They know such a business would be unhealthy from the purely physical point of view, and positively suicidal from the political angle.

So who's to blame them? And what's to be done?

It is true, as Commissioner Robertson moints out, that Kentucky should produce more sheep; that sheep-raising could be a source of profit to more farmers, and should be. It is true that sheep-raising is a venture usually marked by disaster where dogs are permitted to roam at will, with the farmer unprotected by a dogtax fund.

Moreover, counties such as Floyd, with natural cover, water and hillsides which should be grazed rather than put to the plow, should grow more sheep.

All that is admitted. But what to do?

Until public sentiment changes, no official or set of officials will succeed in enforcing this law through threat of killing off the dogs which thousands of Kentuckians consider peculiarly as-their own and part and parcel of their households.




