#### Bond lowered, but McCann remains in jail

Tarah McCann, 21, of Spring Hill, Florida is still being held in the Floyd County Detention Center and has observed a birthday since her incarceration on charges of firstdegree criminal facilitation in connection with her involvement in a robbery that occurred at Lee's Famous Recipe on North Lake Drive.

During the early evening hours of October 24, Joe Lee Wells, 27, of Miami, Florida, allegedly committed the act of armed robbery by entering the restaurant through a back door and threatening the employees with extreme physical harm if they did not give him the cash being held on the site.

Wells ordered the restaurant manager to open the store safe or else he would "blow her -g head off."

After committing the robbery, Wells fled from the restaurant by way of the same back door through which he had earlier entered.



## Bishop moved, assigned new attorney

A man charged with the stabbing murder of his estranged wife has been transferred out of the Floyd County Detention Center to another state facility.

Dwayne Earl Bishop, 40, of Teaberry, has been transported to the Eastern Kentucky Correctional Complex at West Liberty, where he will await trial in connection with the death of Carolyn Ann Tackett Bishop, 32

Bishop had originally been represented by Pikeville attorney, Stephen W. Owens, but Owens has since filed a motion to withdraw from the case based on Bishop's failure to make proper financial arrangements for his pay-

Harolyn Howard, assistant public advocate, now stands to represent Bishop.

On November 21, Howard filed a motion for review and modification of the conditions necessary for Bishop to be released. However, his bond still remains set at \$1 mil-

According to court records, documentation exists attesting to a history of domestic violence in which Dwayne Bishop was the perpetrator.

Protective orders demanding that Bishop have no unlawful contact with his estranged wife exist, dating back to as early as 1994. Those records claim that Bishop had committed acts of violence involving both shooting and stabbing against Carolyn Bishop in the past.

A pre-trial conference has been scheduled for March 7.

## New surgeon journeys from Zimbabwe to Appalachia

A Romac Catholic nun who has spent area, that it seems familiar to the last 12 years practicing medicine in an African missionary hospital has now arrived in Floyd County to begin work as a

Sister Patricia Cataldi came on staff at in Shillington, Pennsylvania. the Appalachian Regional Medical Center In 1967, she graduated from in McDowell on Monday.

Dr. Cataldi said that she feels that God is at work in her ministry because she has come "full circle" since the beginning of her medical career.

Dr. Cataldi was born in Glastonbury, Connecticut. Her family lived in the Connecticut River Valley on land there that they used to farm tobacco for eigar-making. She said that the weather there was often hot and humid, making for ideal conditions in which to raise tobacco. She said that in many ways, the geographics of this region remind her of Connecticut, "except for the mountains; we didn't have moun-

Dr. Cataldi said that she feels very comfortable in our

Dr. Cataldi professed her vows in 1963 at the Sisters of the Precious Blood missionary nursing school and began work as an intensive care and emergency department nurse at St. Joseph's Hospital in Reading. It was during this time that she

decided to pursue a medical degree, citing the reason for this decision as believing that in becoming a doctor, she would be able to gain more independence in her missionary work.

In 1973, she completed her undergraduate degree at Temple University in Philadelphia, and went on to graduate from the city's Hahnemann Medical College, a teaching affiliate of Monmouth Medical

ed into the surgical residency program at Monmouth, and she completed her surgical training there in 1982. It was at this time that Dr.

Cataldi said that she first contemplated the idea of serving in the Appalachian region. She said that she even had exchanged correspondence with McDowell ARH at that

Instead, she took an assignment in Africa, spending her five years of residency training in one of her order's missionary field hospitals, St. Jude's Hospital, located on the West Indies island

nation of St. Lucia. Dr. Cataldi said that she received valuable surgical experience at St. Jude's and also had the opportunity to work with many specialists, such as urologists and orthopedists.

In 1988, Dr. Cataldi traveled to Brunabeg, Zimbabwe, a rural village in the southwest corner of the country, near Botswana. When she arrived at St. Anne's Hospital, "they had not had a doctor there for nine months.

Dr. Cataldi said that she encountered various problems at St. Anne's, such as a shortage of supplies and medicines, high surtaxes, and problems resulting from a shortage of electricity.

St. Anne's was powered by a generator that operated for only two hours a day. It was during this time that Dr. Cataldi performed most of her surgical work.

But, Dr. Cataldi said, the hospital used solar energy to heat water and they also had in place a bio-gas system that they used for cooking and heat. The bio-gas system incorporated the use of a slurry made from animal waste that was, in turn, transformed into methane gas. She said that goats and cattle were plentiful in the

## Church seeks to help 1,000 families during holidays

Paster Joseph Sloce, who ministers at the Praise Assembly Church located on Water Gap road, believes that God has blessed his life and his ministry in many ways. As a way of showing thanks, he has launched "Operation Christmas Blessing" here in Floyd County.

Pastor Sloce and his wife, Donna, came to the Floyd County area in September 1996 from Wise, Va. Prior to settling here, they had become familiar with the Floyd County area through evangelical services they had offered in the Wheelwright and Wayland areas.

Pastor Sloce says that they saw a great need in the area and decided to stay on a more permanent basis in order to minister to this need.

"Operation Christmas Blessing" was started in 1999 by Praise Assembly Church members.

Last year, the church received 130 applications for assistance from needy families in order to provide them with a means for celebrating the Christmas holiday. They were able to serve 200 families the first

year out, Pastor Sloce says that as they handed out

and gratitude of those being served, that he and his

helpers vowed "on that very spot" to serve 1,000 families in 2000. The church began taking applications for assis-

tance on November 2. Already, they have received approximately 500 applications.

Pastor Sloce says that in order to meet the goal for the upcoming Christmas season, the church worked all summer holding car washes, bake sales and carnivals in order to raise funds to purchase the various food items needed for the baskets.

In order to assist the church in its endeavor, Food City of Paintsville arranged a special purchase price on Armour canned hams, canned sweet potatoes and cake mix. Save-A-Lot of Martin has given the church a special purchase price on canned vegetables.





Dr. Cataldi said that among the illnesses she treated, she saw a lot of disease and infection among the Zimbabweans that was caused from the consumption of contaminated water, especially during the rainy flood season. She said that the people of the area would sometimes have to travel for miles to find safe drinking water from area "bore-holes" that reached far down into the water table. As a result of this inconvenience, they would sometimes take chances using more readily available surface waters and, as a result, would fall prey to various illnesses brought on by various micro-organisms that would be present in the water.

Cataldi said that the hospital and health workers in the area spent a great

Also, said Dr. Cataldi, a great deal of her time was spent in maternity service, performing emergency caesarean sections. In times such as these when emergency surgical procedures were needed, the hospital's generator would be turned back on.

Dr. Cataldi said that people often traveled for miles by bus, foot and donkey cart to reach the hospital. sometimes arriving well into the night. She said that St. Jude's operated a hostel where rooms could be rented, but that often the people would simply wait the night out under the shelter of the hospital building.

"When I first arrived in Zimbabwe, I would see about five new cases of AIDS each year, but today, the hospital diagnoses nearly 500 cases annual-As a result, the average life expectancy of a Zimbabwean stands now at about 38 years, as opposed to an earlier life expectancy of as much as 78 years and beyond.

Dr. Cataldi said that even with the

very often seek care from traditional healers before deciding to use the hospital services. As a result, the people would generally have developed complications before she ever had a chance to first see them.

One of the more common occurrences, according to Cataldi, was the use of a traditional healing practice referred to as "smoking." When an infant or small child became sick with congestion or a cough, the family would hold blankets over a small fire and contain the child therein in order

to "smoke" out the sickness. Of course, Dr. Cataldi said, the procedure only served to complicate the condition and make the child's illness worse. She said that very often, the mothers would not want to admit to her that they had "smoked" the child when she asked them, and so, after a while, she learned to ask the mothers, "How many times did you smoke the child?," as opposed to asking, "Did you smoke the child?"

Dr. Cataldi said that although many Christian churches are making progress in conversions of the people of the small African country, many still believe in the notion that "spirits' make one ill and that these "spirits" can be cast out in order to cure the person of the illness. So, many people would first seek out the help of tradipresence of the hospital and five rural tional "nyangas," or "witch doctors,"

Cataldi said that the people of outreach clinics, people would still who would say chants and throw was excited at the prospect of returnbones in an attempt to rid the ill person of the evil spirit(s).

Ironically, said Dr. Cataldi, the "nyangas" would come to the hospitals first when they themselves became ill.

The hospital staff also found competition from area "herbalists," who Dr. Cataldi said were pretty much "bona fide," but still at times would use herbs in toxic proportions. In particular, she recalled one time an herbalist was administering an herb to young infants that was causing necrosis of the liver. One of the infants died, but two others were able to be saved. Dr. Cataldi believes that the amount administered was probably the problem and that the first baby received far too much of the herb.

Dr. Cataldi said that she and the hospital staff held a meeting with several of the herbalists and informed them, "without pointing fingers," of the dire situation that had come about from the administration of these herbs. She said that the situation improved after the meeting was held.

Dr. Cataldi said that the people of Brunabeg had very little money and so her fees were often paid with eggs, chickens and sheep.

"Eggs were to them like gold is to us," said Dr. Cataldi.

Even though Dr. Cataldi said that she felt that the time had come for her to leave Zimbabwe, she said that her departure was bittersweet.

"I delivered many children who I watched grow up, and even though I

ing home. I still experienced some sadness," the surgeon said.

She said that upon her return to the United States, she again returned to Monmouth Medical Center to brush up on recent surgical advances and techniques. She began corresponding with McDowell ARH for a second time in March of this year. She said that it looked for a short while as though ARH was going to have to hire a new surgeon before she would be available for work, but as it turned out, just as God had brought her "full circle" back to Monmouth, He had also brought her "full circle" back to her original desire to serve in the Appalachian area of our county.

She arrived in McDowell on November 20, and said that her first general impressions of the area are that "everyone is very friendly and very helpful, they make me feel very welcome." She said that she is also impressed and pleased with the number of female doctors on staff at ARH.

Cataldi said that she is looking forward to being able to develop a good rapport with her patients because it will be "so much easier to communicate" with her patients here than with the patients she encountered in Africa. She smiled as she admitted to having "a little trouble" with the local accent, but she said she is "not too worried."

Dr. Cataldi is scheduled to begin duties as a general surgeon at ARH in the near future, and she said that she is looking forward to serving the people of our area.

Police believe that McCann waited in a "getaway" car for Wells and assisted him in evading authorities by driving him away from the scene of the incident.

Prestonsburg City Policeman Steve Little testified in court on October 31 that a car driven by McCann attempted to run him over as he was stopping cars on North Central Avenue immediately following the incident.

McCann admits to aiding Wells in his get-away, but says that she did not do so willingly.

McCann says that Wells drove her to North Central Avenue and parked the car that they were traveling in giving her instructions to wait for him in the car because he was going to visit a friend who lived nearby and ask to borrow some money.

Upon his return, McCann says that Wells pushed her into the driver's seat and ordered her to "drive" while he lay in the floorboard of the car with a gun aimed at her.

According to McCann's attorney, Vicki Ridgeway, McCann claims to have had no prior knowledge of Wells' plan to commit armed robbery and says that after Wells returned to the car that she knew that he had "done something" but that she did not know what.

McCann claims to have known Wells for only about a month before the incident took place, and that she had traveled with him from Florida to Kentucky.

District Judge Eric D. Hall has referred McCann's case to a grand jury and on November 8, he granted a motion produced by McCann's attorney to reduce McCann's bond and to modify the conditions of her release

Judge Hall reduced the original \$10,000 bond to \$5,000 with the stipulation that McCann would not be allowed to leave Floyd county.

No previous arrest record has thus far been located on McCann.

## All kids deserve a chance

The pampered baby boomers grew up deprived in comparison with today's crop of kids, awash as they are in such electronic marvels as cell phones and virtual games, DVD players and TV sets with gobs of channels and sharp pictures on big screens, Today's young people spend like never before. And, they get their own rooms.

What's more, they know the value of an education. They attend college in higher numbers than did their boomer parents and, thus, are better prepared to make the big bucks. So, outside of typical adolescent anxieties - the pimples, the first date - today's young people have little reason to worry, right?

Actually, the complete picture — as painted by researchers at the Urban Institute, a leading think tank — is not so bright. Yes, many young people are growing up in more luxurious circumstances than the nation has ever seen before. But many others are eking out lives in the vise grip of poverty - often without dads to help out. In fact, fathers far too often are stewing in

And, between rags and riches, there is a third group of children, who live in families that barely make ends meet and who get high school diplomas but no solid academic or vocational skills. Some in this group will eventually gain enough knowhow for middle-level jobs, but others won't. They will forever flounder on the lower rungs of the job ladder.

What's more, even the kids steeped in affluence occasion worries, notes the 124-page Urban Institute report, titled prosaically "Youth in 2010: Trends and Policy Implications." They face the draw of gangs and drugs and sex. And, because of a rise in working parents and a decline in siblings, today's young people don't interact with their families as much as the boomers did.

Well-off parents do enjoy resources to help ward off the demons that threaten their children, though. The challenge such parents face is communication.

They must talk with their kids. Parents must warn their children of the dangers that lurk out there and must hear what's on the minds of their offspring.

But the plight of poor and near-poor kids demands better public focus. Leaders of both the public and private sectors must step up efforts to help such kids so that the three categories of children identified by the Urban Institute won't harden into three hostile social classes in tomorrow's America.

A problem that sorely needs addressing is the continuing rise in the number of children living in single-parent families - almost half of all the nation's children by 2010, based on the current trend. Some of these families prosper, but most suffer. So-called welfare reform has not eased this problem. In fact, the reform repeats a mistake of the original by targeting almost all the help, now often in the form of jobs, at mothers.

Public policy must aim much more employment help at men so they can gain the wherewithal to support families.

And policy-makers must keep trying to better link education to the job market and to otherwise upgrade schools. Learning has become even more crucial to decent pay than when the boomers were toting book bags.

These are mere examples of the sorts of initiatives America must consider to improve prospects for those kids with futures that are anything but bright.



## Museum highlights businesses

The Highlands Museum & Discovery Center in Ashland features a pictorial exhibit, titled "Enduring Excellence: Kentucky's Centennial Businesses," through December 29.

The businesses in this exhibit are members of the Kentucky Historical Society's Centennial Business Program, which since 1996 has been recognizing "for profit" Kentucky businesses that have been in continuous operation for at least 100 years.

The Centennial Business Program's primary goal is to help these businesses identify and preserve for posterity their invaluable records and artifacts.

These enduring businesses often share similar characteristics—family pride in ownership, flexibility in adapting to changing business conditions, and a strong customer focus. All of the more than 260 businesses in the Centennial Program are important, with stories worth telling, but there is room for only 28 of them. They are representative of the initiative and ingenuity of Kentucky's entrepreneurs across more than two centuries of statehood.

One of the featured businesses is Pollock Jewelers of Ashland, founded in 1874. Pollock Jewelers still maintains its flagship store on the main downtown street, Winchester Avenue.

Kentucky business history is a story begging to be told. State Historian James C. Klotter has written. "The businesses of Kentucky have played a key, and under-reported, role in the state's development. Their stories must be told. The choices made, the risks taken, the successes and failures—all not only provide perspective for our own acts, but demonstrate the importance of the human equation in events."

The stories of some of Kentucky's biggest businesses have been told, but according to Klotter, that leaves most of our business history unwritten. "More than anything else, we need to know about those smaller businesses that are little known but affect so many people every day. They are the human side of economic history."

'Enduring Excellence: Kentucky's Centennial Businesses" is part of Museums To Go, a traveling exhibits program of the Kentucky Historical Society. This program was funded in part by the Kentucky Humanities Council and the National Endowment for the Humanities.

## Bluegrass at the Sipp

J.D. Crowe and The New South, along with 5 Miles From Nowhere, will be in concert at the Historic Sipp Theatre in Paintsville, Saturday, December 9.

The Grammy Award winning Crowe and his band are among the top in the bluegrass music world and were the first band to perform in the Bluegrass at the Sipp concert series back in 1994.

In the late '60s, J.D. Crowe became a bandforming the leader. Kentucky Mountain Boys to play a steady engagement at the Holiday Inn North, in The band Lexington. evolved from relatively traditional into a more contemporary unit, and in the early 70s became known as the New South.

With material from country and rock sources, a stellar array of sidemen (including Doyle Lawson, Ricky Skaggs, Tony Rice. Keith Whitley, and Douglas), and flawless picking and harmony singing, the New South became an important trendsetter in bluegrass music.

Starting in the mid-'70s, Crowe's interest in modern country sounds and their commercial possibilities has at times led the New South away from bluegrass, with a corresponding downplaying of the banjo's role.

However, in the '80s, he reaffirmed his roots by collaborating with Lawson and Rice on a series of albums of strictly traditional blue-

Crowe's style is unmistakably Scruggs-derived, but includes many bluesy single-string ideas and occasional use of the melodic styles as well. His clarity, absolute solidity, and distinct, deep tone set him apart from the legions of Scruggs-based players.

Despite his strong, silent stage personality, he is approachable and willing to help aspiring players, always encouraging them to work on their "timing, separation, and solid drive."

Anita Belhasen, music coordinator at The Sipp, said that additional concerts are already booked for year 2001, including Larry Sparks in January and Dave Evans & River Bend in


"Are you ready?" Ronnie asked as he steadied me to my feet.

## NEWS OF THE WEIRD

#### by CHUCK SHEPHERD

Doctors in England are under criticism. according to a November report in Canada's National Post, for having performed a legstretching surgery on Emma Richards, 16, apparently only for the purpose of making her happier about her height. She had aspired to be a flight attendant (minimum height, 5-foot-3), but had stopped growing at 4-foot-9. Surgeons fractured her femurs and inserted pins to gradually separate the pieces so that bone material would grow internally to fuse the pieces back together. (In the 10 months since the operation, she has grown five inches but also has endured a bad infection and two unintentional fractures.)

#### Number One in the News

In September, engineers reported that the mecca of Brazilian "futbol," Maracana stadium, is corroding in places because so many fans, unwilling to miss a few minutes' action by queuing up at the restrooms, relieve themselves on the terraces. Also in a September international incident, Macedonian soldiers captured a very modest Albanian border officer who had wandered across the line; he said Macedonia-side trees provided better cover to answer nature's call than the sparse vegetation on his own side.

#### **Cultural Diversity**

Critics of China's one-child policy say it has produced the country's most overindulged generation ever, a symptom of which is the Jin Duoba camp in Shanghai, famous for its tough-love regimen for overweight kids. According to an October story in the Chicago Sun-Times, the camp is modeled after military training, including requiring kids to crawl on their bellies while fake bullets fly overhead.

In September, The New York Times reported on a rhinoplasty fad among upscale Iranian women. Since Islam requires almost every part of women's bodies to be covered in public, getting a nose job has become virtually the only way in which Iran's conspicuous consumers can effectively avail themselves of plastic surgery. According to the Times, even the post-surgical bandages are seen as indicators of wealth.

Rome hairdresser Vittorio Giunta has created a stir this year by defiantly keeping his salon open past the decades-old, mandated closing time of 7 p.m., which he does sometimes in order to offer his customers haircuts during a full moon, which some believe is part of the same superstition by which crops grow faster during a full moon. According to a June New York Times report, the hours of operation of hairdressers and dozens of other artisans are rigidly controlled, which opponents say limits competition and proponents say allows Italians the luxury of not having to work so hard.

#### Crisis in the Dog Community

Wilton Rabon told reporters in Seattle in September that he had no intention of dropping his seven-year-long appeal (that would be 49 in canine years) to get his Lhasa apso dog back. The dog, named Word, was declared vicious and impounded on "death row" in May 1993, but the matter has been

tied up in court since then, with Rabon visiting Word's pen periodically yet unwilling to accept a compromise (exiling Word to faraway, but wide-open, spaces).

#### Elect Me, and I'll Fight for You!

Joe Brown, a challenger for district attorney, got into a fistfight with the incumbent's brother at a restaurant in Sherman, Texas, the day before the election (lost the fight, won the election). And on the night of the primary election in September, two members of the Florida legislature got into a fistfight at a Miami radio station when one's father called the other's father a drug dealer. And Robert Votava, running for the Rhode

Island General Assembly, was arrested the week before the election for throwing nine punches at a state tree-trimmer in his neighborhood (South Kingstown).

#### Update

News of the Weird reported the January 2000 arrest of Samuel Feldman after a three-year, \$8,000 spree of squeezing and smashing packages of bread and cookies in various Bucks County (Pennsylvania)-area supermarkets (and who was finally caught in the act by a hidden camera). Though Feldman argued that he was simply a finicky shopper.



sheet and bake for 20 minutes or until lightly browned. Cool on rack and store in an airtight container.
