## Betting site is a no-go

Owners of ThunderRidge racetrack in Floyd County have withdrawn an application to operate a betting site in the city of Ashland.

Ashland residents and city officials opposed ThunderRidge's application, saying they had no prior knowledge of the company's intent.

Under legislation passed earlier this year by the General Assembly, track owners can apply to operate a center because the definition of a racetrack was amended. The definition includes any property owned, leased or purchased by a track within a 60-mile radius. Before the bill was passed, facilities had to be located in the same county as the track.

Also, the requirement that local elected officials be notified 10 days before an application is considered by the Kentucky Racing Commission was deleted from the legislation that was passed this year.

Ashland city officials didn't find out about ThunderRidge's owners' intention to locate an extension of the track in the city until after it was approved by the racing commission.

Gil Johnson, an attorney in Lexington that represents ThunderRidge, informed the racing commission last week that the company intends to withdraw its application.

Johnson said concerns raised by Ashland officials and residents was the reason the application was pulled.

Some state lawmakers were caught off guard by the language passed in House Bill 566 changing the regulations and will ask that it be deleted.

State Senator Charles Borders, a

## Jesse Jackson will visit Mud Creek Clinic

The Rev. Jesse Jackson will be in Floyd County Monday, September 21, to look at the plight of people in Appalachia.

As part of his "Leave No One Behind Tour," the Rev. Jackson plans to visit the

Mud Creek Community Health Clinic at Grethel at 11:30 a.m., Monday.

Jackson, a civil rights activist and former presidential candidate, is touring the Appalachian areas of Eastern Kentucky, Ohio, and West Virginia beginning Saturday.

Jackson, who is president of the Rainbow/PUSH Coalition, says that

poverty has no racial barriers.

"We must talk about changing the national debate," Jackson said in announcing his tour.

"Blacks hold no monopoly on poverty. Most poor people are white, female and young. Poverty still grips Appalachia, a region populated by some 25 million predominantly white people.

"Coal is no longer king there and the industry has failed to diversify. The gaps between rich and poor, black and white, demand structural solutions. Those who aspire to lead America into the new millennium must refocus the debate if America

## Family member definition clarified by ethics commission

The Floyd County Ethics Commission wants to change the fiscal court's definition of "family member," in its hiring procedures.

Floyd County Judge-Executive Ben Hale said he will ask members of the commission to present their recommendation Friday at the next meeting of the fiscal court.

At a meeting with fiscal court members in August, the commission changed the fiscal court's defi-

nition of "family member" to mean spouse, parent, child, brother, sister, mother-in-law, father-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, grandparent, grandchild, aunt, uncle, niece, or nephew.

That definition met with opposition, according to John Rosenberg, who serves on the Ethics Commission. Rosenberg said that the county court was "more inclined to a narrow definition which would be limited to spouse, parent, or child and perhaps include brother and sister."

"Americans are being left behind. We need economic expansion, inclusion and shared growth. Cultural blinders that restrict the flow of resources and leave so many communities underserved and underutilized must give way to a new and broader American vision," Jackson said.

Jackson will meet with the United Mine Workers and members of the Black Lung Association in Pikeville at 9 a.m., Monday and will speak at an outdoor rally at 10 a.m.

He then travels to Mud Creek on a fact-finding tour, according to Mud Creek Clinic founder, Eula Hall.

"I was excited that he would come here," Hall said. "We're honored. I want him to see what we're trying to do to help people ... A lot of people can't afford health care. If it wasn't for the clinic, a lot of people wouldn't get help. I want him to see how vital our clinics are. There should be a clinic in every county in Appalachia."

After the floats are put in the water, canoes will be launched to begin the race. Kayaks will be launched last, James said.

The occasion includes a triathlon that involves the water race, as well as bicycling and running competitions. The triathlon will have divisions for canoes and kayaks.

Canoes can be solo or tandem, James said. Tandem canoes and kayaks can enter as a team. In those competitions, bike and run times will be added together for comparison to other teams, according to the tourism director.

Triathlon competitors will bike approximately 17 miles down a road course from the Paintsville River Ramp to the Jenny Wiley Convention Center. There they'll encounter the trial run on the Jenny Wiley Hiking Trails for the distance run of the 3.5-mile course.

The bikers will be followed from Paintsville to the park and officials will be posted on the trail run for directions and in case of emergencies, James said.

He added that competitors are responsible for their bicycle support, pick up and transportation at the Paintsville River Ramp and at the Jenny Wiley Convention Center Trail Run.

republican from Russell, said he has asked the Legislative Research Commission to rescind all parts of the bill. He said that many members of the legislature were upset by the bill and felt they were misled or given inaccurate information about the issue.

Johnson maintains that the track owners did not try to sneak anything by the community.

"It was neither ARI's (Appalachian Racing Incorporation) or the commission's desire to prevent interested parties from expressing their opinions regarding track expansion requests or any other request which might affect a community in which the track is located or desires to expand its facilities," Johnson said in a letter to the racing commission.

Ashland officials and city leaders in Hopkinsville, where an application for the same type of facility was granted to Kentucky Downs owners, sued in Franklin Circuit Court to stop track owners from opening those facilities. The two cities also mounted a constitutional challenge of House Bill 566.

The lawsuit is pending and officials of those two cities say they want the case to be resolved in court.

The Mud Creek Clinic and its satellite clinics in Magoffin and Martin counties offers health care on a sliding fee scale to low-income families.

The clinics, which are operated by the Big Sandy Health Care, offer dental, pharmaceutical, laboratory, social services, and other primary care services. Patients who qualify for the health care pay a minimum charge of \$10 per prescription, Hall said.

After visiting the Mud Creek Clinic, the Rev. Jackson will travel to Jenkins and Whitesburg to garner

support for a National March for Appalachia in Ohio on Sunday, September 27, where he will hold a rally with UMWA president Cecil Roberts to revitalize Appalachia. Jackson's goal is to have at least 2,000 participants attend the rally with a cross section of demonstrators representing the region in order "to close the gap ... between Appalachia and Wall Street."

"As long as the debate is between black and white, we can never discover what is wrong or right," Jackson said.

The current code of ethics simply states that no county government officer or employee ... shall ... cause the employment, appointment, promotion or transfer, or advancement of a family member, Rosenberg said.

"The definition of family member is important also in determining whether a county government officer or employee acting in his official capacity might have a conflict of interest because of the involvement of a family member in a particular business organization with whom the fiscal court might be considering a relationship," he added.

He explained that the final decision for adoption of the ethics code is in the hands of the Floyd County Fiscal Court and encouraged Floyd County to express their opinions about the issue to members of the fiscal court.

The Floyd County Ethics Commission, which was estab-

lished in 1995, had been involved in two major projects. In addition to reviewing the fiscal court's Code of Ethics, the commission also is ensuring that all officials and candidates comply with the filing requirements of financial disclosure forms, Rosenberg said.

In addition to Rosenberg, members of the Floyd County Ethics Commission are Lorena "Sis" Hall, Peggy Bradford, Patty Murphy, Bobby Joe Akers, and John Richard Porter.

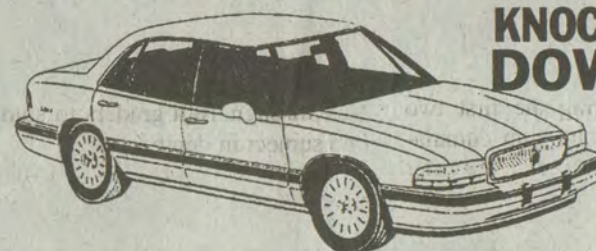

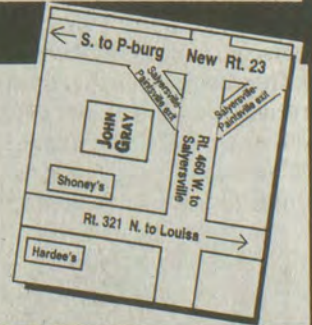

### Having second thoughts

I returned to Prestonsburg following the Gulf War due to the illness of my father. I was on the "Fast Track" in the Army, and was preparing to leave the enlisted ranks for Officer's Candidate School in a couple of months. My intentions were to stay in the military as a career. Dad's condition worsened, and shortly thereafter my mother was killed in an automobile accident, leaving Dad alone and leaving me with little option but to stay here to help Dad with his business and with his health care.

On the first day of this month, Dad passed away. In the days following the funeral, I have been indecisive about what I want to do. There is no real reason for me to stay here, as I have very little family left. My child attends school in Johnson County where my wife teaches at W. R. Castle Elementary, so maybe moving to Johnson or Lawrence County, closer to better employment offered in the Ashland-Huntington area or even moving to the Lexington-Georgetown area would be a good move.

Pilots will understand—I needed to clear my head out and think things out, so I went out and flew around the county for a little while. Flying over Prestonsburg, many things stand out. Foremost is the Golf Course and Recreational project on top of the hill. If everyone could have this view I thought, they would understand what a huge undertaking this has been for our city government.

The next thing I looked down at was the Mountain Arts Center and the new motel next to it. I never

thought I would see those parking lots anywhere near capacity, but there they were, crowded and a line of cars backed up in each direction on the parkway. "Think of all the return on tax dollars invested that this place is getting," I thought.

The following day, I drove the back streets to avoid the school time traffic and noted that many were newly paved and striped. I went downtown to get a haircut and noticed all of the sidewalk work, the fence work, the new parking lot and the fountain park across from the new courthouse. After getting my haircut, I drove down a freshly paved section of Arnold Avenue and as I passed the library, I thought: "This really isn't that bad a place to raise my family."

That afternoon, I took my daughter to play at Archer Park and noticed all of the new renovations that has taken place there; the creek bank, the playground area, the racquetball court, and the picnic area. My daughter fell down while running on the playground and was crying. Before I could get to her to see if she was alright, a park employee helped her up, dusted her off, and was trying to calm her down. "That wouldn't happen in Lexington," I thought.

Today, my daughter and I went bike riding. Our route took us behind Prestonsburg Elementary School where we ran into a friend of mine walking his dog. I asked him what was going on the property behind the school as I could see that a former wooded area had been excavated. "The city is building a neighborhood park stop there sort of like they did

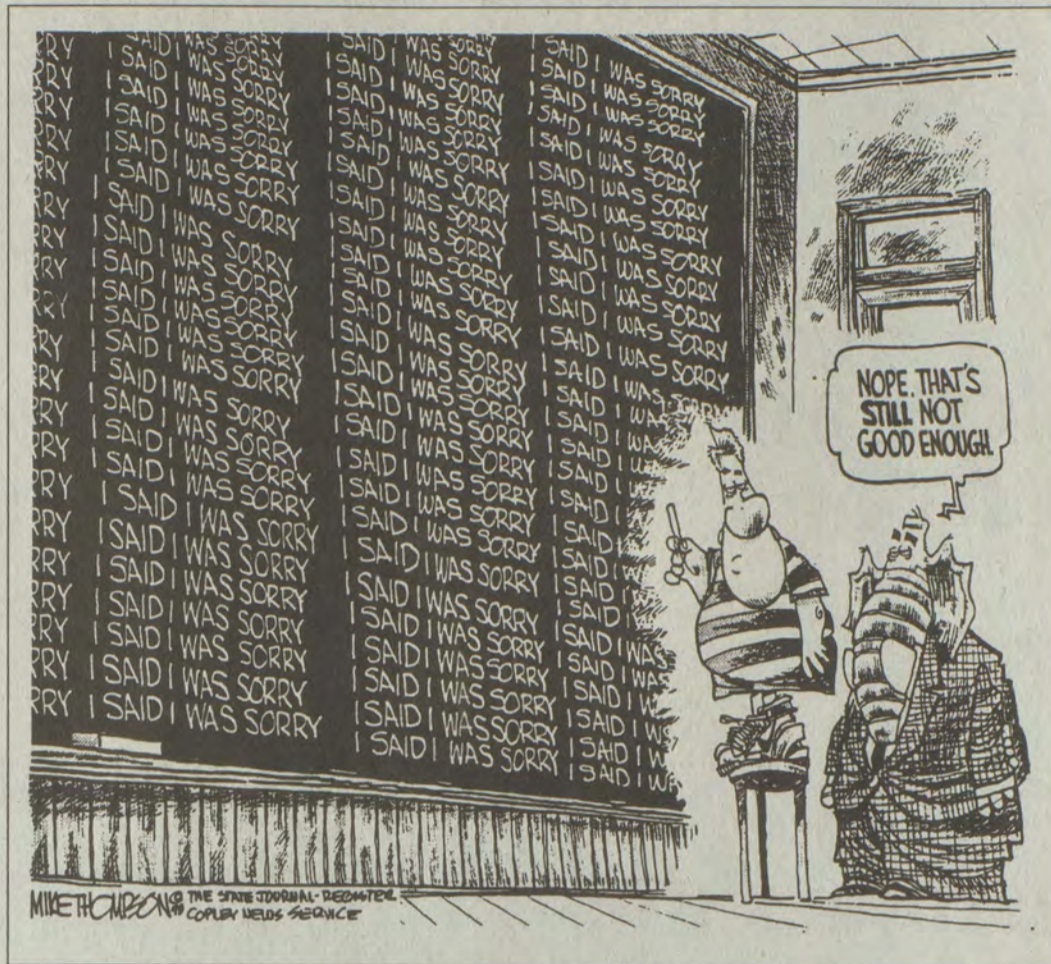

### Options are listed regarding direct mail

Editor:

Your recent item on direct marketing in your column "Better Business Bureau warns..." (July 22, 1998) omitted some important information concerning advertising mail that may be valuable to your readers.

According to the U.S. Postal Service, the average U.S. household receives 2.0 direct mail pieces per day—a small percentage of the hundreds of commercial messages consumers are exposed to every day. Most Americans—nearly 80 percent—read or look at their direct mail; 15 percent discard it unopened. In addition, last year, 130 million Americans made the convenient choice to shop at home, by mail or by phone. Kentucky-based businesses used catalogs, direct mail and direct marketing to generate more than \$14.5 billion in sales in 1997, sustaining more than 253,000 jobs.

Of course, mailers don't want to mail to people who don't enjoy receiving it. For more than 25 years, direct marketers have offered their customers options to limit individual consumer names and addresses from being shared with other marketers for commercial purposes. These options come in the form of "company-specific mailing preference services." The choice is left up for the individual consumer.

Consumers can ask the companies with which they do business not to make their names available to other marketers. Individual consumers will still receive mail from companies they know, but reduce other related mail offers.

Or consumers can choose to send their home name and address to The DMA Mail Preference Service at the address published, where their names will remain on the free mailing-list name-removal service for five years. Because the lists are reviewed quarterly, it may take three months to six months to notice a reduction in the delivery of direct mail pieces.

The Mail Preference Service deletes the consumer's name from most national mailing lists including: catalogs, magazine subscription notices, major non-profit groups solicitations, credit card offers, sweepstakes, and other national mail. MPS does not affect local advertisements. If consumers do not enjoy local advertisements, they may wish to contact them directly.

## School days, School days, Peer pressure— positive or negative?

There does not seem to be any indication of when the concept of peer pressure really began, since it has been around for years. Like so many things in our lives, "peer pressure" has come into its own via the media using it to explain many of our youths' social and legal woes. Usually peer pressure as we know it today becomes obvious in middle school years and probably peaks during high school. Most likely, more college coeds want to be "me." However, the extremes have toddlers in the sand box wanting the same toy as playmates versus retirees wanting to bunch up together in a Florida trailer park.

Although negative peer pressure has always received the most attention with its corruptive tendencies, positive peer pressure can actually be quite good for everyone. In addition, parents and adolescents can influence the type and amount of peer pressure experienced by teenagers, as well as their response.

Even though we all like to think of ourselves as unique, we still get all bent out of shape when we realize that we really are not fitting in with the crowd we desire to match. Just think about all of those "love children" of the 1960s who tried to be different and did their "own thing." At our present local level, there are young people who "just have to have or do" what others want. Guess it would not be too bad, if the youngsters' wants stayed with designer jeans. But, what about the kid who has to have a go-cart and/or a 4-wheeler, and who are prone to have such immature judgment while playing with friends? Then, what about the high school teen with his "just have to have" red pick-up truck that is cleaner than his rooms? Families often make sacrifices for him to have enough money in his pocket to buy what he wants, even if it is a substance of his choice—alcohol or drugs. Is he prepared for meetings with his "friends" who may tease and say put-downs in an effort to get him to do what they want? In contrast, many adolescents do things because that is what they want to do and is not necessarily what their friends are doing. Also, there are instances where some peer pressure helps the young person develop an awareness of what is right or wrong. It is not unusual for an unruly teen to adapt to the guidelines of a sought-after peer group in order to be accepted.

For a teen to stay with the positive things in which he believes, he needs courage, self-confidence, and self-esteem. Most importantly, he has to decide whether or not he takes responsibility for making his decisions or allow someone else make decisions for him. High self-esteem usually supports trust in himself to make good decisions. "These good decisions translate to his Teenage Bill of Rights. He has the right to: change his mind; say "no" and mean it; decide for himself what he thinks is right; be responsible for his own feelings; ask for what he wants; leave a situation where the pressure is too much; and express his opinion, feelings, wants, needs, and desires without manipulating or hurting others. (Wildey, 1996)." Most likely there will always be all kinds of pressure to go along with the crowd and for the individual to do what he wants. Also, if friends value each other as individuals, he will probably have an easier time saying "no" when he wants to say "no."

As with other parts of our children's lives, many possible negative issues related to future relationships as teens can be addressed many years earlier while the children are young. Of course, the parents need and have to be major managers of the situation. Examples include: (1) teach your children by your good example, such as no smoking, drinking, or driving too fast, and saying "no" to a friend when needed; (2) allow your children to be involved in youth groups, such as Boy/Girl Scouts where they can learn to get along with peers and make decisions in a supervised situation; (3) decide together about extra-curricular activities at school. These activities help to increase self-confidence and self-esteem; and (4) follow through with what you say you will do and what you expect—have consistent rules for everyone. Very importantly, parents need to provide a home where children are proud to bring their friends. By all means, parents need to be at home. Thus, parents can get to know their young adolescents' friends and have an opportunity to observe how they treat each other. Even more importantly, parents need to make an effort to meet and know the parents of their teen's friends. Both set of parents need to talk with each other about what their rules are for their teens, and the values they share with their

children. This is a great way to cut out, "Well, everybody else gets to before it can begin."

There are also ways in which parents can assist their teen at the time he is actually experiencing the process of choosing positive peer relationships. Practice assertiveness skills with your teen so he can rehearse saying "no" when you are not there. Allow your teen to talk about possible fears of being different, or possibly having to deal with ridicule and rejection for standing up for what he believes. It is helpful to discuss how being a true friend and doing what he believes, can

show maturity, courage, and responsibility. Remember, your teen may not always make the exact and right choice that you would prefer, but coping with peer pressure can be very difficult and your teenager needs your love and support. What adult is without some of those unnecessary experiences in his history of growing up?

# THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO ME

I think the four most common things we humans do are breathe, eat, sleep — and grumble.

There's no situation so good that some knothed can't find the negative in it.

You know what I mean. Let's say a guy, we'll call him Fred, is making \$6 an hour at a pie factory.

One day fortune smiles on him. He lands a more lucrative job at an automobile plant. Suddenly he's getting \$15 an hour, and volunteering for plenty of overtime as well.

Compared with the way he was living before, he's now rolling in money. He's ecstatic. He buys a new truck. He brags to his friends. He thanks God every night for the blessing of his new job. He works hard to prove himself worthy of the position.

Then the novelty wears off. A few months later, Fred's noticed that some of the people on the assembly line don't slave as hard as he does, and yet they get the same pay. So he slacks off.

His back's sore, and it dawns on him that this job is physically tougher than his old pie factory job. He learns that the foreman who sits in a nearby office pushing a pencil earns twice what he does.

Soon his attitude sours. He's underpaid and overworked, he thinks. The company took advantage of him.

He complains to his wife that he's been ripped off. He mouths at his coworkers. He whispers behind the foreman's back about what a jerk the guy is.

The next thing you know, Fred's in a mess. His wife's tired of hearing him gripe. The morale in his department stinks. The boss is look-

ing for an excuse to fire him.

Why? The guy has become a grumbler. Instead of continuing to focus on the positive in his situation, he's chosen to start concentrating on the negative.

In the long run, such a choice always carries a big penalty. It injures not only the one who grumbles, but also his family, friends and coworkers. It might cost him his job.

Sadly, there are few places where you'll find more grumblers per capita than in a typical religious congregation.

Church members complain about the length of the services. They gripe about the music. They grumble

## Grumbling is destructive

because they're asked to give money.

What they're really saying is that they could do a better job than those in charge.

That can be dangerous stuff.

There's a chilling story in Numbers 16 about a priest named Korah who, along with two buddies and 250 other leaders of Israel, grew dissatisfied with the leadership of Moses and his brother Aaron. Korah started running off at the mouth.

He and his friends decided they were as qualified to direct the Jewish assembly as Moses and Aaron. After all, they had experienced God's presence, too. They were tired of taking orders. They were sick of wandering in a wilder-

ness.

There was one problem, though: God had placed Moses and Aaron in their jobs.

When Korah and the others griped about Moses and Aaron, they actually were conspiring against the Lord. This made God mad. Really, really mad.

God got so angry with these malcontents that He created a whole new punishment for them. The ground literally opened up and swallowed Korah and his two closest friends.

It swallowed their families, their houses and all their possessions, too. Evidently everything that had come in contact with these three men had been contaminated by their obnoxious attitudes.

Then fire leapt from the hole into which the men and their families had fallen and consumed the 250 ministers who had agreed with them.

And yet by the very next day, many other Israelites had started griping at Moses and Aaron again. (Talk about slow learners!) They claimed it was Moses' and Aaron's fault the conspirators had died.

So God loosed a plague that killed 14,700 of them.

Much later, St. Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 10 that these gruesome deaths should serve as a warning to us. We shouldn't grumble, either, lest we similarly unleash destruction on ourselves. "Let him who thinks he stands take heed lest he fall," Paul says.

I'm afraid that grumbling comes far too naturally to most of us — to me, anyway.

But I'm trying to obey Paul's warning.

I try to remind myself also of what Jesus said: "Every careless word that men speak, they shall render account for it in the day of judgment. For by your words you shall be justified, and by your words you shall be condemned."

## Sandy Valley Water District receives loan for upgrades

The Sandy Valley Water District will receive a \$1.4 million low-interest rural development loan from the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

The loan will enable the Water District to upgrade its water system in Floyd County and northern Pike County.

"This grant will help make sure that families served by the Sandy Valley Water District have safe, dependable water," U.S. Representative Harold "Hall" Rogers said. "With this grant we are one step closer to ensuring that a

repeat of the July 1997 water outage does not happen again."

In July 1997, customers of the water district were out of water for several hours, due to a major water line break because the system currently does not have required 24-hour storage capacity. The planned water system upgrade, which includes building three storage tanks, one pump station, approximately three miles of distribution lines and an office building, will help ensure such an outage is not repeated.

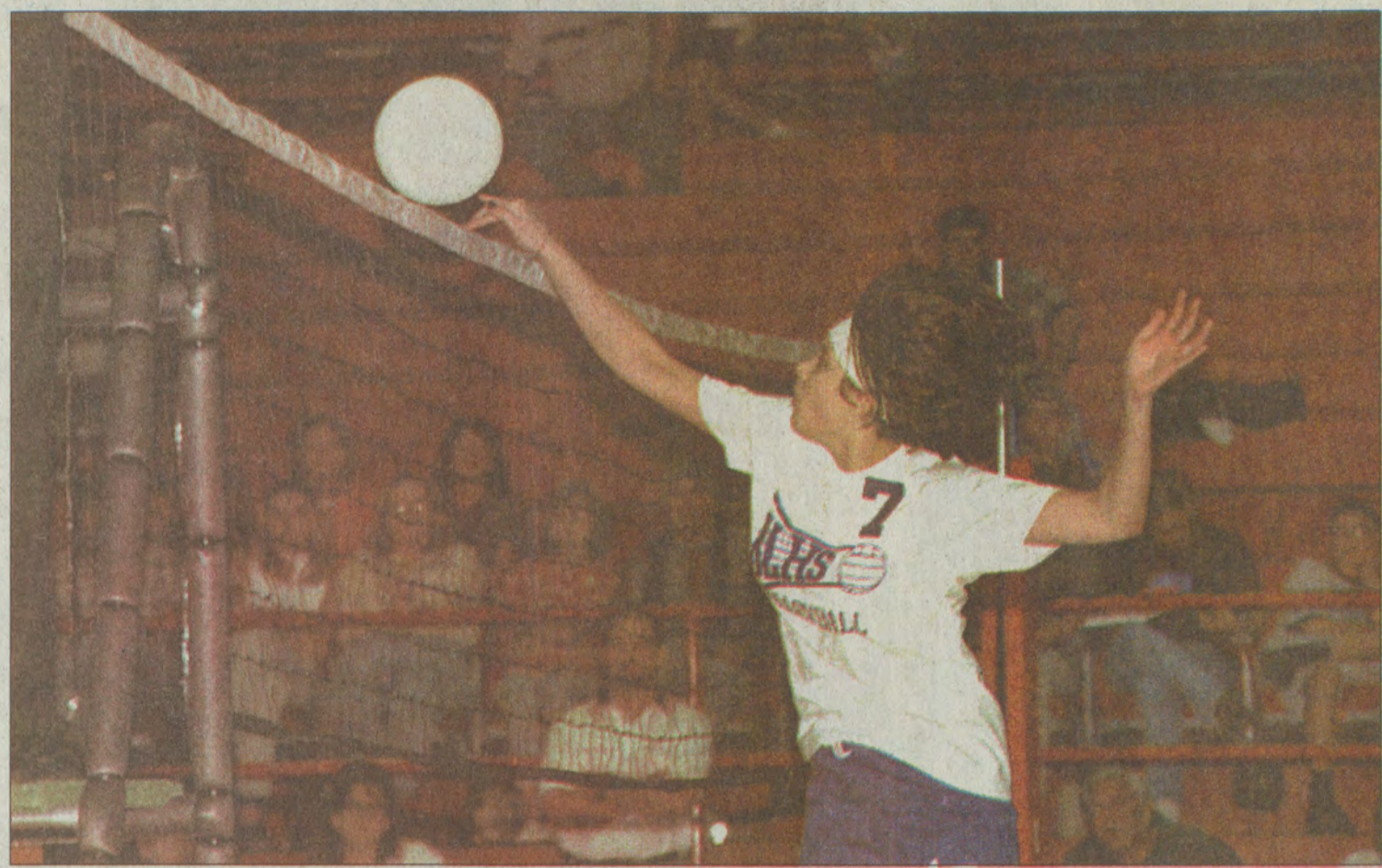
The girls' high school volleyball season is off and going well as both Allen Central, Betsy Layne and South Floyd have played games.

Morgan County quarterback B.J. Benton completed five of 17 passes for 31 yards giving the Cougars' 217 yards total offense.

With both teams keeping the ball on the ground, Morgan County, who is still winless, took an 8-0 lead with 2:23 to play in the first quarter. Lykins scored on a three-yard run and added the two-point conversion.

points for the Lady Rebels for the 15-8 victory.

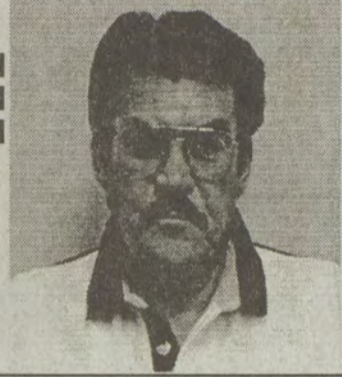
"This is a lot of fun," said Betsy Layne coach Tim Rice, who questioned some of the calls by one official.

The Cats' defense came up big again as they forced the Yellow Jackets to punt the ball. With big runs by Mullins, Ortega, and Castle, the Cats scored when Castle scored from one yard out. The two-point conversion was good as Castle picked up his second conversion.

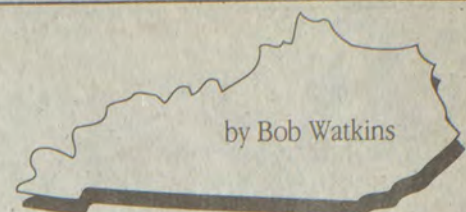

All the niceties aside associated with having scored 68 and 52 points on consecutive Saturdays, IU will show Wildcat fans whether or not their team is ready to put a whine on Steve Spurrier's face or do the usual, go to Gainesville and be embarrassed.

UK's opener at Louisville was a worthy yardstick, a confidence builder, but the Wildcats' walkover against Eastern Kentucky should never have happened. No matter how spin doctors tried to portray Saturday's game as a tribute to Coach Roy Kidd's greatness, it was a UK scheduling disgrace which may have set back this team's progression toward SEC title contendership considering Hal Mumme was fuming about his team's letdown against the Colonels.

A schedule designed to progress Mumme's team toward a date with Florida next week should have had an opponent in the two hole like Marshall or Cincinnati or — and consider the tapestry of this one — Missouri. Like UK, the Tigers are in a football renaissance of their own.

But a ticket sellout is a sellout is a sellout.

This week, however, Kentucky should face a nice test in the Hoosiers who not only rang up 587 total yards and 45 points against Western Michigan last week, 31 by halftime, they demonstrated an effective pass-run combination from quarterback Antwaan Randle El that should prepare Kentucky for Florida on CBS-TV next week.

Kentucky and Indiana. Let the season begin.

## HEROES NEW WAVE? MCGWIRE, SOSA, COUCH

"Where have all the heroes gone?" Senator Robert Byrd lamented on the Senate floor last week. "Where have all the heroes gone?"

West Virginia's owlish old statesman shook his head in consternation.

Certainly few heroes are to be found in the White House these days

or even inside Washington DC's Beltway. But maybe, just maybe a new wave of heroes is rumbling toward the strobe lights of fame and celebrity, cool stepping onto the common we know best — the playing fields of America.

His is a genuine selflessness that make fans crazy happy and media types suction-cup themselves to him, anointing his head with the most colored superlatives to be found in Webster.

Tim Couch, a hero? Yes. He personifies a clear response to the kind of cynics who pen such tripe as: (it would) "suit the era" if whoever gathered in Mark McGwire's 62nd home run, hired an agent, declared \$1 million an insult and held out for more.

Heroes. I want to remain unlightened enough to believe a new era is arriving. New heroes. A new era in

which it is natural and not headline news for those who retrieved McGwire's 60th, 61st and 62nd home runs to hand over baseballs to the home run slugger who in turn naturally gives them to Baseball's Hall of Fame.

A new era where we don't care two dimes about Michael Irvin's stupid dance in a Cowboys' end zone; or a nickel about whether NBA players and owners settle a squabble over money. Let us alone to sit in warm sunshine of another Kentucky autumn and enjoy a new era of heroism with one of our own. Tim Couch.

Too, this hero of yours and mine, I like to believe, is having such a splendid time of life and knows it. He realizes he passes this way but once, and will enjoy his fleeting moments as hero — and decide to stay at UK as long as the NCAA will allow.

After all, part of being a hero is knowing when to do the right thing and how to do it very well.

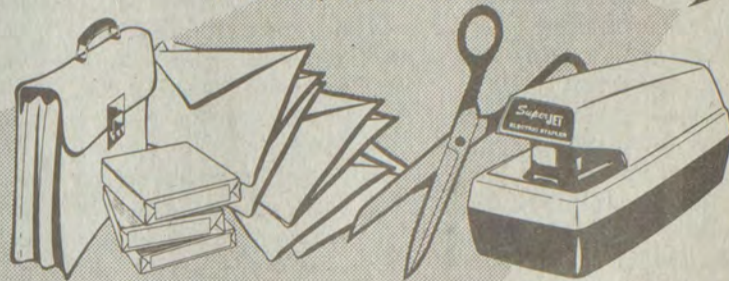

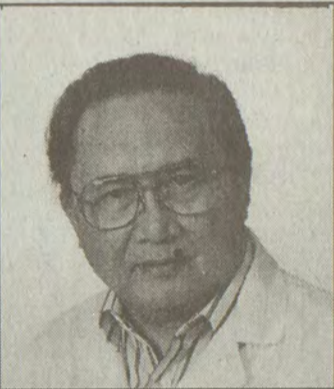

Jeff Burton held off a hard-charging Jeff Gordon to win the Exide NASCAR Select Batteries 400 at Richmond International Raceway this past Saturday.

Burton's margin of victory was .051 seconds, or about a hood-length, making it the closest finish of any NASCAR Winston Cup this season.

"To win this Exide race was just great," said Burton. "I've got to thank Jeff Gordon. He raced us clean all night, but these guys in the pits did a good job. We were able to pick up spots every single time and we beat the 24 cars out of the pits every single time."

It appeared Gordon might make another successful late charge like he has in so many races this season, but Burton wasn't to be denied this victory.

Gordon had caught Burton's No. 99 Ford Taurus with five laps remaining in the 400-lap event. He tried the outside groove and then the inside as they raced nose-to-bumper, but each time Burton was able to out-duel Gordon.

"He could go faster on new tires and I just kind of took my pace," said Gordon. "My car really came on the long runs, but I couldn't pass him. The outside groove was just too fast."

Mark Martin, who is second in driver points, finished third. "I tell you, the best race I've seen in a long time was my buddy Jeff Burton holding on out there. Man, he was the man."

The win was Burton's second of the season and the fifth Winston Cup victory of his career.

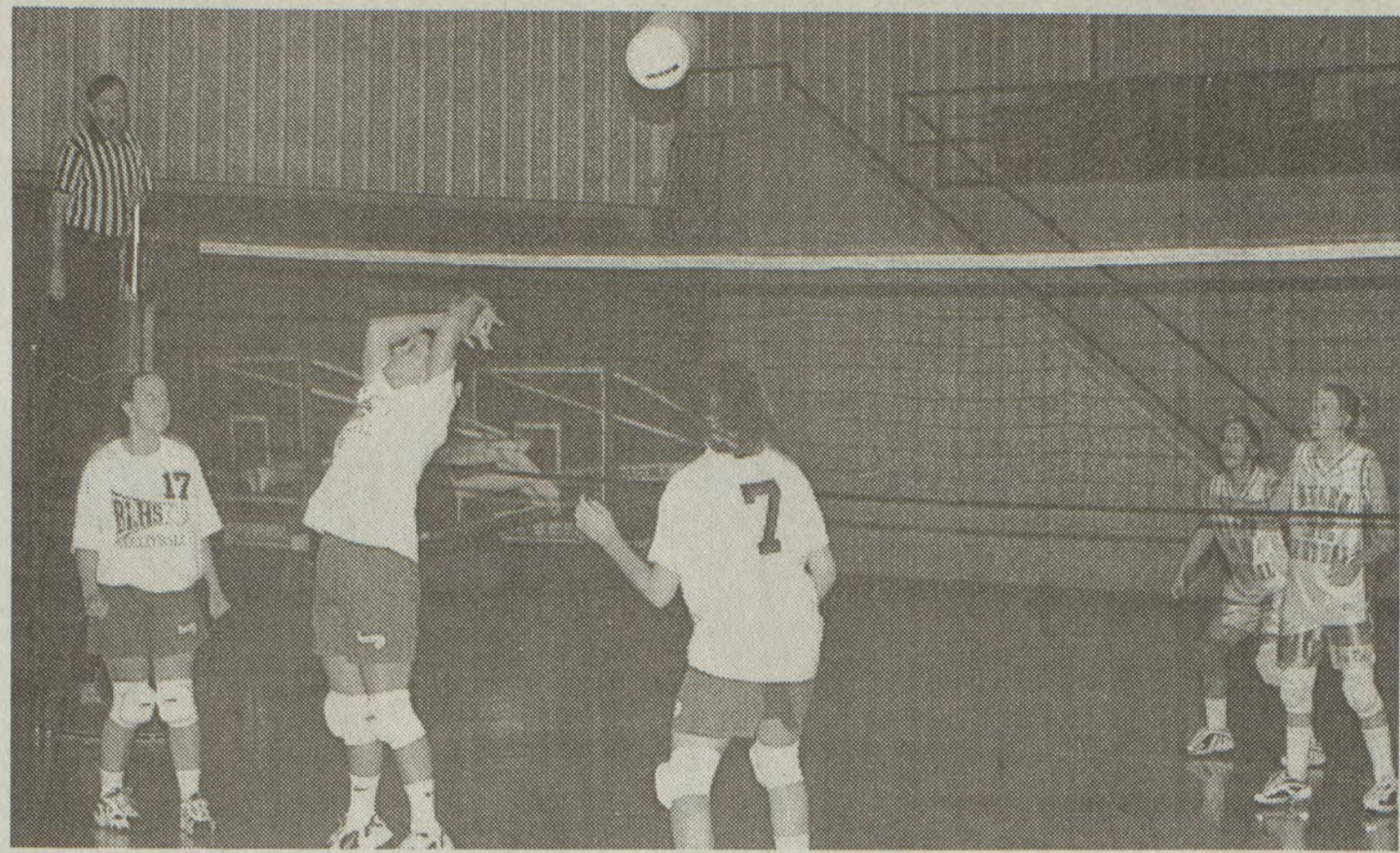

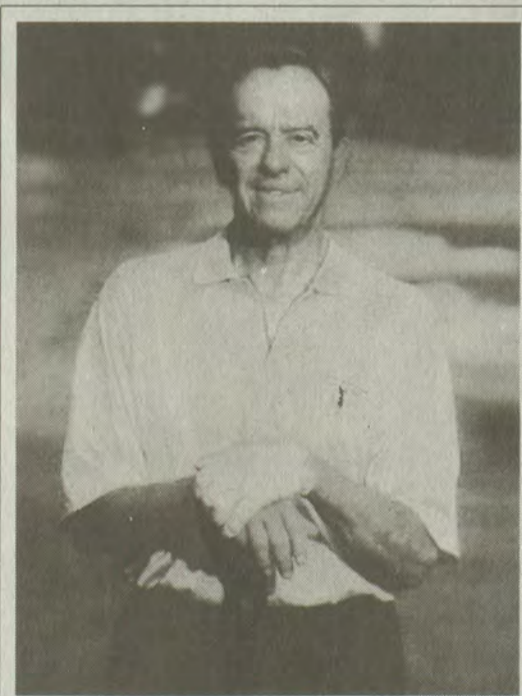

## Racing as usual for Donlavey

You would think that Richmond International Raceway would be the last place that car owner Junie Donlavey would want to find out

that his sponsorship would be leaving him after this year. Donlavey is a Richmond native and has maintained his shop in the Richmond area as long as NASCAR has been sanctioning races.

Helig-Myers, also headquartered in Richmond, announced they would be leaving Donlavey after the '98 season as primary sponsor, but hadn't decided if they were going to get completely out of Winston Cup racing.

Most of Donlavey's career in racing has seen the Virginia native always scrambling to come up with sponsorship dollars to try to compete in Winston Cup. For years Donlavey was noted for bringing in young talent, working with them only to see them leave him for greener pastures after their lessons were learned.

This time the scenario seems different for Junie. He now has a driver in Dick Trickle, who is 56 years old and seems to be just fine racing with the limited resources of Donlavey.

Thanks, in part, to ESPN's Sport Center's always reporting where Trickle finishes in each and every race, he has attracted a loyal group of fans. At one time, the sight of a fan wearing a Dick Trickle T-shirt at a race was as rare as a Bodine brother standing in victory lane. Now, when you go to a race, Trickle's T-shirts and hats can be observed everywhere.

Trickle is somewhat of a racing legend in the Midwest, as he is reported to have accumulated over 1,200 victories before heading South to try his fortune in the Busch and Winston Cup Series. Not all of those 1,200 wins was just at those ol' Saturday night tracks either. He was a two-time ASA champion and finished in the runner-up spot on nine different occasions.

Trickle is just another one of those drivers that may have just not been in the right place at the right time or his career may have taken him to greater heights in Winston Cup.

Whatever the reason, at age 48, he went to Winston Cup full time and the results had this grandfather winning the Rookie of the Year honors.

Since that "rookie" year, Trickle has yet to make his way to victory lane, but has finished as high as third on five different occasions. He did win the Winston Open at

Charlotte at NASCAR's all-star weekend and has one pole to his credit.

So, you have a driver in Trickle that has won more races in his career than most people will ever start in and an owner that has been racing longer than NASCAR has been sanctioning events. It is one of the most unique combinations in all of racing, and it is easy to see why they would be appealing to so many fans.

When race fans begin to show an interest in you, then the Winston cup sponsors seem to follow suit. The day after Helig-Myers told Donlavey that they were pulling the plug on his team, his phone began to ring with leads on new sponsors. He also received an offer to sell the team, but turned it down saying he was sure that he could have a deal within the next two weeks with a new sponsor.

The Donlavey-Trickle combination is definitely not a threat to make it to victory lane anytime soon, but the appeal that they could bring to a sponsor is one of the great things about Winston Cup racing.

In a time that sees the rich seem to keep getting richer in racing, the sight of these two senior citizens may be losing his sponsorship before the end of the season.

Darrell Waltrip and Tabasco is thought to be parting ways after a short relationship. It was first reported that Tabasco wouldn't be on Waltrip's car last Saturday night at Richmond, but the relationship was extended for one race with no promise of being on the car at Dover.

# Grigsby's featured in Girls Hoops documentary

A new video is about to hit the stands, and it will feature two Floyd Countians who were a big part of the Title IX development that brought girls' basketball to prominence in the mountains of Eastern Kentucky.

Pete Grigsby Jr., an assistant to Floyd County school superintendent Charles Clark, coached basketball at McDowell High School before becoming the school's principal. He later moved to the central office where he became superinten-

dent of the Floyd County schools. But it was in the mid-'70s that Grigsby was urged to be part of the development of Title IX.

"Charles Clark was superintendent then, and he asked me to be part of the Title IX development process," Grigsby said. "So I was part of the committee that implemented the Title IX program."

Title IX brought an entirely different look in basketball as girls' basketball got its start in 1975. The program allowed Geri Grigsby, later a star at McDowell and at the University of Kentucky, to become the boost the girls program needed. Grigsby became a prolific scorer and became the all-time national scoring leader in America.

The Whitesburg Appalshop undertook the effort to put together a film documenting girls' basketball in the state of Kentucky, and it was appropriately named, "Girls Hoops." The film will have its premiere this Friday night at the Whitesburg Appalshop Theater at 7:30 p.m. Guests for the premiere include Grigsby and his daughter Geri.

"The film is about the history of girls' basketball in Kentucky," Grigsby said. "It will feature interviews with Geri, myself and others."

The film, soon to be released on video tape, was four years in the making and features clips from the '20s and '30s, when girls' basket-

ball was part of the sports scene in Kentucky.

"They called me when I was principal at Auxier and asked me to help in the making of the film," Grigsby said. "I spent about two hours with them and did interviews. It will have a lot of history in it."

Justin Richardson put the film together documenting why girls' basketball was dropped in the state and why it got a new beginning.

### Doctor's discovery may end obesity

HILTON HEAD, S.C. — A doctor believes that a natural formula containing the extract of a small Asian fruit can help cause significant weight loss.

Anthony A. Conte, M.D. reported in an American Medical Journal that the formula, now called Bio-Rex 3000, caused patients to lose more than twice as much weight as those in a control group on the same fat reduced diet. Neither group was instructed to decrease the amount of food they ate or to increase their exercise levels. ## Time to control grubs in lawns

If you had Japanese beetles on the plants in your yard this summer you may have a problem with white grubs this fall. White grubs are one of the most important insect pests of lawn grasses in Kentucky. Several different kinds of grubs, in particular, the larvae of masked chafers and Japanese beetles can cause damage.

Adult beetles emerge and feed on plants during June and July. During this time they burrow underground and lay their eggs which hatch in soil during August and September. Grass is damaged when the grubs feed on grass roots. The cutting of the roots kills the grass and loosens the turf so that it can be rolled back like a carpet.

Drought-stressed or diseased turf can easily be mistaken for grub damage. Early symptoms of white grubs include gradual thinning, yellowing, and weakening of the grass stand followed by the appearance of scattered, irregular dead patches. As damage continues, the dead patches may increase in size, and apparently healthy turf areas may suddenly wilt. The turf may feel spongy as you walk over the infested area.

Another indication that white grubs may be present is if moles, skunks or flocks of blackbirds are

actively digging in your yard. You can check to see if you have a white grub problem by cutting square-foot prices of sod out of suspect areas and closely inspecting the roots for small white grubs. Sample grub "hot spots," which are most likely in full sun, lawns seed with Kentucky bluegrass, lawns that were heavily irrigated during June and July, and turf areas that were damaged by grubs in previous years. After examining the sample, tamp it back into place and water it well to encourage recovery. An average of eight or more grubs per sample may indicate a need for treatment.

If damaging numbers are present you can treat the areas where you have found grubs now. Normally, the entire lawn does not need to be treated. Treatment should not be made any later than mid-October.

For best results, mow the lawn and rake out dead grass and thatch before treatment. Water the lawn immediately after application to wash the insecticide down into the root zone where the grubs are feeding. Watering in is especially important for spray applications; once spray residues dry on foliage, they cannot be washed into the

root zone by later drenchings. For this reason, granular formulations may be easier to use, since timing of irrigation is not so critical.

Treated areas should be drenched with 1/2-1 inch of water, using a lawn sprinkler. The required amount of water can be determined by placing a disposable pan or rain gauge in the treated area.

Several products are labeled for control of white grubs on home lawns. Dylox 6.2G has worked particularly well in University of Kentucky tests; Oftanol, diazinon and Sevin have also given adequate control. Always read the label and follow safety precautions when using any chemical.

## ZESTY VEGETABLE SOUP

28-oz. can tomatoes, quartered  
2 cups water  
3/4 cup KRAFT Barbecue Sauce

ring occasionally. Cool slightly. Arrange orange sections on top of cheesecake; cover with glaze. Chill.

## BLUEBERRY GLAZE

1/3 cup sugar, 1 tablespoon cornstarch  
1 1/2 cups blueberries  
1 tablespoon lemon juice  
One hour before serving: In small saucepan, combine sugar and cornstarch; mix well.  
With fork, crush 1/2 cup blueberries. Stir into sugar mixture, along with 1/2 cup water. Bring to boiling, stirring, until thickened and translucent. Add lemon juice and rest of blueberries. Cool 30 minutes.

## SHRIMP LOUIS POTATO SALAD

6 medium potatoes (about 2 lbs.)

## Students' after-school snacks pack powerful nutritional punch

Children often can't eat enough at mealtime to supply the energy they need each day. An after-school snack is one way to provide a steady energy supply and help children make healthy snacks a life-time habit.

"Because children have small appetites and stomachs, it doesn't take much to fill them up. However, growing, active children need a lot of energy. In fact, their total energy needs are comparable to an adult's," said Sandra Bastin, extension food and nutrition specialist with the University of Kentucky College of Agriculture.

Research indicates that snacking is a good way to give children the variety of nutrients necessary for growth and development, according to Bastin.

"Snacks don't have to be high-calorie, low-nutrient foods," she said. "Wise snack food choices can provide the essential nutrients children need. For example, fruits and vegetables make fast, easy snacks that are jam-packed with vitamins, minerals and fiber."

Lifelong eating habits are formed during childhood so this is a good time to instill a balanced approach to snacking. And the Food Guide Pyramid is a good place to begin.

The Food Guide Pyramid emphasizes five major food groups that give children the essential nutrients. Each food group provides some, but not all of these nutrients.

Youngsters ages two years and older need at least six child-size servings from the bread, cereal, rice and pasta group; a combined minimum of five child-size servings of fruits and vegetables; at least three servings from the milk, yogurt and cheese group; and at least two child-size servings from the group containing meat, poultry, fish, dry beans, eggs and nuts.

Other factors affecting the number of servings daily from each food group include the number of calories a child needs and the youngster's size and activity level.

The small tip of the Food Guide Pyramid represents fats, oils and sweets. Eat these infrequently because they generally contain a lot of calories, but have very little nutritional value.

"Foods like cookies, ice cream and potato chips can be part of a varied diet—in moderation. But remember, 'moderation' is the key here. Give your children small and infrequent servings of high-fat and high-sugar foods," Bastin said.

The following tips on after-school snacks are provided by Bastin and Janet Kurzynske, interim assistant director of Home Economics Extension.

If children aren't getting the recommended daily servings of a food group or groups, concentrate on providing them in afternoon snacks.

It's a good idea to use items from at least two different food groups for snacks.

Be sure to give children age-appropriate servings. A snack is a supplement, not a replacement, to a meal. Adult-sized servings can overwhelm children, causing them to eat less.

Don't be surprised if children don't eat as much as you think they should. Studies show that children who are given healthy food choices will eat what they need when they're hungry.

Serve snacks with various colors, textures, shapes and tastes (sweet, sour, etc.).

Don't use food as a "reward" for children.

Let children help plan and choose foods for after-school snacks. When children are old enough, encourage them to prepare snacks, too. Many children enjoy helping select and prepare snacks, and often show more interest in eating these foods.

Snacking too close to a meal can dull children's appetites. Encourage them to snack at least one and preferably two hours before supper.

If a child under age five years old is hungry, the child needs to eat. Children this age have an internal mechanism that says, "I need energy," and they need to eat something.

If children are hungry close to mealtime, incorporate a snack as part of the meal. Let them help prepare (and munch on) raw carrots, broccoli or other fresh vegetables. As a meal appetizer, serve the vegetables with a low-fat dip.

Using fresh, frozen or canned fruits and vegetables as part snacks is a good way to ensure that children meet the recommended "five-a-day" servings.

Unconscious over-eating patterns often originate from eating while engaged in other activities in the house. To help make snacking a safe, structured and purposeful experience, limit snacking to certain locations, such as the breakfast nook, kitchen or dining room.

Designate a "snack spot" to make it easy for children to find after-school snacks. It can be on the kitchen counter, refrigerator, cupboard or pantry.

Since some children will eat vegetables raw, but not cooked, keep a finger-sized supply in the refrigerator within easy reach.

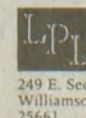

## Latest scam targets shareholders

The Kentucky Division of Securities is advising the public to be on guard against potentially misleading solicitations from third-party firms that purport to 'assist' shareholders with exchanging 'old' certificates for 'new' certificates following the merger of a company the shareholder has invested in. These firms do not disclose that exchange of such certificates following a merger can occur with little or no cost to the shareholder, simply by contacting the official transfer agent (usually a bank) of the company directly. When the fee charged by these third-party firms for this 'service' is taken into consideration, shareholders can suffer significant—and, in the Division's view, entirely unnecessary—monetary losses. The bottom-line: you don't need to pay someone else (like these firms) to exchange your shares for you—you can do it for free by contacting the transfer agent directly.

In one case currently under investigation in the Division, the third-party firm is charging a fee of 15 percent of the value of the shares

transferred. This, in spite of the fact the company shares could be exchanged for free by simply contacting the company's exchange agent, a large bank with offices in the Louisville area. The firm currently under investigation is targeting shareholders in a large Louisville company that several years ago acquired a smaller Louisville company. The targeted shareholders, as often happens following large corporate mergers, failed to exchange their certificates in the acquired company for certificates in the resulting merged company. Although the 'old' certificates in the acquired company that are held by the targeted shareholders cannot be freely traded at this time, the shareholders' equity interest in the merged company is unaffected by the fact they hold out-dated certificates.

In the misleading pitch made to these shareholders by the third-party firm, the shareholders are led to believe that they must exchange their old certificates for new ones immediately, or run the risk of losing their investment in the company.

This is entirely untrue. Worse still, shareholders are not told that they could exchange their old certificates for new ones for free simply by contacting the company's transfer agent directly. Red-flags with this type of operation include:

- Language in the firm's cover letter to shareholders that suggests that shareholders must act quickly to return their certificates because 'there is no longer a market' in these shares. The firm fails to mention that there has been no 'market' in the certificates since the merger, that the absence of a market at this time is nothing new, and indeed, has no bearing on the equity interest of these shareholders in the company's stock.
- Use of federal EXPRESS in sending this correspondence to shareholders and providing a prepaid package for certificates to be returned—the firm is conveying an inappropriate sense of urgency with respect to the need of the shareholders to obtain new certificates.
- The firm fails to disclose any information about the shareholder's

ability to exchange old certificates for new ones, at no charge, by contacting the transfer agent directly. Remember, you don't need anyone to perform these types of share exchanges for you—you can do this for free simply by contacting the transfer agent directly.

• The fee charged by the firm is exorbitant—in some cases as much as 15 percent of the value of the shares transferred. Given that the shareholder could perform the share exchange at no charge by contacting the transfer agent directly, any fee that is more than nominal is, in the Division's view, entirely inappropriate.

## Kentucky's jobless rate falls to 4.2

Kentucky's unemployment rate inched down from 4.5 percent in June to 4.2 percent in July, according to the Department for Employment Services, a Cabinet for Workforce Development Agency.

Kentucky's jobless rate for July 1997 was 5.4 percent. The U.S. jobless rate in July remained at the June level of 4.7 percent.

Carlos Cracraft, the department's chief labor market analyst, said that the jobless rate had declined in Kentucky between June and July for 12 consecutive years.

Six of Kentucky's nine major job sectors had employment losses, while the other three showed gains, Cracraft said.

With 2,200 new jobs, construc-

tion added more positions in July than any other sector. General building contractors, which include those in residential building, added 1,000 jobs. Heavy construction contractors added another 900 positions. Special trade contractors, which include electricians, drywallers, brick masons and heating and cooling contractors, grew by 300 jobs.

Mining and quarrying reported 200 more jobs in July.

Transportation, communications and public utilities grew by 100 jobs between June and July.

Government reported the largest decrease in jobs for the month—11,500 fewer positions. Local government, not including local education, added 600 jobs. This gain, however, could not offset the temporary loss of 11,900 state and local education jobs in July due to annual school closures.

Agriculture employment dropped 3,900 in July. "Farm work usually wanes in mid-summer because the planting season is over and farm maintenance work decreases," he said.

Trade jobs fell by 2,300. Eating and drinking establishment jobs

declined by 1,700 and food store employment was down 600.

Manufacturing job totals were down 1,800 in July as one strike and several seasonal plant shutdowns caused a temporary downturn.

"Employees on strike or layoff during the period we conduct surveys for the unemployment rate are not counted as employed," Cracraft said. "The same applies to plants that close down in the summer to upgrade, retool equipment or make yearly product changes."

Transportation equipment was down 900 jobs; primary medical industries, down 700; petroleum, rubber and plastic products, down 300; fabricated metal products, food and kindred products, electrical equipment industry and tobacco products, down 100 each.

Manufacturing industries showing gains included paper, printing and publishing up 200 and chemicals and allied products, other dramatic goods and stone, clay and glass products, up 100 each.

Service jobs declined by 1,300 in July. Seasonal losses occurred in agricultural services due to the end of planting season; in educational

and social services because of school closures; and in amusement and recreation services when live summer horse racing ceased. However, business services added 1,200 jobs. Health services increased by 300 positions as recently graduated physicians, therapists, nurses and health technicians were employed. With the height of summer vacation season, jobs in hotels and other lodging places grew by 300.

Finance, insurance and real estate jobs fell by 200 in July.

The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics monthly estimate of the number of employed Kentuckians for July 1998 was 1,893,693. This figure is up 348 from the 1,893,345 employed in June 1998, and is up 25,088 from the 1,868,605 Kentuckians employed in July 1997.

The monthly estimate of the number of unemployed Kentuckians for July was 82,418. This figure is down 7,194 from the 89,612 unemployed in June 1998, and down 23,314 from the 105,732 Kentuckians unemployed in July 1997.

The monthly estimate of the number of Kentuckians in the civilian labor force for July was 1,976,111. This figure is down 6,846 from the 1,982,957 recorded for June 1998, but up 1,774 from the 1,974,337 recorded for July 1997.

The civilian labor force includes non-military workers and unemployed Kentuckians who are actively seeking work. It does not include the unemployed Kentuckians who have not looked for employment within the past four weeks.

Employment and unemployment statistics are based on estimates. They are compiled to indicate employment trends rather than actually to count numbers of people who are or are not working.
