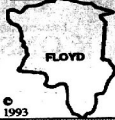

Elderly woman is killed in accident

A mid-afternoon collision at the intersection of U.S. 23 and Ky. 1428 claimed the life of an elderly Prestonsburg woman Wednesday and hospitalized an Oil Springs native.

According to a report issued Thursday by the Prestonsburg Police Department, the accident occurred Wednesday when Ruth Wright, 70, of Prestonsburg, attempted to turn onto U.S. 23 from Ky. 1428 directly in the path of a northbound vehicle driven by Sherietta M. Dodderer, 29, of Oil Springs. Wright was apparently thrown from her vehicle.

The accident occurred at around 2:17 p.m.

The two women were transported to Highlands Regional Medical Center, where Wright was pronounced dead by Floyd County Coroner Roger E. Nelson.

Dodderer was treated for injuries and released on Thursday.

Responding to the scene were members of the Prestonsburg Police Department, the Prestonsburg Fire Department, the Respond and P & B Ambulance services and Prestonsburg Fire Marshal Larry Adams.

The accident is still under investigation by patrolman Mike Coon of the Prestonsburg Police Department.

Leeway okayed on one issue; tight reins vowed on another

In an effort to reward schools that have voted to form school-based decision making councils, Floyd County School Board Members Wednesday authorized those schools to deter-

mine pay scales for teachers for extracurricular activities.

Schools that do not have site-based councils will have to abide by the board's adopted pay scale and must have board approval for any deviations.

"I don't think we should give non-

site-based schools the same flexibility as site-based schools," acting board chairman Eddie Patton said. "I think we should reward site-based schools and this board should go on record wanting every school in the county to be site-based."

Superintendent Steve Towler expressed concern that it may not be acceptable for the board to impose different procedures for schools that are not governed by school-based decision making councils.

Patton appeared to be unmoved by Towler's comments, saying, "I don't see any reason not to do it until a lawyer tells us not to."

Under the board's plan, site-based schools will have the authority to determine how a budget allocation for supplemental pay will be spent.

Elementary schools, K-5, will receive \$2,800 for supplemental pay; elementary schools K-8 will receive \$10,000; middle schools will receive \$17,000; and high schools will be allotted \$55,000.

Board member Eddie Billips cautioned that school councils should attempt to follow the board approval

State is riled over bypass of local board

State school officials have chastised Floyd County school superintendent Steve Towler for failing to provide local board members with vital information relating to the district's improvement plans.

Local board members apparently have also been bypassed in the distribution of revised state guidelines — some of which require their attention — concerning school construction projects.

In an April 22 letter to Towler from Sandy Gubser, director of the state's management assistance program, the state's ire was evident concerning the communication gap and that Towler had apparently told state officials that he kept board members informed on those issues.

"Both the management assistance staff and the Commissioner (Thomas Boyesen) have expressed dismay and grave concern that you have not shared with the Floyd County Board (local and state monthly progress reports)," Gubser's letter said. "These omissions are especially serious given the local board's responsibility and authority for completion of the short term plan, and the fact you had indicated to us on numerous occasions that this information is being shared with the board."

"The purpose of this letter is to direct you to ensure that all monthly progress reports must be submitted to and approved by the board... prior to their submittal to the Kentucky Department of Education," Gubser's letter said. "Likewise, all Kentucky Department of Education monitoring reports must be submitted to the local board for their review and action... We consider compliance with these directives of the utmost importance and a critical step in the overall improvement process."

Board members have also been left out in receiving information concerning revisions in state school construction guidelines which in some areas require local board approval.

At Wednesday's special board meeting, board member Eddie Billips asked Towler if he had received a copy of the state memorandum sent to architects and construction man-

agers. "Are you aware that Mike Luscher, (director of facilities management for the state education department), sent out a letter or document in March... that requires architects to provide drawings to the board prior to the time they are submitted to Luscher?" Billips asked Towler.

"We get quite a bit of correspondence from him and I'm not sure I have seen that," Towler answered.

Pot 'harvest' gets off to an early start

Marijuana eradication efforts have begun early in Floyd County with state and local law officers confiscating over 150 plants Thursday in two different strikes.

Officers executed a search warrant at the home of Theresa Gibson, 20, at Middle Creek Monday afternoon and came away with approximately 30 pot plants.

Floyd County Sheriff Paul Hunter Thompson and deputies Homer Neeley and Ricky Thornberry joined forces with Kentucky State Police officers Bobby Day, David Watkins and Tim Mullins in a search of Gibson's trailer where officers found the pot plants on a window sill in Gibson's bedroom. Officers also found a small quantity of prescription drugs not in proper containers.

Gibson was arrested and charged with cultivating marijuana, over five plants, prescription drugs not in proper container and possession of drug paraphernalia.

In the second hit Thursday, officers found just over 130 marijuana plants on a hillside at Shop Fork on Mare Creek.

After a short hike up a hillside, officers found several plots of marijuana plants growing in prepared growing beds.

Ivel woman abducted, beaten, raped; Tram suspect is jailed

A Floyd County man was arrested early Saturday by officers of the Kentucky State Police after allegedly abducting, beating and raping an elderly Ivel woman.

According to Floyd County Jail records, Eddie Dean Hall, 20, of Tram, was arrested at the Tram residence of his uncle, Junior Hall, by Kentucky State Police Detective Lynn Cross and lodged in the jail at around 9:30

a.m. Saturday.

Deputy Floyd County Jailer Durren Jarrell said Thursday that the arrest occurred after an incident Friday evening in which Hall allegedly entered the residence of a 70-year-old Ivel woman, tied her up, raped her, then burglarized and vandalized her home.

Jarrell said Thursday that Hall had formerly served a probationary sentence on charges of first degree attempted rape and fourth degree assault stemming from a December,

1991 incident in which he allegedly beat and tried to rape his own mother.

Hall was charged Saturday with one count each of first degree rape; first degree burglary; first degree robbery; criminal trespass; terroristic threatening; and criminal mischief. He remains lodged in the Floyd County Jail pending a \$50,000 cash bond.

The incident is still under investigation by Detective Lynn Cross of the Pikeville Post of the Kentucky State Police.

Local sales rep is big winner in HBO promo

One day last November, Peggy Thompson was working at her desk as a customer sales representative (CSR) for Cablevision, on South Lake Drive, Prestonsburg, when the phone rang.

"I could tell when he called — by the ring of the phone — that it was the HBO Mystery Caller. I just had a feeling," she said Wednesday at the Cablevision office. Little did Thompson know that the phone call would lead to her winning a grand prize in the HBO Mystery Caller Contest.

The HBO national contest was held last fall for employees of cable systems that carry Home Box Office. Grand prizes included eight new cars, eight trips, and big cash.

Other HBO Mystery Callers had already called Thompson and fellow CSR Mary Woods about five times each that month, pretending to be prospective Cablevision customers. Governor's plan is highlighted

The Kentucky Commission on Health Care Reform on Monday approved Governor Brereton Jones' controversial new health care package, voting to send the plan to the Kentucky General Assembly, where it will be reviewed extensively by the legislature's interim Health and Welfare Committee. The following outline offers a brief overview of Jones' plan.

Controlling Costs

• A Health Care Authority, appointed by the Governor and controlled by the Senate, would set rates

for all health care providers by January 1, 1994. Rates could not go up more than the Consumer Price Index or cost of living. That means that Kentuckians' health care cost increases would be limited to the same percentage as food, clothing or other necessities of life.

The Authority also would set rates for health insurance policies, and insurance companies could not charge their customers more without the Authority's approval.

• To improve consumers' bargaining power, a health care purchasing cooperative, or mega-pool, would

allow millions of Kentuckians to come together as a group to buy insurance or health care. The Authority would negotiate with health care and insurance providers on behalf of Kentuckians in the pool.

• To help Kentuckians plan for the future, a state tax credit would be awarded against premiums paid for long-term care insurance. This credit would amount to 25 percent of the premium payments.

• Health care reform within the workers' compensation system would mean rate reductions for companies

and enhanced workplace safety for employees.

Coverage for All Kentuckians
• No Kentuckian could be denied insurance coverage because of a pre-existing condition of any type, including cancer, heart disease, and diabetes.

• Every health insurance company in Kentucky would be required to offer a minimum benefit plan that the Authority would develop.

This plan would provide compre-

Development conference discusses Martiki Coal's mining reclamation site

How can states and communities address the increasingly conflicting issues of environmental protection and economic development? To answer that question a conference in Louisville will take a look at MAPCO Coal Company's Martiki mining site in Martin County.

Martiki's reclamation project will be included in a session on redevelopment during "From Rio to the Capitols: State Strategies for Sustainable Development," May 25-28. The redevelopment session will also include a discussion by Kenneth Dobson, executive vice-president of the Detroit Downtown Development Authority, on the reuse of surplus industrial space in his city.

Featuring speakers from throughout the United States, the conference marks the first national follow-up to last year's international Earth Summit in Rio de Janeiro. It will focus on a key issue discussed in Rio—the concept of sustainable economic development—a long-term strategy of meeting the concurrent needs of creating jobs while protecting and preserving natural resources and the environment for future generations.

"The most pressing issues, and the most innovative solutions, will be discussed by environmental and economic development experts from across the country," Jones said. "Other conferences have focused on the questions about the environment or development. Our conference will showcase some of the innovative programs that have provided answers for state and local governments which deal with these pressing community concerns on a daily basis."

The list of speakers includes Dr. Thomas L. Joyoy of the Smithsonian Institution and Chief Oren Lyons, spokesman for the Onondaga Nation and an advocate for environmental causes. Business leaders addressing the conference include David Buzzell of Dow Chemical Company; Cynthia Georgeson of S.C. Johnson East; and Jon Plant of Allied-Signal, who also chairs the U.S. Council for International Business Environmental Committee.

In addition, there will be speakers who will address the particular concerns of small businesses, including Karen Brown, Small Business Ombudsman from the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and Scott Bernstein, president of the Chicago-based Center for Neighborhood Technology.

"We have speakers from Sacramento, California to Augusta, Maine; from Walt Disney Corporation to United Parcel Service," Jones said. "This conference marks an unprecedented effort to bring together state and local leaders, citizens, businesses, environmental groups, social issues

groups and professional associations. It is essential to our future and our children's future."

A session on financial services—a rapidly changing sector that is ultimately important for entrepreneurs and community-based development organizations—will feature Mary Houghton, president of the Southshore Bank Corporation in Chicago and Joan Bavaria, president of the Boston-based Franklin Research and Development Corporation. Both Houghton and Bavaria have been active in promoting sound development and easing access to credit for community-based ventures.

These sessions will be included among 30 to be offered on topics ranging from "Economic and Environmental Equity" to "Water Quality and Availability." The conference will also feature regional forums to give participants an opportunity to exchange ideas and express differing views on environmental and development issues.

pay scales and not to make "radical changes."

Billips also suggested that if a non-site-based school wanted to make a change in the supplemental pay scale the issue must be brought before the board with an explanation why a change was needed.

Billips added that such a request would "not likely" get board approval because it would be giving those schools the same options as site-based schools.

Also Wednesday, the board tightened the reins on bidding procedures by voting to review bid specifications on all items put out for bids. Buildings and Grounds director Frankie Francis had asked the board to approve advertising for bids on various maintenance items so that bids could be awarded for the next fiscal year.

"I think we should approve the specs," Patton commented.

"In my opinion with as much scrutiny as we've been under, I think the board should approve the specs and then approve that those items go out for bid," Billips added.

Francis indicated that advertising for the maintenance materials should not be prolonged and that if the board wanted to review specifications on all items it would "be a lot of material."

"That's good," Patton replied curtly.

In other action Wednesday:

- the board declined to enter into a contract with National Facility Consultants Inc. to oversee the replacement of rooftop heating and cooling until the document is reviewed by the board attorney; Floyd County's maintenance department has been recognized statewide and nationally for their energy management program.

- the board heard from Alan Little with Bowser-Morner Engineering about settlement at the Betsy Layne 21-classroom addition site. At the inception of the site preparation, Little said that architect Paul Hoffman was told that it would take at least eight months to settle and that it is expected to settle by July or August.

- the board was informed that the district has received a grant to fund family resource centers at Duff Elementary and Melvin and Osborne schools; and

- the board approved the summer feeding program.

Board members called a special meeting for Monday, May 10 at 6 p.m. at Auxier Elementary. The agenda items for that special meeting were not identified at Wednesday's meeting.

"From that document sent out, it's obvious that the guidelines are not being followed... (Paul) Hoffman's been taking plans to Frankfort we've never seen."

Billips was referring to the board's frustration about Hoffman's delay in presenting construction plans to the board for the South Floyd High School gym project.

On Saturday, the board gave Hoffman a May 10 deadline to submit final plans on the project.

The March 25 seven-page memorandum from Lucher included revisions in the submission of BG-1 forms; design professional contracts; schematic plans; design development plans; completed plans; change orders and contract documents.

Local board approval is needed in several of the areas set forth in memorandum before documents can be submitted to the state for approval.

Best deals for the money

The continuing discussion over the best way to accomplish economic development in these bills has prompted us to get out the old calculator and do some basic ciphering, as the old folks used to say.

Much of the controversy centers around how much of our money the state is willing to use as bait to lure industry to our scarce river and creek bottomland. We hear a variety of figures bandied around and they include local perks, such as buildings and utility services, as well as state tax incentives and other industrial welfare programs.

Say the total package comes to \$36 million. It sounds astronomical to most of us, but in the world of big business baiting, the figure is not unreasonable.

Cut out the tension of flying across the country to woo a company into moving here. Cut out the high-priced development specialist, staff and fancy quarters. Cut out the fear that a wild-eyed union organizer will wrest control of the work force.

Cut straight to the heart of the matter. Have the employment office select 120 out-of-work men and women and give them \$15,000 each for the next twenty years. (That's not a princely sum, but it puts a family of four \$3,000 or so above the poverty level.)

You have no worries about worker unrest. You don't have to keep raising the ante to keep a company

from pulling up stakes and moving to Mexico. You needn't bother with benefits packages, absenteeism, vacations, and pregnancies, day care, walkouts, work-related injuries or any of those other nagging problems so worrisome in the workplace. There's no need to worry about remodeling facilities, road repair from overloaded trucks, or loss from floods or power outages or depreciation.

If the non-workers choose, with their "salaries" they can further their education or volunteer in the schools or perhaps even get a part-time job at a fast-food restaurant — something to fill up the idle hours and supplement their wages for not working at the nonexistent company.

When the pseudo-industry is on-line, the state can cough up another \$36 million for another non-factory and put another 120 people on the payroll, and so on.

Some would call it welfare, but, as one of our favorite childhood books says, it all depends upon how you look at things. — *Appalachian News-Express*

Do as I say, not as I do

If you don't think legislators write laws for other people and not for themselves, consider the DUI trial last week of state senator Joe Meyer.

When Meyer, of Covington, was arrested February 5 of this year in Lexington, he refused to submit to a Breathalyzer test. He told police officers that he wanted to talk to his attorney before taking the test.

"I am worried that I don't know what I'm getting into," Meyer, an attorney himself, told the officers, accusing them of violating his right to call counsel.

But the officers told the senator that if he talked to

his attorney first, he could not take the Breathalyzer. You see, state law says that DUI suspects who refuse to take the test will automatically lose their license for six months.

Meyer then grabbed for another defense: He argued with police that since that provision was not in effect at the time he received his driver's license, it didn't apply to him.

Good grief. Jurors didn't buy Meyer's defense; they convicted him of driving under the influence and recommended a \$500 fine and three days in jail.

The irony of this spectacle is that Meyer was a member of the General Assembly when the DUI laws were passed. Was he not paying attention when the legislature approved a law it expects regular citizens to abide by?

Kentucky's motto is, "United we stand, divided we fall." The General Assembly's unofficial motto apparently is, "Do as I say, not as I do." — *The Painsville Herald*

Sheriff for hire

During local campaign seasons, I like to read newspapers in surrounding counties to see how their campaigns are going. Being unfamiliar with most candidates, I can usually learn something about them through their campaign ads.

One of the most honest, down-to-earth ads I've seen so far is by a candidate for Martin County sheriff. He is not asking people to elect him to the office; he's asking them to hire him for the next four years.

The candidate makes no bones about it: He wants

to be employed by Martin Countians as their sheriff. In fact, his ad is titled "Application for Employment." At the bottom, instead of asking voters to "elect" him, he requests that they "hire" him.

There's little question that many, if not most, candidates who run for local office do so because they want the money. Finally, at least one of them has the guts to admit it. — *The Painsville Herald*

Muggings in the kitchen

A popular singer's husband was arrested for allegedly kicking and smashing her with a chair. The story made headlines because she's famous — but it is hardly news. Every 15 seconds, an American woman is beaten.

The Family Violence Prevention Fund released a study revealing that while only 19 percent of those surveyed had witnessed a robbery or mugging, 34 percent had witnessed a battering.

Americans seem finally aware that a woman socked in the kitchen by her husband is as much a victim as a woman mugged in the street by a stranger. — *Condensed editorial from the New York Times reprinted in The Lexington Herald-Leader.*

The longer they look at it, analyze it and think about it, the less cost cutters in either party like the 1994 budget Bill Clinton sent to Congress early this month.

Despite all his lofty rhetoric about shared sacrifice, the new president's first federal budget does surprisingly little to slow down spending and bring deficits under control.

Two things we know: Clinton is trading water on cost control, accepting deficits in the \$200 billion to \$300 billion range for the foreseeable future. Over the next six years, at least \$1.5 trillion will have been added to the \$4 trillion national debt under the Clinton proposals.

If he is serious about deficit reduction, Clinton will have to put forth a new and tighter set of spending priorities over the next four years that inflict pain on the recipients of federal grants, allowances and subsidies as well as on the taxpayers.

"There are no spending cuts in this budget," says Allen Schick, a professor of public policy at the University of Maryland. "He's going to have to come up with another deficit-reduction plan."

Schick concedes that Clinton is proposing deep cuts in military spending, but he contends that deep cuts would have been made anyway as a natural consequence of the winding down of the Cold War.

His basic argument is that rather than "A Vision of Change for America" that Clinton proclaimed in his Feb. 17 State of the Union speech the president is defending the budgetary status quo.

To be fair about it, Clinton is talking about eliminating 100,000 federal jobs (mostly by attrition) over the next four years. He has asked Vice President Al Gore to take a long look at federal agencies, with an eye to cost-cutting. And he wants to freeze federal pay in 1994, although that proposal—like others—seems open to modification.

The dark side is that Clinton has missed a chance to make dramatic proposals—to attack farm subsidies, most of which go to wealthy agribusinesses; to scale down veterans' benefits; to stop pouring billions into expensive-but-extendable projects such as the space station and the Texas supercollider.

It's true that Congress, not the president, has the final say on spending measures. Clinton can only propose or veto bills as a last resort. But a new president who represents the entire nation, not any particular state or interest group, has more leverage and much more clout than the typical lawmaker on Capitol Hill.

Clinton would be well-advised to stop negotiating, compromising and retreating from proposals to reduce the federal deficit. He'll be amazed at the support he'll get for performing a thankless task.

Tackett petitions appeals court for rehearing

Johnson County jailer Thurman Tackett has officially petitioned the Kentucky Court of Appeals for a rehearing in a March decision returning control of the Big Sandy Regional Detention Center in Paintsville to a four-county jail authority.

The hearing request, filed on Tackett's behalf by Covington attorney Jeffrey C. Mando, says the appellate court's March 26 decision which ruled that an earlier state Supreme Court ruling barred Tackett from seeking further legal action in the jail controversy, was "erroneous."

The Court of Appeals decision overturned a January 21, 1992 Johnson Circuit Court ruling that put the operation of the detention center into Tackett's hand. The appellate court said the operation and management issue had been settled in 1989 when the Supreme Court allowed the Big Sandy Regional Jail Authority, comprised of Johnson, Lawrence, Magoffin and Martin Counties, to run the facility.

That ruling, in turn, had reversed a Court of Appeals decision giving Tackett control of the jail.

In response to the petition, Paintsville attorney J.K. Wells, representing the Jail Authority, claims the validity of the jail authority was an issue in the first litigation, filed in 1986. — The Paintsville Herald

prehensive coverage, including health services, preventive dental screenings, periodic physicals, and other benefits.

There would be no deductibles or co-payments for preventive services, and deductibles for other services would be capped at \$400 per person and \$800 per family per year. Maximum co-payments would be 20 percent of a bill from a health care provider who participate in the state program, 50 percent if the provider does not participate.

All Kentuckians would be required to have insurance as of January 1, 1994. They could obtain this coverage in a number of ways, such as through their employer or their spouse's employer, a government assistance program, private purchase, or the state mega-pool.

Low-income Kentuckians (those with household incomes of less than 200 percent of the federal poverty level, or about \$28,000 for a family of four) would receive assistance from the state in buying a low-cost insurance plan that the state will make available to them. All children under 200 percent of poverty would be covered for free. The coverage of this plan would be the same as that offered in the minimum benefit plan.

To help finance universal coverage, a payroll tax of 3.75 percent would be imposed on all Kentucky employers. They would receive a credit against that tax for the money they spend on behalf of health care for their employees.

Improving the Quality and Availability of Care

Consumers would have access to information, developed by the Health Care Authority, on providers' charges and the quality of health care they provide.

Medical education would be restructured in Kentucky to train more primary care/family practice physicians and to locate more physicians in medically underserved areas. There also would be a focus on training more physicians assistants, advanced registered nurse practitioners and nurse midwives. Incentives would be offered to encourage primary care/family physicians to locate in Kentucky.

To make sure all Kentuckians have access to quality care, the state Authority would work with local communities and providers to create networks for delivering health care services.

Additional Provisions

The use of seat belts would be mandatory.

Taxes of up to a certain rate would be imposed on health care providers, ranging from 2 percent on physicians, dentists and others to 4 percent on hospitals and 5.5 percent on nursing facilities.

A person taken into custody on suspicion of being mentally ill and a danger to himself or others could no longer be put in jail. Rather, he would be taken to a hospital or psychiatric facility for evaluation.

Loans and grants available for waste tire projects

The Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Cabinet is now accepting applications for grants and low-interest loans for waste tire projects through the Waste Tire Trust Fund. A limited amount of funding is available for tire removal or control projects.

Businesses and individuals can apply for low-interest loans if they currently have recycling projects underway or have committed to purchase supplies and equipment or to hire personnel for recycling projects. Grants are available to cities, counties and urban-county governments.

Applications will be accepted from May 1 through June 30, 1993. Applicants must meet eligibility and application requirements.

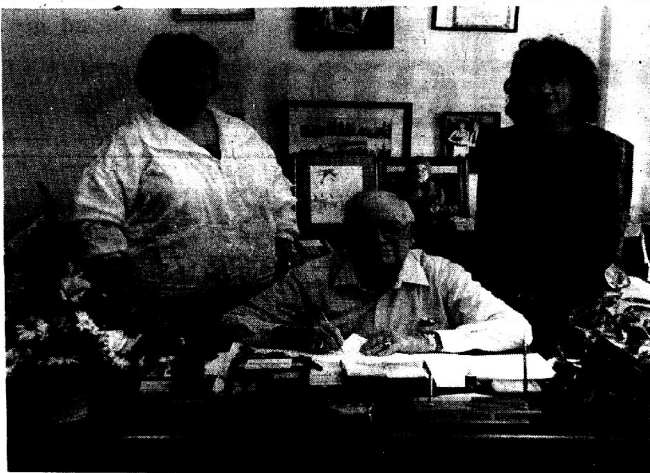

Dear Joe & Shelley,
That's practically a childhood legend. Everyone has heard that you'd kill a butterfly (for a moth) if you rubbed the powder from its wings. But hardly anyone knows why it's actually true.
That powder is really tiny little shingles all over the wings - like scales. Without them, the moth or butterfly cannot control its flying. It dies because we've accidentally taken away its ability to find food and shelter.
This is a terrific thing to do a report on at school. You can even make a model of a moth or butterfly wing out of just paper and tape.

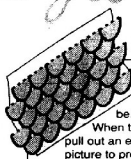
MORE THAN THEY SEEM

WHAT YOU NEED:
Paper - scissors - tape - crayons

WHAT TO DO:
Cut lots of circles. Make them the size of a big coin. Use a half-dollar. Then cut them in half. Color them any color you like.

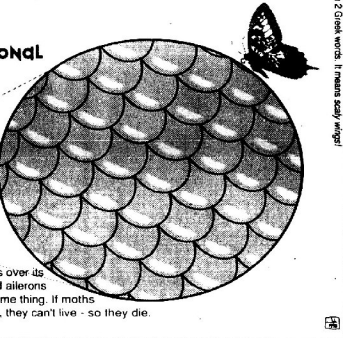
MORE STUFF TO DO:
Tape a row of the half-circles across the bottom of another piece of paper. Start a new row above the first, moved over just a bit, like in this drawing. Keep going until the paper is filled. If you like, use the colors to make a pattern.

SO WHAT: Take your project to school and see if anyone can figure out what it's supposed to be. Tell them it's a butterfly wing. When they say you must be really dumb, pull out an encyclopedia and show them a picture to prove it. Blow air over the wing. What happens?



butterflies - up close & personal

Some schools have microscopes. Some do not. If your school has one, take a moth or a butterfly to class to inspect under the lens. You'll think you're looking at a rooftop covered with shingles. The scales are only on the wing tips.



The scales help the moth or butterfly control the way air flows over its wings. Airplanes use flaps called ailerons (AY-lee-ron) to do the same thing. If moths or butterflies can't fly right, they can't live - so they die.

The first Floyd County Schools Technology Showcase attracted approximately 500 people to the Wilkinson/Stumbo Convention Center on Monday, April 26.
"It was a huge success," said Harold Burchell, technology coordinator for the Floyd County Schools. "I would like to thank the principals, teachers, students, and citizens who made this showcase such a wonderful event."
Students from each of Floyd County's schools participated in the showcase, displaying computers, video equipment, and many other

components of their technology programs.

The technology program is designed to "train our young people for careers that don't even exist today," said Burchell.

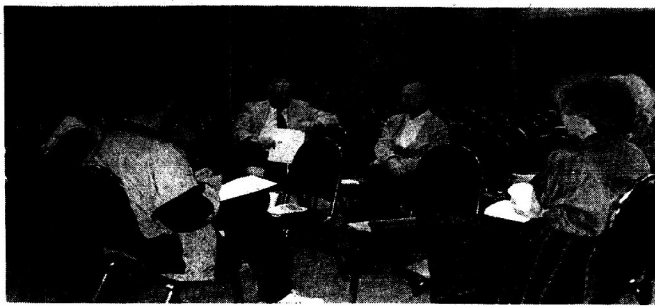

Immunizations underway at health department

The Floyd County Health Department is stepping up efforts to immunize area children against childhood diseases. The week of April 24-30 has been declared National Preschool Immunization Week, and health officials hope to raise parental awareness about the importance of shots for their babies and toddlers. To achieve that goal, health department personnel are doing in-home health screening of programs such as the well-child program and WIC, said Carrie Branham, with the health department. Branham said that she's finding the common age of Floyd County children not immunized is between two and five years old. Before entering kindergarten, students must be immunized. Last year's figures indicate around 95.1 percent of children entering kindergarten were fully immunized — the highest immunization rate recorded for the state. State law requires that all children receive a series of eight vaccines, which are confirmed upon school entry. To be fully immunized, a child must receive the full series of shots. "School entry is the first opportunity for a formal, statewide check of children's immunization status," said Dr. Rice Leach, Health Services Commissioner. "So many parents seem to be under the misconception that shots can wait until closer to first grade entry. They couldn't be more wrong." Branham said that the Floyd County staff is trying to clear up that misconception by explaining the importance of early childhood immunization. Health officials insist that children should actually receive the re-

quired four DTP (diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis) vaccines, three polio shots and one MMR (measles, mumps, rubella) immunization by age two years. Health officials also recommend a series of Hib (Haemophilus influenzae type b) vaccines, not required by state law, by age 15 months. "Many times, children will start out on the proper schedule," Leach said. "But something will happen along the way and they don't finish all of the necessary vaccines, so they do not have a lasting protection against the disease." Leach estimated that only 65 percent of Kentucky two-year-olds have received the full series of immunizations on schedule. "That percentage of adequately immunized two-year-olds lags far behind the goal of 90 percent immunized by the year 2,000," Leach said.

Quit-smoking with the patch

Our Lady of the Way Hospital will offer a three-session program called "Quit Smoking with the Patch". The sessions will be held at the Betsy Layne Elementary School on May 20, 27 and June 1, from 6-7 p.m. The sessions will be held in the Family Resource Building adjacent to the gymnasium. This program offers participants strategies for conquering smoking addiction using the nicotine replacement patch. It also teaches behavior modification and stress management, thereby enabling smokers to handle the problems they cite most often as obstacles to smoking cessation. Rhonda Crisp RN, smoking cessation instructor, will offer information on the types of patches available and tips for successful cessation. A kit will be given to each participant which includes a free cassette on relaxation techniques. The program cost is \$20. Partial and full scholarships are available according to individual financial circumstances. A reduced cost of \$15 is offered to students and senior citizens. Participants are asked to register by calling the Community Health Education Department at Our Lady of the Way Hospital at 285-5181, Ext. 388, between 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.

Local board announces food and shelter help

The Floyd County Emergency Food and Shelter Board announced at April meeting allocations awarded for 1993. The purpose of the announcement is to familiarize Floyd Countians with how federal funds from the Emergency Food and Shelter Program will be used to meet the needs of hungry and homeless people in Floyd County during 1993. Floyd County's total Phase XI Grant was \$23,142, of which only \$463 may be used for administration. United Way of Eastern Kentucky is administering the funds and also acting as the fiscal agent for the county's food pantries. The local board voted to spend \$19,679 on food distributed through the county's food pantries. People in need of food should go to the pantry nearest to where they are living. The names of the pantries, their allotments and information on their services follow. St. Vincent Mission, David, received \$2,501. The pantry is open on Tuesdays and Fridays from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Clients must call Sister Ida Marie Deville at 886-2513 before coming. Mud Creek Clinic received \$5,082. The Mud Creek Clinic pantry is open Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. Clients may contact Eula Hall at 587-2200 or 587-2209. Christian Service Ministries of Drift Presbyterian Church received \$4,032. Clients should call Doreen Martin at 886-2342 between 10 a.m. and noon any weekday or Wednesday afternoon before coming to the pantry at the Drift Presbyterian Church. The Wayland Food Pantry received \$4,032. Its pantry, which is located in the Wayland Methodist Church, is open on Mondays from 6-8 p.m. Clients should call Genia Hall at 358-9328 before coming. The Martin Branch Food Pantry, located in the former Bell Telephone Exchange Office at Estill, received \$4,032. The pantry is open on Wednesdays from 1-3 p.m. Clients may contact Rebecca Patton at 358-4494. The Floyd County Ministerial Association was awarded \$3,000 to meet shelter needs; \$2,000 to meet lodging needs of transients that could not be housed at the Prestonsburg shelter and \$1,000 to provide rent assistance.

The board decided not to allot any money for utility assistance. Federal emergency food and shelter monies are intended to supplement existing services provided by established agencies and not of the agencies which applied for funds had the staff, time and financial set-up necessary to distribute the funds according to guideline. The objectives of the Emergency Food and Shelter National Board Pro-

gram is to allocate funds to the neediest areas, to ensure fast response, to foster public-private-sector cooperation, to ensure local decision-making and to maintain minimal, but accountable, reporting. Floyd County's local board meets regularly to monitor the expenditures of funds. The next meeting is scheduled for 10 a.m. on Thursday, June 3 at St. Martha Catholic Church, Prestonsburg. Board meetings are open to the public and interested individuals are encouraged to attend, especially those who are, or who have been homeless. Public law 102-550, the Housing and Community Development Act of 1992, will require local board to have a homeless or formerly homeless person among their membership in order to have their input and insight on decisions that affect their lives within the community in future phases of the program. Lawyer's advice puts crimp in Governor's health care plan

The Kentucky General Assembly can mandate employers provide health care coverage for their employees, but it cannot specify what minimum health care benefits employers must provide, according to a lawyer who specializes in labor law.

Charles Miller, of the law firm Covington and Burling, testified before the Governor's Commission on Health Care Reform last week. His statements blew a hole in Gov. Breton Jones' plan to impose a 16 percent payroll tax on businesses that do not provide health insurance coverage for their employees.

"So if an employer has a First Aid box and a bottle of aspirin, he can say, 'I provide a benefit so I'm exempt from the payroll tax,'" Rep. Marshall Long, D-Shepleyville, said.

Miller replied yes. "The state has no right to tell an employer he must offer a certain minimum benefit plan," Miller said.

Miller added the state can request employers provide a certain minimum benefit plan or their employees,

and the state can tell insurance providers the minimum insurance benefit plan they must provide.

Miller recommended the state set a minimum wage, then count what employers pay toward health care as part of that minimum wage.

"If the employer doesn't provide health care, then he has to pay the minimum wage," Miller said.

Last week Gov. Jones said he is unsure when he will call a special session of the state General Assembly to amend or vote on his proposed health care plan. The governor's plan calls for universal coverage for all Kentuckians regardless of pre-existing conditions, and lower health care costs.

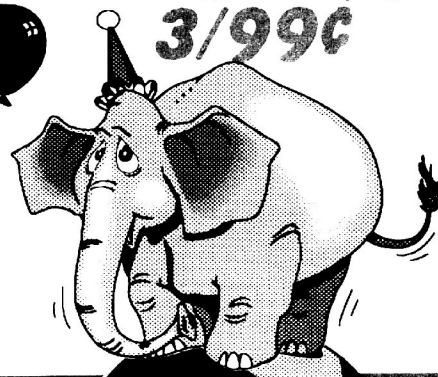

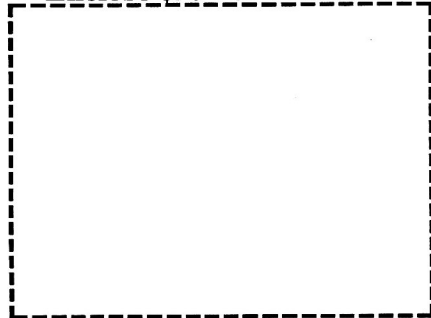

COP AND A HALF

After a long stint as a sex object, Burt Reynolds faded into relative obscurity due to health problems. He found his career revitalized with the hit TV show, "Evening Shade." Now, he's back on the big screen, and he couldn't have found a better vehicle. Reynolds portrays Nick McKenna, a cynical, seen-it-all Tampa, Fla., policeman. His career is his life, and it's obvious there's no one particularly special in it. Maybe it's because he doesn't really like kids all that much.

So, how does McKenna wind up with an 8-year-old "partner"? Devon Butler (Norman D. Golden ID) is the little boy. He's positively obsessed with anything related to cops. He intends to be one someday, and he figures a little practice right now couldn't hurt. Thus, he spends his time in school jumping out at people from behind trees, making "arrests" with his squirt gun, and generally being a pest. 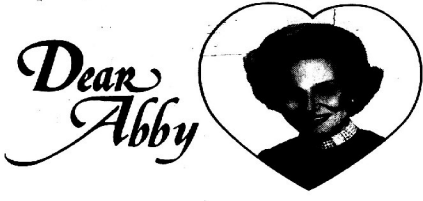

It was a precious day indeed.

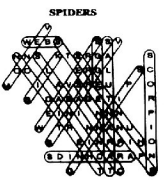

Jason Crisp bunted for a one-out bunt hit to start the fourth. Crisp moved to second on a catcher's overthrow. Designated hitter Robbie Risner followed with a single to score Crisp and Jason Burke collected his second hit of the game by grounding into center field, scoring Risner who was running with the pitch.

Prestonsburg scored twice in the fifth inning and plated two in the sixth.

Aaron Tucker and Anthony Howell each collected three hits in the game. Tucker tripled in the third, driving in Sean Damron who had reached on an error. Tucker later scored on Howell's RBI single.

Tucker three-bagger was a gapper to left center that rolled to the fence that separates the football field from a residential area. Tucker could only make it to third base as the Trojan outfielder retrieved the ball quickly.

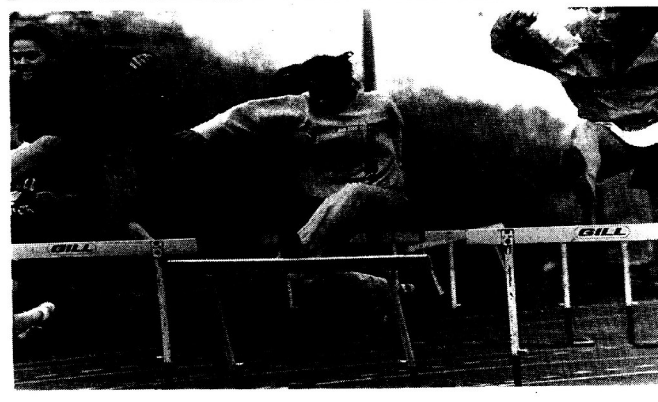
"Tiffany has come a long way for us," said Smallwood. "She is looking real good in the shot put."

The Kentucky all-stars were announced last week. Twelve boys and girls each picked to try and "sweep" Indiana in the summer series.

On paper both teams look solid and should acquit themselves well. Predictably, there were a few eyebrow raisers regarding those left off the teams. I will mention two in particular because of reactions to their not being chosen.

Matt Simons of Shelby County. One wonders how selectors, bent on beating the Hoosiers, could pass on a 6-11 All-State center who has signed with a top Div. I program.

The other is Lori Kluck of Cumberland. The USA Today Kentucky player of the year and three-time All-Stater who led her team to a pair of Class A titles, was sent packing too.

Reactions?
Sports In Ky. has learned that Shelby County Coach Gary Kidwell penned a letter to one member of the selection committee, expressing praise for the group's diligence and said he understood how difficult the selections must have been to make.

Kluck?
"I was hurt at first, but I'm more embarrassed than disappointed," she said last week.

Coach Bond was not as easily mollified as Kidwell. And one can understand his feelings too.

Cumberland's coach brought to the fore questions about the integrity of the Kentucky all-star selection process.

"I definitely think it's a political thing," he said. "There were (team selection) evaluators on the court who had kids from their teams trying out. That's not right."

Sports In Ky. contacted an official from the Kentucky Lions Club Eye Foundation directly involved with the selection process, Joe Bartley.

"We want players based on what they've done in prior seasons. But once they get to the tryouts all those things are erased," Bartley explained. "They don't mean a thing. It's what they do in those two days at the tryouts that count."

The other major criterion, Bartley pointed out, is the coaches pick players they believe they must have to beat Indiana.

"The girls all-stars Coach Leslie Scully puts a premium on speed and quickness," Bartley said, adding that Kim Cunningham (Shelby Co.) and Tootie Shaw (Butler) were chosen ahead of Kluck for those reasons.

About Bond's point that Kluck has to be among the best 12 players in Kentucky?

"We choose by position," Bartley said. "If we took the 12 best players available we could easily wind up with 11 guards and one forward."

And Bond's allegation that coaches of some players were on court during evaluations?

Coach Hatton from Nicholas County (mother of Christie Hatton) had been chosen to take part in the evaluation process long before tryout selections were made, Bartley explained. Likewise, veteran John High of Whitesburg (coach of Amanda Baker and Hillary Swisher).

Bond is right however. If a coach or relative of a player trying out were automatically excluded from the process, allegations of politics would be a no factor.

"Stinkrat" Simpson quit the UK football team last week. It's a mistake! Linebackers last year, both were bent out of shape because they were moved to defensive end, left and right, then became doubly unhappy when they discovered No. 3 in front of their names on the depth chart.

Wells arrived late for a team meeting during spring drills, got himself in a turr, doghouse.

But Wells' decision might not be final. According to Cox, "If Emerson humbles himself and asks for another chance I think this thing can be worked out."

"Emerson's a good kid, a tremendous talent, but sometimes he brings trouble to himself," Cox said. "But I don't think coach Curry has closed the door. Emerson is still there to finish the semester. If he will just humble himself, go see the coach, I think things would be all right."

"I really would like to see him stay," Cox added.

"Emerson is the kind of athlete Kentucky needs to get out of the cellar in the SEC. They can't afford to lose a kid like this. I'm hoping some minds are changed and Emerson stays there."

Emerson Wells' options?
Cox says "my phone is ringing again just like Emerson is being recruited all over again."

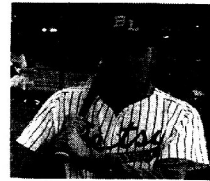

The rains came down and down and down until around 3 p.m. at the Boyd County High School track and field facility as the Allen Central Rebels track and field team traveled to Ashland for the Boyd County Invitational Meet.

While the rains fell and the temperatures were on the cool side, Jenny Wiley and Jessica Wade showed that a 1-A school can compete against 3-A and 4-A competition.

Wade took third place in the highly competitive 1600 meter run with a time of 6:19.00.

"We actually did better than we expected to do at Boyd County," said Jamerson. "When you finish in the top ten at Boyd County you have done something." Allen Central placed eighth in the events last Saturday.

The Rebels relay team of Wiley, Floyd, Nikki Queen and Dreama Isaac placed fourth in the women's 1600 meter relays. The new foursome posted a time of 4:57.09 which was a pleasant surprise for Jamerson.

"This was the biggest surprise of the meet. A first in that it was the first time that this combination has run together in this event," Jamerson explained. "They did very well and are going to get better."
