Group Plans Suit For KAI Bldg.Use

Claim Irving Rent Demand Stalls Plant

All members of the Prestonsburg Industrial Corporation who were present at a meeting held here last Wednesday night agreed to take legal action in an attempt to regain control of the KAI building at West Prestonsburg from Irving Industries.

Other members contacted later concurred in the proposal.

Those attending the meeting were unanimous in the decision that they have no other recourse. At least two manufacturers have expressed an interest in locating here if the building is available, but negotiations with Irving have drawn only rental offers and a selling price that are regarded as unreasonable.

Irving holds a lease agreement to the effect that as long as it pays \$1,100-amonth to sublease the structure back to the Industrial Corporation. According to Edward Music, chairman of the Industrial Corporation, it has set a sale price of \$240,000 on the building.

A Boston firm which would have employed 30 initially and 130 within two year has lost interst while the attempt to get the building for its plant failed. Music said a South Carolina clothing manufacturing firm which would have

Woman Accused **Of Knife-Slaying Of Her Husband** Bond of \$9,000 was asked Tuesday afternoon by County Judge Henry Stumbo for the release from jail of Mrs. Hattie Sue Wagner Hatfield, 26, who is accused of the knife-slaving late last Friday afternoon at the Hatfield home on Spurlock Fork of Middle Creek of her husband, Cledith Hatfield, also 26. Bond was set for her appearance in response to grand jury action after Commonwealth testimony was heard at the woman's examining trial. The defense did not offer testimony. Principal witnesses at the hearing were the dead man's parents, Morrow and Loma Calhoun Hatfield, whose home is near that of their son. Mr. Hatfield said he saw his daughter-in-law with a knife, heard her during the course of an argument with her husband say, "I'll kill you if I can." He said the two then disappeared from his sight and that he later heard his wife cry, "Lord, have mercy !- Sue, what have you done?". He added, that upon running to the nearby home he found his son stabbed. Mrs. Hatfield told of her son and his wife arriving in their car and of beginning its unloading. She testified that before the stabbing her son's wife threw rocks at him and that he picked up a piece of wood "to protect himself." Hearing Set Here Today **On Permits Mine Wastewater** To Be Given Study; **97 Permits Planned**

The U. S. Environmental Protection Agency began public hearings in Frankfort Tuesday and is in Prestonsburg today (Wednesday) to receive comments on wastewater discharge permits proposed for 97 · Kentucky mining operations, Regional Administrator Jack E. Ravan announced.

The hearing originally had been scheduled only for Frankfort-on Tuesday, Sept. 25, at 10 a.m. But at the request of the Appalachian Research and Defense Fund and the Natural Resources Council, the federal agency agreed to extend the hearing and reconvene it here Wednesday at 10 a.m.

Paul J. Traina, director, Enforcement Division, will conduct the hearing.

The permits were drafted by EPA under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System, the new permit program established by the 1972 Amendments to the Federal Water Pollution Control Act. The proposed permits specify strict limits on the discharge of pollutants.

A temporary permit was granted the Inland Steel Company in this county, among others. Such permits will become permanent if evidence produced at the hearing is considered by the Environmental Protection Agency

The initial 10,000-square-foot unit for KAI was begun when 32 business men here invested \$500 each. Two other additions of the same size were later made. The rent paid by Irving and its subsidiary KAI has been applied to bank loans effected for construction financing. The total cost of the building was \$110,627.

The building has been closed almost three years, and Irving has given no indication that it expects to return here.

"What we are concerned about," Music said, "is not that Irving has the building but the fact that the building is empty, isn't being used for the purpose it was built for and may never be used for that purpose."

An advertisement appearing in this edition of The Times means, in all probability, that the Social Security Administration has failed for a second time to decide upon the permanent location of an office to serve Floyd, Johnson, Magoffin and Martin counties. The advertisement says that the U.S. government wants to lease 3,933 square feet of air-conditioned office space within the city limits of either Paintsville or Prestonsburg, or on US 23, between the two towns.

Acceptance of a bid out of the second lot of bidders was expected last Monday, but this week a Social Security representative said the new advertisement possibly indicates rejection of all bids and readvertising. Bids were first asked last March, then again early in July.

Meanwhile, Social Security offices remain in operation in the former States Motel building here and are expected to continue in this location "for an indefinite period of time."

Originally, Congressman Carl D. Perkins announced two years ago that a permanent Social Security office would be established here. That statement was later confirmed by a Social Security Administration spokesman, who predicted that the office here would eventually employ a larger staff than the Pikeville office. The office was being set up here, it was explained, for the convenience of residents in the northern part

of this county and in Martin, Magoffin and Johnson who were at the time obliged to travel the long distance to Pikeville.

But, according to local sources, the bidding was extended to include Paintsville after U. S Senator Cook intervened. Supporting this contention was a statement later credited to Senator Cook's office which said recently that he "had expressed an interest in the proposed Social Security building and wanted to know if it could be located in Paintsville." According to the Cook office spokesman, the senator's main reason for favoring the Paintsville location was its accessibility to those who would use its services, as well as population distribution and highways.

A Social Security representative expressed the fear that if the building is located in Paintsville a large portion of Floyd county which would be served by an office in Prestonsburg would go to Pikeville, causing an overload on the office there.


Fair Attracts 2,228 Exhibits, Gains over 1972

Discounting the loss in school entries, interest of Floyd countians in exhibiting their crafts and the products of fields and gardens was greater at last week's Floyd county fair than at the event a year ago. A total of 2,228 items were on exhibit as compared to 1,989 in 1972.

School exhibits, which heretofore have predominated the fair scene, dropped to a mere half-dozen this year, with only Dwale, Clark and Prestonsburg elementary schools and the Jenny Wiley Right To Read group having entries. Other entries in the school category were by the Mountain Manor Rest Home and Mountain Mental Health, with both excelling in their displays.

Cold, threatening weather cut into the The Floyd fiscal court purchased last attendance at the fair the first two days, Wednesday and Thursday, but the Friday heavy machinery to be used crowds were at normal or above by mainly at sanitary landfill operations in Friday. The 4-H exhibits were most numerous, with 1,176 items-202 more than at last year's fair. These included foods, woodwork and electricity, garden crops, clothing, knitting and livestock. The 621 adult exhibits were next in number, including flowers, antiques and hobbies, fine arts and handicrafts, sewing, canning, cooking, garden crops and livestock. Other exhibitors were the Future Homemakers and Future Farmers of America.

Addition Near for New School

If contractors' bids due next month are accepted and work moves as planned on Phase II at Allen Central High school, the new school at Eastern will be the largest public school facility in the county.

Phase II is the multi-purpose physical education building at Allen Central. Its approximately 60,000 square feet of area will house the physical education, music and drama departments of the school. The physical education facilities to be provided include a gymnasium with inter-collegiate basketball court,

two intramural courts and loft playing areas for minor physical education sports and a swimming pool approximately 35 x 75 feet. The gymnasium-auditorium facility will seat approximately 3,800.

Cost of the building project has been estimated at \$1,237,752. It will be of steel structure with pre-cast concrete floor systems and masonry walls. The Phase II contract will include exterior site development and parking. Completion is scheduled for November, 1974.







Democratic Women Hear Red, White, Blue Founder



"A Gymnasium for Rats"

Irving Industries, the firm which at one time operated Kentucky Appalachian Industries (KAI) here and which retains control of the KAI building, holds the key to possible future manufacturing industry here, and it asks a high price for putting the key in the lock.

Under a lease agreement executed at a time when local interests were anxious to get a manufacturing enterprise of any kind or size established here, Irving retains control of the West Prestonsburg building which housed KAI as long as it pays the \$1,100-a-month rent. It continues to pay that rent, although the building is unoccupied and, according to a company spokesman, the firm does not expect to return here.

The 30,000-square-foot structure was erected by the Prestonsburg Industrial Foundation. The original building of 10,000 square feet was started by 32 businessmen here, each of whom invested \$500 in the structure with the sole aim of getting a new industry to employ people who needed work. The Foundation borrowed money to complete that first unit, borrowed more money to complete two additions.

Now they and others see a building with closed doors, and the price Irving asks is such that the doors may never be reopened. For Irving Industries is offering, according to Ed Music,

chairman of the Industrial Foundation:

1. To sublease the building for a period of six months at a rental of \$2,000 a month; and, after that, to charge 90 cents a square foot, or \$27,000 a year

2. Or to sell the building back to the original builders and owners for \$240,000.

These figures are difficult for Prestonsburg people to understand, inasmuch as the cost of the building, to begin with, was only \$110,627, and the rental charge to Irving is only \$1,100 a month—\$900 short of the minimum rental Irving now asks.

Any industry is entitled to a profit on its investment, but this smacks of profiteering.

The situation thus created is made more tragic because, it is claimed, the community has lost already this year one industry which had offered up to \$1,200 a month rent for the building, and another has apparently lost interest while negotiations for the building have dragged along to an unsuccessful conclusion. Failure to acquire at least temporary control of the KAI building and the location of a new plant there also stymies industrial growth in another direction. The Prestonsburg Industrial Foundation has an excellent industrial site waiting development at Cliff. But highway access must be provided to it. Road construction to the site, however, can be justified only by a commitment by an industry to locate there. An industry cannot locate there until a road is built, and so a chicken-and-egg situation exits. If the KAI building were available, it is claimed, such an industry could locate in it temporarily, commit itself to the Cliff location and in the interim be producing at a profit while the access is being built.





The Life of John Morris

I have this information in a History of Regular Baptist concerning John A. Morris who was my great-greatgrandfather.

John Morris was born on Smith's River in Virginia, about 1780. In early life he emigrated to Floyd county, Kentucky and settled on Beaver Creek where he spent the remainder of a very long and useful life.

Here he united with Stone Coal Church, then under the pastoral care of good, old Simeor Justice, he was ordained to the ministry in 1819, and soon afterwards succeeded to pastoral care of the Stone Coal Church. To this congregation he ministered 50 years. To what other churches he preached, the author is not informed. He was much loved and revered by the people among whom he lived and labored; and his influence over them was very great. He was a good man, and full of the Holy Ghost and of faith, and much people were added to the Lord. The Master took him to Himself, when he was 90 years, in 1870.

Mountain Parkway, An Example

Kentucky's parkways are playing an integral part in shaping a bright future for the Commonwealth. The parkways help carry farm and manufactured goods to market. They have attracted many new industries to various areas of Kentucky.

An important example of the industrial development advanced by such a highway is the Mountain Parkway, The Mountain Parkway, extending 75.5 miles from Winchester to Salyersville, serves the towns of Prestonsburg, Paintsville, and Pikeville. During the past eight years, \$38,585,000 has been invested in new industry along this parkway. An additional \$17,727,000 has been spent in expanding existing industry. This development has created 2,330 new manufacturing jobs.

The parkways most certainly have added to the pleasure of Kentuckians and those traveling in and through Kentucky. They have helped in attracting many tourists to Kentucky, providing scenic routes to many of the state's recreational and historic attractions.

They reflect the history and geography of Kentucky. For example, the Daniel Boone Parkway is not only named after Kentucky's frontier hero, it takes the motorists right through the Daniel Boone National Forest and Levi Jackson Wilderness Road State Park.

Parkways are designed for maximum safety, efficiency, and pleasure. They are strategically located to connect with Kentucky's Interstate highways and major cities in all regions of the Commonwealth.

Kentucky's parkways have been rated among the safest in the United States. According to the National Safety Council, the 53-mile-long Jackson Purchase Parkway has never been the site of a fatal accident.

Generally, the parkways have four lanes with access controlled by carefully located interchanges. All crossroads go over or under the through-lanes to provide an added margin of safety. The parkways allow long-sight distances and provide advance warning signs and exit signs that are easy for the motorists to

added features.

Kentucky's first parkway, the Kentucky Turnpike, was opened to traffic in 1956. The last in the sytem, the Daniel Boone Parkway, will be completed in 1974. No other parkways are planned. With the completion of the parkway system in the near future, Kentucky will have the most extensive toll road system in the United States. At that time, 10 parkways will total 688 miles taking motorists to every region in the Commonwealth.

The parkways were made possible through special toll road issues and were built with money raised from the sale of bonds. This has enabled the state to develop the parkways at a steady rate. Since toll collections are not sufficient to meet the annual bond retirement schedule, the Bureau of Highways meets the deficiency by budgeting a portion of the general road fund for this purpose.

Toll Road Receipts Up During August

Kentucky's toll receipts for August, 1973 totaled \$2,247,497. This represents an increase compared to \$1,870,423 collected over the same period last year.

Toll facility collections as compared to their 1972 aggregates were: Shawneetown Bridge, \$39,971, up from \$36,851; Kentucky Turnpike, \$820,924, up from \$777,870; Mountain Parkway, \$217,273; up from \$189,618; Western Kentucky Parkway, \$391,994, up from \$342,080; Blue Grass Parkway, \$253,732, up from \$225,139; Jackson Purchase Parkway, \$50,069; up from \$46,293; Pennyrile Parkway, \$198,539, up from \$193,770; Sebree Bridge, \$4,619, down from \$4,759; Audubon Parkway, \$61,796; up from \$33,435; Daniel Boone Parkway, \$27,473, up from \$20,608; the Green River Parkway, opened to traffic in December of 1972, collected \$153,693 for the month of August; and the Cumberland Parkway, which is partially opened to traffic, collected \$27,414 last month.

HopeAbandoned For 4 on Plane Lost Sept. 9th

Hope of survival for four men lost since the afternoon of Sept. 9 with their chartered twin-engine plane has been abandoned, and the air search for the wreckage has been suspended.

The ground search continued last week-end, however, with Kentucky National Guardsmen combing woodland in the area of Combs airport, near here, which was the destination of the plane. Relatives of the missing men have requested owners of woodland to undertake an individual search of their farms. The search by helicopters and other aircraft has been suspended because the heavy leaf cover of trees makes detection at ground level virtually impossible.

The Floyd County Emergency & Rescue Squad has assisted in the ground search. Every report of a low-flying plane or of a plane apparently in trouble on the afternoon when the plane disappeared has been checked out, without result

The lost aircraft, a red-and-white Cessna, reported by radio to Tri-State Field, Huntington, W. Va., around 6 p.m. on the day of its disappearance, noted its position as four minutes from Combs field and did not report any trouble. The plane, en route to Combs airport from Humbolt, Tenn., was charted for a direct route from London, Ky. to the airport near here.

Three of the missing men were employed by the McCarley Corporation in the construction of the Louisa General Hospital. They were J. W. Milam, superintendent; his son, Joe, and James Hall, all of the Brownsville, Tenn., vicinity. The fourth man was the pilot, Bill Wickersham, Dyersburg, Tennessee.

one county, for hill counties all the way to the Tennessee and Virginia borders were equally, if not more, uneducated.

Realizing that she had within her influence those things needed to do away with ignorance so far as book learning was concerned, Mrs. Stewart opened night school for adults. Classes were to meet in rural and county schools only on moonlight nights.

In an article in The Rowan County News (no The Morehead News) Cen-Mrs. Cora Wilson Stewart was tennial Edition of 1956, a writer stated that "mothers bent with age came that they might learn to read letters from absent sons and daughters, and that they might learn to write to them for the first time.'

On Labor Day, Sept. 4, 1911, Mrs. Stewart and volunteer teachers made a canvass of the county to explain the program. The following evening 1,200 men and women from 18 to 86 showed up to start their "schooling."

It was not easy to admit they could not read or write, said Mrs. Stewart, and they mentioned excuses by the dozen. "High bills, bridgeless streams. weariness from the day's toil, the shame of beginning study late in life and all other others. But they were not seeking excuses-they were earnestly and sincerely seeking knowledge. Their interests, their zeal and their enthusiasm were wonderful to witness."

Word spread about the schools in Rowan county and by the following year Moonlight Schools had been formed in 10 Eastern Kentucky counties.

A retired Lewis county teacher said many nights at a late hour she would answer her door to find some adult standing there "embarassed, but wanting to learn to read and write so much all they could say was 'Will you help me?' " If extreme shyness prevented some aged persons from seeking help through the schools, teachers frequently traveled

to the homes out in the county and gave private lessons. The Moonlight Schools continued

through World War I.



Region 11 Mental Health-Mental Retardation Board, the regional policy board of Mountain Comprehensive Care Center, approved Monday the purchase by the board of the old Prestonsburg General Hospital on First Avenue here for use as a regional administration office.

The property was owned by the Highlands Hospital Corporation and includes buildings and land in the rear of the hospital building. The purchase price was \$100,000.

Stai, executive director of Mountain Comprehensive Care Center, explained that the board will renovate the first floor of the building immediately to house regional administrative offices which are now located throughout Prestonsburg. Later, regional administrative offices will be moved to Auxier and the hospital building will then house the Floyd county team administrative and I-S-R units, presently located in the Odd Fellows Building.

Stai said that the upper two floors of the hospital will eventually be renovated for other Comprehensive Care Center programs.







Media Is Topic At AAUW Meet

American Association of University Women members from all over Kentucky gathered Saturday at Jenny Wiley State Park for their fall conference.

With 72 officially registered, Kathryn Frazier, of Prestonsburg, A.A.U.W. vice president for program development, welcomed the group and introduced the theme of the conference, "Media: Issues-Communications."

Alice Kousser, supervisor of educational television in Tennessee, began her presentation on "Mass Media and Children" with a plea that media be an aid in communication which she described as a two-way process. Using graphic visual aids, Mrs. Kousser made the point that media in any form should be utilized with the objective of furthering a child's self-expression and development.

In a panel presentation, Bos Johnson, of WSAZ-TV, made a plea that individual citizens communicate their views to the people who are responsible for mass media. This communication puts the media in a better position to assess community needs.

Richard Schwein, assistant editor of the Lexington Leader underscored the need for the public to speak up, focusing his remarks on the need for citizen press councils which would function as a communications system between journalists and the community.

Mr. Taylor urged his listeners to be mindful of the vast amount of material available on the psychological impact of the media, particularly television. 



Fish and Wildlife, Topic Of State Conservation Contests

Fish and wildlife—whose welfare often reflects that of mankind—is the topic this year as Kentucky elementary and high school students compete for \$4,050 in U. S. Savings Bonds in the 1973 Conservation Essay and Conservation Poster Contests. The subject for the 30th annual essay contest and first annual poster contest is "Fish and Wildlife Conservation: What Can I Do?"

The competitions are sponsored by The Courier-Journal and The Louisville Times in cooperation with the Kentucky Department of Education and the Kentucky Association of Soil and Water Conservation Districts.

The annual essay competition, open to all Kentucky elementary and high school students, last year drew 89,372 essays on "Trees—Their Effect on Me and My Local Environment." The 1972 winner was Johnnie Matthew Walters, of Garrison.

The new annual poster competition is open to all Kentucky elementary students in grades one through five. Although the essay contest is open to students in these grades, students may not enter both the essay and posters contests during the same school year.

The writer of the top essay in the state will receive a \$500 bond. The second place essay winner will receive a \$200 bond, and third place will earn a \$100 bond.

The state winner of the poster contest will be awarded a \$100 U. S. Savings Bond. The second place poster winner will receive a \$75 bond, and the third place award will be a \$50 bond.

The three top winners in each contest, their parents and teachers will be guests of honor at the newspapers' annual Farm Awards Luncheon in Louisville next March. Prizes will be awarded at the luncheon.

Each essay contest winner in the state's 121 Soil and Water Conservation Districts will receive a \$25 bond and a wooden plaque from the Louisville daily newspapers. District winners in the poster contest will receive a wooden plaque from the newspapers.



Clark Says Right To Read Aim Is To Eliminate Illiteracy

Read program now in progress in the United States is to eliminate illiteracy by 1980, Jenny Wiley Council members were told in a recent meeting at the Osborne elementary school.

Joseph Clark, Right to Read coordinator and reading supervisor from the Kentucky State Department of Education, told council members of the newest efforts concerning the Right to Read program. "It was decided," Mr. Clark said, "that a redirection of momentum needed to be made, that more work would be done through state agencies in an effort to strive for the outcome Right to Read hopes to achieve."

Kentucky was one of the first 11 states to receive Right to Read funding. A total of 31 states have received this funding and it is predicted that within a year every state will have a person or office for coordinating the Right to Read efforts.

"The basic idea of the Right to Read effort is not to improve general reading ability," he remarked, "but to aid those who don't read at all, or



It's worth taking time off to enjoy - especially at Kentucky's state parks, where the cost of accommodations drops long before the autumn leaves do.

Out of the state's 15 resort parks, nine remain open year round, offering winter lodge room rates of \$8.00 single or \$12.00 double. Each room is furnished with two double beds, climate controls, television

> In the state's eastern area, Jenny Wiley State Resort Park, at Prestonsburg, is the choice of many travelers who seek a mountain vacation. Private balconies and patios help you enjoy the wonderful aroma of thick forests, and the distant lake sounds. Lake Cumberland State Resort Park offers planned recreation throughout the year for its guests. Cumberland Falls, called "the Niagara of the South," is well worth the trip just to see the largest waterfall east of the Rockies (except for Niagara itself). A beautiful sandstone-and-timber lodge nestles into the scenery to become a part of one of Kentucky's loveliest resort areas. A full moon on a clear night, combined with the mist from the falling water, creates a moonbow . . . one of only two in the world. 9-26-2t Barren River Lake State Resort Park is almost directly south of Louisville and you might make some sightseeing stops along the way at Hodgenville, to take in Abraham Lincoln Birthplace National 9-26-tf. Historic Site, and Lincoln's boyhood home at Knob Creek . . . and a stop in the CentralKentucky Cave Area, for a scenic tour. You will most certainly be im-9-26-1t. pressed by the spacious, relaxed atmosphere on reaching Barren River. 


