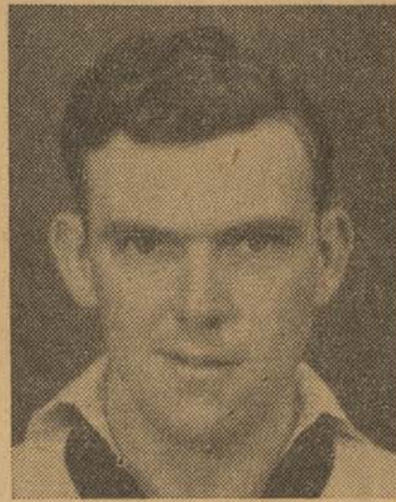
**Pfc. Stumbo in Germany With Infantry Regiment**

**19th Combat Engineers, With Laferty a Member, Ask and Get Recognition**



"Wherever Stars and Stripes reporters have gone—Tunisia, Sicily, Italy—they've always run across the 19th combat engineer regiment. And, like all Joes who are proud of their outfits, the men have asked: 'Hey, when are you going to do a story on the 19th combat engineers?'"

The 19th, thus distinguished in a story published in **THE STARS AND STRIPES**, is the unit to which **Otis V. Laferty**, 24-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. P. D. Laferty, of Lackey, is attached—and the 19th has done a good job of it in the long, slow, grinding campaign up the Italian "Boot."

The 19th began its distinguished record in a landing at Oran in early November, 1942, since that time has fought through Tunisia, Sicily and Italy as infantry, has built roads, bridges, airfields, pillboxes, drained swamps, laid pipelines and operated rock quarries. It is one of the few units in the Mediterranean theater to be authorized the Silver Star for its theater ribbons representing five campaign stars.

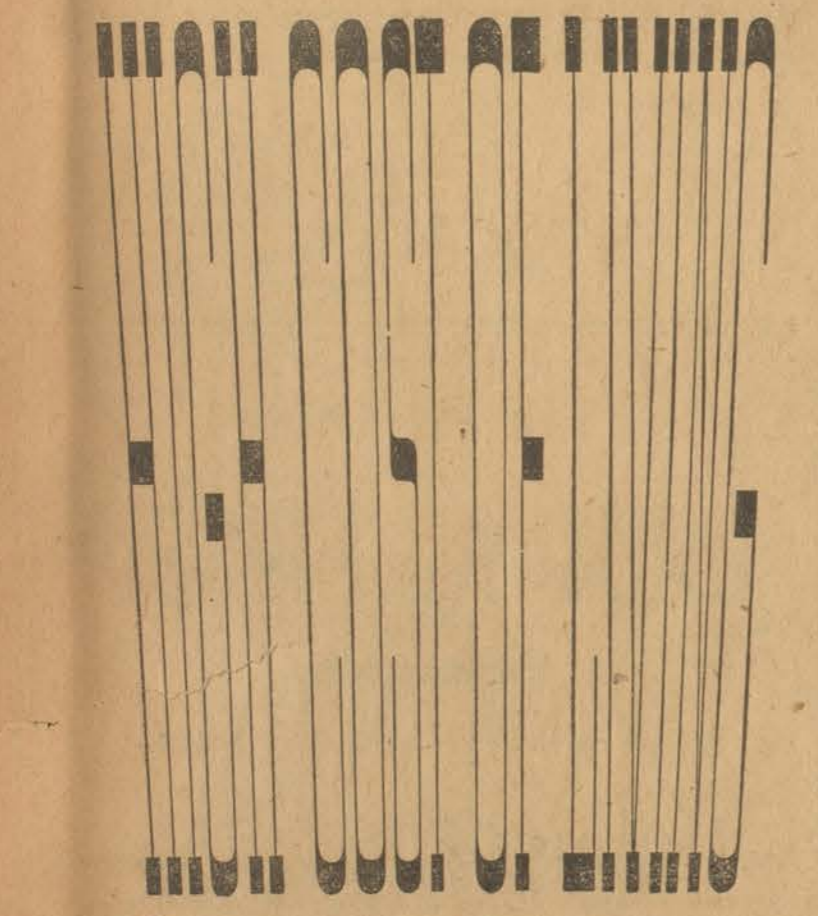
