### Police raid former GOP chair's home

McDOWELL — Former Floyd County Republican Party chairman Bobby Stumbo was arrested Friday after authorities executed a search warrant at his home.

Police and jail officials were not commenting at press time as to what Stumbo was charged with, nor did they release any details concerning what evidence they were looking for during the search or what they ultimately seized. Sources close to the investigation have fold The Floyd County Times that the warrant authorized a search for stolen property.

Details of the investigation are expected to be shared on Monday.

Stumbo retired as party chair in 2004 to run against Charles "Chuck" Meade in two elections for the 95th District state representative seat, previously held by Attorney General Greg Stumbo. He lost both times.

Stumbo was charged last year with one count of séxual abuse in a case that stemmed from an August incident in which he was home alone with his roommate's child, who was visiting the pair as part of a divorce agreement which granted the roommate visitation on three weekends each

That charge went through a preliminary hearing which passed the case to a grand jury. No indictment has been returned since

PRESTONSBURG — "It's not a matter of 'if,' but a matter of 'when.' We know it's going to hit us, we just don't know when," said Jane Bond, health educator with the Floyd County Health Department, during opening comments to those assembled at the facility this past Thursday evening to attend a local pandem-

ic flu summit. The summit is one of many flu outbreak.

that will be held statewide throughout the following weeks to address preparedness and other issues in regard to a possible outbreak of a new influenza virus.

Representatives from area hospitals, schools, emergency management and response, fire and police departments, faith-based organizations and others attended the summit to learn and discuss ways in which local communities can work together to prepare for and manage a possible pandemic

A pandemic flu occurs when a new influenza virus appears or emerges in the human population, causing a global outbreak of the disease, resulting in serious illness as it spreads from person to person. Three such pandemics have occurred in the last 100 years - the "Spanish flu" (1918-1919), the "Asian flu" (1956-1958) and the "Hong Kong flu" (1968-1969).

### Grand jury returns 16 indictments

PRESTONSBURG — A Floyd County grand jury issued 16 indictments Friday, with several other charges remaining sealed until the subjects are taken into custody,

Trenton M. Ward, 33, of Martin, was charged with one count of first-degree assault for allegedly shooting another man and causing serious injury to him on Nov. 15.

Eric Kelly, 27, of Salyersville, was also indicted on charges of assault and wanton endangerment for allegedly engaging in conduct which put another person in substantial danger on March 17, as well as a fourthdegree assault charge for allegedly ramming the victim's car with his own.

Drug crimes accounted for nine indictments issued, which included Randy Tackett, 37, of Wheelwright. Tackett was charged with one count of trafficking in a controlled substance and one charge of being a persistent felony offender for an August 15 incident in which he allegedly sold cocaine.

Drug possession charges accounted for three of the indictments. Paul Maynard, 32, of Allen is facing two counts of drug possession as well as single counts of public intoxication and possession of drug paraphernalia for a May 20 episode. Brentina Elswick, 38, of East Bernstadt, was charged with

possession charges, including drugs and paraphernalia, for a May 3 incident that also charges her with operating a motor vehicle under the influence and various traffic violations. Rhonda Gail Caudill, 26, of Prestonsburg, was charged with one count of possession for allegedly possessing a one-quarter of a methadone wafer on August

Four subjects were charged with driving under the influence of various substances and rounded out the persons charged with drugrelated offenses. Timothy Cain-Micah Cantrell was charged driving under the influence, driving on the wrong side of the highway and two other traffic violations for a Sept. 3, 2004, incident. Nicholas McKinney, 26, of Raccoon, was charged with DUI and failure to surrender his revoked license, disorderly conduct and resisting arrest for an Oct. 5 incident that saw him arrested by Kentucky State Police. Rodney Gerron Scarberry, 30, of Bypro, was charged with DUI and various traffic violations as well as possession of marijuana for a November 2004 incident that was investigated Kentucky Enforcement. Charles Hall Jr. received the most charges for a Dec. 26 incident during which he was charged with driving under the influence, driving on a revoked license,

### Trial date set for Dwale beating, robbery

PRESTONSBURG - Two of three subjects accused of beating and robbing an elderly and disabled Dwale man last September have entered guilty pleas to the crime, while the third party asked for a trial date on Friday.

August 7 trial date for Shawn Sexton, 21, who was scheduled to enter a guilty plea last month but balked at having to serve 10 years for the crime.

> Sexton, who is facing robbery and assault charges, will get to face a jury this summer but will also be up against his former codefendants who agreed to testify against him upon entering their pleas.





The U.S. House of Representatives is performing an important service for debt-burdened students and their families by demanding that colleges explain why tuition is rising more than four times faster than

On Thursday the House voted to renew the Higher Education Act, which provides guidelines for colleges and universities that receive federal aid. It's not clear whether the bill would achieve its main purpose - making college more affordable for students - but the measure would shine a light on college costs and apply at least some pressure on the schools to control spending and hold down tuition increases.

In a 2004 column, Terry Eastland, the publisher of The Weekly Standard, posed a question that families all over the country are asking: "Why is it that college must cost so much?"

Over the past 15 years, a period marked by low inflation in the general economy, tuition at state universities has been rising by more than 10 percent a year. Since 2000, tuition increases have been running about four times higher than the inflation rate.

The cost of attending college in Kentucky began to soar after the legislature approved the higher education reform law in 1997. Although college costs in the state remain below the national average, annual tuition increases of more than 14 percent are causing more students to go into debt to pay for their education.

The rising cost of college also forces some high school graduates to abandon their plans to obtain a degree. A study cited by David Wessel, a columnist for The Wall Street Journal, found that every \$1,000 increase in tuition reduces the fraction of 18- to 24-year-olds in college by 3 or 4 percentage points.

Recently, skyrocketing college inflation has captured the attention of Congress. Congressional leaders have a stake in the issue because the federal government pumps tens of billions of dollars each year into the higher education system, with most of the aid taking the form of student loans and tax breaks.

A report issued by Congress in 2003 noted that "tuition increases are outpacing the rate of inflation, increases in family income, and even increases in state and federal aid, which have grown tremendously in

Some observers believe the availability of government-subsidized financial aid provides an incentive for colleges and universities to continue raising tuition. Student loans are a form of third-party payment that helps to reduce accountability for costs by enabling students to pay

the higher bills, although to do so they must go deeply into debt. The House version of the renewal of the Higher Education Act seeks to supply some accountability by forcing colleges to justify double-digit tuition increases. Colleges that raise tuition more than twice the rate of inflation over three years would have to explain why their services cost

Also, the bill requires colleges to submit detailed information on their costs to federal education officials. The information will be posted on the Education Department Web site so that families can compare

If the House bill becomes law, it's likely that all of Kentucky's public colleges and universities will have to explain why their tuition increases are far outpacing inflation. The explanations should go further than the claim that 3 percent to 4 percent increases in base funding by the legislature haven't been sufficient to cover the school's costs. The question university officials need to specifically answer is why the expense of running their institutions is rising much faster than other costs in the economy.

The House higher education bill isn't strong enough to assure a lower rate of college inflation. But it has the potential to shed light on excessive administrative spending and empire-building on some cam-

An article in a publication of the Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis highlighted the shift toward administrative spending in college budgets over the past 30 years. In 1976, 30 percent of instructional expenditures went to administration; by 2001, colleges were devoting 50 percent of their instructional expenditures to bureaucratic functions.

Congress needs to pull back the curtain on college costs. If recent trends continue, millions of young people will be priced out of the college market, leaving them with diminished hopes for the future.

### The United Nations' shame, cont.

Wherever she is right now, the late Eleanor Roosevelt is probably having a kind thought about U.S. Ambassador to

the United Nations John Bolton. The ambassador is the liberal bugaboo who was filibustered by Senate Democrats before heading to Turtle Bay, where last month he fought a valiant, losing fight to reform the U.N. Human Rights Commission.

Roosevelt was the commission's

first chairman back in 1947, and thought it would play an important international role by shaming human-rights abusers. Over time, the commission's mandate evolved into passing over human-rights abuses in silence and, instead, shaming itself. Bolton had hoped to change the commission and infuse it with some of its old idealism. Nothing doing. He's finding that at the U.N. Augean Stables, the cattle always prevail.

The human-rights commission's abiding flaw is that it has no standards for membership. So, bloodthirsty tyrannies sit on it together with liberal democracies.

Given the let's-all-get-along bonhomie of the United Nations, they all operate based on a vaporous consensus that strips the commission of any purpose. China, Cuba, Eritrea, Saudi Arabia, Sudan and Zimbabwe are all

> current members, ensuring ample representation of governments interested only in preserving their ability to jail their dissidents, repress countrysides.

Human-rights abusers are particularly drawn to

moral threat it might pose to their misrule. They can vote as a bloc to oppose any strenuous language directed at themselves or fellow abusers. On the inside, they subtly influence the process in their favor.

John Bolton and the U.S. proposed reducing the commission's membership from 53 countries to 30, thus making it harder to get on, and requiring a twothirds vote of the General Assembly to approve members in an attempt to keep the worst abusers off. These reforms were effectively trashed.

The counterproposal passed last month by a 170-4 vote pegs the membership at 47, approved by a mere majority of the General Assembly. The biggest change is literally nominal: No longer will it be the United Nations Human Rights Commission, but the Human Rights Council. The moral stink will remain, whatever they call it.

Debates over the U.N. feature an odd dynamic. It is skeptics like Bolton who favor making it a more effective and worthy institution. It is the U.N. worshippers who have standards for the world body so low that it will always remain mired in disrepute. So it was that their women and "Jimmy Carter favored the evisceration despoil the their of the reforms

For such U.N. supporters, it appears that genuinely high-minded multilateralism is not as important as maintaining the United Nations and other internathe commission so tional bodies as an irritant to American power. Carter made a personal promise to the ambassadors of Egypt, Pakistan and Cuba - not a democracy among them - that he would side with them on commission reform.

> Eleanor Roosevelt would no doubt be surprised at how low her treasured world body has sunk, and who is working to make it better.

### Oil discovered on Capitol Hill

I always thought the best job in the world was being Dick Cheney's mea culpa coach. The pay wouldn't be much but, in terms of not having much to do, it ranks up there with being a Christmas shopper for Osama bin Ladin.

But I have discovered an even better job, easier and a lot more lucrative. Next time around, I want to be an oil company executive.

bad answer is as follows:

Back in 1995 the outlook wasn't bright for Gulf oil producers. Crude oil

small oil companies were flaming out. Drilling investment was going overseas.

Enter Congress and the Clinton administration (much underappreciated as a willing tool of the ruling classes). They passed a bill that allowed companies to forego the standard 12 percent government royalty on oil

and natural gas found in the Gulf. It was supposed to be for a limited amount of oil and only if oil was going for less than \$34 a barrel. Ha!

The story now is that some Clintonistas in the Interior Department "forgot" to include the limits in some of the oil contracts they were writing. (I wonder how those guys are doing now. Pretty well, I'd bet.) Which meant that, on those leases, no royalties had to be paid no matter what the price of oil.

> The upshot of it all is that this serial capitulation to oil companies is going to cost the American taxpayer between \$7 billion and \$28 billion over the next five years, depending on how the suits go. And where is the money going? Into the already fat wallets of oil produc-

ers. And what are the American people getting? The shaft.

There's a belated effort to do something about this. Rep. Edward Markey, a Massachusetts Democrat, has introduced legislation that would pressure companies to pay full royalties when energy prices are high, no matter what their leases. It has little chance of pass-

As Gail Norton, Mr. Bush's former Interior Secretary and chief wilderness exterminator, said: "These are binding" contracts that the government signed with companies. I don't think we can change them just because we don't like

Good point, Gail. Ms. Norton recently left government to pursue other career options. Wanna bet she winds up as an energy company executive?



### Sago owner announces 115 citations, says nearly all corrected

BUCKHANNON, W.Va. -The owner of the Sago Mine ers said Friday that federal inspectors issued 115 citations for alleged problems found during an electrical spot inspection of the underground operation.

The inspection was conducted as part of an investigation

into the Jan. 2 explosion at the to determine if it will challenge Upshur County coal mine that resulted in the deaths of 12 min-

Mine owner International Coal Group, said none of the alleged violations were related to the explosion. The Ashland, Ky.-based company said it has corrected all but one alleged problem, which it is reviewing

the citation.

ICG did not provide details of the alleged violations but said "the vast majority were found to be unlikely to cause injury, and none of the conditions actually caused any injury."

The company said MSHA terminated most of the citations after the problems were corrected.

spokesman, confirmed that the agency had cited the company and that, to his knowledge, most of the problems had been corrected. He did not know the total number of citations.

The citations included ones involving maintenance and testing of electric equipment, switches or other controls on electric equipment, and sprinklers that are required above

Avian influenza is an infection caused by bird flu viruses. The current strain of avian flu is that which is occurring at present in Southeast Asia. The viruses are naturally occurring among birds and can spread from birds to people, causing serious illness and even death among the human population.

Concerns are that the virus could mutate to a new flu virus that spreads easily from person to person. And because infections of new human flu strains cannot be prevented by currently available annual flu vaccines, no one will be immune to the new virus, should it occur. Manufacturing a safe vaccine to prevent infection for a new human virus can take months.

Therefore, becomes a vital issue in regard to saving multiple lives in the event of a pandemic flu outbreak.

"If a pandemic should occur,"

said Dr. Kraig Humbaugh, pediatrician and epidemiologist, featured guest speaker at the summit, "there won't be much outside response. Each community will be struggling to meet their own needs. Therefore, working to strengthen individual communities through planning and preparation becomes vital.

"The avian strain may die out," Humbaugh continued, "but we need to prepare for what will happen if it doesn't."

According to Humbaugh, pandemic outbreaks "are not preventable." Humbaugh also said that "outbreaks generally last for about 6-to-8 weeks, with multiple waves (two or three) occurring over time."

"A pandemic is not imminent at this time," he said further.

Informing the community members in attendance as to how best to prepare for a possible pandemic, Humbaugh said, "Don't panic, but get prepared. A prepared community is stronger against the threat."

"No," replied the other. "I got those scars in a sawmill accident."


### GOOD OL' SAM

### Local housing authority program grooms new homeowners

The Family Self-Sufficiency Program, offered by the Floyd County Housing Authority, was organized with the purpose of helping those ready to make a commitment of becoming financially self-

The goal of the Floyd County Housing Authority is to help families to gain the resources and personal skills necessary for long term security. When applying for participation in the Section 8 housing program, each family is presented with the opportunity to join the Family Self-Sufficiency Program.

Those who choose to participate enter into a five-year contract with the Housing Authority. The Housing

Authority then works with the family in setting goals and in implementing a plan that will help the family to accomplish those goals.

As individual steps are taken and individual goals are accomplished, the families continue to pay rent but, in accordance with their income, an escrow account for them is created. As the family's rent increases - a result of earned income - money is placed into the escrow account and set aside for the family's dream of future home ownership.

In the winter of 2000, Darla Innis, a Floyd County Section 8 participant, signed a Family Self-Sufficiency contract with the Floyd County Housing Authority. Innis'

original goals entailed those of becoming a full-time, paid worker, eventually able to purchase her own

Throughout the six years that she was a participant in the Family Self-Sufficiency program, Innis continued to work, gaining income, and watched her escrow account grow to \$8,897. On March 21, 2006, she received a check in the full amount of her escrow from the Floyd County Housing Authority.

Innis accomplished her goal of remaining a participant in the Family Self-Sufficiency program, working hard toward becoming a self-sufficient member of society, and is now a proud homeowner.

### **MOVIES FROM** THE BLACK LAGOON 'Creep'

Despite a theatrical release in Europe two years ago, this film, about the perils of late-night travel in the London Underground, didn't rate a home video release until December. One finds it hard to fathom how a taut thriller like this one could have

missed a theatrical run, while films "Boogeyman' and "Cry Wolf" clogged theaters like a ping pong ball in your gas tank.

The movie announces intentions early with a well choreographed sequence

that follows two sanitation workers (think Ed Norton with a Cockney accent) as they investigate a blocked line. Turns out the sewage was blocked up because the pipe was stuffed with human remains, though solving the mystery doesn't get them very far when they run afoul of the tit-

The film then cuts away to a swank party thrown by a fashion magazine where we meet the main character, Kate. Here the filmmakers take a big chance as Kate is a bit of a snot. Her cushy job doesn't appear to have enlightened her much as her big plan for the evening involves flipping off a coworker and making for an even swankier party where she intends to seduce George Clooney, who is in town to take in the fall line.

Kate arrives at the subway station nine minutes before her train is scheduled and opts to kill time by killing a bottle of vodka. Unfortunately her intolerance for alcohol sends her into a Smirnoff's-induced sleep which causes her to miss the train and totally derails any chance of canoodling with Clooney. When she awakens the station has been shut down for the evening, but her nightmare has just begun as the station is inhabited by a ghoulish figure that picks up her scent and decides to compete with Clooney for her affections.

What follows is a nightmarish spin on that age-old commuter fear of being stranded in the subways after closing time. Kate lucks out in that this station has a few non-mutant inhabitants. She briefly hooks up with a homeless couple but only winds up leading them into the clutches of the Creep, who basically spends the rest of the movie making mincemeat out of everyone who attempts to help the somewhat shallow Kate. The list also includes one of the sanitation workers from the opening, as well as an ad executive from the party who, frankly, deserves a date with the Creep after attempting to sexually assault Kate.

It all leads up to a spectacular showdown between Kate and the Creep which culminates in one of the most creative death scenes ever committed to celluloid and clearly demonstrates that a length of chain with a hook at one end is a fashion accessory that is a definite no-no when worn too near a subway train.

### South's first interracial — and tuition-free — college turns 150

BEREA — The founder of Berea College was named "Fee," but the school's claim to fame is not charging one.

Almost a century before Martin Luther King began his struggle for civil rights, the Rev. John Fee conceived a more radical concept than King ever advocated — one that would leave him beaten by an angry mob and almost drowned in the Ohio River.

Fee thought there should be a college for poor Southern Appalachians, even those who couldn't afford to pay, where blacks, whites, men and women would live, worship and study alongside one another.

Berea College, the first such institution in the South, turned

call its history rocky would be every four applicants, it draws dying tree limbs. an understatement. Forced to exclusively from families that segregate for 46 years because rank in the bottom 30 percent of of a Kentucky Jim Crow law that banned interracial education, only lately has the school begun to build back its numbers of black students to recapture Fee's vision.

But the idea of free tuition has never changed. Its \$900 million endowment ranks 62nd among the nation's 4,000 colleges and universities, and the 61 ahead of Berea all charge their students at least \$30,000 a year to attend.

"These folks don't bring money with them," said Berea's current president, Larry Shinn. "They don't come from families of wealth."

In fact, any student who does need not apply. Although the school is academically competi-150 this academic year, but to tive, admitting only one of

The endowment, a result of thousands of small-amount donations and only a handful of million-dollar ones, covers nearly three quarters of Berea's operating budget. All students get a full-tuition scholarship valued around \$85,000 for four years, and families pay for housing, meals and books based on what they can afford — a maximum of around \$7,000 a

In exchange, all students must work for the university at least 10 hours a week, receiving a stipend below minimum wage with the rest of their earnings directed toward their education

That's why at Berea students are more likely to greet each other with the question, "What do you do?" than "What are you studying?" The jobs range from busing tables to shelving books to such career-oriented pursuits as farming or fixing computers.

"A lot of my friends are jealous of this job," said freshman Laura Finley, wearing security goggles and ear plugs as she wielded an oversized contraption called an airknife to cut off

Higher education had

seemed out of the question for Angie Denmark, a 19-year-old freshman at Berea College. She couldn't afford to pay for school, let alone day care costs for the 2-year-old daughter she raises alone.

At Berea, day care is covered, freeing her up to spend long hours hitting the books and working in the school's archives. Denmark, who also needs a scooter to get around campus because of a blood disorder, said she seldom feels as though her peers are looking down on her. Berea's just not that kind of place, she says.

"They take away the social stigma usually involved in college, like keeping up with the clothes," Denmark "There's no dealing with the haves and have nots because we're all have nots."

At one point, Berea's black enrollment was equal to its enrollment of whites. But in 1904, the Kentucky legislature passed the Day Law, which mandated blacks and whites couldn't be educated in the same school. Berea, the state's only such institution at the time, appealed all the way to the U.S. Supreme Court but lost.

Faced with the decision to segregate or close, it stayed open to serve mountain whites while providing funds to establish the Lincoln Institute, an allblack school near Louisville. When colleges were allowed to integrate again in 1950, Berea was the first in Kentucky to do

Still, until 1995, the school's black enrollment at times hovered around 3 percent. But in the last decade, the ratio has risen to about 20 percent.

That doesn't mean the campus hasn't endured its share of racist incidents, even in recent years. Shinn recalled hearing a white man call a black student a derogatory name and telling him to "Go back to Africa."

"What that person didn't know was that he was talking to one of our African students, who will go back to Africa," Shinn said.

U.S. News and World Report consistently ranks Berea as the nation's top comprehensive college, a category that applies to undergraduate-only schools that award the majority of their degrees to students in professional programs, such as business and nursing.

Berea is about 45 minutes south of Lexington.

The school's goal is to not only produce service workers but keep them in Appalachia. "If you look at the migration of students who come from traditional Appalachian counties, the majority of them stay within the region," said Joe Bagnoli, a 1988 graduate of the college who is now associate provost.

Berea's records show more than 80 percent of Appalachian students remain in Appalachia after attending the college. Of the 350,000 college-aged students in the region, only 1,500 go to Berea, but Shinn says their impact is broad.

'The question is how can our students count for more than one?" Shinn said.

Among those who decided to stay was Katie Basham, a 2002 graduate of the college who has since taken a job on campus as a chapel coordinator. Although Basham, who grew up in Paris Ky., originally figured Appalachia was the last place she wanted to end up, she

became hooked. "I tried to leave and I couldn't," she said. "I realized this was home. This campus and this town foster such a great sense of community."

While there, Bland's offense broke several school and conference records, led the conference in scoring in 1998 and 1999, and was among the conference leaders in most offensive categories. In 1997, the Muleriders won the Gulf South Conference championship and were ranked 10th nationally.

Bland also gained invaluable experience at Central High School in Columbia, Tenn., where he served as an assistant coach for two years. In graduate school at Auburn University he worked as a graduate assistant under Pat Dye and while completing his undergraduate degree at the University of Arkansas he served as a student assistant.

Bland spent his collegiate playing

Local lifters break state records in powerlifting


PRESTONSBURG - United States Powerlifting Federation (USPF) state records were broken Saturday, April 1 at the annual meet which was sponsored by the Kentucky National Guard and Pro-Fitness Multisports. The contest was held at the National Guard Armory in Prestonsburg, where a total of 21 lifters competed in the squat, bench press and deadlift events which are then added together for a grand total to determine the winners. A powerlifting contest has age group and weight class divisions, which makes for close competition among lifters of all abilities.

A group of five Pikeville High School lifters competed in five different weight classes. Four of the lifters are defensive linemen for the Panthers.

In the 148 pound class, Austin Fields broke the existing squat record of 341 pounds, set in 1987, with his very first attempt (each lifter gets three attempts at each lift) of 350 lbs, then went 375, 400, and was granted a fourth attempt, which was successful at 425 pounds. This combined with the bench press and deadlift for a total of 1020 pounds, enough to award Fields the best lifter trophy in the teenage division and another state record for the weight class. Fields set records one week earlier in Paintsville at the annual NASA powerlifting meet, competing in the 165 pound weight class.

In the 165 pound class, Brad Slone of Pikeville, a wheelchair athlete, set a new state record of 405 pounds in the bench press and pound for pound, was the most outstanding bench press competitor in the meet. Slone also competed one week earlier in Paintsville, barely missing a 425 pound bench press. He has several NASA and USPF bench press records to his credit, in more than one age group and weight class. Another Pikeville football player, Justin Walker, competing

Drew Hilton of Prestonsburg won the 165 pound class for the 18-19 year olds with an 1110 total.

All four lifters from the Pikeville High football team will be playing on defense in addition to their offensive duties.

The mens open division, ages 20 and above was highlighted by Mike Roberts of Prestonsburg, breaking (another) bench press record set by Don Fields, owner and trainer at Pro-Fitness Multisports. Last year, Roberts broke Don Fields; 425 pound bench press record in the 181 pound weight class by five pounds and this year came back to do it again in the 198 class, breaking Don Fields' 455 record by yet another five pounds. Roberts was going for an outrageous 500 pound third attempt, but was unable to lock it out. He finished with a 1460 pound total, enough to name him the best lifter of the meet.

Heath Chaffin won the 181 pound class with an 1175 total. Matt Smith of Prestonsburg, lifting in his first full meet, had an impressive 440 pound bench press and a near miss at 475 pounds, which would have tied the current state record for that class.

The masters division, for lifters over the age of 40, saw Randy Burruss, manager and trainer at Pro-Fitness, add yet another state record to his list. Burruss had a smooth looking 605 pound deadlift, breaking

Slone, a wheelchair powerlifter, benched 405 and was close with 430 pounds on his 2nd and 3rd attempts.



"I'm guarded about saying, well if we can be in the top 25 or the top 20 at the end of the season, we'd really be pleased," Aikman said Thursday. "Because we'd like to win. That certainly is the objective."

Remember, before Aikman won three Super Bowl championships with the Dallas Cowboys in the 1990s, he went through a 1-15 season when he lost all 11 of his starts. So he's realistic.

Hall of Fame Racing is off to a respectable start in its inaugural season, at 29th in owners points. The team makes its Texas debut this weekend.

Aikman co-owns the team with Roger Staubach, the fellow Hall of Fame quarterback who led the Cowboys to their other Super Bowl titles in the 1970s.

"What I knew coming in has only been reinforced, is how competitive this sport is, and how much of a disadvantage a startup team is under," Aikman said. "But I do think we're going to continue to do better."

### Baseball average salary closing in on \$3 million

NEW YORK - Baseball's average salary soared 9 percent this year to nearly \$2.9 million, with Alex Rodriguez topping a sport in which more than half whe players on opening-day ros-

ters make \$1 million or more. Rodriguez headed the list at \$25.7 million and was No. 1 for the sixth straight year, according to a study of major league contracts by The Associated Press. He was followed by New York Yankees teammates Derek Jeter (\$20.6 million) and Jason Giambi (\$20.4 million).

San Francisco's Barry Bonds was fourth at \$20 million, and Houston's Jeff Bagwell - who might not play because of a shoulder injury - was next at \$19.3 million.

"Baseball had record crowds last year," Giambi said. "Probably with Barry going to break the (home run) record, it will bump it up and more people will come out and watch it. That makes players more popular, and in turn guys make more money.'

Yankees' payroll dropped a bit to \$198.7 million from \$205.9 million on opening day last year. Boston was second again at \$120.1 million, followed by the Los Angeles Angels (\$103.6 million), the World Series champion Chicago White Sox (\$102.9 million) and the New York Mets (\$100.9 mil-

Payroll figures don't include cash transactions, such as money the Yankees are receiving from Texas for Rodriguez and the White Sox are getting from Philadelphia for Jim

At the other end were the Florida Marlins at just under \$15 million, including 17 players making the \$327,000 minimum. It's the lowest figure for any team at the start of a season since Pittsburgh and Montreal in 1998. It's also less than the top 12 players make and 1/13th of what the Yankees pay their ros-

While the biggest spenders kept their payrolls pretty much at the same levels as last year,

many teams at the bottom made boosts. Toronto added freeagent pitchers A.J. Burnett and B.J. Ryan, and catcher Bengie Molina, among others, hiking its payroll to \$71.9 million from \$45.4 million.

Eleven of the bottom 15 teams increased spending. Baseball's labor contract expires Dec. 19, and the sport's economic system will be negotiated again by players and owners.

There are still concerns at both the top and the bottom," said Bob DuPuy, baseball's chief operating officer. "The goal would be to get a tighter range that would ensure that even more than 20 clubs at Labor Day still have a chance to compete for playoff spots, that playoff spots are based on skill and talent and blossoming stars and not just on plugging holes with economics.'

Oakland, 21st at \$62.3 million, still has little margin for error. Some of the high-spending clubs, such as the Yankees, complain that the smaller-market franchises haven't spent their revenue-sharing money on major league payrolls.

"Certain teams are funneling

it back in the right ways and there are some teams that aren't," Athletics outfielder Mark Kotsay said. "I think this club in the last couple of years has definitely shed that. They've used the money in revenue sharing and put it back into players' salaries.'

In a sign that the money is being spread out, the number of players making \$1 million or more rose from 390 to 409 still shy of the record 425 in 2001. The median salary - the point at which an equal amount of players fall above and below - rose to \$1 million from \$850,000, breaking the previous high of \$975,000 set in 2001.

Figures for the study included salaries and prorated shares of signing bonuses and other guaranteed income for the 813 players on opening-day rosters and disabled lists. For some players, parts of salaries deferred without interest or with minimal interest were discounted to present-day value.

## NFL unveils plans for

NEW YORK - The NFL has its plan for eliminating those not-ready-for-prime-time matchups that too often sneaked onto national television.

The league plans to hold off scheduling Sunday night games in seven of the final eight weeks - just as playoff races start heating up - to ensure the best games are played on NBC. The league has long wanted some kind of flexible scheduling, but could never implement one until now.

For Weeks 10-15 and Week 17, the final regular-season weekend, all Sunday games will be listed with start times of 1 p.m. or 4:05-4:15 p.m. EST.

The league must then announce which match will be played Sunday night at least 12 days before the date of the game. The lone exception is the

season finale on Dec. 31, when the past, teams are allowed to the switch must be made no later than six days before the

Only Sunday games are subject to the flexible schedule that is part of the NFL's \$3.6 billion contract with NBC for the Sunday night package.

CBS, which does the AFC games, and Fox, which does the NFC, each has the option to protect five games in the seven weeks of flexible scheduling, but can't protect more than one game per week. So if Indianapolis playing Pittsburgh in a late-season game and CBS does not want it moved to Sunday night on NBC, it has an option to keep the game.

Week 16 is Christmas weekend and no game will be

Teams will be told by the NFL office as soon as they are not under consideration to have a game moved. And, unlike in play in consecutive Sunday night games.

To make the system more flexible, up to three teams each season will be allowed a bonus sixth prime-time appearance. All the others will be limited to a maximum of five, including the Monday night ESPN package and the late-season Saturday or Thursday games on NFL Network.

The NFL often has moved games from early afternoon to late afternoon on Sundays to get a top matchup in a better viewing slot. It did so eight times in 2005. That flexibility

In recent seasons, the league has faced lower prime-time ratings because of poor late-season matchups. It also has seen surprisingly successful teams shut out of prime time because the entire schedule is released

### Boxer Sugar Ray Robinson honored on new stamp

WASHINGTON - Sugar Ray Robinson would have considered being featured on a postage stamp "an honor for him, an honor for God and an honor for the community," his son said of the latest accolade for a man once selected as the top boxer of the 20th century.

The new 39-cent stamp, designed to resemble a vintage fight poster of the 1940s and 50s, is being released Friday in ceremonies at New York's Madison Square Garden.

"I think he would have thought (the stamp) was a gift from God," Ray Robinson II said in a telephone interview.

But not just a gift to him alone.

"He was a team player in a sport where you don't have a team," the younger Robinson said. His father valued his family, agents, lawyers, training staff and sparring partners, "that was the team.'

And he recalled his father's concern for fair and equal treatment for everyone. "We're all father.

The elder Robinson once did a public service announcement urging the police to treat everyone the same, whether they are individuals on the street or famous athletes like Jackie Robinson, Roy Campanella and himself, the son recalled.

And he noted his father's close friendship with boxer Jake LaMotta. LaMotta was the first fighter to beat Robinson, and the two fought six times. Yet they also became friends and Robinson was best man at one of LaMotta's many weddings.

"They were two men that were committed to nothing but their craft," the younger Robinson said. "They didn't take their craft personally, they took it as going to work, like a plumber would, like an electrician would, and afterwords it was, 'Let's go out for a beer.""

Robinson was inducted into the International Boxing Hall of Fame in 1990. After his fight career ended, he became an actor and established a youth foundation. He died from complications of Alzheimer's disease and diabetes on April 12, 1989.

The younger Robinson, a fight promoter, stays close to the sport and works with Ring Eight, a boxing support group that assists indigent fighters.

### Labonte eager to see what winning in No. 43 car is like

MARTINSVILLE, Va. -There was a time in Bobby Labonte's career when a fifthplace finish wouldn't have caused a ripple of interest in the media or in the garage.

That was before he joined Petty Enterprises as the new face behind the wheel of the famed No. 43 car, bringing along a career resume that could help put it back in the spotlight.

So far, though, Labonte said what he and his team accomplish on the track is all he's focusing on. He'll consider the magnitude of a victory when it comes.

"I don't know how it will be until it happens. I'll know more after that," the 2000 series champion said. "It might be total chaos, or it might be just another win."

One thing that's certain, though, is that after only six races, the Petty organization feels closer to getting back to Victory Lane than it has in a

Labonte's fifth-place finish at

weekends ago was the first topfive run for the company in five years, and was followed by talk that a win at Martinsville was a possibility. That's the place where Team Petty got its last victory, with John Andretti driving the car Richard Petty made famous, in 1999.

It didn't work out that way at Martinsville, but Kyle Petty said the Petty teams have struggled just to compete for so long that there's really no pressure on Labonte to hurry up and take a checkered flag.

"He ran fifth at Bristol and it's, like, huge. It's huge," Petty

"That's what I told him: 'You come over here and have any type of success and it's going to be big because it has been so long since we've had success.' The pressure's not to come out and win races at Petty Enterprises. It's to come out and run competitive."

Labonte learned to expect that and much more during 11 years at Joe Gibbs Racing, where he won 21 races.

Labonte's offseason move Bristol Motor Speedway two was the centerpiece of an ambi-

tious Petty team rebuilding that includes Robbie Loomis, a former championship crew chief for Jeff Gordon who now is the Petty executive vice president; Todd Parrott, who won a championship with Dale Jarrett in 1999, becoming Labonte's crew chief, and Paul Andrews, another championship-winning crew chief, who came to the team last season and is the crew chief on

"One brings two, two brings four, four brings eight, eight brings 16 and that's the way that works," Petty said at Martinsville, where gear trouble doomed them both to poor finishes. "We're stronger as a team all the way through because of Bobby Labonte."

The chance to join a rebuilt team was what lured Labonte, too.

"I found myself in a position at the end of the year to make the move, and I thought that was the right thing for me just because of the people that were going there and the people that were there," he said. "That just made my decision easier."

So far, he sees signs that things are moving in the direction he hoped, even though he knows it takes time to build chemistry, which brings consistency.

"We're gaining on it," he said before running 32nd at Martinsville. "We've just got a lot of work to do. There's no doubt that we'll go somewhere and we're going to struggle. If we do, we've got to make sure that we realize what we did

That reality, at least for now, keeps expectations realistic.

"We're going to be like the stock market. We're going to be up and down," Labonte said.

"Everybody is excited that we can win, and we've got to keep that in mind," he said. "We don't want to walk away from (the yearend banquet in New York City) with just one top-five finish."

For the first time in a while at Petty Enterprises, the parts all seem to be in place.

People have asked me, 'Hey, what do you think about driving the 43 car?' I say it's great, and it's going to be even better when we land in Victory Lane one day," Labonte said. "That's when it's going to really mean something."

### Brewco Motorsports ready for debut with rookie Coleman

CENTRAL CITY - Much has been made over the driver development programs pouring into the ARCA RE/MAX Series. From Evernham Motorsports to Robert Yates Racing: from Rusty Wallace, Inc to Roush Racing; from Hendrick Motorsports to Richard Childress Racing, and then some, more and more teams that compete at NASCAR's highest levels are turning to ARCAville.

Now add NASCAR Busch Series team Brewco Motorsports, which has entered Houston, Texas rookie Brad Coleman for the upcoming PFG Lester 150 April 15 at Nashville Superspeedway.

Brewco, which fields Busch Series teams for David Green and Greg Biffle, got things started for Coleman at the Nashville test last week where he, in his first stock car outing on a superspeedway, posted the sixthfastest speed out of a record 55 ARCA RE/MAX Series drivers who tested during the series' first superspeedway open-test session of the year.

Coleman posted a speed of 158.438 mph and a time of 30.220, placing him among the top contenders on the speed charts next to some of the

biggest names in the ARCA RE/MAX series, including Steve Wallace (RWI), Erin Crocker (Evernham Motorsports), Matt McCall (RYR) and seven-time series champion Frank Kimmel.

The testing session in Nashville meant a number of firsts for Coleman. It was his first time in a race car in five months, first time on a superspeedway oval, first time on a concrete track, first time to run with his Brewco team, and his first experience in a stock car with the level of horsepower, weight and size that comes with driving an ARCA RE/MAX Series machine.

Coleman will drive a Brewco

Ford in at least 10 ARCA RE/MAX Series races in 2006, beginning with the April 15 PFG Lester 150 at Nashville Superspeedway. The young Texan, who has lived in Martinsville, VA the last few years with his driving coach, will also compete in 7 NASCAR Busch Series races for Brewco Motorsports in 2006. NASCAR veteran crew chief Shawn Parker will steer

"We're very encouraged by Brad's strong run at Nashville," said team owner Clarence Brewer Jr. "Brewco recognizes Brad as an extremely talented young driver with the ability to who turned 18 just a few days be successful in our sport. We're looking forward to seeing him race in a Brewco Motorsports car later this month in Nashville."

Coleman's 10-race ARCA package also includes the renowned Salem Speedway short-track on April 23. Coleman, in addition to the Nashville test, tested at Salem on Tuesday of this week alongside NASCAR veteran Ken Schrader and rookie Blake Bjorklund.

Brewco Motorsports announced in mid-December, 2005, the signing of Coleman to a NASCAR driver development contract for 2006. Coleman,

after the 2006 season-opening ARCA 200 in Daytona, is already a record setting young driver with a wealth of stock car, sports car, and open-wheel experience. In 2005 he won the NASCAR Dodge Weekly Series Rookie Points Championship in his first season of late model stock car racing at Ace Speedway in Altamahaw, NC, set a World Record by finishing seventh in the Rolex 24 of Daytona in a Porsche GT3 Cup car at 16 years-old, and posted a Top 10 finish in a Daytona Prototype in a Grand American Series race this fall.

### Raines puts in test time at Kentucky Speedway

SPARTA Sunday's NASCAR NEXTEL Cup Series race at Martinsville Speedway can't arrive soon enough for 41year-old Hall of Fame Racing driver Tony Raines.

The sixth race of 2006 season will be his first opportunity to compete in the No. 96 DLP HDTV Chevrolet and his first chance to take advantage of an important career opportunity.

The NASCAR Busch and Craftsman Truck Series veteran signed with his new NEXTEL Cup team before the start of the season, but yielded his seat to Terry Labonte, who secured a spot for the No. 96 in each race field with past champion's provisionals.

Labonte moved the No. 96 to 30th in the series standings and will turn the entry owned by Bill Saunders and NFL Hall of Fame quarterbacks Troy Aikman and Roger Staubach over to Raines for 29 of the 31 races remaining on the schedule. Labonte will return to the car for the June 25 road race at Infineon Raceway

and the August 13 road contest at Watkins Glen International

Four days out from his 55th career NEXTEL Cup Series start, Raines tested at Kentucky Speedway to gain a feel for his car and lay an intermediate track foundation he will need to be competitive in two weeks at Texas Motor Speedway.

"I didn't come here today to see how fast I can go," Raines said. "Terry had a lot of things that he liked about the car, but nothing suits everybody. So, we're just trying to go through the motions and get the rust knocked off of me. We only brought one car, so I have to be kind of careful, at least until the last run of the day. We'll get a Richmond test in after Martinsville, so, by the time we get to Texas we should be up to speed."

After making many of his previous NEXTEL Cup Series starts with moderately-funded teams such as R and J Front Motorsports, Row Motorsports and BACE

Motorsports, Raines has been looking forward to competing with top-of-the-line equipment.

"This will be a lot of fun because I'll have the chance to get to race with all the tools good equipment, a relationship with (Joe) Gibbs (Racing) that is drivers and teams when you

going to help us out a lot, and sponsorship from Texas Instruments with their DLP brand. We have a lot of the right things. It makes me a little bit nervous, but, at the same time, it's hard to play against the best don't have everything they have. Now, I feel like we do and we can compete." In addition to his optimism,

Raines also was enjoying the luxury of preparing for his important career step on a versatile track where he owns two third-place and two top-15 NASCAR Busch Series finishes.

"I love this racetrack, it has a little bit of everything," he said. "It's a pretty big track that has some speed to it. Turns 1 and 2 are a little flat and turns 3 and 4 are a little banked so you can iron out a lot of stuff here."

He hopes the knowledge he gains will help him deliver his second career top-10 NEXTEL Cup finish on Sunday. However, should he fall short of that goal in his first start with a new team at a tough track, he won't be extremely disappointed.

"I'm anxious," Raines said. "Martinsville is a tough race track, it's a tough surface and just a hard place to race. But, it's a race and I'm excited about it. I just want to go there, run all the laps and not tear the fenders off,

get my first race under my belt and pick up some steam. I've said top 25 is where I think we should be able to race, so, if I finished 25th or better that'd be on mark. Obviously though, we'd like to run top 10. Every week is tough, so we'll just have to do our best and stay out of trouble.'

Regardless of the outcome, Raines will be simply happy to be in the driver's seat this weekend after watching Labonte and the No. 96 open the season.

"Friday and Saturday (at the tracks) weren't too bad because there were a lot things going on and I kind of got caught up in it," Raines said. "On Sunday, up until noon, it took forever. When the race was running I felt helpless because I could hear what was going on and the changes they were making, but I couldn't do anything about it. It's harder to watch your car out there racing than it is to be in it. especially at Bristol. Every time someone got near him (Labonte) I thought they were going to take him out. That just makes for a nail-biting race.'




