## FLOYD RESTAURANT CLEAN-UP ORDERED

### Must Comply With Health Regulations or Face Prosecution

A state inspector is in the county aiding the Floyd county health department in a check-up on restaurants, hotels and boarding houses in a clean-up campaign. The state health department is determined that places offering food or sleeping accommodations to the public be properly equipped to serve their patrons and conduct their affairs in places according to State Health Department rules and regulations.

Hearings will be held before the county health department from time to time, and such operators of establishments as clearly will be given an O. K., while those who do not meet the requirements will be turned over to the courts.

A few of the requirements to be stressed will be: The use of a chlorine solution for rinsing dishes and glasses. In this manner protecting patrons against such contagious diseases as trench mouth, etc. The providing of a sanitary toilet; fitting lid running hot water; proper sewage disposal; clean, pegmises, inside and outside; a health certificate from a family physician for each person serving food or preparing food for public consumption; mental connections for dispensing of draught beer; tables not be permitted to open six feet into a room where food is prepared or served.

These measures are being taken for the protection of the public and the support of the health authorities in order that such conditions which may be found to exist can be corrected.

## EDGAR SAMMONS VICTIM OF SHOT FROM OWN GUN

### Local Taxi Driver Dies in Hospital at Paintsville From Chest Wound

Edgar Sammons, 36 years old, Prestonsburg taxi driver, died in the Golden Rule hospital at 2 o'clock Monday morning from a bullet wound near his heart which was self-inflicted. The bullet, of .38-caliber, entered his left chest, above the heart and emerged from his back. He was rushed to the hospital at Paintsville in his taxi, driven by Tom Marshall. Motive for the shooting has not been definitely established. A son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Sammons of this place, the victim was one of Prestonsburg's best-liked young men. He was of a quiet, unassuming nature and held the friendship of all who knew him. Surviving him are his parents, his widow, Mrs. Ruth Spradlin Sammons; one stepson, Otto, 11; seven brothers and one sister: Dewey, Marlon, Toy and Darling Sammons, of Prestonsburg; Ronald, a half-brother, Annapolis, Md.; and Miss Tonia Mae Sammons, Prestonsburg. The body was returned to the home here and Tuesday afternoon was taken to the home of the victim's parents, on the Auxier road, a few miles below here, where funeral rites were conducted by Rev. Arnold T. Melaberg of the Presbyterian Church. Burial was made under the direction of E. P. Arnold in the Bingham cemetery.

### Mrs. Sallie Blanton Shoots A. Legged Rival for Husband's Affections

Mrs. Sallie Blanton fired a bullet from a .38-caliber revolver through the leg of Mrs. Bert Wells, of Auxier, whom she is said to have considered as a rival for the affections of her husband, Walter Blanton, a drifter, when she found her husband and Mrs. Wells sitting in an automobile in front of the Harvest Pattern filling station here Tuesday afternoon. Mrs. Blanton, who resides at Paintsville, is said to have fired five shots at Mrs. Wells. The wounded woman was taken to the Paintsville hospital, where it is said she is not seriously hurt.

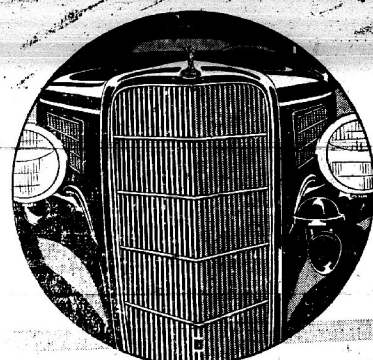

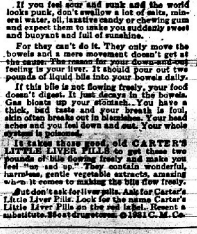
