MAKE IT REAL

Next week is Clean-Up Week in Prestonsburg. Every resident of Prestonsburg should join in the move. Ashland, a city of our own mountains, holds the proud title of "Cleaneest City in America." Ashland has achieved such fame by practicing consistently the doctrine of "Clean Up, Paint Up."

There is, however, little to be gained in making of Clean-Up Week nothing more than Mowing Week. Last year, Eriend street caught the dirt and trash of other parts of Prestonsburg.

The Times is not knocking the idea of Clean-Up Week. It trusts that citizens here will take a greater interest in the move than ever before. But it would suggest that at least an attempt be made toward making the move city-wide in the future by moving debris outside the town—an arrangement which will be carried out, it is said.

And, for the good of the entire town, we would further suggest that something be done about the open sewers which clutter the Broadway and Friend street section of town, as well as the removal of the dump heap from the natural drain back of Friend street. The town as a whole may look clean but its smell will belie its appearance so long as these exist.

ALIVE, DEAD OR DYING?

The Whitesburg Eagle recently started an interesting discussion when it asked, "Is Whitesburg Dead or Alive?" Various readers have contributed articles to The Eagle's columns, some averring that the old town is very much alive, while others contend that it is in a bad way.

Whitesburg or any other town will have its times of industrial depression, its unsavory elements which suck, leech-like, at the lifeblood of the community. But the town will not die so long as its citizens are alive.

This is not to say that the mere state of breathing on the part of the town's inhabitants will keep the town alive. WHEN HOG PRICES ARE HI JEST

Do you sell your hogs when prices are at their peak, or simply sell with these low prices and then they are ready to sell? This is a question a farmer asks when he watches the market for his hogs. The price of hogs has been dropping steadily since the middle of the year, and it is not likely that it will ever reach the peak of the year. BAR THE DANGEROUS DRIVER

During 1929, 22,000 people were killed in automobile accidents, according with 1,215 in 1929, according to the Traffic Builders Insurance Company. During 1929, 12,000,000 gallons of gasoline were consumed, as compared with almost 14,000,000 in 1928.

In other words, an automobile kills in the road over four per cent more of people in an average car than of people decreased at one per cent. The only possible conclusion that each year the highways grow more dangerous.

This may be due to a multitude of causes. Car speeds are increasing and in many instances highways are inadequate for modern, congested, fast moving traffic. Of greater importance, there are unacceptably thousands of people now operating cars who are being mechanically or physically unfit.

In states which have adopted strict examination laws for drivers, licensees have been refused by an appreciable percentage of applicants. As a result, the accident rate in those states has usually gone down while increasing in states where licensees are issued to all who wish them. The overwhelming percentage of drivers are reasonably careful and competent. The small percentage who are unscrupulous, reckless and incompetent cause so many deaths, and are a constant menace to lives and property of all who drive.

Every state should take steps to make certain that every possessor of a driving license is really a fit driver on public highways.
