The bulle against tuberculosis in which victory is still not quite within reach has been attended in Floyd county by a fight against superstition, "old wives' tales" and prejudice—both of these battles fought, step by grudging step. But both are being won.

One sign of victory—an isolated instance, but no less significant—was found in a Floyd county ashool recently when the teacher invited Mrs. J. D. Mayo, county TB nurse, to make a talk and show a film combatting the disease. In that same school, 22 years ago, health authorities were not permitted to do any kind of work, said Dr. Marvin Ransdell, director of the Floyd County Health Department. 
