Man arrested after chase, cruiser crash

GARRETT - A Hueysville man was arraigned Thursday after being charged with fleeing police in a car chase that saw him allegedly damage a sheriff's department cruiser.

Otis Gene Shepherd was arrested following a Wednesday evening episode which began when he was observed crashing into a telephone pole in front of an officer's home in Garrett. Sgt. Terry Chaffins responded to the call and pursued Shepherd into West Garrett, where he was eventually stopped after damaging a cruiser operated by Deputy Kevin Shepherd.

In a report filed by Shepherd, he noted that he barely got out of his parked cruiser when Shepherd hit it. He observed that Shepherd appeared intoxicated and was very irate, yelling and cursing at the officers.

Shepherd was charged with fleeing police, two counts of wanton endangerment, operating a motor vehicle under the influence, disorderly conduct and resisting arrest.

At his arraignment, Shepherd was issued a \$10,000 partially secured bond and ordered to return to court for a preliminary hearing on July

Grand jury indicts aide, blasts school system

PRESTONSBURG - The Floyd County Grand Jury indicted a former May Valley Elementary teacher's aide Friday, charging him with nine counts of criminal abuse and six counts of perjury.

The grand jury also issued a report on their findings which chastised the staff at the school and county education administrators for failing to "protect the safety and well being of the children by not taking immediate action to attend to complaints.'

The grand jury indicted Marty Mullins, 35, following more than a year of investigation which included reviewing documents and listening to over 14 witnesses in the case, which dates back to 2002 and has already seen a civil suit brought against the school which was set-

Spears strikes plea deal in sex abuse case

PRESTONSBURG -A Prestonsburg man accused of rape and sodomy of a child under the age of 12 pleaded guilty to amended charges in circuit court Friday, following a recommendation by the commonwealth that he serve six years in jail and register as a sex offender.


Johnny Spears, 52, will be formally sentenced Sept. 8 after admitting

that he was guilty of the amended charges, which included two counts of unlawful transaction with a minor. He also pleaded guilty to one count of sexual abuse and must submit to three years of supervised probation upon his eventual release and register as a sex offender.

Spears admitted to suicidal thoughts at his hearing which have manifested themselves as a loss of appetite. Judge John D.

PRESTONSBURG - One defendant in the eBay theft cases appealed her high bond in circuit court Friday and saw her bond reduce somewhat, as it was brought down to \$100,000 cash after originally being set in district court at \$250,000.

Deborah Wallen, 36, of Prestonsburg, who is facing six counts of receiving stolen prop-

erty in the case, appeared for the hearing with her attorney, Jerry Patton. County Attorney Keith Bartley stood in for the commonwealth.

Patton began the proceedings by making his case for Wallen. He said that she was accused of the lowest level of felony crimes and that there has been no testimony that Wallen ever entered the victims' homes. Gora Wicker, the codefendant, has been hit with several theft

charges but thus far Wallen has only been charged with receiving stolen good from Wicker's neighbors which were subsequently sold on eBay, with the exception of items recovered at her Bull Creek home. He said that Wallen was being held for an exorbitantly high bond which was tantamount to a jail sentence. He further argued that Wallen hasn't been convicted of

Miners say mine safety rooted safe attitudes, not new laws

HARLAN - Leon Napier was a hardworking man, but he admits that sometimes he and his buddies cut corners while mining underground. Maybe a ventilation curtain wouldn't stay up, maybe a coal-cutting machine was driven through a shortcut instead of on safe pathway

Mostly, he says, the shortcuts were taken to speed up production.

"To run coal the right way ---the safe way - you won't run as much coal," says Napier, 46, who retired three years ago after working 28 years in eastern Kentucky's coal fields.

After two major coal mine disasters this year, new federal and state laws have been passed to save miners from explosions,

fires, rockfalls and other hazards. But some longtime miners, like Napier, say it's going to take more than doubling up air packs and escape drills to create a safer working environment.

It's going to take a change in attitude.

"Until we get mine managers to take the responsibility for their employees and start caring about human lives, that's not going to matter," said Carl Potter, an Oklahoma-based mine safety consultant.

Allen Turner, a Harlan County miner also acknowledged workers should also take safety more seriously.

"You can do things to make your job easier, but it's not necessarily safer," he said.

The new federal Miner Act, and recent state laws passed in states like coal mining

Kentucky, West Virginia and Illinois, come within months of the Sago mine explosion in January, when 12 West Virginia

a May 20 explosion at the Kentucky Darby Mine No. 1 in Harlan County killed five more miners. The number of miners killed this year has already reached 33 - 11 more than in

While investigators probe the Sago and Darby fatalities, lawmakers scrambled to pass laws designed to increase the chance of survival in the event of another disaster.

Kentucky's law, effective Wednesday, will require mine managers to report within 15 minutes a serious injury or fatality to state officials; have two air

A glance at Kentucky's new mine safety law

Key points Kentucky's new mine safety law, with effective dates:

Effective July 12:

In the event of a fatality or serious injury at a mine, a mine supervisor has 15 minutes to report the incident to the state Office of Mine Safety and Licensing.

underground All All mines must provide each miner with an additional air pack that contains at least an hour of air.

Miners must participate in escapeway drills once every 90 days.

No mine supervisor shall terminate or discipline a miner for reporting unsafe mining practices to regulatory agencies.

Effective Sept. 1:

Each underground mine must have a two-way communication system, such as telephones, between the surface and underground operations.

Effective Jan. 1:

Emergency action plans must be submitted with each application of a mine license to operate an underground coal mine.

The story broke in 2003 when an investigation by the Cabinet for Families and Children substantiated reports of abuse by Mullins towards special education students. The abuse allegedly occurred between January 2001 and September 2002. The alleged abuses included pinching students and twisting their arms and wrists, as well as reports of children being locked in a bathroom as punishment.

Mullins was charged in Floyd District Court with five counts of criminal abuse on July 30, 2004, and granted a preliminary hearing after an investigation by Kentucky State Police Det. Mike Goble.

The five perjury counts lodged against Mullins allege that he lied under oath when testifying on July 13, 2004. He was charged with regard to five statements made at that time, which include saying that he never made fun of a child's personal appearance, never locked a child in a bathroom and that he was never told that there was any dissatisfaction with his job performance before Sept. 17, 2002.

The criminal abuse charges, all class C felonies punishable by up to 10 years in jail, number 13 and include five incidents of locking children in a bathroom, four incidents of twisting a child's arm behind his or her back and four incidents of applying pressure to sensitive parts of the student's bodies.





BACKGROUND: In accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Huntington District has prepared a Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) which documents planning analyse undertaken for a proposed flood damage reduction project in the Levisa Fork basin in Floyd County, Kentucky. Th study area includes the incorporated areas of Prestonsburg and unincorporated areas in Floyd County which are sub ject to flood damage from the potential of a reoccurrence of the April 1977 flood. The study area does not include th City of Martin, Kentucky, where a separate flood damage reduction project is underway. The DEIS documents agenc evaluation of four alternatives, two of which include floodwall/levee alignments intended to protect Prestonsburg an non-structural flood-proofing measures, a total non-structural alternative, and the No Federal Action alternative.

The USACE has distributed copies of the DEIS to appropriate Members of Congress, State and local government off cials in Kentucky, Federal agencies, and other interested parties. Fletcher under fire from fellow Republicans

FRANKFORT — A key GOP leader called on Gov. Ernie Fletcher to drop his bid for a second term, saying Thursday that Kentucky's first Republican governor in more than 30 years is unlikely to

"The governor's persistent inability to grasp and manage political issues has led to a collapse of support within his own party, making it necessary for me to say publicly what many Republicans are saying privately: 'Governor, enough is enough. Do not seek re-election," said Jack L. Richardson IV, chairman of the Jefferson Sounty Republican Party.

Richardson is the first Republican leader to publicly call for Fletcher to bow out of next year's governor's race.

"Our Senate president was not exaggerating the level of concern," Richardson said. "If anything, he understated the depth of the governor's political problems. They are profound."

Senate President David Williams, R-Burkesville, said last week he and fellow Republicans have "serious doubts" about Fletcher's reelectability. Lt. Gov. Steve Pence, Fletcher's running mate in 2003, withdrew from the ticket in June. And U.S. Sen. Mitch McConnell declined to endorse Fletcher's candidacy last week, saying "I really haven't given it any thought.'

Richardson also said he doesn't think Fletcher can raise enough money to win reelection.

"I think at this point the governor is probably \$2 million behind in fundraising where he should be,' Richardson said. "It's not a good situation."

The comments came one day after Fletcher and running mate Robbie Rudolph of Murray filed a campaign finance report showing they had raised \$372,275 between June 23 and June 30.

"Raising this amount of

money in less than 15 days sends a strong message that the people of Kentucky are excited about the Fletcher-Rudolph ticket and that they support my vision and my reelection," Fletcher said in a statement released by his campaign.

Fletcher campaign spokeswoman Jessica Ditto had no immediate response to Richardsons' comments.

Bill Stone, a Louisville businessman and former chairman of the Jefferson County Republican Party, said Richardson should not have publicly criticized a Republican governor, especially one who is seeking reelection.

Stone said Republican Party officials take an oath to support Republican office holders and candidates. "I think the only honorable thing now for Jack to do is resign." Stone said.

Despite the criticism, Stone said he believes Fletcher is on his way to a political recovery and pointed to his latest campaign finance report as evidence.

"The governor will tell you that he is not an obsessed political operator. He probably gets a C in politics, but he's the valedictorian of public policy. From a public policy point of view, he's been the best governor this commonwealth has had in at least two generations.'

Williams said during an appearance in Louisville Thursday that Fletcher stumbled in his handling of the state hiring scandal, which resulted in his indictment in May for allegedly rewarding political supporters with state jobs. He pleaded not guilty and is scheduled to stand trial in November.

Fletcher. the first Republican governor since 1971, ran on a promise to "clean up the mess in Frankfort." In his indictment, he is charged with official misconduct, political discrimination and conspiracy, all misdemeanors.

"I don't think the hiring practices was the big problem as much as how he was handling it," William said at an impromptu press conference at

the Galt House, a Louisville hotel where he spoke to a local Rotary Club. "I advised the governor early on to go down and talk to the grand jury and accept responsibility for what folks in his administration had done and express contrition ... People will forgive a lot things if you show contrition."

Williams, who told reporters he has no plans to run for governor, also criticized the governor's political prowess.

"The problem that he has in office goes back to the fact that he hasn't been a seasoned politician," Williams said. 'Some people would say that's good, but it's made his relationship very difficult with the General Assembly, both Republicans and Democrats.'

Richardson, in a harshly worded statement delivered Thursday afternoon in Louisville, said he is not attacking Fletcher personally nor is he attacking his policies.

"It is his political ineptitude that is the problem, and ineptitude that has crippled his ability to implement important initiatives," Richardson said. " ... The governor's two and a half years of political missteps now threaten an opportunity that took over 30 years for Republicans to gain."



Joseph Lambert appointed Melcher to the case early last month. Melcher is a family court judge who serves in Harrison, Nicholas, Pendleton and Robertson counties.

Fletcher's attorneys had argued Stumbo should be disqualified because he may be a potential political rival of the governor's in the 2007 goverpor's race. While Stumbo has not ruled out a possible run for governor, the Democratic attorney general has said he would not challenge Fletcher while his office was prosecuting him.

Melcher said there would only be a conflict if Stumbo eventually became a gubernato-rial candidate. However, Melcher said he was "exercising caution" in disallowing Stumbo's participation. "Under the unique circum-

stances of this case, appearances are important," the judge said. "The commonwealth has not denied comment attributed to the attorney general which implicate him as a possible direct political opponent of the defendant."

Despite the ruling, Melcher said it doesn't appear that the attorney general is a "direct active participant" in the case.

Stumbo said he was pleased with Melcher's decision.

"The judge clearly states that, 'No actual conflict and no actual prejudice of the attorney general have been established' in this case," Stumbo said in a written statement. "He found that the Office of the Attorney General has handled this merit investigation and prosecution properly and according to law and may continue to do so."

Attorneys for Fletcher also filed a motion to dismiss the

charges against him, saying there were "several statutory grounds for dismissal."

Prosecution of the governor on alleged hiring violations "amounts to selective and vindictive prosecution in violation of the equal protection clauses of both the Kentucky and United States constitutions," attorneys said in the motion.

And, a sitting governor must first be impeached and convicted by the legislature before being indicted or prosecuted for official acts, Fletcher's attorneys argued.

Melcher said he would rule on that matter and others at an Aug. 11 hearing.

For the past year, a special grand jury has been investigating whether Fletcher's administration broke state law by basing personnel decisions on political considerations.

That grand jury indicted

Fletcher in May on charges of criminal conspiracy, official misconduct and violating a prohibition against political discrimination.

Defense attorneys entered a not guilty plea for the governor at his arraignment.

The grand jury has also indicted 28 others in the patronage probe. Half of the indictments have been sealed by the judge, so that only grand jurors know who is named in them. The others are all current and former Fletcher administration staffers or associates.

Fletcher has issued a blanket pardon for anyone in his administration who might face charges - except himself.

packs available for each miner and conduct escape drills every 90 days, among other new rules. The state also gained the power to fine mines in violation of the rules, and increased the number of underground inspections from two to three annually.

Similarly, West Virginia's new mine safety law, already in effect, mandates that miners be Provided with emergency communicators, tracking devices and extra air supplies underground.

The disasters also spurred federal legislation for miners to have more oxygen supplies and mine rescue teams to be within an hour's distance. Mine operators are also required to have new devices to track and communicate with trapped miners be in place within three years.

While the new laws have either gone into effect, or about to, there is a lag in the practical reffect of the law as regulators draw up with enforcement rules and approve new equipment.

But are new rules the answer?

"I would argue we have enough laws," said Bill Caylor, president of the Kentucky Coal Association. "Once the dust settles, you'll see if there was a series of occurrences that resulted in Darby and Sago. More than likely these were violations of current existing laws - I don't think the new laws would have much impact."

Industry observers say the laws focus too much on disaster survival, instead of disaster prevention.

Caylor said regulators should put more weight on the "behavior modification" of miners - changing bad, unsafe habits to prevent future disas-

"Probably, more laws would not have prevented the Sago or Kentucky Darby disasters," he added.

Both Caylor and Potter said government inspectors visiting mines should observe and train more — and police less. They said inspectors typically enter mines looking for violations, but don't spend enough time with miners to ensure that the mine is functioning properly --and not covering anything up during routine inspections.

Napier, who spent half of his career as a mine foreman, added that the short visits allow mines to clean up their act for inspectors and resume their flawed ways afterward.

"When the inspection was over." Napier said of some of the mines he worked for, "they went back to the way it was."

However, other experts, like Bruce Watzman, disagree, saying inspectors do help coal operators and workers.

"When inspectors are underground, they're with the miners," said Watzman, vice president for health and safety for the National Mining Association, which influenced the federal legislation. He added, "It's not like they go down there in a vacuum.'

Watzman said the new laws will make a difference in saving miners, though he added the federal legislation has room for improvement. He said what's missing is provisions to ensure that inspectors spend more time evaluating the most potentially hazardous areas of the mines and mandate random drug testing of all mine employees.

As he prepared for another shift underground, Turner said he has faith in all the new laws

Near bottom once again

Yet again, Kentucky is near the bottom, in 42nd place, in the latest Kids Count survey, the Annie E. Casey Foundation's state-by-state assessment of children's well being.

The rankings are based on 10 key indicators, such as infant mortality, teen pregnancies, and high school dropouts. Despite Kentucky's dismal showing overall, there were a few bright spots. Its teen death rate and the number of 15- to 19-year-olds having babies each fell between 2000 and 2003, and so did its rate of infant mortality.

However, the number of Kentuckians 18 and younger, living in poverty rose to 25 percent in 2004, dropping Kentucky to 46th among the states from 43rd in the 2000 rankings.

Meanwhile, the percentage of children living in families with no parent having secure employment rose from 34 percent in 2000 to 38 percent in the survey. And on top of that, Kentucky is one of just nine states that made no improvement in its dropout rate.


"What you don't want is a state that's not moving on dropouts," said Terry Brooks, executive director of Kentucky Youth Advocates. "If we don't tackle that problem, we've invented the next decade of economic problems."

Intergenerational poverty is, unfortunately, deeply rooted in Kentucky culture. Many of the state's poorest remain firmly planted not only where they were born and reared, but also in the same circumstances.

Better-funded social programs are, of course, part of the answer.

²¹ But as Mr. Brooks said, "Santa Claus doesn't have to dome to town to help poor families." One of Kentucky's biggest problems is its failure to maximize existing resources. He lamented, for example, that there's not better cooperation and more collaboration between state welfare officials and others engaged in work force development.

These latest results emphasize how poorly the state is served by the political games and wedge-issue politics that now dominate Frankfort. Voters must insist that their leaders produce agendas for progress, not more excuses for the status quo.

Pulling out of Iraq

The Texas outlaw John Wesley Hardin once famously said that he never killed anyone who didn't need

killing. Hardin's definition of who needed killing was considerably too liberal. But if there ever were anyone who unquestionably exhibited such a need, it was the late Abu Musab al-

Zarqawi, Iraq's maestro of vileness and death.

Zarqawi took the death cult that surrounds suicide bombing and pushed it to its hellish logical conclusion. pool of blood and a few scattered shoes, with loved ones wailing in the background.

His tactical goal was more death. He wanted to provoke the Shiite into acts as cruel as his own, and unfortunately had achieved some success. The vengeful Shiite militia members plying the streets of Baghdad to tor-

ture Sunni men before dumping their bodies in the street are Zarqawi's progeny. He gleefully pointed to their murderous work as justification for even more killing by Sunnis, toward a full-scale civil war making Iraq an Arab Rwanda

choking on its own blood.

The word for this vision is "evil." It has become fashionable to regret President Bush's black-and-white, good-and-evil view of the world. But sometimes the ledger is indee quite simple - with Zarqawi's demise, the sum total of evil in the world is now a little less. Everyone professes to know this. But some know it more than others. Otherwise a major Democrat like John Kerry wouldn't be advocating a full U.S. pullout from Iraq. Until Iraqi forces can carry the load, a pullout means abandoning the field to the likes of Zarqawi. If Kerry had been given a magic wand to wave

and make all U.S. troops disappear from Iraq instantly. Zarqawi would almost certainly be alive right now. There would have been no one to send F-16s to drop two 500-pound bombs on his head.

Within hours of the news breaking of Zarqawi's death, Rep. John Murtha was on CNN saying we should leave Iraq and let the Iraqis work out their civil war just the way we worked out ours. Of course, 600,000 died in our Civil War. And the Iraqis "working it out" would be accomplished with truck bombs and ethnic cleansing.

Humanitarian considerations aside, the stakes in Iraq are incalculably large. If many politicians in the U.S. have never realized this, Zarqawi always did. He knew the advent of decent government in the Arab world would be a blow to the ideology of terror, hence his ultimate strategic goal of forestalling it with mayhem and slaughter. We don't know if we will prevail in Iraq, but there is no doubt about how to lose: pull out prematurely. That's why erry, Murtha, et al., are effective advocates of defeat. From beyond the grave, Zarqawi can only wish that the Democrats for a pullout had been able to effect their preferred policy. Then this loathsome man who so needed killing would instead still be working his evil will.

-guest column Congress may yet have to raise the minimum wage

It's a quiet war against America's working poor: Refuse to raise the minimum wage for a decade and watch rising prices eat away at the living standards of millions. That is what the United States Congress has done, and the minimum wage today buys less than it did before the last increase in 1997. In fact, it buys less than it did 50 years ago — a shameful new milestone in our country's long march toward Third World levels of inequality.

At \$5.15 an hour, today's minimum wage won't even buy two gallons of gas. At \$10,300 a year for a full-time worker, it's not even close to the meager poverty threshold of \$13,000 for a single parent with one child.

But some 7.7 million workers are today working at minimum wage, or close enough that they would benefit from an increase. On average, they are contributing about two-thirds of their family income. The majority are over 25 years old, and only 30 percent are teenagers. So much for the stereotype of minimum wage workers as high-school kids who live with their parents.

It was just over 10 years ago, in May 1996, that the U.S. House of Representatives passed the last increase in the federal minimum wage, from \$4.25 to \$5.15 an hour; it finally became law in August of that year. It was a hard-fought victory for the Democrats in a Republican-controlled Congress. Sen. Ted Kennedy (D-MA) had to force a vote in the Senate by threatening to attach the wage increase to every piece of legislation in that chamber. But interestingly, when the vote came to the floor, it passed the Senate 74-24. Similarly, in the House, it passed by a vote of 281-144, despite the Republican majority.

Then, as now, more than 80 percent of the public favored the increase. Many Republicans didn't want to be on the wrong side of that issue in an election year.

Now Sen. Kennedy is back, with proposed legislation that would increase the federal minimum wage to \$7.25 per hour over the next 26 months. And last month, Republicans on the House Appropriations Committee bucked their leadership and approved the increase.

The increase to \$7.25 isn't enough. In terms of its real purchasing power, it wouldn't bring the minimum wage to its level of 1968. When one considers that productivity (output per worker) has more than doubled since then, it's hard to justify anyone working for less than what was paid nearly four decades ago. But \$7.25 is at least a step in the right direction.

The loss of real income at the bottom of the wage ladder is part of a broader long-term trend that ought to be the dominant theme in any national election: the failure of the majority of American employees to share in the gains from economic growth. Over the last 30 years, the median wage has grown by about 9

percent, while productivity has increased by more than 80 percent. This is a sharp break with the past, when wages tended to grow with productivity, allowing for broadly shared prosperity.


To make things even worse, we have had a series of tax breaks in recent years — for example on stock dividends and capital gains — that are targeted toward upper income groups.

The minimum wage increase will buck this ugly trend toward increasing polarization of income and wealth, and it is hard to argue against. But the Right will haul out its usual posture, dating back to the 18th century, that such legislation will only hurt the people it is proposing to help, by making labor unaffordable, and thereby reducing overall employment. But the mainstream of the economics profession has rejected this argument on the basis of empirical research. Why should anyone else believe it?

And, while minimum wage workers have been losing ground to inflation, members of Congress have been hiking their own salaries, now at \$165,200 per year. A House vote recently paved the way for another cost-of-living increase worth thousands of dollars annually. Congressional elections are about five months away. If Republicans in Congress want to block the minimum wage increase while raising their own pay, they could be playing with fire.

Car needs a warm-up to get out of park

by TOM and RAY MAGLIOZZI

Dear Tom and Ray:

I picked up a repo'd 2000 Kia Sephia last fall. It's in great shape. The only problem I have with the car is that whenever it gets bitter cold --

which it does a lot where I live, in Montana - it will not shift from park to drive until it warms up! One cold morning last winter, I sat in the driveway waiting for 10 minutes. Otherwise, it runs great. Can anything be done before next winter to reduce the time it needs to shift in the cold? -

Scott RAY: Yes. Build a heated garage.

TOM: There are several possibilities, Scott. But the first

thing I'd check is the shift interlock. RAY: This car, like every car these days, has a switch that prevents you from shifting out of park unless your foot is on the brake.

TOM: That's to prevent you from stepping on the gas by accident, and then putting the car in gear and accel-

erating straight into the nearest moose. RAY: It's possible that the shift interlock is out of adjustment, or the solenoid is being lazy in the extreme

cold. That happens to my brother. TOM: Only when the temperature drops below 95!

> RAY: If it's the shift interlock, you don't even have to fix it. You have a bypass button that allows you to shift out of park just in case the shift interlock fails. I don't remember where it is on the 2000 Kia Sephia, but it's usually on or near the shifter. Your owner's manual will tell you where it is and how to use it. TOM: If using the

bypass allows you to move the shifter when it's otherwise

stuck, then you know the shift interlock is the problem. And you can either get it fixed or just keep using the bypass.

RAY: And if that's not it, you can use the remaining months before next winter to look for work in Arizona, Scott.

Tom and Ray discuss ethanol Dear Tom and Ray:

I've always wondered about ethanol. Seems too good to be true -you just plant some corn, harvest it, and in no time you have fuel for your car. So I Googled ethanol on the Web. There are tons of Web sites extolling the great benefits of corn-based ethanol as a fuel. Then I found one, healthandenergy.com, that made the opposite case. You guys went to MIT. Am I missing something? The report on this site says that 131,000 BTUs are needed to make one gallon of ethanol, but each gallon of ethanol only produces 77,000 BTUs. That means we're losing 54,000 BTUs for every gallon we produce. Just wondered if you guys have an opinion. Best regards. - Charlie

TOM: Yes. But, as usual, it's not an informed one.

RAY: This issue is not only very controversial, it's also ripe for all kinds of obfuscation from various interested parties.

TOM: Right. I mean, if guys with degrees in chemical engineering can't agree on the answer, how the heck are we supposed to know who's telling the truth?

RAY: Wait a minute. You DO have a degree in chemical engineering.

TOM: Yeah. But to understand this issue, I'd have to actually READ all

those papers! That would cut into my nap time.

RAY: All right. Well, from what we can tell, the basic issue is this: When you calculate how much energy it takes to produce a gallon of ethanol, you have to make certain decisions. Everybody agrees that you need to include the energy needed to plant the corn, water it, harvest it and convert the starch to alcohol. But, for instance, do you include the energy needed to manufacture the tractors that plow the fields? Scientists disagree about that.

TOM: They also disagree about the other side of the equation. The guy whose study you refer to, David Pimentel of Cornell University, is very well regarded, and has been studying this issue for years. He adds up his calculation of the amount of energy needed to grow the corn and then subtracts the amount of energy you get from a gallon of ethanol, and gets a negative number

RAY: But there are other credible researchers, like David Lorenz and David Morris of the Institute for Local Self-Reliance, who take Pimentel's research and say yes, BUT, a gallon of ethanol isn't the only thing you get from that corn you grow. You also get stuff like corn oil and gluten feed. So, some of the energy that goes into growing the corn has to be assigned to those other corn byproducts, too.

When they do the numbers, the energy ratio of ethanol comes out positive.

TOM: So, the answer is not clear. What everybody does agree on is that ethanol made from plants with morecellulose, like switchgrass or sugar cane, will produce more ethanol per acre than corn will. And that will improve the case for ethanol - no matter what your starting point.

RAY: People also agree that using ethanol that we grow at home reduces the amount of foreign oil we need, which may eventually mean we don't have to spend billions to send our kids to guard oil fields overseas. So, there's a national security issue here in addition to a scientific one.

TOM: And then there are other questions. Like, how much of this ethanol blitz is a big, wet, government-subsidized kiss to big agri-business and corn growers? Is it ethical to use food to fuel our cars when people are going hungry? And if I'm using the stuff in my Grand Cherokee, will the price of a corn dog go through the roof?

RAY: We don't have the answers, Charlie. But we're eager to see some more light shed on the subject. And we're eager to move beyond corn to more efficient plant-based ethanol and see what kind of scale that could achieve. Meanwhile, pass the butter, will ya?

The cemetery workers picked up their shovels after the Barbados Sanitation Service Authority pledged that boots had been ordered for all workers.

During Tuesday's walkout, friends and family of an 83year-old woman had to cover her grave with soil during (morning service at the cemetery.



FRANKFORT – It's simple. There's roughly 5,700 elk, but only 200 hunting permits. The deadline to enter for this year's Elk Hunt Drawing is July 31. The cost to apply is \$10.

Drawn licensed hunters who live in Kentucky will be required to pay another \$25 for a permit to hunt.

Non-Kentucky residents will pay \$300 if drawn.

The permits are available online at fw.ky.gov. Permits may also be obtained in person at any license dealer, or by calling 1-877-598-2401.

The Kentucky Fish and Wildlife Commission has voted to allow handgun hunting for elk beginning this season. The new regulation will allow elk hunting with any handgun with a barrel at least 6 inches long, and firing a cartridge capable maintaining at least 500 footpounds of energy at 100 yards with a bullet diameter of .270 or greater. For pistols, this will include some.41-caliber handguns, and handguns equal or more powerful than the .44-caliber magnum.



Reid was signed as a develoment driver for Hendrick in 304. He shared seat time in le Hendrick Busch Series, nd kept busy with the USAC ilver Crown Series and RCA events. But the future at endrick changed quickly hen Ricky Hendrick died in ctober 2004 in a plane crash a route to Martinsville, Va.

"The developmental pro-

gram got put on the back burner, and for good reason," Reid said. "They had to focus on getting their drivers in the Chase."

Reid competed in seven Busch races for Hendrick, finishing a best of 17th at Nashville.

"It was the chemistry I noticed. I mean it was instant, you could tell they could get along," Woodard said.

At 24, Nelson said there are to make the calls on the truck and get it prepared to be successful on the track.

"It's working. We keep going faster and faster, but there are weekends we just struggle," Nelson said. "There are weekends you wish you were 45 years old."

The team has been in the top 20 each week, posting a season-best 14th at Mansfield, Ohio.

"It's not going to happen overnight. I was at Hendrick Motorsports and it didn't happen overnight," Reid said.

Woodard is patient with Nelson and Reid, and is eager to see how the team does when it returns to tracks for a second time. Then there will be few

excuses for not improving performances.

"I'm a competitive guy," Woodard said.

Reid said the veteran drivers in the truck series have helped him along the way in his first season, including points leader Todd Bodine.

Bodine said the rookie has the tools and the personality to have success. The veteran of every level of NASCAR said Reid takes instruction and criticism well.

"He's one of the kids who's really got a good head on his shoulders to start with. That's hard to find," Bodine said. "A lot of these kids have the ability to go fast, but they don't think."

Bodine said he gained new respect for the rookie after Mansfield, when the two raced for position for about 20 laps.

"He came over after the race and thanked me for racing him clean," Bodine said. "He knows his position in the sport and he's just trying to get to a better position. I'll help him all I can now."

Nelson has a few headaches each weekend, which he attributes to trying to figure ways to make Reid's truck faster.

"Maybe I'm not the smartest guy in the garage right now, but at 27, 28 years old, I will have four years of experience when other guys are still mechanics," Nelson said. "It may not be the best decision right now, but it's the path I want to go."

Shot put and discus throwing sector goes into effect in 2006-07

INDIANAPOLIS - Effective with the 2006-07 high school track and field season, the throwing sector of 34.92 degrees is now required for the shot put and discus events. In addition to this change that was approved last year for implementation in 2006-07, seven rules revisions were approved by the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) Track and Field Rules Committee at its June 11-12 meeting in Indianapolis. These rules changes subsequently were approved by the NFHS Board of Directors.

The rules committee determined at its 2005 meeting that the throwing sector of 34.92 degrees would be required for the 2006-07 season," said Mike Colbrese, executive director of the Washington Interscholastic Activities Association and chairperson of the NFHS Track and Field Rules Committee. "This year's committee developed optional guidelines for the discus cage. Those guidelines are now found in the appendix reference."

In another change, Rule 7-5-12 states that the runway adjacent to the pole vault box may be marked with a permanent 1-centimeter or one halfinch line drawn through the top of the vault box (zero point) and extended 10 feet on each side. This will allow the host school to have a visible aid for proper placement of the landing pad, which will speed up the process when a last-minute change has to be made due to inclement weather.

"When there are prevailing winds, the host school would like to have the option of turning the pit in the opposite direction, and allowing for the line to be marked would aid in that process," Colbrese said.

Rule 9-6-5 was amended to stipulate that a competitor shall wear the assigned unaltered number when numbers are provided and computer chip(s) when those devices are used in competition.

"This addition makes it clear that when assigned for use, competitors shall wear the computer chips as assigned without altering or else be disqualified," said Becky Oakes, NFHS assistant director and liaison to the NFHS Track and Field Rules Committee.

The "set" starting command was eliminated for races or opening legs of relays of 600 meters or more indoors. Runners now will be expected to be set when instructed "On your marks."

The standard scoring system for the decathlon, pentathlon and heptathlon shall be the point scale established by the IAAF (International Association of Athletics Federations), unless the state association determines otherwise.

"The rule permits these special events to be conducted, but did not specify how to score," Oakes said. "This note to Rule 8 clarifies use of a standard scoring system unless determined otherwise by the state association.

Several rules changes will impact athletes' apparel and were adopted for clarify. Rule 3-2-4(o) states that games committees may restrict the wearing of items worn in excess of the school uniform, such as headwear. Rule 4-3-1b(5) and 9-6-1b(6) state that an American flag patch, not to exceed 2 by 3 inches, and either a commemorative or memorial patch, not to exceed 4 square inches, may be worn on the uniform top or bottom. Rule 4-3-1c now states that only a single manufacturer's logo/trademark/ reference, no more than 21/4 square inches with no dimension more than 21/4 inches, is permitted on the uniform bottom when a two-piece uniform is worn.

Track and field is the third-most popular sport among boys and the second-most popular sport among girls at the high school level with 944,901 combined participants during the 2004-05 season, according to the High School Athletics Participation Survey conducted by the NFHS. It also ranks second in school sponsorship for both boys and girls.

Softball right-of-way rules go into effect next season

INDIANAPOLIS - Effective with the 2007 high school softball season, new rules will dictate who has the right-of-way between a base runner and a fielder on a non-controlled batted ball. These rules revisions were approved by the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) Softball Rules Committee at its June 18-19 meeting in Indianapolis, and then were subsequently approved by the NFHS Board of Directors.

"A player legally running the bases has full responsibility to avoid contact with a fielder who is attempting to make an initial play on a batted ball," said Ralph Swearngin, executive director of the Georgia High School

Association and chairperson of the NFHS Softball Rules Committee. "However, after a fielder has had an opportunity to make an initial play on a batted ball, the responsibility for contact changes. Once a fielder, excluding the pitcher, misplays a batted ball, that fielder should not be protected and, therefore, should not be permitted to obstruct the advancement of a runner.'

A revised definition of interference states that a fielder is considered to be making an initial play on a fair batted ball when she has a reasonable chance to catch or gain control of the ball that no other fielder, except the pitcher, has touched. The fielder is still considered to be making an initial play if she fails to gain control of the batted ball, but is within a "step and reach"

of the ball. This rule clarifies that the runner is charged with interference if she makes contact while the fielder is attempting to make the initial play on a fair batted ball.

In another change, Rule 3-6-17 expands the penalty when a player removes any lines of the batter's box or on the field of play. A team warning will be issued, with the next offense resulting in a strike for the offense or a ball for the defense. The change now restricts any subsequent offender to the dugout along with the head coach.

In addition to these two rules changes, the committee approved six major editorial changes. New Rule 2-15 clearly defines the confines of the field of play as the designated dugout/bench area and any enclosed

or marked area designated as a warmup area that is adjacent to the field and within view of the umpire(s).

This rule identifies an area that has been left to umpire or site-by-site discretion," said Mary Struckhoff, NFHS assistant director and liaison to the NFHS Softball Rules Committee.

Malicious contact penalties will be clarified with additions made to Rule 3-6-18, which now states that if malicious contact is made by the offense, the play is dead immediately and the offender is declared out, unless she has already scored. If the defense is responsible for the malicious contact, the offender is ejected at the end of playing action.

For state associations that have chosen to utilize a double first base, Rule 8-10 will now provide more detailed information.

"With more states permitting the use of a double first base, we thought it necessary to make some additions to clarify which player uses the white and colored portions of the base," Struckhoff said.

The committee also identified Points of Emphasis for the 2007 season. Among those are concussions, batter delays, obstruction and interference, and inspection of equipment by umpires.



Mixed blessing: Where there are blackberries, there are chiggers

PADUCAH - Like bacon and eggs, some things just seem to go ogether.

So it is with blackberries and chiggers, an interwoven duo that's good news and bad in a package deal.

Blackberries are the familiar fruits of several species of Rubus genus plants that grow as upright and spreading canes. The canes produce leaves and spring flowers, followed by some of the sweetest natural fruits in our wild environment.

Blackberry plants are some of the first to "volunteer" in open or cleared ground, canes reaching several feet in the few months of a single growing season. A blackberry cane produces fruit in its second year, then dies, newer canes carrying on with production.

The most apparent feature of the

blackberry plant is that it bristles with needle-sharp thorns that grab at the clothing of human pedestrians, bogging them down and readily piercing tender skin.

The canes are generally avoided because of their painful "sticker" characteristics - except right about now and into midsummer as their berries ripen. They yield delicious fruit, long famous as prime ingredients in cobblers and other desserts, and they are quite desirable for eating berries alone.

The berries turn glossy black when ripe. When "green," they're an attractive red.

Humans have no exclusive favor for blackberries. The fruits of the thorny canes are an important seasonal food for most species of Kentucky wildlife. Many varieties of songbirds, wild turkey and quail eat them. So do raccoons, opossums, coyotes, foxes,

voles. The deer, for one species, likes them ripe, green - red, that is - or past their prime in a dried condition.

Despite the thorns, the plants themselves are important to wildlife. Deer eat the leaves and rabbits nibble the canes. Several songbirds are attracted to the canes for nesting habitat, and numerous birds, rabbits and small rodents use the prickly thickets as escape cover.

In early to middle July, people often turn to wild thickets for gathering berries to eat fresh or to freeze. Just after these gathering sessions is when they often note the itchy red welts on their skin that represent the handiwork of chiggers.

Chiggers, the larva of harvest mites, are red-orange, six-legged arachnids that you've probably never seen. That's because it would take roughly 120 of them marching along

squirrels, box turtles, deer, mice and in a tight nose-to-rump formation to make an inch-long column. They are so small as to be invisible to the human eye.

Adult harvest mites don't do this, but chiggers are parasites that feed, when given the opportunity, on humans and other animals. The chigger doesn't suck blood, but it crawls on a host, finds its way to a hair follicle or pore, then jabs a cutting mouthpart into the skin. From there it injects a sort of saliva that digests and liquefies tissue, then sucks it up. The chigger itself doesn't bury into the skin

Chigger "bites" on people show up as red, itchy bumps that are the leftover result of the digestive juice injected into the skin. By the time people start scratching chigger welts, the tiny animal itself already may have dropped off, full and satisfied.

Human hosts of chiggers often use

a folk remedy of painting welts with nail polish to "smother" the chiggers, which likely already have departed. The nail polish, indeed, may give some relief from itching by keeping air from the welts. Over-the-counter ointments with antihistamines or topical anesthetics may provide more relief from the torment.

Chiggers seem inseparable from blackberries, although they could be as prevalent on growth around blackberry canes as on the canes themselves. Weedy habitat is generally effective in giving chiggers access to human pickers.

For berry picking or any other activity in tall grasses, weeds and brush, the best recommendation for blocking chiggers is a combination of a permethrine-based repellent sprayed thoroughly on one's clothing, and an application of a DEET-based insect repellent on exposed skin.

Hatchery surplus produces stocking bonanza for Ohio River

FRANKFORT - Minor Clark Fish Hatchery just downstream of Cave Run Lake Dam produced excess numbers of hybrid striped bass this year. The Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources stocked these excess fish in the Ohio and Kentucky Rivers and should provide excellent fishing in the coming years on the two rivers.

"Our hatcheries did a tremendous job producing hybrid striped bass this year," said Gerry Buynak, assistant director of fisheries for Kentucky Fish and Wildlife. Fisheries officials requested 150,000 hybrid striped bass for stocking in the Ohio River. The hatchery produced over 479,000.

"The Ohio River looks fantastic this spring," said Doug Henley, Ohio River fisheries biologist for Kentucky Fish and Wildlife. "We had such a great year spawning last year on the river for all species, but especially forage fish such as emerald shiners and shad. We should have

another year like that this year. We had three feet of visibility earlier this spring, which is phenomenal for the Ohio River.'

The fisheries division of Kentucky Fish and Wildlife originally planned to stock 30,000 hybrid striped bass in the Markland pool of the Ohio River, but the surplus allowed them to stock 112,000. They planned to stock 12,000 hybrid striped bass in the McApline pool of the river, but stocked 60,000.

Fisheries officials slated 24,000

hybrid striped bass for stocking in the Cannelton pool of the Ohio River, but stocked 88,500. The Uniontown pool of the river received twice as many hybrid striped bass as originally planned and the Smithland pool was to receive 15,000, but got 71,000.

The hatchery produced so many hybrid striped bass that biologists were able to stock two extra pools of the Kentucky River. "This is the first year we stocked that many pools of the Kentucky River with hybrid striped bass," Buynak explained. "We

originally planned to stock pools four through nine, but we had extra fish so we also stocked pools two and three."

The Kentucky River would have received 20,000 hybrid striped bass, but fisheries biologists and technicians stocked 34,000.

"It was a very good year," Buynak said. "If these rivers continue to look this good and our survival is good, watch out. The fishing should be phenomenal in a few years for hybrids on both of these rivers.'

Stewart exhibit unveiled at IMS Hall of Fame

INDIANAPOLIS - Hoosier hero Tony Stewart received more accolades and one-of-a-kind awards for winning the 2005 Allstate 400 at the Brickyard during a public ceremony and media event Wednesday at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway Hall of Fame Museum.

Stewart, a native and resident of nearby Columbus, Ind., accepted his race winner's ring from IMS President and Chief Operating Officer Joie Chitwood. Stewart will try to earn a repeat victory in the 13th Allstate 400 at the Brickyard Aug. 6.

Stewart, a two-time Cup champi-

on, also helped unveil a piece of artwork by noted motorsports artist Sam Bass that Bass has donated to the Hall of Fame Museum.

The artwork on display at the museum is a one-of-a-kind color reproduction of an original painting that The Home Depot commissioned Bass to create for Stewart.

The art commemorates post-race events from Stewart's long-sought, emotional victory at the Allstate 400 at the Brickyard: Stewart kissing the famous "Yard of Bricks," climbing the Speedway's catch fence, his No. 20 Chevrolet crossing the finish line and a headshot of Stewart.

Stewart's 2005 win at IMS in the No. 20 Chevrolet was one of the most emotional moments in Indianapolis Motor Speedway history and among the highlights of the 2005 season in which he won his second NASCAR Cup Series championship. His first season title came in 2002.

Stewart also officially opened an exhibit at the Hall of Fame Museum featuring five cars, scheduled to be on display until June 2007, that played a significant role in Stewart's rise from Indiana short-track racer to motorsports superstar.

"It's just a huge honor," Stewart said. "To have visited that museum so many times and seen so many pieces of history, and to have that exhibit dedicated to me is an honor. I don't know how else to put it.

There have been a lot of winners [at IMS], and they've never had an exhibit like this, so it basically makes me speechless. It's cool to see all these cars and see them all together again for the first time in a long time. It brings back a lot of cool memories of good times in my career. To see those cars sitting next to the cars of A.J. Foyt and so many other great winners is incredible."

The cars driven by Stewart that are on display are:

· The 1995 USAC Midget and Sprint championship-winning cars that carried Stewart to USAC's "Triple Crown." In 1995, Stewart became the first driver to win USAC's three national championships (Silver Crown, Sprint and Midget series) in the same year.

The Midget car is the No. 9 Performance Racing Industry Beast/Gaerte owned by Steve Lewis at the time, and the Sprint car is the Glen Niebel-owned No. 20 Boles Chevrolet. The Niebel Silver Crown series car will be added to the display in about a month.

· Stewart's No. 22 The Home Depot Dallara/Oldsmobile/Firestone IRL IndyCar® Series car and the No. 20 The Home Depot Pontiac that he drove at the 1999 Indianapolis 500

and Coca-Cola 600 on the same day. Stewart became part of an elite group that year, becoming only the third driver after John Andretti and Robby Gordon to race "the double," competing in both prestigious races the same day.

. The No. 20 The Home Depot Chevrolet in which Stewart won the 2005 Allstate 400 at the Brickyard.

A sampling of Stewart's driver's suits, helmets and other memorabilia are also on display, including:

· Driver's suit and helmet from the 1995 USAC Triple Crown season.

· Driver's suit and helmet, promoting the motion picture Shrek2. which Stewart wore at the Nextel All-Star Challenge in 2004 at Lowe's Motor Speedway.

All the cars, driver's suits and helmets are part of Stewart's personal collection, generously loaned by him to the Hall of Fame Museum.

Two Busch crew chiefs suspended for six weeks

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. NASCAR announced Thursday penalties and fines that have been issued among six Busch Series teams as a result of rule violations at Daytona International Speedway.

Shane Wilson, crew chief for the No. 21 Chevrolet driven by Kevin Harvick, was fined \$15,000 and suspended from NASCAR for the next six events beginning with the July 8 race at Chicagoland Speedway for violating Section 12-4-A (actions detrimental to stock car racing) and

12-4-Q (car, car parts, components and/or equipment used that do not conform to NASCAR rules; Section 20A-2.1E: unapproved modifications in trunk area to enhance aerodynamic performance; Section 20A-3.9F: deck lid must retain stock shape and contours; lower read edge bent to allow air to escape and Section 20A-16.3G: shock absorber access doors missing). The violations were discovered during post-qualifying inspection on June 30.

Additionally, Harvick will lose 50 Busch Series driver points and team owner Richard Childress will forfeit 50 Busch Series owner points.

Also, Gene Nead, the crew chief for the No. 77 Chevrolet driven by Burney Lamar, was fined \$15,000 and suspended from the next six events starting with the Chicago race for violating Sections 12-4-A and 12-4-Q (Section 20A-12.3J: unapproved shock absorber components; base valves are not permitted). The infraction was found during post-race inspection on June 30.

As a result, Lamar will lose 50 Busch Series driver points while team owner DeLana Harvick was also penalized with the loss of 50 Busch Series owner points due to the infrac-

Four other crew chiefs were fined due to violations at Davtona, Mark Durgin, crew chief of the No. 43 Chevrolet driven by P.J. Jones and Dave Fuge Jr., crew chief for the No. 34 driven by Paul Tracy, were each fined \$5,000 for violating 12-4-A and 12-4-Q. During pre-qualifying inspection on June 30, the No. 43 was found to have unapproved modification to the approved air filter housing while the No. 34 was discovered to have unapproved air directional devices inside the air filter housing.

Also, Rick Gay, crew chief for the

No. 10 Ford driven by John Andretti, was fined \$2,500 violation of Sections 12-4-A and 12-4-Q (Section 20A-2.1E: vent near the "A" post modified to enhance aerodynamic performance) and Marc Reno, crew chief for the No 1. Dodge driven by Mike Wallace, was also fined \$2,000 for violating 12-4-A and 12-4-Q (Section 20A-16.4.2A: fuel cell vent tube exceeded the maximum use). The No. 10 violation was discovered during pre-qualifying inspection while the No. 1 violation was found during opening day inspection on June 28.

"The team has already won a race this year [with Kyle Busch in the No. 51] and hopefully we can get another win in the next couple of races.

I've also known Billy since he was first getting into truck racing. We always talked about teaming up together and now we've got the chance. I hope to make good things happen from this opportunity."
