State schedules killer to die Tuesday

For the third time since the state's death penalty was reinstated in 1976, a death row inmate is scheduled to die at the Eddyville prison in western Kentucky.

David Smith, 52, was convicted in 1983 of the murders of four people in Pike County. If last-ditch appeals are unsuccessful, he will be executed Tuesday.

A jury found Smith guilty of the 1980 killing of his girlfriend, Rebecca Church, 17, of South Point, Ohio; her 18-month-old daughter, Amanda Church; her mother, Mary Thompson, 48, also of South Point; and Rebecca's sister, Betty Maynard, 27, of Canada in Pike County.

Because Smith was convicted prior to the state's revocation of electrocution as a means of putting condemned felons to death, he was given the opportunity to choose between that method and lethal injection. According to prison officials, Smith has chosen the electric chair.

After the death penalty was reinstated in 1976, 21 years passed without an execution in Kentucky. In 1997, Harold McQueen Jr. became the first modern execution when he died in the electric chair. Eddie Lee Harper died by lethal injection a year ago.

Heart recipient meets family of organ donor

Even though the two families had never met face to face before in their lives, their "introduction to one another" was an emotional one.

Barbara Kelty, from Springfield in Washington County, paid a visit to the family of Danny Justice Jr., whose heart was donated to Kelty when Justice was killed in an automobile accident in 1995. Kelty, along with her brother, Donnie Carrico, and her daughter, Darlene, made the trip to the County Cafe on Mud Creek to meet the Justice family. Denise Justice, Danny's mother, works at the cafe.

Kelty, who says she has had no health problems since she had her heart transplant, says it was important for her to meet the Justice family.

"The family is mine," Kelty said. "Part of this family is keeping me going."

Kelty now works with the Kentucky Organ Donor Affiliates (KODA) and her bubbling personality shows a strong need for such a program. Kelty said she knows there were two sides to organ donations.

She said she was very happy when she learned that she was getting a heart, but knew somewhere a family who cared enough about life to donate organs was losing a loved one.

Kelty said a day did not go by that she didn't think of Danny.

"Every day I say a prayer to Danny (not for him) to him," Kelty said. "I also tell my husband (who died about a year a half ago) to take care of Danny."

Kelty said people ask her if anything is different now that she has a different heart — did she like or dislike something that she did not in the past. She said there were no major changes, but she did relate how she cultivated a taste for watermelon. The Justices said Danny was a big watermelon eater.

Kelty said she lives by herself and wants it that way. She said she has an open invitation to stay with her children but prefers to live alone and take part in activities with the family. She said she went to the zoo, to Myrtle Beach and other outings.

"I do whatever I want to," she said.

She said her great love is gardening. She said she just loves to

Elementary teacher arrested after shooting

A Kentucky State Police officer was called to the scene of a shooting in Harold last Thursday, June 1.

Dwight D. Newsome, 35, of Harold was arrested after he allegedly fired three shots into a vehicle driven by Mike Conn, also of Harold.

Newsome, who was reported in the arrest citation to have allegedly been drinking, told officers he shot the car but was trying to shoot a deer target.

According to the citation by Trooper Rick Conn, the alleged victim was struck in the right side of his face by a piece of glass, causing a small scratch.

Newsome, a teacher at Betsy Layne Elementary, was charged with second-degree wanton endangerment and second-degree criminal mischief.

The alleged perpetrator damaged Conn's vehicle by shooting through the windshield, the driver's side window, the driver's door and passenger's door panel.

Newsome was released from the Floyd County Detention center on a \$10,000 bond. He is scheduled for arraignment on July 5.

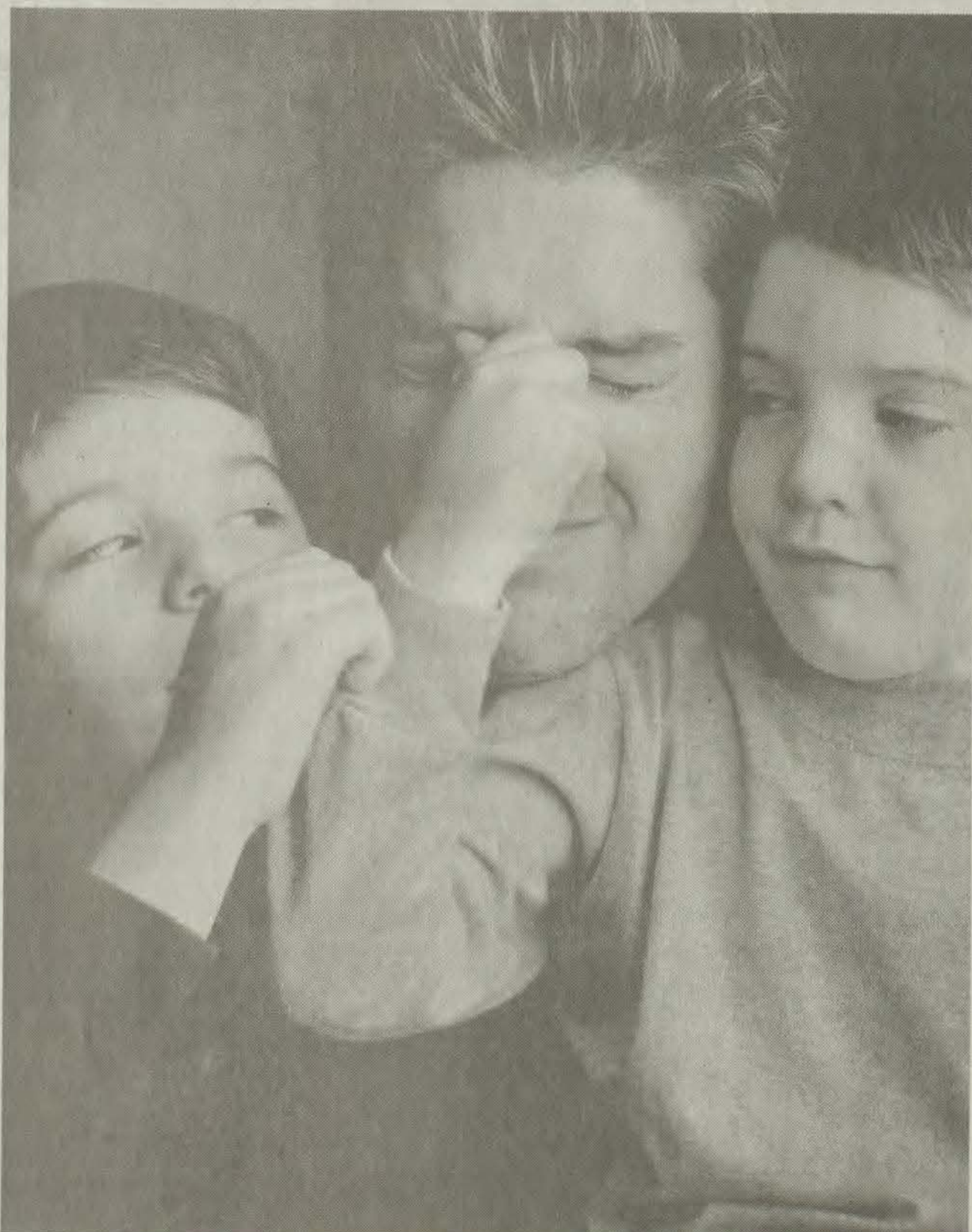

When asked about her impressions of eastern Kentucky, she said, "It has a lot of hills and curvy roads."

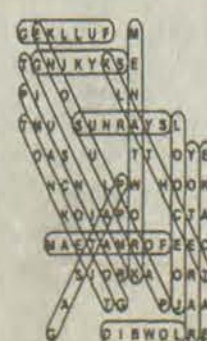

Questions and answers about bacterial meningitis

What is meningitis?

Meningitis is an infection of the fluid of a person's spinal cord and the fluid that surrounds the brain. People sometimes refer to it as spinal meningitis. Meningitis is usually caused by a viral or bacterial infection. Knowing whether meningitis is caused by a virus or bacterium is important because the severity of illness and the treatment differ. Viral meningitis is generally less severe and resolves without specific treatment, while bacterial meningitis can be quite severe and may result in brain damage, hearing loss, or learning disability. For bacterial meningitis, it is also important to know which type of bacteria is causing the meningitis because antibiotics can prevent some types from spreading and infecting other people. Before the 1990s, Haemophilus influenzae type b (Hib) was the leading cause of bacterial meningitis, but new vaccines being given to all children as part of their routine immunizations have reduced the occurrence of invasive disease due to H. influenzae. Today, Streptococcus pneumoniae and Neisseria meningitidis are the leading causes of bacterial meningitis.

What are the signs and symptoms of meningitis?

High fever, headache, and stiff neck are common symptoms of meningitis in anyone over the age of 2 years. These symptoms can develop over several hours, or they may take 1 to 2 days. Other symptoms may include nausea, vomiting, discomfort looking into

bright lights, confusion, and sleepiness. In newborns and small infants, the classic symptoms of fever, headache, and neck stiffness may be absent or difficult to detect, and the infant may only appear slow or inactive, or be irritable, have vomiting, or be feeding poorly. As the disease progresses, patients of any age may have seizures.

How is meningitis diagnosed?

Early diagnosis and treatment are very important. If symptoms occur, the patient should see a doctor immediately. The diagnosis is usually made by growing bacteria from a sample of spinal fluid. The spinal fluid is obtained by performing a spinal tap, in which a needle is inserted into an area in the lower back where fluid in the spinal canal is readily accessible. Identification of the type of bacteria responsible is important for selection of correct antibiotics.

Can meningitis be treated?

Bacterial meningitis can be treated with a number of effective antibiotics. It is important, however, that treatment be started early in the course of the disease. Appropriate antibiotic treatment of most common types of bacterial meningitis should reduce the risk of dying from meningitis to below 15 percent, although the risk is higher among the elderly.

Is meningitis contagious?

Yes, some forms are bacterial meningitis are contagious. The bacteria are spread through the exchange of respiratory and throat secretions (i.e., coughing, kissing). Fortunately, none of the bacteria that cause meningitis are as

contagious as things like the common cold or the flu, and they are not spread by casual contact or by simply breathing the air where a person with meningitis has been.

However, sometimes the bacteria that cause meningitis have spread to other people who have had close or prolonged contact with a patient with meningitis caused by Neisseria meningitidis (also called meningococcal meningitis) or Hib. People in the same household or day-care center, or anyone with direct contact with a patient's oral secretions (such as a boyfriend or girlfriend) would be considered at increased risk of acquiring the infection. People who qualify as close contacts of a person with meningitis caused by N. meningitidis should receive antibiotics to prevent them from getting the disease. Antibiotics for contacts of a person with Hib meningitis disease are no longer recommended if all contacts 4 years of age or younger are fully vaccinated against Hib disease (see below).

Are there vaccines against meningitis?

Yes, there are vaccines against Hib and against some strains of N. meningitidis and many types of Streptococcus pneumoniae. The vaccines against Hib are very safe and highly effective.

There is also a vaccine that protects against four strains of N. meningitidis, but it is not routinely used in the United States and is not effective in children under 18 months of age. The vaccine against N. meningitidis is sometimes used to control outbreaks of some types of meningococcal meningitis in the United States. Meningitis cases should

be reported to state or local health departments to assure follow-up of close contacts and recognize outbreaks. Although large epidemics of meningococcal meningitis do not occur in the United States, some countries experience large, periodic epidemics. Overseas travelers should check to see if meningococcal vaccine is recommended for their destination. Travelers should receive the vaccine at least 1 week before departure, if possible. Information on areas for which meningococcal vaccine is recommended can be obtained by calling the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention at (404)-332-4565.

A vaccine to prevent meningitis due to S. pneumoniae (also called pneumococcal meningitis) can also prevent other forms of infection due to S. pneumoniae. The pneumococcal vaccine is not effective in children under 2 years of age but is recommended for all persons over 65 years of age and younger persons with certain chronic medical problems.

UK trustees answer questions about closed session

Seven members of the University of Kentucky Board of Trustees met with media representatives Tuesday as part of a settlement to end the year-long legal dispute over a closed session of the board.

Board Chairman Billy Joe Miles issued a statement that said he believed that the executive session "did not comply with the spirit, if not the letter, of the Open Meetings Act, and did not comply with the requirements of KRS 164.170."

In addition to the Open Meetings Law (KRS 61.870 to 61.884), there is a separate statute (164.170) that deals specifically with the UK Board of Trustees, and predates the open meeting law, that says all meetings of the board are to be open to the public.

The controversial executive session was held May 4, 1999, to discuss extending UK President Charles Wethington's contract. Following the closed door session, the board extended Wethington's contract for two years, putting him in the university's top spot until 2003. An uproar within the university's faculty, student body and media organizations followed the closed session.

The Lexington Herald-Leader, Louisville Courier-Journal and Kentucky Press Association sued the university. The lawsuit's alleged violations included: failure to include the contract extension on the agenda; failure to make a transcript of the session; and taking the vote in open session by voice vote only. The suit alleged the board's actions were deliberate to avoid public debate, scrutiny and comment by university faculty.

Six weeks after the closed door session, the board rescinded its decision to extend Wethington's contract as president — and instead hired him as a fundraiser for the university after his retirement — but the lawsuit proceeded through Fayette Circuit Court.

Papers are expected to be filed this week dismissing the litigation. Tuesday's press conference was held for trustees to answer questions regarding the executive session.

"This press conference and

Miles' statement is the way that all the parties came together to try and figure out a way to resolve the lawsuit," said KPA General Counsel Jon Fleischaker. "It appeared evident to everybody, that it was not worth pursuing the lawsuit in regards to time and expense, once the Wethington matter was resolved. I certainly hope and expect UK will do a better job in regard to following the open meetings laws. The lawsuit will have served its purpose if it reminds UK to abide with what the law requires on open meetings."

Former governor Edward T. "Ned" Breathitt, then chairman of the board, said Tuesday he called the executive session to avoid possible embarrassment for Wethington, in the event there wasn't enough support to extend the contract. He said he also feared placing the item on the board's agenda would restrict trustees from having a "full and frank discussion" about the contract extension.

Breathitt said he was initially approached with the contract extension idea by Billy Wilcoxson, chairman of the board's investment committee. He said Wilcoxson was concerned that a presidential search and change in leadership would hinder the university's very successful fundraising efforts and suggested Wethington's contract be extended by three years.

UK is in the middle of a five-year capital campaign and Wethington has been credited as being responsible for the fundraising success. That ability was cited as the prime reason the board wanted to extend his contract.

Breathitt said he received legal advice from the university's lawyer before calling the executive session.

"I asked the university's lawyers to advise me as chairman, so that I could advise the board, and Mr. Wilcoxson, what were the proper steps to legally have a closed session," he said. "I received that material from Paul VanBooven, the university's lawyer. He prepared a motion for Mr. Wilcoxson and on the strength of that legal opinion, he (Wilcoxson) made a motion to go into executive session. I felt that it was important that we have an executive session because we

needed to get the 'sense' of the board as to whether there would be any interest in extending the contract. If there wasn't, there would be no motion made to extend it."

Breathitt denied that any type of showing of hands or straw vote was taken during the closed session. He said only four members of the board of trustees had advance knowledge the contract extension would be discussed at the May 4 meeting: he, Wilcoxson, James F. Hardyman and Robert P. Meriwether.

In addition to Breathitt and Chairman Miles, five other trustees attended Tuesday's press conference: Paul Chellgren, Billy B. Wilcoxson, Frank Shoop, Steven S. Reed and Daniel R. Reedy.

Reedy, a Spanish and Italian professor at UK and one of the two votes against the contract extension in the original meeting, said he raised the issue of exempting Wethington from the mandatory retirement age of 65 during the executive session and the possible fallout from such a decision.

"There was a general discussion of it, both pro and con," said Reedy.

Chellgren said he and another trustee offered a compromise plan during the executive session to extend Wethington's contract by 18 months, instead of three years as originally proposed by Wilcoxson.

Reedy said he was asked during the executive session if he could support a three-, two-, or one-year extension — to each of which he replied, "no."

In the uproar that surrounded the May 1999 meeting, there was much speculation regarding Gov. Paul Patton and his public clash with Wethington in 1997 over the community college system.

Wethington, a former chancellor of the community college system, vehemently opposed Patton's plan that removed the colleges from the umbrella of UK.

A contract extension would have placed Wethington in the president's seat through most of Patton's second term. Another factor deemed suspect by some was the timing of the May 1999 meeting. It was the end of the school year, graduation, final exams and summer break were on the front burner for many UK faculty and its student body. Also, terms of office of two of Wethington's most loyal supporters on the board were set to expire in a month.

"In preparing the lawsuit and researching the issues, we heard speculation and comment about the possibility that Gov. Patton's role in choosing the new president may have been discussed by members of the board as part of the closed meeting," said Fleischaker.

When asked about any discussion during the closed session involving the governor, Shoop said he stated there wasn't a conflict between Patton and Wethington.

Herald-Leader editor Pam Luecke said she was glad the litigation was over.

"I'm glad it's behind us. A year after the fact isn't the same as having an open meeting, but it's better than nothing," said Luecke.

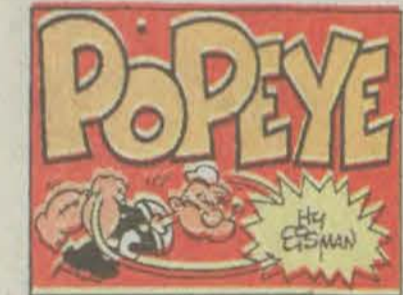

I wish I'd said that

Now that all the votes are counted, the primary election is finally history.

But before you can say "I LIKE IKE," the general election will be gearing up again and the remaining candidates will be back on the campaign trail. And, if you were tired of all the name calling and political shenanigans during the first round, just keep in mind what Jimmy Durante used to say, "You ain't seen nothin' yet."

Whether we like it or not (analysts' polls confirm that we do) negative campaigning has been shown to work. So now is the time for the upcoming campaigners to sneak into their opponent's closets and start pulling out skeletons or anything else that looks, sounds or smells suspicious.

- A craven hedge-born lewdster.
- An errant pottle-deep pignut.
- A fawning toad-spotted scut.
- A spongy flat-mouthed lout.
- A mewling, clay-brained maggot-pie.
- A paunchy, rude-growing flap-dragon.

Phase II: By summer, it will be time for more pointed remarks, along the lines of Winston Churchill's description of a rival as a "modest man with a lot to be modest about." One Internet site, www.corsinet.com, has a section called Brain Candy that features a large collection of famous put-downs:

"I never forget a face, but in your case I'll make an exception." — Groucho Marx.

"If I were married to you, I'd put poison in your coffee." — Lady Astor to Winston Churchill.

"If you were my wife, I'd drink it." — Churchill's reply.

"A \$400 suit on him would look like socks on a rooster." — Former Louisiana Gov. Earl Long.

"When he does smile, he looks as if he's just evicted a widow." Mike Royko on Bob Doyle.

And from "The Book of Classic Insults," edited by Tom Steele (Morrow 1999):

"Harding was a not a bad man, he was just a slob." — Alice Roosevelt Longworth on Warren Harding.

"Bill Clinton's foreign policy experience stems mainly from having breakfast at the International House of Pancakes." — Patrick Buchanan.

"I enjoyed talking to you. My mind needed a rest." — Henry Youngman.

Phase III: By late summer, the gloves will start coming off. Here are some possible one-liners from a comedian named Butch Fisco on his website www.insults.com:

"Nice suit! Somewhere there's a Pinto without upholstery."

"Hey, Vice President Gore: Nice hair! What is that, Rayon?"

"Hey, Gov. Bush, nice suit! There's a family in Tijuana right now saying, 'What happened to our kitchen curtains?'"

Phase IV: During debate season, regional insults will abound. And since the two contenders are from the South, Jeff Foxworthy's "Redneck Classic" would go like this: You might be a redneck if...

"Your good deed of the month was hiding your brother for a few days."

"You can entertain yourself for more than an hour with a fly swatter."

"Your wife has said, 'Come move this transmission so I can take a bath.'"

Phase V: By election day, the rhetoric is bound to descend to the level of "Liar, liar, pants on fire!" So here are some useful last-minute barbs for desperate candidates from Percelay, Dweck and Ivey's "Double Snaps" (Morrow 1995):

"Your father is so dumb he stole a car and kept up the payments."

"You're so ugly you can't get a date off a calendar."

Docu-drama explores life of German clergyman and resistance fighter

What is a moral person to do in a time of great immorality? That question was central to Dietrich Bonhoeffer, a German clergyman of great distinction who actively opposed Hitler and the Nazis. His convictions eventually cost him his life.

"Bonhoeffer: Agent of Grace," airing on KET Wednesday, June 14, at 9:30 p.m., and KET2 Tuesday, June 20, at 9 p.m., dramatizes Bonhoeffer's final years, his participation in the German resistance and his moral struggle.

The 90-minute film won the top honor at the Monte Carlo TV Festival this past February.

Shot in the Czech Republic, Berlin and Canada, the dramatization depicts the heroic rebellion of Bonhoeffer, a highly regarded Lutheran minister who could have kept his peace and saved his life on several occasions, but instead paid the price for his beliefs.

The film is a vital portrait of the man, the teacher, the resistance fighter, the moralist, the prisoner and, eventually, the martyr. The program also sheds light on the efforts of the German resistance.

NEWS OF THE WEIRD

In April, doctors at Washington, D.C.'s St. Elizabeth's Hospital said Tomar Cooper Locker, 25, was no longer mentally ill and should be unconditionally released. Just two months earlier, Locker had been found not guilty by reason of insanity (post-traumatic stress) in the murder of boxer Reuben Bell, whom Locker had fatally shot because he thought Bell had killed Locker's girlfriend. Though Locker thus escaped penalty for murder and the wounding of five bystanders, he was sentenced to 20 to 60 months for gun-possession (but since he was jailed pre-trial for 26 months, a judge at press time was considering whether to release Locker immediately).

Potential Caretakers of Democracy

Among this year's political candidates: For governor of West Virginia: Joseph

Oliverio, who admitted in February that he's had 60 speeding tickets and been arrested 150 times. For Anderson County, Tennessee, property assessor: Bobby E. Jones, who served time for 37 counts of making false statements to the federal government. For a seat in the Missouri General Assembly: Richard Tolbert, who recently filed for Chapter 13 bankruptcy for the seventh time in three years. For Scottsdale, Arizona, City Council: Gary Tredway, on the lam for 30 years after a conviction for throwing a firecracker at firefighters during a student antiwar demonstration.

Frontiers of Science

Recent Language/Brain Scramblings: Wendy Hasnip, 47, told BBC Television in December that a minor stroke had given her the rare Foreign Accent Syndrome (in her case, a French accent, though she knows no words in French). Also in

December, the Moscow (Russia) Times featured Willi Melnikov, 37, brain-injured by a landmine in the Soviet-Afghanistan war, who emerged from the hospital with an activated (previously dormant) facility for languages and has since become fluent in dozens and conversant in 93.

China's Xinhua News Agency reported in March that the 13-pound cyst removed from a 28-year-old farmer in the northern province of Shaanxi actually contained the ossified fetus of his identical twin brother. Physicians at Hanzhong Medical School and Xi'an University of Medical Science said the fetus had grown for a while after the farmer's birth, then stopped, with the result that it had hair, skin, and teeth similar to an adult's but other features that resembled a fetus.

In March, Christie's Auction House of

New York City unloaded all of the 60 paintings created by artists that happen also to be elephants, including Sao (a former log-hauler in Thailand's timber industry), whose work was likened by Yale art historian Mia Fineman to work of Paul Gauguin for its "broad, gentle, curvy brush strokes" and "a depth and maturity." Fineman said she is writing a book on the three distinct regional styles of Thai elephant art.

Garbage artist Tom Deininger's one-person show opened at the Newport (Rhode Island) Art Museum in January, consisting of his sculptures made of discarded trash, including packaging, toys, clothes and computer parts. Deininger says fans feed him tips on particularly cool Dumpsters to raid and told the Providence Journal that he was working on a self-portrait made of cardboard boxes, with cheeks

Distiller named national historic landmark

U.S. Secretary of the Interior Bruce Babbitt has announced the designation of the Labrot & Graham Distillery in Woodford County as a National Historic Landmark.

Labrot & Graham is one of 15 properties in 10 states recommended to the Secretary for this designation by the National Park System Advisory Board for their national significance in American history and culture.

"We are very pleased and honored that the U.S. Department of the Interior has recognized the importance of Labrot & Graham, home of Woodford Reserve, to the development of bourbon whiskey by naming it a National Historic Landmark," said L&G General Manager Bill Creason.

In recommending Labrot & Graham as a National Historic Landmark, the advisory board said:

"As the birthplace of bourbon in the 1830s, this site illustrates, like no other property, the history of bourbon distillation in Kentucky. With its intact rural setting, Labrot & Graham presents the evolution of the craft from the traditional pot still distilling of farmers during the 19th century to the mature and highly specialized industry of the post-Repeal era.

Of all Kentucky distilleries, Labrot & Graham is closely associated with the development of bourbon as a distinctive Kentucky alcoholic beverage and the one that became the leading export of the United States."

Speaking of Labrot & Graham and other newly designated National Historic Landmarks, National Park Service Director Robert Stanton stated, "These landmarks serve as a guide in comprehending important trends and patterns in American history, allowing us to better understand the conditions which helped shape our country. Their continued preservation will ensure that future generations will learn from and enjoy these treasured sites for years to come."

A site recognized as a National Historic Landmark receives such a designation because of its historical importance to the entire nation and is already listed in the National Register of Historic Places.

While the National Register contains more than 71,000 historic sites, only 2,310, or roughly 3 percent, have been selected for landmark designation.

National Historic Landmarks are identified by theme and special studies prepared or overseen by National Park Service historians and archaeologists. The National Parks Service often conducts National Historic Landmark studies in partnership with federal, state, tribal or local preservation officials; the academic community; independent scholars; and others knowledgeable about a particular subject.

The American Association of Museums has announced the winners of its national Publications Design Competition for 2000.

Second prize was awarded to the University of Kentucky Art Museum in the Supplementary Materials category for its brochure titled, "Modern Fiction and Art: Prints by Contemporary Authors."

Designed by Robin Jones, with an introduction by UK Art Museum curator Rachael Sadinsky, the brochure includes essays by Kurt Vonnegut and Ralph Steadman.

Reproductions of Vonnegut's Traftamadore No. 1, Steadman's Lizard Lounge, and Hunter S. Thompson's The Sheriff, illustrate the

The Historic Sites Act of 1935 authorized the Secretary of the Interior to recognize historic places judged to have exceptional value to the nation. The National Historic Landmark program was established to identify and protect places possessing exceptional value in illustrating the nation's heritage.

Prestigious prize awarded to UK art museum

The Vonnegut prints illustrated characters and ideas for several of his novels, while the Steadman works

were images from the Thompson novel Fear and Loathing in Las Vegas.

The Modern Fiction and Art: Prints by Contemporary Authors brochure was on display at the AAM Annual Meeting in Baltimore, May 14-18. All the winning publications will be featured in a special section of the July/August issue of Museum News, the AAM journal.
