

Council okays mayor's plan for golf board

Compromise gives veto power to mayor, council

The city of Prestonsburg now has a golf advisory board.

Despite last-minute lobbying by Councilman Gorman Collins in favor of his own plan, the Prestonsburg City Council gave final approval Thursday to an ordinance which places control of an 18-hole golf course planned for the city's mountaintop project in the hands of an advisory board, subject to veto power by the council and mayor.

The measure was drafted by Mayor Jerry Fannin. Under terms of the ordinance, the advisory board has charge of the general supervision and control of the operation and maintenance of the golf course.

The board will determine programs, improvements and rates, and may establish rules and regulations of the course. The board will keep a complete record of all meetings and actions taken and shall make reports to the city council.

The ordinance states that the purpose of the board shall be to handle the daily operations of the golf course and that the mayor or the city council shall retain the right to overrule any action taken.

Passage of the ordinance came just three days after a heated council session in which members rejected another proposal drafted by the city's ordinance committee. That proposal, some members said, would have left the council powerless over the course.

Collins wanted the council to table the second reading of the ordinance passed Thursday until another special meeting could be held. He also asked to have a first reading of yet another ordinance.

Collins drafted the third measure, which proposed the creation of a golf department in the city. The department would have made recommendations to the city council concerning programs, improvements, rates, rules and regulations,



,Court OKs changes to sheriff's budget

The Floyd County Fiscal Court gave its approval to an amended budget presented by the Floyd County Sheriff's Department during a special meeting held Wednesday.

The budget okayed by commissioners increases expenditures for the department by \$293,121.99, as well as reflects unanticipated revenues of \$166,095.56.

The revenue increase stems from a \$74,794.49 state advancement to the office and \$91,301.07 from a 10 percent fee on delinquent taxes.

The office will increase expenditures in clerks' salaries by \$77,527.88; office supplies by \$14,000; postage, \$850; auto

expense, \$88,050; and uniform expense, \$15,250, for a total of \$195.677.88

Additional expenditure accounts for transporting prisoners, \$4,000; state advancement, \$74,794.49; miscellaneous expense, \$1,000; start-up money, \$1.000; radio equipment, \$5,559.85; conventions and training, \$1,500; dues, \$1,698.58; bond, \$1,636.19; accounting fees, \$2,000; and CCDW, \$4,255, were added into the sheriff's budget.

The new line items total \$97,444.11, bringing a total increase in spending of \$293,121.99.

When you hear the word "carpet," what city comes to mind? You probably said, "Dalton, Georgia." If you said the word and had to think locally, many of you would come up with Kentucky Carpet Factory Outlet in Allen.

Paul and Pluma Branham have operated the business in downtown Allen for the last 27 years, with their son Tony helping since the age of 13.

Branham said he used to be a barber in Prestonsburg and used the customary Wednesday off day to drive to Dalton, Georgia, for Donald "Dookney" Horn to pick up carpet.

As the trips increased, Branham caught the "carpet bug" and wound up running the third-largest carpet store in the county in Jessup, Georgia.

But his success was not enough to ward off his love for the mountains, so he and his wife moved back to Allen and opened their own carpet store.

Branham said to survive the competition from the big stores, he had to be competitive and make the installation of the carpet personal. He said his son taught installers the art, and he had a lot of confidence in their work.

Branham said he could be competitive because he owns his own building and has little overhead. His trust keeps workers on the job, as Orville Powers has worked for Branham for 11 years, while Clyde Endicott has been employed for nine years.

The store has six crews to install carpets and it has business in a 200mile radius of the store, going to such places as Matewan and Williamson, West Virginia, Morehead, Louisa, Hazard and the counties surrounding Floyd.

In addition to carpet, the store sells and installs wood and vinyl products.

Branham still buys some of his carpet in Dalton, Georgia, but he and another carpet owner produce some of their own carpets.

Branham said his store was the fourth-largest in-stock carpet store in the state. That is rather impressive considering that Allen has a population of about 500.

If you visit the store, you may have to sit next to Morris the cat. Morris has his own recliner and doesn't take kindly to being deprived of his sleeping site

Pluma is proud of the fact that the store was voted "Best in The Valley" in a survey conducted by Appalachian News Express.





Staying connected: No nonger confining

(NAPSA)-E-mail has quickly grown into one of the most popular forms of communication in the 20th century. As we move into the next millennium, more and more people will have an e-mail address that is as common as having a home address or telephone number.

Regular surface mail, or snail mail, as the computer community calls it, will not disappear. But the promise of speed and convenience that e-mail offers is irresistible to some. A recent survey found that 60-70 percent of laptop users carry their laptops to send and receive email only. And although toting a heavy laptop while backpacking in the Grand Canyon or Europe may seem like a silly idea, a recent America Online study found that 47 percent of subscribers take their laptops on vacation and 26 percent check their e-mail on vacation.

But despite the high number of laptop-toting travelers, there are still some obstacles with this form of staying connected. Although there may be laptop modem connections at airports or even at hotels, connection costs can be extremely high. Sending a three-

sentence e-mail to Aunt Hilda in Internet access. However, you may Maine from Hawaii can cost as much as a 20-minute phone call. Even in urgent situations, when cost may not be an issue, it may seem impossible to find a phone or data line. There are also potential problems with connections. Few things are more upsetting than getting disconnected from your e-mail service provider, which bills you \$20 per month, in the midst writing a threepage e-mail to your long-lost friend. Your words are lost instantly, along with your momentum, without warning.

Fortunately for people without computers there are less expensive and less frustrating options for staying connected.

Tips for Staying Connected

Here are some new, cost-effective and simple ways to communicate by e-mail without even owning a laptop or computer:

Subscribe to an e-mail service such as Yahoo, Excite or Hotmail, which is available free from any computer that has Internet access. You can then access your email from cybercafes, airport lounges and other places with pay up to \$12 an hour at a cybercafe for connecting.

Try a low-cost mobile email service that doesn't require a computer. Purchase a Sharp TM-20 device for \$100-\$150 and then activate PocketMail service for under \$10 per month or \$99 for one year. Unlike laptop computers, PocketMail devices are easy to use, highly portable, inexpensive, and don't need a telephone jack or data line to send or receive e-mail. You use the device with almost any telephone by dialing a toll-free number

remarks by requesting that those in attendance remain in order and talk one at a time, asked Warden William Wohlford to address the crowd about the implications of the lack of prisoners at the center.

rison

Armed with charts that indicated that the prisoners brought in from Indiana were no more violent than the ones at the prison now, and in some cases are less violent, Wohlford said keeping the prison open would be benefical both to the prison and the community of Wheelwright.

Wohlford said Corrections Corporation of America (CCA) could handle the extra prisoners with the facility as it is, but said to alleviate some of the fears expressed by citizens in Wheelwright, the company planned stricter security measures including a second fence and either an electronic detection device or a tower that would be manned 24 hours a day, plus other improvements in security.

Wohlford said \$4.5 million a year in employee salaries would be lost if the prison were closed. He said typically these monies turn over in the community four times, resulting in an \$18 million impact on the local econmomy.

"All of us here understand this, but what about the older people?" asked commissioner Andy Akers.

Wohlford explained that he and other prison officials were going to the Wheelwright Senior Citizens Center the next day (Wednesday) to explain the situation to seniors.

Wohlford said there was "no way to convince everybody. That's why we all have to work together. It involves us all. I'm a citizen of Wheelwright."

Charles Johnson, who recently became the city policeman, asked about extra police protection for the city. Wohlford said the city would realize extra revenue if the prison accepted out-of-state prisoners.

Johnson asked if that meant the city could have an extra police officer. Wohflord said that would have to be decided by the commission, indicating the commission could use the extra money for the police department if it desired.

Wohlford said the prison was training a special emergencyresponse team that would handle situations where prisoners became a problem. He said the center has not had an escape since 1997.

Wolhford said the Lexington and Louisville media "would make a big deal out of this," and suggested that the local people should work to see that the area has "more jobs, better security and more revenue."

Wohlford said the center didn't really need the city's approal, but wanted a sense of unity in the decision

By a 5-0 count, the commission passed a resolution in support of the expansion of the prison. The decision was greeted with applause from the crowd, many of whom were employees of the center.

The item about armor dealt with a grant of \$388 dollars to buy special clothing for the city police. The city will not be required to expend any funds for the clothing.

The next scheduled meeting will be in January.

Meliorism: A Victorian idea worth remembering

Many worthy writings were left to us by Mary Anne Evans, the English novelist born in 1819, but a single word among them merits special note. The word is meliorism, which she invented to describe an outlook that the world may be bettered by individual endeavor.

It may seem such a simple idea, almost an assumption, a notion too small or commonplace to voice. It is anything but, and a glance at its origin shows why,

Evans lived and wrote in the first half of the Victorian era, an age of great achievements and relentless turmoil that offers some obvious parallels to our own.

Scientific discovery, rapid industrialization and moderate political reforms gave many in England the basis of a great optimism - a sense that the world was the best it could be, or at least moving toward that ideal state. But accompanying upheavals in social order, economic structure and religious adherence inclined others to the opposing stance of pessimism. The importance of individuals, and their efforts, seemed to be both shrinking and expanding.

Evans was no detached observer of these trends. Her rejection of religious practice cost her the affections of her father, to whom she was especially devoted. Old friends deserted her when she decided to live openly as the lover of a man she never married. A woman in a world owned by men, she found it necessary to present such works as "Silas Marner," "The Mill on the Floss" and "Middlemarch" under the pen name George Eliot. She struggled with the world, and frequently with depression.

Asked once if she considered herself an optimist or a pessimist, she chose a third alternative and gave it a name, drawing on the root shared by "ameliorate" and other words.

Meliorism has sometimes been described as a sort of a compromise, a midpoint in a spectrum ranging from pessimism to optimism, but in its inventor's mind, it had the additional and important quality of personal involvement. Optimists and pessimists can remain inert, disconnected from the world they survey; a meliorist cannot.

"Our deeds determine us as much as we determine our deeds," she wrote, and here she referred not only to the accomplishments that might be measured as heroic, historic or grand. Meliorism is also an everyday, everyman kind of thing, and a lens we might use for examining our daily lives, in search of opportunities to try. "The growing good of the world is partly dependent on unhistoric acts, " she wrote as "Middlemarch" came to an end, "and that things are not so ill with you and me as they might have been, is half owing to the number who lived faithfully a hidden life, and rest in unvisited tombs."

Band aid?



Such an awful day in American history should be remembered by all. Because of what happened in Pearl Harbor many of our relatives gave up a part of their lives for our nation. Some gave all. But as I look at my desk calendar the date wasn't even noticed by the makers of my calendar. What a nation we have become when we refuse to see our past. Because when we look at our past we can remember those who kept the world free.

Editor's note: On Tuesday, Gov. Paul Patton my efforts to seek your advice and counsel. became the first governor in two centuries to be sworn in for a second consecutive term of office. What follows is the text of his address after accepting the oath of office.

Thank you, Secretary Riley for your kind words and for your presence here today.

Justice Lambert and members of the judiciary; Speaker Richards and members of the General Assembly; Lieutenant Governor Henry and other constitutional officers; former governors and other distinguished guests; family; and my fellow Kentuckians.

I stand here humbled with the knowledge that, knowing full well my strengths and weaknesses, you have again placed upon me the responsibility of chief magistrate of our Commonwealth. Your expression of confidence in our administration compels me to rededicate myself to your service; to recommit myself to work for you every waking moment; to redouble

Four years ago, when Judi and I stood before you to accept this office, we set the bar high for our administration. It's been a good four years - for Judi and me; for the people we've worked with; for the people of Kentucky. We're proud of what we've done, but this is not a day to revel in the accomplishments of the past. It is rather a day to set new goals; a day to look for new horizons; a day to renew our commitment to make Kentucky the very best that it can be!

We're assembled here to celebrate once more the heritage of our homeland, the land we call Kentucky. Our state is more than just 40,000 square miles of majestic mountains and sparkling streams and golden cornfields and rolling bluegrass pastures. Kentucky is a people unique in their gentility, devoted to family, with a sense of place, willing to work from dawn's

God's creation reveals His genius Someday, if you're not feeling **GOSPEL ACCORDING TO ME**

particularly enthralled with God, take a few minutes to consider the magnificence of His creations.

I don't know whether the Lord made the universe in six 24-hour days, or whether those "days" in Genesis are symbols for six eons. I can't say; I wasn't present.

But I am sure that however He did it, God is the Maker. You'll never convince me that our incredible cosmos just happened by accident. It's too complex, too vast, too interconnected.

It lifts my spirits to think about such matters.

The author of Psalm 33 exhorts us to praise God because "the Lord merely spoke and the heavens were created. He breathed the word and all the stars were born." Here are some facts about

God's planets and stars: Our sun is merely one average-

size star - yet it's 300,000 times as large as Earth. Earth is 92.7 million miles from the sun.

If Earth were a golf ball on the carpet in a large room, Pluto, the most distant planet in our solar system, would be a pea eight miles away. The sun would touch the 8foot ceiling. And that's just our own dinky solar system, which

revolves around our one star.

Outer space is so enormous that its distances must be measured in "light years," or the distance light travels in one earth year - 6 trillion miles.

Other than our sun the next nearest star to Earth, Alpha Centauri, is 4.3 light years, or 25.8 trillion miles, away,

Our sun is a tiny part of the Milky Way galaxy. Our galaxy alone contains 400 to 600 billion such stars. There are up to 100 times as many stars in our galaxy as there are people on earth.

The observable universe holds about 100 billion galaxies. That's roughly, say, 60 trillion stars altogether. That scientists know of.

So how powerful is God? The Psalmist tells us that the Lord merely breathed the word and all the stars were born.

But I also like to consider the flip side of all this: the minuteness of God's handiwork.

In Psalm 139, the Psalmist says to the Lord, "You made all the delicate, inner parts of my body and units that serve as its skin, skeleknit me together in my mother's womb. Thank you for making me so wonderfully complex!"

You see, although people might appear to be only specks of dust among the great cosmos, we were created more carefully than the galaxies.

Every human body contains 75 trillion cells. Cells are so small that it would take 10,000 of them to cover the head of a pin.

Yet each of those 75 trillion cells is itself a microscopic universe. Each cell contains 46 chromosomes and five to seven feet of DNA. The DNA in each cell is made up of 3 billion pairs of chemicals.

Every individual cell contains enough information to fill 100 million pages of the Encyclopaedia Britannica. (My source for this? The Encyclopaedia Britannica.)

Each cell is capable of digesting its own nutrients, providing its own energy and reproducing itself. It's composed of even smaller

ton and digestive tract.

Each cell communicates with its neighbors and cooperates with them in assemblies that form tissues and then organs.

The brain alone contains 30 billion special neuron cells and 250 billion other cells that help the neurons communicate. Every neuron is connected with 50,000 other neurons.

The Grand Canyon is about a mile deep, two to 20 miles wide at various points and 200 miles long. I heard one scientist, who holds a Ph.D. from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, estimate that the information contained in the cells of one human body - if printed on standard sheets of paper - would produce enough books to fill the Grand Canyon at least 20 times.

The Lord who made us is an awesome God. He's the One the prophet Isaiah referred to as "the Mighty Almighty."

Now I know what Isaiah meant.

The South Floyd Raiders just missed the century mark, but did score a 94-75 win over the Millard Mustangs Tuesday night at Raider Arena.


Millard came into the game with their best start in several years, as Joe Marson's ballclub has been playing good basketball this season.

Cruising big time

Taller than the Statue of Liberty, longer than a 17-car freight train, larger than four 747's, wider than an eight-lane freeway. It's the world's largest passenger ship-142 thousands tons-Voyager of the Seas.

The Voyager of the Seas arrived in Miami on November 11, in preparation for its maiden voyage on November 21. The 142,000-ton vessel, with a total cost in the area of \$700 million, was completed at the Kvaerner Masa shipyard in Turku and handed over, October 29, to Royal Caribbean chairman Richard Fain.

The ship, with a capacity of 3,838 guests in 3,114 lower berths, is 1,021 feet in length and 157.5 feet in the beam, or more than 50 feet too wide to pass through the Panama Canal.

On November 15, I was fortunate enough to view the Voyager of the Seas during a Pre-Inaugural Tradeshow overnight sail to sea. There, of course, was a limited amount of time to inspect every inch of the ship, but believe me, I tried. To my amazement, I have never experienced such a master-piece.

Preparing for its entry into year-round, seven-day service from Miami to the western Caribbean, Royal Caribbean and the Port of Miami are completing the world's largest terminal facility, a total of three terminal structures with about 250,000 square feet.

Royal Caribbean is promising that its new facility will provide fast and streamlined check-in procedures, despite the large number of passengers who will board the ship. Late this summer, Royal Caribbean sent nine of the ship's top officers, including Captain Sven Pettersen, to spend 10 days in a training facility in Dania, Florida, with a \$2 million simulator of

NEWS OF THE WEIRD

Life Imitates "Weekend at Bernie's": In November, government officials in East London, South Africa, thwarted an attempt by two men and a woman to register a corpse for pension benefits. According to the South African Press Association, the three propped up the recently deceased man (who they said was merely ill) at the window serving the illiterate and held his hand out to be fingerprinted before a clerk got suspicious.

— A November feature in Toronto's Globe and Mail newspaper recounted the exhibits in Philadelphia's Mutter Museum of medical oddities, including the preserved corpse of a woman with a condition that turned her fatty tissue, upon her death, into a soap-like mass that halted decomposition; the "Muniz collection" of circular-sawed Peruvian human skulls; the extensive, 70year-old Chevalier Jackson Collection of Objects Swallowed and Inhaled; and the huge colon (described as "about the size of a large basset hound") that caused fatal constipation.

Latest Inappropriate Nude Activities

Parishioners at Saint Andrew's Church in south London, England, overpowered a naked, sword-wielding man after he had attacked nine people during a children's service (November). Two former Rutgers male basketball players filed a lawsuit against the school and its coach for making them run laps naked during a practice two years ago (November). A naked University of California at Santa Cruz student was hit by a car, commandeered it, drove off, and promptly crashed into a tree (October). A judge released often-nude gardener Robert Norton, 76, of Pekin, Illinois, after his 19th arrest, but said he will go to jail if he is seen naked again (August). ("I can't (promise) anything," Norton said.)


Compelling Explanations

— Douglas Alan Feldman, 41, was sentenced to death in Dallas in August for two road-rage murders, based in part on letters he had sent to a former girlfriend after his arrest. Wrote Feldman: "I found it quite pleasurable to kill those two men. If you are an angry person and someone provokes you to violence, (it) feels wonderful to cause their death and to watch their pain."

— When Lawrence Russell Brewer Jr., the second defendant to go to trial in the 1998 Jasper, Texas, racial dragging death, showed up in a Bryan, Texas, courtroom in September 1999, the arresting sheriff had trouble recognizing him because Brewer was so much heavier (having gone from a 30-inch waist to a 40). Brewer's explanation was that he so feared that a Y2K computer crash would wipe out his prison commissary account that he had decided to spend down all his money right away on junk food.

— In August, an 87-year-old woman, pursued for 30 miles along southern California's Pacific Coast Highway by siren-blaring sheriff's deputies who wanted to stop her for a traffic violation, said when she finally pulled over that she had kept driving because the deputies never did what cops do in the movies: overtake her and force her over. And one month later a jury

Priority treatment when cruise ship runs aground

(NAPSA) - When Norwegian Cruise Line's newest ship, the Norwegian Sky ran aground at the juncture of the Saguenay River and the St. Lawrence Seaway in Quebec, no injuries were sustained by the 1,924 passengers and 787 crew members who were on board for the 10day Canada/New England cruise.

Repairs to the hull of the 77,104-ton Norwegian Sky were required and the tour was cancelled. Passengers were just three days away from the end of their cruise. The cancellation also affected scheduled vacationers who had just begun the land portion of their tour in Washington, DC, and a third group who were packed and ready to leave from their homes.

The travel agent, Your Man Tours, began contacting their clients with news of the cancellation within minutes of hearing of the ship's dilemma. The decision was made to give full refunds to those clients who were two days into their tour. For clients who were about to leave on their trip, full refunds were provided.

Your Man Tours clients who were aboard the Norwegian Sky at the time of the grounding received prompt refunds for the unused portion of their tour. Norwegian Cruise Line had indicated that these passengers will receive certificates for a free future cruise with NCL. Those passengers who were scheduled to board the Norwegian Sky were promised discount certificates for future NCL cruises and a hotline was established for all those affected by the cancellation. YMT apprised their clients of these additional benefits when their refund checks were sent.

In this day and age, vacationers interested in cruises have become very wary of travel scams and tips-offs. Even those who book through reputable travel agents often must wait 6 to 8 weeks for any form of refund in the case of cancellations. In 32 years of operation, Your Man Tours had never had a ship run aground on one of their tours. In this unexpected circumstance, they were anxious to uphold their reputation of providing high-value full-service vacations to their loyal repeat clients, as well as their new customers. Clients are top priority, and refund checks went out within two weeks, before the company had recouped any of their losses.

Kentucky Crafted: The Market offers a homecoming for 2000

On February 5 and 6, 2000, Kentucky Crafted: The Market's 19th annual exhibition will turn Kentucky's eyes upon the tradition of its artists and craftspeople.

With the "Homecoming 2000" theme, this year's Market will not only showcase craftspeople who are currently juried under the state's Craft Marketing Program, but also former exhibitors who will bring their products back to where it all started.

"Homecomings and reunions are traditional events in Kentucky," says Program Director Fran Redmon. "What better way to celebrate the millennium than to bring back many of the wonderful craftspeople that have been part of The Market's success and history for nearly 20 years?"

This special millennial Market will not only give visitors the opportunity to come home to the fine traditions of Kentucky, past and present, but also a chance to travel through the time span of the 20th century-from vintage art to '90s contemporary art-one last time.

Barbara Harrell, who has exhibited at The Market

year with her life-size vintage figures. The idea for her craft originated while she was looking through old magazines with a friend and became intrigued with the fashions of the 1920s.

She began cutting wooden figures out of wood and painting them in early 20th century attire, complete with fitting accessories, such as umbrellas and mirrors. Through her work, she hopes to give a "real visual image of what life was like in the 1920s."

On the other end of the spectrum, Kim and Chris Fitch give an ancient rural art form a contemporary twist with their "whirligigs," moving sculptures that blow in the wind. Springing from the idea of a weather vane and from Chris's fascination with windmills, these whirligigs have enjoyed a great deal of popularity over the past few years. As the name suggests, these are not simply instruments for wind tracking; they are fun, innovative sculptures that depict a slice of life.

One whirligig is a dog messing in the flowers and Granny yelling at him; another depicts the dog since 1992, will return this pulling Granny's undergarments off the clothesline. Most of the sculptures have five-to-seven moving parts and span about 30 inches in length. Each one is accompanied by an imaginative poem or story.

The Fitchs' also feature another type of product. The "Preacher's Stress Relief" is a small box with the devil and Moses standing on top. Moses is holding in his hands the Ten Commandments, and with a turn of the crank on the bottom of the box, Moses whacks the devil on the head with his scroll.

Kim Fitch, who is a ninth generation Appalachian, is proud to be able to carry on the traditions of her upbringing in what she calls a "true vein." She credits much of that opportunity to the Kentucky Craft Marketing Program.

"It's the best thing that ever happened to us." she says. "Kentucky takes such good care of its artists. It restores dignity and respect to its traditional art forms."

Another artist who will attend The Market this year produces works that represents Kentucky through the last thousand years, in its entirety. David Dick practices art of a different kind. His materials are words, and his finished products are books-both fiction and nonfiction-that explore and celebrate Kentucky people, and old and new traditions.

Dick's most recent books, "Home Sweet Kentucky," which he co-authored with his wife, Lalie, is a collection of more than 90 essays about Kentuckians.

"There are wonderful people doing good things and living in this Commownealth," said Dick. "It is our mission to sit down with them in their homes or workplaces and listen to them. They have interesting stories to tell."

Dick's other novels include "The View From Plum Lick," "Peace at the Center," "The Quiet Center," Kentuckians," "A Conversation with Peter P. Pence.' "The Scourges of Heaven." and "Follow the Storm," each of which somehow focuses on life in Kentucky.

"There are 3.8 million Kentuckians-most of whom are very good, and these are the ones that don't get any attention," says Dick. "We want to break through sterotypical thinking and writing. The Market repre-



sents what we are trying to do."

From Barbara Harrell's reminiscent images, to the Fitchs' upbeat whirligigs, to the timeless words of David Dick, Kentucky Crafted: The Market, Homecoming 2000, focuses on what Kentucky is and has been for hundreds of years.

"It is a showcase for Kentucky's cultural products," says Redmon. "All the wonderfully created works reflect on the spirit of the people and tell the story of our traditions. That heritage is still being carried forward today through historic and contemporary interpretations of craft, art, books, music, and food. Visitors to The Market will have all their senses fully immersed in an enriching experience that is truly and uniquely Kentucky."

The Market is open to the public from 9 a.m.-6 p.m. on Saturday, and noon to 5 p.m. on Sunday. The cost is \$5 for adults and \$2 for children ages 6-12. Children under 6 are admitted free. Parking is \$3. The Market is sponsored the Kentucky Craft by Marketing Program, a state agency in the Kentucky Arts Council; Arts & Humanities Cabinet; Commonwealth of Kentucky.

CRITTERS CORNER

You've probably spent the last few weeks getting your house and car ready for winter, but have you winterized your pets?

As I write this, we are

enjoying what I fear are the last few days of Indian Summer. By the time this is published, the cold weather may have come to stay. I'll be making my annual trip to Wal-Mart to lay in the winter supply of cedar chips. (I get even more strange looks than when I load the week's supply of cat and dog food.)

Your particular situation will dictate just what you need to do to prepare your animals for cold weather.

Let's start with shelter. I have so many dogs that I don't rely on regular doghouses, although the new plastic insulated types that come apart for cleaning are very nice, and I have a few that serve as extra resting places on milder days.

When we had central heat installed, we had the workmen run an extra vent into the kennel area, and at home, we had a vent placed under the front porch, and two openings left in the block foundation to allow the dogs access to the entire area. It's a pill to

crawl under there to spread the cedar chips, but the dogs have a nice

warm area all winter.

Doesn't Jeff Foxworthy say you might be a redneck, if, should your front porch collapse, it would kill more than three dogs?

If you are building a doghouse, something to keep in mind is to minimize drafts. It's best to build a rectangular doghouse and place the door near the end of one of the long sides. I've tried making door flaps out of mine belt, but my dogs all seem to think I've given them a new game, and the object is to see how fast they can remove it. You might have better luck

I've also stumbled on a nifty way to make an insulated shelter for a cat or very small dog that can be used on a sheltered porch. Get a large, cheap Styrofoam cooler, and find two cardboard boxes-one that will hold the entire cooler, lid and all, and one that will fit inside the cooler. I don't like to leave the Styrofoam exposed. because cats tend to claw at it and dogs can't seem to resist chewing it.

> Cut an opening in one end, as described for the doghouse, and seal any gaps with duct tape. A flap could possibly be left on one of the boxes to serve as a draft stopper for the door. With bedplaced ding inside, this seems to make a very

comfortable sleeping box. Remember how cats like to sleep

on

warm motors of cars, so

be sure to blow the horn or bang on the hood before starting your vehicle. I have seen many cats horribly mutilated or killed in motors, and of those who avoid the moving parts. I wonder how many are lost or killed when they are too terrified to move after the car starts, and fall out later.

I know this happens because I had a friend whose cat rode from Garrett all the way to Prestonsburg Community College somewhere up under the car. He was startled to see a cat that looked just like his in the parking lot, and even more

shocked to discover, on closer inspection, that it WAS his cat.

She rode back home inside the car, and he never forgot to check the car for hitchhikers again -

although I doubt that particular cat ever set foot near the car, having lost eight of her nine lives within half an hour.

One last reminder is PLEASE be careful with antifreeze. Animals often like the taste and drink it willingly. It takes an unbelievably small amount to kill an animal, and often by the time the animal is obviously sick, its kidneys have already started to fall.

Treatment exists for the condition, but it is prolonged, expensive, and frequently unsuccessful. If you even think your pet may have had access to antifreeze in any amount, CALL VETERINARIAN YOUR IMMEDIATELY. Your pet's best chance for survival is within the first hour of ingestion.

There are "safer" antifreezes on the market that are based on propylene glycol rather than the traditional ethylene glycol, and I think their slightly greater expense is worth it.

Q. My parents left me a set of 1950s cherry bedroom furniture. Unfortunately, it was stored too long in a closed room, and the drawers smell moldy. I have tried commercial disinfectants, but nothing has worked. Can you help?

A. Try spreading some fresh coffee grounds in the drawers and letting them sit for at least 24 hours. They might absorb the odor.

If that doesn't work, sprinkle the drawers with baking soda, and leave them open for a week. Vacuum and repeat if necessary.

If the smell persists, parch several handfuls of uncooked rice in a shallow pan in the oven. Place the pan and rice in a misty drawer to absorb the odor.

You also can try spreading cat litter or charcoal chips in the drawers. Close the drawers for several days, and repeat until the odor seems to be gone. Then wash the inside of the drawers and let them dry.

Some people solve the problem by placing the drawers outdoors in the shade, then using a fan to blow air through the drawers.

If none of these methods Coa work, you can try varnishing the inside of the drawers to seal in Inc.

the odor. Good luck.

TIP: When storing dolls, old or new, be sure to remove any sticky tape that might have been used to hold bows or other accessories in place. The glue from the tape eventually would discolor the fabric.

Q. I recently learned that the vaseline glass candlesticks that sit on my dining room table get their yellow-green color from uranium. Does this pose a health risk?

A. The coloring agent used in making vaseline glass was the stable compound uranium dioxide, not the radioactive element uranium.

Tests to measure the emissions given off by genuine vaseline glass show they are on the same level as TV or microwaveoven emissions.



In August, a Portland, Oregon, jury acquitted drunk-driving defendant Robert Lee Buskirk after a judge accepted his argument that incriminating statements he made at the scene not be used against him because he was so drunk he didn't know what he was doing when he waived his "Miranda" right.

- In 1994, psychologist Kenneth Olson of Phoenix, already on probation with the state's licensing board for a 1988 exorcism, filed a lawsuit against the board, asserting that he had a constitutional right to perform a 1993 exorcism on an 8-year-old foster child (and to be paid \$180 for it by the state's Child Protective Services). (In July 1999, a federal appeals court ruled against him.)

-Milwaukee's Thomas Rollo, 53, chopped off his arm at the elbow with a homemade guillotine in October, but authorities found the arm in his refrigerator and made plans for reattachment surgery. However, Rollo refused the surgery, threatened to sue, and promised to chop the arm right back off if it were reattached. ...

Update

-In September, authorities in Lincoln, Illinois, said the "Sock Man" (reported in News of the Weird earlier this year) from nearby Springfield had finally slipped up and committed a crime when he tried to abduct three kids. In Springfield, he had offered female strangers \$100 for their socks, and in nearby Auburn in August, he allegedly offered young girls \$5 to chew some gum and give it to him. Springfield and Auburn police said neither of those incidents was illegal (or, as a Springfield officer said, "It's no crime to be weird"). ...

Thinning the Herd

- One month before the Texas A&M bonfire tragedy, a 17-yearold University of Oklahoma football fan in Kingfisher, Oklahoma, accidentally shot himself to death while celebrating the team's victory over Texas A&M. And in September, a 21-year-old Bryant College (Smithfield, Rhode Island) student, trying to slide down a banister in a residence hall, was killed when he fell three stories onto his head.

... Also, in the Last Month ...

- A man and his son, ages 54 and 17, were arrested in Columbus, Mississippi, for burglarizing a home, both dressed in ninja costumes, armed with swords and star-shaped throwing blades. An armed-robbery sus-

pect, hiding from police in a tree at 4 a.m., was arrested when his wristwatch alarm sounded (Reno, Nevada). Officials at a landmine museum adjacent to two schools finally acceded to demands to defuse its 463 live mines (Zendajan, Afghanistan). A 37year-old woman was cited for driving on a major freeway while reading a book (Ottawa, Ontario). An ultra-Orthodox religious court in Jerusalem banned women from using cell phones in public, ruling that it makes them look like prostitutes.


