

Seven cents a mile. That iniquity in the sheriff's office began when the Sheriff's Association of Kentucky went down to the Legislature and procured the passage of the processes. I want to show you how it operates to enrich a sheriff and how it keeps a poor man from going into court to get a wrong righted.

If you live at Wheelwright and have a warrant of ar-rest for a man who has committed a misdeameanor or if you are engaged in a civil action and need an attachment for a witness, it will cost you seven cents a mile to get the sheriff to come and serve the papers.

What I propose to do is to have the sheriff in the mag-isterial district in which you reside serve the papers and not charge this seven cents. It is just one of the many little fees that go to build up a big pot for the sheriff at the little man's expense. I'm going to do away with it we one of my first official serve.




