# **Kittens** tossed with trash

PRESTONSBURG - Newborn mammals are generally very dependent on their mother's care for the first several weeks of their life, some even more than others.

Eyelids closed, senses not yet fully developed, they huddle together and search out mother's warm body, gentle touch and life-sustaining

But what happens when mother cannot be found? Left defenseless and on their own, most newborn creatures are doomed to perish.

A small litter of days-old tiny kittens were fast moving toward such a fate early Friday morning, but luckily for them, the city maintenance worker on duty in their neighborhood was wide-awake and paying attention.

The worker picked up a box containing a plastic garbage bag and was about to add it to the load of refuse already collected that morning when he realized that the bag was different from others. Upon examination, he discovered five,

US 23 from Dorton High School in Pike County to the county line near Harold was listed as the deadliest stretch of highway in the Big Sandy area. Data compiled by the Big Sandy Highway Safety Committee found that 46 fatal accidents occurred on this section of highway in the last two years, making it the most deadly road examined in the five-county survey.

Group identifies worst roads, seeks improvements

PRESTONSBURG Investigators and safety organizations are working every day to learn more about the causes of fatal accidents and how they can be lessened, but the process requires extensive research, time

Members of the Big Sandy Highway Safety Committee hope to make those efforts easier and feel they may be making progress toward that goal, as well as the ultimate goal of reducing fatal accidents in the five-county Big Sandy area.

During a meeting held Thursday afternoon at the Big Sandy Area Development District office in Prestonsburg, committee members spent time

examining fatal accident data total of 136 fatal crashes from 1998 through 2000 within the five-county area.

In an effort to even further pinpoint areas of concern, the committee closely examined 12 segments of highway that had

# Johnson sheriff raids marijuana operation

PAINTSVILLE - One week after participating in the arrests of Dr. Fredrick Cohn and his associate, Dr. Yakov Drabovskiy, who operated a pain clinic in Paintsville, Johnson County Sheriff William D. "Bill" Witten, once again gave an example of his department's commitment to stop illegal drug trafficking.

On Thursday, the Johnson County Sheriff's Department discovered an indoor marijuana growing operation at a Main Camp residence in Thealka, marking the first of such operations ever found by the sheriff's department.

Michael Coleman, 33, originally from Bristol, Tenn., was arrested following the search and charged with cultivating more than five plants of marijuana, use and/or possession of drug paraphernalia, endangering the welfare of a minor, trafficking over 8 ounces of marijuana and two counts of prescription drugs not in the proper container.

Coleman was living with a female at the residence also occupied by her two minor chil-

According to Witten, the sheriff's department began making "drive-bys" of the residence for observation as a result of an investigation prompted by an anonymous informant.

"Most of all of our drug busts result from cit-(See MARIJUANA, page three)

# Hotel complaint leads to pot, crack find

PIKEVILLE - Four Ohio natives were arrested Thursday morning at the Landmark Inn in Pikeville and charged with various drug possession charges, trafficking of a controlled substance and receiving stolen prop-

At just after 7 a.m. Thursday morning, officers from the Pikeville Police Department received a complaint by phone regarding several guests at the Landmark.

The complaint stated that the individuals were believed to be possession of drugs, but did not reveal any further information.

City police officers Aaron Thompson and Ricky Younce responded to the complaint and found four individuals when they arrived at the motel.

James Shepherd, 29, and Milton Ellis, 30, both of Portsmouth, Ohio, along with Crystal Bennett, 21, of Columbus, Ohio, as well as a 16year-old juvenile were arrested shortly thereafter.

The arrests came after the officers found a substantial amount of crack cocaine and a small amount of marijuana along with a small amount of cash in the group's vehicle while apprehending the four Ohio residents.

In addition to the discovered drugs, the vehicle was found to

Pikeville lead detective Bruce Anderson explained on Friday

the juvenile arrested Thursday morning had initially been arrested as an adult, having provided the police with false identification and posing as her older

Approximately an hour after her arrest, however, the juvenile spoke up and told the Pike County Detention Center staff she had used her sister's identifi-

Additional charges have been brought against her for falsely reporting information to police.

Police reports did not detail the amount of crack cocaine that was discovered in the stolen vehicle, but Anderson said on Friday that the department knew "for a fact" the group had come to the Pikeville area to sell.

"We know for a fact they were coming here to sell, but we don't know if it was a drug ring erwise been overlooked.

or the first time," Anderson alleged. "During questioning while at the jail they said things like, 'You could come to Pikeville and double your money,' you know, jail talk.

"We have a lot of out-of-state traffic through here. We're just off US 23 and people could be just passing through and stopping over in Pikeville. That's where we're probably getting a lot of this from."

Anderson went on to say that there are plans to eliminate these kinds of out of state stopovers. The department, he said, has an undetermined amount of money for training officers to become more aware of certain situations, as well as a developed canine unit that is expected to greatly increase the chances of making a drug seizure that might have oth-

"While I interviewed them. they made it clear they came to Pikeville to sell," continued Anderson. "They said they were on their way to Georgia, but that they wanted to stop by here in Pikeville on the way.'

According to Anderson, the Pikeville Police Department averages a substantial number of out-of-state arrests, some drug

"We got a family about six months ago here in with nine rifles and cocaine," said Anderson. "They sent that case to federal, that's how much

cocaine those cats had." The three adults are being held in the Pike County Detention Center while the juve nile was transported and is being

eyelids closed, umbilical cords still attached, all calling out in weak, muffled mews for mother. The animals were quickly transported to the local animal

shelter located on Sally Stephens Branch in West Prestonsburg. There, shelter director Rhonda Castle and her assistants immediately assessed the kittens' conditions, finding two with deformities - one with a "bobtail," the other with malformed hind legs known as "club legs." The remaining three appeared to be in good health.

The animal shelter staff initiated bottle-feeding sessions with all five of the kittens in an effort to spare their lives.

"They don't like this bottle very much," said Castle. "It's not mommy and mommy is what they need right now. But, they've escaped danger once today and we're going to do our best to save them."

Sadly, the two kittens with deformities will most likely have to be "put down" because their medical conditions usually result in an inability to thrive. The two kittens will remain in the care of the shelter, while the other three are scheduled to be transferred into the care of two tender-hearted local women,

Rhonda Chaffin of Martin and Connie McGuire of Bull Creek. The women operate East Kentucky Occupational Health, a mobile company that deals in drug, urine and breath analysis

"We have two animals with us already that we found abandoned, one in a box on the highway with a sign that read 'Take me home, please.' We both love animals and we want to help these kittens," said Chaffin.

After being reminded that helping the kittens to bottle-feed will be a 24-hour job, Chaffin remained undaunted. "We'll sure give it our best try," was her determined response. "Call us up in a month or so and see how we're doing," she challenged.

According to Laura Sakow, the director of the Spay and Neuter Organization Prestonsburg (SNOOP), this sort of occurrence is a much more common than many people realize. "Just a short time ago, a litter of newborn kittens were discovered by an associate of Maggard's in the dumpster behind the store. The lady who found them crawled into the dumpster with an injured leg to rescue them. It's just awful what some people will do to ani-

Sakow went on to say that spaying and neutering is the first step in alleviating this sort of problem.

"We have entered into an agreement with each vet in Floyd county to participate in a program where we issue certificates through our organization that can be redeemed at the vet's office of the owner's choice for a significantly reduced surgery fee for animals who need to be spayed or neutered. The program is geared mainly toward fixed-income individuals, or those on low incomes, or those who frequently harbor and take stray animals into their care. The certificate can be presented at the vet's office and for \$10 the animal can receive a spay or neuter surgery. We hope to improve the situation involving unwanted births of animals in this county through this pro-

Dr. Carol Combs-Morris. who operates the Beaver Animal Clinic, in Wayland, recently participated in a traveling spay and neuter clinic - she agrees that this is the first step in solving the problem of animal overpopulation. She is also an avid proponent of locating persons who abandon animals and prosecuting them for their actions.

"According to KRS 525.130. a person is guilty of cruelty to animals in the second degree ... when they intentionally or wantonly cause any animal to be subject to injury or mistreatment through abandonment," Combs-

Morris went on to say that "cruelty to animals is a criminal offense, a class A misdemeanor. If convicted, a person may be sentenced for up to one year in the county jail and/or a fine of \$500. If concerned citizens want to prosecute in cases regarding animal cruelty or abandonment, they need to call the Kentucky State Police for further information and investigation, or the county attorney. We live in a throw-away society and I guess people just think it's okay to throw away these animals. It's not okay. It is morally wrong and they should not get away with it."

three or more fatalities.

These 12 segments were found to be the site of 43 percent of the total fatal crashes in the Big Sandy area, or 59 of 136, with the largest number of crashes occurring in Pike County.

In Pike County alone, 46 fatal accidents occurred within the twoyear period studied. Fourteen of those fatalities took place along US 23 from Dorton High School to the Floyd County line at Harold, making that stretch of road by far the most deadly.

Studies revealed 18 fatalities along Floyd County roadways, seven occurring from KY 1498 to KY 80 at Martin, with Johnson, Magoffin and Martin counties finishing the study with comparatively low numbers of fatalities.

One section of Route 80 in Floyd County included in the segments studied runs adjacent to Duff Elementary at Eastern.

Parents say this area is at a high risk due to congestion during end of the day pickup routines.

"Yesterday when we went to pick our son up, it was ridiculous," said Rick Bentley of Garrett. "People were backed out onto Route 80. They were lined up to pick their children up."

Bentley said Friday that he arrived at Duff Elementary at approximately 2:30 p.m. and waited for little over an hour before finally getting to pick his son up at the school.

"It's real hazardous," continued Bentley. "If they needed to get an ambulance in during that time or something it would be impossible. It's complete chaos, I feel there is going to be a major accident there, I really do."

involving fixed objects such as trees or embankments occurred along two-lane, rural roads while approximately 50 percent involved alcohol or drugs. Goble also expanded on driver error to include simple driver inattention and cell phone usage as contributing factors.

Committee chairman Burl Spurlock also urged Goble to give a brief overview of a presentation the group has assembled for Gov. Paul Patton's Highway Safety Conference in early November.

In that presentation, the committee will offer to the governor and other attending members three safety programs for implementa-

The first will be a media marketing plan for the regional safety project which will include radio spots, television broadcasts, flyers and posters.

Secondly, the committee will present a plan for developing a fixed object removal program that would remove trees, concrete headways and other objects near highways to create a clear safety zone on rural, two-lane roads already owned by the state or respective county.

A third component the safety committee will present in November will revolve around the hope that now that target areas are developed for unsafe road locations and segments, these may be incorporated into the existing Department of Kentucky Highways' Hazard Elimination Program.

This elimination program already lists six projects on the sixyear highway plan for correction or construction, including intersections, bad curves, additional turn lanes and rock fall locations.

In spite the committee's progress, just before Thursday's meeting came to a close Spurlock touched on an aspect of the committee's goals that he feels could become an opposing factor if not handled properly.

"Most of what we've talked about doing here is unfunded,"

# Wolfe County man leads Breathitt police in a high speed chase

# The search for research

It is always disquieting to see public funds spent to lobby public officials for public funds.

That, after all, is why we have a representative democracy. Part of the job description for Kentucky's six U.S. House members and Sens. Mitch McConnell and Jim Bunning is to bring back a fair share of the taxes its citizens and businesses send to Washington.

But with that caveat, there's a lot to be said for Gov. Paul Patton's decision to step up Kentucky's effort to do a better job of attracting federal research dollars.

Equally laudable is the fact that the University of Kentucky and the University of Louisville, rivals in so many respects, are jointly supporting this effort. In this arena, the question isn't whether UK or the U of L gets more research money, but rather whether Kentucky can nurture an intellectual and business environment that will produce jobs in the emerging high tech and medical fields.

Between them, the two universities now attract about \$200 million a year in federal research grants. Bill Brundage, who holds the improbable title of Commissioner of the New Economy, wants to boost federal research spending in Kentucky to at least \$500 million.

To that end, the state is preparing to open a permanent office in Washington. ("Reopen" might be a more apt verb, since Kentucky had a D.C. office until Patton closed it shortly after he was elected governor.)

The new office will be headed by Audrey Haynes, a former chief of staff for Tipper Gore who once worked briefly for Patton. Kentucky will also hire the services of a consulting firm reputed to have ties to the Bush administration.

It won't be cheap: estimated annual cost of the office is \$700,000; UK and the U of L will each contribute \$50,000,

the state will pay the rest. Kentucky isn't alone in trying to land federal research dollars; in fact, it's somewhat late in the game. Ever since Congress expanded funding for the National Institutes of Health and other research-sponsoring agencies, states, foundations and private institutions have been scrambling to get

in on the action. The folks in Frankfort are quick to note that the research initiative isn't limited to UK and the U of L. It has a statewide reach, ranging from workforce development to nurturing high tech business corridors in key areas.

The research push should also extend to Kentucky's regional campuses. Though they are mainly, and properly, undergraduate teaching institutions, Northern Kentucky University and the commonwealth's other regional universities do sustain selective, and significant, research efforts. These deserve more attention.

All this matters, because this is where the jobs of tomorrow will be generated. The revolutions now underway in genetics, computing, imaging and the basic sciences will eventually have commercial applications.

Kentucky needs to make sure it's in a position to support basic and applied research, and to prepare an environment that nurtures the development of commercial applications of

# The sham of political compromise

Writing on the New York Times oped page recently, new Senate Majority Leader Tom Daschle called for "a spirit of principled compromise." The top Democrat presumably means compromise with the Republicans. He's in luck. Compromise with the Senate Republicans is entirely possible because they hold the same reactionary principles as the Democrats.

Compromise is mutual concession making in search of agreement. Implied in the concept is that the two parties share common ground. When a buyer and seller of real estate bargain and settle on a price somewhere between the asking price and the offer, that is a compromise. They share some basic premises: that the seller, as the owner, is justified in asking to be paid for his property. and that the buyer does not have a right to the property except on terms agreeable to the owner.

Now imagine a "negotiating" session in which the party seeking the property does not share the premise that the other party is the owner with a right to demand payment for his property. Is any compromise possible? No. Is it not the case that one or the other must capitulate? If the landowner settles for the theft of only half his property, one would hardly be tempted to call that a compromise. It would be capitulation.

Now let's move to Congress. Mr. Daschle hopes for compromise with Republicans on education, energy, the environment, health care, and Social Security. He's proud of the bipartisan compromise on campaign-finance reform. In each of these cases, Mr. Daschle's party favors government use of physical force to accomplish ends they favor. Is that too an extreme a formulation - or simply too frank for polite company?

As George Washington reputedly said, "Government is not reason. It is not eloquence — it is force!" That has not changed in 200 years. Government brings one thing - and one thing only - to any project; the legal authority to use violence against people who themselves have committed no violence against anyone.

Take campaign-finance reform. It is a euphemism for government power to punish people who give their own money to candidates or political parties above an amount limited by the law, or who place television ads at the wrong time saying the wrong things as defined by the law. Note that offenders need not commit violence against anyone before they are subject to government violence. (Try not paying a fine and see what the government does.)

And so it is for all the issues Mr. Daschle fervently wishes to compromise on. Government would forcibly take money from the taxpayers (taxation equals fiscal force) and give it to government schools, energy-related projects, health-care providers, and retirees. It would also forbid certain peaceful activities, such as drilling for oil in Alaska on land the government has forcibly kept from becoming private

Notice that the Republicans accept the premises of every program on

Daschle's list. They favor government activism in education (so much for these "free-enterprise" enthusiasts), in energy (read the Bush plan), in health care (why haven't they repealed the 1973 law that created and subsidized HMOs?), in the environment (there go the champions of private property), and in retirement pensions (they're all New Dealers now). They quibble over details, such as whether grants to the states should come with strings or not. But they do not question the premises that government may forbid certain peaceful conduct; compel other behavior, and spend other people's money.

That's why compromise is possible and even likely. Imagine a member of Congress who believed that government should not interfere with education or health care because interference necessarily violates individual rights and the Constitution. Could he strike a compromise with Mr. Daschle? Of course not. Any "compromise" would be a surrender of principle. What does it mean for Mr. Daschle to compromise? Only that perhaps he trims his demand for how much the lives of Americans should be directed by government. Big deal.

There can be no compromise on basic principles. There is no middle ground between freedom and government usurpation. To pretend there can be is an insult to all intelligent Americans.

No doubt Mr. Daschle will get his compromise. And the principles embodied in the concept "America" will be despoiled once more.

# Water testing lab helps to ensure safe drinking water

For more than 20 years, oped to detect pathogens in drink-Morehead State University's Water Testing Laboratory has been striving to ensure that the citizens of East Kentucky have safe drinking water. Now, that mission has expanded to cover the common-

During the last year, the laboratory has been overseeing the Laboratory Certification Program for the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Cabinet.

"The cabinet is required by federal regulations to maintain a certification program for all public water systems or commercial laboratories performing microbiological analysis of drinking water," said Dr. Ted Pass, laboratory director.

Within the state, there are 38 laboratories in 23 counties with approximately 60 analysts that are certified, Dr. Pass noted. He, along with laboratory manager Rita Wright, act as certification program managers, completing annual audits and ensuring that all laboraadhering are Environmental Protection Agency regulations. Assisting them for the next year will be Peggy Ryker of Frankfort, a retiree of the Kentucky Division of Water who has 25 years experience as a certification officer.

Public water systems are required to submit monthly water samples for bacteriological analysis to a certified laboratory to ensure their customers are receiving safe drinking water.

"The number of samples has grown tremendously in the last 10 years," Wright said, "from approximately 10 samples per month in 1979 to more than 400 per month in

Samples come from public and private companies, federal agencies, health departments and well

"Under the certification program responsibilities, MSU must offer an annual workshop for laboratory analysts to keep them abreast of new methods and regulations that impact drinking water," Wright

Since assuming management of the certification program, the laboratory management team hosted 24 analysts from 29 state-certified laboratories for a one-day workshop in October. In May, 36 analysts from 26 laboratories attended a three-day session on the campus. Speakers from the state Division of Water and US EPA in Cincinnati were among those presenting talks on new regulations and waterborne pathogens. During the training, analysts were given the opportunity to perform hands-on activities involving the use of new methods devel-

Because of its extensive involvement in water quality within the state, the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Cabinet, Division of Water, Drinking Water Branch, contracted with MSU in become to Commonwealth of Kentucky's Principle Microbiology Laboratory, a role that continues today. The laboratory has assisted the

state's Division of Water with environmental issues which have impacted source and drinking water, such as the fish kill in the Kentucky River in 1999.

Dr. Pass became involved in water testing while he was teaching at Miami University in Ohio. After coming to MSU in 1972, he continued his efforts after receiving a request from the local health department. The water testing operation on the campus began in a laboratory in Lappin Hall. It moved to its


Ashland Inc. financed the renovation of the former Energy Conservation Laboratory whose construction had originally been funded by Ashland.

To serve as certification program managers, the laboratory staff must receive continual training. Dr. Pass and Wright attend numerous programs each year, including the U.S. EPA workshop in Cincinnati, They recently received certification to perform audits of laboratories performing microbiological analysis of drinking water in Region IV, which is a six state division that includes Kentucky and Tennessee.

MSU is currently pursuing a four-year contract with the state's Division of Water to continue management of the Certification Program through 2006.

'We want to ensure that all citizens are receiving safe drinking water. After all 'safe drinking water is our business," Dr. Pass said.





He knows just as much about playing defense as he does offense. What him play, and it is evident.

"I know every assignment on defense already, straight-up hitting contact on defense is what we play here at Prestonsburg," said Slone. "Our main goal this year is to score. We know our defense is good enough."

Boyle County is absent from Class AA. Lexington Catholic is in now in Class AAA along with Boyle, the Blackcats are ranked fourth in the state and already own a 27-26 preseason win over number two ranked Corbin.

Slone, like his teammates, is excited about working toward a state championship game.

Prestonsburg made it to the Class AA finals in 1993, eventually falling to Mayfield. This year's Blackcat team, under the direction of John DeRossett, has that same goal in mind.

"We've talked about going to

state a whole lot," said Slone. "Our team, our senior players are some of the fastest and most athletic players on the team. Our number one goal is to go to state and win it all."

Josh Slone, one of the newest members of the Pikeville College football team, had the chance to play with younger brother Matt last season at Prestonsburg. Both Slones were keys to a very good Prestonsburg defense. "It's tremendous that my

brother is going to be playing college football," said Slone. "Hopefully, I'll get the chance to watch him and he'll get the chance to come and watch me and maybe one day be on the same team or one day play against each other."

In football, skill players such as backs and receivers often form strong friendships or bonds

Lexington Lafayette High who loved to have his hands on the ball when a game was on the line.

Rupp later called him one of the best clutch players he ever coached. Cox

was a skinny 6-4 junior who seemed shy except when it came to firing a sweeping hook from the top of the key or a one-handed jumper from the corner.

The other starters were 6-7 senior center Ed Beck, an ordained Methodist minister who had lost his wife to illness the previous season; John Crigler, a 6-4 senior forward who specialized in rebounding and defense; and Adrian

"Odie" Smith, a 5-10 senior guard from Farmington who had transferred from the junior college ranks.

As the season unfolded, the "Fiddlers" looked more like candidates for the Grand Ol' Opry instead of Carnegie Hall. In December, when Temple and slick guard Guy Rodgers came to UK's Memorial Coliseum, Hatton showed his clutch ability

by hitting a pair of free throws to send the game into overtime, hitting a 49-footer to send the game into a third overtime, and then scoring six of the Cats' final eight points in an 83-81 victory.

Alas for UK fans, however, that turned out to be one of the few memorable games in a 19-6 season — the Cats' worst record since 1940-'41. As usual, however, they managed to win the Southeastern Conference championship, giving them an automatic berth in the NCAA Mideast Regional that was, luckily for UK, held in Memorial Coliseum.

After dispatching Miami of Ohio and its massive center, Wayne Embry, UK faced Notre Dame for the right to advance to the Final Four in Freedom Hall.

The Irish had a graceful forward in 6-5 Tom Hawkins, but the Cats limited him to 15 points while racing to an 89-56 win that was, said Rupp, "as perfect

as anything I've ever seen." So the Fiddlers found themselves in Carnegie - ah, Freedom — Hall, but their task in the semifinals was daunting: A rematch against Coach Harry Litwack's Temple Owls, who had recovered from their triple-overtime loss in Lexington to compile a 26-2 record. Well, talk about deja vue! Before a wildly pro-UK Final Four record crowd of 18,586, Hatton again drove a dagger into Temple's heart, this time hitting a reverse layup with 16 seconds remaining to give the

Cats a 61-60 victory. That set up a championship game between UK and Seattle. In the other semifinal, the silky Baylor had scored 23 points and hauled in 22 rebounds to lead his team to a shocking 73-51 upset of a strong Kansas State team led by 6-9 Jack Parr and 6-8 Bob Boozer. After watching Baylor's magic, UK assistant Harry Lancaster told Rupp, "There's no way we can beat this team...they're just too good."

In those days, the semifinals were played on Friday night, the championship on Saturday. Late on Saturday noon, as Rupp and Lancaster were in a hotel room trying to figure what to do about Baylor, they were visited by John Grayson, an obscure coach from Idaho. He advised the UK coaches that Baylor tended to foul players who tried to drive on him. So when Seattle coach John Castellani assigned assigned Baylor to guard Crigler, Rupp ordered Crigler to drive every time he touched the ball. The result was three early fouls on Baylor, forcing Castellani to switch him to UK's low-scoring centers, Beck and backup Don Mills of Berea.

To counter, Rupp then ordered Hatton to drive off blocks set by Beck, forcing Baylor to either switch off and risk fouling out, or letting Hatton go. After the frustrated Baylor picked up his fourth foul trying to block a Mills hook, the game was essentially over, much to the delight of the crowd

of 18,803, another Final Four record. At the end of UK's 84-72 win, Baylor had 25 points and 19 rebounds, but Hatton scored 30 and Cox added 24 as the Fiddlers finally became violinists.

"They weren't the greatest basketball players in the world," Rupp said proudly. "All they could do was win."

Hatton was named to the Helms Foundation All-American team, and, after a short career in the NBA, returned to Lexington, where he became a successful auctioneer. Cox, a consensus All-American as a senior in 1959, also had a short pro career. He's now a retired businessman in Hazard.

This year's other Hall of Fame inductees are Lee Rose of Irvine and Lexington, one of the few coaches to take two teams to the Final Four; nationally prominent sportscaster Tom Hammond of

the NBC network; current yours truly. WNBA star Lisa Harrison; longtime track official Charlie Ruter; Wes Cox, former basketball star at Louisville Male High and U of L; Bill Gatti, ex-U of L football star and pro softball slugger; and



support for the program, "We can't expect the athletes to accept standards that we ourselves are not willing to accept."



INDIANAPOLIS - The NCAA Division I Board of Directors has reaffirmed its commitment to addressing concerns and ongoing reform in intercollegiate athletics. As part of that commitment, the Board agreed at its August 9 meeting to appoint a task force that will focus on the Association's reform agenda.

"The Board had a very good discussion about issues of concern in intercollegiate athletics at the Division I level," said William "Brit" Kirwan, chair of the Board and president at Ohio State University. "Those concerns have come from a number of sources internally and externally, including the recent Knight Foundation Commission report. It is clear to us that the Board is the appropriate body to drive the reform efforts.'

The task force, which will be appointed in the next few weeks, will focus on issues of academic and fiscal integrity. Kirwan noted that the group will consist largely of Board members, but it may be augmented by other individuals with partic-

Kirwan said the task force will be asked to make its initial report at the Board's next meeting, November 1, 2001. At that

time, it will provide a sense of priority for the major issues that the Board and Division I need to

Part of the task force's charge will include oversight of a proposed baseline study of economic and other forces that drive the behavior of member institutions and participating student-athletes. The study, which is expected to be completed by October 2003, is designed to help guide future reform initia-

Also on the Board's agenda was a discussion of the Association's event-certification process, especially as related to events with ties to sites where sports wagering on intercollegiate athletics competition is conducted. The Board discussed three basketball events certified by the NCAA and that initially were scheduled to be conducted in a casino in Las Vegas, Nevada, where sports wagering on intercollegiate events is con-

"Clearly, conducting these events in such a venue is inconsistent with the position the NCAA has taken regarding sports wagering," Kirwan said. "But there is no criteria in place at the moment that permits the Association to deny certification of such events."

The Board directed the

NCAA staff to review certifiedevent criteria, including venue policies, and submit a report for the Board's consideration by November 2001. In addition, the Board requested that emergency legislation be developed for its review in November that would specifically prohibit certification of any event that is conducted in a venue where sports wagering on intercollegiate athletics is conducted or where

there is signage for the venue. The Board also received an educational presentation on the package of amateurism proposals that will be before the Division I Management Council at its October meeting and an

update on research related to the ongoing review of current initial- and continuing-eligibility requirements.

Acting on a recommendation from the Division I Football Study Oversight Committee, the Board agreed to establish a moratorium on the acceptance of new applications for NCAA Division I-A membership until new membership criteria for that subdivision are adopted. The next meeting of the Board will be November 1, 2001, in Indianapolis.
























(AHS), the most comprehensive survey of U.S. housing between censuses. The Census Bureau has been conducting the AHS since 1973 for the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

The survey will be conducted through November.

"The AHS permits decisionmakers across the nation to

assess the extent to which families are financially burdened by housing costs, including utilities," said Susan B. Hardy, director of the Census Bureau's Charlotte regional office. "They use these data to identify where and for whom programs may be needed most to allevi-





The center was renamed Licking Valley Extended Campus Center in 1990 and other educational classes, both adult and college classes, and governmental services were initiated. 



ate these situations."

The survey collects data about the size, composition and condition of the housing inventory, financial and demographic characteristics of the people who live in the housing and the livability of their neighborhoods. In addition to housing costs, other subjects about which data are collected include: the unit's square footage, the year the structure was built, plumbing facilities, type of mortgage, source of water, the frequency of equipment failures and residents' overall opinion of their neighborhood.

By law, the Census Bureau protects the confidentiality of all identifying information about survey respondents and their housing units. Local households selected in the nationwide sample receive a letter from Census Bureau Acting Director William G. Barron Jr. In the letter, they are told that they will be interviewed by a field representative who carries a photo identification card. Besides visiting occupied housing units, the interviewers obtain data on unoccupied units from landlords, rental agents or neighbors.

Joint HUD-Census Bureau reports on the survey's findings for the United States and regions are issued about 10 months after the interviews are completed.

#### Data in the reports answer such questions as:

■ Why people move?

- How much time does it take people to travel to work and what means of transportation do they
- How well is rent control working?
- How many people find it difficult to afford to
- What kinds of problems and situations do people have in their homes and neighborhoods that affect their living environment?
- What type of fuel do people use to heat their homes?







# Neet GBS' self-proclaimed arbiter of taste — and cheese

The host of CBS' The Late Late ShowWith Craig Kilborn is thrilled to experience a typical day for a new homeowner. He is awaiting delivery of ruos.

"I looked for 2 1/2 years to find my dream house," Kilborn says.

"It's a 1920s Spanish-style, and two gentlemen restored it, and they went crazy." Like many owners of older homes, he's curious about who once lived there. This being Los Angeles, his house was formerly owned by 1930s film actress Margaret Sullavan and actor Dennis Hopper.

Kilborn, who turns 39 on Aug. 24, wanders about on a cordless phone, describing a sunken living room, a three-level garden and a Jacuzzi. "I don't deserve this," he says.

During two conversations, Kilborn often refers to his family and his Midwestern roots, stressing how normal he is.

"I'm the youngest of three kids," Kilbom says, "I have an older brother and an older sister. I grew up in the Midwest, and my parents are still married after 44 years. The entertainment industry is a lot of neurotic, dysfunctional people. I am an outsider there, I am fairly normal."

Kilborn's background does indeed sound delightfully sane.

"A lot of my childhood was basketball," says the 6-foot-5 Kilborn.

"And that was a good thing because it just occupies you. A whole other part was comedy. I remember the first joke I wrote when we moved from New Jersey to Minnesota. I was 6 years old, and my dad was complaining to my mom about all the Jell-O that we were packing. And mom said, "Well, it was on sale." And I said. "Yeah, just like the cat food, and we don't even have a cat." My mom thought I was charming, and my dad thought I was obnoxious."

His father leveled with him early about a career in the NBA."He let me know that my chances are minimal," Kilborn says. "And my mom said, "You are so verbal. Maybe you should do something with your mouth."

He wound up graduating from Montana State University, Boze-man, with a degree in film and television. In college, Kilborn was on the basketball team but spent a fair amount of time on the bench. "I was an adept shooter, but defense was not something that got me excited," he says. "And I was very creative. I thought more about style at the time. Like, "Give me the ball and get out of my-way." My give and go is "Give me the ball and go to hell."

Kilbom sperit a summer break working the midnight-to-6 a.m. shift at a radio station. He learned to stay alert on-air after dozing off during one of Barry White's longer ballads. As luck would have it, the bosses were listening.

After jobs at a lumberyard and a now-defunct Santa Monica, Calif., restaurant, Kilbom put his basketball knowledge to work as an announcer for a shortlived laague in Savannah, Ga. When he landed a latenight job on ESPN's SportsCenter, he says his father's reaction was "Great, now you will become a national embarrassment to the family."

Kilborn caught the eye of CBS executives while hosting Cornedy Central's The Daily Showand slid into the Late Lateslot two years ago. Since then, he's closed the ratings gap with that other tall, thin, redheaded late-night host, Conan O'Brien.

Kilborn works in front of an 88-member audience, without a sidekick or band. The set is beautifully appointed, and he seems born to the spot. His trademark shlick is asking five questions of guests, and the first is geographical.

Kilborn laughs when confronted with five questions. He aces the first two — name the states bordering Minnesota (Wisconsin, lowa, and South and North Dakota) and the state's nickname — Land of 10,000 Lakes. Also spotlighted are the oceanic white-tip, which can smell a wreck from miles away; the tiger shark, which may be the ocean's nonpickiest eater, and the king of the uglies, the hammerhead. The special includes interviews with George Burgess, director of the International Shark Attack File, and shark researcher





"Of course I will, Cinder," I answered. "Devon, when she gets through singing, I'll ask her to sing a few bars of that old Italian classic "La Viva Loca."





# Critter Corner...

Though I have often written about the overpopulation problem as a major cause of unwanted animals, another cause is pet/owner mismatches. Many cases stem from an owner acquiring the animal because of its looks or the popularity of its breed, without consideration for how the animal was genetically programmed to behave.

Mismatches occur more often with dogs than with cats, for several reasons. For one, cat owners generally expect cats to have independent. and often quirky, personalities; these seem to be species-wide traits. Secondly, people have fewer expectations for a pet cat to perform a certain job - usually companionship and occasional mouse-catching duties are all that are expected. Finally, there is less variation among cat breeds than dog breeds. There are two major divisions in cats - the slim, wiry "Oriental" breeds like Siamese and Burmese, and the heavy-boned "Cobby" types, such as Manx and Persians. In general, Orientals tend to be active and vocal, and the Cobbies are more laid-back. Most domestic mix-breed cats fall somewhere in the spectrum between these two extremes, so predicting behavior is not always easy.

Dog breeds, however, offer more predictability. Most breeds of dogs were developed with a specific purpose in mind, and their behavior reflects this genetic selection. It is always important, when selecting a dog, to do a little research on his breed. In the case of mixed-breeds, getting a good educated guess from an experienced "dog person" about the breeds involved can help you prepare for the type of personality the dog is likely to have.

The American Kennel Club divides dogs into seven groups, depending on the purpose for which they were developed. Even if you are considering a breed not recognized by the AKC, you should be able to fit it into one of the seven categories, and this will help you understand the genetically programmed behavior of that breed. The seven groups are:

The Sporting Group. These dogs were primarily developed to hunt birds, both waterfowl and upland game birds. The group includes the retrievers, setters, spaniels and pointers. Dogs who fit in this group tend to be fascinated by anything that moves, from birds to tennis balls, and can spend hours pottering around in the hills, distracted by every blowing leaf. They are not necessarily concentrating on remembering the way back home or listening for their owner to call. Retrievers especially, are very mouth-oriented because they have been bred for this very trait. People call to ask me when their Labrador puppy is going to stop carrying off everything left lying on the back porch! You can't teach a retriever NOT to put things in his mouth, because every instinct he has tells him to do it. It's a matter of letting him know WHICH things are

acceptable to carry around.

The Hound Group. Also hunting dogs, this group focuses on furry critters rather than birds. There are two broad divisions within this group, the Scenthounds and the Sighthounds, named for their method of hunting. We are more familiar with the Scenthounds, which include Beagles. Coonhounds, Bassets Dachshunds. These are independent dogs, bred to make their own decisions and ignore distractions. This can make them a little difficult to train in a household setting, since they don't always agree with their owner's ideas. If they are to live with cats or other small pets, they should be introduced to them early. and some will always regard these other species as prey animals. The same principles apply to the other half of this group, the Sighthounds. This includes the Greyhound, Afghan Hound, and Whippet. In addition, the fact that these dogs can move extremely fast and don't depend on their noses as much means that they can become lost very easily and may not be able to find their way home. A fenced yard is a requirement for these dogs.

The Terrier Group. This group contains most of the remaining hunting breeds. The word "Terrier" comes from the Latin terra, meaning "earth". These dogs were bred to "go to ground" in search of burrowing animals, such as rats, foxes and other vermin. These dogs needed to be small enough to fit in a burrow, determined enough to dig down to their prey, and brave enough to confront it face-to-face in a dark confined space. This has resulted in tough, independent (read "stub-

born"), tenacious dogs that can sometimes be fearless to the point of stupidity. They are alert to every movement, and I have heard it said that they "bark at dust settling". Unfortunately, most of them are also so darn cute that they are hard to resist. I love terriers, but they are not for everyone. The popularity of "Eddie" and "Wishbone" on television has resulted in a great many Jack Russell Terriers landing in homes that were not prepared for the activity, digging, and battles of will that come with owning a terrier.

Each breed presents its own unique qualities. We will continue the discussion next week with the four remaining groups - Working, Herding, Toy and Non-Sporting.

This week, we continue the discussion of dog breeds, and how they relate to the behavior of individual dogs. We are looking at the seven groups recognized by the American Kennel Club, which places each breed in a category based on the purpose for which it was developed. So far, we have covered the Sporting, Hound and Terrier Groups.

The Working Group. These dogs have a genetically programmed job to do. Breeds in this group include the Doberman, Rottweiler, and Siberian Husky. These dogs can make tremendous companions IF they are given lots of attention and training, and their minds are kept busy. They do not have to have their original assignments of guard duty or sled pulling, but lots of socialization and quality time with their owner, along with some degree of obedience training will help keep them alert and happy. On the other hand, these are large, powerful dogs with lots of energy. Boredom, isolation and confinement can have tragic consequences.

The Herding Group. A spinoff of the Working Group, these are the true workaholics of the dog world. Working Dogs need a job; Herding Dogs MUST have a job. Popular herding breeds include Collies, Australian Shepherds and Shetland Sheepdogs. My rescued stray German Shepherd, Britta, has the neurotic habit of running in circles whenever she is the least bit stressed. I suspect she was kept confined in a small pen when she was young, and became obsessed with following her own tail. My friend Trish recently adopted an Australian Shepherd, and Sheridan is only happy when she has the entire family together in one room. She regards someone going to

the kitchen for a snack as a straying sheep that she is responsible for returning to the fold. She collapses with a sigh in the living room floor when everyone settles down to watch television, her job done for the time being. I received a call from a lady who was very distressed because she had purchased a Border Collie and was unhappy with her dogis behavioroshe had wanted a lap dog!

The Toy Group. These dogs were developed to be companions, so they generally excel at their jobs! There is so much variation among these dogs individual personalities, that a prospective owner should take a close look at the particular breed. Chihuahuas, Pugs and Pomeranians are examples of Toy breeds that are very different both in appearance and personality. In general, the Toys are fragile little things that may not be suited to homes with young, active children.

The Non-Sporting Group. This is another group of very dissimilar breeds. These are the dogs that can't be easily pigeonholed anywhere else. Members of this group include the Dalmatian, The Bichon Frise, and the Chow Chow. Again, it's almost impossible to make generalized statements here, so individual breed characteristics need to be examined.

Breeds that are currently very popular include the Labrador Retriever, Border Collie, and Jack Russell Terrier. It is not difficult to see that these are dogs that could easily cause problems in homes that were not prepared for their particular characteristics. Evidence of this is seen in the growing numbers of these breeds showing up in animal shelters across the United States. Dog fanciers generally don't regard a rise in popularity of their favored breed as a good thing. Dalmatians, Rottweilers and Saint Bernards are recent examples of breeds that suffered from being the fad of the moment.

For your own best interest as an owner, and for the benefit of dogs in general, do some research on that beautiful breed you saw on television before you rush out and buy one. If you already have a dog, check out his rootsoit may give you a lot of insight into why he behaves the way he does.

# News of the Weird...

- On July 21, police arrested a squatter couple who had boldly commandeered an unoccupied (but definitely not abandoned) house in isolated Tunbridge, Vt., and had begun elaborately remodeling it, in keeping with their professed beliefs that property should be shared rather than privately owned. Jeremiah Sturk, 38, and Rene Hunt, 26, had torn out some walls, ripped out some plumbing, and were starting to redo a bathroom (financed by selling some of the house's antiques) when the owners arrived from their principal home in Massachusetts. Said the arresting officer, of the couple: "(They're) definitely (people) with a different mindset.
- IBM said its "artificial passenger" dashboard device might be on the market in three years, thus helping to make highways safe from dozing drivers by, among other things, shooting a stream of cold water into the driver's face. According to a July issue of New Scientist, when the device detects drowsiness, it launches into jokes and other conversation and automatically rolls down windows, sounds an alarm and changes radio stations, among other things.
- The city of Cascavel, Brazil, recently enacted a law banning office gossip by municipal employees. Punishments include reprimand, mandatory sensitivity training and dismissal, in order to protect government workers whose reputations are degraded by rumor and innuendo, especially by newly hired workers who express contempt for incumbents.

#### The Great American Holiday, 2001

Three Pennsyl vanians were killed in separate fireworks mishaps on July 4 (in Butler Township, Altoona and Wilkes-Barre). A 21-year-old soldier was shot to death in Huntsville, Ala., early on July 5, allegedly by the man the soldier asked not to launch fireworks nearby. A 46-year-old man was killed in Spanish Fork, Utah, on July 4 when a fireworks stand toppled over and crushed him. A mother and three children were killed in a fire in Houston on July 4 that a relative said was spread by fireworks. An off-duty police officer was beaten and sent to the hospital in critical condition on July 4, allegedly by two men who objected to the officer's request to stop launching fireworks near kids (Jersey City, N.J.).

#### Great Art!

- Tatsumi Orimoto, according to an April report in London's Observer "a grand old man of Japanese contemporary art," said he will be working his signature piece of performance art off and on until the day he dies: "Bread Man" (in which he roams a city's streets with a half-dozen baguettes wrapped tightly around his head to pay homage to the Christian homily of "bread means body").
- Several days after Moema Furtado's exhibit opened in March, municipal officials in Knoxville, Tenn., told her to remove her installation of thin-latex likenesses of large pieces of pulled human skin hanging from walls and ceiling, which she said were testaments to the horrors of the Holocaust. City official Mickey Foley said that the exhibits reminded her too much of huge, used condoms and that East Tennessee was not ready for that kind of art.
- In June, playwright Bob Ernst suffered a setback at his final dress rehearsal for his work, "The John," which was being staged entirely inside a basement men's room at Maritime Hall (capacity: 20 seats) (story: a middle-aged theatergoer meets "Death" in a men's room during an intermission of "King Lear"). Ernst had rented the space, but the only Maritime supervisor with keys to the "theater" had taken the day off for his birthday, and when the room was finally opened, Ernst realized that it had not been cleaned in a while. Nonetheless, the show went on.

#### Bright Ideas

■ Among the Cold War

- intelligence ideas of the mid-1970s was the British MI5 agency's proposal to station gerbils at airport terminal gates, in the hope that they would exercise their ability to detect passengers who were unusually sweaty, in that such passengers were disproportionately likely to be spies entering Britain. MI5's director-general during that time, Sir Stephen Lander, speaking at an intelligence agency conference in June, said the idea was abandoned when the agency realized that lots of people who go up in airplanes sweat.
- Kevin Erwin was charged with rape, kidnapping and assault in Canton, Ohio, in June, based on his allegedly acting out on his female "sex slave" whom he had met over the Internet. Faced with imminent arrest, Erwin smugly showed police a signed contract, in which the woman had agreed "to freely give myself to Kevin L. Erwin as a personal slave and life mate" and "to make myself sexually available to Kevin at all times." (She also agreed to divorce her husband and marry Erwin and to pay Erwin \$100,000 for "alienation of affection" if she ever broke the contract.) The prosecutor said the woman was coerced.

#### People With Issues

London's Steve Bennett continues his quest to become the world's most successful amateur rocket engineer, with all systems go for launching himself into space in a "test flight" (to an altitude of 10,000 feet) in 2003 on a venture that most professional engineers called foolhardy, according to a June story reported by the BBC. The more that is known about Bennett's mission (e.g., he recently said it would be a rocket capsule made from a cement mixer, with modest installation and a small computer), the more rocket scientists believe his launch will result in instant death. However, the louder the criticism, the more certain of himself Bennett professes to be. He still rejects conventional preparations such as wind-tunnel tests and g-force tests:

"That is what the test flight is for," he said.

#### Least Competent Criminals

M According to the account of police in Shaker Heights. Ohio, in June, Darryl Owens, 33, may be the least intellectually equipped bank robber of 2001 so far. He walked into a Huntington bank as it was opening at 9 a.m. and approached a teller, demanding money in a threatening manner; the teller told him to go back and get in line with other early-arrivers. Owens threatened a second teller, who then pulled out a large wad of money and laid it on the counter for him, and Owens took about half and fled. Before police arrived, Owens walked back into the bank, laid the money on the counter, and asked for a \$45 money order. The teller, thoroughly confused, told Owens to get out of the bank, which he did, leaving on the counter his entire stash. Police chased down Owens' car a few blocks from the bank and arrested him.

# Recurring Themes More Penile Clashes

With Nature: In June, two fishermen bled to death in Papua New Guinea's Sepik River after pirhana-like fish, attracted by the men's urine streams, attacked the source with their razor-sharp teeth. And two weeks later, a 63-year-old peasant squatting to answer nature's call in a field near Lorica, Colombia, was bitten on his penis by a poisonous Mapana-tigre snake and was rushed to a hospital (where he arrived with the snake still attached because he feared trying to dislodge it); he is recovering satisfactorily.

#### Also, in the Last Month

■ St. Louis Alderman Irene Smith, reluctant to yield the floor during a filibuster against a redistricting plan, took a restroom break at the podium, shielded by aides holding up a quilt. A man seated in a hillside cafe quietly playing dominoes was knocked unconscious by a wandering cow that fell

through the roof (Nevsehir, Turkey). The Transport Minister in Abuja, Nigeria, Ojo Maduekwe, pedaling to the weekly Cabinet meeting to promote greater use of bicycles in the traffic-snarled city, was accidentally knocked into a ditch when hit nearly simultaneously by two passing buses. A 39-year-old man was arrested at a store in Plainville.

But did she really understand the love of Christ? Had she studied and accepted the teachings found in the second chapter of James?

What if she had put her arms around the dirty, ragged little boy and said, "Son, I am so glad you are here, and hope you will come every chance you get to hear more about Jesus."

I reflected on the awesome responsibility a teacher or pastor or a parent has to welcome little ones in His name. How far reaching her influence was! I prayed that I might be ever open to the tenderness of a child's heart, and that I might never fail to see beyond the appearance and behavior of a child to the eternal possibilities within.
