Some Floyd countians may have found in the story of their condition cause to fear the treatment that is given to prevent hydrophobia after a person or an animal has been bitten by a rabid dog, cat or other animal.

They should be fearful, but not of the anti-rabies treatment, necessarily, although it is no trivial thing to have to undergo this series of inoculations. There is the mental anguish of the person threatened with hydrophobia; there is pain in some degree, much in convenience, some expense, some time lost — and, there is the possibility of severe, though not fatal, reaction to the "shots."

What the people of Floyd county should be more deeply concerned about is rables, its spread, the lack of control of dogs and our failure to see that every dog is immunized against this fearsome malady.

They should now begin asking themselves, "Who is it that deserves more consideration in this fatter—human beings or dogs?"

There is only one thing to do if you are bitten by a rabid animal, and that is to take treatment promptly. Your own personal comfort doesn't enter into the matter. It's do this—or else.

Then don't you think it would be more considerate of humans, and also of the animals themse let the dogs stand the pain and effects of those and so immunize them against hydronho tect human beings against this threat to life!



-A PLAN of ACTION BEYOND The CALL Of DUTY

The law requires many duties of your County Attorney in the operation of our County Government. Broad powers are allowed him in the performance

Floyd County is entitled to an attorney who will not be satisfied with "just doing his duty", but one who will use imagination in exercising the powers of the office to initiate and bring about reforms and added services in the County government, fields of criminal prosecution, county financial management, and road building and maintenance.

Paul E. Hayes will discuss the duties of the County Attorney's Office and his plan of action in three or more articles covering criminal prosecution, County Financial Management and Road Building and Maintenance. This first article will cover the duties and his plan of action on the investigation of crime and criminal prosecution in Floyd County.

INVESTIGATION OF CRIME AND CRIMINAL PROSECUTION

THE LEGAL DUTY: The County Attorney is charged by law to be present at unfaing trials, Rentucky Criminal Code, Section 51 and shall assist the Grand Jury, nutsky Criminal Code, Section 10; Thus, by necessity and by law, the County At-ney is required to investigate all crime in the County.

- As your County Attorney, Paul E. Hayes will expect to be with the first the scene of the crime, day or night, collecting evidence, interrogating wit-ses, to the end that the prosecution's case will not fail for want of proof.
- 2. As your County Attorney, Paul E. Hayes will seek to arouse and inform the public to its necessary participation, in the stamping out of bootlegging and other community vice. No longer will the officials be able to blame the public for falling to come forward with the information for search and other warrants. Hayes will initiate the organization of a small but active citizens committee in each community. Cooperating and advising with these committees, the evidence for successful prosecutions can and will be collected.
- 3. When present before the grand jury, Paul E. Hayes will seek to render helpful, impartial legal advice and assistance in the presentation of cases for indictment. As your County Attorney he will seek to prevent indictments based upon spite, politics, or personal vengence. Indictments will be carefully and legally prepared to prevent trial delays due to technical defects.

THE LEGAL DUTY: "The County Attorney shall attend to the prosecution, in courts inferior to the circuit court, of all criminal and penal cases in his county in which the Commonwealth or the county is interested . . . " (KRS 6.9.10 (2).

A PLAN OF ACTION:

- To prosecute the guilty as well as protect the innocent shall be given meaning, not just lip service, by Paul E. Hayes.
- 2. Speed up the trial of misdemeanor cases in the Quarterly (commonly called County) Court. This can be done by pre-trial investigation, subpoenas for Commonwealth's witnesses and dismissal of cases that drag on the docket because of absence of prosecuting witnesses. Slow justice is no justice. Witnesses should be spared the expense and time in coming to Prestouburg month after month to be in cases that should be either tried or dismissed.
- 3. As your County Attorney, Paul E. Hayes will seek to revise the manner of selecting juries in the County or Quarterly Court. Presently selected on the hit or miss plan of picking up bystanders, jurous are unpaid, many times inconvenienced and oftentimes have been stationed around the courthouse for the purpose of serving in a particular case. Hayes will recommend and work toward having a regular panel selected from all parts of the County for each two-day Court Term, EACH JUROR TO BE PAID SOME COMPENSATION FOR SUCH SERVICE. In addition to improvement in justice, the trial of cases will be expedited.

THE LEGAL DUTY: "The County Attorney shall attend the circuit courts held in this county and aid the Commonwealth's Attorney in all prosecutions therein , . . ." KRS 69-210.

A PLAN OF ACTION:

Paul E. Hayes has had considerable experience in criminal law and will be

When he is your County Attorney it will not be necessary to hire special cosecutors to assist the Commonwealth's Attorney.

Upon the request of the Commonwealth's Attorney, or at the request of any resecuting witness, Hayes will assist in the prosecution of any criminal case prosecuting witness, Hayes will assist in the prosecution in circuit court, thus having a special prosecutor free of charge.

In making the rounds in my campaign I have been asked time and again about the lawsuit that has recently been filed in the Federal Court against Floyd county. I became interested enough to procure a copy of that lawsuit so that I might familiarize myself with it so that I could more intelligently discuss it with you.

Floyd county and its taxpayers are, to say the least, jeopardized to the extent that we have an important lawsuit to defend in Federal Court and your next County Attorney, in co-operation with C. Kilmer Combs, employed counsel, will have that service to perform. Our present County Attorney and Mr. Combs are, in my considered judgment, doing a fine job so far representing us in this case, but there is no doubt in my mind that this case will be pending in the courts throughout the most of the term of your next County Attorney.

What the law firm of Skaggs, Hays & Fahey, who represent the plaintiff and bondholder in this case, are trying to do our people is best ascertained when one reads the prayer of their petition. In their prayer they ask for the following things:

- 1. Injunction against our treasurer and depository to prevent them from expending certain moneys except for retirement of bonds, interests, et cetera.
 - 2. Judgment against Floyd county for the defaulted bonds and interest.
- 3. A mandatory injunction against the Fiscal Court requiring it, by order of Federal Court, to "Make such rates and charges for services furnished by the Gas & Water System securing such bonds, so as to be adequate to pay said judgements and to pay the interest and principal on all of such Bonds as such interest and principal mature."

I have given serious thought to the third relief they seek. If they succeed in this, that means that our Fiscal Court will be under orders from the Federal Court to meet and raise the water and gas rates high enough so that your bills will be sufficient to pay these defaulted Bonds, with interest, and to pay the remaining ones promptly as they become due. If the bondholder succeeds in getting this order of the Federal Court, that would mean that the Fiscal Court would have to more than double the present water and gas rates, which, as I am told is now far too high. This is one of the reasons that this lawsuit must be fought right on through with the same vigor that has been exercised thus far. After January 1, 1953, your next County Attorney will be your lawyer representing you along with Mr. Combs and I submit for your careful consideration that I with two Law Degrees, backed up with 35 years experience as a lawyer at the Floyd County Bar and in the State and Federal Courts, can do a better job defending Floyd county and its Gas and Water users, as well as its taxpayers generally, than either of my opponents.

As things now stand, our Gas and Water users are paying far too much for their Gas and Water and at the same time are receiving far too little service for their money. To have to double (and more) that rate would be outrageous and our people just couldn't stand it. I propose to use every ounce of energy physically and intellectually, at my command as your next County Attorney to defend this lawsuit and save the day for us in court. If you have faith in my ability and honesty of purpose, then I humbly solicit and beg of you your active support.
