

Charges against superintendent made official just before deadline

Official charges were served against Floyd County School Superintendent Ron Hager at the eleventhhour Thursday when Hager made a rare appearance at the central office.

Floyd County Sheriff's deputies have made repeated attempts to locate Hager at work and at home since the March 12 state school board meeting when Education Commission Thomas Boysen charged Hager with willful neglect of duty and mis-

Funds needed to help child with cancer treatment

Fundraising efforts are underway to assist the family of James (Lee Bug) Boyd who is continuining his fight against cancer.

Lee Bug's condition was reported in the Times last year and since that that time he underwent a bone marrow transplant in September 1991 at the University of Kentucky Hospital in Lexington.

Before the September transplant, Lee Bug went to California for treatment to get the bone marrow suitable for transplant.

His family was notified several weeks ago that the cancer has returned and he will be admitted to an Ann Arbor Michigan Hopsital the first week of April for a new-type of treatment.

Family and friends began distributing donation jars to area stores this week in an effort to offset set the costs of travel, medicine, food and accomodations while in Michigan.

Hager has been noticeably absent from his office at the administration building and numerous attempts by the Times to contact Hager for his response to those charges since March 12 have been unsuccessful.

Hager had to be officially served with the charges 10 working days prior to a scheduled April 10 summary hearing before the state board of education. The time limit would have expired Friday (today) at 9 a.m.

"Other efforts are being made to serve Hager," said KDE spokesman Jim Parks Thursday. "If he isn't served before 9 a.m. tomorrow, the suspen-

Parks declined to say what other efforts were made to serve Hager.

Repeated efforts by the Floyd County Sheriff's Department to serve Hager prior to Thursday afternoon were unsuccessful, Sheriff Paul Hunt Thompson said Tuesday.

At the April 10 hearing, Boysen's attorney, Stephen D. Wolnitzek, and an investigator from the state's Office of Education Accountability will detail the charges against Hager before the state board of education.

Hager or his attorney will have the opportunity to rebut any of the charges before a decision is made at that hearing whether or not to suspend Hager from his duties as superinten-

If Hager is suspended, a removal hearing must be set no less than 20 days and no more than 30 days from the service of final charges against Hager. Hager would have 10 days from that service to inform the state

Water project flowing along

Beaver-Elkhorn Water District has recently completed its community meetings that were held at the local schools serving the Left and Right Beaver areas of Floyd County.

As explained to all persons in attendance at these meetings, Beaver-Elkhorn Water District has developed a major project to expand its water treatment plant from the present 1.0 MGD to 1.5 + MGD and extend its water distribution system approximately 76 miles to serve an estimated 1,500 additional house-

The project is being designed to serve the areas of Spurlock Creek, Wilson Creek, Goose Creek, Prater Fork, Turner Branch, Route 7 Area, Salyer Branch, Turkey Creek, Hayes Branch, Northern Area (Duff Elementary), Weeksbury, Doty Creek, Halls Branch, Frasure Creek, Royal Hollow, Riley Branch, Hen Pen Branch, Muddy Gut Branch, Betsy Clark Branch, Fisher Hollow, Hunter Branch, Route 7 above Wayland, Henry Branch, Doc Allen Branch, Melvin (Abner Fork), Clear Creek, Hi Hat, Jacks Creek, Bevinsville, Bypro and Caleb Fork.

Beaver Elkhorn Water District received a \$2,000,000 grant and a \$4,194,216 loan from the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority. The loan is required to be paid back over a 30 year period at an interest rate of three percent. The Floyd County Board of Education has agreed to contribute \$500,000 for providing water service to the new Left Beaver High School, Osborne Elementary, Melvin Elementary and to improve the water situation at Duff Elementary. The water district is anticipating to generate \$473,875 from tap fees to be paid by new customers. The tap fee for new customers is \$425. This amount enables the water district to tap the

Floyd County GOP selects new officers

Floyd County's Republican Party elected a slate of five officers Saturday, March 21, to direct the party's efforts for the next two years.

Those selected include Curtis Hall, of McDowell, who was re-elected as county GOP chairman; Patricia Potter, of Prestonsburg, who was reelected as vice-chairperson; Duna Combs, of Langley, who was reelected as secretary; Glen D. Burgess, of Harold, who will become the party's new treasurer; and Roy Hunter, of Honaker, who will become the party's new youth chair-

The elections were held at 10 a.m. Saturday at the Floyd County Courthouse.

made no recommendation that it be added that a deed to the site had closed. In fact, the report offered seven possible alternatives for the future use of the site. They included:

- · Continued use as an airfield:
- · Development of recreational fa-
- · Development of an industrial park; Development of public housing;
- Development of public facilities; · Combined usage for industrial and recreational projects; or
- Sale of the site in whole or in part. Recktenwald also noted that the total site encompassed 49.77 acres. with 32 of those acres above the 100year flood plain.

The ADD report also offered projected costs for extending sewage treatment to the site, detailing five alternatives which ranged in cost from a low of \$67,500 to a high of \$1.35 million. Water, natural gas and electrical services are already available on site.

The report concluded with recommendations that Paintsville and Prestonsburg council direct a joint development authority, established by both cities in 1987, to "engage in a best-use determination for the site" and to submit conclusions to both councils by July 1. The report also recommended that "adjoining property owners, community residents and current patrons of the airport have the opportunity to participate in the bestuse determination process...'

The ADD report was attacked by Belhasen, who accused the agency of being one-sided because the ADD was involved in the development of the Big Sandy Regional Airport. Belhasen said the ADD was in conflict because the agency board has passed a resolution encouraging use and development of the Big Sandy Regional Airport. Belhasen continued his cross-examination of Recktenwald until he was interrupted by Prestonsburg councilman William Callihan, who noted that "all this bickering is not helping either side. What we need to know first is who owns the property."

Callihan's comments were in reference to information provided by Paintsville Mayor John Preston, who opened the meeting Tuesday by responding to questions raised earlier about original condemnation of the airport site. Preston said court actions in both local and federal courts had gone in favor of the airport, but he corporate level.

"never been recorded." Preston said the title issue could be resolved "in about two months.'

Preston and Paintsville councilman Johnnie LeMaster exchanged words briefly, early in the meeting, after Preston read a letter from state Office of Aeronautics director Bob Bodner. Bodner said in that letter that the state would "waive" approximately \$200,000 of a debt on the airport site if and when it ceased operating as an airport but that a loan of approximately \$50,000 would have to repaid.

LeMaster disputed that waiver, noting he had met "face-to-face" with state Transportation Secretary Don Kelly and that Kelly had said the debt 'will not be waived."

Bodner said Wednesday that the letter "holds true," that Transportation Secretary Kelly "read it and gave me permission to mail it." He said the waiver would be granted as long as the site is used for "industrial development."

Apparently miffed that the Prestonsburg contingent had not come to Tuesday's meeting prepared to act on the airport issues, Paintsville councilman Mitch Kinner asked Mayor Ann Latta when she expected to name appointees to the joint airport board.

When Latta responded that she was having a difficult time finding "openmined" individuals willing to serve, Kinner asked if Prestonsburg would be willing "to withdraw from participation" in the airport operation.

"I doubt seriously that Prestonsburg would be willing to give up its interest," Latta said.

That's the point," Kinner added, "there doesn't seem to be a lot of interest now."

Tuesday's meeting offered a variety of recommendations and suggestions from the audience, including comments from American Standard plant manager Ron Belhasen concering the development of industrial sites on property owned by American Standard. Belhasen said the Paintsville plant was situated on 138 acres and ,"if we get our heads together we could probably come up with a plan for development." He added that any decision for using property owned by American Standard would have to be made at the

Other suggestions included developing industry at the airport, leaving the airstrip intact, and concentrating on other, privately owned sites, as an alternative to closing the Paintsville-

Prestonsburg airport. No action was taken on any of the proposals.

Present for the two-hour session were Prestonsburg councilmen Jerry Fannin, Michael Vance, William Callihan and George Archer. Paintsville was represented by Mitch Kinner, Johnnie LeMaster, Debbie Trimble, David Trimble and Ronnie

appear and answer any charges.

Hager, who has been consistently absent from his office since March 12, has kept in contact with the office, acting superintendent Tommy Thompson said Thursday.

Thompson declined to say how many days Hager had been out of the office, saying "I'm not keeping a tab on him." Thompson had "no comment" when asked if Hager's absences had caused any problems in the running of the school system, but said "things are going just fine with his (Hager's) directions."

Thompson would not say how those directions were relayed to him.

Boysen's charges claim that Hager filed fraudulent annual financial reports for the school district in 1989 and 1990. Charges claim Hager knowingly failed to include a \$345,000 debt to the federal government stemming from the 1984 flood. If the debt would have been included in the annual report, the district would have ended those years in a financial defi-

Other charges were:

· Hager allegedly circumvented state bidding laws by awarding five contracts for security services from October 1988 until December 1990 without putting those services out for bids. The contracts totaled \$9,455.60 per month. The companies did not have surety bonds that were called for in the contracts.

 Hager allegedly failed to place monies in two major construction accounts into interest bearing accounts for three years at the First Guaranty National Bank. The estimated loss of revenue to the school district was placed at \$70,000 to \$80,000 per year.

· Hager allegedly allowed the continuous operation of at least one

Babbage announces registration deadlines

Floyd County citizens who want to vote in the primary election on May 26 have until April 28 to register, according to Bob Babbage, Secretary of State and chairman of the State Board of Elections.

Citizens can register to vote or check their voter registration records at their county clerk's office. There they can obtain and fill out a voter registration card. The clerk can also identify their voter precinct and tell them where to vote, Babbage ex-

Babbage said he is working with the current session of the General Assembly for changes in the voter To get things rolling in April, the registration laws which will make voter registration more convenient.

"You should be able to register to vote with the same ease as mailing a letter," Babbage said.

Babbage also noted that there are several myths surrounding voter

"Many people say they are not registered to vote because they fear they will be chosen for jury duty. sen from driver's license records as well as voter registration rolls, Babbage explained. If you have a driver's license you are eligible for jury duty.

Another state law requires that county clerks furnish voter registration forms to all high schools. High school principals or their assistants are to designate a person in each school who will be responsible for informing students and school personnel of the availability of the registration forms and assist them in properly registering, Babbage explained.

Babbage noted that nearly 800,000 Kentuckians are eligible but not registered to vote.

"Citizens often say they feel far removed from the democratic processes," Babbage said. "The unregistered are certainly far removed from having a say in the government services they pay for and receive," he

"One of the major thrusts of govemment should be to open the door to all our citizens and remind them of their privilege to be a part of their government," Babbage added.

"People also say their vote doesn't count. That is just not so. During the last primary election, for example, the Democratic candidate for Attorney General was chosen by a majority equal to one-half a vote per precinct," Babbage added.



Dixie renovation planned

Prestonsburg's Housing Authority is continuing its efforts to provide facelifts for authority projects by applying for a \$1.1 million modernization grant for Dixie Apartments.

The authority met in special session Wednesday to authorize a resolution for the grant, which will provide for four handicapped housing units and one unit for a sight or hearing impaired tenant.

Housing director Julia May explained to members that over \$281,000 will go toward stabilizing an eroded riverbank adjacent to the project. The erosion was caused by past flooding

May also explained that if monies were left over from any of the line item expenditures, that money could be shifted to other areas of the proj-

Prestonsburg Mayor Ann Latta told the authority that the housing complex needed to be renovated because "it probably doesn't conform to building codes now."

"It's probably not as safe as it ought to be," Latta said.

main line, run the service line to the customer's property line and install a meter setting. All material from the main line to the meter setting, including the meter, is the property of and will be maintained by Beaver-Elkhorn Water District. The homeowner is responsible for installing and maintaining the service line that runs from the meter setting to the house.

This project will require approximately 1,100 households to pay the required tap fee and take the water service once it is available to the resident in order to make the total project feasible. If 1,100 households do not sign up for water service, it could jeopardize the entire project. Kentucky Infrastructure Authority is requiring the water district to show that all local money is in place before any release of grant or loan money will occur. In order for Beaver-Elkhorn Water District to pay back the \$4,194,216 loan at the terms stated above, the water district will be filing an application to raise the water rates and other charges with the Kentucky Public Service Commission. Notice as to the water district's request of new rates will be advertised when the application is submitted. All rates are required to be approved by the Public Service Commission before going in effect.

It has been projected that 70 percent of all the residents that live in each of these sections need to sign up for service. If the 70 percent is not met in any of these areas, it could mean re-locating the line to serve another area that has the required number of sign ups. If this should occur to an area where residents have signed up and paid the required tap fee, the tap fee will be refunded with interest.

In addition to paying the required tap fee, the state's Division of Plumbing requires all new customers to office at 606-285-3856.



BREAST LUMPS

Finding a breast lump can be frightening if you are not aware that your breast is constantly changing. Although most of these changes are harmless, the possibility of cancer remains. Even though over 150,000 women in the U.S. are diagnosed as having breast cancer, most breast lumps are not cancerous. Through early detection, by practicing self examinations, having periodic doctor evaluations and breast x-rays (mammography), statistics show that most breast cancer can be cured.

At least 90% of breast lumps are discovered through self-examination. It is true that the breast is constantly changing due to weight fluctuations and the aging process. But, you can detect any unusual thickening or lumps by knowing your body. Although most lumps are found through self-examination, mammography can detect a lump before it is big enough to feel.

CHANGES: Changes brought about by the aging process are apparent from puberty with the onset of menstruation. Breasts swell with fluid the week prior to menstruation. Therefore the best time to examine your breast is the week following the menstrual period.

Pregnancy also causes apparent changes. Tenderness and enlarged mammary glands and ducts may last throughout the pregnancy. Changes will occur in size and shape even until breast-feeding stops.

Menopause will bring with it the decrease of mammary glands and ducts. Tissue will begin to thin as the breast becomes less firm and begins to sag. Weight changes will increase and decrease the amount of fatty tissue in the breasts.

NONCANCEROUS LUMPS. There are common noncancerous (benign) breast problems that may appear as lumps. Fibrocystic "disease" is responsible for 80% of all breast operations. Pockets of fluid develop as the amount of fibrous tissue increases. In Fibrocystic disease and simple cysts, tenderness and lump size increase during menstruation and decrease the week after. They usually disappear completely after meno-

Fibroadenoma is a single solid tumor which accounts for nearly all breast tumors in women under the

age of 25. Fibroadenoma is composed of fibrous and glandular tissue. Papillomas are small wart-like

growths near the breast nipple which can produce a clear or bloody dis-

Mastitis is an infection of the breast which occurs when bacteria enter the mammary ducts through the nipple. This usually occurs during breast-

Injury to the breast may result in blood accumulation (hematoma). Such trauma causes destruction of fatty tissue. There is no evidence that injury causes cancer.

CANCEROUS LUMPS. Cancerous (Malignant) lumps develop most often from mammary ducts or glands. They are usually single, hard, and painless. In time, they will grow in an uncontrolled manner and spread beyond the breast. Cancerous lumps are commonly found in the upper and outer portion of the breast. There are three classifications of cancerous

·Early breast cancer, a small tumor less than an inch in size located in the breast only.

· Advanced breast cancer, a larger tumor that has spread from the breast to the lymph nodes.

·Disseminated breast cancer, the cancer cells have spread not only to lymph nodes but to other areas of the body. (The cure rate is low.)

CANCEROUS OR NOT? A biopsy is used to confirm whether a breast lump is cancerous. The physician surgically removes the lump for examination. If malignancy is found, the physician will discuss several treatment options, depending on the staging classification. Yearly mammography is recommended to detect recurrences before they are large enough to be felt. Regular checkups


ever going to lose those 15 pounds?

Winning \$1 million does't make you rich,

Q: Do lottery jackpot winners really keep their jobs and keep working? It seems that nearly everyone in the past few months who has won has also declared that they were going to keep their jobs. I'm more than a little skeptical. Do they actually keep working? I'd retire immediately if I

A: In spite of what they say in the first few exciting days of finding out they have won the lottery, people who win less than \$2 million usually keep their jobs. People who win over \$2 million usually quit work within a few weeks of collecting their first winning check.

Keep in mind that winning \$1 million really doesn't make you a millionaire and make you able to do whatever you want to do; it amounts to about \$35,000 a year for 20 years after taxes have been taken out. That's not really enough money each year to significantly change a person's lifestyle. Even winning \$2 million only gives you about \$70,000 a year.

Winners of over \$2 million frequently believe that they will keep working, but they usually don't. A person who wins \$5 million, for example, will quickly discover that a new income of \$175,000 a year takes a considerable amount of time to manage well. Suddenly, the \$25,000 a year job, even though a great job, doesn't seem quite that important anymore.

for a ticket is returned in the form of prizes for every game.

Most states return to players as prizes about 50 percent of the money they take in in ticket sales. So, if a state lottery offers a game which has 25 million tickets for sale, there will be a total of \$12.5 million in prizes of various amounts scattered in those tickets. Since some people only play games where there is a chance to win big prizes, lotteries create some of their games with fewer winning tickets, but with bigger prizes, perhaps with one prize in every eight tickets. Other people don't really care about big prizes but like to play games where there is a good chance of winning something, even if it is just a free ticket or \$2, so the lottery creates games for them where the \$12.5 million dollars is divided up into many more smaller prizes, perhaps with one winning ticket in every three. In

both games, however, 50 percent of the price of each ticket is returned to players in the form of prizes.

Q: I understand that comedian Rich Little has gone to work for some state lottery. Which lottery, and what will he be doing?—B. T.

A: Rich Little has been signed by the Tri-State Megabucks Lottery to serve as its spokesman for its new advertising campaign. Dear June — I would appreciate your comments on refund cheats. I have heard people admit to using more than one name and address to send for manufacturers' refunds and rebates. Isn't this illegal? Have any of these people been prosecuted?

I would be very unhappy if these people killed the "golden goose" of refunding for ethical refunders. -Jeanne McCartney, Taunton, Mass.

Dear Jeanne-Refunding has its cheats. When they are caught, they are prosecuted. Some have even gone

Cheating can take several forms. The most common is sending multiple requests for offers that are limited to "one refund per family or address." The cheats use different spellings of their names—or entirely different names. They may even rent several post office boxes.

Duplicating required mail-in certificates is another form of refund fraud. Refund forms typically require that only an original be used. As most refunders know, finding forms is not always easy. This creates an incentive for the unscrupulous to counterfeit the forms.

When coupon cheats are indicted, it is usually for mail fraud. This is because the U.S. Mail has been used as part of a fraudulent scheme.

In Florida, Connie Avidson was sentenced to 27 months in a federal prison for conspiracy and mail fraud. This former "coupon queen" used counterfeit refund forms and sent for multiple refund requests.

Despite the prosecutions, the cheats could still ruin things for the many millions of ethical people who depend on refunding to stretch their grocery budgets. If the manufacturers believe their refund offers are being seriously abused, they will end

Many refund offers now say "No post office boxes." The cheaters have made it impossible for millions of refunders to send for these offers.

There is no need to become a refund cheat if you are a Smart Shopper like Sharon Morris from Mus-





MUNICIPAL RULES TARGET MESSY NEIGHBOR

DEAR BRUCE: What do you do when you have a slob for a neighbor? Everybody in our neighborhood takes good care of their homes except one house. These people are, as you would say, "industrial-strength slobs."

They don't cut the grass or paint the house. Their cars, while licensed and running, really shouldn't be. Their picket fence is about half pickets and half empty spaces. It looks like a hockey player's smile.


Unfortunately, there's no property maintenance code in our community that applies to these deficiencies. Everybody in the neighborhood agrees that this takes away from our lifestyle and the value of our property. And yet the community says that there is nothing we can do to force them to keep their house properly painted and appropriately repaired.

We don't care what goes on inside the house; they can live like slobs because that doesn't affect us. What would you suggest?—P.C., York, Pa.

DEAR P.C.: You might consider asking your local governing body to pass what's called a property maintenance code, which will set standards for outdoor appearances. Like you, I think that whatever they do behind closed doors is their business. But I do think they should be required to cut the grass, keep the fence in decent condition (or take it down) and keep the home painted.

A reasonable property exterior maintenance code, I'm sure, would pass court tests (as it has done in other communities). If enough of your neighbors feel as you do, get cracking, get active in politics. Politicians respond to numbers. Go to a local council meeting and let your representatives know how you feel. But making such a code "reasonable" is the operative term here. If you make it too restrictive, there's a distinct possibility that the courts might strike it down.

DEAR BRUCE: We have seen a number of loans advertised that seem too good to be true. No credit application, no collateral, no credit history, etc. We could use a loan of about \$10,000, and we've called the numbers that have been advertised. We were told that for a \$400 fee (in some cases as much as \$500), we would be put in touch with lenders who would be very happy to process our loan.

Somehow, this seems in the category of too good to be true, and I'm not prepared to invest \$400 to \$500 to find out. What would you suggest?-J.S., Bakersfield, Calif.

DEAR J.S.: I suggest you save your money. If you read the fine print of the ad, or certainly any literature they will send you after the \$400 goes past, all they do is put you in touch with lenders who may or may not approve your application.

There's absolutely no reason for you to go through a broker for a loan of this kind. If your credit is not in the best of shape, or your debt-to-income ratio is so high as to not justify more credit, these folks are not going to be in a position to help you.

What often appears to be an advertisement by a lender is nothing more than an advertisement by someone who is acting as a broker, bringing interested parties together. And more often than not, all you'll have to show for it, is a canceled check for \$400 or \$500.

Community Synopsis

CORRECTNESS OR **CULTURAL DIVERSITY** Dr, Nnamdi Anosike,

Asst. Prof. of Socio-Economics. Prestonsburg Community College America is changing and we ought

to be aware of the implications of such change for the decades ahead. The ethnic composition of many regions of the United States is changing and indicates that minorities and people of color are increasing in size. Even without adjustments for racial and ethnic population undercounts, the U.S. Census Bureau (1990) reports that 17 states, compared to 13 in 1980, now have a combined African American, American Indian, Asian, and Pacific Islanders, and Hispanic/ Chicano/Latino populations of one million or more. And six of these, compared to five in 1980, at present have racial and ethnic populations in excess of 2 million.

The sex, socioeconomic status, race, and ethnic mix of America's kindergartens as we know it today reflects this change, too. Most of the students who will enter High school, and subsequently go to college in the coming decades will be drawn from this pool of kindergartens. Thirtythree percent of Kindergarten students in the U.S. in 1987 were minorities. In Texas and California this shift in population is even more vis-

ible as the majority of the five year olds in both states is ethnically minority. A reason given for a drop in White ethnic-kindergarten enrollment is an apparent lack of interest in marriage and/or child-bearing among many married white ethnics (a consequence of the me-attitude of the past two decades), and not that the birth rate of minorities is increasing (Wattenburg, 1987). Also nonwhites, vomen and immigrants, notes Dr. William H. Mobley, President, Texas A&M University, will make up more than 83 percent of the new additions to the work force between now and the year 2000, although they make up only 50 percent now.

Zelma Harris (1988) president of Penn Valley Community College, Missouri, while delivering an opening address to the North Central Association Commission on Institutions of Higher Education, notes that we have already witnessed the coloring of our campuses, especially in the South West U.S., and Florida. In 1987, for the first time, the University of California at Berkeley's freshman class was largely minorities (12% African American, 17% Hispanic, 26% Asian, and 40% white). African Americans are only 4% of the population of the University of Kentucky. But between 1990 and 1991 African American enrollment at the University of Kentucky increased by 26 percent (from 772 to 975). Texas A&M University has 1100 African American students enrolled in 1991, twice the enrollment in 1983. Also it has a multicultural services department that caters to the interests of minorities. Its equivalent at the University of Kentucky is the two year old cultural diversity week program.

A call for ethnic and cultural diversity on U.S. campuses is leading to an increase in polarized views that are colored with highly racial and ethnically biased rhetorics among various groups on university campuses and among members of the general public. At major ivy league universities many minority groups demand inclusion of other literary works in English Literature in addition to traditional texts by Shakespeare (Macbeth. Romeo and Juliet, etc.), considering the diversity of the student populations. Students and faculty therefore are demanding more inclusive curricula, and courses that reflect the history and contributions of people of color. At Denuba, Southern California, parents and their children staged a boycott of local primary schools to protest a lack of representation in the local Board of Education even though the school's population is now predominantly Hispanic. Bilingual education for all students in public schools in South Florida and parts of Southern California is now becoming the norm rather than the exception.

Opponents of diversity argue that all these may lead to a rewriting of aspects of history. Such opposing views are generating a great deal of controversy across the nation both in the communities, and across university campuses, and are now leading to a resurgence of white supremacy groups on campuses and racial bigotry is increasingly reported. As expected, the majority's position is thought to be in danger as repeated

calls for curricula changes are made. Scholars of political economy refer to all the controversies arising from these on-going debates on ethnic pair.

A QUESTION OF POLITICAL imbalance in institutions of higher learning as "Political Correctness." It is politically correct in that it touches on issues of race, power, and dominance as well as imminent loss of the achievements of affirmative action laws of the 1960s. The 1st and 4th amendment issues are therefore subjected to testing in these debates as campus ethnoviolence escalates.

The allegations of segregation in the Mississippi public school system (Ayers vs Mabus) and Alabama State University's pending case with its Board of Education highlight these arguments. In the Mississippi case. the Supreme Court is yet to decide on the alleged continued practice of segregation in the Mississippi educational system. In Mississippi, funds are unevenly allocated for higher education respectively to predominantly black colleges and white uni-

Changes in our universities and our colleges, urges Harris, ought to be approached in a systematic manner by leaving open all lines of communications for debate and discussion of issues of diversity and political correctness. There is a popular belief out there that now is the time to place emphasis on meeting the diverse needs of the changing population. That the acknowledgment of the potential of America's diverse ethnic populations through cultural pluralism or accommodation rather than assimilation is beneficial to the coun-

Since the goal of assimilation and Melting Pot was unrealizable and with increasing emphasis on diversity, it is appropriate to evaluate the demographic shifts and equally represent the various minority groups' interests, thus assuring that most of the support services they will need will be available in public schools. Such an approach would increase enrollment of minorities, and their reten-

tion and graduation rates, because

academic and support systems must

be in place if students are to succeed. A first place to address this complex issue, notes Miss Maggie Abudu (1991), Executive Director, South West Center for Human Relations Studies, The University of Oklahoma, at the 4th Annual National Conference on Racial and Ethnic Relations in American Higher Education, is at the top executive levels of our institutions where policies are made. The initiative must come from the president or the chancellor, and board of trustees. It cannot be left to the whims of busy administrators caught in the bureaucracy of their time. Diversity issues such as the following ought to



The difference is that a possibility that something may be the whole airplane has to move forward in order to get lift, while the helicopter needs only to move its rotor blades through the air. This is what enables a helicopter to go straight up or down or hover over one

> In front of the pilot in a helicopter there is the "cyclic stick," or go-stick. He moves it in the direction he wants to go and the helicopter flies that way. The cyclic stick works by changing the pitch of one blade at a time as it passes one side of the helicopter. This means that one side of the disk - the circle made by the whirling blades — has more lift than the other, and the disk tilts.

When the disk is flat, the helicopter hovers because all the lift force is straight up, keeping the helicopter in the air. If the disk is tilted, most of the force is still up, keeping the helicopter in the air, but some of the force pushes slightly forward, backward or to the side, and the helicopter moves in that direction as a result.





Science Screen Report explores human muscles

SCIENCE SCREEN REPORT, an educational video series produced in cooperation with the National Science Teachers Association and representing the most recent development in science, technology and engineering, has been placed in the Floyd County Schools by Consolidation Coal Company

This month's edition of SCIENCE SCREEN REPORT, explores HUMAN PHYSIOLOGY: MUSCLES.

Looking at motion on a molecular level reveals the complexity of this seemingly simple ability. In "Human Muscles" the creators of SCIENCE SCREEN REPORT ask students to be physical trainers, aerobics instructors, cardiologists and scientists for a day as they're presented with leading research into human muscle systems.

"Human Muscles" begins where motion begins, in the human brain. In the ordinary grasping of a pencil, the show reveals how our somatic nervous system activates nerve and muscle fibers, beginning a microscopic chain of protein-based reactions that makes hands and fingers move. The three muscle types, skeletal, smooth and cardiac, are also explained using athletic training, human breathing and heart therapy as examples.

The show also quizzes students on the differences between voluntary and involuntary muscles. They view selected body movements and are asked to determine what kinds of muscles make each motion possible.

From the scientific and research communities, "Human Muscles" looks at new and proposed treatments for heart patients involving transplants and pacemakers. Muscular dystrophy is also discussed, including how it happens, what proteins are responsible and how our recently discovered ability to grow healthy tissues from single cells is helping science find a cure.

Creativity is child's play at Children's Museum of Art

The Children's Studio, a children's art workshop once sponsored by Prestonsburg Community College, has returned to Prestonsburg under the creative direction of artist and founder Ralph Clark of David. Clark has expanded the studio into The Children's Museum of Art where children can "develop an awareness of art and communication." The studio is sponsored by the Floyd County Library and the Emma May Wells Cultural Center.

"This program," explained Clark, "is very much a continuation of the Saturday morning class at PCC." He said the facilities at PCC were fine, but would not accommodate his dream - a children's art studio that could serve the entire community.

Sessions at The Children's Studio are now held at Clark Elementary School where Clark has converted a former locker room into an art studio.

"I must have talked to everybody and their dog trying to find a place." said Clark. Originally, he had planned to travel to area schools to conduct his classes, "but then it just seemed right to stay in one place and have the children come there

After a few inquiries, the principal of Clark Elementary School offered a storage room. "Oh, it was just packed," Clark chuckled as he described the cleaning project that would not only clean out the room but also reveal that the room had once been a locker room. Paint and some "new," donated furnishing combined with "a few things brought from home and anything I (Clark) could scrounge" soon transformed the room into a creative workshop.

Participants in The Children's Studio are encouraged to explore the creative study of art through drawing, painting and sculpture. "Landscapes of the imagination and designs of nature will be emphasized,"

Sculpting projects will explore form and motion using recyclable materials furnished by The Lexington Children's Museum. In turn, these sculptures will be exhibited at the Lexington Children's Museum during the summer.

Other activities include a Game and Toy project. Children learn about the development of games and toys while designing their own. Children are also encouraged to create their own cartoon strip.

Martin Elementary Library

Utilizing a significant increase to the library coffers at Martin Elementary School, media specialist Delores Reichenbach has begun an extensive media expansion project designed to complement the school's curriculum. Considering the needs and requests of the faculty, the librarian has chosen a variety of print and non-print media to supplement and reinforce classroom instruction and activities.

Martin Elementary's policy is to make the media center, the hub of the curriculum, readily accessible to faculty and students. Though the school is staffed only three days per week with a certified media specialist, the services of a library aide on alternate days ensure the library is open for use at all times. In addition to regularly scheduled classes for grades Kindergarten through eight, the media center offers opportunities for reading enjoyment as well as information quests and research proj-

One of Reichenbach's goals is to have the media center project a warm, friendly atmosphere. She says that students and faculty can begin the day by reading the LEXINGTON HERALD-LEADER, FLOYD COUNTY TIMES, and USA TO-DAY, and as the school day continues, visitors to the library have access to many of their favorite periodicals.

Regarding current and pending improvements, Reichenbach expounded, "In addition to an increased number of periodicals, our new book selection focuses on the lives of presidents and other famous people who have made significant contributions to our country. We have added titles on explorers, Congress and the Constitution. Also, we are enlarging our literature collection and anticipate a twentieth century collection of Black America poetry. We are currently up-dating our non-print materials. We have added videos on South America, the Civil War and America's discovery. Following the faculty's recommendations, videos on weather, dinosaurs, the solar system and earth's natural resources have also been added to the non-print collection. Each year we plan to add interesting, but much-needed print and non-print media so that our library will remain a useful and most

welcome place to visit again and again."

Reichenbach, a veteran educator of eleven years, is currently part-time librarian at Clark Elementary School. She has also served as a high school Language Arts/Latin teacher in the Fayette County school system.

ORDINANCE #2, 1992 SEWER USE ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE OF PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SEWERS AND DRAINS, PRIVATE SEWAGE DIS-POSAL, THE INSTALLATION AND CONNECTION OF BUILD-ING SEWERS, AND THE DISCHARGE OF WASTES INTO THE PUBLIC SEWER SYSTEM; AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF IN THE CITY OF WHEELWRIGHT. Be it ordained and enacted by the City of Wheelwright, of the Commonwealth of Kentucky as follows

ARTICLE I

Unless the context specifically indicates otherwise, the meaning of terms used in this ordinance shall be as follows:

Sec. 1. "BOD" (denoting Biochemical Oxygen Demand) shall mean the quantity of oxygen utilized in the biochemical oxidation of organic matter under standard laboratory procedure in five (5) days at 20 degrees C, expressed in milligrams per liter

Sec. 2. "Building Drain" shall mean that part of the lowest horizontal piping of a drainage system which receives the discharge from soil, waste, and other drainage pipes inside the walls of the building and conveys it to the building sewer, beginning five (5) feet or 1.5 meters outside the inner face of the building wall. Sec. 3. "Building Sewer" shall mean the extension from the

building drain to the public sewer or other place of disposal. Sec. 4. "Easement" shall mean a written document negotiated by the City and/or the Operator for the purpose of, but not limited to, the inspection or repair of components of the sewage system lying within the boundaries of said easement.

Sec. 5. "Combined Sewer" shall mean a sewer receiving both surface runoff and sewage.

Sec. 6. "Garbage" shall mean solid wastes from the domestic and commercial preparation, cooking, and dispensing of food, and from the handling, storage, and sale of produce.

Sec. 7. "Industrial Waste" shall mean the liquid wastes from industrial manufacturing processes, trade or business as distinct from sanitary sewage.

Sec. 8: "Natural Outlet," shall mean any outlet into a watercourse, pond, ditch, lake, or other body of surface or groundwater.

Sec. 9. "Operator" shall mean the Wheelwright Utility Commission or any successor identified specifically by amendment to this

Sec. 10. "Person" shall mean any individual, firm, company, association, society, corporation, or group. Sec. 11. "pH" shall mean the logarithm of the reciprocal of the

weight of hydrogen ions in grams per liter of solution. Sec. 12. "Properly Shredded Garbage" shall mean the wastes

from the preparation, cooking, and dispensing of food that have been shredded to such a degree that all particles will be carried freely under the flow conditions normally prevailing in public sewers, with no particle greater than one-half (1/2) inch (1.27 centimeters) in any dimension. Sec. 13. "Public Sewer" shall mean a sewer in which all owners of

abutting properties have equal rights, and is controlled by public authority

Sec. 14. "Sanitary Sewer" shall mean a sewer which carries sewage and to which storm, surface, and groundwaters are not intentionally admitted.

Sec. 15. "Sewage" shall mean a combination of the water-carried wastes from residences, business buildings, institutions, and dustrial establishments, together with such ground, surface, and

stormwaters as may be present. Sec. 16. "Sewage Treatment Plant" shall mean any arrangement of devices and structures used for treating sewage.

Sec. 17. "Sewage Works" shall mean all facilities for collecting,

pumping, treating and disposing of sewage. Sec. 18: "Sewer" shall mean a pipe or conduit for carrying sewage.

Sec. 19. "Shall" is mandatory; "May" is permissive.

Sec. 20. "Slug" shall mean any discharge of water, sewage, or industrial waste which in concentration of any given constituent or in quantity of flow, exceeds for any period of duration longer than fifteen (15) minutes more than five (5) times the average twentyfour (24) hour concentration or flows during normal operation.

Sec. 21. "Storm Drain" (sometimes termed "storm sewer") shall mean a sewer which carries storm and surface waters and drainage, but excludes sewage and industrial wastes, other than u polluted cooling water.

Sec. 22. "System" shall be defined as the Wheelwright Sewer System both treatment and collection.

Sec. 23. "Commission" shall mean the City Commission of the City of Wheelwright or the Mayor, or their authorized deputy agent or

Sec. 24. "Suspended Solids" shall mean solids that either float on the surface of, or are in suspension in water, sewage, or other liquids, and which are removable through laboratory filtering. Sec. 25. "Watercourse" shall mean a channel in which a flow of water occurs, either continuously or intermittently.

Sec. 26. "Hearing Board" shall mean that Board appointed according to provisions of Article X.

ARTICLE II

Use of Public Sewers Required

Sec. 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to place, deposit, or permit to be deposited in any unsanitary manner on public or private property within the City of Wheelwright, or in any area under the jurisdiction of said City's wastewater collection system human or animal excrement, garbage, or other objectionable

Sec. 2. It shall be unlawful to discharge to any natural outlet within the City of Wheelwright or in any area under the jurisdiction of said City, any sewage or other polluted waters, except where suitable treatment has been provided in accordance with subsequent provisions of this ordinance.

Sec. 3. Except as hereinafter provided, it shall be unlawful to construct or maintain any privy, privy vault, septic tank, cesspool, or other facility intended or used for the disposal of sewage.

Sec. 4. The owner of all houses, buildings, or properties used for human occupancy, employment, recreation, or other purposes, situated within the boundaries of the City of Wheelwright and abutting on any street, alley, or right-of-way in which there is now located or may in the future, be located a public sanitary sewer, is hereby required at his expense to install suitable toilet facilities therein, and to connect such facilities directly with the proper public sewer in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance, within ninety (90) days after date of official notice to do so. provided that said public sewer is within one hundred (100) feet or 30.5 meters of the property line.

ARTICLE III

Private Sewage Disposal

Sec. 1. Where a public sanitary or combined sewer is not available under the provisions of Article II, Section 4, the building sewer shall be connected to an interim private sewage disposal system complying with the provisions of this Article.

Sec. 2. Before commencement of construction of a private sewage disposal system, the owner shall first obtain a written permit signed by the Operator. The application for such permit shall be made on a form furnished by the Operator, which the applicant shall supplement by any plans, specifications and other information as are deemed necessary by the Commission, A permit and inspection fee shall be paid to the City at the time the application is filed; the amount of said fee shall be what is the standard rate

at the time of application. Sec. 3. A permit for a private sewage disposal system shall not

become effective until the installation is completed to the satisfaction of the Commission. The Commission and/or Operator shall be allowed to inspect the work at any stage of construction, and, in any event, the applicant for the permit shall notify the Commission when the work is ready for final inspection, and before any underground portions are covered. The inspection shall be made within 72 hours of the receipt of notice by the Commission.

Sec. 4. The type, capacities, location, and layout of a private sewage disposal system shall comply with all regulations administered by Floyd County Health Department of the State of Kentucky. No permit shall be issued for any private sewage disposal system employing subsurface soil absorption facilities where it conflicts with county health department standards. No septic tank or cesspool shall be permitted to discharge to any natural outlet. Sec. 5. At such time as a public sewer becomes available to a property served by a private sewage disposal system, as provided in Article II, Section 4, a direct connection shall be made to the public sewer in compliance with this ordinance, and any septic tanks, cesspools, and similar private sewage disposal facilities shall be abandoned and filled with suitable materials.

Sec. 6. The owner shall operate and maintain the private sewage disposal facilities in a sanitary manner at all times, at no expense

Sec. 7. No statement contained in this Article shall be construed to interfere with any additional requirements that may be imposed by the Health Officer.

Sec. 8. When a public sewer becomes available, the building sewer shall be connected to said sewer within sixty (60) days and the private sewage disposal system shall be cleaned of sludge and filled with clean bank-run gravel or dirt. The sludge removal from private sewage disposal systems shall be performed by a licensed operator and be disposed of in a manner which meets or exceeds environmental laws and regulations

ARTICLE IV

Building Sewers and Connections

Sec. 1. No unauthorized person shall uncover, make any connections with or opening into, use, alter, or disturb any public sewer or appurtenance thereof without first obtaining a written permit from the Operator.

Sec. 2. There shall be two (2) classes of building sewer permits; (a) for residential and commercial service, and (b) for service to establishments producing industrial wastes. In either case, the owner or his agent shall make application on a special form furnished by the Operator. The permit application shall be supplemented by any plans, specifications, or other information considered pertinent in the judgment of the Commission. A permit and inspection fee for a residential or commercial building sewer permit and for an industrial building sewer permit shall be paid to the Operator, as the agent of the City, at the time the application is filed at the amount set by the Commission at that point in time. Sec. 3. All costs and expenses incident to the installation and connection of the building sewer shall be borne by the owner. The owner shall indemnify the City and Operator from any loss or damage that may directly or indirectly be occasioned by the installation of the building sewer.

Sec. 4. A separate and independent building sewer shall be provided for every building; except where one building stands at the rear of another on an interior lot and no private sewer is available or can be constructed to the rear building through an adjoining alley, courtyard, or driveway, the building sewer from the front building may be extended to the rear building and the whole considered as one building sewer

Sec. 5. Old building sewers may be used in connection with new buildings only when they are found, on examination and test by the Commission, to meet all requirements of this Ordinance.

Sec. 6. The size, slope, alignment, materials of construction of a building sewer, and the methods to be used in excavating, placing of the pipe, jointing, testing, and backfilling the trench, shall all conform to the requirements of the building and plumbing code or other applicable rules and regulations for the system innovated by the City. In the absence of code provisions or in amplification thereof, the materials and procedures set forth in appropriate specifications of the A.S.T.M. and W.P.C.F. Manual of Practice

Sec. 7. Whenever possible, the building sewer shall be brought to the building at an elevation below the basement floor. In all buildings in which any building drain is too low to permit gravity flow to the public sewer, sanitary sewage carried by such building drain shall be lifted by an approved means and discharged to the

Sec. 8. No person shall make connection of roof downspouts, exterior foundation drains, areaway drains, or other sources of surface runoff or ground water to building sewer or building drain which in turn is connected directly or indirectly to a public sanitary

Sec. 9. The connection of the building sewer into the public sewer shall conform to the requirements of the building and plumbing code or other applicable rules and regulations of the Operator, or the procedure set forth in appropriate specifications of the A.S.T.M. and the W.P.C.F. Manual of Practice No. 9. All such connections shall be made gas-tight and watertight. Any deviation from the prescribed procedures and materials must be approved by the Operator before installation.

Sec. 10. The applicant for the building sewer permit shall notify the Operator when the building sewer is ready for inspection and connection to the public sewer. The connection shall be made under the supervision of the Operator or their representative.

Sec. 11. All excavations for building sewer installation shall be adequately guarded with barricades and lights so as to protect the public from hazard. Streets, sidewalks, parkways, and other public property disturbed in the course of the work shall be restored in a manner satisfactory to the Operator.

ARTICLE V

Use of the Public Sewers Sec. 1. No person shall discharge or cause to be discharged any

storm water, surface water, ground water, roof runoff, subsurface drainage, uncontaminated cooling water, or unpolluted industrial process waters to any sanitary sewer. Sec. 2. Storm water and all other unpolluted drainage shall be dis-

charged to such sewers as are specifically designed as combined sewers or storm sewers, or to a natural outlet approved by the Commission. Industrial cooling water or unpolluted process waters may be discharged, on approval of the Commission, to a storm sewer, combined sewer, or natural outlet, providing an N.P.D.E.S. permit has been issued from the Environmental Pro-

Sec. 3. No person shall discharge or cause to be discharged any of the following described waters or wastes to any public sewers: (a) Any gasoline, benzene, naphtha, fuel oil, or other flammable or explosive liquid, solid or gas.

(b) Any waters or wastes containing toxic or poisonous solids, liquids, or gases in sufficient quantity, either singly or by interaction with other wastes, to injure or interfere with any sewage treatment process, constitute a hazard to humans or animals, create a public nuisance, or create any hazard in the receiving waters of the sewage treatment plant, including but not limited to: cyanides in excess of 0.05 mg/L as CN in the wastes as discharged to the public sewer.

(c) Any waters or wastes having a pH lower than 5.5, or having any other corrosive property capable of causing damage or hazard to structures, equipment, and personnel of the sewage works.

(d) Solid or viscous substances in quantities or of such size capable of causing obstruction to the flow in sewers, or other interference with the proper operation of the sewage works, such as, but not limited to, ashes, cinders, sand, mud, straw, shavings, metal, glass, rags, feathers, tar, plastics, wood, underground garbage, paunch manure, hair and fleshings, entrails and paper

dishes, cups, milk containers, etc., either whole or ground by

garbage grinders.

Sec. 4. No person shall discharge or cause to be discharged the following described substances, materials, waters, or wastes if it appears likely in the opinion of the Operator that such wastes can harm either the sewers, sewage treatment process, or equipment, have an adverse effect on the receiving stream, or can otherwise endanger life, limb, public property, or constitute a nuisance. In forming his opinion as to the acceptability of these wastes, the Operator will give consideration to such factors as the quantities of subject wastes in relation to flows and velocities in the sewers, materials of construction of the sewers, nature of the sewage treatment process, capacity of the sewage treatment plant, and other pertinent factors.

The substances prohibited are:

(a) Any liquid or vapor having a temperature higher than 150 degrees F/65 degrees C.

(b) Any water or waste containing fats, wax, grease, or oils, whether emulsified or not, in excess of 100 mg/L or containing substances which may solidify or become viscous at temperatures between 32 and 150 degrees F/ 0 to 65 degrees C.

(c) Any garbage that has not been properly shredded. The installation and operation of any garbage grinder equipped with a motor of three-fourths (3/4) horsepower or 0.76 HP metric or greater shall be subject to the review and approval of the Operator. (d) Any waters or wastes containing strong acid, iron, pickling wastes, or concentrated plating solutions whether neutralized or

(e) Any waters or wastes containing iron, chromium, copper, zinc, and similar objectionable or toxic substances; or wastes exerting an excessive chlorine requirement, to such degree that any such material received in the composite sewage at the sewage treatment works exceeds the limits established by the Operator for

(f) Any waters or wastes containing phenols or other taste- or odorproducing substance, in such concentrations exceeding limits which may be established by the Operator as necessary, after treatment of the composite sewage, to meet the requirements of the State, federal, or other public agencies of jurisdiction for such discharge to the receiving waters.

(g) Any radioactive wastes or isotopes of such half-life or concentration as may exceed limits established by the Operator in compliance with applicable State or Federal regulations.

(h) Any waters or wastes having a pH in excess of 9.0.

(i) Materials which exert or cause:

1. Unusual concentrations of inert suspended solids such as, but not limited, to, sodium chloride and sodium sulfate.

2. Excessive discoloration such as, but not limited to, dye wastes and vegetable tanning solutions.

3. Unusual BOD, chemical oxygen demand, or chlorine requirements in such quantities as to constitute a significant load on the sewage treatment works

4. Unusual volume of flow or concentration of wastes constituting "slug" as defined herein

(j) Waters or wastes containing substances which are not amenable to treatment or reduction by the sewage treatment process employed, or are amenable to treatment only to such degree that the sewage treatment plant effluent cannot meet the requirements of other agencies having jurisdiction over discharge to the receiv-

Sec. 5. If any waters or wastes are discharged, or are proposed to be discharged to the public sewers, which waters contain the substances or possess the characteristics enumerated in Section 4 of this Article, and which in the judgment of the Operator may have a deleterious effect upon the sewage works, processes, equipment, or receiving waters, or which otherwise create a hazard to life or constitute a public nuisance, the Operator may: (a) Reject the wastes.

(b) Require pretreatment to an acceptable condition for discharge to the public sewers,

(c) Require control over the quantities and rates of discharge, and/

(d) Require payment to cover the added cost of handling and treating the wastes not covered by existing taxes or sewer charges under the provisions of Section 9 of this Article. If the Operator permits the pretreatment or equalization of waste flows, the design and installation of the plants and equipment shall be subject to the review and approval of the Operator, and subject to the requirements of all applicable codes, ordinances, and laws.

Sec. 6. Grease, oil, and sand interceptors shall be provided when, in the opinion of the Operator, they are necessary for the proper handling of liquid wastes containing grease in excessive amounts, or any flammable wastes, sand or other harmful ingredients; except that such interceptors shall not be required for private living quarters or dwelling units. All interceptors shall be of a type and capacity approved by the Operator, and shall be located as to be readily and easily accessible for cleaning and inspection.

Sec. 7. Where preliminary treatment or flow-equalizing facilities are provided for any waters or wastes, they shall be maintained continuously in satisfactory and effective operation by the owner at his expense.

Sec. 8. When required by the Commission, the owner of any property serviced by a building sewer carrying industrial wastes shall install a suitable control manhole together with such necessary meters and other appurtenances in the building sewer to facilitate observation, sampling, and measurement of the wastes. Such manhole, when required, shall be constructed in accordance with plans approved by the Commission. The manhole shall be installed by the owner at his expense, and shall be maintained by him so as to be safe and accessible at all times.

Sec. 9. All measurements, tests, and analyses of the characteristics of waters and wastes to which reference is made in this Ordinance shall be determined in accordance with the latest edition of "Standard Methods for the Examination of Water and Wastewater," published by the American Public Health Association, and shall be determined at the control manhole provided, or upon suitable samples taken at said control manhole shall be considered to be the nearest downstream manhole in the public sewer to the point at which the building sewer is connected. Sampling shall be carried out by customarily accepted methods to reflect the effect of constituents upon the sewage works and to determine the existence of hazards to life, limb, and property. The particular analyses involved will determine whether a twenty-four (24) hour composite of all outfalls of a premise is appropriate or whether a grab sample or samples should be taken. Normally, but not always, BOD and suspended solids analyses are obtained from twenty-four (24) hour composite of all outfalls whereas pH's are determined from periodic grab samples. Sec. 10. No statement contained in this Article shall be construed

as preventing any special agreement of arrangement between the Operator upon approval of the City and any industrial concern whereby an industrial waste of unusual strength or character may be accepted by the Operator for treatment, subject to payment therefore, by the industrial concern.

ARTICLE VI

Protection from Damage

Sec. 1. No unauthorized person shall maliciously, willfully, or negligently break, damage, destroy, uncover, deface, or tamper with any structure, appurtenance, or equipment which is a part of the sewage works. Any person violating this provision shall be subject to immediate arrest under charge of disorderly conduct.

ARTICLE VII

Powers and Authority of Inspectors

Sec. 1. Any Commissioner or the Mayor and other duly authorized employees of the City or their Operator bearing proper credentials and identification shall be permitted to enter all properties for the

purpose of inspection, observation, measurement, sampling, and testing in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance. The Commission or the Mayor or his representatives are authorized to obtain information concerning industrial processes which have a direct bearing on the kind and source of discharge to the wastewater collection system. The industry may withhold information considered confidential. The industry must establish that the revelation to the public of the information in question might result in an advantage to competitors.

Sec. 2. While performing the necessary work on private properties referred to in Article VII, Section 1 above, the Commission or duly authorized employees of the City shall observe all safety rules applicable to the premises established by the company and the company shall be held harmless for injury or death to the City employees and the City shall indemnify the company against loss or damage to its property by City employees and against liability claims and demands for personal injury or property damage asserted against the company and growing out of the gauging and sampling operation, except as such may be caused by negligence or failure of the company to maintain safe conditions as required in Article V, Section 8.

Sec. 3. A Commissioner and other duly authorized employees of the City bearing proper credentials and identification shall be permitted to enter all private properties through which the City holds a duly negotiated easement for the purposes of, but not llimited to, inspection, observation, measurement, sampling, repair, and maintenance of any portion of the sewage works lying within said easement. All entry and subsequent work, if any, on said easement, shall be done in full accordance with the terms of the duly negotiated easement pertaining to the private property

ARTICLE VIII

Sewage Service Rates

Sec. 1. Residential, commercial, and those industrial customers not participating in the industrial cost recovery program will have sewage service rates based on water consumption

Sec. 2. All sewage service customers are prohibited to discharge the following above their indicated concentrations at any time: (a) Cyanide 0.050 mg/L (b) Arsenic 0.020 mg/L (c) Cadmium 0.030 mg/L

ARTICLE IX

Penalties Sec. 1. Any person found to be violating any provision of this ordinance except Article VI shall be served by the City or their Operator with written notice stating the nature of the violation and providing a reasonable time limit for the satisfactory correction thereof. (2) For residential and commercial building sewers; and

(3) For industrial sewer connections

ARTICLE XII

Sec. 1. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith Sec. 2. The invalidity of any section, clause, sentence, or provi-

sion of this Ordinance shall not affect the validity of any other part of this Ordinance which can be given effect without such invalid part or parts.

ARTICLE XIII

Ordinance in Force

Sec. 1. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, recording, and publication as provided by law. Further, any ordinance entitled "Sewer Use Ordinance" previously adopted is hereby repealed upon legal passage of this Ordinance Sec. 2. Passed and adopted by the Commission of the City of



Building project tips:

Keep your dream from becoming a nightmare

Planning to build or remodel? Here are a few important tips before you begin:

You may already know exactly what you want in the way of the finished product but if you've not quite decided, most building suppliers have updated books of plans and designs of homes, garages, patios, decks, etc. Or, you may want to enlist the help of a local architect.

When you have made a choice of what to build, visit your local building supplier who has samples of paneling, cabinets, plumbing fixtures, lighting fixtures, paint colors, siding, brick, doors, etc.

This will give you an idea of the type of materials you wantto use in your project.

It's also time to choose a reliable contractor whom you can also communicate with. Choosing your contractor is probably one of the most important aspects of any building project no matter how large or small.

A good contractor will

advise you on the best quality materials for the price and labor saving ways to help you with the total cost of your project. Some ways to obtain names of contractors are through your local newspaper ads, radio commercials, or through a friend who has utilized the services of a reli-

able contractor.

Call several contractors and make appointments with them to explain what you are planning to build. Inquire at the meeting if they've done a project similar to the one you're wanting done. Ask for phone numbers of their customers for reference. Have the contractor give you a complete estimate of the total cost of materials and labor for your project. Beware of contractors who turn in an extremely low bid compared to the other bids. Some contractors will deliberately omit part of the cost in order to turn in a lower bid. Then if they're awarded the contract and have begun work, they will be around asking you for more money for something they've missed.

Once you do choose a contractor you feel comfortable with, have him give you a total estimate of materials and labor for your project. Then have him draw up a contract stating all he plans to furnish as far as materials and labor, including all inspections such as electrical and plumbing along with the price you were quoted.

Your contract should also contain a reasonable warranty on the labor that is to be performed. Most building suppliers already have warranties on the products they sale. Be sure to inquire about this and make sure the product has a warranty and what type.

These few tips will help you with one of the most important decisions you'll ever make. Taking a little extra time to follow them now will benefit your family's future.

Updating A 90s Home for The 90s

Having reached her 90th birthday, she was showing her age (who wouldn't?); color, style and grace had all left their mark, but had, indeed, left. Then along came a man, much younger than she, determined to help restore hervibrant youth. And so he did.

The stuff of a turgid romance cum sci-fi novel? No, it's a true life story of hard work and effort by Des Moines builder Jim Seaman, who joined with the editors of Country Home magazine and architect Marcia Lyon to restore a historic Victorian home in a venerable Des Moines neighborhood.

What would motivate a seasoned pro, like Seaman to tackle a project where every major component-heating, plumbing, electrical, floors, walls and before all else, the foundation—needed rebuilding or refurbishing?

"First, location, location, location," Seaman says in the Country Home cover story on the project. "It's in a great neighborhood. And I just fell in love with it the first time I saw it. It has a terrific lot and the house is attractive."

More attractive now than ever, thanks to Seaman's masterful juggling of schedules, contractors, materials and the rest. The home's dowager-turned-debutante spirit is perhaps best captured in the kitchen.

The kitchen's first need was space-better access to the room from other areas of the home, and improved traffic flow and circulation within the room. A four-pronged strategy accomplished this: a wall was reopened between the kitchen and a stairwell leading from the front and side entry halls: a too-large bathroom was shrunk: a dining room entry was moved: and a rear entrance was added. Strong advantage was also taken of the natural light available through an abundance of windows.

Quality was the project watchword, according to Country Home building editor Steve Cooper. kitchen was much more than a facelift," Cooper says. "For example, we chose state-ofthe-art appliances to create an environment where any cook could thrive.'

The working nature of the room is exemplified by the hardworking appliances: 24inch deep built-in refrigerator, automatic dishwasher (both with matching cabinet panels), all-white drop-in range with cast-iron cooking

elements, and powerful disposer, all from Kitchen Aid.

"The home's classic roots are reflected in the elegantly crafted cabinetry (from Plain 'n Fancy) and soft colors,' Cooper adds. Durable, faux

DuPont Corian® and lively floor tiles from Summitville Tiles add further warmth and charm. A huge veranda just off the kitchen and garden room makes for mellow afternoons under a gorgeous hard maple.

Sometimes-fussy Victorian decor was eschewed in favor of a country romantic feel, emphasizing bright colors and complimentary patterns; all combine in an atmosphere where people can relax, entertain and have fun. A Victorian of the 1890s becomes a Victorian for the 1990s, her dignity intact, her spirit renewed.



back door. And because they turn on only when needed, motion sensors use minimal energy.

The newest types of motion sensors are pre-assembled for even faster installation. Also look for models using pulse count technology, which enables the motion sensor to take a second look at objects and minimize false triggering caused by snow, leaves or small animals

"Outdoor motion sensors are available for use with standard floodlight fixtures, as well as decorative lights," says Peterson. "There's also a new quartz model with a powerful 500-watt lamp."


Motion sensors are increasingly being used with indoor lighting controls, too. Several products feature a built-in motion sensor that turns indoors lights on the moment somebody enters a room, Another model can be programmed to turn lights on and off at random times to create the impression that someone is home.

Both outdoor motion sensors and indoor lighting controls are available at local hardware stores and home centers. Outdoor motion sensor lighting controls carry suggested retail prices ranging from about \$19 to \$35, while indoor lighting controls cost between \$13 and \$35

LOST SENSE OF SECURITY

With the average value of items stolen in a burglary now approaching \$1,000, (about the same amount as Mandy lost), a single burglary could put a severe dent in most anyone's budget. Even if you have insurance, that sense of security cannot be replaced.

"The price of outdoor and indoor motion sensors is really a minimal investment," says Peterson. "The real question isn't how much it costs to protect yourself, but how much you can afford to lose if you don't."





Permits needed for construction or for filling in floodplain areas

Most builders are familiar with the need to determine the location of various underground utilities before construction begins. However, builders often don't realize they need to apply for a permit before doing any construction in a floodplain area, according to the Kentucky Division of Water.

These regulations apply to anyone who wants to alter floodplain property. Altera-tions may include adding any type of fill in order to create a surface on which to build or for the construction of culverts, bridges, levees, and placement of mobile homes.

Structures that obstruct a floodplain may divert floodwaters onto property that would otherwise not have been flooded. In other words, one person's actions to

"improve" his property may destroy, or at least degrade another's property.

Permits for construction are not an attempt to prevent construction in floodplains. However, the permits do al-

low for experts in floodplain gram. management to review proposed construction and offer alternative methods that will prevent damages to the floodplain area.

Floodplain maps, available from the National Flood Insurance Program Map Distribution Center, can usually help determine whether or not property is in a floodplain. Maps may be ordered by calling a toll-free number (800/ 333-1363) and giving the name of the community, the county, and the six-digit community number. (The community number is available from the Floodplain

Management Section of the Division of Water at 502/564-3410.)

Lending agencies, developers, and builders should be aware federally insured money cannot be lent for construction in a floodplain unless the community has elected to participate in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) and has met all requirements of the pro-

The NFIP is a governmentbacked insurance program established by Congress in the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968. The program provides government subsidized flood insurance at reasonable rates in exchange for the careful management of flood-prone areas by local communities.

To protect their investments, lenders, developers,

and builders should be aware of NFIP requirements:

·Losses due to flooding are not covered under a homeowner's insurance pol-

•Flood insurance protection is available through the NFIP only if a community is currently participating in the program.

•To become eligible, a community must adopt floodplain management measures. Permits for construction in a floodplain are necessary whether or not the community is participating in the NFIP. County judges-

Prevention is best bet to spider control

Q. My family really enjoys taking vacations at our summer retreat, but we have a serious problem with cobwebs. A friend told me about some sort of paint additive to control this problem, but when I inquired about this at our local paint store, I came away with no answers. Do you know of anything like

A. According to the experts on bugs, paint additives are short-lived at best. Your best bet is to control spiders by preventing them from entering your home. In severe cases, you should consider insecticides.

To check your spider problem, caulk any cracks you may have in the foundation where they're likely to get in. Seal any gaps around doors, windows, pipes and where wiring comes into the house. Check your firewood before you bring it into the house for spiders. Clean up areas where spiders potentially breed.

If these measures don't work, you're likely looking at a spider infestation. Apply an insecticide, such as chlorpyrifos (Dursban) or propoxur (Baygon), around all baseboards, corners and other areas spiders are found. These chemicals can be found at garden centers. For safety's sake, make sure you follow all recommended procedures. Since exterminators have a greater access to a wider vari-

ety of insecticides, you would probably do better to hire them for your problem.





To remove old finishes, use a water based stripper

For a long time, chemical paint and varnish strippers have been a popular choice among do-it-your-selfers for removing old finishes from wood furniture. But conventional chemical strippers—those with methylene chloride, alkaline, or aromatic solvents— have significant drawbacks.

These strippers pose a variety of health risks to the

user. Contact with the skin or eyes can be extremely dangerous, while exposure to the fumes of methylene chloride based strippers can lead to serious long term health problems.

"If you're planning on stripping a piece of furniture or some other woodwork, your main concern should be your health risk," said Beverly Dejulio of The Family Handyman magazine. "Newer products on the market are a lot safer to use. They are water based."

Water based strippers entered the market in 1989 when 3M introduced Safest Stripper brand Paint and Varnish Remover. Water based strippers use organic technology that substantially reduces the health risks involved with conventional strippers.

"These new safer strippers can be used without gloves, without a respirator and you don't need ventilation," said Ms. DeJulio. "So, you can really do paint stripping any time of the year."

These new strippers are almost odor free and are less likely to irritate the skin. They clean up easily with water. They also work differently from traditional chemical removers. When used properly, the new strippers are as effective as the conventional removers.

The conventional strippers

contain harsh chemicals that evaporate quickly. Only small areas can be stripped at a time. They have to be removed quickly, causing short working times that result in a patchwork process for larger pieces.

Water based strippers, however, can be applied over the entire project at one time. They should be applied in a thick (one-eighth of an inch minimum) coat. Since water based products work differently, there isn't any blistering or bubbling of the paint/finish as found with conventional products.

The new strippers need time to work. They soften old paint or varnish, so they should be left on for 45 minutes to three hours, depending on the finish.

The new strippers can be left on overnight without damaging the wood. They may skin over and appear dry, but they are still working under this "skin" for up to 24 hours. Entire projects can be

stripped at one time.

Several companies introduced solvent-based formulations recently — a middle ground between methylene chloride and the water based products. The solvent-based products are expensive and claim to be safer than methylene chloride. But most require protective gloves for application and recommend "well ventilated areas" for use, unlike the water based products.

So, before starting your refinishing project, check the facts about the different kinds of paint strippers. Remember a water based product does reduce health risks and needs to be worked with in a different way from conventional chemical strippers.

Household help

Q. Last week, my basement laundry room started flooding for no apparent reason. It's not coming from the washing machine, or the pipes. It almost seems to be seeping in from the floor and back wall. I called a plumber, but he told me he'd have to tear up my driveway to determine where the leak is coming from, and that it would cost me several thousand dollars just to do that. I can't afford that, so I'm at my wit's end. Perhaps you can give me some guidance as to where this water could be coming from, and what I can do about it. Just for your information: the house is six years old, and is attached on both sides. It is a three-story house.

A. I can only guess without being able to look at it. However, with row houses such as yours, there is usually one water main feeding the attached houses. Even if there is a tiny pinhole in that main, the water has to go somewhere. I think that's what's happening with your basement. In order to determine this, I suggest you call your local water department. Their number will be listed in the phone book. Have them come out and look. They will then determine the location of the leak and let you know what has to be done to repair

Unfortunately, since you're the one with the leak, you will probably be responsible for the repair. To get yourself the best price, contact several plumbers for estimates. Local ordinances will probably require that these plumbers be licensed to work on municipal pipes, but most plumbers are, anyway.

As you probably know, time is of the essence. Water damage is an insidious thing, and it can be quite extensive. Don't wait any longer on this. Get on the phone right away.

As to the cost, it is possible that your homeowner's insurance will cover some of it. Check your policy, or call your insurance broker for more information once you know where the leak is coming from, and what you have to do to repair it. Good luck.

How to build a screened patio



secured. Begin by mounting 2-in.x4-in. wood base strips panel sizes and can be cut with tin snips or a sharp utility knife.

Building on masonry, you will also need an electric drill with a masonry bit and non-rusting screws in lead sleeves, to secure the wood frame.




along the patio floor and main wall of the house—drilling through masonry if necessary—and measure the space within the rectangle formed. You'll build a screen wall for each of these rectangles, then attach screening to the frames. Apply wood stains or other finishes before the screening is installed.

Build the frames separately to fit the three spaces, using vertical beams spaced evenly on 24-in, 36-in, or 48in. centers—all three are typical screen widths. A horizontal "rub rail" at chair back height, about 30-in. above the floor, will add stability. Use the metal framing angles on corners where the vertical and


horizontal beams are joined.

To provide an outside exit from the porch, use two 4-in.x4-in. studs to frame a door opening in one wall. You can then install a pre-made door easily.

Once the frames are finished, raise them into position and nail them to the floor and ceiling base strips, then nail the corners together. Now, add the screening in each vertical section by unrolling from the top down and stapling it into place. Cover the staples with wood strips of the same width and finish as the wood studs. If you have built a door frame, install the door and start enjoying your new summer living room!
