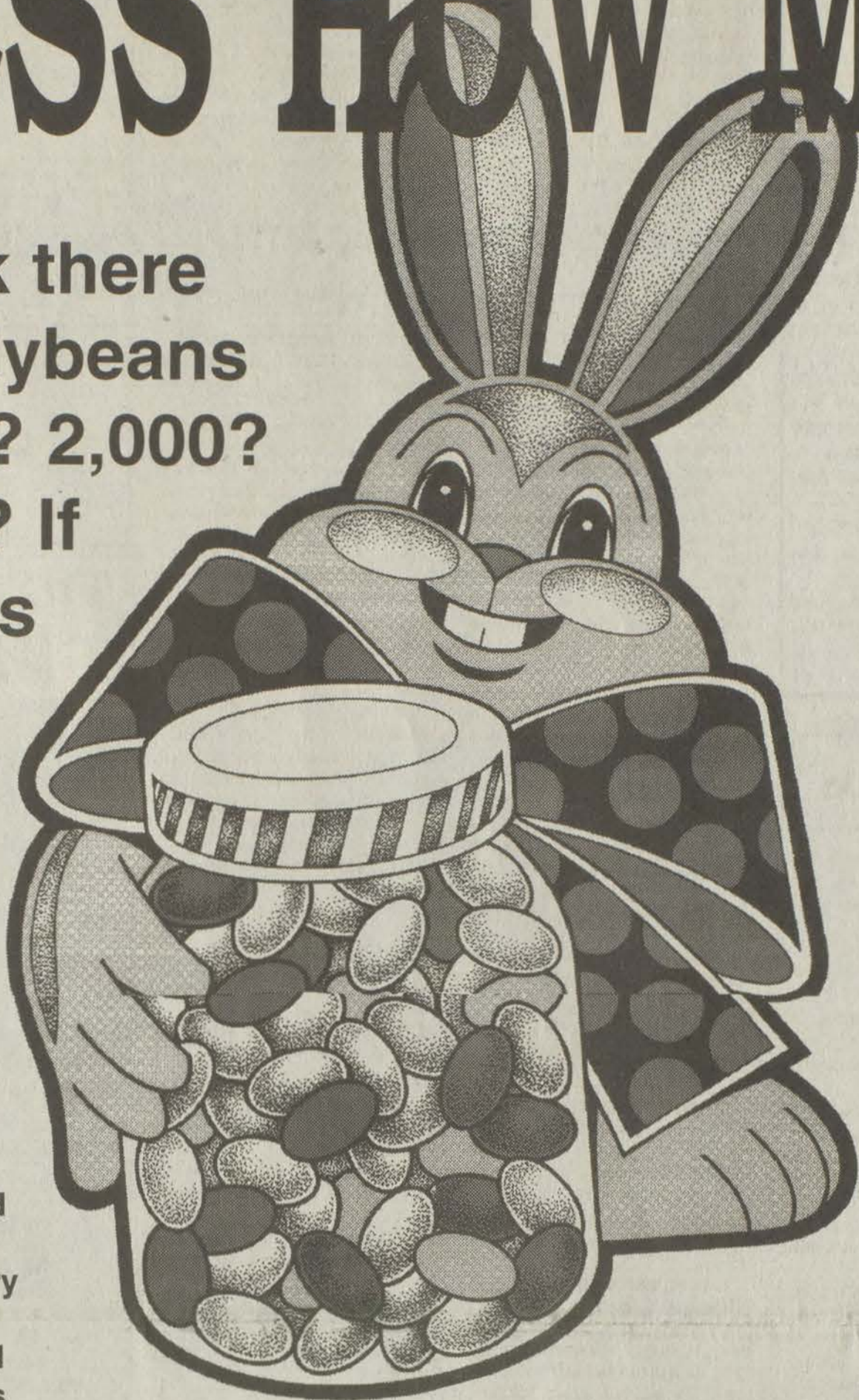

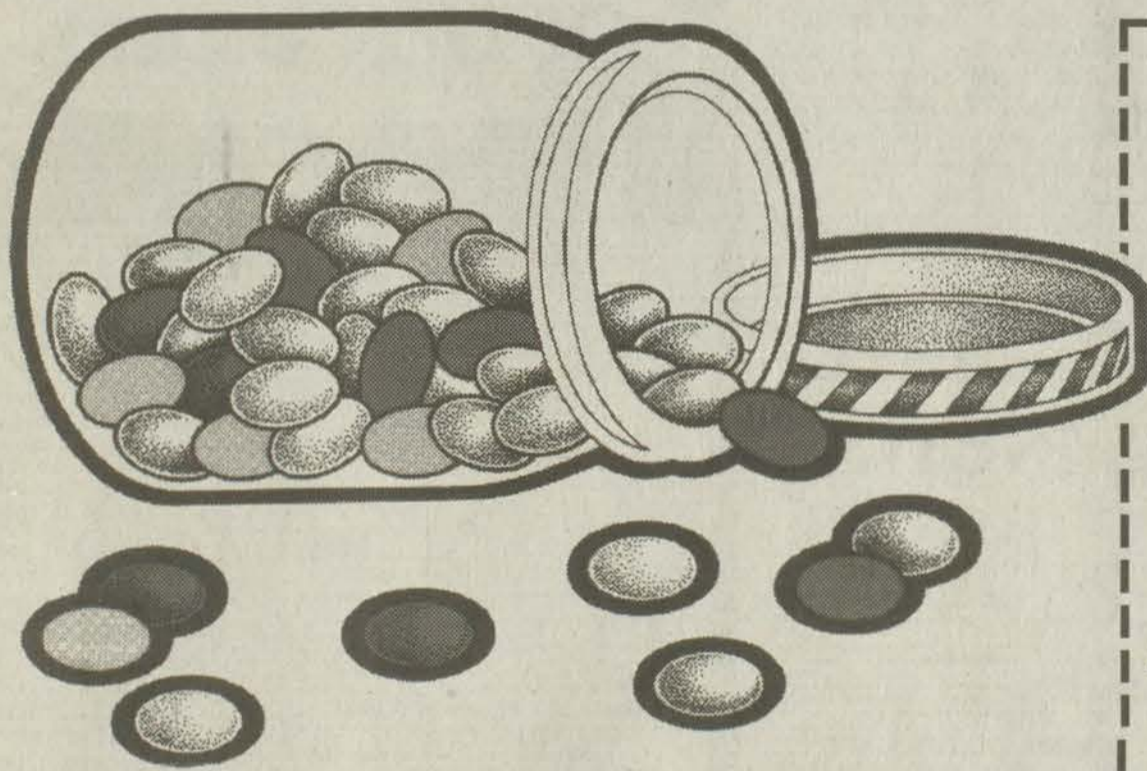

IN FOCUS — NANCY BECKER KENNEDY: The costar of the new CBS series, "Louie," Kennedy is a wheelchair bound quadriplegic who has many talents with which she both entertains and informs.

"I wound up in this chair because of a diving accident," Nancy says. "But although it's not the most efficient way to get around legs are much better it does take me where I want to go."

Nancy figured she was a shoo-in for the "Louie" role.

"When I learned they were looking for someone to play a woman in a wheelchair, I figured I had a pretty good chance of getting the part. And I was right. But what really got them interested in me was not my mastery of the chair; it was my background as a stand up comic. They probably figured they could get almost anyone to learn how to use a chair, but not everyone has her comedic timing down just right."

As with her character, Helen, Nancy says, "She's a lot like me in that her disability is secondary to who she is as a person."

An activist on many fronts, including women's rights (she majored in political science in college) she is an outspoken advocate in behalf of the handicapped.

"I'm delighted Christopher Reeve feels some movement in his body," she says. "But while we certainly need to do research on overcoming paralysis, we mustn't overlook the need for care in pursuit of a cure. Too many people who need help now aren't getting it."

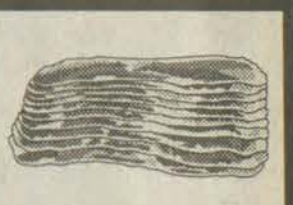

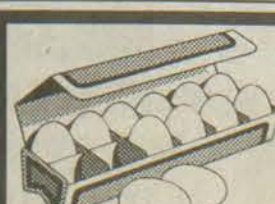

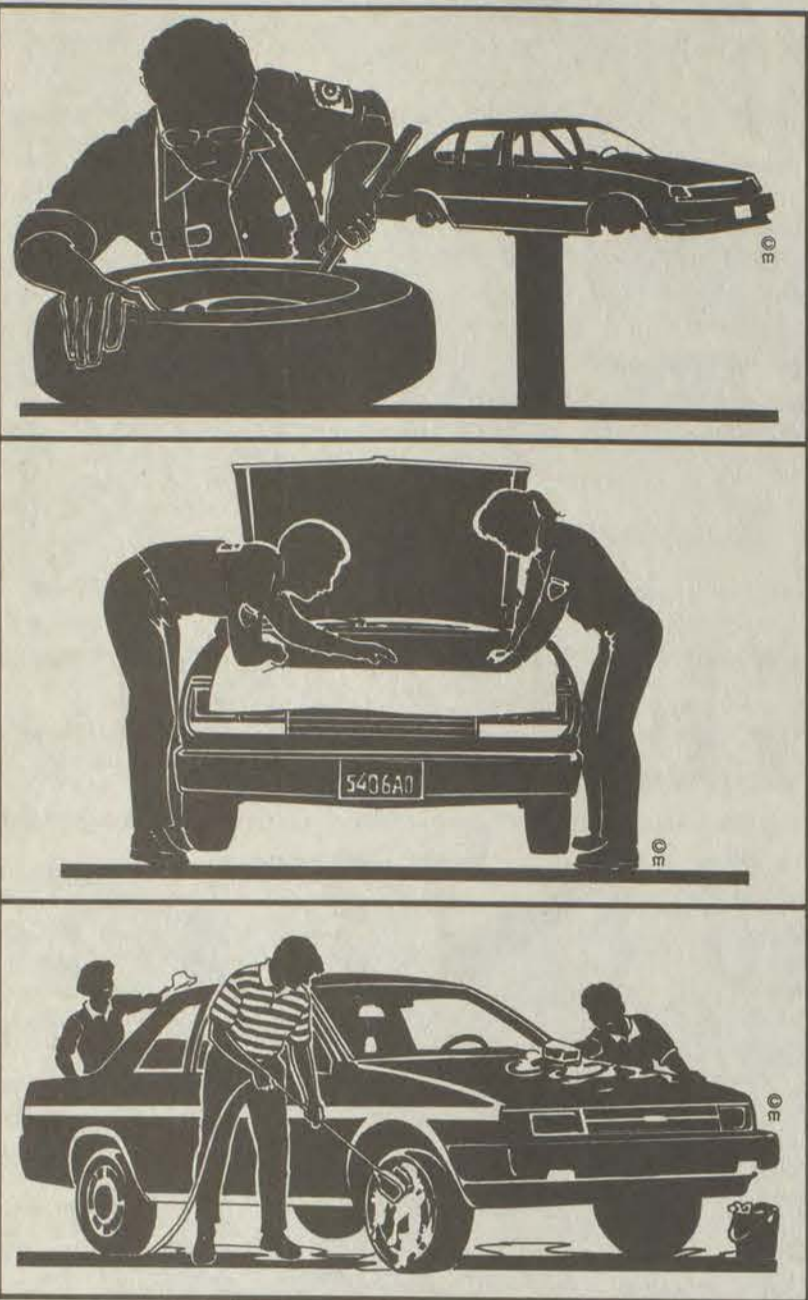
