First inning—

ORGANIZES YOUNG FLOYD DEMOCRATS

At last meeting officers were selected for the Floyd county club, with the work divided in each of the eight magisterial districts by vice-presidents of the club. Two directors have been named, also, in each voting precinct of the county.
