And so the voters do at last see the law exacting just penalty from violators of a law which intimately concerns the lowliest and the greatest among us. County and state courts have utterly failed to curb election fraud in local elections. In Floyd county, for instance, a scattered few are indicted from time to time for vote-buying or vote stealing; but—many may be called for prosecution, yet few are chosen to suffer the consequences they richly deserve.

If the Harlan county election fraud case can be followed up over the counties of Kentucky and throughout the nation in every federal election, a clearer expression of the will of the people will result in all elections. Morever, Senate committees will not be blandly reporting, as they did last week, the expenditure of near fifty millions of dollars in a national election without a trace of law violation.


