6 indicted in 2008 jail beating

PRESTONSBURG — Six men accused of the 2008 beating of a fellow prisoner in the Floyd County Detention Center were indicted this week by a grand jury. PRESTONSBURG

On Aug. 10, 2008, Terry Fisher, then a prisoner at the Floyd County Detention Center, was reportedly found near death in his cell, after allegedly being assaulted by upwards of 10 other inmates. On Tuesday, a Floyd County grand jury

indicted six men on charges of complicity to first-degree assault. Ivan Gunnels Jr., 31 of Eastern; Christopher N. Newsome, 38 of Harold; Larry Thomas Adkins II, 30 of Pikeville; Kevin Woods, 26 of Allen; Matthew

Ritchie, 28 of Garrett; and Stephen Jervis, 50 of Prestonsburg, were each charged with one count of complicity first degree assault. Two of the men, Gunnels and Adkins, were additionally indicted as persistent felony offenders.

Commonwealth's Attorney, Brent Turner, trial for the men is set to begin on Feb. 6, and all of the men charged will be tried together. According to statements




