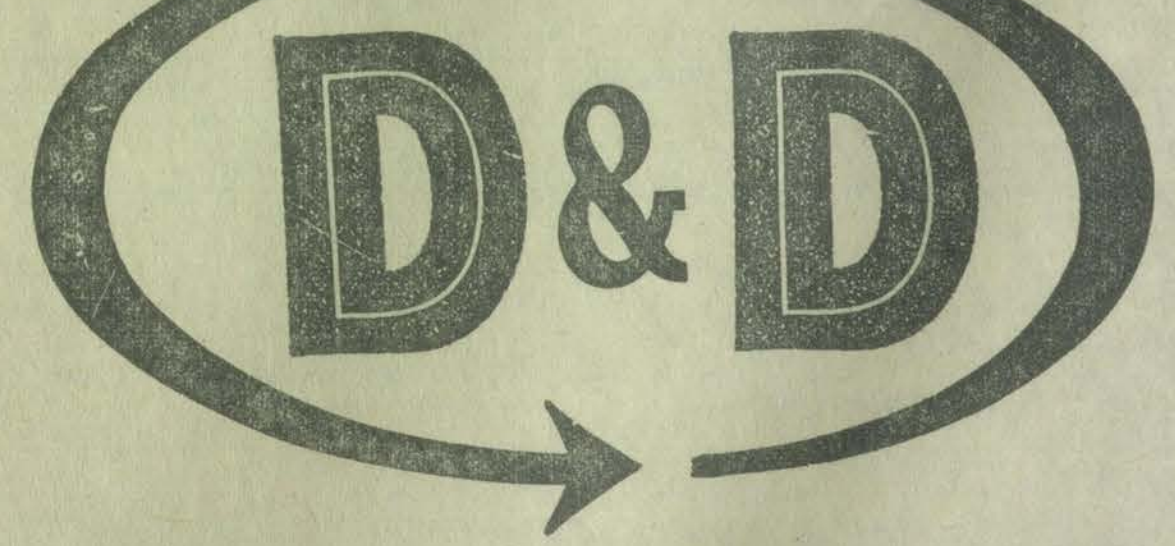

### Leaflets Discuss Home Furnishings

"Backgrounds and Furnishings," one of the major phases of home furnishings subject matter, is what most people have in mind when they speak of "interior design" or "interior decorating," says Miss Beth Burr, area extension agent in home furnishings.

The University Extension Service has leaflets available on this topic, also on "Consumer Information" and "Skills and Renovation."

Basic color should really be studied first, according to Miss Burr, because the success of everything else in the home depends upon your choice of color. Color combinations throughout the house are important and can give a sense of unity to all the rooms.

Decorating with a plan gives promise that, through long-time planning, one cannot only purchase what is needed but will also have everything looking as if it belonged together.

Important features to consider—walls and woodwork. Having them light in color and soft in texture, not shiny, makes them easier to live with longer.

Finishes for floors—there are two kinds—a built-up finish and a penetrating seal. The latter is easier to repair in worn areas and does not show scratching.

Arrangement of furniture and accessories such as pictures, lamps, flowers, books, and dozens of things give the room an orderly atmosphere or one of clutter and absence of unity.

Window treatment adds or detracts from the over-all room plan. Many homes have problem windows, and there are special ways of dealing with them. Draperies can either match the wall, or a patterned material may serve to unite all the colors in the room.

Mixing old and new furniture is an ever-present task. It's the wood, color, line, and style that decide whether the old will go with the new or the new with the old.

Furniture for outdoor living is constantly being improved. Some is guaranteed against rusting. The major concern here is comfort and lasting quality. Sit or recline in it before purchasing. Get the guarantee, and keep it.

Attractive tables for all your meals is an important topic, because it implies concern for one's favorite people—the family. Information on selection of china, glassware, silver and linens, and how to put them together for an attractive setting is contained in a leaflet available from the Extension Service.

Above, over, or beside each of these items of furnishings should be an attractive glow of light. Lighting the home is important, first for eye health, and second for beautifying what you have put time, money, and effort into.

University Extension is a service to people. The Homemakers organization is an Extension organization for reaching people. Homemakers let agents know what they want to study.

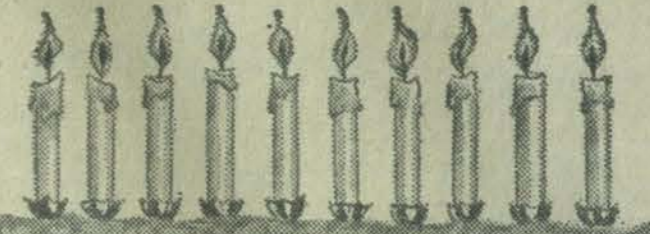
