Chairman ousted in **board** coup

State invited to take over management

In what may be a last-ditch effort to avoid their own ousters, a split Floyd County Board of Education voted Tuesday evening to replace chairman Ursal 'Ray Wilcox and to invite a state management assistance team to take administrative control of the embattled system.

What impact the request for state management could have on superintendent Gene Davis will be decided by the state board of education, if the invitation is accepted.

Just after Tuesday's meeting got underway, board member Jody Mullins asked that the board item "new business" be moved up on the agenda. After Mullins motion was passed, on a 3-2 vote, board member Eddie Patton asked that board policy be amended regarding the selection of a chairman and the term of vice chairman. Patton's motion to allow the board to change a chairman "at any other time deemed necessary by a majority of

Wilcox commented, "I'll ride him hard," and superintendent Davis chimed in, "bring it on."

When seated, Wilcox told Mullins he would have to face state board members at the October meeting.

"I will face them, but I will not say 'no comment," Mullins quipped, making reference to Wilcox's response of "no comment" to a state school board committee in August.

A former Floyd County man was one of two area residents killed in a three-car accident Tuesday afternoon on the Mountain Parkway west of Salyersville.

One victim was tentatively identified by deputy Magoffin County Coroner Johnny Lovely as former Floyd resident Mack Denzil Kidd Jr., 35, who was

of \$1 million, were destroyed Monday by the Floyd County Sheriff's Department on a remote mountaintop in Mud Creek.

The plants, which ranged in heights from 12 to 14-feet tall, were found in a cleared out plot in Frasure's Branch. The stalks of the plants appeared to be about an inch to an inch and a half in diameter and were full of buds, some about 18-inches long.

Sheriff Paul Hunt Thompson said Monday that the patch is the biggest find ever in the county since he's been sheriff.

Thompson and detectives Jim Rederick and Homer Neeley with deputies Matt Johnson, Charlie Thompson and Tommy Gearheart cut the plants and burned them at the site.

According to court records, Hall "caught (Hatfield) breaking into his bar. He caught Mr. Hatfield and assaulted him.'

After being detained and reportedly assaulted by Hall, Hatfield was arrested Friday by trooper Baker. Hatfield was charged with first degree burglary.

Court documents suggest Hatfield is also responsible for the burglary of the residence of Colleen Little and Jeff Newman, who is also reportedly an owner of the bar.

According to trooper Baker's reports, Hatfield allegedly stole two firearms and other items from Little and Newman's residence.

gives Perry killer the 'chair'

Floyd Circuit Judge John David Caudill sentenced a Perry County man to death Saturday for the 1989 brutal murder of Helen Madden.

The judge issued the death sentence to Donald Herb Johnson, 30, Saturday after more than two hours of deliberation in his chambers, a little "soul searching," and a request for "divine guidance."

Johnson was also sentenced to 15 years in prison for first degree burglary of the Brite & Clean Laundromat, where Madden was working when she was murdered; 20 years for first degree robbery; and ten years for two counts of first degree sex abuse.

Although Johnson appeared to have no reaction to the judge's decision, his mother became very emotional when her son was sentenced to die.

Johnson's capital murder trial in Floyd County is the third state case in which a jury was waived and the penalty for the crime was left to the discretion of a judge.

Although Johnson entered an unconditional guilty plea to the charges in 1994 and requested that Judge Caudill determine his fate, prosecutors would not agree to waive a jury before the matter was appealed to the Supreme Court.

That court's ruling stipulated that the Commonwealth would also have to agree to waive the jury.

Prosecutors agreed about two weeks before the penalty phase began for Caudill to determine Johnson's sentence for Madden's murder and the other felony charges.

During closing arguments Saturday, prosecutor David Smith asked the court to impose the death penalty for Madden's murder, and noted that the prosecution wanted

"I had to keep reminding myself who is the victim and who is the defendant," he said.

Numerous witnesses, including Johnson, testified about the alleged abuse Johnson suffered from his father.

Smith said no documents have been recorded about the alleged sex abuse and the doctors who testified about the abuse received their information from the defendant.

Defense attorney Vince Yustas admitted that no one could minimize the death of Helen Madden.

"The question here is do we need to have another killing in this matter," Yustas said. "(Johnson's) psyche is broken - not sanity, but the emotional, mental illness causing the defendant to commit the crime.'

Yustas reminded the court that Johnson has spent the last eight years in county jails, and that he

he murdered Madden.

"We need to keep ourselves in context of who it was at the time of the crime," he said, noting that Johnson has no other criminal record; suffers from Attention Deficit Disorder (ADD); and was from a dysfunctional family.

"Both experts say it was one of the most seriously dysfunctional families they had ever seen," Yustas said. "(Johnson) is not the mean and evil person (the prosecut tion) is trying to portray.

Yustas contended that Johnson "snapped" shortly after his father said the defendant wasn't his son.

"God help us if we kill everybody," he said. "...(Johnson) must be punished, but the state can not put him down like an animal."

Formal sentencing is scheduled for 9 a.m. September 30.



nnexation of park gets first reading

Prestonsburg's city council held first reading Monday of an ordinance to annex over 500 acres of land in and around Jenny Wiley State Park.

In June, council announced its plans to incorporate the land at the park as part of its efforts to create a multi-million dollar hilltop recreation project.

Mayor Jerry Fannin said Tuesday that only the formality of a second reading of the ordinance remains before the land is annexed.

"The time has passed (for anyone to oppose the annexation)," Fannin said. "We're now just waiting for the second reading of the ordinance for it to be final."

The proposed annexation will include the May Lodge; the park's public swimming pool; guest cottages and boat dock; the amphitheater; a portion of the golf course and Stratton Branch; and the Stumbo/Wilkinson Convention Center.

In return, the park will be served by the city's fire and police departments, plus realize a savings in city water and sewer rates.

The second reading of ordinance is expected to be at council's September 22 meeting.

I shall never forget the remark of one dear lady. She said, "I would only get \$17.00 a month in food stamps. It would cost me \$20.00 to get someone to take me to Pikeville to get them. It isn't worth it.'

The only way this trip could have proven financially feasible for this woman is if she had someone to drive her who was willing to run her about town and wait for her at her doctor's office, this pharmacy, the food stamp office, the bank and the grocery store. This would entail an all-day commitment on behalf of the driver.

Economically speaking, this woman realized the cost to obtain the food stamps was not worth the benefits they provided to her. What is disturbing about her business acumen of three years ago is that today transportation in Eastern Kentucky has only marginally improved. Our senior citizens and others who cannot drive due to physical ailments and handicaps, need dependable transportation at affordable costs.

To car pool and to share travel expenses would produce a greater savings for this woman, providing every rider saw the same doctor at the same time, used the same pharmacy, banked at the same financial institution and shopped at the same store. Reasoning tells us that this kind of coordination is highly unlikely. To care for all of one's business in one day is stressful and physically demanding for most everyone, especially is this true of many senior citizens.

Some feel it is the family's responsibility to care for the transportation needs of their aged and handicapped. Yet this is not as easy as it may seem on the surface. Several factors are involved. A majority of our senior citizens have never learned to drive, others because of impaired eyesight had to give up driving, and still others cannot afford properly insured, dependable vehicles. Safety factors need also to be considered.

Though we have fairly good county and state roads for the Appalachian environment, our mountainous terrain and the black ice in the winter do not make for safe road conditions. Our hollows are narrow, often making it impossible to pass without one vehicle coming to a complete halt to let the other pass. These "paths" with all of their beauty are treacherous. Many hollow roads are little more than compacted dirt. Some are graveled and a few are blacktopped. In Appalachia, unless we are on well-maintained state roads, we often find ourselves one slip away from a tragic accident. We must drive on extremely narrow, curvy roads, up and down steep inclines, where only lower mountain ridges or muddy creeks would stop our vehicle's airborne mobility, were we to slip over the edge. Some roads have guard rails. Many more need them. Although these are of little help in the event of serious impact, they do help drivers to judge distances on their right, while they provide psychological assurance to drivers of all ages. These rails are especially helpful to those with impaired vision.

Many who live in our beautiful mountains do not venture out on our highways any further than their local post offices or their favorite Mom and Pop grocery stores. Oftentimes this is because they do not have the luxury of a dependable vehicle. Few of these tranquil,

far removed communities have doctors, and fewer have hospitals. Some have medical clinics. I know people who live deep in the hills who will not drive to the Breaks or over Pine Mountain or even over the mountain from McDowell to the Mud Creek Clinic.

Too, we must take into consideration the distance one has to drive and the time involved to take Mom or Dad, a dear friend or a deserving neighbor to the doctor. If a driver with a dependable car is employed, but does not have employee benefits that allows him or her to incur "sick leave," the chances are great that they would have to miss a day of work without pay to get their family member to the doctor or the hospital for tests. Can they really afford to do that often without jeopardizing their jobs? Yet, it is not unusual for a senior citizen to have to see the doctor three or four times a month.

It appears that people in Eastern Kentucky are not supposed to get sick after 4:30 or on weekends. Hospital emergency rooms are partially staffed around the clock. Doctors and specialists take turns being "on call" after hours. The Hope Clinic, Mud Creek Clinic and Shelby Valley Clinic now offer some evening hours. Likewise, some physicians in private practice have begun to have evening hours to accommodate working people so that they can care for their own medical needs as well as the needs of their loved ones who depend on them for transportation.

To pay someone to take you on errands in their private vehicle could put the driver at a legal risk. (I strongly urge that drivers talk with their vehicle insurance agents before they accept either money, gas or other forms of barter in exchange for transportation). Yet, not everyone in the mountains who is willing to provide a service in this way, can afford the money it takes for gas to make the trip to Pikeville, Prestonsburg, Ashland, Lexington or Louisville.

What are our sick and elderly to do? Where can they turn for help? What are the guidelines to qualify for transportation in the Big Sandy area. Who pays the fare? What, if anything, will it cost the rider? Is a family member or friend allowed to accompany you? What will it cost for the second party? These are questions we will begin to consider in next week's column.







Tailback scores four TDs, rush for 137 yards

It was a battle of backs rather than a battle of teams on the gridiron when South Floyd visited Betsy Layne this past Friday night for a county confrontation.

Raider running back Ketrin Mays and Billy Mitchell, for the Bobcats, turned up the heat for their respective squads but it was South Floyd going home with a 46-20 win over Betsy Layne.

Mays rushed for 137 yards, scored four touchdowns, and had two receptions for 50 yards. Mitchell had more yardage on the ground, finishing with 204 for the game. He scored all three of the Bobcats touchdowns and ran a conversion.

"He's a hard runner," said South Floyd coach Donnie Daniels. When we give up yardage, we give it up in bunches.





Rose to head up elementary officials clinic

The Floyd County Elementary Basketball Conference tournament format was adopted by the Floyd County Board of Education recently and became board policy in a victory for the committee to revamp the programs from last year.

Floyd County Athletic Director, Pete Grigsby, Jr., with help from Neil Turner, speared-headed a committee that oversaw the revamping of a program that had become outdated with its four sectional tournaments

Under the new program that takes effect this year, the county grade school teams will be divided into two divisions, North and South, and all teams will be participants in the county grade school tournament in February.

In a move that was needed, the committee won board support of an officials clinic and organizations that grade school coaches may draw from when needing referees for home games.

The official's clinic and membership will be under the direction of veteran high school official, Brent Rose, who also coaches basketball at McDowell.

"Brent has agreed to take the responsibility of organizing the clinic," said Grigsby. "I think he

get the best officials we can for our grade school games."

Grigsby said only those officials who register with the FCEAC will be eligible to be used in grade school games.

"They have to register with the Conference and they have to attend an official's clinic as well," said Grigsby. "Also, they must be a registered official with the KHSAA.'

Grigsby said each official will be expected to wear the proper attire and attend one on-the-court training from the KHSAA panorama's or the annual FCEAC referee clinic.

In previous years, the winners and runners-up in each of the four sectionals advanced to the Floyd County Grade School Tournament, while the loser's seasons ended. This year all teams will be part of the biggest event to take place in the county.



Spin it however you like, this was a conference game Kentucky should have won and fans should be disappointed, since SEC victories come so rarely. Yet, whatever else happens this fall (3-8, 4-7, 5-6...), the Wildcats' season - as the media guide cover proclaimed, is







Child safety on the farm Hunter-Thompson wed

The family farm is a great place, but it also holds potential for harm to the ones we want to protect the most-young children.

The farm is a unique environment for children to live, play, work and grow up; but agriculture is one of the most hazardous occupations, and farm children are routinely exposed to the same hazards as their parents who are working on the farm.

It is impossible to know the exact number of children who are seriously injured or killed on our farms every year. Estimates range from 100 to 300 deaths and from 100,000 to 250,000 injuries each year. While we don't know the exact number of injury events, there are many things we do know about children, production agriculture, and injuries.

· From one-third to one-half of nonfatal childhood agricultural injuries occur to children who do not live on farms.

• The highest farm injury rate is among boys 14-17 years of age.

· Tractors are associated with the greatest number of deaths to children on farms.

· Nonfatal farm injuries are often associated with livestock, falls, small tools, building structures, and moving machinery parts.

In order for a farm to be a safe place for a child to live and/or visit, the farm must be a safe environment for adults. All standard safety measures and practices should be in place on any farm where children are present.

Adults should keep in mind that they are responsible for maintain-

ing the safety of any child or adolescent who may be present on the farm worksite. When assessing when and where a child should be present on a farm worksite, the owner/operator and parent should consider the fact that farming is one of the most hazardous occupations in the U.S., and the worksite holds dangers that are comparable to construction workers and miners. For every hazard present on a farm, there should be a barrier that protects children and other visitors from that hazard.

What can farmers and parents do to protect their children from danger? First of all, it is helpful to know what types of injuries occur most frequently to children in the local region; that is, different types of injuries are associated with different types of production agriculture

Once adults are aware of the primary causes of injury, decisions should be made regarding the appropriateness of having children watching or participating in the work environment.

These decisions should be made far in advance of any work requirements that may tempt the adult to have children observe or help with work. Young children are subject to potential problems associated with exposure to dusts, vibration, noise, and other physical hazards in the worksite.

Therefore, they should have limited exposure to the farm worksite. As children age and mature, their presence and participation in the worksite should be adapted to their physical and cognitive skills.







Mines recognized for outstanding safety records

Two area mining operations were recognized recently for exceptional safety records during 1996.




