School board considers roofs, classrooms

The Floyd County Board of Education gave the go-ahead for advertising and letting bids for new roofs at Stumbo and Osborne elementary schools at a specialcalled meeting Tuesday evening.

District 4 board member Carol Stumbo to make sure that the re-roofing does not crowding at Stumbo Elementary.

"We said we would never do this again," said board chairman Terry Dotson, referring to the school system's costly experience with mobile classrooms. "I would like to see specificity regarding leases. The last lease was so open-ended, it was scary," Dotson said.

With the mobile units expected to cost as much as \$900 per month and more, the board broached the matter of purchasing rather than leasing.

"I want to make sure this is a temporary facility, even if we purchase it," said District 1 board member Johnnie Ross.

Adams recommended looking into the purchase of a 24'x64' unit, which would make two classrooms, and a 24'x32' unit. He said that if he advertised the bids right away, pending state approval, the process still requires more than 20 days.

Dotson said he might be able to get one unit donated to the system.

Pointing out the substandard conditions at the school, Carol Stumbo said, "Every day that goes by, those students are in those classrooms. We need to get them out of

Also in regard to facilities, the board approved the agreement with Johnson-Romanowitz Architects for the interior renovation of the "water building" at Duff Elementary School. Some discussion ensued as to what governing body is responsible for the use of the building.

District 5 member Jody Mullins said he

#### Educational goals approved by board

With an overall target of improving teaching and learning in Floyd County schools, the local board of education approved a set of goals, recommended by Supt. Paul Fanning, and added some of their own at Tuesday night's special meeting.

#### Board members were advised of three goals:

■ To increase the district academic index by 3.5 points on the Spring 2001 Kentucky Performance Report, according to results reported by October 1, 2001.

■ To reach 95 percent student attendance by June 30, 2001.

■ To reach 97 percent employee attendance by June 30, 2001.

Board member Carol Stumbo requested that a goal regarding an ongoing system of accountability be added. "I would like to see us consider an accountability process... with evaluation of all staff," the District 4 member said.

Fanning informed the board that work has been done on a management audit, with "significant gains." He added that another scholastic audit by the state is coming up in the next few weeks. "We'll be assessed (as to) where we are, what we've done," the superintendent said.

State Manager Woodrow Carter said the completed audit by the Department of Education is expected by early December.

District 5 board member Jody Mullins said he would like for the board to see a report before the audit report is done. "I would hate to be blind-sided," he said.

Board members also asked Fanning to add a goal concerning an increase in parent involvement in schools.

"We've moved this meeting all over the county, and I've yet to see a roomful of parents," Mullins said.

First District board member Johnnie Ross agreed. "We can meet for months and years and talk about academic standards, but we talk about athletics and the room is filled," he

"I don't believe people in the community don't care," said Carol Stumbo. "We just have to find a better way to communicate."

She added that she believes many parents "feel they can't get involved" and indicated that board members "need to look at systems where par-





Mine operators charged with criminal violations

Three men from Floyd County who ran a mine where a scoop operator, James

Sturgill, was killed last year, are scheduled to be rearraigned in U.S. District Court, October 18, in Frankfort.

The men were indicted July 12 for criminal violations of the Federal Mine Safety and Health Act.

The criminal indictment by the U.S. Attorney accused the three officials of six safety violations:

 Allowing miners to work under unsupported roof. Roof bolting in areas where the

roof support system would not reach. Failure to instruct miners in changes in the roof control plan.

where roof support ended. Failure to follow ventilation plan. Allowing miners to smoke in the mine, and failure to search miners for

Failure to post warning signs

cigarettes. If convicted, each man faces a sentence of up to one year in prison and

fine of up to \$100,000, on each count.

Sammons, the mine president, faces additional charges for issuing false MSHA training certificates to four miners. Sammons faces up to five years in jail for each count, and a fine up to \$250,000.

The charges are against Jody Sammons, 39, of Minnie, president of J & A Coal Corp.; Matthew Hall, 44, of Grethel, the mine superintendent, day shift section foreman, and Randy Carroll, 42, Grethel, the second shift foreman.

They are accused of allowing their employees to work under an unsupported roof and numerous other violations at the No. 1 mine in Knott County. This mine, located at Lackey, employs about 34.

The investigators determined that the accident occurred as a result of mine management's failure to adequately supervise and direct the work force, to prevent miners from traveling under unsupported roof. A practice of traveling and working under unsupported roof was found to exist which directly contributed to the death of the 35year-old miner and injuries to three co-

had been advised that if the building is to be used for Head Start, the Duff Site-Based Decision-Making Council does not have authority over it.

Cost of the renovation is estimated at \$85,000.

The board also approved the standard agreement with the architectural firm to go ahead with the plan to fill in the swimming pool at Allen Central High School and convert it to other usage, at a cost of \$97,503.

Ross voted against the measure, saying he remains "opposed to closing the pool.'

The board learned that it would have to reconsider the 2000-2001 property tax rates. According to finance director Matt Wireman, the board received "erroneous property assessments" from the state.

Those assessments, upon which tax rates are set, resulted in a projected loss of state funding of more than \$232,500. To minimize its losses, the board must adjust the property tax rate to 61.9 cents per \$100 assessment.

Following the required public notices and a public hearing, the earliest the new rate could be approved by the board is October 30. Wireman said he has planned a hearing for that date at 6 p.m. at May Valley Elementary School library. A special board meeting would then follow to consider the tax rate adoption.

After turning down Prestonsburg Elementary School's request to alter its primary progress report at the last regular meeting, the board approved a revised edition.

Principal Gwen Harmon explained the process followed in getting parent input for the revision. She said that a survey showed that parents are in favor of students in the primary classrooms being assigned letter grades, but not kindergarten students.

The revision removes the younger children from the letter grade assessment and adds more opportunity for teachers to provide narrative assessment on the reports.

The board discussed once again the possibility of giving parent volunteers a break on school meal prices. The issue was brought up at the last regular meeting.

"Having been a parent volunteer, I really appreciate what they do," said District 3 board member Jeff Stumbo. "Anything we can do to assist them, we should."

Food service director Brenda Fish presented charts showing the cost to the system under different options. For instance, according to the charts, if 50 full-time volunteers were offered meals at the same rate as students, the cost for the rest of the school year would be more than \$13,000. At a "reduced rate," the cost would be more than \$4,000.

Fish said there is a potential for 400 or so volunteers, but not all of them would spend the entire day at the schools. Many, she said, will The proposed new rate would cut work after school. Last year, about

Carol Stumbo said that having to buy meals at full price "may be a barrier to parent participation," but Fish reminded the board that the food service would have to be reim-

bursed for the cost breaks. Ross suggested that site-based councils "chip in money from vending machines toward parent lunch-

Board members appeared not to be pleased with the City of Prestonsburg's decision to annex the area around KY 114, including Clark Elementary School.

Ross, whose district encompasses the city and the school, said he believes the annexation lines were "arbitrarily drawn" to include school employees in the city's occupational tax. "I am concerned," he said, "that the employee tax will be assessed on all classified (employees), particularly bus drivers and aides.

Other board members said they still want to have a meeting with city council members. A meeting had been requested prior to Monday night's council meeting, but could not be set up because of conflicting schedules.

Chairman Dotson urged the board not to "come across as hostile" in its dealings with the city.

Also during the Tuesday meeting, the board approved policy regarding correspondence and Virtual High School courses, and it approved the use of Allen Central High School for a class to be offered Prestonsburg Community College.

MSHA's report described the incident as follows:

This "boom hole" was blasted out by the day shift, creating an unsupported area prior to the second shift entering the mine. The second

came on duty and cleaned up the blast site and stopped to eat. After eating, the men began installing roof bolts in the unsupported area of the

Sturgill was assisting Byron Martin and John Crisp, who were installing roof bolts. Burl Hughes, a scoop operator, was holding drill steel for Martin, who was operating a roof bolting machine. Crisp, who was operating another roof bolting machine, saw Sturgill crawl past him and enter the unsupported area -Sturgill apparently was planning to hold the drill steel for Crisp.

A section of roof fell, and Sturgill was crushed under a 7 ft. x 4 ft. x 5in. slab. Martin was knocked unconscious momentarily; Crisp was hit on the elbow, and Hughes was knocked

in the head and left hand. In spite of their injuries, some of the group helped get the rock off Sturgill. An EMT, Benjie Stewart, traveled under-

ground to give aid.

Sturgill and Hughes were both taken to McDowell Appalachian Regional Hospital, where Sturgill was pronounced dead. Hughes was treated and released.

MSHA investigators arrived that night to begin inspections and inter-

Sturgill had been killed on his first day at work, on March 11, 1999. A scoop operator with 15 years experience, Sturgill took refresher training in 1998 and 1999. However, Sturgill had not been instructed in the revised roof control plan, or in the procedures

#### Parental responsibility

At Tuesday night's special meeting of the Floyd County Board of Education, goals for the school system were discussed and a goal to increase parent involvement was requested to be added.

As happens frequently, the discussion turned contentious - unnecessarily so. One board member made a statement about the lack of parental involvement and another interpreted the statement as meaning that Floyd County parents don't care. A block of time was then devoted to clarifications and the all-too-common one-up-man-ship debates.

No board member wants to admit - not in the face of political reality - that there is a real problem and that the ills of the school system cannot be cured without the back-

Let's make one thing perfectly clear before we go on -FLOYD COUNTY PARENTS MOST DEFINITELY CARE DEEPLY ABOUT THEIR CHILDREN.

They care about their health. They care about their appearance. They care about their religious upbringing. They care about their socialization. They care about the condition of their athletic fields and their recreational parks. They care about their safe transportation to and from school. They care about the quality of their children's non-parental

What far too many parents do not concern themselves with, the evidence would seem to indicate however, is the quality of their children's education. If they did care about this aspect of their children's lives, student achievement would be much higher.

If they did care, they would literally be storming the school system's central office, they would appear in legions at board of education meetings, they would be lined up at principals' doors, they would be questioning teachers, and they would be monitoring every aspect of their children's

Very little of that is happening.

There are likely some excuses to be offered. First of all, education is not highly valued in our area. That is an inescapable reality. If you want proof, walk through Wal-Mart on any given school day; you'll see parents and hool-age children going up and down the aisles. And if you hear many parents talk about taking their children to the doctor for a check-up or to a dentist, you'd think no medical services are available in Floyd County after 3 p.m. School is simply not important enough, to many, to make sure that children are there.

Because education is not valued, many parents feel they don't have an adequate education and they feel ill-prepared to monitor their children's progress or to discuss their children's needs with teachers and other school personnel. The cycle is perpetuated.

Historically, the way most people have made their living in this area has not required a great deal of education. But those ways are changing, and a good education is critical if

#### Urges breast cancer screening

As a board-certified plastic surgeon in Pikeville, who regularly works with breast cancer survivors, I strongly urge support of October as National Breast Cancer Awareness Month by reminding the women you love to schedule regular cancer screenings.

Anna felt a lump in her breast that two mammograms did not detect. Ten to 15 percent of all tumors are not detected by mammograms. Being very concerned, as there is a history of breast cancer in her family. She had a biopsy on the lump and it was found to be cancer. She had to have chemotherapy, radiation and a mastectomy. She was extremely blessed to have the support of her husband of 24 years, her family and friends.

After the cancer treatments, when Anna started to feel better and was ready, she consulted with me. We ance denials for the surgery. discussed the best options for treatment specifically for Anna and went forward with a procedure to reconstruct her breast, called the TRAM flap. In this procedure, the patient does not use implants; we use their own tissue for the reconstruction. She then underwent outpatient surgery to complete the nipple areola reconstruction.

Anna says, "The results are so amazing. I'm so glad I did it." She has already served as a resource for other women who are considering reconstruction

Early detection through self-examination and medical screening are key prevention methods. For Anna and the estimated 175,000 other women diagnosed with breast cancer each year, advances in plastic surgery and break-through legislation have helped make such devastating news easier to bear.

Improvements in post-surgical therapies, including several breast reconstruction options, are helping

allay the fear of disfigurement from mastectomy. Typically, plastic surgeons make recommendations based upon the patient's age, health, anatomy, tissues and goals. The most common procedures include skin expansion followed by the use of implants, or flap reconstruction.

Equally important to breast cancer survivors is the 1998 passage of the Women's Health and Cancer Rights Act (WHCRA) that mandates insurance coverage for breast reconstruction following a mastectomy. Board-certified plastic surgeons know first-hand how breast reconstruction improves a survivor's self-esteem and confidence after a mastectomy.

The American Society of Plastic Surgeons (ASPS) was a major supporter of the WHCRA and is proud to have been part of the effort to stop insur-

Now almost every woman who loses her breast to cancer can have it rebuilt through reconstructive surgery. Discussion about this can start immediately after diagnosis. Breast reconstruction following mastectomy increased 180 percent between 1992 and 1999, with 82,975 procedures performed in

My fellow members of ASPS and I are well aware of the devastating effects of breast cancer. We support all women in their fight against the disease. For all breast cancer victims, I suggest the following: talk to a board certified plastic surgeon regarding reconstruction options, and discuss the pros, cons, and realistic expectations of those options.



But no matter how hard these



In previous seasons the Red, White & Blue Bowl meant a big district showdown between the South Floyd Raiders and the Allen Central Rebels.





Mark Sickman, a playwright and poet from San Diego. California, will conduct two sessions, one in playwriting and one in poetry. "The Death of Jazz," a comedy that he wrote, recently had a run off Broadway, and "Charming Billy," a serious drama, has been selected for staged readings in Kansas City, Missouri, Hollywood, Florida, and Los Angeles.

Charlotte Morgan, a novelist who is an assistant professor of English at DSLCC, will conduct sessions in novel and short story. Morgan's novel, "One August Day," was recently published, and one of her short stories won the Sherwood Anderson Short Story Contest. Another one of her short stories received a Pushcart Prize in 1999.

M. Ray Allen, a poet, journalist, and playwright who has three books of poetry to his credit along with more than two dozen poetry awards, will conduct sessions in poetry and screenplay writing. Allen's "Beyond Star Bottom and Other Poems" was released by Mountain Empire Publishing last month, and he recently received a Governor's Award nomination.

"An Innovative Spirit: The Southern Highland Craft Guild Celebrates 70 Years," a traveling exhibition, opened at the Kentucky Folk Art Center in Morehead on Thursday, October 12. This landmark exhibition is made up of 92 works produced in Southern Appalachia during the last seven

An Innovative Spirit highlights the accomplishments of the Southern Highland Craft Guild and its members, with traditional and non-traditional objects made by more than 90 different crafts men and women, between 1930 and

The exhibition demonstrates the gradual evolution of certain craft forms over this 70-year period, explores issues of tradition and innovation, and illustrates changes that have taken place in the use of

materials and design.

"If there is one constant in the objects made in this region over the past 300 years, it is innovation and change," writes Robert S. Brunk, in the exhibition catalogue. "The objects made by Guild members over the past 70 years are part of a much longer continuum of cultural memory, assimilation and invention. Why are we surprised that the objects keep changing? Are we afraid that something will be lost if we don't see objects familiar to us?"

Since its founding in 1930, the guild has nurtured the creative skills and promoted the work of craftspeople from 293 mountain counties in nine southern states, and has served as a model for many similar crafts organizations formed elsewhere in the country.

father at the 1983 Chicago Blues Festival to his years spent with Koko Taylor's Blues Machine and Willie Dixon's band, Allison has grown into a mature, selfassured front man. This "Jubilee" performance, taped at the 1999 W. C. Handy Blues Festival in Henderson, showcases the young gun's scorching guitar licks, thick tone and mature vocals.

With the torch of blues being handed shakily from one generation to the next, Allison seems the heir apparent to his father with his mixture of traditional and new styles.

Perhaps Allison himself sums it up best in his autobiographical song, "Young Boy Blues" - "I'm not Muddy Waters. Don't mistake me for that. I'm just a young boy, who knows where it's at."

# Many a tear has to fall, but it's all in the brain

As a sports enthusiast, it is extremely difficult for me to discredit any activity that not only ascribes to building strong young minds and bodies, but also assists in developing character. However, as far as I'm concerned, football is one of those physical activities (like boxing) which range from brutality to legalized assault.

Don't take my word for it. I was reading an article over the Internet last night about a study that had been done on football players. The headline read "Football Players Risk Concussions."

Well, duh!

The title was so intriguing, I had to continue reading. It seems a study was conducted by Dr. Mark Lovell of the University of Pittsburgh's Sports Medicine Concussion Program. And it stated, "Even a single concussion can be more dangerous than players think, partly because it affects their ability to think. Mental problems linger even after physi-

cal symptoms go away."

Can you imagine how fortunate this team is to have a man with this type of medical expertise and insight on their payroll? I mean, I was truly fascinated by Dr. Lovell's comments that, whether taken out of context or not, were quite enlightening. For example, he explained that football players who had experienced one concussion during the season had a higher rate of repeating another one. In fact, the statistics he gave were that 15% of the players who have concussions have another one in the same season. He also said that 86% of the players complained of headaches and 59% experienced dizziness after a concussion. He further noted that sometimes more serious side affects occurred such as amnesia and loss of consciousness. His exact quote: "That's kind of alarm-

As far as I'm concerned, that's equivalent to dousing yourself in gasoline and lighting a match.

Dr. Lovell noted that it wasn't easy trying to diagnose your patient when he was 30 feet away on the field, but that team doctors and trainers often had to examine their patients this way. I mean, can you imagine! It's hard enough to diagnose patients when they're sitting in your office, let alone when they're 10 yards away under 600 pounds of sweaty flesh. That really does present a problem,

I think the real "kicker" came when Dr. Lovell told about having to write a letter to a teacher for one of his players who had bombed a trig exam due to a problem he had experienced after a brain concussion. It seems that Dr. Lovell intervened on behalf of the young man

saying, "He's a 4.0, an excellent student; he's not a slacker." Boy, if only I'd been able to play football when I was in school. Lord, that's a better excuse than saying the dog ate your homework, or your grandmother died. I'm serious! Dr. Lovell said that students who ordinarily do well on tests may show foggy thinking for days after a concussion. Of course, that can also be said for the ones who drink a half a case of beer and smoke pot.

Now, I'm no Einstein, but let's evaluate this scenario: A young man, who weighs in at 250 pounds of hard, toned flesh, wearing a rigid, plastic helmet, goes out onto a playing field—oh, excuse me, a gridiron—and starts charging at approximately 3 to 5 mph at another similarly attired human being. (You have seen those two car crash dummies in the commercials, haven't you; the ones that hit a brick wall at 10 mph and disintegrate in front of your eyes?) Common sense tells you that someone is going to get jarred—a bunch!

And as for foggy-headed, well, try it for yourself. If you don't have a football helmet, or your grandfather's mining helmet, any construction hard hat will do. Put it on, find yourself a brick wall, step back about 50 feet and take a good run and go at it. Afterwards, try and recite your ABCs.

(Forget math tests!)

Maybe I shouldn't be so hard on Dr. Lovell and football. After all, most of my friends who don't play anymore still enjoy watching the sport. In fact, this past weekend as some of them sat watching a game on the tube, one of the old jocks stood up said, "Uh, uh...yeah...touchdown...uh, yeah."

#### American Playhouse features film about one Mexican family's move

Pulled between the lure of American values and their Mexican heritage, Maria and Jose's two sons grow to become rebellious and troubled young men. Only as adults—and after much tragedy—do the Sanchez children discover the comfort and importance of family.

#### NEWS OF THE WEIRD

In September, driving-school owner Bharat Patel, 49, became the 31st person convicted in a driver's-license bribery scandal at a Chicago examining station, According to testimony, Patel did not even bother to teach and spent all his time with examiners. Some of Patel's students were such bad drivers that examiners, who took \$300,000 in bribes in two years, actually gave Patel his money back. Some subsequently licensed drivers did not know how to start a car or engage the transmission; others turned directly into traffic during the test; and sometimes, terrified examiners halted the test mid-trip and hitchhiked back to the station.

Federal wildlife officials believe that the voracious and largely indestructible Asian swamp eel has somehow made its way to within a mile of Florida's Everglades National Park and poses an imminent threat to its balance of nature, according to a September Wall Street Journal report. The 3-foot-long eel apparently eats anything in its path, has no known enemies, survives in salt- and fresh water and on land, can change genders in order to facilitate year-round breeding, lays 1,000 eggs at a time, and is so durable that one lived in a wet towel for seven months with no food or water.

Helene Canuel filed a lawsuit in August against the Rimouski (Quebec) Minor Hockey Association, asking about \$700 (U.S.) in damages, because the coach of her 14-year-old son benched him for the playoffs. Canuel said she just wanted "justice for my son," but the coach was apparently more interested in surviving the single-elimination tournament.

In June, a school district in Orange County, California, was ordered by a jury to pay \$1.4 million to Taylor Steiskal, age 10, who three years ago fell off his school's monkey bars and broke his arm, which developed further complications and has required eight surgeries. Steiskal's lawyers argued that monkey bars for children should be no higher than 72 inches off the ground (thus giving a few inches' ground-clearance for a 48-inch-high boy hanging from his hands); the one Steiskal fell from was 79 inches high.

Anne and Lucy Abolins filed a \$4 million lawsuit in May against the owners of the house they formerly rented in Edmonton, Alberta, from which their 114 cats were confiscated by health inspectors, who ruled in June 1999 that the feces-laden dwelling was uninhabitable. Contrary to neighbors' claims that the Abolinses had lowered their neighborhood's value, the sisters now say that their own lives were

ruined by the health inspectors and that notoriety has made it impossible for them to find new living quarters. (In August 2000, a judge fined the sisters about \$3,500 (U.S.) for housing code violations, and Lucy Abolins then called the SPCA "the

## **Ghost Walks haunt Clay Family**

With the approach of Halloween, it is only fitting that the spirits of one of Kentucky's most colorful families return to tell the story of their lives,

The Clay family, whose home, White Hall is now a state historic site, cut a wide swath through Kentucky history. Green Clay was a pioneer surveyor who came to own thousands of acres of land in Madison County.

Among his children was Cassius Clay, a fiery abolitionist and political figure known for frequent dueling and his service to Abraham Lincoln as U.S. minister to Russia.

His political courage rubbed off on one of his daughters, Laura Clay, who became an outspoken women's rights leader in the late 19th century. Add to the colorful mix a cousin, none other than Henry Clay.

White Hall State Historic Site and the Eastern Kentucky University theatre department have teamed up to sponsor a series of "ghost walks" that feature scenes from the lives of Clay family.

Visitors will be escorted from room to room in the expansive White Hall mansion and its grounds to witness the final moments of Green Clay's life, watch Cassius fight a duel, and enjoy other fascinating moments from the past. Acting students from EKU will portray the historical characters in period costumes.

The ghost walks will be conducted October 20-21 and October 27-31, beginning nightly at 7 p.m. Admission is \$8 per adult. Reservations are required. For more information or to make reservations, call the park at 1-859-623-9178.

Antichrist' for taking her cats away.)

In September, a jury in Tacoma, Washington, ordered the state Department of Corrections to pay \$22 million to the family of a woman killed when a convicted felon (domestic assault) on probation ran a red light and hit the woman's car, concluding that the department somehow ought to have super issed the man better. The governor's office said it would appeal the verdict, questioning the state's ability to monitor the driving behavior of its 55,000 probationers 24 hours a day.

#### NOT MY FAULT

Paralyzed inmate Torrence Johnson filed a lawsuit in July against the Spartanburg (South Carolina) County Jail because guards failed to stop him in 1998 when he was whimsically doing backflips off a desk in his cell, the last one of which resulted in a fall and his subsequent paralysis. Johnson claims guards should have been watching him carefully because he had been diagnosed as depressed, although they said he appeared to be vigorous until he landed on his neck.

#### RECURRING THEMES

Last year, News of the Weird reported that a Bombay, India, collection agency had hired six eunuchs to hang around the homes and offices of obstinate debtors to embarrass them into paying up. According to a July 2000 report in London's The Guardian, the Tsaisheng credit agency in Taiwan has begun hiring AIDS patients at about \$100 (U.S.) a day for the same purpose. According to the agency owner, many peo-

ple in Taiwan still believe that AIDS is transmitted through mere social contact.

#### LEAST COMPETENT CRIMINALS

Sherman Lee Parks, 50, escaped from the Dallas County Jail in Fordyce, Arkansas, in August, oblivious of the fact that a judge had just ordered his release because he had been locked up too long; he was rearrested the next day, charged with escaping, and jailed. And in September, according to police in Shawnee, Kansas, a 19-year-old clerk at a Texaco Starmart reported he had been robbed, but actually he had just looted his own cash register, and to conceal the crime, he had put tape over the store's surveillance cameras. However, he had used transparent tape; said a police lieutenant, "(I)t looks a little fuzzy, but I don't see any robbery in there."

#### ALSO, IN THE LAST MONTH ...

Water and health officials were mystified at the continued appearance of half-inch-long red worms in the tap of a Deltona, Florida, woman but after tests, declared the water safe. A mayoral candidate in Vlore, Albania, promised that, if elected, he would re-open the city's long-shuttered brothels. Officials in Cairo, Egypt, began implementing a 20-year program to relocate 21 cemeteries (with 109,000 graves) to the suburbs.



When the Eastern Kentucky Kennel Club assigned me to their Education Committee, one of the first things I wanted to do was increase the club's visibility in the community. A public information booth at the Apple Festival seemed to be a perfect opportunity.

Being the idiot that I am, I arranged for a spot for the club to set up one. This sounded so simple. We needed, I figured, a tent, a couple of tables, some displays and some pamphlets from the American Kennel Club.

The AKC promptly shipped a whole box of leaflets on different subjects, and I had some others left over from the last dog show stashed away. One problem solved.

Then there was the tent. Paul Ray informed me that there were a couple of canopies somewhere in his attic that had been used several years ago as grooming tents at an outdoor show.

The Apple Festival Committee told me that we could have a better

location if we had a tent that did not have stakes that had to be driven into the ground. (Guess which type we had.) Of course, I wanted us to be as visible as possible, and so I asked for a location on a main street. We would deal with how to set the thing up later.

Displays shouldn't be that difficult, either. Paul and his wife, Rose, loaned me the professional photographs of winners at one of our recent shows. Another member, Barbara Dunn, found a three-paneled display frame from one of her daughter's high-school science projects.

I had a Canine Good Citizen poster that I could use, John and Bonnie Faulkner gave me permission to use their name

and phone number with this, since they hold the club's CGC classes and testing. I also ran across a poster with all the AKC-recognized dog breeds that we had used for something earlier.

Armed with these, plus a roll of clear Contact paper, some computer-generated lettering, lots of poster board, and, of course, the most essential supply of all, duct tape, I had the raw materials. Three weeks later, I actually had a decent display.

The time was now drawing close

enough for me to actually start to worry about the technical aspects of the tent. My husband, Pat, had been in the Boy Scouts, so I figured this should be a piece of cake. He popped that bubble by informing me that his Scouting leaned experience more toward the mischievous than the constructive.

He did know how to partially cut moistened tent ropes so they would snap as they dried, causing the leader's tent to collapse in the middle of the night. He had no idea how to pitch a tent. He also thought it was hilarious that I was going to try it. Being determined, but not completely stupid, I caught him gone and enlisted his mother's help.

I need to explain that the tent had been stored in a Weed Eater box, without instructions or pictures to give any sort of clue about how the thing was even supposed to look. In addition, there were supplies in the box for two tents, all mixed together.

My mother-in-law is in her 80s and recently had eye surgery. In the dark glasses she has to wear outdoors, she is functionally blind. We also had help from Punkin, her tittle Cocker Spaniel mix, and Punkin's adopted kitten.

Despite all this, we got it up in about 45

minutes, and it didn't look half-bad. By the time Pat returned, I had figured out how to substitute cement

blocks for the tent stakes. He was skeptical, but agreed that it might work.

When the time came to set up the booth, we loaded all our supplies, including a table I swiped from my cousin's auction house, and some boards that were intended to be new shelves for our bathroom. And naively set off to set up our booth.

You know where this is going. Does anything ever work the way you think it will? The job that took 45 minutes at home turned into an hour-and-a-half of something that looked like a Tim Conway sketch. Cement blocks are NOT reasonable substitutes for tent stakes, although they sort of work once you get several poles set up. More than two poles when you only have two people is the trick.

We did eventually get the thing set up, although it looked as if it had been erected by Rube Goldberg himself. It was dark by the time we pushed the table and all the supplies under the listing canopy, covered them with a plastic drop cloth and left for home.

I will have to finish this tale next week. Although our misadventures with the tent continued, I think we had a productive weekend. Hopefully, we accomplished our goal. I'm certain we provided the church group in the booth across the street from us with all the entertainment they could stand.


