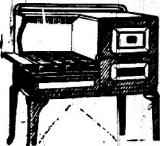

School-Bag Gospel League at Work in Floyd County

Some very interesting work has been done this fall in some of the schools of this county by Elmer C. Wagner, of Emma, Ky., who is engaged in Sunday School work in that community.

A total of 45 schools were visited, the majority being in the rural sections and often at the "heads" of the creeks. The proposition, it was learned,

ed, require, the reading of the gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John and the memorizing of 20 selected scripture verses. By so doing, any boy or girl from the third grade and upward may receive an attractive cloth-bound copy of the New Testament.

Six weeks or longer were given in which to do, the required work. The School-Bag Gospel League of New York City furnished Mr. Wagner the necessary copies of gospels and New Testaments.

The best showing came from school No. 63 on upper Mud Creek, of which B. M. Stone is teacher. A one-room school with about 65 enrolled, there were 36 pupils who received Testaments. The school at Beall, on Right Beaver, Franklin, Webster, teacher, also had a high mark of 31 New Testaments obtained.

DEPOSITORS PAID ANOTHER 20 PCT.

Beaver Valley State Bank Now Has Paid 45 Pct of Deposits

Beaver Valley State Bank, Prestonsburg, Ky., March 7, (Sp.)—L. C. Campbell, special deputy banking commissioner, liquidating the Beaver Valley State Bank, Weeksville, Ky., made a disbursement of an additional 20 per cent to depositors under date of March 5, 1932.

This payment, with the 25 per cent disbursed December 10, 1931, constitutes 45 per cent of the bank's obligations to depositors. Drafts, when mailed to all persons who have filed proof of claim and where the amount of disbursement exceeded \$1. Depositors having less than \$1 due will be paid in cash upon calling at the bank.

The work of liquidating this bank is being carried on as rapidly and economically as possible with the view of returning to the depositors, 100 cents on the dollar.

Persons owing the bank obligations are being urged to pay them as rapidly as possible in the interest of closing out the bank's affairs, at an early date.

HISTORY OF NATIONAL BUSINESS WOMEN'S WEEK

National Business Women's Week was first observed in 1923. March 6-11 marked the fifth annual observance.

Miss Emma Dot Partridge, of New York City, who was executive secretary of the National Federation of Business and Professional Women's Clubs from 1924 to 1927, was responsible for suggesting the plan. The week was originally designed to turn the spotlight of publicity upon the achievements of business and professional women.

Although it has not strayed entirely from that idea, the emphasis has changed from how business women can improve their own status to that of the contribution they can make as citizens. The program for the current Business Women's Week focuses upon the relationship of the business woman to the community in which she lives. Such topics as what men and women can do to better municipal government, how the woman

can contribute to the public relation, dinner during the latter part of the week, at which there were representatives from each of the civic organizations, subjects and activities were discussed during the week, the climax of which was the committee on arrangements.
