. "Last year we had some from Cincinnati."

The fun actually gets started on Saturday night, although there will be no activities.

"We will have someone in the chapter who will go over to the park and roast a pig," said Shawn. "We'll have plenty to eat."

Ten dollars will get you in the gate, let you eat and enjoy the live entertainment. You can watch the field events or compete in them if you wish. Children under 12 are admitted free.

"We'll have events such as slow race, tire toss, stud run and barrel roll," said Adkins.

The local chapter is also involved in raising money for the Shriner's Hospital.

"I think we raised \$6,000 for them last year," said Blackburn. "We have given them about \$10,000 over the years."

"Last year we had two people from our chapter go to San Francisco to present the MDA check on Jerry Lewis's Telethon," related Adkins. The two were Ellen Adams and Tammy Newsome.

"All of this. It does make you feel good," said Adkins.

Spreading a little love and some sunshine to help others who are less fortunate is the dream of the local Prestonsburg H.O.G. Chapter. Because of their concern and hard work, someone else is going to benefit from the "benefit" they will hold on September 28. Get out, join in and have a good time. Feel good about yourself.

## Irony Dept.: Hilltoppers, UofL fake, Haskins and Jagers top the hit parade

 ✓ Best college football team in Kentucky this season? Using prevailing criteria — numbers and entertainment, has to be Western Kentucky. The Hilltoppers are perfect in three starts, ranked in the Top 20. And for entertainment the 'Tops have a 3-overtime 52-50 victory over Murray State and a comeback 37-21 victory at Eastern. Attention tailgaters, WKU's next two games are at home.  
 ✓ UofL resorts to a (Hal Mumme inspired?) fake punt play to get the Cards going toward a 26-14 victory over Illinois.  
 ✓ Lemme get this straight, oft maligned ex-UK quarterback Billy Jack Haskins completed 30 of 40 passes(!), three for touchdowns as Rhode Island won 35-21 Saturday?  
 ✓ Also at Rhode Island U., officials are working hard to wedge Lamar Odom into college, even as a part-time student. No, no, it has nothing to do with his being a 6-foot-9 basketball phenom. In Lexington, Ky. meanwhile, KHSAA officials are working hard applying rules to prevent high

school students from playing football if they are 19 years old.  
 ✓ When North Hardin came from ahead to lose at home to Madisonville two weeks ago, it stymied coach Joe Jagers' chance to post a win at Fort Knox last week that would have made him the state's winningest coach. Now tied for most coaching wins, and with unbeaten and ranked Central Hardin (3-0), Bowling Green (2-0) and Class A power Beechwood coming up next, Jagers may have to wait another month to stand at the mountain top.

### NEW MR. FOOTBALL HOPEFUL?

New face in the crowd? Dennis Johnson and Julius Yeast of Harrodsburg, Bernard Jackson of St. Xavier remain the marquee names to earn Kentucky Mr. Football '97. However, as on-field numbers stack up, pencil in Jeremy Britt.

Off an incredible performance last week, Warren East's stealthy little running back injected himself into the Mr. Football mix. A 5-8,

160-pound running back, Britt's 486 rushing yards, 57 carries and eight touchdowns against Owensboro raised eyebrows and rightly so. All are new state records.

Consider for a moment, only the second record and the durability it required. At 5-feet-eight-inches and 160 pounds, Britt carried the football 57 times in a 48-minute game. The only thing more incredible is he gained very nearly the length of five football fields. Jeremy Britt. If he shows as much promise in the classroom and on campus as he has so far on a football field, then his name belongs alongside all the other Mr. Football candidates.

On a broader plain, Britt's numbers, along with 9 touchdown passes in a game by Male QB Gerry Ahrens, brings attention to the remarkable numbers blitz happening in Kentucky high school football the last decade.

The KHSAA has become not only a clearing house for statistics submitted by various athletic programs, but for blending them with standing records, adding to football tradition, at least on the offensive

side of the football.

Publication of items such as Britt eclipsing records held by Thomas Walker at Fulton County (472 yards rushing, 1973), Kevin Crisp's 41 rushes for North Bullitt, and Derek Homer's touchdown record (eight) gives fans points of reference, and adds to the growing interest in high school football records and statistics.

Currently, the numbers watch involves retired coach Walter Brugh and his 280 victories at Paintsville. Going into last Friday's action, North Hardin's Joe Jagers had 279 coaching wins and his march toward becoming the state's winningest coach stirs more interest in the sport.

All these 'yard markers' enrich and showcase football's traditions in a commonwealth alleged to be a basketball state.

If you like to compare, the Kentucky Wildcats will be on ESPN six times, CBS five, ABC and Fox one time each. The Wildcats will be Jefferson-Pilot's feature game seven times. Four home games will be offered via tape-delay.

For intersectional star-power, Louisville's winter card is clearly more attractive than Kentucky's — North Carolina, Purdue, Ga. Tech, Kentucky, Arkansas, St. John's, Syracuse and UCLA.

UK — Clemson, George Washington, Arizona (probably), Purdue, Indiana, Ga. Tech, Louisville and Villanova.

UoFL and UK have what we might call, exotic exhibitions. The Cardinals play Israel Nov. 22 in Freedom Hall. UK hosts Court Authority Nov. 11.

Meanwhile, Western Kentucky's schedule was released as well. The Hilltoppers, after two exhibitions, open (and close?) NIT play at Kansas.

Does it rattle anyone else when tournament planners kowtow so shamelessly to television directors? At least the NIT(wits) could have allowed Western the home floor.

Western has some attractive non-Sun Belt home dates: Xavier visits Dec. 6, Murray on Dec. 21 and Clemson Dec. 30.

## A generation of survivors

I wouldn't swap my childhood in a 1940s Eastern Kentucky coal camp for a pickup truck.

As anyone who ever lived in one can attest, regardless of what appeared over the post office door, a coal camp back then provided a different way of life.

That comes as no surprise, though, because the industry that spawned them was as unique and intriguing as any Louis L'Amour novel. Unlikely heroes whose brave deeds were heralded, then quickly forgotten, popped up on a near-daily basis, as victims to those ever-present accidents-ready-to-happen which techniques of the day afforded, were dragged to daylight.

Ironically, depending on the season, most of the time these mountains seemed perfectly benign. Whether appearing completely sterile from a three-inch blanket of new-fallen snow, or in autumn, resembling a grandmother's patch-work quilt stitched with every bright color her rag bag would provide, our hills were often nothing more than well-camouflaged traps, set to maim, or even snatch the breath from those brave enough to crawl into their depths.

The children (of both sexes) of the miners who perished beneath these hills, as well as those fortunate enough to survive long enough to have their lungs eaten away by years of accu-

mulating rock dust (officially diagnosed as silicosis) sprang from an environment that absolutely demanded they be tough. They learned the lessons of life by playing and fighting ... together. And, together, they fought any outsider (usually defined as anyone from

another holler or from town) who threatened their territory. But, whether standing alone, or back-to-back with a coal-camp comrade, they managed to somehow grow to adolescence, then into full adulthood.

Children of survivors of an industry that sometimes forced its participants to donate body parts, from single digits to entire limbs, in order to, as the song says "owe my soul to the company store" so that food would be on their tables and roofs over their heads, became hardened, yet compassionate. They eventually fought wars on foreign soil, many returning to seek employment themselves on job sites their fathers vowed their children would never visit.

Beginning in the 1950s, many of the big companies, thinking they'd had enough, left Eastern Kentucky. What remained was a hardy generation of survivors ... coal miners' kids ... who know the meaning of hard work; who are doing whatever is necessary to ensure a better life for their own children; who will forever appreciate the sacrifices of parents who struggled in an industry that demanded so much.

## Caring father important for adolescents

While Americans celebrate fathers once a year on Father's Day, many take them for granted the rest of the year. A study of more than 5,500 Kentucky adolescents in grades six through twelve provides an important reminder of just how significant fathers can be on a day-to-day basis.

Results clearly demonstrate that the presence of a caring father is associated with a young person's overall well-being. It also reduces a teenager's likelihood of engaging in high-risk behaviors.

The study compared two groups of teens living with both biological parents. The "high father care" group reported that their fathers always care about them. The "low father care" group consisted of teens who reported that their fathers' care ranged from never to most of the time.

Those in the low care group

are one-and-a-half times more likely to drink beer, wine-and hard liquor and one-and-a-half times more likely to have drunk five or more alcoholic drinks at one time during the past month. They also are four-and-a-half

times more likely to use cocaine or crack and two-and-a-half times more likely to use marijuana.

In addition, teens who do not report high father care are two-and-a-half times more likely to report that will probably drop out before completing high school, two and a half times more likely to say that they have felt

depressed or sad most or all of the time during the past month, five-and-a-half times more likely to report having thought about killing themselves most or all of the time during the past month and three times as likely to have

actually tried to kill themselves.

The differences are very similar both for boys and girls and for middle school and high school students.

While we assume that male role models are particularly important for adolescent boys and seem to think that children need less attention as they get

older, the presence of a caring father appears to be just as significant for daughters as for sons and for older as for younger adolescents.

In order to determine if the mere presence of a father in the house contributes to adolescent well-being, the study compared young people living with single mothers with the two groups living with both biological parents.

While teens living with single mothers score worse on every measure of well-being and risk behavior than teens from two-parent families in the high father care group, they score better on virtually every indicator than teens in the two-parent low father care group.

Similar patterns were found for teens living with their mother and stepfather. Teens living with a single mother generally fare worse than teens with a high care stepfather and better than teens with a low care stepfather.

It appears that fathers do contribute to adolescent well-being.

## Garden Phil-osophy

If you're planting your fall garden by the phrases of the moon and signs of the zodiac, here's the information you'll need for the upcoming week.

### MOON IN DARK PHASE

By the time you read this, the moon should have moved from the light to dark phase, that change having occurred at 1:50 this afternoon. From now until the next new moon—or no moon visible in the sky—on Oct. 1, only those fall-hardy veggies that produce below the ground should be planted.

This full moon is what they call a harvest moon, so if the night's clear go out and have a look at it.

### GREAT PLANTING TODAY

If you have fall planting to do, lay down the paper and head for the garden! With the moon now in the dark phase, you may plant anything that produces beneath the ground today, since the sign is in Pisces (the feet), one of the four fruitful signs.

All planting should cease Wednesday and Thursday, when the sign moves to Aries (the head), one of the killing signs. Wednesday is also an Ember Day, so it's a double

no-no planting day!  
**EMBER DAYS ALSO FRIDAY, SATURDAY**

Outstanding planting should be on tap for Friday and Saturday when the sign moves to Taurus (the neck), one of the fruitful signs. However, like Wednesday, these are Ember Days when no planting should occur at all. Don't ask me why because I can't tell you why—you just shouldn't plant.

Sunday, next Monday and Tuesday find the sign moving to Gemini (the arms), the bean sign, but the moon is in the dark phase and beans produce above the ground, and it's too late for beans now, anyway.

## Tractor safety on roadways

The National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) indicates that between one-third to one-half of fatal farm injuries involve tractors, including accidents on and off the farm.

The summer and autumn seasons

increase the amount of farm traffic on public roadways.

Reduce the risk of accidents involving non-farm vehicles by advance planning. Move your farm equipment when traffic is low, maybe in the early morning or early afternoon hours.

Drivers should plan travel routes well in advance and use proper signage and lighting on their tractors and slow-moving vehicles.

Consider asking someone to drive a car or pickup marking your vehicles as slow-moving. This will reduce the risk of rear-end collisions involving non-farm vehicles.

The extra vehicle should use its hazard signals and follow the slow-moving vehicle by more than 100 yards. If you cannot find a driver for this purpose, use the warning signals

provided on many newer-model tractors. Older tractors can be fitted with battery-powered intermittent lights.

Slow-moving vehicle emblems—bright orange triangle-shaped signs—should be clean and permanently affixed to farm equipment.

In addition, reflectors and reflective tape can be effective during early morning and evening driving.

Reflective tape should be used on both the front and back of farm equipment so motorists can determine the width of your equipment and allow for safe passage.

Whatever system your farm uses, make sure that every driver knows how to use the lights and signage.

When using public roadways, be courteous of the other drivers. When

a string of motorists line up behind you, slow down, pull over to the shoulder as far as possible and allow them to pass safely. Avoid waving motorists on to pass. Drivers may be held liable should an accident occur.

## Sunshine Lines

Senior citizens, in last week's Sunshine Lines column several questions were presented in regard to the transportation needs of the sick and the elderly in Appalachia.

We were taught a lesson in basic economics from a senior citizen right here in Eastern Kentucky. We learned from the remarks this lady shared at a senior citizen center, a few years ago, that it is not always to one's advantage to spend more for transportation than the benefit derived from that expenditure. In this particular situation it would have cost this woman \$20.00 to have someone take her to Pikeville for her monthly allotment of \$17.00 in Food Stamps. (In most situations Food Stamps can be mailed, but theft still occurs.)

To obtain Food stamps is only one reason adequate transportation is needed for the ill and the elderly. We discussed how these folks have basically the same transportation needs familiar to all adults. Just because many of our senior citizens don't drive, or because they don't have family members, friends or neighbors to take them to their appointments, or to care for their personal business matters, does not mean that transportation needs do not exist for them. In fact, the need for non-emergency medical transportation is greatest for this age group. The reasons they have to see their physicians and specialists more often than younger age groups is understandable. The lack of transportation continues to be an ongoing and costly concern for most every senior citizen. Many, who have no way to get to their appointments, put off receiving that care that they need until which time an ambulance is summoned. To wait, until which time one's health has declined to the point that an emergency transport service must be called, is oftentimes fatal.

In preparation for this article, I examined transportation sections of area telephone directories—the first resource most senior citizens turn to

for help. Not much was found in any of them. Then I examined the latest update of the "Directory of Human Resources—A Guide To Services In The Big Sandy Region Of Kentucky." Although this publication is the most thorough resource directory available to professionals in Eastern Kentucky, it does not provide a massive list of non-emergency transportation services. It lists only two.

I dialed the two numbers listed for one of the services. In a few seconds after placing each call a computer enhanced operator recording stated, "You have reached a number that has been disconnected or is no longer in service..." Great! I thought. This transportation situation is a real problem from which we need to be rescued.

The other transportation service this directory lists is Sandy Valley Transportation (SVT). I called its local number. You've probably seen these vans around town. If you're a member of your local senior citizen center you have probably ridden in one. Anyway, a pleasant, articulate young lady answered in a warm, professional manner. I asked to talk with the director of SVT, Mr. Greg Hamlin. We arranged a meeting for early next week to discuss SVT, and the non-emergency services it offers. I feel there are some misconceptions about this transportation service. Senior citizens, do you know that there is a specific reason why this service charges 50 cents a mile to transport you to and from your doctor, or to UK or to another distant medical facility?

After my interview with Greg Hamlin I'll share more with you next week in "Sunshine Lines" about this transportation program and how it might be of assistance to you or to someone in need.

Just remember, SVT is not big enough to answer all the transportation needs of the ill and aged in Eastern Kentucky. At this point, I am of the opinion it does what it can, with the funding resources it has, to provide transportation for people in the Big Sandy area.

He will discuss your problem with you and make every effort to put you in contact with an agency that might be able to help you solve your problem.

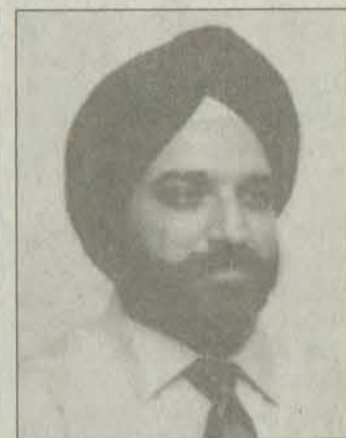

**ORDINANCE NO. 8-97 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PRESTONSBURG, KENTUCKY, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 4-88 RELATING TO THE RECREATION, TOURIST AND CONVENTION COMMISSION.**

WHEREAS: The City of Prestonsburg has duly enacted an ordinance establishing a recreation, convention and tourism commission in Ordinance No. 4-88, codified as Sec 118 et. seq., of the Ordinances of the City of Prestonsburg; and;

WHEREAS: KRS 91A.360 (1) provides that the commission shall be made up of 7 members, with various methods of nomination, and;

WHEREAS: In order to make the ordinances of the City of Prestonsburg conform to directions given in the Kentucky Revised Statutes,

BE IT THEREFORE ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PRESTONSBURG, KENTUCKY AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: That Chapter 118 of the Code of Ordinance be amended to read as follows:

SECTION 118.02 MEMBERS  
(A) The Recreation, Tourist and Convention Commission shall consist of seven members to be appointed by the Mayor as follows:

(1) Three commissioners from a list of six or more names submitted by the local hotel and motel association in the city and if no local association exists, then up to three commissioners shall be appointed from a list of six or more names of persons residing within the jurisdiction of the commission submitted by the Kentucky Hotel and Motel Association.

(2) One commissioner from a list of three or more names submitted by the local restaurant association in the city and if no local association exists, then one commissioner shall be appointed from a list of three or more names of persons residing within the jurisdiction of the commission, submitted by the Kentucky Restaurant Association.

(3) One commissioner from a list of three or more names submitted by the Floyd County Chamber of Commerce.

(4) Two commissioners appointed by the Mayor.

(B) Terms of the Commission members shall be for three years, except that in making the three appointments, two commissioners will have a one-year term, two commissioners will have a three-year term; and two commissioners will have four-year terms.

(C) Commission members shall serve without compensation.

(D) All vacancies on the Commission shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointments are made.

**SECTION 118.04 POWERS AND DUTIES**

The Recreation, Tourist, and Convention Commission shall have all the rights, powers, duties and obligations prescribed by law relating to the promotion of recreational, convention and tourists activity in the city. It may employ such personnel, subject to the approval or discharge by the Mayor and make such contracts as are necessary to effectively carry out the purposes of KRS 91A.350 through 91A.390. Such contracts may include but shall not be limited to the procurement of promotional services, advertising services, and other services and materials relating to tourist and convention business; provided however, that such contracts be made only with persons, organizations, and firms with experience and qualifications for providing promotional services and materials, such as advertising firms, chambers of commerce, publishers, and printers.

**SECTION 118.06 ANNUAL REQUEST FOR FUNDS**

(A) The Recreation, Tourist, and Convention Commission shall annually submit to the City Council a request for funds for the operation of the Commission for the ensuing year. The Council shall include the Commission in its annual budget and shall provide funds to the extent it deems necessary, for the operation of the Commission in its annual budget.

(B) The Recreation, Tourist, and Convention Commission shall include in its annual budget fund for the costs of maintenance, acquisition, construction and operation of city park facilities useful in the attraction and promotion of tourists and convention business, including athletic facilities. The Recreation, Tourist and Convention Commission shall budget 33% of the Hotel, Motel and Restaurant tax, to the City Park Commission for such purposes.

The Recreation, Tourist and Convention Commission shall meet annually with Park Commission prior to the preparation of the Recreation, Tourist and Convention Commission's budget to determine the amount of funds to be allocated to the park system. The City recognizes Archer Park and any other city recreational parks existing now or hereafter established, to be major attraction for visitors to the area, and it is the intent of this chapter to provide sufficient funding to the city park system to maintain city recreational facilities at a high level for future growth and development of the city's tourism economy. The Recreation, Tourist and Convention Commission shall budget 34% of the Hotel, Motel

and Restaurant tax to the acquisition, construction and operation of the Mountain Arts Center, home of the Kentucky Opry, and the total of this amount may be pledged to the bonded indebtedness for the life of the bonds.

SECTION 2: All ordinances, or any parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby expressly repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 3: This Ordinance shall become effective upon adoption and publication as required by law.

**Taking Charge of Your TV**

By Joan Dykstra, President, National PTA and Decker Anstrom, President, National Cable Television Association

(NAPS)—Parents and television have a love/hate relationship as parents struggle to control what and how much their children watch. Now, the cable television industry and the National PTA have found a way to give parents tools to take charge of television and address concerns about violence and commercialism. Together, we have developed a project—called the Family and Community Critical Viewing Project—that educates parents, teachers and children to be active and smarter television viewers.

First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton and Congressman Billy Tauzin of Louisiana, the Chairman of the House Telecommunications subcommittee, joined us in unveiling the latest element of our critical viewing program—a video, available free, featuring Rosie O'Donnell. In the new video, called "Taking Charge of Your TV," O'Donnell introduces parents to "critical viewing" and offers basic information about how parents can talk to their children about television.

Through critical viewing skills, parents are encouraged to set rules about TV-watching and stick to those rules, and to watch and talk about TV with their children. While some suggest dealing with concerns about TV by just turning it off, or getting rid of it entirely, for many parents that is neither realistic nor desirable. After all, television contains many programs that inform, educate and entertain in positive ways. Instead, the video suggests that parents can help their children be more selective and savvy viewers.

The video—produced by HBO in consultation with the American Medical Association and the American Academy of Pediatrics—encourages parents to help their children question what they see and hear on television. Parents might draw kids' attention to inappropriate behavior, acknowledge positive role models, or discuss how certain people are stereotyped. To keep their children from becoming desensitized to violence, parents can point out that while violence may appear funny or thrilling on television, in real life the results are quite different. The video also addresses commercialism by suggesting that parents remind children that advertisers want viewers to buy their products.

Children who learn to be smarter, more critical TV viewers will learn to be smarter, more critical information consumers. Critical viewing is, after all, an exercise in critical thinking.

(NAPS)—When a natural disaster such as a flood, hurricane, tornado, earthquake or fire sweeps through a community, it does not discriminate. ## SPINACH-CHEESE BALLS

2 cans (14 ounces each) Popeye or Sunshine Chopped Spinach, well-drained  
2 cups herb seasoned stuffing mix  
1 to 1 1/2 cups shredded mozzarella cheese  
1/4 to 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese  
1/2 cup butter or margarine, melted  
2 to 3 eggs

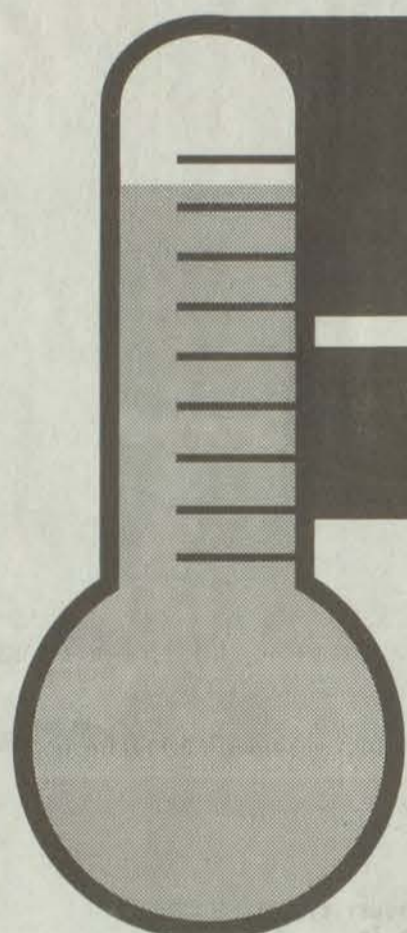
