BONUS-AMENDMENT TEXT

SENATE BILL NO. 296, 1958 GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

Section 1. The Constitution of the Commonwealth of Kentucky is hereby proposed to be amesded by the ratification of a new section to read as follows:

The General Assembly shall by law provide for the issuance and sale of bonds of the Commonwealth, notwithstanding the limitation of indebtedness in Section 49 or, any other section of the Continuous of Kentucky, which shall be in addition to all other bonds of the Commonwealth herelefore authorized. The proceeds of such additional bonds, or so many thereof as may be necessary for the purpose, shall be used and appropriated SOLELY for the purpose of paying a cash bonus not to exceed \$500 for service outside the continental limits of the United States, and \$500 for service in the continental limits of the United States, and \$500 for service in the continental Winded States to the veterans, their widows or heirs, or next of kin, of the Spanish American Way. World War II, and the Korean Cunflict, who were residents of the Commonwealth at the time of their ENTRY into the service and at least six months prior thereto. The General Assembly at the same session authorizing the issuance of the bonds shall levy a tax upon all retail sales at suich a rate as will pay the interest upon and retire the bonds in not less than 30 years, PROVIDED that retail sales of FOOD and FOOD PRODUCTS, MEDICINES and CLOTHING may be EXEMPTED from such tax.


