**HOW WILL DEFENSE PROGRAM AFFECT MOTOR VEHICLE OWNERSHIP AND OPERATION?**  
HARDLY a day goes by when your Motor Club does not receive several queries from automobile owners as to various phases of car operation and prospective operation under the conditions created by the large-scale preparedness program undertaken by the government.  
To what extent will production of new cars be curtailed in the 1942 schedule? With more old cars in use, what about the outlook for servicing? What form will the increased taxation on the automobile take? How extensive is the threatened gasoline shortage? How will the shortage affect the big touring industry? With rubber priorities already invoked, will it be possible to secure tires and tubes? What will be the effect of curtailments and restrictions on the automotive structure?

Manifestly, these questions raise far-reaching considerations from the standpoint of an organization like ours. We have striven to keep in touch with all developments that may affect our members and the car owners in general in the immediate months ahead. And this column, beginning next week, will in a series of articles attempt to give automobile owners a bird's-eye view of the situation as we see it.
