THE DIPHTHERIA SITUATION IN THE STATE

During the corresponding period in 1929, 269 cases were reported, while only 131 were reported within corresponding dates in 1930.

These figures, Dr. Jones points out, represent only a cross-section of the actual incidence of diphtheria in the state. In his opinion, the number of cases actually existing are perhaps three times as numerous as those officially reported to the health authorities. Dr. Jones further points out that during the first three months of the year, the maximum incidence of diphtheria is usually observed. During the latter part of August 50 cases were reported, and for this reason he expects a high incidence of the disease to continue for some weeks yet.

"From the above figures," says Dr. Jones, "it is evident that diphtheria control constitutes the outstanding health problem in the state at this time. The State Board of Health is urging concerted action in getting the children of the state protected against this disease by immunization with toxin-antitoxin or toxoid. Every child should be protected at the age of nine months. If this were done, diphtheria would be completely eradicated. However, if this period of life has been past, the immunization should be given now, unless a Schick test has been made and the immunity of the child definitely established. All parents are urged to take their children to their family physician, who will gladly administer the necessary immunization and thus protect them against this dangerous disease.

"Health officials are doing everything possible to control diphtheria and prevent its further spread, but they are in urgent need of the support of physicians, school and other public officials and the general public in accomplishing this purpose.

"When any member of the family has a sore throat or other suspicious symptoms of diphtheria, the family physician should be called at once. 
