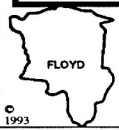

Bingo is back at PHS with board nod

Bingo is back at Prestonsburg High School and the first numbers are expected to be called at the weekly game's revival on Monday, June 7. Floyd County school board members approved a proposal from principal Karen Trivette Wednesday to bring back one of the top money-making fund raisers for that school. Trivette explained that the operation of the activity is an exact replica of the process used by Betsy Layne High School principal Alan Osborne. Under Osborne's plan, formulas are used to distribute the money raised by activity to all extra curricular activities at the school. Trivette added that all the legal paperwork had been filed with state officials to operate the gaming activity and that parents would assist in all aspects of the operation. "We've learned from the mistakes that had been made before," Trivette said.

In the spring of 1991, the local board voted to suspend the weekly bingo games after it was reported by The Floyd County Times that the Prestonsburg Athletic Academic Association (PAAA), which ran the operation, failed to adhere to state charitable gaming laws. A special investigations unit of the Kentucky State Police investigated the gaming operation and reported the findings to the Floyd County Grand Jury. The grand jury declined to return an indictment.

Eastern Kentucky may be the big loser if energy tax enacted

President Bill Clinton's controversial energy plan may spell trouble for Eastern Kentucky, Fifth Congressional District Representative Harold Rogers said Wednesday, costing the region nearly 2,000 jobs. Rogers said in a press release issued Wednesday that Clinton's energy plan, which went before the House of Representatives Thursday, contains the "largest tax increase in America's history" and will have a dramatic impact on rural America,

particularly Eastern Kentucky. According to figures compiled by the Washington, D.C.-based Tax Foundation, Rogers said, total job loss in Kentucky is estimated to be 7,305, with greater loss in Eastern Kentucky than in other portions of the state. The Fifth Congressional District, which contains Floyd County, is expected to lose 1,802 jobs if Clinton's plan is approved. Rogers said, the primarily to greater expenses for energy-intensive businesses, such as coal producers. "I've got to vote no," Rogers said.

"This is the biggest tax increase in the nation's history. More importantly, it hits my district especially heavy. If you buy groceries, it's going to hit you heavy. If you use electricity, it's going to drive up your heating costs and everything you use electricity for. If you drive a car or truck, it's going to hit you heavy because gasoline and diesel fuel will be more expensive. The change I thought people voted for last year was for more jobs and more opportunities, not fewer

Driver held at gunpoint; suspect jailed

A Floyd County man was allegedly held at gunpoint Wednesday by a Prestonsburg woman who demanded the man take her to the First Guaranty National Bank and withdraw funds from an account. The man, Mike Taylor, told police that a woman, identified as Rhonda Harris also known as Rhonda Vanco, came to his business place Thursday claiming that her car had a flat tire and that she was pregnant and needed assistance.

Floyd County deputy Ricky Thornsberry said the victim said the woman pulled out what appeared to be a .45 caliber weapon and said she was wired with explosives. Taylor reported that the woman instructed him to drive to the bank at Martin.

When Taylor pulled into the parking lot at the bank, he fled the vehicle, ran to Jacobs Cligo in Martin and phoned the sheriff's department.

When deputies arrived a short time later, the woman was not in the vehicle and deputies began a search of the area.

Deputy Eugene Hutchinson informed officers that a woman matching the description of the suspect was sitting in a booth at Zippie's Pizza located behind the bank.

Deputy Daniel Hutchinson, who was dressed in plain clothes, entered the pizza parlor while uniformed officers came in through the rear entrance. Daniel Hutchinson briefed

officers and Thornsberry took the woman into custody.

Taylor was brought to the scene of Harris' arrest and identified the woman as the one who held him at gunpoint.

The woman did not have a weapon on her and the shirt she was wearing did not match the description given by police. Officers later found the weapon and clothing at an unknown location near the scene.

Taylor also told officers that the woman said she had wired his home and his neighbor's house with explosives.

FBI agents and Kentucky State Police arrived at the scene after the woman was in custody and took statements from witnesses.

Harris had reportedly been involved in a similar incident in the past.

Earlier reports that the bank had been robbed turned out to be false. The woman reportedly did not enter the bank.

Officers responding to the scene were Sheriff Paul Hunt Thompson; deputies Thornsberry, Daniel Hutchinson, Eugene Hutchinson, Homer Neeley, Lloyd Powers, Johnny Layne, Roy Compton and Ricky Newsome; Martin City Police officers James Stone; and KSP Detectives Lee Weddington, Lynn Cross and Joel Newsome. Two unidentified FBI agents also responded.

The incident is still under investigation by the FBI.

Smoke hasn't cleared yet in primary fire

Despite mechanical malfunctions and apparent vandalism that compelled out-going Commonwealth's Attorney Jerry Patton to request that seven ballot machines be impounded immediately after the election Tuesday, Floyd County Clerk Carla Boyd said Thursday that none of the losing candidates have as yet asked for a vote canvass. Boyd said that she, Patton and Attorney General Chris Gorman had asked the Pikeville Post of the Kentucky State Police to impound the machines after mechanical malfunctions at the Wheelwright, Maytown

and Cliff Number Two precincts forced voters to cast paper ballots and the locks on machines at the Auxier, Abbott Creek, Porter and Garrett precincts had apparently been tampered with. Still, Boyd said, there is no indication that the ballots themselves have been tampered with because the official seals on all voting machines used Tuesday were unbroken. Boyd said that despite wide-spread rumors, no candidate on Tuesday's ballot has yet officially requested a recount. Candidates must file a written request for a canvass in the county clerk's office within a 96-hour period, Boyd said.

The big winners in the election

were incumbent Floyd County Sheriff Paul Hunt Thompson, whose 10,625 vote total was at least 1,400 more than any other candidate on the May ballot and 4,197 more than runner-up opponent John K. Blackburn's 6,428; and Boyd, who defeated opponent Willis Hall by nearly 3,000 votes, with unofficial totals of 9,291 to Hall's 6,525.

Boyd will face GOP competition in November's general election, as will incumbent Floyd County Judge/Executive John M. Stumbo; incumbent District One Magistrate Gerald DeRossett; Magisterial District Two incumbent Jackie Edford Owens; and

Board hires firms to study construction, maintenance

A site preparation contract was awarded Wednesday to Ooten Coal Company for work to begin on the physical education facility at South Floyd High School.

Because the site preparation part of the project was declared an emergency, four companies were contacted to submit proposals and Ooten's \$91,398 cost estimate was the lowest received.

Warco Land Improvement Company gave a \$99,250 quote; Hayes Inc., \$161,000; and Roll Crawl Inc., \$95,250.

The contract includes: fire suppression water line removal, elimination of a high wall between the athletic field and the academic building; site preparation for the gym; installation of a retaining wall; construction of a bus loop; removal of two catch

basins; and relocation of a catch basin.

Board member Eddie Billips asked why companies submitting proposals had been sought out rather than the contract being put out for bids.

Frankie Francis, director of buildings and grounds, explained that part of the project had been declared an

emergency by the board and the board directed the project architect, Paul Hoffman, to seek quotes for the work. The board declared the site preparation work an emergency several months ago.

In other construction issues, the board hired the architectural firm of Ross Feldman to do a comprehensive

analysis of the district's school construction projects.

The analysis by the firm will include a review of contract documents; interviews with the architect, consultants and the construction manager; and a report on each school site.

Also, the board hired the firm on Naim Inc. to perform a similar analysis on the school system's maintenance department. The company will do a total evaluation on the district's maintenance operations and make a report to the board.

Superintendent Steve Towler said he recommended the review and that he felt this type of analysis has been needed.

"We said from the very beginning, this (review) has been needed in Floyd County."

A recommendation to hire consultant Ken Brooks to develop edu-

Floyd miners plead guilty to fraud

Five Floyd County men were among twelve individuals who pleaded guilty to fraudulent respirable coal dust sampling charges Monday in U.S. District Court at Pikeville.

the U.S. Department of Labor and the Mine Safety and Health Administration. Among those who pleaded guilty were Leonard Clark, president and owner of Diamond C Fuels Inc. at Eastern, who admitted that fraudulent dust samples were submitted on his company's behalf between June and October of 1992; Emery Caudill, mine foreman at the Derna Coal Company Number One Mine in Wayland; Jesse W. Cole, section foreman at the M & MB Coal Company Number Four Mine at Drift; Marvin R. Billiter, owner and superintendent of the M & MB Coal Company Number Two Mine at Galveston; and Ralph Edward Stiltner, president and owner of Trina Coal Company Inc. at Drift.

The individual defendants each face a maximum term of imprisonment of one year, a fine up to \$100,000, or both. The coal companies each can be fined up to \$500,000.

Combs; Adams will be double-teamed by Republican challenger Curtis Hall and independent Clinis Hall; and rounding out the Gorman Collins tandem-race, Gorman Collins Jr. will attempt to bring an end to the DeRossett dynasty.

Non-partisan city races, with the exception of the city of Martin, will also appear on the ballot in November.

According to the Tax Foundation's findings, Kentucky ranks ninth in the top ten states to be economically damaged by the Clinton plan; Kentucky's Fifth Congressional District will be the hardest hit of any of the state's six districts; and nearly half a million

jobs are expected to be lost nationwide by 1998.

The Tax Foundation analysis, compiled by Senior Economist Dr. Arthur Hall, was compiled using employment data published by the U.S. Department of Commerce Regional Economic Information Systems, a division of the Bureau of Economic Analysis.

Racing commission in for a fight

The Kentucky Racing Commission may face a bigger fight than it bargained for, House Majority Leader Greg Stumbo said Wednesday, including legal action that could be adjudicated in Floyd Circuit Court.

Stumbo, D-Prestonsburg, met in Frankfort last week with a small contingent of Eastern Kentuckians who had traveled to the state capital to meet with Governor Breereton Jones to protest the racing commission's apparent opposition to the Kentucky Downs harness track project.

Calling the racing commission's

actions "arbitrary and capricious," Stumbo told the group that he had prepared legislation that would abolish the commission and prohibit off-track betting parlors. That legislation was pre-filed on Tuesday, Stumbo said.

However, Stumbo said Wednesday, he met over the weekend with other attorneys to prepare a lawsuit against the racing commission and had discovered that grounds may exist to try the case in Floyd County, rather than in Franklin Circuit Court.

"We're attacking the commission on several different fronts," Stumbo said, "and will continue to attack from every feasible position.... What

they effectively did was to revoke or suspend a right that had been previously granted by placing a requirement on it that could not be accomplished.... Every fair-minded citizen ought to be infuriated by the damn commission's rulings."

Unfortunately, Stumbo said, any litigation will have to wait until after the racing commission's next meeting in June, because under its by-laws, none of the commission's rulings are technically final until they have been voted upon at a following meeting.

Still, Stumbo said, he will not be idle.

In a press release issued Thursday, Stumbo said that he and co-sponsor Representative Russell Bentley, D-Topmost, have requested that the legislative Committee on Business Organizations and Professions conduct hearings as soon as possible on his proposed legislation to abolish the racing commission.

"East Kentucky has already had one awful encounter with 'robber barons' when the mineral companies took land owners' wealth hiding behind broadform deeds," Stumbo said. "We don't need another robber in the guise of off-track betting parlors that are just vacuum cleaners sucking the dollars out of the communities into the hands of racing interests in other parts of the state."

That legislation could be discussed soon by the Kentucky General Assembly, Stumbo said.

In the meantime, he said, Eastern Kentucky Racing President Clyde Woods has requested live racing rights for 1994 and continues efforts to get Kentucky Downs up and running.

• board members canceled B & J Construction Company's security contract for South Floyd High School and hired Collins Security to provide security at the site.

The meeting was recessed until Thursday, June 3 at 6:30 p.m. at Allen Elementary. The meeting is open to the public.

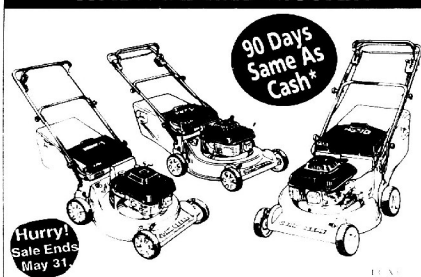

Now, the hard part

Thursday's House vote on the Clinton economic program is a huge political test for the President. If he fails to muster enough Democratic support—by finding ways to make new taxes more palatable and spending restraint credible—his administration will have all the authority of a deflated balloon.

It's also a big test for members of Congress and, by extension, their constituents. Bewailing the unacceptable deficits that Clinton inherited is easy. Posturing about waste draws cheap applause. Now comes the hard part—doing something. Clinton proposes a combination of higher taxes and budget trimming. Critics say there are too many of the former and not enough of the latter—as critics always do. Skeptics worry that new money will set off a spending frenzy. It's fair, indeed, to insist on discipline and accountability.

But the bottom line is that these are the only deficit-reduction tools available. And in applying them, Congress and the President must find a balance that doesn't penalize those who are already hurting.

For all the screaming, Clinton's tax measures fairly allocate the pain. More is asked of those who have more—many of them folks who profited from tax cuts for the rich during the Reagan years.

The source of much of the resistance is the Bu

tax, based on heat content of fuels and other energy sources. Companies in the coal and oil business don't like it but have less reason to complain now that they have won relief in the form of partial exemptions or fairer collection mechanisms. They should be grateful they escaped a carbon tax, which would have fallen more heavily on this region.

In addition to raising money, an energy tax should encourage energy conservation. Yes, middle class families will pay a little more for fuel and other products, but an expanded earned income credit will offset the cost for those with low incomes.

Whatever its shortcomings, this plan takes accurate aim at the nation's overarching problem. Clinton deserves Congress' help. —Louisville Courier-Journal

"Gender equity"

If women make up 54 percent of the student body at XYZ University, should they receive 54 percent of the athletic scholarships? A National Collegiate Athletic Association task force has suggested just that: simplistic approach to achieve "gender equity" in college sports.

The task force's recommendation should be rejected by the full NCAA.

At present, the average Division I school spends \$849,000 annually on athletic scholarships for men and \$373,000 for women. Sexism? Not necessarily. In America's high schools, 3.4 million boys play school sports in comparison to 1.9 million girls. Colleges could — should — do better by girls. But must they confer a sexual mix nonexistent in sports elsewhere?

The committee also erred in failing to appreciate the special status of football, which can take up to 85 scholarships. Because there is no women's sport with such a large roster, the pigskin alone accounts for much of the sexual gulf.

To achieve pristine gender parity, the practical choices are to give scores of new scholarships in such emerging women's sports as archery, badminton and squash or else to whack the number of football. But most colleges can ill-afford either option. The only money-maker in most programs is football. Degrading it by axing scholarships ultimately means less money for everyone, including women athletes. —The Daily Independent, Ashland

A victory for sense

This week, the Senate confirmed Roberta Achtenberg as assistant housing secretary for fair housing and equal opportunity in the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

That was news for only one reason, she's gay. If you walk upright and don't drag your knuckles, that shouldn't bother you. Achtenberg's sexual preference has as much to do with how well she'll do her job as the color of her grandmother's hair.

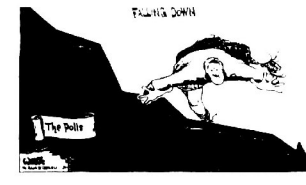
But unfortunately, some members of the Senate don't think so.

The majority of the debate over Achtenberg's confirmation centered on the fact that she is a lesbian. The debate raged for three days. Senators voting against her said Achtenberg will be a threat to traditional families. They suggested that she might discriminate against heterosexuals—a claim that seems pitifully desperate at best.

But in the end, common sense and justice prevailed. The Senate confirmed Achtenberg by a vote of 58-31. Kentucky Senator Wendell Ford was in the majority, despite a heavy campaign by a conservative religious group to influence him otherwise.

Progress on the issue is slow, but Achtenberg's confirmation is a clear sign that it is moving in the right direction. —Lexington Herald-Leader

Former Hospice director speaks at National hospice organization management meeting

Chris Conley, former executive director of Hospice of Big Sandy, was a consultant and workshop presenter at the National Hospice Organization's eighth annual Conference on Management Issues on Thursday, May 20.

The management conference is an annual event which is designed to provide information and assistance for the administrative personnel of hospice programs across the United States.

Conley had been invited by Galen Miller, director of Education for NHO, to make a presentation at a concurrent session on the importance of Boards of Directors developing a self-evaluation process. The basis for the workshop was the work done by the National Center for Non-Profit Boards while she was the director of the program. Conley's workshop was well-attended by over 300 NHO members representing boards of directors and program directors from across the country.

Others at the conference were Leon Panetta, director of the Office of Budget and Management for President Clinton and a valued friend to hospices for several years. Panetta's opening remarks at the Plenary Session set the tone for the entire conference as he challenged hospice personnel throughout the country to work

to keep hospice cares and concerns in the forefront of the national healthcare agenda.

The speaker at the NHO Luncheon on Friday, May 21st, was Dr. Charlotte Beason, the Director of Educational Programs for the Department of Veterans Affairs, a member of the President's Health Care Reform Task Force and a close friend of Conley's since their days as Berea College classmates. Conley was invited to share the head luncheon table with Dr. Beason, Jay Mahoney, president of the National Hospice Organization, Betty Schmitt, chairman of the NHO Board of Directors and several other members of the NHO Board.

Dr. Beason spoke about the challenges which confronted the task force and the additional challenges facing the country as through reforming of the health care system in this country. Her remarks urged the NHO membership to take up the challenges of this reform and to work to promote hospice ideals and philosophy in the healthcare system at large.

Although she is no longer associated with Hospice of Big Sandy, Conley intends to continue pursuing her commitment to the work of hospice and hopes to continue to be involved on both state and national levels regarding issues relating to hospice care.

Welt had two runs batted in with a triple for the Indians. Welt collected three hits and had three RBIs. Mike Goble also had three hits with two runs batted in.

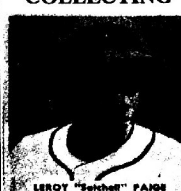
Josh Howell led the Indians from the plate with his four hits. He scored three times. Adam Akers and Barrett Blankenship each had two hits.

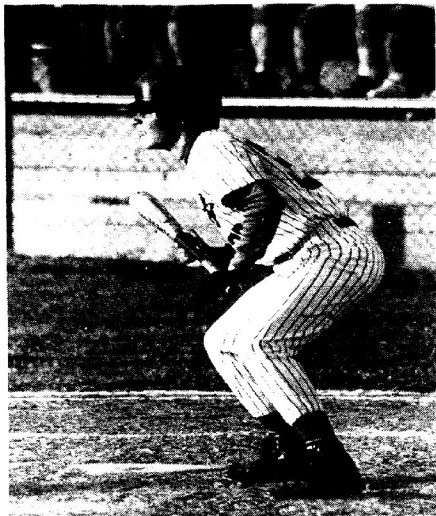

We had a total of 47 that actually attended the camp. The tryout lasted about five and a half hours, so my manager and coaches had plenty of time to evaluate the talent.

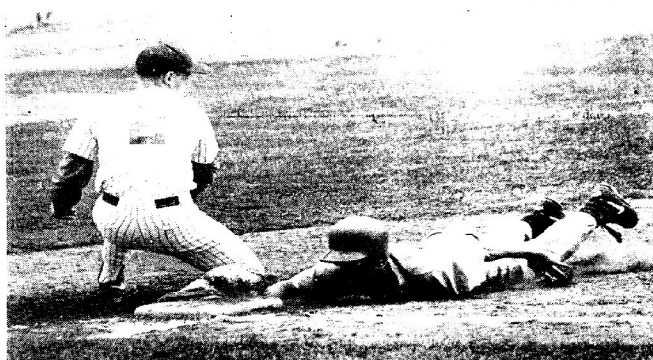

Betsy Layne Center bridges the generation gap

When the Betsy Layne Senior Citizens Center opened its doors in 1988, it promised to be a community meeting place that also offered needed services for older adults. So far it has lived up to that promise. Although its initial location, a building on the grounds of the old Betsy Layne High School, was temporary, the center quickly became a fixture in the community.

In 1989, the center was relocated to a prefab building just off Route 23 near the Betsy Layne fire department building. With the move came the gradual expansion services and activities for residents in an area that includes Allen, Banner, Prater and Mud Creek, as well as Betsy Layne. The center is not just for older

adults. The center offers programs that residents from youth to old age can take part in. Now activities on the agenda include line dancing every Tuesday from 6 to 8 p.m., and "skinny school" held every Monday night. "The 'skinny school' is a diet program set up for the public," center director Teresa Campbell said.

This fall the center hopes to bridge the generation gap by starting an "adopt-a-grandparent" program in which students from Betsy Layne High School volunteer to keep in contact with shut-ins who are Meals On Wheels clients. "The students will call, write letters and visit their 'adopted grandparent,'" Campbell said.

The program will be directed by Lisa Roberts, coordinator of the Community Service Center at the high school.

Thursday, Betsy Layne senior citizens took part in the "Heritage on the Hill Day," a community gathering at the high school in which students and senior citizens mingled their talents and interests in a celebration of the past and the present. Activities and exhibits centered on quilting, genealogy, crocheting, computers, science, line dancing and more.

Other events sponsored by the center focus on meeting the needs of older adults. One of the needs is socialization. "A lot of senior citizens don't have a family. Here, they can come by and enjoy themselves and just relax," Campbell said.

More than just a place to socialize, the center offers such services as recreation, transportation, congregate meals, home-delivered meals, escorts for doctor and dentist appointments and information and referral.

Health promotion is an important aspect of the center. Guest speakers in the health care field are often invited to the center to talk to seniors about health promotion and prevention. Recently, one such guest was David Eastland of the Christian Appalachian Project. Eastland is studying to be a doctor and while at the center, he checked seniors' blood pressures; then, during an informal lecture, he answered concerns they had about health problems such as hypertension and heart disease.

The center also has fund raising activities. In May, seniors participated in a yard sale and hot dog sale with proceeds going to the center. The center also has a special crafts room where handicrafts the seniors make are displayed for sale.

On tap for the future is an August 28 horse show to be held at Prestonsburg's Archer Park. Proceeds from the show will be divided between the county's senior citizen centers. Campbell is also working on raising funds for a proposed senior citizens housing complex which will be constructed on property next to the center. Grant money will pay a large part of the construction costs of the building. In order to receive the grant, Campbell must have 30 housing applicants. She has twenty and she is looking for ten more.

Campbell, of Banner, was named center director last September and it is a job she loves. "I get into it," she smiled. "Seniors are great people to work with."

Martin Senior Citizens Center :

"A good place to communicate"

Attention older Floyd Countians: the Martin Senior Citizens Center is not, repeat, not a nursing home and it isn't a place to wither and grow old. If anything, at least according to those who know it best, it's a place to celebrate and enjoy life, providing a shining beacon for those twilight years.

The center was first formed in May 1978, organized in downtown Martin with the help of the Big Sandy Area Development District by a group of seniors who were tired of having to travel to Prestonsburg every week just to congregate with their peers.

When the center first started, it catered to seniors from as far away as Betsy Layne, Mud Creek, Garrett and McDowell, although the continuing expansion of the senior citizens program has now provided centers in most of the county's larger communities.

Although the center was a huge success, catering to several patrons every day, the facility was located in the flood plain and was frequently

half-submerged whenever the Big Sandy overran its banks. So in 1982, then-director Dee Burchett and the seniors moved the center's facilities for higher ground, the Town Plaza Center.

Town Plaza, with an apartment complex catering to older Kentuckians, provided a uniquely suitable location, allowing the senior center's many clients easier access to its services and making it far easier to continue food delivery to the homebound.

Iris Chapman, director of the center since 1989, said Wednesday that the center now provides home food delivery to 25 clients every day, but even more congregate at the center itself for good food and good times with good friends.

Among those good times are the many trips the seniors group takes throughout the year, including visits to Natural Bridge, the Breaks Interstate Park and, most recently, to Renfro Valley. Twelve of the center's patrons went on the Renfro Valley trip, Chapman said, ranging in age from 65- to 89-years-old.

"It was kind of a Mother's Day trip for themselves," Chapman said.

Although park and museum tours are fairly popular with the center's clients, Chapman said, the most requested junket is to county's cultural center, the Prestonsburg Wal-Mart store.

"Most of them don't have a way to go anywhere," Chapman said. "(The center bus) is their sole means of transportation."

Still, Chapman added, the most important aspect of the center is the people who use it. They agree.

"I don't know what we'd do without them," 91-year-old Claudia Cox, who has visited the center since its inception, said Wednesday. "It couldn't be any better. It's good for senior citizens.... They really take care of me."

"It's just a good place for everybody to meet and communicate and just talk," Edna Franklin, a client since 1985, said. "We get together and do all kinds of activities, play games.... It keeps me active."

"We get so many women here who have just lost their husbands," Chapman said. "Most of them have never really taken care of any kind of business. They come here and say 'I don't even know how to write a check out.'"

But, Chapman continued, the members of the group stick together and help each other out.

"When they first come here, they're usually really shy and backward," Chapman said, "but they snap out of it pretty quick."

In an effort to help even more people, Chapman said, the center will soon be expanding its Town Plaza facilities, making more room to accommodate the 30-40 patrons who congregate for lunch every day. Chapman will also soon be making more trips to the David community, which is currently without its own center, helping to provide transportation and food delivery services.

Currently, the Martin Senior Citizens Center is state-funded and relies on private donations and volunteers like Juanita Ratliff and Karen Stone to help provide services throughout the area. Services are free.

The center is open from 8 a.m. until 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. The public is welcomed with open arms.

Wayland center on the move

It was a swing from one end of the spectrum to the other when Sharon Smith decided to head the Wayland Senior Citizens Center almost a year ago.

Once a children services worker for Mountain Comprehensive Care Center, Smith decided to forego the long drive from her home in Knott County and take the job of director of the Wayland center.

"I'm glad I made the change," Smith said Wednesday. "The people, the seniors, are the best part of the job. From the first day I felt like I belonged here."

A new program scheduled to begin in Wayland this summer will be a part-time adult day care center. Smith said on Tuesdays and Wednesdays the center will offer the adult day care center. Anyone interested in the day care service should phone or stop by the center to pick up a referral form.

Seniors don't just sit around at the Wayland center they have many activities to keep them on the go.

Fishing trips, shopping trips, education and health promotions and monthly pot luck dinners help keep the 25 seniors in the Wayland, Gar-

rett and Beaver area from getting bored.

The center provides 21 meals daily to homebound seniors, Smith said. Also telephone reassurance calls and friendly visits to citizens unable to come to the center allows Smith to keep in touch with their needs.

Also available at the center is a grocery pick up and delivery service to those citizens who need a few items to make it through until the weekly trip to the grocery store.

Funding for the center comes in part from the Big Sandy Area Development District and private donations. For more information about the Wayland center call 358-4161.

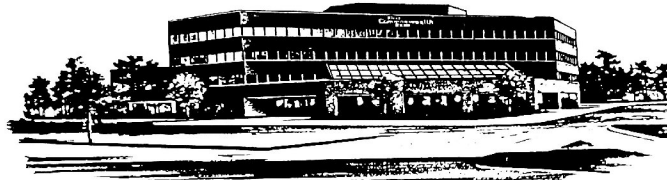

P'burg seniors gain strength from community

In a valley near Prestonsburg, the tinkling sounds of youngsters as they scramble through metal and wooden jungles merge with the chuckles of oldersters as they toss horseshoes, play croquet or square dance.

Nestled in the dell of Archer Park, Prestonsburg Senior Citizens Center rocks with activity. Quilting keeps fingers nimble; walking and sports activities keep bodies supple; and guest speakers keep minds alert.

Senior citizens play pool, card games and exercise. Men gather around the pool table and engage in a casual, endless eight-ball competition. Seniors string beans, peel and freeze apples, make ice cream and hold luaus. They also hold cook-outs, fashion shows, hayrides, rummage

sales, square dances and old-fashioned pie suppers.

A small garden located behind the center lets seniors combine their talents to produce nourishing additions to their meals.

Their talent extends into the community through the crafts they make and display at the Mountain Heritage Arts and Crafts Center. The crafts create a homey atmosphere at the center. Flowering baskets made by Orbic Vaughn hang from the ceilings. Quilts adorn the walls and curtains hang from the windows — all made by the hands of the seniors.

Their footsteps, made from colored paper and traced from the feet of the members, blaze a trail across the wall of the center. Their feet have also trod the world. The group has visited Hawaii, New England, The Smokies, Nashville and Renfro Val-

ley. They have participated in West-coast tours, enjoyed the ocean at Myrtle Beach and walked the trail of monuments in Washington, D.C.

The center is place of solace, a place to boost the spirit. It is like a second home to Lucy McGuire, who lives alone. McGuire is the center's quilter. Her friend, Dixie Campbell, a former quilter whose hands have become stilled by arthritis, keeps the quilting needles threaded. Both feel a sense of accomplishment with their work at the center.

"I go home and say, 'well, I've done something good today,'" said Campbell.

Senior athlete Troy McKenzie also feels the thrill of success. McKenzie won eight gold medals in the Kentucky Blue Grass games. He will participate in the national games in June.

Victoria Lafferty lives in the country and would spend her days alone but for the companionship she finds at the center. Members of the center "are one big happy family," says Grace Rowe, who is also a member of a senior citizens center in Florida.

"You can't come here sad and go away without laughing," she said with a twinkle in her eye.

Some members find the center gives them a reason to get up in the morning. "You'll wash your face, comb your hair, and get out," said Julia Stephens, chuckling.

Senior Minnie Music James said the center kept her from "going crazy" after her husband, L.J. Music, died. She was home alone, "doing nothing." She began losing weight. But once she began going to the center, she regained her weight. She met John James, a member for the past six years, and the two married.

The seniors attribute the family atmosphere to director Patsy Evans. "She's so good to us," said Orville Cooley. "She mothers us, cares for us, and entertains us."

Belle Harless agrees. "She's like an old mother hen with her biddies." Harless said her vision is deteriorating. Evans makes sure someone guides her when she travels with the group.

Evans doesn't shut herself off behind the doors of an office. Her desk is an important part of the center and seniors can be found congregated around her when she isn't leading them in exercise activities. She has

traveled in the guise of a clown with seniors on their visits to distribute cheer and crafts to area nursing homes. During a recent trip to a nursing home, they distributed 25 hand-made lap robes to residents.

"Words cannot describe the heart-felt service we provide," said Evans. "Pictures do not portray the true picture because we get the joy of seeing a smile return to a face, a twinkle in an eye, a spring in the step and reason for living return."

In one case, that reason for living took the form of a wedding — "with the whole works" — at the center. Approximately 200 people attended.

"The snow was flying that day and we took them (the newly married couple) home on the senior van. We put 'Just Married' on the back of the bus," said Evans with a chuckle.

The center is more than a place to find the face of a friend, though. It is a place to keep them active and healthy. The various activities keep them on their feet, said Jonah Hall, who will be 86 in July. He attributes the center for his agility because of the exercise and walking activities it offers.

Seniors can also eat a well-balanced meal at the center daily. They also eat more when eating with a

companion. Seniors don't do "much cooking," said Hager White, whose husband Rainey White was one of the first members of the center.

The center began about twenty years ago when Ed Music looked down on a valley of weeds and saw the beauty and potential for a senior citizens center there. Folks told him he was crazy, said Evans, but he visualized it and made it happen. Music, Dr. George Archer and Judge Henry Stumbo went to Washington and gained funding for the building of Kentucky's first senior citizens center.

The Prestonsburg center provides various services for the elderly, including visitation programs, transportation, telephone reassurance, health promotions and hot meals. The center feeds approximately 30 seniors per day, plus 35 others through the home delivered meals program. Clients range in age from 60 to 100, and the center has a waiting list to become enrolled in the program.

To feed that many people and to keep the center open and active requires a lot of funding. The budget is around \$78,000. The center receives assistance through the Big Sandy Aging Services, the county, the city and Archer Park, but budget cuts have

sliced deep into center funding.

To offset budget cuts, the center has numerous fundraising activities, including food booths at festivals, pie sales, knife sales, yard sales and Smokey Mountain Wrestling exhibitions. They have sold quilts, afghans and even turkeys. Area businesses also sponsor monthly birthday parties for the seniors.

The Prestonsburg Senior Citizens Center has won various awards for its commitment to area seniors. In 1990, it received the first award of an annual competition sponsored by the Kentucky Division of Aging. The center also was awarded \$500 from the Kentucky Association of Electric Cooperatives. It has won mammogram awards and awards for its window displays.

Evans visualizes the center as a lofty tree, tall and sturdy, standing in an open field with its roots running deep and its limbs reaching out, bringing services into the seniors center. The strength of the tree comes from its roots, said Evans, which runs deep into the community, the city, the county and the state. The leaves of the tree fall into the lives of the senior citizens, enhancing their condition and bringing joy into their hearts.

Construction to begin soon for new McDowell Senior Center

Coming soon to a vacant lot near you (if you live at McDowell, that is) a brand-new, state-of-the-art, up-to-the-minute senior citizens center that provides tender loving care and community service to the young, old and everyone in between.

Bonnie Hale, director of Human Services for the Big Sandy Area Development District, said Wednesday that the McDowell area senior citizens group has for the past two years been congregating at McDowell's First Baptist Church on Tuesdays and Thursdays, with transportation and food delivery services provided by the Wheelwright Senior Citizens Center and organized by director Lois Curry and a group of devoted volunteers.

Sandy Valley Transportation

transports the group to and from the church, Curry said Wednesday, and she and the Wheelwright senior citizens and volunteers cater food to the congregation, as well as to homebound seniors.

"Anything that I do at Wheelwright, they do at McDowell," Curry, who has been the director of the Wheelwright center for the past 14 years said. "We try to make sure they have everything they need."

However, Hale said, the Wheelwright group will soon be relieved of the double-duty by the new facility, which will function not only as a senior citizens center, but also as a child care and community center.

The project, to be built at McDowell across from the under-construction Minnie apartment complex, will function as a day care center for children from infants to preschool age playing and learning un-

der the watchful eyes of local older Floyd Countians.

Hale said that she and the center's board of directors, which is made up of senior citizens and McDowell residents, have worked hard to ensure that the center will cater to the community's needs without duplicating the services provided by the family resource center.

The board is currently advertising for construction proposals, Hale said, and if all goes according to schedule, construction on the new senior center should begin by late July and the facility should be ready for business by January, 1994.

The McDowell Senior Citizens Center project and the services that the facility will provide are being funded through state grants and private donations and depends primarily on volunteer efforts, Hale said.

The center which serves the senior citizens in the Wheelwright area offers its members a variety of programs which promote not only good health and physical fitness, but also social interaction. Lois Curry, the director of the Wheelwright Center says, "The members enjoy the activities that we provide." The center serves an average of 23 senior citizens per day.

Health promotion is one of the services offered by the center to promote good health and physical fitness. This program consists of health screening and exercise programs such as walking.

The seniors are taken to Our Lady of the Way Hospital in Martin regularly for screening of their blood pressure, etc. Once a month, George Archer, from Highlands Regional Medical Center, comes to Wheelwright to discuss changes and concerns about Medicare. The center provides low-cost and nutritious meals daily to seniors. The center delivers 27 lunches to homebound seniors in the Wheelwright area and 20 in the McDowell area. The center also provides lunches Tuesdays and Thursdays to those seniors who attend the McDowell Center. In July, McDowell will begin providing their own meals.

Exercise is provided to the seniors in many ways. One of the more popular activities is the Senior Olympics, which I attended. It was wonderful to see the seniors involved in so many activities. One of my favorite events was the line dancing. It was amazing and exciting to watch seniors from all around Kentucky do line dances such

as Cotoneyed Joe and the Achy Breaky. It gave the seniors a chance to prove just how fit they were. There were many volunteers who gave their time to help make this event possible. They all deserve a special thanks.

Walking is another way that the seniors exercise. They walk around the walking track at the Weeksbury Park. Good health and physical fitness are encouraged a great deal at the center.
