# Hamilton sentenced for robbery

PRESTONSBURG — The case of a Teaberry man who robbed a convenience store in Betsy Layne while he was intoxicated ended Friday when he was sentenced to five years in prison.

The five-year sentence for 23-yearold Nathan Jerome Hamilton was handed down more than a month after

he was originally expected to be sentenced. The delay occurred because of a courtroom incident in October when he was expected to agree to the deal but backed out while standing before the

The change of heart came when Hamilton was asked by Circuit Judge John David Caudill whether he was satisfied with his counsel in the case, to which he responded he was not

because he was going to serve time in prison for his offense. The deal was no longer valid and a status hearing was set for Nov. 13 to schedule a jury trial, but Hamilton used the opportunity to apologize for the incident and accept the previously offered deal.

Hamilton explained that he was frustrated at the time about the idea of going to prison, but he realized that a jury would more than likely hand down

a much longer prison sentence.

"If he had gone to trial and was convicted, the [second-degree robbery] charge carries a five- to 10-year sentence," said Commonwealth's Attorney Brent Turner.

Hamilton was formally sentenced to five years in prison Friday, of which he will spend two-and-a-half years in

# Stumbo seeks to clear run for governor

FRANKFORT Attorney General Greg Stumbo wants the state ethics commission to reconsider an opinion saying he could not run for governor in 2007 without confronting a "perceived or actual" conflict of interest.

Stumbo, a Democrat, said he has not decided whether to run for governor but has no plans to do so "at this time," The Courier-Journal reported.

"But that ethics opinion is a bad precedent, and even if I would never seek public office again, I would press to have that opinion reversed," he

Fletcher spokeswoman Jodi Whitaker said, "It's not surprising that Greg Stumbo is seeking clearance from the ethics commission to continue his positioning for a run for governor.'

June, Last **Executive Branch Ethics** Commission issued an advisory opinion that said Stumbo faced a conflict of interest if he ran for governor in 2007 because he had prosecuted incumbent Republican Gov. Ernie Fletcher in the state hiring investigation.

John Steffen, general counsel of the ethics commission, said the commission received the request from a lawyer represent-Stumbo ing Wednesday. He said the commission would likely take up the request at its next meeting Dec. 15.

EASTERN — The welcome sign at Allen Central High School is home to a grinning Confederate soldier, proudly waving a banner bearing the Andrew's cross of the Confederate battle flag. The courtyard nearby is composed of blue brick that forms the cross and a mural in the lobby pays homage to another rebel soldier, this one carrying the flag on horseback.

More rebel soldiers and Confederate flags cover the same

walls that hold posters touting academic achievement, fundraising drives and notable attendance of the allwhite student body.

The students know all about the controversy surrounding Confederate flag, about the many schools that have banned its presence on campus. They know that many associate it with slavery and racism. Yet, they defend their displays

with firm conviction. "To us it's not about the hatred," said Tiffany Owens, an 18-year-old

# Holiday writing program in eighth year

Christmas Through the Eyes of a Child is a special community partnership program that shares the voices of the children from the Floyd County school district on WMDJ 100.1 FM radio. The program began in 1998 with WMDJ partners radio. McDonald's, and Floyd County Schools. Lafferty Enterprises, Wal-Mart, and BellSouth have each have been contributors in past years.

The Christmas writing program is now in its ninth year. Through guidance of both, a district and school program coordinator, all Floyd County students from kindergarten through grade 12 are invited to submit a writing selection that is limited to 30 seconds of radio air time. This year, students were asked to respond to one of the following questions, "What is the best gift you have ever given?" and "What is the best gift you have ever received?

Each school selects their top twelve writings to submit to district judges who determine the overall winner at primary, intermediate, middle, and high school levels. This year's judges were: John Carroll, Melissa Forysth, and Kate Lowe, from Big Sandy Community and Technical College; and Melissa Little, Pam Meyer, and Thelma Spears from the community.

The judges noticed the student's consistent depth of writing and offered, for the first time, what they named the "Silver Salute Award" to Betsy Layne Elementary School and the Floyd County Area Technical School. The Silver Salute award will be presented in the school years to follow.

At the conclusion of judging, the top 12 students from each school recorded their selections at WMDJ radio 100.1 FM. Beginning Dec. 1, each school is featured on the radio through a rotation cycle. All schools are heard throughout the month of December. Each year, McDonald's pre-

sents each of the 12 school winners with an "All American Meal," and the overall school winner with a t-shirt. WMDJ also presents a t-shirt to the overall school winner, as well. Then, too, each year, the Floyd County school district presents each of the twelve school winners with decorative certificates and the overall winners from each school with a beautiful book. This year, the book selected is An Orange for Frankie, by Patricia Polacco. As the temporary rules were vetted this year, the federal MINER Act was signed into law, encompassing many of the same regulations found in MSHA's final standard.

"MSHA started this emergency rule when it was uncertain when MINER Act was going to pass," said Chris Hamilton, of the West Virginia Coal Association.

The final rules spell out how mine operators should make improvements to meet which include miners carrying at least a two-hour supply of

oxygen with them while they work — an increase from a one-hour standard — and mine operators leaving additional air packs at various points in mines. The act also requires rescue teams to be within an hour's distance of mines, rather than a two-hour standard, and notification of mine accidents within 15 minutes.

The law, backed by both the coal industry and United Mine Workers, also directed MSHA to require that new underground tracking and communication be in place within three years and revise fines for mine the requirements of the act, safety civil penalties.

"These new requirements are an integrated approach to providing proper guidance to miners and mine operators during emergency situations," said MSHA chief Richard Stickler of the final rules.

For example, MSHA set up a single hotline for reporting accidents, in hopes of making compliance with the 15minute rule more efficient.

MSHA will release additional rules that speak to different part of the act, including regulations by the end of December dealing revising fines for safety violations, said agency spokeswoman Amy Louviere.

Rules for mine rescue teams are due by the end of next year.

The black students who have encountered Allen Central's school spirit don't accept such views, though they do little to fight back.

"It really makes me mad," said Ted Honaker, one of two dozen black students at Pikeville High School, about 25 miles away.

The 17-year-old plays basketball against Allen Central and says he's sick of looking at Confederate flags in the stands when the two teams face off. The only thing that bothers him more is the assumption

High's 559 students. Black students make up only half a percent of the county's 10,945 students.

In Floyd County, home of Allen Central, there 33 black students out of 6,348 students in the county, making up less than 1 percent.

Even school board member Mickey McGuire, the one who criticized Allen Central's school flag and mascot, felt outnumbered. No one else on the five-member board, which has no black members, has spoken up.

"I really don't think those people intended it in a racial way, but these are children who don't realize how racially sensitive that flag is," McGuire said. "They have no sensitivity toward what black people feel about that flag."



# Streamline vote restoration

The right to vote in this country is among the most cherished rights Americans have. Voting is fundamental to a strong democracy and should never be denied to any individual without the best of reasons.

Being convicted of a felony and sentenced to prison qualifies as a justifiable reason to suspend a person's right to vote. The consequences of committing a felony crime should be heavy. But it is also reasonable that even convicted felons should have their right to vote restored at some point after their period of punishment.

It doesn't happen every time, but it is hoped and expected of people who have paid their debt to society to become productive again, earning for themselves the respect of people around them. To forever ban them from the voting booth is unfair and fails to appreciate that people can and do turn their lives around and have paid enough for their misdeeds.


So the question becomes, how does the state go about restoring the rights of convicted felons once they are released? Should it be a standardized, straightforward system, or a system that is applied on a case-by-case basis, with one person — the governor — ultimately responsible for giving the thumbs up or the thumbs down to each felon seeking the right to vote again?

The latter is the way it is done in Kentucky. We think it is time to take a look at changing a system that may work well in some cases, but is nevertheless arbitrary by nature.

Only three states out of 50 — Kentucky, Florida and Virginia — automatically revoke felons' voting rights. In Kentucky, that means more than 180,000 people can't vote. If they want to vote, hold office or bear arms, they have to appeal to the governor to ask that their rights be restored. It's in the state constitution.

Gov. Ernie Fletcher requires felons seeking their rights back to submit references and a written explanation. Many have done so, and Fletcher has reinstated voting rights to more than 730 people.

A pair of constitutional amendments have been proposed to change the system, both of which remove the governor from the decision-making process. One would automatically

# The culture of corruption loses

The "culture of corruption" was real. That phrase was a much-contested talking point during the past two years, with Democrats touting it as an accurate description of the degraded ethical state of the congressional GOP and Republicans dismissing it as a smear.

Democrats were much closer to the truth. Voters took a good whiff of the odor emanating from Washington and some of their Republican representatives, and recoiled. One-third of Republican losses in the House came in congressional districts where the party had been tainted, to varying degrees, by scandal.

Those seats were in Arizona's 5th, California's 11th, Florida's 16th, New York's 20th, North Carolina's 11th, Pennsylvania's 7th and 10th, Ohio's 18th and Texas' 22nd congressional districts. Drawing from these races, the GOP's message to its ranks

infested with self-enriching charlatans - please, go find some other party.

The culture of corruption was really a culture of looking the other way, delaying action and hoping no would notice. The first step on the slide toward oblivion was the decision of the House

Republican conference right after the 2004 elections to reverse a rule that said members of its leadership had to step aside if indicted. It was meant to protect Majority Leader Tom DeLay from a bogus indictment in Texas, but played as a special favor for a powerful player and was unsustainable. Republicans changed the rule back. But the culture-of-corruption theme had been set, and Republicans would play into it right up to Election Day.

As the scandal around Jack Abramoff developed, Republicans

tress or run a congressional office Unfortunately, Speaker of the House Dennis Hastert was the opposite of zealous, refusing to force his mem-

bers to purge themselves and adopt a wideranging, meaningful reform agenda.

Republicans just hoped they could hang on, without voters dwelling on the fact that all they seemed to care about was their

own self-perpetuation. If there was ever any chance that strategy would work, it was eliminated by Florida Rep. Mark Foley's disgrace. The scandal again presented an image of a Republican Party resolutely unenergetic in policing itself and consumed with trying to shift the blame once misconduct came to light.

Exit polls show that more voters cited corruption as their top concern than even the Iraq War. Pundits are dismissing this number, but Republicans do so at their own peril.

# Better get used to 'earmarks'

Remember "earmarks"? They're those awful things Democrats kept railing against during the recent election, shabby political deals made "in the dark of night" that funneled taxpayers' money into the districts of powerful politicians.

Perhaps the worst of a bad breed, you'll recall, was the infamous \$200 million "Bridge to Nowhere" in Alaska. (Actually, it was to a small island where 50 people lived, which technically may not be "nowhere" but you certainly can see it from there.) Republican Senator Ted Stevens was the project's godfather and he was insulted - positively outraged — that anyone would find fault with spending \$4 million per person on a bridge in his state.

The practice of attaching these earmarks, often anonymously, onto legislation without discussion of their individual merits, simply as a favor to the legislator involved, had gotten entirely out of hand, said the Democrats. Under Republican rule, the cost of earmarks had ballooned to \$64 billion a year and Democrats were going to do something about them; yes they were.

Now that they are about to take control of the appropriations machinery, however, the Democrats have Roseanne morphed Roseannadana. "Never mind," is their battle cry.

Sen. Daniel Inouye of Hawaii, the 82-year-old Democrat who is taking over as chairman of the defense appropriations subcommittee, the

largest pool of discretionary spending available for earmarking, said that he didn't contemplate any "mon-

umental changes" in the system: He said that he'd met with Sen.

Stevens, the current defense appropriations chair, before the election, and they'd come to an agreement.

'We pledged to each other that no matter what happens, we will continue with our tested system of bipartisanship and we've been doing this for the past 25 years, and it's

worked." Yes, it has, particularly for Alaska and Hawaii. Those two states get more bucks per person in earmarks than any other state. Hawaii gets about \$750 per resident per year, Alaska \$1,677

The way the system works is, the majority party gets 60 percent of the booty for its projects, while the minority settles for 40 percent. Now that the Democrats have become the majority, is it really fair to expect them to give up their turn at the public trough?

"What's good for the goose is good for the gander," Democratic Sen. Patty Murray of Washington, set to become chairperson of the transportation subcommittee. She, incidentally, threatened her colleagues with reprisal if they voted against Stevens' bridge. Who said there's no bipartisanship Washington?

These projects, after all, are a way of rewarding political contributors and convincing working stiffs that you have their best interests at heart. Some of them are even worthwhile.

Sen. Tom Harkin, Iowa Democrat, says he is an unabashed supporter of earmarks, which he prefers to call 'Congressional directed funding.'

He claims that 14 years ago he started directing millions of dollars out of the defense budget into breast

cancer research. 'Now, was that bad?" he asked "The New York Times" reporter interviewing

him on the subject. He should have asked me. Yes, it's bad. Not because the project isn't worthwhile but because it is a violation of the integrity of the bud-

get procedure.

There's no legitimate defense reason for the Defense Department to fund breast cancer research. If a project, however noble, cannot get funded on its own merits, it should die. Getting away from that principle leads inevitably to the Bridge to Nowhere.

My personal favorite of the examples of the art of the earmark is the work of Sen. Robert Byrd of West Virginia, the longest serving U.S. senator in history, who is slated to become the chairman of the full House Appropriations Committee.

As a result of his appropriations magic over the years, his state now home to the Coast Guard's Operations System Center, its National Vessel Movement Center and (soon) its National Maritime

If the state only had a coast, it would be all set. And now that Senator Byrd is back in charge, maybe it will get one.



# Quick fix caused more problems than it solved

Dear Tom and Ray: Oh brother. I lost my oil cap last time I changed my oil.

While I searched for a new oil cap, I stuck a rag in the opening as a temporary fix. While driving on the highway, my car started making an awful noise. When I stopped to look,

I saw that the rag was sucked suppose it's possible. halfway into the engine. I RAY: Preventing the valves

from closing WOULD cause noise and poor performance. In any case, it's easy enough to check. Have a mechanic remove the valve cover which isn't a big job - clean out whatever's in there, put it back together, and hope for the

TOM: And by "hope for the best," I mean hope that either (A) bits of rag didn't get chewed up and sent down the oil-return holes into the oil pan. Or (B) that you didn't just run the truck out of oil.

RAY: If rag fragments managed to get down into the oil pan, they could be clogging up the pickup screen on the oil pump's intake tube. That can lead to oil starvation, which can also create noise and poor performance. Then you'd need to remove the oil pan - which is a pretty big job — and clean off the screen, since a simple oil change is unlikely to get it

TOM: The worst-case scenario is that by driving without an oil cap, you ran the truck out of or very low on oil.

RAY: Right. The rag could have acted like a wick, and soaked up a bunch of oil. And then you removed the remnants of the rag and kept driving without an oil cap. While you were driving, oil could have splashed out of the valve cover - further depleting your supply of oil.

TOM: If you run the engine out of - or very low on - oil, you can do serious damage to the bearings, which can result in knocking, poor performance and, pretty quickly, complete engine failure.

RAY: In fact, you already might have experienced complete engine failure by the time you read this, Ryan. If you did, congratulations! You no longer need our help.

TOM: I'd start by checking the oil level. Then, assuming it's good, remove the valve cover and see if there's stuff



preventing the valves from closing. If there is, clean it out and then change the oil and fil-

# \* Elk like to travel on mountain roads during winter months

TIMES STAFF REPORT

FRANKFORT - Motorists in southeastern Kentucky should watch out for elk in the road during the next few months, as animals move to lower elevations in search of food.

"Considering the number of elk we have, there aren't many collisions," said Law Enforcement Capt. Kenneth Amburgey of the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources. "Drivers need to observe

the speed limit in areas where we've had collisions before, and cautiously ease through if they see elk. It's important to watch for other traffic at the same time.'

Roads with the highest number of elk-vehicle collisions during the past few years include KY 7 in Knott County, KY 582 in Knott and Floyd counties, KY 476 in Perry County, U.S. 421 in Leslie County and KY 66 in Clay County.

"The vast majority of elk-vehicle

collisions happen from Thanksgiving through April," said Tina Brunjes, big game program coordinator for Kentucky Fish and Wildlife. "Motorists need to be aware that elk move a lot this time of

Elk are most likely to move on nights when the moon is full. "They can move all night during a full moon," said Karen Alexy, Kentucky Fish and Wildlife's research program coordinator. "This time of year,

some of the elk move down from the reclaimed mines in search of food."

If drivers encounter an elk in the road, they should slow down and cautiously move past the animal. Drivers should not turn their vehicle's headlights off. "Animals freeze when confronted with bright lights," Brunjes said. "But if you turn the lights off, they begin moving and you can't see them, which can be dangerous.'

Kentucky began restoring free-

ranging elk to southeastern Kentucky in 1997. The state's herd now numbers about 5,700. However, even with the growing herd, elk are much less likely than deer to collide with cars or trucks. An average of 10 elk-vehicle collisions have occurred per year since Kentucky's elk restoration began.

"Elk aren't as prone to dart out in front of cars as deer are," said Brunjes. "But it's still a good idea to slow down and pay attention."

Ballard Wildlife Management Area near Oscar in Ballard County, for instance, a few years ago might have held 40,000 to 70,000 interior geese during the height of the migration, whereas the interior visitors might peak well under 5,000

birds in more recent seasons. Kentucky nesting geese were estimated at 40,000 this spring. With good production from a favorable nesting season, the fall population should be considerable larger enough so that Kentucky's own geese should figure high into hunting, especially given the decline of interior goose visitation of the state.

Hunting temperate geese is a bit different from how Canadas are hunted in traditional goose areas, Pritchert said. Large decoy spreads at semi-permanent hunting sites are less effective with "local"

"A lot more of the hunting is done on farm ponds where geese may or may not come any give day," Pritchert said. "It's done mostly with small decoy spreads where you can come and go more quickly and adapt to changes in the goose habits.

"You go out and hunt from temporary blinds and hope to get in front of a bunch or two of geese," Pritchert said. "You don't see as many birds hunting that way, but you usually have better chances of getting them to come in if they do

"But local geese know their territories, and they're quick to move from a place if they're disturbed there," he said. "That's why hunters have to be flexible.'

Traditional big decoy spreads and day-after-day hunting from established pits, meanwhile, still produce around the longtime western Kentucky goose strongholds of Ballard County and the Henderson-Sloughs WMA near Henderson.

With some continuing interior geese influx and a smattering of shorter-migrational temperate geese dropping in with interior birds, the big spreads continue to fool a fair share of honkers.

"There's enough that the traditional techniques still work for the guys who do it around those western management areas," Pritchert

# Park planned to commemorate role blacks play in horse racing

LEXINGTON - A new park designed to commemorate northeast Lexington's role in the history of thoroughbred racing is in the planning stages, with proponents saying it will help the city and blacks reclaim their places in racing history.

The park will be named Isaac Murphy Memorial Art Garden, after the three-time Kentucky Derby-winning jockey, a black man who has been called the greatest jockey of the 19th century. He once lived in the

"It's been talked about for years - how to take advantage of this neighborhood being historically connected to the horse

industry," said Jim Embry, a member of NorthEast Lexington Initiative, one of the organizations involved in development of the park. "Hardly ever is there recognition within the community at large ... of the important role that this community played in the development of the horse industry."

Plans call for the park to be built on a half-acre piece of land owned by the state, but designated for use as a park, Embry

Work on the garden is expected to start in the spring, Embry said.

All the plans for the Isaac Murphy Memorial Art Garden are preliminary and public input is being sought. But organizers describe an interactive teaching garden with native plants and art with horse

'We're thinking of a variety of ways to approach it," Embry said. He estimated the park could cost up to \$200,000.

Bruce Mundy, a history researcher and lecturer, said the area has historic significance, given the connection of Murphy and two other black jockeys, Oliver Lewis, who won the first Kentucky Derby in 1875 with Aristides and James "Soup" Perkins, who won the Derby in 1895 aboard Halma.

'We want this community to go back to its former glory," Mundy said. "Doing this park is our chance to say it's going to happen; it is happening. Let's do it collective-

# Morehead State women pick up win over Austin Peay

MOREHEAD – Junior guard Anitha Smith-Williams scored 20 points off the bench and senior forward Jessie Plante made her fourth start of the season a good one with a season high 15 points and six rebounds as the Morehead State University women's basketball team opened Ohio Valley Conference play 1-0 with a 66-61 win over Austin Peay Thursday at Johnson Arena. Austin Peay fell to 2-6 and 1-1 in the league.

Burton (Louisville), an outstanding wide receiver and kickoff returner, leads the SEC and is sixth nationally in all-purpose yardage with 149.8 yards per game. He has caught 72 passes for 1,006 yards and 12 touchdowns this year. He is only the third player in school history, joining Craig Yeast and James Whalen, to reach the 1,000-yard receiving mark in a season. He is third in the league in kickoff returns with a 24.9-yard average.

Tamme (Danville) leads the league's tight ends with 28 catches, good for 327 yards and one touch-

down. He had a career-high seven receptions for 120 yards in the regularseason finale at Tennessee.

Not even knowing at the start of preseason practice if he was going to be the starting quarterback, Woodson (Radcliff) won the job in August and has had a tremendous season. He has thrown for 3,216 yards and 28 touchdowns, leading the SEC in passing yardage, total offense, and TD passes. His touchdown-to-interception ratio of 28-to-7 is the best in the league. His career interception ratio is the lowest in SEC history (min. 400 attempts).

Burton, Tamme, and Woodson played key roles in a passing attack that leads the SEC with 274 passing yards per game.

# Seven Cardinals earn First Team All-BIG EAST honors

PROVIDENCE, R.I. - Following its first-ever BIG EAST championship, 12 Louisville football players were rewarded Wednesday by being named to the All-BIG EAST team, as selected by the league's coaches. Harry Douglas, Renardo Foster, Kurt Quarterman, George Bussey, Art Carmody, William Gay and Amobi Okoye all made the First Team, while Mario Urrutia, Eric Wood, Malik Jackson and Brian Brohm all made the Second Team.

The seven first teamers were the most in the league. Douglas had an outstanding year, catching 60 passes for 1,100 yards and was tops in the conference in receptions per game and receiving yards. He caught a pass in all 12 games and had three 100-yard receiving games. He ended the year with a career-best 149 yards last week against Connected and Bussey.

Foster, Quarterman and Bussey were part of a much-improved offensive line. Each player started all 12 games, as the Cardinals are the nation's second-best offensive unit in the nation.

Carmody, who is re-writing the University of Louisville record book, is a finalist for the Lou Groza Award. He connected on a school record 20-of-23 field goals and is a perfect 57-for-57 in extra points. He had a streak of 15 in row this season and is second in the nation in field goals. He also ranks fourth in the country in scoring.

Gay is having a career-best year from his cornerback position. He is second in the BIG EAST Conference in interceptions with five and second in passes defended. He has a careerbest 55 tackles and also owns a pair of sacks.

Okoye, who is a 19-year old senior, was one of two unanimous selections after playing his best season with the Cardinals. Okoye recorded a career-high for tackles with 49 and also had a career-high six sacks. One of the team's captains, Okoye is also one of the team's emotional leaders.

Urrutia had his best season as a sophomore wide receiver. The 6-6 product of Fern Creek High School, caught 55 passes for 929 yards and six touchdowns. He continues to make big plays in the passing game, averaging 17.2 yards per catch. He has four 100-yard games and has

caught a pass in all 12 games.

Wood makes the second team as a center. The sophomore from Cincinnati, Ohio., started all 12 games, playing over 700 offensive snaps and grading out at 87 percent.

Brohm, who missed two games due to injury, is starting to put up huge numbers late in the season. Brohm has thrown for 2,783 yards and 16 touchdowns this season, completing 62.7 percent of his throws. In the last three games, Brohm has thrown for 951 yards and 10 touchdowns, including four in games against Pittsburgh and Connecticut.

Jackson has stepped up his game to another level this season as one of the big playmakers on defense. Jackson is third on the team in tackles with 53, but leads the team in tackles for loss with 14 and sacks with eight. He had one of the season's biggest play when he return a fumble for a touchdown against third-ranked West Virginia.

Sharp was steady for the Cardinals at safety, starting all 12 games as one of the veterans of the secondary. He recorded 50 tackles and also had seven pass break-ups.

The Cardinals will play 15thranked Wake Forest in the Orange Bowl Jan. 2.

# Steelers 27, Browns 7

PITTSBURGH - Pittsburgh Steelers running backs are supposed to be big and strong, rugged and durable, perfect symbols like Jerome Bettis and Franco Harris of a toughas-it-gets franchise. Willie Parker is much different, and he finds himself in their record book because of it.

Parker, a speed back in an offense built around power, broke the Steelers' single-game rushing record with 223 yards - a game better than either Harris or Bettis enjoyed - and Pittsburgh excelled as usual in cold weather by roughing up the offenseless Cleveland Browns 27-7 Thursday night.

Parker, the first player in Steelers history to have two 200-yard games in a season, broke John "Frenchy" Fuqua's record of 218 yards against Philadelphia in 1970, two years before Fuqua was the intended receiver on

Harris' famous Immaculate Reception against Oakland.

"I don't know too much about him, though Coach (Dick) Hoak has told me all about him," said Parker, referring to the running backs coach who coached both backs. "This (record) was nice, but all those accolades come - and then they go. The best thing was

Parker, the fastest running back in Steelers history and the first since Bettis in 2000-01 with consecutive 1,000 yards, broke Fuqua's record early in the fourth quarter and might have approached 300 yards if the game had been closer.

Parker wasn't drafted out of North Carolina in 2004 and originally thought he'd be a special teams player with Pittsburgh.

"They've never had a speed back, they've always had power backs so I thought I'd have to make a niche on special teams," Parker said. "Then I said. 'Naw, I'm going to keep going at it, keep hard at it and be a running back, just be that every down back.""

The Steelers ran the ball so well, tackle Marvel Smith said, the Browns' defensive players were yelling at each other in the huddle.

"There's no better feeling than that, when they know you're going to run it and they still can't stop it," Smith said. 'We rammed it down their throats."

The Steelers (6-7) withstood temperatures in the teens, a wind chill that was below zero in the second half and an occasional snow flake to win their seventh in a row against their Rust Belt rival, following up a 41-0 rout in Cleveland last December and a 24-20 comeback victory last month in Cleveland. Pittsburgh is one of the NFL's best clubs when the weather gets bad and the games usually are more important, going 21-6 past Dec. 1 since 2001.

For the Browns (4-9), this time of the year simply is a case of going from bad to worse. Assured now of their fourth consecutive losing season, they are 2-11 in December the last three

"It was cold, but both teams have to play in it - and they caught and ran the ball fine," Browns tight end Steve Heiden said.

Parker went over the 1,000-yard mark for the second season in a row on Pittsburgh's opening drive and kept on going, following up his 213-yard game against New Orleans on Nov. 12. He had been limited to 129 yards in his last three games, but there was no stopping him Thursday as he helped lead the Steelers' two longest drives of the season.

Parker ran for 26 yards on five carries during a 97-yard drive ended by Ben Roethlisberger's 49-yard TD pass to Nate Washington that made it 7-0 during the first quarter. Washington started for the injured Hines Ward, who sat out a second straight game following knee surgery.

Later, Roethlisberger (11-of-21, 225 yards) finished off a 91-yard drive with a 2-yard bootleg TD run, crossing up a Browns defense that was expecting Parker to get the ball.

Cleveland never did find a way to slow down a Steelers running game that only two weeks ago was limited to 21 yards in a 27-0 loss to Baltimore. Pittsburgh gained 304 yards on the ground, the Browns just 18.

"You can't stop it and you can't move it, you get beat," coach Romeo Crennel said. "They ran inside, ran outside, and we couldn't tackle him."

Parker also had a 3-yard TD run on a 74-yard drive during the third quarter as the Steelers, despite playing without four injured starters, continued to wear down the Browns.

Cleveland appeared to be headed toward its second shutout loss in three weeks until Derek Anderson, making his first NFL start for the injured Charlie Frye, threw a 45-yard TD pass

to Braylon Edwards with 5:20 remaining. Anderson couldn't replicate his dramatic debut Sunday when he threw two TD passes to lead a 31-28 overtime win over Kansas City.

Until then, the Steelers hadn't allowed a touchdown on defense in nine quarters, or since the second quarter in Baltimore. Pittsburgh beat Tampa Bay and its inexperienced quarterback, Bruce Gradkowski, 20-3

The only trouble with this latest Steelers late-season surge is it apparently comes too late to save a season that was all but over after the Super Bowl champions lost six of their first

"We're going to win the next three, then see where 9-7 gets us," linebacker Joey Porter said.

Notes: The announced crowd of 55,246 was about 10,000 below Heinz Field's capacity, and there weren't nearly that many fans around even by the third quarter. ... Browns S Brian Russell sat out with an elbow injury. He had a staph infection in the same elbow earlier this season. ... The Steelers evened the series 55-55, counting playoff games, for the first time since it began in 1950. Pittsburgh has won four of five.

# Legless teen proves a giant inspiration for Browns

CLEVELAND - Pounding his hands into the turf, Bobby Martin propelled his 3-foot body across the field the way he once chased high school quarterbacks.

Born without legs, Martin, wearing a Browns jacket and hat, slid into place in a single-file line of Cleveland players during pregame introductions before Sunday's game against the Kansas City Chiefs.

As the NFL giants darted past, Martin reached up, slapped hands and screamed encouragement to his new

He no longer inspires by playing football.

These days, Martin motivates simply by being himself.

"He was firing people up," Browns safety Brian Russell said.

He always has.

Last weekend, Martin was invited to be a guest of the Browns, a team desperate for wins and one quickly coming apart at the seams.

A week earlier, Cleveland had been embarrassed 30-0 by the Cincinnati Bengals, a lospided loss made much worse by Braylon Edwards' sideline tirade. The wide receiver was upset about the Browns' offensive line and yanked at quarterback Charlie Frye's jersey to prove his point.

That outburst set off red flags for some Cleveland fans, who wondered if coach Romeo Crennel had lost control. The Browns seemed to be unraveling fast.

Meeting Martin may have helped them get it together.

"I think it inspired some of the guys to feel different about what they consider to be their problems," Crennel said. "Their problems are that they're feeling bad and they didn't catch enough balls, and here's a guy who doesn't have any legs who has a great attitude and who can still operate and play the game. So I think that that changed some of their attitudes."

Martin has that affect on people. On Saturday, after being introduced by Crennel, the 19-year-old Martin began working his charm on the Browns. First, he had a laugh at

the expense of Edwards and Frye. "I had some fun," he said. "I was messing with Braylon and Charlie. They were standing next to each other, and I said, 'Did you two settle your differences, or do I have to settle them for you?' Braylon said, 'Oh, yeah, we're cool.' They shook hands."

Later, Martin bet Edwards \$100 that he could tackle Browns punt returner Dennis Northcutt in a race to the end zone.

'He tried to shake me a little bit, but I stayed with him," Martin said. "I pushed him out of bounds at the 1thought I was gonna leave you back there."

Martin arrived at Sunday's game decked out in some of the gifts he got from the Browns. The team presented him with a signed helmet, and tight end Kellen Winslow gave the youngster a pair of his gloves.

As the Browns and Chiefs warmed Martin scooted around Cleveland's sideline on his widedecked skateboard. Last season, the Green Bay Packers had him for a visit. This Sunday in Cincinnati, he'll be a guest of Oakland defensive lineman Warren Sapp, who sent Martin an autographed Raiders helmet.

It wasn't all that long ago Martin was on the field as a player. He was a nose tackle and played special teams at Dayton's Colonel White High School, a feat that surely speaks to the possibilities of human will and spirit. He would drive his arms into the ground, then swing them like crutches to thrust himself forward.

A few days before coming to Cleveland, Martin was in Boise, Idaho, where he received a humanitarian award and visited a local veter-

"Some of them had lost limbs and I showed them what I could do," Martin said. "One of the men got so emotional, he made me cry. He was like, 'I'm amazed by what you do. I'd given up. I'm just lying in bed waiting yard line, and he was like, 'Wow! I for my life to end,' I told him, 'Don't

ever give up cause you only live

After the Browns rallied to stun the Chiefs in overtime, the team invited him into their locker room to celebrate. Edwards called Martin the club's good-luck charm and the two exchanged phone numbers.

Martin had already given the Browns something much bigger.

"Inspiration," kicker Phil Dawson said. "To see a guy like that, and the things that he's been able to accomplish in his circumstances, is something special. Anytime you can be around a person like that it's encouraging. I hope he went away knowing that he brought encouragement to us. It was a treat to get to meet someone like that."

# Bengals try to avoid a K.C. stumble

CINCINNATI - Enjoying a rare Sunday off in December, the Cincinnati Bengals cozied up to their big-screen televisions last weekend and morphed into NFL fans with rooting interests.

They had just kept the AFC North race alive by beating Baltimore in a Thursday night showdown, and were looking to get some help from the other teams they're trying to catch.

They exulted as the Kansas City Chiefs - one of the teams ahead of them in the wild card race - went to Cleveland and lost to the lowly Browns, putting the Bengals near the front of the line of playoff contenders.

"Yeah, I wanted Kansas City to lose," receiver T.J. Houshmandzadeh said with a satisfied grin.

As they pondered the Chiefs' selfdestruction in the Dawg Pound, the Bengals' celebration soon gave way to a more sobering thought: They can't afford to pull a Kansas City of their

The Oakland Raiders (2-10) are tied with Detroit for the league's worst record and represent the last "gimme" on the Bengals' schedule. Cincinnati

(7-5) finishes the season at Indianapolis, at Denver and at home against Pittsburgh, always a tough

Kansas City served as a warning. "They came in against

Cleveland and were probably looking ahead of them, looking past them," quarterback Carson Palmer said. "It's a big challenge for us not to do that." It would be very

The Raiders are deep into a rut of irrelevance. Since their Super Bowl appearance in the 2002 season, they've gone 4-12, 5-11 and 4-12, their worst stretch since they joined the NFL. This year, the offense is dragging them down.

Oakland has gained the fewest yards in the league, scored the fewest touchdowns and second-fewest points: 146, one more than Tampa Bay. The most telling statistic: The offense has scored only 10 points in the fourth quarter all season, none in the last eight games.

"They (the Bengals) are playing great right now," Raiders center Jake Grove said. "They're playing hard and having good results, and they're shutting people down. It seems like we're doing the opposite. We're playing hard, we don't get results and we're not getting anything done. And it's frustrating, because our defense is playing on a level where we could win a lot of games."

That defense is the Raiders' best hope of pulling off the upset in Cincinnati on Sunday. The Raiders held Texans quarterback David Carr to 32 yards on seven completions - he was sacked seven times for 37

> yards of losses - but Oakland somehow lost 23-14 last Sunday, the lowest point of a bad season.

With their season in playit-out mode, coach Art Shell has challenged his team to toughen during a closing stretch of games against Cincinnati, St. Louis, Kansas City and

"I told the team last week that we're going down the stretch with teams that are vying to get in line for the playoffs," Shell said. "And we can have a say-so in that decision. So, it's a great opportunity for us. It's going to give us a chance to match up with some outstanding football teams and see where we are, and hopefully go into the offseason with a nice taste in our mouth instead of this sour taste right now."

The Bengals can taste the playoffs

Their offense has been back in high gear and the defense has set franchise records during a three-game winning streak. Cincinnati has allowed only seven points in the last two games, a franchise first.

Losses by Kansas City and Denver last Sunday forged a five-way tie for the two AFC wild cards, with Cincinnati in line to get one based on

tiebreakers at this point. If the Bengals win out, they might do even better.

"If we win four games, I think we'll have accomplished one of our first goals, and that's to win the division," coach Marvin Lewis said. "So we'll keep pressure on them."

The Bengals have turned into one of the NFL's hottest teams at the right time. Palmer appears to be all the way back from his reconstructive knee surgery, throwing for 10 touchdowns in the last four games.

Receiver Chad Johnson has 32 catches for 664 yards in the last four games, the fourth-highest total in NFL history. He needs 159 yards on Sunday to top Charley Hennigan's league record for a five-game total.

Of course, the Chiefs also were feeling good about themselves when they went to Cleveland to play a team that was in disarray after a 30-0 loss to the Bengals. Look where it got them.

"The most important thing is Oakland right now," Johnson said. "You know how the NFL goes. There's always teams whose records aren't that well, that always seem to play well and spoil the chances of teams that are doing well, trying to make the playoffs."

Before the season started, Johnson boasted that the Bengals would dominate their division. Their struggles in the first half left him humbled, and the recent winning streak has brought him perspective.

Like the rest of the Bengals, he doesn't even want to look at the wildcard standings these days.

## DirectTV's "Sunday Ticket" draws fire from Pennsylvania senator

WASHINGTON - The National Football League's ability to negotiate exclusive sports packages is under fire from the outgoing chairman of the

Senate Judiciary Committee. Sen. Arlen Specter, R-Pa., twice said he would introduce legislation in the next session aimed at eliminating the league's freedom from antitrust

Specter said the NFL should not use the exemption to negotiate exclusive programming packages such as DirectTV Inc.'s "Sunday Ticket," which allows viewers to watch teams outside their regional market.

"As I look at what the NFL is doing today with the NFL channel with the DirectTV ... a lot of people, including myself, would like to be able to have

that ticket," Specter said.

But the 1961 law that gives the NFL this freedom should not apply to DirectTV because it is not "sponsored programming," said Stephen Ross, a law professor at Pennsylvania State University and chair of the school's sports law institute. He said the Pennsylvania senator could be using the threat of legislation to pressure the

NFL to make changes voluntarily. Access to out-of-market football games was one of many consumer fairness issues addressed during the

hearing. Another hot topic was whether cable providers should be forced to share sports broadcasting rights with every service provider in

David Cohen, executive vice president of Comcast Corp., said his company has not made a local Philadelphia sports network it owns available to DirectTV because it is one way his company can stay competitive with the "Sunday Ticket" package.

"What is sauce for the goose is sauce for the gander," he said.






