

The Veterans Administration again this week urged veterans who have national service life insurance to give careful consideration to the settlement provisions of their poli-

cion.

Bitel L. McKinney, of the VA office here, explained that the Inustance Act of 1866 opened a large field of new settlement options designed to provide for the various needs and circumstances of veterancy benefits. The new optional settlement range from lupap sum payments to monthly installments during the life of the first beneficiary. Under the original law, the only settlements authorized were monthly income and annulty payments.
