These rates are those submitted to and approved by the Council of the City of Prestonsburg. The rates in detail, with a brief description of their application follow:

RESIDENTIAL RATE

Tariff B. R. is available for full residential service, which includes residence lighting, refrigerators, ranges, irons, washers, radios, and any other use to which electric service may be put in the home. It is restricted entirely to domestic use and requires only one meter per residence.

TARIFF B. R.

(Base Rate—Full Residential Electric Service)

AVAILABILITY OF SERVICE

Available for full residential electric service.

RATE

Monthly customer charge of fifty cents per meter plus an energy charge as follows:

7 cents per Kwhr. for the first 30 Kwhrs. used in any month.
4 cents per Kwhr. for the next 50 Kwhrs. used in same month.
3 cents per Kwhr. for the next 270 Kwhrs. used in same month.
2.5 cents per Kwhr. for all over 350 Kwhrs. used in same month.

MINIMUM CHARGE

The above tariff is subject to a minimum monthly bill of one dollar (\$1.00) for each meter installed.

DELAYED PAYMENT CHARGE

The above tariff is net if account is paid in full within ten (10) days of date of bill. On all accounts not so paid, an additional charge of 5 percent of the amount billed (but not less than \$0.10) will be made.

JOHN MARSHALL RANKED AS AMERICA'S GREATEST JURIST

John Marshall's name must be linked with that of George Washington, even though the great jurist's most important services to his country were contributed after the death of the first president. This is the opinion of the United States George Washington Bicentennial Commission, which recognizes the achievement of a great Marshall, America's foremost jurist, and one of the leading jurists the world has ever produced, on the one hundred and seventy-sixth anniversary of his birth. John Marshall was a nephew of General Washington in the Revolutionary War. John Marshall was Washington's most famous disciple in the theory that a nation which is to exist must be strong in spirit, first and last. John Marshall wrote the first American biography of George Washington.

This majority his thoughts were taken up with the impending crisis, which was soon to bring the colonies into an "eighty-year" struggle with the Mother Country. In the summer of 1775, a regiment of Minutemen was raised in Culpeper, Orange and Frontier counties. Thomas Marshall was the major of this regiment, and his son, John, not quite 20 years of age, was a lieutenant. On their own hunting shirts, the mothers' dresses of these volunteers had inscribed the motto, "Liberty or Death." Their banner pictured a coiled rattlesnake with the words "No Tax Without Consent." A green, untrained, poorly equipped regiment, with hunting rifles, knives and even tomahawks for weapons, the men nevertheless evidenced a determination which was to prove irresistible.

John Marshall served at Brandywine, Germantown, Valley Forge, Pa., the Loch and Stony Point, and was one of the most popular men in the army. His robust ability, his geniality and kindness won the affection of all. In the war drew to a close, Marshall's name was mentioned with honor. The loss of the British general's army, 1781, was a disaster of American honor.

one of the leading lawyers in the state of Virginia. When the Old Dominion gave called a special convention, in 1788, for the purpose of ratifying or rejecting the new federal constitution, Marshall played an important part in the proceedings. There was a great deal of opposition to the new instrument of government, and the objections were led by some other than the famous orator, Patrick Henry. It required a great deal of patience, reason and skill to batter down the arguments of Henry and his followers, but the ratification, with James Madison and John Marshall at the helm, were able to accomplish this. Many years later, in 1797, President John Adams appointed Marshall, with Charles Catesbaugh Phinckes and Elbridge Gerry, on a special mission to France.

"We were having difficulties with our former ally. The French Directory was unadvisedly corrupt at this time; the three domains were made for a huge debt from America, before recognition would even be considered. Marshall and Pinckney left to lead in this fashion and left France. The loss of the mission, this setback, and the family were prevented. All of Mrs. Mayo's children with the exception of Miss M. W. Curran, the youngest, attended. Together with the plebeian United States supreme court. Before this time the court was not held in high repute. It did not possess the dignity and power which it exercises today. But after Marshall took the reins the situation changed. Because of his marvelous power of analysis and logic, John Marshall became a leader of the supreme court in spirit, as well as in name.

No man did more to centralize the government; no man did more to improve the constitution, and to establish the right of the judiciary to declare federal and state acts unconstitutional. The forty-four decisions rendered by the chief justice are his living monument, still as potent today when he delivered them. During the first few years of office as chief justice, Marshall with the assistance of Bushrod Washington, wrote the biography of his hero, George Washington. The work was completed

in 1804-1807, in five volumes. While this biography has been superseded by more recent historical research, Marshall's resumé of George Washington's life and deeds is still of great interest to the layman. On Christmas Day of 1831, his wife, the former Mary Willis Angler, died, thus breaking a union that was noted for its felicity, and which had lasted for forty-eight years. Marshall never recovered from this loss. In June of 1835, he went to Philadelphia for medical attention, and died there, on July 6, one of the finest, most versatile, and most influential Americans of our nation's history passed from the stage of life. His body was removed to Richmond, where it still remains.

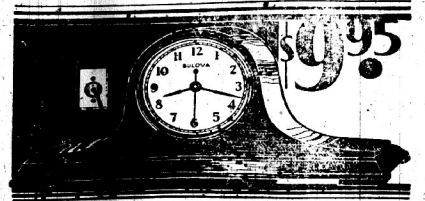
