'Handshake of Death' Charg-ed to Blackburn in Slay-Blackburn in Slay-ing of Slone

SELF-DEFENSE, CLAIM

Emery Slone. 30-year-old Maytown merchant and restaurant-owner is dead with three builets fired through his head, and Bennie Blackburn, jail here in connection his murder.

Sione was killed shortly atter midnight Saturday as he sat beside his wife in his truck parked in front of Sadie's Place at Knotley Hol few miles above here.

Blackburn admits shooting Stone but claims that he fired in self-defense Baker was arrested, it was said, follow-ing his statement that he also fired on Slone, but his story is peing discredited.

One story of the killing is to


