His slayer, Joe Nelson, negro, was shot through his wrist and thigh and a third bullet grazed his head. A second negro, Robert "Pump" Finley, was shot in his arm and twice in his leg as he fled the room in which the battle was staged at close range.

Ne'son fled to the hills but surrendered to Wheelwright police Tuesday night and was jailed here after midnight Tuesday.
