noted without neglecting any other phase of the school work. After the standardized reading test has been given and the results recorded, an analysis of the results will be made and a definite plan, for remedial work set up. The teachers will be expected to teach in accordance with the plan made and a record of the work will be kept. After six or eight more reading tests have been given there will be a test given at the end of the term to determine the progress made; then an evaluation of the methods and devices used will be determined. It is my hope that the teachers will be so enthusiastic about their teaching technique that they will desire to read books and magazines on teaching reading in order that they may improve their own teaching. I am going to recommend that the teachers become acquainted with at least one or more of the following books on reading: ELEMENTARY READING by Stone; TYPES OF TEACHING IN PRIMARY SCHOOLS by Parker; HOW TO TEACH READING by Bruner and Cheney; THE TEACHING OF READING by Hirst, Donovan and Alexander.
The above points in the teaching of reading might well be carried out as a campaign for the improvement of the school in the following:
1. There are certain points that a teacher must have in the development of a good lesson, that are as follows:
1. Definition and elements of the lesson.
2. Preparation of lesson by the teachers.
3. Skill in stimulating thought.
4. Skill in questioning.
5. Skill and care in making assignments.
6. Skill in teaching how to study.
7. Skill in motivation of work.
8. Skill in habit formation.
9. Skill in choice of material.
10. Skill in determination of subject matter.
11. Attention to individual needs.
12. Skill in telling of the new experience with the child's previous experience.
13. Skill in motivation and stimulation.
14. Skill in providing the opportunity for application of the lesson.
15. Skill in bringing home a general summary of the lesson.
16. Skill in keeping a record of the lesson.
