



Once you have learned to understand the "sign language" of plants, you can often toll just by looking at a growing plant whether it is drawing from the soil at the nitrogen, phosphorus, potash and other elements it umst have to produce healthy, high-yielding crops. A deficiency in these essential elements will affect the plant's appearance in some way which will tell you just what is short. Here are some of the "hun-ger signs" in corn, for example: • Yellowish-creen leaves and stunted growth in-

Yellowish-green leaves and stunted growth in-dicates nitrogen deficiency.

• Tips of leaves gummed together indicates cal-cium deficiency.

Purple color in leaves indicates phosphorus de-ficiency

• Bottom leaves dead; yellow striping between

Vaccinate pigs against cholera while they are still young, advises the United States

Vaccinate pigs against choiera while they are still young, advises the United States Bureau of Animal Industry. It is cheaper, the pigs are esser to handle, and the risk is less. Several pig discusses have symptoms similar to cholera, and with cholera elimantod through softy accination, diagnosis and treat-ment of the specific disease will be simplified.

If the pig is to grow normally, it must be provided with the required amounts and proper quality of building materials with which to develop the various body tissues and organs.

Quantity of feed alone will not insure thrift, vigor, and Quantity of teed none will not insure thriti, vigor, and normal growthe. Water, protein, minerals, vitamins and energy must be supplied in proper proportions to enable the pig to build a strong skeleton, plump muscles, vigor-ous vital organs, and the desirable amount of fat.

Quality of protein is especially important because all ssential amino acids, or body protein building-stones. must be included in the feed. The inclusion of some animust be included in the feed. The inclusion of some ani-mal protein in the feed is the simplest method of insuring a surply of all the essential animo acids. Vitamin A, most easily surplied from green pasture, and Vitamin D, best obtained from direct sunshine, must also be provided. If you meet the quantitative nurricant needs of the pig, the goal of efficient gains is not difficult to attain.


