Ford was born near Leitchfield, Columbia, Mississippi, a fact often mentioned by his uncle, Southern expression and mannerisms, talked for a year in each of his parties in St. Louis, where he finished his high school. His first work in the radio business, in which he was successful in securing success, was in the office of a New York music publisher. It was while thus employed that he became the partner in one of the country's most popular radio programs. Ford was always interested in sports and while in St. Louis he had the unusual profession for a short time to play baseball with the St. Louis Cardinals. GOOD SUGGESTIONS—ALSO GOOD WORK

The following, taken from the Palmetto Herald, tells of the kindly cooperation shown by the Palmetto fire department in combating Tuesday morning's fire here, and also points out some much-needed improvements: The Palmetto fire department was called to Prestonsburg Tuesday morning at about 4 o'clock by an appeal from the operator that the town was in danger, and that the Prestonsburg department could not handle the fire, and that Pikeville and Palmetto were needed to save the town. This was just the supposition of some one that the department made the run to Prestonsburg, they found that the water hydrants of that city were too small for the connections used in Palmetto, and a line ought not be used from the Palmetto equipment, but the Prestonsburg force and about all they wanted for the night and turned their equipment over to the Palmetto fire department. Louisa, Palmetto, Prestonsburg and Pikeville are all close enough that they should always be ready to assist any of the towns should they be needed, but it will be necessary to have all of them use the same size waterplugs. This is the second trip that Palmetto's fire department has made to Prestonsburg, but unable to use their equipment, although notified by the state fire prevention and control department of Prestonsburg, who did Prestonsburg had the same size connections. The International Encyclopaedia says in part: "In later Jewish and Christian belief, a mighty spirit of evil who has during unknown ages ruled over a kingdom of evil spirits and is in constant and resolutely active opposition to God." The writer of that article states that the Hebrews knew little about such evil spirits until they came in contact with the religions of Babylonia and Persia during their captivity in Babylon. These ideas were developed by the Jews and many of them were carried over into Christian theology, where they were subject to other influences.
