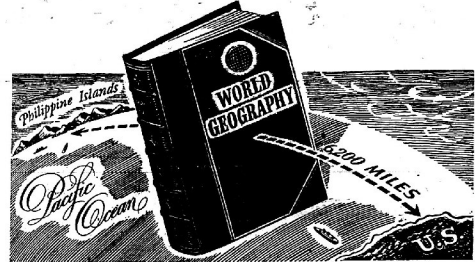

This is one of Japan's greatest allies—geography. It has already put 6,300 miles between the guns we make and the men who are using them. It will put many, many more.

We have to overcome this great barrier of distance before we can fire a single shot at a single Japanese stronghold like Iwo Jima or Okinawa—or the islands of Japan, itself.

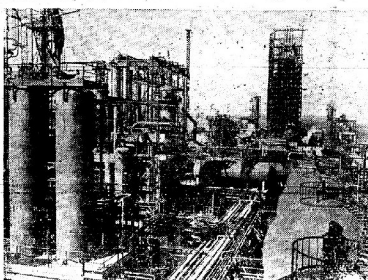

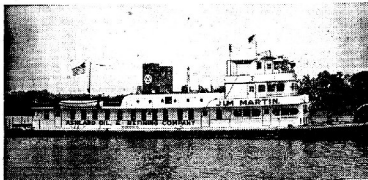

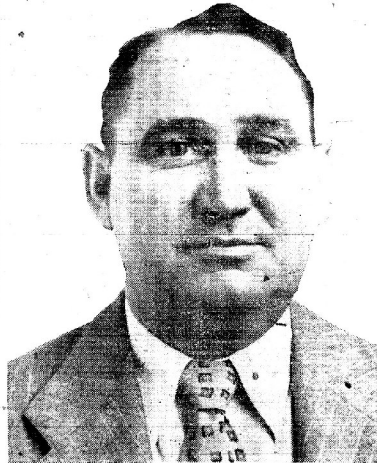

To the Voters Of Floyd County:

Last week, in The Floyd County Times, some candidate, desperate in his search for votes, assailed through one or two ex-service men who did not sign their names to the statement, all Veterans seeking office in Floyd County. I am not saying which candidate did that, for I do not know. I write this in defense of myself, since I am a Veteran.

It has been clearly understood, from the outset of this campaign, that I am not making my own race for County Court Clerk and so I do not speak for any other candidate when I reply to the allegation that I am dishonoring the uniform of the United States army and its air force when I permitted my likeness, clothed in our country's uniform, to appear in print in connection with my candidacy.

There is a Biblical saying, which, I presume, all will admit is true—"By their fruits ye shall know them."

My opponent has not been modest about his claims of efficiency as County Court Clerk. He has pointed to his record repeatedly.

Then why should not I, unknown to many of you, be permitted without censure to make myself acquainted to you? Every man has his trademark—mine just happens to be different to the other fellow's.

My opponent served you, because you were kind enough to elect him, for sixteen long years, he enjoyed a fine salary in civilian dress, I served you without benefit of anybody's vote—I volunteered to go into the army and I fought from my station in a Flying Fortress of my own free will, for very little pay.

I have never claimed a good soldier is necessarily good timber as a public official. I wore that uniform into a Belgian meadow on an August day of 1943 and it was still on me while German soldiers sought my whereabouts. I did not wear it while I was walking the Underground or while I was walking and crawling across the Pyrenees Mountains to safety, but the "dog tags"—my army serial number—hidden on my person were part and parcel of this uniform.

Did I disgrace the uniform of the United States army air force? I leave it to you who also fought and suffered, to those who starved in prison camps, to the fathers, mothers, brothers, sisters, sweethearts of these men.

If I could be convinced that I have disgraced the uniform I wore during those unforgettable days and months, I most certainly would not ask the good men and women and my friends among the children of Floyd county to join me in utter disgrace.

Some of those who have persuaded one or two ex-service men to consent to disseminate such false propaganda, seeking to have the public believe a real committee of ex-service men exists and that it honestly holds to such beliefs, never wore a uniform; they never knew the stringencies of army life, either on "This" or "That" side of the "right hidden under a bushel" while displaying their own subtly and insidiously infer that the veteran should not use his discharge papers to claim job preference under the G.I. Bill of Rights. (For, isn't the honorable discharge bill and the discharge papers themselves emblems in lieu of this uniform they have said I should not have let the people know I wore?)

This pilot of mine whom I left at the controls of that Flying Fortress over Belgium—was only four years old when my opponent was first elected to this same office of which I now have the nerve to aspire.

The good, common people of Floyd county have been very kind to me. They have decided this may be the "World" but that it is not One Man's World.
